## PACKERS WRAP UP PRESEASON WITH FAMILIAR FOE

Green Bay welcomes the Tennessee Titans to Lambeau Field Thursday night for the preseason finale. It will mark the seventh consecutive season the two clubs have met in the final exhibition game.

- The Packers will be playing their fourth game in 18 days thanks to a disjointed preseason schedule. The team will get some good rest – 10 days – before it opens against the Minnesota Vikings on *Monday Night Football* Sept. 8.
- Green Bay comes into its final preseason game after notching its first win of the exhibition slate, a 27-24 win at Denver Friday night. Led by an efficient performance from QB **Aaron Rodgers**, the first-team offense scored on four of five possessions. A late touchdown in the fourth quarter sealed the victory.
- The Titans travel to Green Bay after recording their first preseason loss to Atlanta. The team previously had defeated St. Louis and Oakland.
- As has been custom with this game the past two seasons, the Titans are expected to play their starters a bit longer than the Packers. Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** traditionally has played his starters for a series or two in the final preseason game, whereas Titans coach Jeff Fisher has played his starters into the third quarter.
- Regardless of which players are on the field, don't expect the teams to show too much schematically from either side of the ball: the Packers will travel to Nashville to face the Titans in a Week 9 matchup Nov. 2.
- Thursday night will be the ninth preseason game between Green Bay and the Houston/Tennessee franchise. Since the teams began playing in the final preseason game (2002-present), Tennessee holds a 4-2 advantage.



## MIDWEST SHRINE GAME

One of the NFL's longest team traditions, the Upper Midwest Shrine Game kicks off its 59th installment Thursday night.

- Each season, the Packers donate a percentage of the gate to the Shriners' Hospitals for Children.
- The Shriners' facilities provide specialized medical services, helping children with birth defects and other injuries, at absolutely no cost.
- To date, the series has raised more than \$3.1 million for the Midwest Shrine's burn centers and hospitals for crippled children.
- Green Bay is 30-25-3 all-time in the series. Green Bay and Tennessee met in the 2002 game.
- The series has called three separate stadiums home: Milwaukee's State Fair Park (1950-51), Milwaukee County Stadium (1952-82, 1984-94) and Lambeau Field (1983, 1995-present).
- In his first season leading the Packers, Vince Lombardi made an agreement with George Halas to play in the Shrine game annually. Green Bay and Chicago played each preseason in County Stadium from 1959-73.
- The Packers annually designate the Shrine game as the first 'Gold package' game for season-ticket holders primarily from the Milwaukee area. The team created the three-game package after moving all of its home games to Green Bay in 1995. Also in the 'Gold package' this season are the contests against Dallas (Sept. 21) and Chicago (Nov. 16).

## WITH THE CALL

The **Packers Television Network**, which includes all Green Bay Packers broadcast partners, will air the game in HD over a nine-station network throughout Wisconsin, Upper Michigan and Northeastern Minnesota. With veteran network production, personnel and state-of-the-art technology, Packers preseason games will be broadcast in HD for the first time.

- The CBS Sports broadcasting team of **Kevin Harlan** (play-by-play) and **Rich Gannon** (analyst) will call the action.
- WTMJ's **Jessie Garcia** serves as the sideline reporter and WFRV's **Larry McCarren** joins the crew for pre-game segments. In addition to WFRV-TV (Green Bay) and WTMJ-TV (Milwaukee), the Packers Television Network includes WKOW/ABC, Madison, Wis.; WAOW/ABC, Wausau/Rhineland, Wis.; WXOW/ABC, La Crosse, Wis.; WQOW/ABC, Eau Claire; WYOW/ABC, Eagle River, Wis.; WJMN/CBS, Marquette, Mich.; and KQDS-TV/FOX, Duluth, Minn.
- Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since 1929, heads up the 56-station Packers Radio Network, with Wayne Larrivee (play-by-play) and two-time Packers Pro Bowler Larry McCarren (color) calling the action. The duo enter their 10th season of broadcasts together across the Packers Radio Network, which covers 47 markets in six states.

## PACKERS NEWS OF THE WEEK

### ROSTER MOVES

With the first NFL-mandated roster cut, to 75 players, on Tuesday, the Packers announced several transactions Monday.

- ▶ The team waived four players: T Ryan Considine, WR Chris Francies, RB DeShawn Wynn and FB Ryan Powdrell. Considine ('08), Francies ('06) and Powdrell ('07) all signed with the club as non-drafted free agents. Wynn was a 2007 seventh-round draft choice.
- ▶ Green Bay placed DT **Justin Harrell** on the reserve/physically unable to perform list with a back injury.
- ▶ Players on the PUP list are not eligible to be activated to the 53-man roster for the first six weeks of the season. After that period of time, they are eligible to practice with the club for up to three weeks. Before being activated to the 53-man roster, which can be done at any time during the three-week period, the team must make a subsequent roster move.

### THIS WEEK'S SCHEDULE

The Packers will hit the practice field three times before the Tennessee game as they wrap up the final week of training camp.

- ▶ Sunday afternoon was a shells practice, with the team returning to full pads for the final time this summer on Monday morning. Tuesday's workout will be in shells.
- ▶ "At the expense of trying to run your team into the ground, this is just the way we've gone about it," Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** said about the pre-season format. "To play on a Monday night then a Saturday to a Friday to a Thursday, you never get that seven-day run that you would prefer in training camp to stay on a 2-1-2 schedule or 2-2-1, whatever schedule you like. So we're just making the best of it, being smart. We're doing extended jog-throughs, extended walk-throughs in the gym, a little more classroom time than you probably would in training camp, and it really goes back to our schedule in the offseason program. We addressed it back in March, just that we needed to do more, and once we got in the OTAs and we had a complete understanding of our training camp schedule, we set targets to hit in the offseason program and we did achieve that."

### RETURN TO FORM

Six days after a lackluster performance in San Francisco, the Green Bay Packers rebounded behind a sharp performance from quarterback **Aaron Rodgers** to notch their first win of the preseason, a 27-24 victory at Denver. He completed 18-of-22 passes for 193 yards and one touchdown for a 118.4 quarterback rating.

- ▶ He completed passes to nine different receivers as he led the No. 1 offense to scores on four of the five series they played.
- ▶ The No. 1 offense looked particularly efficient on the game's opening drive. Rodgers completed a pass over the middle to tight end **Tory Humphrey** on the very first play of the game that went for 35 yards as Humphrey gained some big yardage after the catch. Rodgers followed that up on the next snap with a 17-yard completion to wide receiver **Greg Jennings**, and closed the eight-play drive out with a 10-yard touchdown pass over the middle to wide receiver **Donald Driver**.
- ▶ "I thought Aaron had a very good night," McCarthy said. "I thought he was sharp. I thought he managed the offense, the tempo, was smart with the football, and was very good on third down. I thought it was important for our offense to come out and establish some tempo and have some productivity early in the game. We were able to do that and continue it for four quarters."
- ▶ An encouraging sign for the team was its improvement in a number of

areas from the previous week's performance at San Francisco. The pass protection was much improved throughout, allowing just one sack. The Packers struggled mightily against the 49ers on third down (2-of-14 as a team) but rebounded in Denver. Rodgers and the first unit converted 5-of-8 third-down opportunities.

- ▶ The first offense finished their night on a high note on their lone series of the second half. After inheriting the ball at Denver's 40-yard line after a 43-yard punt return by **Will Blackmon**, Rodgers hooked up with wide receiver **James Jones** for a 14-yard gain to start the drive. Wide receiver **Ruvell Martin** was interfered with by cornerback Karl Paymah on Rodgers' pass to the end zone, and two plays later, Rodgers scored on a sneak from the 1-yard line to give Green Bay a 20-17 lead.
- ▶ One area of the team that was not pleased with its performance in Denver was the first-unit defense, which yielded 17 points on three possessions to Denver's first-team offense. The Broncos finished the first half with 206 total yards, including 91 yards on the ground.

▶ Particularly frustrating for the defense was a 16-play, 99-yard Denver scoring drive that took over eight minutes off the clock.

▶ "The big drive was disappointing," McCarthy said. "The strength of our defense has always been third down. We weren't as sharp tonight as we have been, and we need to tackle better. The run defense was not as productive as it has been, but getting off the field on third down, that's the strength of our defense. We're better than we showed on that particular drive, and we'll take full advantage of it and learn from it."

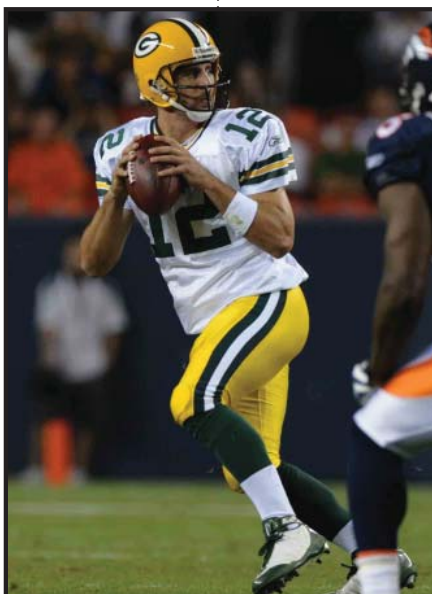
▶ Despite the first group's difficulties, Friday night's victory was set up by a key play from the defense. With just over five minutes to play, defensive end **Jason Hunter** made a big hit on quarterback Patrick Ramsey as he threw to send his pass into the arms of linebacker **Tracy White**. White returned the interception seven yards to Denver's

10-yard line, and the Packers got the winning score on a 1-yard run by rookie running back **Kregg Lumpkin** on fourth-and-goal.

### JENNINGS' RETURN BOOSTS OFFENSE, SPECIAL TEAMS SHINE AGAIN

For the first time this preseason, Rodgers had the full complement of wide receivers at his disposal and was able spread the ball around in the Packers' victory over the Broncos.

- ▶ **Greg Jennings** made his 2008 debut after missing the first two games with a knee injury and **Ruvell Martin** returned after missing the game last week at San Francisco with a slight concussion/jaw contusion.
- ▶ "I think we had a good rhythm going, and that's what we came over here to do," Jennings said. "We wanted to set the tone and set the tempo and move the ball down the field and make plays and get scores."
- ▶ Jennings showed no effects on the knee injury, leading a balanced receiving corps with four receptions for 42 yards.
- ▶ For the second straight week, Green Bay got a number of outstanding individual performances on special teams. Blackmon's 43-yard punt return was set up nicely by his blockers, while punter **Jon Ryan** put together his second solid performance in as many weeks.
- ▶ Ryan punted three times for a 60.0-yard average, including a 59-yarder in the first quarter that was downed inside Denver's 1-yard line by cornerback **Jarrett Bush**. Ryan later added a 72-yard punt that bounced in the end zone for a touchback, and finished the night with a 49.9-yard net average.

- ▶ Became the first Packers coach since Vince Lombardi to lead the team to a championship game in his second season.

- ▶ Holds the franchise record for wins by a head coach (120).

- ▶ Presided over the most successful five-year period (1999-2003) in his club's 46-year history, posting 56 regular-season and five postseason victories, including two division titles.

### THE PACKERS-TITANS SERIES

Green Bay played its first ever dome game, a 23-10 win on Nov. 20, 1972, when the franchises first met 35 years ago at the Houston Astrodome.

- ▶ Since, the clubs have met only eight other times.
- ▶ The teams have split the last four meetings, all during the Brett Favre era, with the Packers getting victories at home in 1998 and at Houston in 1992.
- ▶ The Packers are just 1-2 vs. the Titans since the franchise moved from Houston to Tennessee in 1997.
- ▶ The teams' first meeting after the move, at Lambeau Field on Dec. 20, 1998, was a memorable contest. A 30-22 Packers win in snowy, 29-degree conditions, the game marked Reggie White's final Lambeau Field performance in a Packers uniform. Favre threw for three touchdowns, all to Antonio Freeman, who posted seven catches for 186 yards.

### NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

Packers GM Ted Thompson played 10 years (1975-84) as a LB for the Houston Oilers...Titans GM Mike Reinfeldt spent eight years working at 1265 Lombardi Ave., as Chief Financial Officer (1991-93) and Vice President of Administration (1994-98); Reinfeldt is a Wisconsin native (Baraboo) and was a four-year starter at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee...Thompson and Reinfeldt are close friends, as the two were teammates in Houston (1976-83) and co-workers in Green Bay (1992-98)...Titans DB coach Chuck Cecil entered the NFL as a fourth-round choice of the Packers in the 1988 draft and played in Green Bay's secondary from 1988-92...Titans assistant special teams coach Marty Galbraith coached at the University of Pittsburgh with McCarthy in 1991...Green Bay WR coach Jimmy Robinson launched his coaching career as an assistant with the USFL's Memphis Showboats in 1984, when the franchise's roster included DE Reggie White...T Chad Clifton (Martin, Tenn.), C Scott Wells (Brentwood, Tenn.) and DT Justin Harrell (Martin, Tenn.) are all natives of Tennessee and played collegiately at the University of Tennessee...Titans P Craig Hentrich played for the Packers from 1994-97...Titans LB Kurt Campbell was originally a seventh-round draft pick of the Packers in 2005, and QB Ingle Martin was a fifth-round pick in 2006...Titans QB Paul Thompson spent time in training camp with the Packers in 2007.

### INDIVIDUALLY VS. BRONCOS

WR Donald Driver has 12 receptions for 167 yards and one touchdown in two games against the Titans.

### LAST MEETING, REGULAR SEASON

Oct. 11, 2004, at Lambeau Field; Titans won, 48-27.

- ▶ On *Monday Night Football*, the Titans came into Green Bay and scored more points than any visitor ever at Lambeau, handing the Packers at the time their first four-game losing streak since 1991 and first 0-3 start at home since 1988.
- ▶ Titans RB Chris Brown rushed for 148 yards and two touchdowns, from 37 and 29 yards out on the first two series.
- ▶ Tennessee scored on five of its first six possessions, and Steve McNair threw two second-half TD passes to put the game out of reach.
- ▶ Brett Favre, playing after the death of his 24-year-old brother-in-law, was 24-of-44 for 338 yards, two touchdowns and three interceptions. Donald Driver (10 catches, 150 yards) and Javon Walker (8-159) each topped 150 receiving yards.

### LAST MEETING, PRESEASON

Aug. 30, 2007, at LP Field; Titans won, 30-14.

- ▶ Green Bay RB Noah Herron caught a 6-yard TD pass for the game's first points, and then injured his knee on the ensuing kickoff, ending his season.
- ▶ Tennessee native and recent draft choice from UT Justin Harrell returned a fumble 18 yards for a touchdown in the opening moments of the third quarter to tie the score at 14.
- ▶ Chris Davis returned a punt 70 yards for a touchdown late in the third quarter to give the Titans a two-score lead.
- ▶ Titans QB Vince Young finished 11-of-16 for 96 yards and a TD. He also had an 8-yard rushing touchdown.



## WHAT TO WATCH FOR AGAINST TENNESSEE

### A LAST CHANCE TO IMPRESS

With nearly every player back from a year ago, and a talented bunch of newcomers added to the mix, Packers training camp 2008 has been the most competitive in recent memory.

- ▶ General Manager **Ted Thompson** knows all about training camp battles. Signed as a non-drafted free agent linebacker by the Houston Oilers, Thompson annually held off younger competition brought in by Bum Phillips during his 10-year career.
- ▶ McCarthy has acknowledged just how deep the '08 roster is: "There's competition throughout our whole football team. We'll make sure every position is ready to go with more depth than we've ever had here as a football team."
- ▶ Nothing attracts attention and headlines during training camp like the fight for playing time and roster spots, and the game versus Tennessee will be the final factor as the final roster cut looms.
- ▶ Starters should only play a series of two Thursday, lending plenty of time for players fighting to make the roster. Here's a look at the roster as it stands, position by position. The first number indicates the number of players at that position entering camp, while the number in parentheses represents how many players from that position made the opening-day roster in 2007.

### THE CLOSEST BATTLES: RUNNING BACK

- ▶ One of the most watched positions as the final cut approaches will be running back. **Ryan Grant** and **Brandon Jackson** form a solid 1-2 punch at the position, but just who will back them up remains to be seen.
- ▶ Veterans **Noah Herron** and **Vernand Morency** have experience in the system and have had solid summers. Both have experience as third-down backs (Herron in 2006, Morency in '07) and will look to claim the role this season. Rookie free agent **Kregg Lumpkin** (Georgia) has impressed as the team's leading rusher this preseason. The team kept four running backs last season, so each of the three will try to impress against Tennessee. Herron and Morency have experience on special teams units in the past, which certainly gives them an edge.

### A CROWD AT LINEBACKER

- ▶ While wide receiver has stood out as a major strength on offense, the defensive side of the ball looks to be stacked at linebacker. **Nick Barnett** and **A.J. Hawk** lead the unit, but lots of reps are up for grabs on the outside and in a backup role.
- ▶ Few players on the football field can match the intensity of outside linebacker **Brady Poppinga**, who started at SAM linebacker for Green Bay the past two seasons. A defensive end at BYU, he has natural pass-rush instincts and has taken some occasional reps at defensive end during camp. However, the team did sign **Brandon Chillar** from St. Louis, who comes in advertised as a top cover man. Look for defensive coordinator **Bob Sanders** to try out some experiments - such as Poppinga as a situational defensive end or the 2-4-5 formation - during the final preseason game. Regardless of who starts in the base defense, count on both playing key roles on special teams.
- ▶ An equally intense battle has emerged among the backup linebackers. **Desmond Bishop** and **Abdul Hodge** have both looked excellent in the middle. Bishop missed the first two preseason games, but came out strong in his debut at Denver. His return to form is imperative if he wants to hold off the charge from Hodge, who missed all of last season

with knee tendinitis. Now rested, Hodge is beginning to show the form that made him an All-Big Ten performer and third-round selection in 2006. Both could make the final roster as they have been core members of the special teams units.

- ▶ **Tracy White**, who plays on the outside, is a valuable special teams performer. The team kept five linebackers last season, but Thompson admitted that could change this year with all the talent at the position.
- ▶ "We have normally in the past at all the places, including here, gone with six linebackers," Thompson said. "For instance, the last couple years we've maybe been at five, starting out. So we just kind of see how it works itself out."

### DEFENSIVE BACKFIELD

- ▶ The third cornerback on an NFL team gets enough reps to be considered a "12th" defensive starter. **Jarrett Bush** held that job at the beginning of '07 before **Tramon Williams** came on strong at the end of the season. Williams appears to have the inside track on the job. **Will Blackmon** proved to be an impact player on special teams, but coaches are monitoring his reps in the defensive backfield in the hopes that he will be injury-free this coming season. He has been a fixture in sub-packages on defense. Where does second-round pick **Pat Lee** fit in? With solid performances in his first live action, both on special teams and at corner, he certainly can't be counted out of the nickel competition just yet. With a bevy of talent at wide receiver, this group has been tested early and often in practice.
- ▶ Another battle to watch comes in at free safety. **Nick Collins** is entrenched as a three-year starter, but all second-year player **Aaron Rouse** does is make plays. Rouse had an interception in both the Family Night scrimmage and against Cincinnati and has been the Packers' leading tackler in the preseason. He is an intriguing player because of his size (6-4, 223), but Collins' experience in the system, plus his abilities as a reliable cover man and sure tackler in run support, give him the edge.

### ABOUT THE OFFSEASON

McCarthy let everyone know at the annual Packers Shareholders meeting on July 24 just how he felt about the team's progress through the offseason conditioning program, mini-camps and OTAs.

- "I'm not trying to throw out some positive BS, but we had a great off-season," McCarthy said at the meeting.
- The team did slightly alter its offseason structure, holding the mandatory mini-camp at the end of the offseason in mid-June as opposed to sandwiching it between voluntary OTAs as it had in prior offseasons.
- "I think it's the best offseason that we've had to date (with) the individual time that the players spent with the coaches, the commitment to the off-season program and the strength and conditioning all the way through the OTAs," McCarthy said after the final mini-camp June 19.
- "I really like the way our offseason came to a conclusion here with the mini-camp at the end. It's an exciting time for us. We felt like we had

the opportunity to improve through this learning process because that's really what this time of year is. I liked the way the rookies jumped in there and picked things up. It puts us in a very good position to start off camp healthy and ready to go."

- McCarthy has always stressed that he is not a believer in false confidence. Coming off the offseason, it seems he has real confidence in the 2008 Packers. "As far as our roster, the talent level on our depth chart board, it's the best that it has looked since I've been here, especially at this time of year. The amount of work that we were able to get done from March until today has been the most productive that we've been able to get done in my three years. We're trying to win every single football game, and this team has the ability to be something special and we felt that way coming off our offseason last year. We felt good about the direction we were going. I think our challenges are going to be a lot different this year. The obstacles that we're going to have to get over are going to be a lot different."

## PACKERS TEAM NOTES

### FAVRE, PACKERS PART AFTER 16 SEASONS

Once thought to be impossible, the Green Bay Packers and first-ballot Hall of Famer Brett Favre parted ways after 16 memorable seasons.

- ▶ The Packers traded Favre to the New York Jets for a conditional 2009 draft selection, the final result of a tumultuous month for the club, its fan base and Favre.
- ▶ President/CEO **Mark Murphy** and General Manager **Ted Thompson** issued a joint statement: "We respect Brett's decision that he could no longer remain here as a Packer. But there were certain things we were not willing to do because they were not in the best interest of the team. We were not going to release him nor trade him to a team within the division. When Brett ultimately decided that he still wanted to play football, but not in Green Bay, we told him that we would work to find the best solution for all parties involved."
- ▶ All Favre did while with the Green and Gold was establish every major passing record, including touchdowns (442), yards (61,655), completions (5,377) and attempts (8,758). His 253-game starting streak, an NFL record for the position, remains intact.
- ▶ Michael Jordan laced them up for the Washington Wizards, and Willie Mays finished his career in the outfield for the New York Mets. Star players ending their careers with different clubs isn't so foreign to the NFL:

### 2008 SCHEDULE AT A GLANCE

The Green Bay Packers' 2008 campaign is highlighted by four prime-time contests, including a nationally-televised home-opening tilt against the NFC North division rival Minnesota Vikings on ESPN's *Monday Night Football*. The Packers' 88th regular season includes two additional Monday night games and a Sunday night game on NBC.

- ▶ In addition to the *MNF* home-opener, the Packers host Dallas Sept. 21 (NBC) and will travel for the final two prime-time contests – at New Orleans Nov. 24 (ESPN) and at Chicago Dec. 22 (ESPN).
- ▶ The Week 1 prime-time matchup marks the fourth time the club will open the season on Monday night. The Packers own a 3-0 record in previous Monday night opening games.
- ▶ The Packers own the NFC's longest active streak for seasons with a *MNF* appearance, with the '08 campaign marking the 16th straight season.

- ▶ The Week 3 Sunday night matchup with Dallas marks the Packers' third consecutive season for a prime-time slot on NBC and is the second-straight season the team will meet the Cowboys in prime time.
- ▶ For the first time in club history, the first two games contested at Lambeau Field will be in prime time.
- ▶ The 2008 slate includes six playoff teams from a year ago (Dallas, Seattle, Tampa Bay, Indianapolis, Jacksonville and Tennessee).
- ▶ The Packers play five of the six postseason teams from a year ago in the first eight games, with only one postseason team from '07 scheduled in the second half of the season.
- ▶ An Oct. 12 tilt at Seattle pits the Packers against former coach Mike Holmgren and marks a rematch of the NFC Divisional Playoff matchup in January when the Packers topped the Seahawks, 42-20, in Green Bay.
- ▶ The Packers will see the Tennessee Titans twice during the '08 campaign – a preseason contest at Lambeau Field for the Midwest Shrine Game (Aug. 28) and a Week 9 trip to Nashville, the first regular-season trip to Tennessee for the Packers since the '01 season.
- ▶ Green Bay will travel to New Orleans for the third of four prime-time games in Week 12. The Packers last traveled to the Superdome in 2002. The Nov. 24 *MNF* game will be head coach Mike McCarthy's first return to the Superdome since serving as the Saints' offensive coordinator from 2000-04.
- ▶ The Houston Texans will make that franchise's first trip to Lambeau Field for a Dec. 7 matchup.
- ▶ For the fifth consecutive season, the Packers will celebrate Christmas with NFC North foes – a trip to Chicago (Dec. 22) and a home tilt against Detroit (Dec. 28) mark the final regular-season matchups.
- ▶ *Monday Night Football* and the Packers roll into Chicago for Green Bay's third Monday night game against the Bears in Week 16. No two NFL teams have met on the gridiron more than the Packers and Bears. The 2008 edition of the series marks the 177th overall meeting.
- ▶ The last time the Packers had four prime-time games on the schedule was in 2005. That year also marks the last time that the Packers hosted a *Monday Night Football* contest, also against the Vikings.
- ▶ The Packers have 10 games with noon start times. Five of the noon start times beginning with Week 11 are subject to change due to NFL flexible scheduling. The '07 season saw 13 games with noon kickoffs.

- ▶ Saturday, Aug. 30 – NFL-mandated roster reduction, to 53 players, by 5 p.m. CDT
- ▶ Sunday, Aug. 31 – Clubs may establish practice squad of eight players
