THIRD PRESEASON GAME

GREEN BAY (0-2) at DENVER (1-1)

Friday, Aug. 22 • INVESCO Field at Mile High • 8 p.m. CDT

ON THE ROAD AGAIN – PACKERS HEAD TO DENVER

Green Bay travels to the mile-high city for a preseason contest against the Denver Broncos Friday night, its third preseason game in 12 days.

- ▶ The Packers come into their third exhibition contest with plenty to prove. The team struggled in all three phases against the 49ers Saturday night, a 34-6 defeat, and have just three practices this week to get things turned around.
- ▶ The Packers now stand at 0-2 for the first time in the preseason since 1993. But, it's also worth noting that preseason records do not stand for much. The Indianapolis Colts have lost 14 of their last 17 preseason contests, yet have rebounded after a slow start to win the AFC South title each time, as well as Super Bowl XLI.
- ▶ As is customary around the NFL, projected regular-season starters are expected to see their most action of the preseason in Week 3.
- ▶ Both units have seen multiple starters miss time due to injury this preseason, but will look to establish some momentum heading into the season opener Sept. 8.
- ▶ Green Bay will look to recapture some magic at INVESCO Field, the site of one of its most thrilling victories last season. In a Monday night contest last October, the Packers won on the first play from scrimmage in overtime – an 82-yard touchdown pass to **Greg Jennings**. For the first time in 10 tries, Green Bay beat the Broncos in Denver (1-5 regular season, 0-4 preseason).
- ▶ This will be the first preseason meeting between the clubs since 2001. Denver holds a 6-2-0 advantage in the preseason series.
- ▶ The Broncos defeated the Dallas Cowboys, 23-13, in Denver Saturday night. Denver lost its preseason opener at Houston, 19-16.



THIS WEEK'S GOAL: GET HEALTHY

The Packers played Saturday night without four key starters – Jennings and **Ryan Grant** on offense and **Ryan Pickett** and **A.J. Hawk** on defense.

- ▶ Also, the team was without a number of key backups, as eight other players did not dress. While it was an improvement over the first preseason game (seven starters out), the team must get back to practicing and playing at full strength.
- ▶ Of the four starters missing in action Saturday night, Grant and Jennings are the most likely to see action Friday in Denver. Grant has been bothered by a hamstring injury, while Jennings has been troubled by a knee injury. Jennings (12 TDs) and Grant (8) finished Nos. 1 and 2 last season in touchdowns for Green Bay last season, so their importance to the first-unit offense is obvious.
- ▶ Hawk suffered a chest injury against the Bengals in the preseason opener, while Pickett has spent all of camp on the Physically Unable to Perform (PUP) list with a hamstring issue. Their status for Friday will be determined closer to game time.
- ▶ A number of other players on the Green Bay roster would be welcome additions back on the field, especially for the defense. LB **Desmond Bishop** (Achilles) and S **Charlie Peprah** (hamstring) have missed both preseason games, while the offense could be bolstered by the return of TE **Tory Humphrey** (Achilles), WR **Ruvell Martin** (slight concussion) and RB **DeShawn Wynn** (ankle).

WITH THE CALL

The **Green Bay Packers Broadcast Partners** will air the game in HD over a nine-station network throughout the state of Wisconsin, Upper Michigan and Northeastern Minnesota, with CBS network production, personnel and the latest network-quality technology.

- ▶ The top-notch broadcast team includes CBS's **Kevin Harlan** (play-by-play) alongside fellow CBS broadcaster **Rich Gannon** (analyst).
- ▶ WTMJ's **Jessie Garcia** serves as the sideline reporter and WFRV's **Larry McCarren** joins the crew for pre-game segments. In addition to WFRV-TV (Green Bay) and WTMJ-TV (Milwaukee), the games are televised over WKOW/ABC, Madison, Wis.; WAOW/ABC, Wausau/Rhineland, Wis.; WXOW/ABC, La Crosse, Wis.; WQOW/ABC, Eau Claire; WYOW/ABC, Eagle River, Wis.; WJMN/CBS, Marquette, Mich.; and KQDS-TV/FOX, Duluth, Minn.
- ▶ Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since 1929, heads up the 56-station Packers Radio Network, with Wayne Larrivee (play-by-play) and two-time Packers Pro Bowler Larry McCarren (color) calling the action. The duo enter their 10th season of broadcasts together across the Packers Radio Network, which covers 47 markets in six states.

PACKERS NEWS OF THE WEEK

PACKERS FAIL TO FIND A RHYTHM

Few things went right for the Packers Saturday night in San Francisco, and the numbers prove it: less than 200 total yards, six sacks, nine penalties, three turnovers and a 2-for-14 showing on third down all added up to the Packers' second straight loss.

► It was a struggle for the Packers' No. 1 offensive unit, which played the entire first half. The group managed just 46 yards of total offense and four first downs in 25 snaps, and quarterback **Aaron Rodgers** (9-of-16, 58 yards, 64.1 rating) was sacked four times for losses totaling 26 yards.

► The offense did have some red-zone chances, thanks to a **Charles Woodson** interception late in the first quarter. Facing a first-and-goal from the 7-yard line, the offense couldn't take advantage. Tight end Donald Lee dropped a pass in the corner of the end zone on first down, and defensive pressure forced a sack and a throwaway to stall the drive.

► "We need to find that rhythm and figure out what our identity is going to be," Rodgers said. "Is it going to be spreading teams out? Is it going to be running the football? We just need to get healthy and hopefully have a better performance next week."

► While no one would make excuses after the game, the offense was without a number of key contributors. Starting running back **Ryan Grant** missed a second straight game, as did wideout **Greg Jennings**. Also missing was wide receiver **Ruvell Martin**, inhibiting the team's ability to go to its multi-receiver sets.

► The Packers rested their starting cornerback duo of Woodson and **Al Harris** after the first quarter, and San Francisco's offense took immediate advantage. Its first possession of the second quarter resulted in a methodical 15-play, 87-yard scoring drive that took over nine minutes off the game clock. Later in the quarter, a coverage bust in the defensive backfield led to a second 49ers score.

► Things continued to go downhill for the Packers in the second half, thanks to a number of penalties, breakdowns and fundamental mistakes. Green Bay did get 86 yards rushing from backups **Noah Herron** (6 carries, 35 yards) and **Kregg Lumpkin** (10-51), but squandered two scoring opportunities with turnovers.

► "That's the good thing about playing this poorly in preseason," Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** said after the game. "This is an excellent opportunity for our team to learn from this, and I'll take full advantage of this opportunity for our football team to learn from this, whether it's the quarterback, free safety, defensive linemen, throughout our football team."

► "We're concerned with this effort," echoed Woodson. "This is not what we feel we have as far as this team is concerned. This is not the way we want to go into the season. It is preseason, but it's a time when you work on fundamental things that you need to work on in order to be a good team, so we've got a lot of work to do."

NELSON SHOWS KNACK FOR THE RETURN

Wide receiver **Jordy Nelson** enjoyed an All-American career at Kansas State and put up some eye-popping numbers over the course of four years. But there is one statistic he never recorded at KSU: a kickoff return.

► Nelson hardly looked like a beginner Saturday night as he broke off two long returns, of 56 and 58 yards, to provide one of the few bright spots for the Packers Saturday night.

► Cornerbacks **Tramon Williams** and **Will Blackmon** serve as the team's top kick returners, with Blackmon also handling punt return duties. At the very least, Nelson gave the coaches something to ponder with his performance.

► Nelson, the team's top pick in April's NFL Draft, showed his open-field ability which was a staple at Kansas State. Last fall, he was second in the nation in receiving yardage, and two of his five punt returns went for touchdowns of 89 and 92 yards.

► General Manager **Ted Thompson**, when asked if Nelson would have the chance to make an early contribution, responded that good football players usually figure out a way to impact a football game.

THIS WEEK'S SCHEDULE

Players moved out of the dorms at St. Norbert College Sunday, bringing one aspect of training camp to a close.

► Because of the convoluted preseason schedule, the team will begin its second week of "in-season" training. The team will take to the practice field Monday night for a full-pads workout followed by a mid-morning, full-padded practice Tuesday. The team will have a shells practice Wednesday before travelling to Denver Thursday.

► Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** understood fully the uniqueness of the training camp schedule and planned ahead accordingly.

► "At the expense of trying to run your team into the ground, this is just the way we've gone about it. To play on a Monday night then a Saturday to a Friday to a Thursday, you never get that seven-day run that you would prefer in training camp to stay on a 2-1-2 schedule or 2-2-1, whatever schedule you like. So we're just making the best of it, being smart. We're doing extended jog-throughs, extended walk-throughs in the gym, a little more classroom time than you probably would in training camp, and it really goes back to our schedule in the offseason program. We addressed it back in March,

just that we needed to do more, and once we got in the OTAs and we had a complete understanding of our training camp schedule, we set targets to hit in the offseason program and we did achieve that."

THOMPSON READIES FOR FIRST ROUND OF CUTS

Thompson and his personnel staff will get a final look at some players in uniform Friday night as the first NFL-mandated roster cut looms on Aug. 26. The final cut, to 53 players, comes Aug. 30.

► Just five players will have to be released from the active roster in the first cut, so the team will carry 75 players into the final preseason game against Tennessee.

► Still, Thompson acknowledged just how difficult his decisions will be in the coming weeks.

► "I think every year you make some pretty tough calls," Thompson said. "I think this year there will be more of them, and I think that's natural as you try to grow your core."

► Added Thompson: "I think there are minimums that you keep at every position. You don't want to get too thin. But we don't have any absolutes quite frankly. Last year we had some numbers that were different than normal. On our wall in our draft room we have several different combinations of the least you could take at a position and the most you could take. Certainly special teams is a huge factor towards the bottom of the 53. Decisions you factor how you're going to suit up 45-man, who can contribute, the versatility of different guys, which we try to have at all of our positions."

MIKE MCCARTHY...Is in third year as the Packers' 14th head coach.

- ▶ Was named Packers head coach on Jan. 12, 2006, his first head coaching job after 13 years as an NFL assistant.
- ▶ Honored as the 2007 Motorola NFL Coach of the Year and NFL Alumni Coach of the Year.
- ▶ Became the first Packers coach since Vince Lombardi to lead the team to a championship game in his second season.
- ▶ Tied franchise record for most victories by a coach in his first two seasons (21).

MIKE SHANAHAN...Is in 14th year as the Broncos' 11th head coach.

- ▶ Has guided the Broncos to two World Championships, seven trips to the postseason and nine winning seasons in his tenure.
- ▶ Has the most victories (146) of any NFL head coach since the start of the 1995 season.
- ▶ Including a three-year stint as offensive coordinator in San Francisco (1992-94), has seen his offense finish No. 1 in the NFL four times, second twice and third twice over the past 16 years.
- ▶ Previously served as head coach for the Oakland Raiders (1988-89) and as an assistant with the Broncos (1984-87, 1989-91).

THE PACKERS-BRONCOS SERIES

The Packers first met the Broncos in 1971, Denver's 12th year of existence as an NFL franchise. A Week 2 showdown, Green Bay defeated Denver, 34-13, at County Stadium in Milwaukee.

- ▶ Green Bay is undefeated in the series in games played in Wisconsin (4-0-1) and finally won its first in the series outside of its home state last year. In the Packers' first appearance at INVESCO Field at Mile High (and first trip to the city since 1999), the Packers won for the first time in 10 tries against the Broncos in Denver (now 1-5 regular season, 0-4 preseason).
- ▶ Four-time Super Bowl loser Denver recorded its first-ever win in the NFL's title game with a dramatic 31-24 victory over Green Bay in Super Bowl XXXII in what many call the greatest quarterback match-up in Super Bowl history, pitting Brett Favre vs. John Elway.
- ▶ The two teams met in the preseason four straight years from 1998-2001, splitting the four meetings (two in Denver, one in Green Bay, one in Madison, Wis.), but have not met in the preseason since.

NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

Packers cornerbacks coach Lionel Washington spent two of his 15 NFL seasons playing cornerback for the Broncos (1995-96)...Three current Denver assistants previously coached in Green Bay: Bob Slowik, Joe Baker and Charlie Jackson...Slowik spent five seasons in Green Bay (2000-04), his final season as defensive coordinator...Baker was a secondary/safeties coach for the Packers in 2005, and Jackson served as quality control/defensive assistant in Green Bay that same season... Baker also spent five seasons on the New Orleans coaching staff (2000-04) along with McCarthy, assistant head coach/linebackers coach Winston Moss, tight ends coach Ben McAdoo, offensive quality control coach Ty Knott and wide receivers coach Jimmy Robinson...Broncos QB coach Jeremy Bates is the son of former Green Bay and Denver defensive coordinator Jim Bates...Broncos special teams coordinator Scott O'Brien coached with McCarthy at the University of Pittsburgh (1989-90)... Packers assistant special teams coach Shawn Slocum spent several seasons with Broncos defensive line coach Bill Johnson on the Texas A&M coaching staff (1992-97)...Packers DE Aaron Kampman and Broncos C Casey Wiegmann both hail from Aplington-Parkersburg High School in Iowa, which was destroyed by a tornado this past offseason...Packers WR Greg Jennings was drafted in the second round (52nd overall) in the 2006 NFL Draft, nine selections before the Broncos drafted his teammate at Western Michigan, TE Tony Scheffler...Packers K Mason Crosby spent four years at the University of Colorado (2003-06)...Packers G Jason Spitz, QB Brian Brohm and T Breno Giacomini were teammates at the University of Louisville with Broncos DL Elvis Dumervil...2007 draft picks DeShawn Wynn (Green Bay) and Jarvis Moss (Denver) led Florida to the BCS National Championship in 2006...Broncos S Marquand Manuel played for the Packers in 2006, DE Kenny Peterson was in Green Bay from 2003-05, and DE Larry Birdine was with the Packers during training camp in 2007...Broncos WR Glenn Martinez and Packers WR Ruvell Martin were college teammates at Saginaw Valley State.

INDIVIDUALLY VS. BRONCOS

In last season's meeting, DE Aaron Kampman tied a career-high with three sacks, while WR Greg Jennings caught a career-long 82-yard pass to win the game in overtime, giving him a career-best 141 receiving yards in the game...WR James Jones also set a career-best with 107 receiving yards, including a career-long 79-yard TD catch...RB Ryan Grant recorded the first 100-yard game of his career that night, gaining 104 yards on 22 carries off the bench and becoming the starting running back for the remainder of the season.

LAST MEETING, REGULAR SEASON

Oct. 29, 2007, at INVESCO Field; Packers won, 19-13 (OT).

- ▶ In a Monday night showdown, the Packers won the game on the first snap of overtime as Brett Favre hooked up with Greg Jennings for an 82-yard TD pass.
- ▶ James Jones also had a long TD reception, hauling in a 79-yarder from Favre to tie the score at 7 late in the first quarter.
- ▶ Replacing DeShawn Wynn (shoulder injury) in the second quarter, Ryan Grant rushed 22 times for 104 yards for the first of his five 100-yard games in the regular season.
- ▶ The game went to overtime with a frantic finish to the fourth quarter, as Broncos QB Jay Cutler tried a quarterback draw from the Green Bay 4-yard line in the waning seconds with no timeouts left. Ryan Pickett tackled Cutler for no gain, forcing Denver to rush its field-goal unit onto the field, and Jason Elam booted a 21-yard field goal as time expired to tie the game at 13.



WHAT TO WATCH FOR AT DENVER

POSITION BATTLES HEATING UP

With nearly every player back from a year ago, and a talented bunch of newcomers added to the mix, Packers training camp 2008 appears to be the most competitive in recent memory.

- ▶ General Manager **Ted Thompson** knows all about training camp battles. Signed as a non-drafted free agent linebacker by the Houston Oilers, Thompson annually held off younger competition brought in by Bum Phillips during his 10-year career.
- ▶ McCarthy has acknowledged just how deep the '08 roster is: "There's competition throughout our whole football team. We'll make sure every position is ready to go with more depth than we've ever had here as a football team."
- ▶ Nothing attracts attention and headlines during training camp like the fight for playing time, and the competition will only increase with cuts looming.
- ▶ Here are the positional battles that have been drawing the most interest through the first weeks of camp:

BACKUP QUARTERBACK

- ▶ Rookie draft picks **Brian Brohm** (Louisville) and **Matt Flynn** (LSU) are battling for the job as Aaron Rodgers' backup, and both have had their moments in games. McCarthy and Thompson have said repeatedly that they are not in the market for a veteran backup, so one rookie must step up and take the No. 2 job. Brohm has been praised by McCarthy for his intelligence and ability to pick up the system, but his play in the preseason has been spotty. He still has the inside track on the job, but McCarthy acknowledged that Flynn is closing the gap. Who performs better in the final two preseason games will likely win the job.

INTERIOR OFFENSIVE LINE

- ▶ While injuries have upset the normal order of things, rookie guard **Josh Sitton** has forced his way into the starting rotation at right guard. The incumbent starter there, **Jason Spitz**, has seen time at all three interior positions during camp, but the return of center **Scott Wells** has pushed him over to the left side. The presumed battle heading into camp was at left guard between **Daryn Colledge**, a two-year starter, and second year player **Allen Barbre**, but Sitton's emergence in his first NFL training camp has changed things. Should he prove his worth on the right side, the rookie from Central Florida may get the nod to open the season against Minnesota. Veteran tackles **Chad Clifton** and **Mark Tauscher** remain the anchors of the line on the outside.

A CROWD AT LINEBACKER

- ▶ While wide receiver has stood out as a major strength on offense, the defensive side of the ball looks to be stacked at linebacker. **Nick Barnett** and **A.J. Hawk** lead the unit, but lots of reps are up for grabs on the outside and in a backup role.
- ▶ Few players on the football field can match the intensity of outside linebacker **Brady Poppinga**, who started at SAM linebacker for Green Bay the past two seasons. A defensive end at BYU, he has natural pass-rush instincts and has taken some occasional reps at defensive end during camp. However, the team did sign **Brandon Chillar** from St. Louis, who comes in advertised as a top cover man. Look for defensive coordinator **Bob Sanders** to try out some experiments - such as Poppinga as a situational defensive end or the 2-4-5 formation - during the preseason. Will one linebacker win the job, or will the two platoon throughout the year? Either way, count on both playing key roles on special teams. Poppinga and Chillar have been two staples of the special teams unit this preseason.
- ▶ An equally intense battle has emerged among the backup linebackers. **Desmond Bishop** and **Abdul Hodge** have both looked excellent in

the middle. Bishop has missed both preseason games, so his return to the field is imperative if he wants to hold off the charge from Hodge, who missed all of last season with knee tendinitis. Now rested, Hodge is beginning to show the form that made him an All-Big Ten performer and third-round selection in 2006.

- ▶ **Tracy White**, who plays on the outside, is a valuable special teams performer. The team kept five linebackers last season, but Thompson admitted that could change this year with all the talent at the position.
- ▶ "We have normally in the past at all the places, including here, gone with six linebackers," Thompson said. "For instance, the last couple years we've maybe been at five, starting out. So we just kind of see how it works itself out."

DEFENSIVE BACKFIELD

- ▶ The third cornerback on an NFL team gets enough reps to be considered a "12th" defensive starter. **Jarrett Bush** held that job at the beginning of '07 before **Tramon Williams** came on strong at the end of the season. Williams appears to have the inside track on the job. **Will Blackmon** proved to be an impact player on special teams, but coaches are monitoring his reps in the hopes that he will be injury-free this coming season. He has been in on sub-packages with the defense. Where does second-round pick **Pat Lee** fit in? With solid performances in his first live action, both on special teams and at corner, he certainly can't be counted out of the nickel competition just yet. With a bevy of talent at wide receiver, this group has been tested early and often in practice.
- ▶ Another battle to watch comes in at free safety. **Nick Collins** is entrenched as a three-year starter, but all second-year player **Aaron Rouse** does is make plays. Rouse had an interception in both the Family Night scrimmage and against Cincinnati, and picked off two passes in three starts as a rookie in '07. He is an intriguing player because of his size (6-4, 223), but Collins' experience in the system, plus his abilities as a reliable cover man and sure tackler in run support, give him the edge.

ABOUT THE OFFSEASON

McCarthy let everyone know at the annual Packers Shareholders meeting on July 24 just how he felt about the team's progress through the offseason conditioning program, mini-camps and OTAs.

- ▶ "I'm not trying to throw out some positive BS, but we had a great off-season," McCarthy said at the meeting.
- ▶ The team did slightly alter its offseason structure, holding the mandatory mini-camp at the end of the offseason in mid-June as opposed to sandwiching it between voluntary OTAs as it had in prior offseasons.
- ▶ "I think it's the best offseason that we've had to date (with) the individual time that the players spent with the coaches, the commitment to the off-season program and the strength and conditioning all the way through the OTAs," McCarthy said after the final mini-camp June 19.
- ▶ "I really like the way our offseason came to a conclusion here with the mini-camp at the end. It's an exciting time for us. We felt like we had

the opportunity to improve through this learning process because that's really what this time of year is. I liked the way the rookies jumped in there and picked things up. It puts us in a very good position to start off camp healthy and ready to go."

- ▶ McCarthy has always stressed that he is not a believer in false confidence. Coming off the offseason, it seems he has real confidence in the 2008 Packers. "As far as our roster, the talent level on our depth chart board, it's the best that it has looked since I've been here, especially at this time of year. The amount of work that we were able to get done from March until today has been the most productive that we've been able to get done in my three years. We're trying to win every single football game, and this team has the ability to be something special and we felt that way coming off our offseason last year. We felt good about the direction we were going. I think our challenges are going to be a lot different this year. The obstacles that we're going to have to get over are going to be a lot different."

PACKERS TEAM NOTES

FAVRE, PACKERS PART AFTER 16 SEASONS

Once thought to be impossible, the Green Bay Packers and first-ballot Hall of Famer Brett Favre parted ways after 16 memorable seasons.

- ▶ The Packers traded Favre to the New York Jets for a conditional 2009 draft selection, the final result of a tumultuous month for the club, its fan base and Favre.
- ▶ President/CEO **Mark Murphy** and General Manager **Ted Thompson** issued a joint statement: "We respect Brett's decision that he could no longer remain here as a Packer. But there were certain things we were not willing to do because they were not in the best interest of the team. We were not going to release him nor trade him to a team within the division. When Brett ultimately decided that he still wanted to play football, but not in Green Bay, we told him that we would work to find the best solution for all parties involved."
- ▶ All Favre did while with the Green and Gold was establish every major passing record, including touchdowns (442), yards (61,655), completions (5,377) and attempts (8,758). His 253-game starting streak, an NFL record for the position, remains intact.
- ▶ Michael Jordan laced them up for the Washington Wizards, and Willie Mays finished his career in the outfield for the New York Mets. Star players ending their careers with different clubs isn't so foreign to the NFL:

2008 SCHEDULE AT A GLANCE

The Green Bay Packers' 2008 campaign is highlighted by four prime-time contests, including a nationally-televised home-opening tilt against the NFC North division rival Minnesota Vikings on ESPN's *Monday Night Football*. The Packers' 88th regular season includes two additional Monday night games and a Sunday night game on NBC.

- ▶ In addition to the *MNF* home-opener, the Packers host Dallas Sept. 21 (NBC) and will travel for the final two prime-time contests – at New Orleans Nov. 24 (ESPN) and at Chicago Dec. 22 (ESPN).
- ▶ The Week 1 prime-time matchup marks the fourth time the club will open the season on Monday night. The Packers own a 3-0 record in previous Monday night opening games.
- ▶ The Packers own the NFC's longest active streak for seasons with a *MNF* appearance, with the '08 campaign marking the 16th straight season.

- ▶ The Week 3 Sunday night matchup with Dallas marks the Packers' third consecutive season for a prime-time slot on NBC and is the second-straight season the team will meet the Cowboys in prime time.
- ▶ For the first time in club history, the first two games contested at Lambeau Field will be in prime time.
- ▶ The 2008 slate includes six playoff teams from a year ago (Dallas, Seattle, Tampa Bay, Indianapolis, Jacksonville and Tennessee).
- ▶ The Packers play five of the six postseason teams from a year ago in the first eight games, with only one postseason team from '07 scheduled in the second half of the season.
- ▶ An Oct. 12 tilt at Seattle pits the Packers against former coach Mike Holmgren and marks a rematch of the NFC Divisional Playoff matchup in January when the Packers topped the Seahawks, 42-20, in Green Bay.
- ▶ The Packers will see the Tennessee Titans twice during the '08 campaign – a preseason contest at Lambeau Field for the Midwest Shrine Game (Aug. 28) and a Week 9 trip to Nashville, the first regular-season trip to Tennessee for the Packers since the '01 season.
- ▶ Green Bay will travel to New Orleans for the third of four prime-time games in Week 12. The Packers last traveled to the Superdome in 2002. The Nov. 24 *MNF* game will be head coach Mike McCarthy's first return to the Superdome since serving as the Saints' offensive coordinator from 2000-04.
- ▶ The Houston Texans will make that franchise's first trip to Lambeau Field for a Dec. 7 matchup.
- ▶ For the fifth consecutive season, the Packers will celebrate Christmas with NFC North foes – a trip to Chicago (Dec. 22) and a home tilt against Detroit (Dec. 28) mark the final regular-season matchups.
- ▶ *Monday Night Football* and the Packers roll into Chicago for Green Bay's third Monday night game against the Bears in Week 16. No two NFL teams have met on the gridiron more than the Packers and Bears. The 2008 edition of the series marks the 177th overall meeting.
- ▶ The last time the Packers had four prime-time games on the schedule was in 2005. That year also marks the last time that the Packers hosted a *Monday Night Football* contest, also against the Vikings.
- ▶ The Packers have 10 games with noon start times. Five of the noon start times beginning with Week 11 are subject to change due to NFL flexible scheduling. The '07 season saw 13 games with noon kickoffs.
