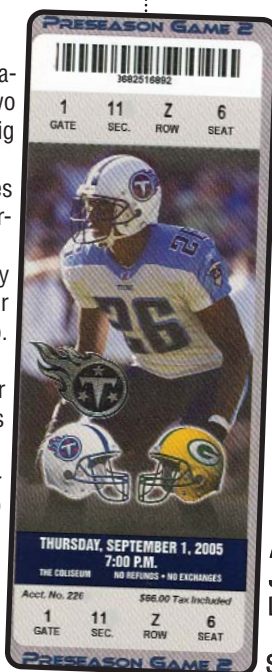

THIS WEEK'S NOTABLES:

- The Packers and Titans conclude a fourth straight preseason. Tennessee has won the finale each of the last two years, including a win last season in Nashville. Rookie Craig Nall led Green Bay to a 21-20 win in 2002.
- After a 27-3 loss to the Patriots last week, Green Bay hopes to gain some momentum and sync headed into its regular-season opener, Sept. 11.
- Returning many of its key contributors to health, Green Bay could see most of its starting defensive unit on the field for the first time. The Packers also will look to return their No. 1 offense back to where it was before last week.
- Pro Bowl tight end Bubba Franks, who signed a multiyear contract Wednesday and passed his physical Thursday, is expected to make his 2005 preseason debut.
- Thursday will mark the final game for several players contending for spots on the 53-man roster. The team needs to reduce its roster by Saturday at 5 p.m. CDT.

WISCONSIN TELEVISION: The Packers television network, with play-by-play man Kevin Harlan, color commentator Bill Maas, sideline reporter Jessie Garcia, producer Ross Schneiderman and director Suzanne Smith. WFRV-TV's Larry McCarren, the team's radio analyst, joins the telecast for pregame, halftime and postgame segments. With the aid of a CBS crew that produces NFL games during the regular season, Green Bay's WFRV-TV and Milwaukee's WTMJ-TV will originate the telecast...Other members of the network: WKOW, Madison; WAOW, Wausau/Rhineland; WXOW, La



Crosse; WQOW, Eau Claire; WYOW, Eagle River; and WJMN, Marquette, Mich. ...**NFL Network** will re-air the game Saturday at 9 a.m. CDT, using the Titans' broadcast and announcers for the first half and the Packers' broadcast and announcers for the second half...**Satellite coordinates** for Thursday's game: 1A-6, Transponder 9 (C-Band); Audio: 6.2 / 6.8.

LOCAL RADIO: Milwaukee's **WTMJ** (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since 1929, heads up the 62-station Packers Radio Network, with Wayne Larrivee (play-by-play) and Larry McCarren (color). Spanning five states, the network covers 50 markets in the upper Midwest. The broadcast also is available to NFL Field Pass subscribers on packers.com.

ROSTER REDUCTION: The team Sunday announced 11 transactions to reduce its roster in anticipation of the NFL's Tuesday deadline, said Ted Thompson, Executive Vice President, General Manager and Director of Football Operations...The team has released linebacker **Hannibal Navies** and guard **Matt O'Dwyer**, as well as wide receiver **Vince Butler**, cornerback **Patrick Dendy**, linebacker **Jeremiah Garrison**, guard/tackle **Atlas Herrion**, tight end **Tory Humphrey**, running back **Derrick Johnese**, defensive tackle **A.J. Lindsay**, wide receiver **Chad Lucas** and defensive tackle **Quintene Newhouse**.

SHERMAN EXTENDED: Thompson's first move in a busy week was to sign his head coach, Mike Sherman, to a two-year contract extension, through the end of the 2007 season.

- Sherman in 2005 could post a sixth consecutive winning season. Since the 1993 collective bargaining agreement, NFL teams have changed coaches 84 times and only Sherman's tenure has produced winning seasons in each of its first five years.
- And, over their first five regular seasons as an NFL coach, since 1970 only Chuck Knox, George Seifert, Joe Gibbs and Mike Ditka have produced better records than Sherman (53-27, .663).

FRANKS SIGNED: Thompson also re-signed Pro Bowl tight end Bubba Franks to a multiyear contract.

- Franks, a 6-foot-6, 265-pound veteran from Miami (Fla.), could become the first tight end in Packers history named to four Pro Bowls. Paul Coffman (1982-84) and Mark Chmura (1995, 1997-98) are the only other Packers at the position who have played in three.
- A durable, consistent offensive threat, Franks has not missed a game in five NFL seasons, playing in 80 straight contests (86 including playoffs). What's more, including an All-America college career with the Hurricanes, he has played in 122 consecutive contests.
- Since the Packers made Franks their first-round selection in the 2000 draft (14th overall), only Tony Gonzalez (39) has more touchdown receptions than Franks (28) among league tight ends. And, with 25 TD catches from Brett Favre, only Antonio Freeman (57), Sterling Sharpe (41) and Robert Brooks (32) have caught more from the future Hall of Famer.

LAMBEAU NO. 1: Veteran writer Rick Gosselin Saturday ranked Lambeau Field as the NFL's best stadium, adding "Lambeau has the coziness of Wrigley Field combined with the historical significance of Yankee Stadium."

THOMPSON'S FIRST DAY IN THE NFL: This week Green Bay General Manager Ted Thompson might recall his days with the Houston Oilers, who moved to Tennessee in 1997 and eventually became the Titans.

- ▶ A workhorse linebacker at SMU, he went undrafted in 1975, but not unnoticed. Bum Phillips, just hired to head the Houston Oilers, had coached Thompson in college. But that hadn't earned the young linebacker anything, not a job, not even a penny.
- ▶ "It was my first negotiation," Thompson told NFL Network earlier this year, remembering his first phone call with Phillips 30 years ago. "He called me and said, 'Would you like to come to camp and try out with the Oilers?' I said, 'Yeah.' I was thrilled. So he sent me a contract.
- ▶ "Well, I got the contract and I called him back, and said that maybe I wanted a little signing bonus. It wasn't in there. I was talking \$100, \$200. He said, 'If you don't want to sign it, then forget it.' I said, 'No, no. I'm signing it as we speak.'"
- ▶ A key contributor for the Oilers from 1975-84, Thompson played in 146 of 147 games over his 10-year NFL career. His teammates included Hall of Famers Earl Campbell, Mike Munchak and Elvin Bethea.

COLLINS FOLLOWING IN CECIL'S FOOTSTEPS: Nick Collins is bidding to become the first Packers rookie to start a regular-season opener at safety since Chuck Cecil in 1988.

- ▶ Cecil, now in his fifth year on the Titans coaching staff, spent his first five NFL seasons (1988-92) in Green Bay. A fourth-round pick out of Arizona, Cecil lined up in the backfield Sept. 4, 1988, a 34-7 loss to Jim Everett and the L.A. Rams in Lindy Infante's first contest as Packers coach.
- ▶ Another Packers rookie starter that day, first-round choice Sterling Sharpe, had a rough afternoon (no catches, one carry for no gain).
- ▶ Collins, a 5-foot-11, 200-pound defender out of Bethune-Cookman, wears No. 36, the number last worn by All-Pro LeRoy Butler. Ted Thompson assigned that jersey to Collins because Thompson didn't want the honor to go to just any player.

SPEAKING OF ROOKIES: The Packers have a history of drafting starting offensive linemen in the seventh round, and guard William Whitticker might be next in line.

- ▶ Whitticker, the 246th overall selection, would follow seventh-round picks Mark Tauscher (2000) and Adam Timmerman (1995). Both players eventually worked their way into the starting lineup.
- ▶ However, if he starts the Sept. 11 opener at Detroit, Whitticker would become the first rookie guard to start the Packers' first game since Bill Bain in 1975. In the 30 years since, the closest a rookie guard has come to opening as a starter was Tom Neville in 1986; he replaced an injured Rich Moran in the first quarter of the opener and started the remaining 15 games.

CAP COGNIZANT: The Packers lost three of their starters — guards Marco Rivera and Mike Wahle, and safety Darren Sharper — mainly for salary cap reasons this offseason.

- ▶ But since the birth of the cap (the 1993 collective bargaining agreement), the Packers have been very fortunate to avoid a salary-cap purge many NFL teams have endured over the last decade-plus.
- ▶ Green Bay still owns the league's best won-loss record (127-65-0, .661) since the 1993 CBA.
- ▶ The Packers haven't had a losing season since 1991, the longest active stretch in the NFL.

PASS-RUSH PEDIGREE: Packers defensive ends coach Bob Sanders tutored former Titans linemen Kevin Carter and Jevon Kearse at the University of Florida. He now is working with another Pro Bowler, Kaber Gbaja-Biamila.

- ▶ Entering his 30th season in the coaching profession, Sanders spent 11 years at Florida. During that span, in addition to Carter and Kearse, he also coached Huey Richardson, another first-round draft choice.

COACHES CAPSULES

Mike Sherman: 55-31-0, .640, sixth NFL season, sixth with Packers

Jeff Fisher: 98-77-0, .560, 11th NFL season, 11th with Titans/Oilers

MIKE SHERMAN...Is in his sixth year as the Packers' 13th head coach.

- ▶ Since the 1993 collective bargaining agreement, teams have made 84 coaching changes and only Sherman's tenure has produced winning records in each of its first five seasons.
- ▶ In 2004, his team became only the ninth in NFL history to reach the playoffs after a 1-4 start.
- ▶ Has led the Packers to three straight division titles (2002-04) for only the fourth time in team history, joining Vince Lombardi's three-time winners of 1960-62 and 1965-67, along with the 1995-97 division champs of Mike Holmgren. This season will attempt to do what no Green Bay head coach ever has done: lead his team to a fourth consecutive division championship.
- ▶ First tenure with Packers came as tight ends/assistant offensive line coach over the 1997-98 seasons, following 16 years as an assistant in the college ranks; coached in Green Bay's Super Bowl XXXII loss to Denver.
- ▶ In 2004 became the second-fastest head coach in team history to reach 50 career victories, doing so in his 78th contest; only Lombardi, with 50 wins in 66 games, did so quicker.
- ▶ Is 6-0 against teams in the Super Bowl the previous season.

JEFF FISHER...Officially became the franchise's 15th head coach in January 1995, after closing his first campaign with the Oilers as head coach/defensive coordinator (replaced Jack Pardee in November 1994).

- ▶ Holds the franchise mark with 98 wins over his 10-year coaching career and ranks third among NFL head coaches (Tony Dungy, Andy Reid) with 61 victories since 1999.
- ▶ Last year he became the fourth youngest coach (46) since 1960 to reach 90 regular-season victories (faster than all but John Madden, Don Shula and Bill Cowher).
- ▶ Over the last six seasons, Fisher has led the Titans to four playoff appearances, two AFC Championship Games, two division titles and a berth in Super Bowl XXXIV.
- ▶ Drafted by Chicago in 1981, he spent five seasons as a cornerback and kick returner for the Bears (1981-85). Assisted Buddy Ryan in Bears' 1985 Super Bowl championship season after being placed on injured reserve with ankle injury.

THE PACKERS-TITANS SERIES: During regular-season play, these clubs have met nine times. With a 48-27 win at Lambeau Field last year, Tennessee gained a 5-4 lead in the all-time series.

Two years after he co-founded the Packers with Curly Lambeau, George Calhoun began writing a piece called The Dope Sheet, which served as the official press release and game program from 1921-24.



- ▶ At Lambeau Field, the Titans franchise has won four of five all-time regular-season games. Only the Chiefs (3-0) and Jaguars (1-0) own a better franchise winning percentage in Green Bay than the Titans/Oilers (4-1, .800).
- ▶ Ironically however, the Packers have enjoyed much more success against the Titans/Oilers on the road. Green Bay is undefeated in the city of Houston, with three wins there over the Oilers and a 2004 victory over the Texans. The Packers dropped their only regular-season game in Tennessee, a 26-20 setback in 2001.
- ▶ Since the franchise moved to Tennessee in 1997, Green Bay has lost two of three contests. Their only win was in 1998 at snowy Lambeau Field, the last Green Bay game for Reggie White and Mike Holmgren.
- ▶ Dan Devine launched the all-time series with a pivotal 23-10 win over Dan Pastorini's Oilers at the Astrodome in 1972. The victory helped keep the Packers in line for an eventual NFC Central title.

NOTABLE CONNECTIONS: Brett Favre and Steve McNair are virtual neighbors in Hattiesburg, Miss.; the Pro Bowl quarterbacks also share the same agent, Bus Cook...Signed as a non-drafted linebacker by Bum Phillips, Packers General Manager Ted Thompson was one of the most durable players in franchise annals, playing in 146 of a possible 147 games...Tennessee wide receivers coach Ray Sherman held the same role in Green Bay from 2000-04...Safety Arturo Freeman spent the first half of the 2005 preseason in Green Bay...Punter/kicker Craig Hentrich owns the Packers' franchise records for gross average in a season (45.0, 1997) and a career (42.8, 1994-97)...Titans safeties and nickel backs coach Chuck Cecil was a fourth-round Green Bay draft pick and roamed the Packers secondary from 1988-92...Both defensive coordinators, Tennessee's Jim Schwartz and Green Bay's Jim Bates, were on Bill Belichick's Cleveland Browns staff in 1995...Titans cornerback Tony Beckham played collegiately at Wisconsin-Stout...Green Bay offensive line coach Larry Beightol coached under Fisher on the 1995 Oilers staff.

LAST MEETING: Oct. 11, 2004, Lambeau Field; Titans won, 48-27.

- ▶ Chris Brown's 148 yards and two touchdowns rushing helped the Titans to a decisive win over the Packers (1-4). Tennessee scored more points than any visiting team at Lambeau Field.
- ▶ Tennessee (2-3) halted a three-game losing streak and extended the Packers to their fourth straight loss; it marked Green Bay's first four-game slide since 1991 and its first 0-3 start at home in 16 years.
- ▶ The Titans posted points on five of their first six drives. Brown scored on the first two series, from 37 and 29 yards out.
- ▶ The Packers had six turnovers, including four in the second half. The Titans didn't turn the ball over at all.
- ▶ Steve McNair overcame chest and ankle injuries that had sidelined him the previous week. He threw two TD passes, an 11-yarder to Eddie Berlin and a 14-yarder to Troy Fleming.
- ▶ Brett Favre extended his NFL record with a 213th straight start, after he sustained a concussion the week before against the Giants. The quarterback also played shortly after the death of his 24-year-old brother-in-law.

LAST MEETING, TENNESSEE: Dec. 16, 2001, Adelphia Coliseum, Nashville; Titans won, 26-20. The loss ultimately cost the Packers the final NFC Central title. Despite handing Chicago (13-3) two of its three defeats that year, the Packers (12-4) settled for a Wild Card berth.

- ▶ Tennessee gave Mike Sherman one of four career losses Dec. 1 and later; the others were Dec. 29, 2002, at N.Y. Jets; Dec. 5, 2004, at Philadelphia; and Dec. 19, 2004, vs. Jacksonville. Sherman is 20-4 overall in that late-season period.
- ▶ Steve McNair threw for two TDs and 283 yards, and Skip Hicks added 142 yards on the ground.
- ▶ Minus four injured starters, the Green Bay defense was led by Vonnie Holliday (two sacks, two fumble recoveries, one forced fumble).
- ▶ Ryan Longwell tied a franchise record with a 54-yard field goal.

PRO BOWL TALENT: Thursday's broadcast booths will include 10 combined Pro Bowl selections.

- ▶ Tennessee's broadcast team includes former tailback Eddie George (television, four Pro Bowls) and former tight end Frank Wycheck (radio, two).
- ▶ Green Bay's airwaves include former defensive lineman Bill Maas (television, two) and former center Larry McCarren (radio, two).

REPORTS OF THEIR DEMISE WERE GREATLY EXAGGERATED: With Carolina and Buffalo attracting much of the spotlight, the Packers in 2004 quietly overcame a difficult start to earn a playoff berth. Green Bay became the ninth NFL team to reach the postseason after a 1-4 start, and the 13th team to earn a playoff berth after beginning with one or fewer wins after five games.

LAST WEEK (packers.com): New England capitalized on four Packers turnovers and rolled to a 27-3 win in front of 69,501 fans at Lambeau Field Friday night.

- On a night that featured two interceptions from Brett Favre, an interception from Aaron Rodgers, an Ahman Green fumble, eight first half penalties and a downpour that drenched the field in the second half, the Packers were eager to move on.
- "We were somewhat tentative and made too many mental mistakes," full-back William Henderson said. "When you get a chance to play against the best, you go out there and you represent yourself to your best ability, and I know we didn't do that tonight."
- The Packers repeated much of the same special teams miscues from their previous game at Buffalo. Patriots cornerback Ellis Hobbs set the tone by returning the opening kickoff 43 yards into Green Bay territory. The Patriots then used the short field for a four play, 41-yard drive, culminating in a Corey Dillon 12-yard touchdown run.
- Preseason can account for some of the performance. With so many new players on the field, teams often have trouble creating the cohesion

essential for special teams success.

- "Covering kicks is a tough thing to do in the preseason," kicker Ryan Longwell said. "What you teach on the Power Point is so different than what you run full speed. We just made fundamental errors the last two weeks ... Obviously it's not to our standard."
- Special teams, however, did lead to the Packers' lone score. B.J. Sander punted 30 yards to the Patriots 15-yard line. When New England's Tyrone Poole let the ball carom off his back, Green Bay's Chris Johnson astutely recovered the muff at the 8-yard line to set up a Longwell field goal. But that was one of few mistakes by the Patriots all night.
- The Packers did show some positive signs. They limited Tom Brady and the Patriots to 159 yards passing while New England often started with good field position. Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila sacked Brady, and Sherman liked how physical the defense played and the way defenders burst off the line of scrimmage.
- "I saw some good things on defense," Sherman said. "Were we perfect? No, far from it."
- The Packers struggled more on offense than defense. Even Favre, who had posted a blistering 140.6 quarterback rating in two games, finished 9 of 21 for 69 yards and two interceptions. But the Packers do have time to address their problems.
- "This is the preseason," Sherman said. "We'll get fixed what needs to get fixed, and hopefully this game will be a distant memory four weeks from now."

ROSTER DATES: Aug. 30 — Reduction to 65 players; Sept. 3 — Reduction to 53 players; Sept. 4 — Teams may establish a practice squad of eight players after 11 a.m. CDT. The Packers have 11 roster exemptions.
