### THIS WEEK'S NOTABLES:

► The Patriots make their first appearance in Wisconsin since a preseason contest on July 31, 1997. New England hasn't made a regular-season trip to Green Bay since 1979 (the teams will meet at Lambeau in 2006). The Patriots' last regular-season game in Wisconsin was in 1988, at Milwaukee County Stadium.

► Friday marks the 45th annual Bishop's Charities Game. The Packers have lost two straight in the series, after winning the previous 12 (1991-2002).

► **Brett Favre** hopes to stay on track for the best preseason of his 15-year NFL career. His current 140.6 passer rating, compared to other years:

**WISCONSIN TELEVISION:** The Packers television network, with play-by-play man Kevin Harlan, color commentator Bill Maas, sideline reporter Jessie Garcia, producer Steve Karasik and director Suzanne Smith. WFRV-TV's Larry McCarren, the team's radio analyst, joins the telecast for pregame, halftime and postgame segments. With the aid of a CBS crew that produces NFL games during the regular season, Green Bay's WFRV-TV and Milwaukee's WTMJ-TV will originate the telecast...Other members of the network: WKOW, Madison; WAOW, Wausau/Rhineland; WXOW, La Crosse; WQOW, Eau Claire; WYOW, Eagle River; and WJMN, Marquette, Mich. ...**NFL Network** will re-air the game Saturday at 3 p.m. CDT, using the Packers' broadcast and announcers for the first half and the Patriots' broadcast and announcers for the second half...**Satellite coordinates** for Friday's game: IA-6, Transponder 9 (C-Band); Audio: 6.2 / 6.8.

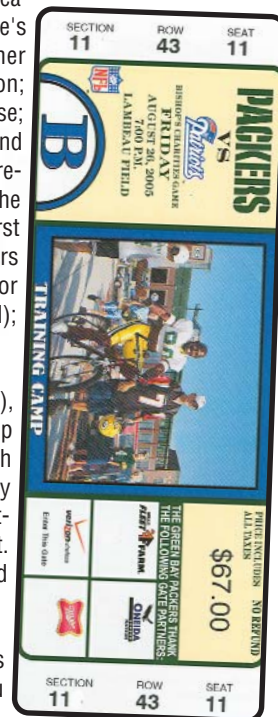
**LOCAL RADIO:** Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since 1929, heads up the 62-station Packers Radio Network, with Wayne Larrivee (play-by-play) and Larry McCarren (color). Spanning five states, the network covers 50 markets in the upper Midwest. The broadcast also is available to NFL Field Pass subscribers on [packers.com](http://packers.com).

**BISHOP'S CHARITIES GAME:** This week marks the annual Bishop's Charities Game, a Lambeau Field tradition now in its 45th year.

- In 1961, the Diocese of Green Bay approached Vince Lombardi about playing a second charitable contest in Green Bay (the Shrine game was already a fixture in Milwaukee).
- Lombardi, a devout Catholic, agreed to the contest. The original contract gave the Packers, their opponent and the church each one-third of the gate receipts.
- During the 1970s, the Packers and the church changed the contract so the Diocese would receive a flat donation, rather than a percentage.
- For more than 30 years, the church handled much of the game's business-related tasks, including game program and advertising sales, using a network of volunteers covering 14 Northeastern Wisconsin counties. The Packers assumed many of those tasks beginning in 1994.
- To date, the series has raised nearly \$3.25 million.

**THE LAST TIME:** These teams' last meeting, Oct. 13, 2002, was a hallmark game in Mike Sherman's tenure, a 28-10 win over the Super Bowl winners.

- Sherman's defense was missing five starters, including three DBs. However, two street free agents, Bryant Westbrook and Todd Franz, signed days before, were instrumental in intercepting Tom Brady three times (a season high for the Super Bowl MVP).
- The Patriots have lost only three times at Gillette in three seasons.

**SHERMAN TIED WITH BELICHICK:** Since 1993, the span of the current collective bargaining agreement, Mike Sherman's .663 Packers winning percentage is tied with Bill Belichick's time in New England for the league's third-most successful tenure. Among the 84 tenures that began 1993 or later, only 26 have posted a better than .500 record over more than one season. The five best regular-season tenures:

**PATRIOTS, PACKERS TOUGH ON ROAD:** The Packers are coming off their best road record (6-2) since 1972, when they went 6-1 during a 14-game season.

- ▶ Over a longer stretch, Green Bay has won eight of its last 10 away from home, and 10 of its last 13, dating to mid-season 2003. The team hasn't lost consecutive road games in the same season since Nov. 17-24, 2002.
- ▶ In fact, the Packers haven't seen a losing record on the road since they were 3-5 in 2000. They went 5-3 in both 2001 and '03, and 4-4 in 2002.
- ▶ Only Philadelphia and New England own a better road record over the last four seasons (since 2001):

**COACHES CAPSULES**

Mike Sherman: 55-31-0, .640, sixth NFL season, sixth with Packers

**MIKE SHERMAN...** Is in his sixth year as the Packers' 13th head coach.

- ▶ In 2004, his team became only the ninth in NFL history to reach the playoffs after a 1-4 start.
- ▶ Has led the Packers to three straight division titles (2002-04) for only the fourth time in team history, joining Vince Lombardi's three-time winners of 1960-62 and 1965-67, along with the 1995-97 division champs of Mike Holmgren. This season will attempt to do what no Green Bay head coach ever has done: lead his team to a fourth consecutive division championship.
- ▶ First tenure with Packers came as tight ends/assistant offensive line coach over the 1997-98 seasons, following 16 years as an assistant in the college ranks; coached in Green Bay's Super Bowl XXXII loss to Denver.
- ▶ In 2004 became the second-fastest head coach in team history to reach 50 career victories, doing so in his 78th contest; only Lombardi, with 50 wins in 66 games, did so quicker.
- ▶ Is 6-0 against teams in the Super Bowl the previous season.

**BILL BELICHICK...** Enters his 31st season as an NFL coach, his sixth at the helm in New England.

- ▶ The only NFL coach to win three Super Bowls in a four-year span, Belichick last season moved ahead of Vince Lombardi (9-1) to claim the best postseason record in NFL history (10-1).
- ▶ Has spent more seasons in the league than any other NFL head coach and is one of just two coaches in league history (George Seifert) to win multiple Super Bowls as a head coach and as an assistant coach.
- ▶ Began his career in 1975 as a special assistant with the Baltimore Colts. Following Super Bowl XXV, Belichick was named head coach of the Cleveland Browns in 1991.
- ▶ Belichick was a center/tight end at Wesleyan from 1971-74.

**THE PACKERS-PATRIOTS SERIES:** Green Bay holds a 5-3 all-time edge in the 32-year-old series (4-3 regular season, 1-0 postseason). The teams have split 12 preseason meetings (6-6).

- ▶ The Patriots haven't played a game in Green Bay that counted since 1979 (26 years). That season, the Packers upset Chuck Fairbanks and his high-octane Patriots, 27-14, on a Monday night game. It was the 1,000th contest in Packers history.
- ▶ No other NFL team has a longer active stretch without a regular-season game at Lambeau Field (26 years) or Wisconsin (17 years). The Patriots' last league game in the state was in 1988 at Milwaukee

County Stadium, a 45-3 Packers win. New Orleans (16 years, Green Bay, 1989) owns the second-longest active period without a Lambeau appearance; the Saints are in Green Bay this Oct. 9).

- ▶ These teams last saw each other at Gillette Stadium, Oct. 13, 2002. The Packers that day became the first visiting team to win in the stadium. Only two other clubs have managed to beat the Patriots there; the team is 24-3, including playoffs, at its current home.
- ▶ Most memorable of the eight overall games between the teams was their only postseason tilt, Super Bowl XXXI, in New Orleans, a 35-21 Packers victory.
- ▶ Just months after the Super Bowl, the teams met again in the pre-season at Lambeau, July 31, 1997, their last non-league clash.
- ▶ The preseason series was launched in historic fashion in 1975; the Patriots pulled out a 20-17 victory at Milwaukee — by way of a John Smith field goal — in the first preseason overtime game in Green Bay's annals.

**NOTABLE CONNECTIONS:** An avid Red Sox fan, Green Bay Head Coach Mike Sherman grew up in the Hyde Park neighborhood of Boston and graduated from Algonquin Regional High School in Northboro, Mass.; he played collegiately at Central Connecticut State...Patriots safety Antuan Edwards was Green Bay's No. 1 draft pick in 1999...Packers guard Adrian Klemm was the first draft pick of the Bill Belichick era in New England, and played with the Patriots five years (2000-04) until signing as an unrestricted free agent with Green Bay this offseason...The Patriots in 2000 signed Grey Ruegamer (now with Green Bay) off the Steelers' practice squad; the guard/center played three seasons in New England before signing with the Packers before the '03 campaign...Packers running back Walt Williams, whose cousin is New England running back Kevin Faulk, began his NFL career with the Patriots, signing as a non-drafted free agent in 2001.

**LAST MEETING (AP):** Oct. 13, 2002, Gillette Stadium, Foxborough, Mass.; Packers won, 28-10.

- ▶ Brett Favre threw three touchdown passes, giving him 301 for his career and moving him past No. 3 John Elway on the all-time list.
- ▶ The Packers (5-1) won their fourth straight as Ahman Green rushed for 136 yards and scored two touchdowns. The Patriots turned over the ball four times, lost two of the three replay reviews and committed critical penalties that led to two touchdowns.
- ▶ The Patriots couldn't exploit a subpar Packers defense missing three starting defensive backs and starting defensive ends Joe Johnson and Vonnie Holiday. In fact, Green Bay turned in its best defensive effort, allowing just 4.3 yards per play.
- ▶ With third-and-5 at the New England 16 and the Patriots ahead 3-0, Donald Driver caught a pass from Favre, but side judge Tom Hill ruled Driver was juggling the ball as he was pushed out of bounds at the 5. Mike Sherman's replay challenge overturned that, then Favre hit William Henderson for the touchdown.
- ▶ Tom Brady's first interception, by Bryant Westbrook — who'd signed with Green Bay four days earlier — ended the opening possession of the game at the Packers 43.
- ▶ Late in the second quarter, Kevin Faulk dropped Brady's backward pass and Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila recovered on the Patriots 8, after rookie Marques Anderson alerted his teammates to the live ball. On the next play, Favre threw to Green for a 14-3 lead.

**LAST MEETING, WISCONSIN:** Oct. 9, 1988, Milwaukee County Stadium; Packers won, 45-3.

- ▶ Erupting for 17 points in the second quarter and 21 more in the fourth, the Packers put an explosive end to a five-game losing streak, their largest margin of victory in more than 20 years.
- ▶ In his 1988 starting debut, Don Majkowski threw for 210 yards and one TD, and Brent Fullwood (14-118) scored three TDs.
- ▶ Green Bay intercepted New England five times, two by Ron Pitts.

**TURNOVERS TELL THE STORY:** During Mike Sherman's tenure, one of the most successful in terms of winning percentage during the current era, the turnover margin has proven to be a significant factor. Among teams with the five best overall records during Sherman's tenure (Philadelphia, Pittsburgh, Green Bay, New England and St. Louis), four appear on at least one of the following two lists:

**LAST WEEK:** In his only series of the night, Brett Favre guided the Packers on an efficient and impressive touchdown drive in a 27-7 loss at Ralph Wilson Stadium Saturday in Buffalo.

- ▶ Favre drove the Packers 75 yards on 13 plays and delivered a perfect touch pass to Ahman Green for a 12-yard touchdown to put Green Bay on the board. The quarterback was 4-for-6 for 41 yards on the opening possession.
- ▶ Then, however, the Packers surrendered a 69-yard kickoff return, giving Buffalo possession at the Green Bay 27. Nine plays later, J.P. Losman's 1-yard run tied the contest, 7-7.
- ▶ On the second play of the second quarter, Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila sacked Losman in the end zone, but an illegal contact penalty nullified the two points. Buffalo went on to kick a field goal, taking a 10-7 advantage.
- ▶ At the end of Green Bay's ensuing drive, another Packers penalty killed a momentum-turning play. After a Packers punt, Todd Franz forced and recovered a fumble, giving Green Bay possession at midfield, but an ineligible man downfield forced the Packers to punt again, and Buffalo answered with a touchdown drive, extending its lead to 17-7.



► First-round pick Aaron Rodgers saw his most extensive professional playing time, at the helm for five Packers possessions following Favre's early departure. Rodgers was 4 of 9 for 21 yards, getting sacked once and throwing an INT.

**DON'T BEAT YOURSELF:** That's the team's philosophy entering 2005. The Packers have won 53 games and lost 27 over the last five years. This off-season, the coaching staff examined each of those 27 losses and concluded that on only a handful of occasions they were dominated beyond hope of victory. They beat themselves in the large majority of those 27 defeats.

► So, the team added high school scoreboards to each of its three practice fields and has devoted much of camp to specific situational drills, attempting to simulate down-and-distance and clock variables in which they were unable to overcome in most of those 27 losses.

**THAT'S WHY THEY PLAY THE GAMES:** Most preseason prognosticators have written off Brett Favre and the Packers, predicting their finish anywhere from the middle to the bottom in the NFC North (*The Sporting News* picked them to finish last).

► That's fine with the Packers, who shy away from the spotlight. In fact, most of the players and coaches prefer the underdog role. Don't miscount the team's confidence, though.

► Three years ago, most of the same publications picked the Bears to defend their 2001 division title. And, few magazines picked the Packers to string together three NFC North crowns.

**ANNUAL FRANCHISE RECORDS:** Using virtually the same personnel, Green Bay set a single-season record for rushing yards in 2003 and a single-season record for passing yards in 2004.

► The Packers are the first NFL team to set franchise records for rushing yards and passing yards in back-to-back seasons since the 1988-1989 49ers (excluding expansion teams).

► San Francisco set a franchise record for rushing yards in 1988 and for passing yards in 1989.

**TOTAL YARDS, TOO:** Green Bay in 2004 also broke its 1983 franchise record for total offense with 6,357 yards.

► The effort, during a season in which offensive coordinator Tom Rossley underwent Oct. 12 emergency heart surgery — and saw Sherman take over play calling — led the NFC, ranked third in the NFL and 15th overall in league history.

**COACHES ON GAME DAY:** The coaching staff is split between the field and press box.

► In the booth, as of the start of the preseason, are Tom Rossley (offensive coordinator), Joe Philbin (tight ends/assistant offensive line),

James Campen (assistant offensive line/quality control), Turner Gill (director of player development/offensive assistant), Charlie Jackson (defensive quality control), Robert Nunn (defensive tackles) and Joe Baker (secondary/safeties).

**ROSTER DATES:** Aug. 30 — Reduction to 65 players; Sept. 3 — Reduction to 53 players; Sept. 4 — Teams may establish a practice squad of eight players after 11 a.m. CDT. The Packers have 10 roster exemptions.

**CAMP EVEN HAS ITS OWN WEB SITE:** The Packers on June 1 launched a new Web site, [www.packerstrainingcamp.com](http://www.packerstrainingcamp.com), an online location designed to assist Packers fans as they make plans to visit their favorite team's training sessions each summer.

► A vacation-planning resource, the site features a practice schedule as well as information on other Lambeau Field attractions, including the Packers Experience, the Packers Hall of Fame, Stadium Tours, the Packers Pro Shop and dining options.

► "Many people descend upon Green Bay each summer and are very interested to know about all of the attractions that are available here at Lambeau Field during training camp," said Executive Vice President/COO John Jones. "This Web site allows fans a convenient look at what options exist."

► A key feature of the site is the daily practice schedule, which will include any up-to-the-minute changes that may occur. Other links include information on directions, parking and autograph sessions.

► Another important link takes viewers to The Packer Country Visitor & Convention Bureau's Web site, which features important information on accommodations, as well as other Green Bay summer activities, places of interest, dining options and airport and rental car information.
