FIRST PRESEASON GAME

PRESEASON KICKS OFF IN PRIME TIME

The 88th season of Green Bay Packers football kicks off at Lambeau Field on *Monday Night Football* as the Cincinnati Bengals come to town for a preseason contest.

- ▶ Opening up the preseason in prime time seems fitting for a team that has dealt with the national spotlight for the past couple of weeks. It is the first of five national television appearances on the 2008 schedule.
- ▶ After 15 practices since opening training camp July 28, including the 'Family Night' intra-squad scrimmage this past Sunday, Green Bay lines up against an opponent for the first time since the NFC Championship Game on Jan. 20.
- ▶ Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**, entering his third season at the helm, leads a team that hopes to build upon the progress it achieved last season when the team matched a franchise record with 13 regular-season wins. Nearly all core players return from a team that was an overtime away from a Super Bowl berth.
- ▶ Typically, starters don't play more than a few series in the first preseason game of the slate. Where the team is injury-wise will be a determining factor, as will the need to see many guys in game action for the first time. The first NFL-mandated roster cut, to 75 players, is Tuesday, Aug. 26.
- ▶ The Packers and Bengals will meet for the 16th time in preseason action. They last played in 2006, also on ESPN's *Monday Night Football*.

BISHOP'S CHARITIES GAME

Monday night marks another Green Bay preseason tradition: the Bishop's Charities Game. It was first played in 1961 after **Vince Lombardi** was approached by the Diocese of Green Bay about playing a charitable contest in Green Bay (the Shrine contest was a fixture in Milwaukee).

- ▶ For more than 30 years, the church handled much of the game's business-related tasks, including game program and advertising sales, using a network of volunteers covering 14 Northeastern Wisconsin counties. The Packers assumed many of those tasks in 1994.
- ▶ The series enjoys its 48th contest on Monday and has raised approximately \$3.4 million.
- ▶ The Packers are 24-22-1 all-time in the series and look to end a five-game losing streak in the annual contest.

WHAT A WEEK AT 1265

The opening week of training camp didn't lack for storylines, and neither should the coming one.

- ▶ The Packers completed nine practices, six in full pads, during the first week of camp. Included in that group was the eighth annual 'Family Night' scrimmage.
- ▶ Just before the scrimmage, the team announced the signing of **Ryan Grant**, who enjoyed one of the best second halves of any running back in '07. Grant was present at every practice in the offseason, but did not participate in the practices.
- ▶ Also activated to the 80-man roster on Monday was quarterback **Brett Favre**. Favre had been on the reserve/retired list since April 25.
- ▶ The practice plan for both Favre and Grant will most likely be determined

by the staff on Monday. Their availability for the game is unknown.

WITH THE CALL

ESPN enters its third season as host of the most successful series in sports television history, *Monday Night Football*. Play-by-play man **Mike Tirico** again is joined by analysts **Ron Jaworski** and **Tony Kornheiser**.

- ▶ With three regular-season contests on *MNF*, Green Bay appears on the prime-time stage for a 16th consecutive season, the NFC's longest appearance streak. Only Denver (17, 1992-2008) has appeared on *MNF* for more consecutive seasons.
- ▶ The contest also will air as a simulcast locally on WBAY (Ch. 2) in Green Bay and WISN (Ch. 12) in Milwaukee.
- ▶ Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since 1929, heads up the 56-station Packers Radio Network, with Wayne Larrivee (play-by-play) and two-time Packers Pro Bowler Larry McCarren (color) calling the action. The duo enter their 10th season of broadcasts together across the Packers Radio Network, which covers 47 markets in six states.

PACKERS NEWS OF THE WEEK

MCCARTHY CALLS FAMILY NIGHT 'BEST WORK YET'

Head Coach Mike McCarthy reiterated to the media Sunday night that 'Family Night' is a scrimmage, so it's hard to jump to any conclusions.

- ▶ "It's a scrimmage," McCarthy said. "It's nice to stand up here and say when the offense scores four touchdowns in a scrimmage, 'Boy, we really feel good about it'. It goes both ways. It's never as good as you think it is and it's usually not as bad as you think it is. But I'll just say this, it's quality film."
- ▶ What that film will show them is just how well many of their players performed under the bright lights for the first time, more specifically 56,600 of them at Lambeau Field. That is why, McCarthy says, 'Family Night' is so valuable.
- ▶ "This is the training environment that we train in. You go to any other scrimmage around the league and there is 10 or 15,000. To go out there and put our players under the lights and see how our young players respond to that environment, it's incredible. This is the best work that we've had all year in training camp and this will be a great learning tool, and we'll take full advantage of it. I can promise you that."
- ▶ All three offensive units struggled in the passing game, as receivers and quarterbacks work on getting the timing down.
- ▶ "I think what happened in the passing game could be as much in the front end as on the back end, as far as the route running and things like that," McCarthy stated.
- ▶ McCarthy did salute both **Brandon Jackson** and **Vernand Morency** for their production in the run game. Both had their moments Sunday (Jackson rushed for 28 yards and a TD on five carries, while Morency took his sole carry for 29 yards) after gaining the coach's praise throughout the first week.
- ▶ The coach had more praise for the defense, which seemed to enjoy a solid night along the line against the run and a number of passes defended by the secondary.
- ▶ "I thought the defense flew around, I thought they got off blocks," the coach said. "You could see that inside, **Johnny Jolly**, just the way he started that second series, the 2 offense versus the number 1 defense, I think he had the first two, possibly three tackles, getting off blocks. As a whole, I thought their production was outstanding. I really thought they flew to the ball. It looked to me, from not studying it, it looked like they did a good job with the bump at the line of scrimmage, disrupting the routes. I thought the defense had a very good night."



SECONDARY STANDS OUT

Throughout the preseason, McCarthy has talked about the defense being the starting point and common thread that will run through the team in 2008, and on Sunday night, several members of the secondary seemed to take the first major step toward that goal.

- ▶ Rookie corner **Pat Lee** led the team with four passes defended, including a nice play to break up an **Aaron Rodgers** pass intended for **Greg Jennings** to stop the first-team offense on its second drive and force a three-and-out. Then he put the finishing touches on another drive when he broke up a pass by Rodgers to **James Jones** on fourth down.
- ▶ Cornerback **Tramon Williams**, who missed a good part of practice last week with a hip flexor injury, was back on the field and posted two

pass breakups, both on third-down plays. The first came when he broke up a Rodgers pass intended for Driver and on the next drive he deflected a **Brian Brohm** pass thrown to rookie wide receiver **Jordy Nelson**.

- ▶ Safety **Charlie Peprah**, who had a number of loud hits in the first week of camp, made his presence felt with three tackles and a pass breakup, as well as one of the bigger hits of the night. On the second drive of the scrimmage, Rodgers rolled out to his right and tried to connect with wide receiver **Ruvell Martin**, but was drilled by Peprah after getting his hands on the ball. Fellow safety **Aaron Rouse** also recorded the lone takeaway of the night, intercepting a Rodgers pass to end a two-minute drill.

INJURY REPORT

McCarthy said the most important statistic of the scrimmage was that the team came away injury-free.

- ▶ The cornerback duo of **Charles Woodson** and **Al Harris** were healthy scratches Sunday. With a healthy week, both should see action versus Cincinnati.

- ▶ Another healthy scratch was running back **Ryan Grant**. The second-year player had signed his contract just hours before the scrimmage and will get his first day of practice Tuesday.

- ▶ Other players who did not suit up due to injury were defensive tackles **Justin Harrell** (back) and **Ryan Pickett** (hamstring), running back **DeShawn Wynn** (concussion), cornerback **Condrew Allen** (knee), center **Scott Wells** (trunk) and defensive end **Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila** (knee). The extent to which each plays next Monday night will be

determined in the coming days.

ROSTER MOVES

In order to make room on the roster for Grant, the Packers waived long snapper **Thomas Gafford**.

- ▶ That gives rookie **J.J. Jansen** the inside track on the long snapper duties. Jansen served as the long snapper at Notre Dame for the past three seasons.
- ▶ With the Packers activating quarterback **Brett Favre** to the 80-man roster, the placed cornerback **Condrew Allen** on injured reserve.

ROOKIES JUMP RIGHT IN

With most of last year's team still intact, the rookie class of 2008 will have to make a strong impact to earn early playing time in Green Bay.

- ▶ McCarthy did praise the group as a whole Friday, noting that it's still very early in the maturation process as they get acclimated to being NFL players.

- ▶ "I really like what I've seen from Patrick (Lee)," McCarthy said. "I think he's been consistent, and his ability to burst on a football, he's someone that when you talk about football players when they put their pads on and that's what it's supposed to look like. I thought **Brian Brohm** has had some good practices. **Matt Flynn** continues to get better. **Josh Sitton** has done a nice job up front. He has showed up with the pads on. Very pleased with the impact they have made to our team, as far as a whole, giving us the ability to practice at the high level of efficiency that we've been able to do this early in camp."

MIKE MCCARTHY...Is in third year as the Packers' 14th head coach.

- ▶ Was named Packers head coach on Jan. 12, 2006, his first head coaching job after 13 years as an NFL assistant.
- ▶ Honored as the 2007 Motorola NFL Coach of the Year and NFL Alumni Coach of the Year.
- ▶ Became the first Packers coach since Vince Lombardi to lead the team to a championship game in his second season.
- ▶ Tied franchise record for most victories by a coach in his first two seasons (21).

MARVIN LEWIS...Is in sixth year as the Bengals' ninth head coach.

- ▶ Only Paul Brown and Sam Wyche have had longer tenures or more career victories as Cincinnati coach.
- ▶ Last year was the club's first losing season (7-9) under his watch.
- ▶ In 2005, led the Bengals to the playoffs for the first time since 1990, going 11-5 and losing in the AFC Wild Card Game to eventual Super Bowl champion Pittsburgh.
- ▶ Was named Rookie Coach of the Year by *Football Digest* in 2003.

THE PACKERS-BENGALS SERIES

The clubs have met 10 times, splitting the contests.

- ▶ Prior to 2005, the Packers owned a three-game winning streak in the series (24-23 in 1992 and 24-10 in 1995, both in Green Bay, and 13-6 in 1998 at Cincinnati). That 1998 meeting is the Packers' lone win in Cincinnati in franchise history.
- ▶ The series launched at Lambeau Field in 1971, when the legendary Paul Brown was head coach of the Bengals, a team he had founded three years earlier as a member of the then American Football League. The Packers got off to a winning start in the rivalry, posting a 20-17 victory in their first meeting, with a Lou Michaels field goal providing the victory margin.
- ▶ Perhaps the most memorable game in the series came in 1992 when Brett Favre, summoned to replace an injured Don Majkowski at quarterback in the first quarter, proceeded to direct the Packers to an electrifying, 24-23 come-from-behind victory, forged when he hit wide receiver Kitrick Taylor with a 35-yard scoring pass as only 13 seconds remained in the game. Chris Jacke's subsequent PAT settled the issue.

NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

Lewis and McCarthy were both assistant coaches at the University of Pittsburgh in 1990 and 1991...Ohio natives include LB A.J. Hawk (Centerville), G Ryan Keenan (Lakewood), CB Charles Woodson (Fremont) and RB DeShawn Wynn (Cincinnati)...Ohio State products include Hawk and DT Ryan Pickett...Bengals WR Antonio Chatman played three seasons for the Packers (2003-05)...Bengals rookie RB James Johnson and Packers rookie WR Jordy Nelson were teammates at Kansas State...Bengals RB Kenny Irons and Packers CB Pat Lee were teammates at Auburn...Bengals WRs Chad Johnson and T.J. Houshmandzadeh and Packers LB Nick Barnett all played one season together at Oregon State (2000)...Bengals QB coach Ken Zampese was an offensive quality control assistant for the Packers in 1999, the same year McCarthy was the team's QB coach...Bengals WR coach Mike Sheppard was New Orleans QB coach for three seasons (2002-04) during the time McCarthy was the Saints offensive coordinator, and then Sheppard took over as offensive coordinator in 2005 when McCarthy left for San Francisco...Packers special teams coordinator Mike Stock was a Bengals assistant coach for five years (1987-91)...Bengals defensive line coach Jay Hayes was an assistant coach at Wisconsin from 1995-98...Packers assistant public relations director Sarah Quick is a native of Middletown, Ohio, and graduated from Ursuline Academy.

INDIVIDUALLY VS. BENGALS

In the 2005 meeting in Cincinnati, LB Nick Barnett set a career high with 15 solo tackles, and one of CB Al Harris' three career sacks came against Carson Palmer in that game.

LAST MEETING, REGULAR SEASON

Oct. 30, 2005, at Paul Brown Stadium; Bengals won, 21-14.

- ▶ In one of the strangest endings to any game, the Packers drove from deep in their own territory in the final minute with the help of a 48-yard pass interference penalty. Going without a huddle against a reeling defense, the Packers had a play blown dead from the Bengals' 28 when a fan jumped out of the stands and ran onto the field. The man grabbed the ball out of Favre's hand and eluded security, which needed several minutes to tackle and arrest him. The long delay broke the Packers' momentum, Favre was sacked on the next play and then threw a desperation pass from beyond the line of scrimmage on the final snap.
- ▶ Favre passed John Elway for second all-time in passing attempts and passing yards but threw a regular-season high five interceptions. His touchdown pass to Bubba Franks, following an Ahmad Carroll interception and 88-yard drive, pulled the Packers within a touchdown with 3:11 left in the fourth quarter.
- ▶ Odell Thurman's second interception, off a tip by Deltha O'Neal, came one play before Carson Palmer's 27-yard TD pass to Jeremi Johnson, giving the Bengals a 21-7 lead. Palmer threw for three TDs on the day.

LAST MEETING, PRESEASON

Aug. 28, 2006, at Paul Brown Stadium; Bengals won, 48-17.

- ▶ In a preseason Monday night contest, the Bengals dominated, scoring 31 straight points to open the game, including three TD passes from Palmer.
- ▶ Donald Driver (four catches, 72 yards) finally got the Packers on the board with a 17-yard TD late in the second quarter.
- ▶ Houshmandzadeh finished with five catches for 96 yards and a TD for Cincinnati.



PACKERS TEAM NOTES

STATEMENT BY PACKERS PRESIDENT/CEO MARK MURPHY

- ▶ Sixteen years after Brett Favre came to the Packers, he is returning for a seventeenth season. He has had a great career with our organization and although we built this year around the assumption that Brett meant what he said about retiring, Brett is coming back. We will welcome him back and turn this situation to our advantage.
- ▶ Frankly, Brett's change of mind put us in a very difficult spot. We now will revise many actions and assumptions about our long-term future, all predicated on Brett's decision last March to retire. As a result of his decision, we invested considerably in a new and different future without Brett and we were obviously moving in that direction. That's why this wasn't easy. Having crossed the Rubicon once when Brett decided to retire, it's very difficult to reorient our plans and cross it again in the opposite direction – but we'll put this to our advantage.
- ▶ Brett will be in camp tomorrow. Although there has been uncertainty regarding Brett's return, Ted Thompson and Coach McCarthy had previously discussed this and have had a plan in place. Coach McCarthy will talk to the team and the quarterbacks about the plan moving forward, and after he has done that we will share it publicly.
- ▶ No matter what, I look forward to another successful season for the Packers and our fans. This has been a tough situation, but the Packers will make the most of it.

ABOUT THE OFFSEASON

McCarthy let everyone know at the annual Packers Shareholders meeting on July 24 just how he felt about the team's progress through the offseason conditioning program, mini-camps and OTAs.

- ▶ "I'm not trying to throw out some positive BS, but we had a great off-season," McCarthy said at the meeting.
- ▶ The team did slightly alter its offseason structure, holding the mandatory mini-camp at the end of the offseason in mid-June as opposed to sandwiching it between voluntary OTAs as it had in prior offseasons.
- ▶ "I think it's the best offseason that we've had to date (with) the individual time that the players spent with the coaches, the commitment to the off-season program and the strength and conditioning all the way through the OTAs," McCarthy said after the final mini-camp June 19.
- ▶ "I really like the way our offseason came to a conclusion here with the mini-camp at the end. It's an exciting time for us. We felt like we had the opportunity to improve through this learning process because that's really what this time of year is. I liked the way the rookies jumped in there and picked things up. It puts us in a very good position to start off camp healthy and ready to go."
- ▶ McCarthy has always stressed that he is not a believer in false confidence. Coming off the offseason, it seems he has real confidence in the 2008 Packers. "As far as our roster, the talent level on our depth chart board, it's the best that it has looked since I've been here, especially at this time of year. The amount of work that we were able to get done

from March until today has been the most productive that we've been able to get done in my three years. We're trying to win every single football game, and this team has the ability to be something special and we felt that way coming off our offseason last year. We felt good about the direction we were going. I think our challenges are going to be a lot different this year. The obstacles that we're going to have to get over are going to be a lot different."

PACKERS TEAM NOTES

POSITION BATTLES HEATING UP

With nearly every player back from a year ago, and a talented bunch of newcomers added to the mix, Packers training camp 2008 appears to be the most competitive in recent memory.

- ▶ General Manager **Ted Thompson** knows all about training camp battles. Signed as a non-drafted free agent linebacker by the Houston Oilers, Thompson annually held off younger competition brought in by Bum Phillips during his 10-year career.
- ▶ Nothing attracts attention and headlines during training camp like the fight for playing time. Certainly with the arrival of Brett Favre, the quarterback position will be under the most scrutiny. McCarthy said he must first talk to Favre, the other quarterbacks and the team before announcing any decisions.
- ▶ Here are the other positional battles that have been drawing the most interest through the first week of camp:

LEFT GUARD

- ▶ Third-year pro **Daryn Colledge** has taken more reps with the No. 1 offense, but he must hold off a strong charge from second-year player **Allen Barbre**, who has received some reps with the first-team offense. A Division II Missouri Southern State product, Barbre saw action in seven games as a rookie last season, and his uncanny athletic ability for an offensive lineman (he played gunner on his college punt coverage team) makes him an ideal fit for the zone-blocking scheme. Colledge, with 28 career starts, has the edge in experience.

ALONG THE OUTSIDE

- ▶ Few players on the football field can match the intensity of outside linebacker **Brady Poppinga**, who started at SAM linebacker for Green Bay the past two seasons. A defensive end at BYU, he has natural pass-rush instincts and has taken some occasional reps at defensive end during the first week of camp. However, the team did sign **Brandon Chillar** from St. Louis, who comes in advertised as a top cover man. Look for defensive coordinator **Bob Sanders** to try out some experiments - such as Poppinga as a situational defensive end - during the preseason. Will one linebacker win the job, or will the two platooned throughout the year? Either way, count on both playing key roles on special teams.

NICKEL BACK

- ▶ The third cornerback on an NFL team gets enough reps to be considered a "12th" defensive starter. **Jarrett Bush** held that job at the beginning of '07 before **Tramon Williams** came on strong at the end of the season. While Williams was forced out of some early training camp practices with a hip injury, he recovered to have a nice showing in the 'Family Night' scrimmage and appears to have the inside track on the job. **Will Blackmon** proved to be an impact player on special teams, but coaches are monitoring his reps in the hopes that he will be injury free this coming season. Where does second-round pick **Pat Lee** fit in? With a solid performance in his first live action, he certainly can't be counted out of the nickel competition just yet. With a bevy of talent at wide receiver, this group has been tested early and often in practice.

THE NFL'S MOST POPULAR PRACTICE

The eighth edition of the Packers' 'Family Night' scrimmage once again was a success, selling every available seat in the Lambeau Field bowl for the fifth consecutive season.

- ▶ Fans had to wait nearly an hour-and-a-half while thunderstorms delayed the festivities. That didn't stop the 56,600 in attendance from getting their first look at the 2008 squad.
- ▶ One of the area's biggest summer attractions, tickets are priced at just \$8. Families also enjoyed a spectacular fireworks display at the conclusion of the scrimmage.

PACKERS TEAM NOTES

2008 SCHEDULE AT A GLANCE

The Green Bay Packers' 2008 campaign is highlighted by four prime-time contests, including a nationally-televised home-opening tilt against the NFC North division rival Minnesota Vikings on ESPN's *Monday Night Football*. The Packers' 88th regular-season includes two additional Monday night games and a Sunday night game on NBC.

- In addition to the *MINF* home-opener, the Packers host Dallas Sept. 21 (NBC) and will travel for the final two prime-time contests – at New Orleans Nov. 24 (ESPN) and at Chicago Dec. 22 (ESPN).
- The Week 1 prime-time matchup marks the fourth time the club will open the season on Monday night. The Packers own a 3-0 record in previous Monday night opening games.
- The Packers own the NFC's longest active streak for seasons with a *MINF* appearance, with the '08 campaign marking the 16th straight season.
- The Week 3 Sunday night matchup with Dallas marks the Packers' third consecutive season for a prime-time slot on NBC and is the second-straight season the team will meet the Cowboys in prime time.
- For the first time in club history, the first two games contested at Lambeau Field will be in prime time.
- The 2008 slate includes six playoff teams from a year ago (Dallas, Seattle, Tampa Bay, Indianapolis, Jacksonville and Tennessee).
- The Packers play five of the six postseason teams from a year ago in the first eight games, with only one postseason team from '07 scheduled in the second half of the season.
- An Oct. 12 tilt at Seattle pits the Packers against former coach Mike Holmgren and marks a rematch of the NFC Divisional Playoff matchup in January when the Packers topped the Seahawks, 42-20, in Green Bay.
- The Packers will see the Tennessee Titans twice during the '08 campaign – a preseason contest at Lambeau Field for the Midwest Shrine Game (Aug. 28) and a Week 9 trip to Nashville, the first regular-season trip to Tennessee for the Packers since the '01 season.
- Green Bay will travel to New Orleans for the third of four prime-time games in Week 12. The Packers last traveled to the Superdome in 2002. The Nov. 24 *MINF* game will be head coach Mike McCarthy's first return to the Superdome since serving as the Saints' offensive coordinator from 2000-04.
- The Houston Texans will make that franchise's first trip to Lambeau Field for a Dec. 7 matchup.
- For the fifth consecutive season, the Packers will celebrate Christmas with NFC North foes – a trip to Chicago (Dec. 22) and a home tilt against Detroit (Dec. 28) mark the final regular-season matchups.
- *Monday Night Football* and the Packers roll into Chicago for Green Bay's third Monday night game against the Bears in Week 16. No two NFL teams have met on the gridiron more than the Packers and Bears. The 2008 edition of the series marks the 177th overall meeting.
- The last time the Packers had four prime-time games on the schedule was in 2005. That year also marks the last time that the Packers hosted a *Monday Night Football* contest, also against the Vikings.
- The Packers have 10 games with noon start times. Five of the noon start times beginning with Week 11 are subject to change due to NFL flexible scheduling. The '07 season saw 13 games with noon kickoffs.

COACHING INTERNS

The Packers annually welcome coaching interns as part of the NFL's Minority Coaching Program. This year's group includes:

- **Ricky Brumfield**, wide receivers coach at Fairmont State. This is his third year in the NFL's program, and he will assist the offense.
- **John Rushing**, cornerbacks coach at Utah State. He coached current Packers cornerback Jarrett Bush, and will assist the defense.

- **Curtis Fuller**, who played four seasons (2001-04) in the NFL, including two seasons (2003-04) in Green Bay. He will assist the defense.
- All three will remain with the team through the first preseason game.

TRAINING CAMP MEDIA INFORMATION & POLICIES

TED THOMPSON INTERVIEWS (PRESEASON)

During training camp, General Manager Ted Thompson will be available for group interviews in the Media Auditorium once per week. These sessions are meant to meet the needs of electronic media, along with assisting print media. As needed, primary beat writers may continue to schedule one-on-one interviews at other times, over the telephone through Jeanne Bruette. All other requests should be directed to Jeff Blumb at 920/569-7210.

- Thompson will be available in the Media Auditorium on the following dates: Aug. 6 - 11:30 a.m., Aug. 13 - 2 p.m., Aug. 19 - 10 a.m., Aug. 25 - 10 a.m.

MIKE MCCARTHY PRESS CONFERENCES

- During training camp, the coach generally will be available on the field once per day, following the first practice. On days with two practices, this press conference will take place following the morning session.
- He also has agreed to make himself available for no more than five minutes following the evening practice for informational purposes. This brief evening session is not intended to be recorded for broadcast.
- On days with one practice, this press conference will take place on the field following the 2 p.m. session.
- One-on-one interviews with McCarthy should be arranged through Jeff Blumb (920/569-7210).

PLAYER INTERVIEWS

During training camp, the team's locker room will open once per day for 30 minutes, following the first practice. On days with two practices, this availability will take place following the morning session, from approximately 10:45-11:15 a.m. On days with one practice, this availability will take place following the 2 p.m. session, from approximately 4:45-5:15 p.m. There will be no player availability following night practices.

- At the conclusion of all games, the locker room will be opened following the NFL's standard "cooling off" period.
- Any requests to interview players other than at the aforementioned times should be directed to a member of the Packers' P.R. department.

ASSISTANT COACH AVAILABILITY

All interviews by request only, through the P.R. department

- During training camp, assistants will be available on the field – for both print and electronic media, upon request – following the day's first practice, in-person, on the following days: Aug. 6 (all assistants), Aug. 8 (coordinators only), Aug. 13 (all assistants at 4:30 p.m., coaches' hallway), Aug. 19 (all assistants) and Aug. 25 (all assistants).
- Following games, coordinators will be available upon request, provided the request is made through the P.R. department (preferably by the 2-minute warning and no later than the time the locker room opens to media).
- Coordinators – Joe Philbin (offense), Bob Sanders (defense) and Mike Stock (special teams) – will continue to serve as primary spokesmen in their respective areas.
- However, position coaches are available for questions on specific players and the position group only. Broader interview topics need to be directed to the respective coordinator.
- Assistant coaches also are available for interviews on more personal subjects, such as Winston Moss on his NFL playing career.
- No assistant coach should be contacted directly by telephone (at his desk, home or on his cell phone), or by e-mail. All interviews must be arranged through the P.R. department.
- Sarah Quick (920/569-7213) serves as the primary contact for assistant coaches. In her absence, feel free to contact either Adam Woullard (920/569-7214) or Rob Crane (920/569-7218).

PRACTICE ACCESS

During training camp, practices are open in their entirety to credentialed media. However, photography may not be allowed for some periods at the direction of the coaching staff.

VIDEO/PHOTO POLICIES

2008 NFL NON-GAME ONLINE CONTENT POLICY

- Accredited organizations may distribute online non-game audio and video content, including interviews, press conferences and team practices at NFL venues, acquired as a result of credentialed access ("Game Information") to games or club/league facilities provided that such distribution:
 - is 90 seconds maximum per day (180 seconds maximum in two-team markets -- 90 seconds per team);
 - may not be "archived" (i.e., made available for on-demand public access) for more than 24 hours;
 - appears in an editorial context only (no sponsorship, merchandising or advertising integrated with or around the content);
 - is not posted live, and is accompanied by links back to NFL.com and to the club web site, www.packers.com in this instance.
- The 90-second limit does not include video/audio material that is comprised entirely of a credentialed media employee providing commentary or analysis ("Talking Head" reporting), including pre- or post-game stand-up material shot on the field or other facility location.
- While a game is in progress, any forms of accounts of the game must be sufficiently time-delayed and limited in amount (e.g., score updates with detail given only in quarterly game updates, fewer than 10 photographs during the game) so that the Accredited Organization's game coverage cannot be used as a substitute for, or otherwise approximate, authorized play-by-play accounts.

REMINDER, INJURY FOOTAGE POLICY

Again this season, the Packers respectfully ask all photographers (video and still) to follow guidelines related to shooting injured players.

- The policy is simply this: No injury footage except what is approved by the public relations department (please check with one of several members of the staff before filming an injury situation).
- Photographers are asked to avoid filming, photographing, printing and/or airing any shots of *any* injury situation, while the injury occurs, while trainers attend to and treat the injured player, and while the player is leaving the field, either on his own or with aid. This includes minor injuries.
- Because injury footage is important to media coverage, the team will allow shots of players after they've been treated. For instance, cameras are allowed to shoot a player on the sideline with ice on his knee, after trainers have left.
- However, cameras are not allowed to film a player on crutches, either on the field or in the locker room.
- The team feels strongly about preserving its players' dignity and ensuring opponents aren't gaining even the slightest competitive advantage.
- Since the Lindy Infante era, the team has asked photographers to avoid shooting players in serious-injury situations at practice.
- If outlets choose not to respect this policy — or any other policy — the team will have no choice but to consider limiting access to the field and/or locker room.



TRAINING CAMP MEDIA INFORMATION & POLICIES

ADDITIONAL VIDEO/PHOTO GUIDELINES

- ▶ Filming or relaying messages/information on closed-circuit televisions throughout the building, including the locker room, is strictly prohibited.
- ▶ Media are allowed to shoot most segments of practice during training camp. A public relations representative will communicate those segments when shooting is not allowed.
- ▶ Shots that require members of the media to be in a kneeling position with camera resting on the ground are strongly discouraged.
- ▶ No tripods are allowed during practice.

OTHER POLICIES & INFORMATION

PRIVATE TEAM COMMUNICATION

The Packers ask all media, print and electronic, to disdain from reporting and/or recording/filming any team communication meant solely for the team.

- ▶ This includes the post-practice team huddle, in which McCarthy addresses his players. It also includes mid-practice and/or post-practice communication between any coach and his players, especially conversations of a reprimanding, negative nature.
- ▶ In general, reporting that the conversation took place is acceptable, just not the details of those conversations. Details are not to be relayed to the public either directly (through first-hand hearing), or indirectly (through interviews, even if the subject answers the question).
- ▶ If media has any question as to whether communication should be kept private, please contact the public relations department before writing or airing such conversations.

CELL PHONES

The team does not tolerate cell-phone distractions at practice. Please set all phones to off or vibrate. Any phone conversations should be conducted well away from the field, while lengthy conversations must be conducted outside of the practice gate. Most NFL teams have banned cell phones entirely from their practice fields.

BOUNDARIES

All practice guests, including members of the media, must remain within the boundaries established by the team. On Clarke Hinkle Field, do not stand on the thick yellow line.

MISCELLANEOUS

For their safety and the safety of Packers players, media are requested to adhere to the following:

- ▶ Any member of the media who does not have a credential will be asked to obtain one and sign the necessary waiver at the public relations office or practice field before gaining admittance.
- ▶ All items brought to practice (cameras, bags, equipment, etc.) should be stored against the wall or fence, away from the field, for safety reasons.
- ▶ **Food** is not allowed during practice. **Bottled drinks** are allowed, as long as they are stored in a personal bag against the wall, and consumed near the wall.
- ▶ Any equipment not stored should be held at all times; when avoiding oncoming action, it is important that anything in your possession moves as you move.
- ▶ When asked to move, media should move immediately.
- ▶ No players or coaches may be actively engaged in conversation or interviewed while practice is in progress.

PRACTICE CREDENTIAL INFORMATION

- ▶ Admittance will not be granted without a credential. No guests will be permitted to use media credentials, which are subject to revocation if used in that manner.
- ▶ All preseason practice sessions will be open to members of the media who cover the team on a regular basis, unless otherwise stipulated.
- ▶ All other media (news departments, etc.) must secure a practice field pass from the public relations department and sign the necessary waiver before attending practice. No exceptions can be made.
- ▶ Visiting media must receive authorization from the public relations department to attend practice.
- ▶ All members of the media are asked to contact the Packers' public relations department to obtain training camp credentials. Practice field (season-long photo ID and daily) credentials, required for all practice sessions, are not transferable and will be closely monitored.
- ▶ Under policy, members of the media (who have yet to do so) will need to sign a liability waiver before gaining access to the Packers' practices. They will be able to sign the waiver upon picking up their practice field credentials from Sarah Quick in the public relations department office.
- ▶ Members of the media are asked to e-mail their requests for practice field credentials to the public relations department's Sarah Quick (e-mail: quicks@packers.com) at least 24 hours in advance of the day (or days) on which they wish to cover practice.

INJURY INFORMATION

All information concerning player injuries will be issued by Head Coach Mike McCarthy. Please don't address injury questions to Ted Thompson.

SEASON GAME CREDENTIALS

The deadline to apply for 2008 season-long home game credentials was 5 p.m. Monday, July 28. The team also welcomed lists of individual road-game assignments, those planning to cover each away game, from sports directors and editors.

- ▶ Anyone who missed the deadline should submit their request ASAP on company letterhead for consideration to receive credentials on a game-by-game basis. Requests should be made to Sarah Quick, via e-mail (quicks@packers.com).

PUBLIC RELATIONS INTERNS
