## PRESEASON ACTION KICKS OFF

The Green Bay Packers' 2009 season officially kicks off Saturday night as the Cleveland Browns come to Lambeau Field for a preseason contest.

- ▶ Green Bay lines up against another opponent for the first time since Dec. 28 of last year, when it defeated the Detroit Lions in the season finale.
- ▶ Though 21 of 22 primary starters from 2008 return, there is plenty new about the 2009 Packers.
- ▶ Saturday marks the debut of rookie and free-agent acquisitions, as well as a potentially high-octane offense that spent its first offseason together. Under the direction of Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**, the offensive play-caller, the unit ranked No. 8 in total offense a season ago. For the first time in the franchise's storied history, it had a 4,000-yard passer (**Aaron Rodgers**), two 1,000-yard receivers (**Donald Driver** and **Greg Jennings**) and a 1,200-yard rusher (**Ryan Grant**).
- ▶ Most eyes, however, will be on the debut of the Packers' new 3-4 defense under defensive coordinator **Dom Capers**. Hired Jan. 19, Capers begins his 24th season in the National Football League.
- ▶ As has been the case under McCarthy in previous preseasons, starters aren't expected to play more than a few series. Maintaining the health of the football team will be the ultimate determining factor, as will the need to see a number of younger players in live game action. Teams must make the first roster cut, to 75 players, on Sept. 1.
- ▶ Saturday marks the 21st preseason meeting in the all-time series between Cleveland and Green Bay. The Packers came away with a 38-31 victory in the last meeting in 2003.

## MIDWEST SHRINE GAME

One of the NFL's longest team traditions, the Upper Midwest Shrine Game kicks off its 60th installment Saturday night.

- ▶ Each season, the Packers donate a percentage of the gate to the Shriners' Hospitals for Children.
- ▶ The Shriners' facilities provide specialized medical services, helping children with birth defects and other injuries, at absolutely no cost.
- ▶ To date, the series has raised more than \$3.1 million for the Midwest Shrine's burn centers and hospitals for disabled children.
- ▶ Green Bay is 30-26-3 all-time in the series. Cleveland played Green Bay in the game in 1983 – a 21-20 Browns victory.
- ▶ The series has called three separate stadiums home: Milwaukee's State Fair Park (1950-51), Milwaukee County Stadium (1952-82, 1984-94) and Lambeau Field (1983, 1995-present).
- ▶ In his first season leading the Packers, Vince Lombardi made an agreement with George Halas to play in the Shrine game annually. Green Bay and Chicago played each preseason in County Stadium from 1959-73.
- ▶ The Packers annually designate the Shrine game as the first 'Gold package' game for season-ticket holders primarily from the Milwaukee area. The team created the three-game package after moving all of its home games to Green Bay in 1995. Also in the 'Gold package' this season are the contests against Cincinnati (Sept. 20) and Dallas (Nov. 15).

## WITH THE CALL

The **Green Bay Packers Broadcast Partners** will air the game over a nine-station network throughout the states of Wisconsin, Upper Michigan and Northeastern Minnesota, with CBS network production, personnel and the latest network-quality technology.

- ▶ The top-notch broadcast team includes CBS's **Kevin Harlan** (play-by-play) alongside fellow CBS broadcaster **Rich Gannon** (analyst).
- ▶ WTMJ's **Jessie Garcia** serves as the sideline reporter and WFRV's **Larry McCarren** joins the crew for pre-game segments. In addition to WFRV-TV (Green Bay) and WTMJ-TV (Milwaukee), the games are televised over WKOW/ABC, Madison, Wis.; WAOW/ABC, Wausau/Rhineland, Wis.; WXOW/ABC, La Crosse, Wis.; WQOW/ABC, Eau Claire; WYOW/ABC, Eagle River, Wis.; WJMN/CBS, Marquette, Mich.; and KQDS-TV/FOX, Duluth, Minn.
- ▶ Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since 1929, heads up the 48-station Packers Radio Network, with **Wayne Larrivee** (play-by-play) and two-time Packers Pro Bowler **Larry McCarren** (color) calling the action. The duo enters its 11th season of broadcasts together across the Packers Radio Network, which covers 43 markets in five states.

## THIS WEEK IN PACKERS NEWS

### LIGHTNING CANCELS FAMILY NIGHT SCRIMMAGE

Players did get warmups in, but sustained lightning around the area forced the team to cancel its annual Family Night scrimmage on Aug. 8.

- 50,787 fans had packed Lambeau Field Saturday night to get their first look of 'live' action in the 2009 season. Instead, fans will have to wait until Saturday to get their first look at the rookie class, **Dom Capers'** defense, and the rest of the '09 storylines in game action.
- A number of players were slated to miss the scrimmage because of minor injuries, prompting Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** and his staff to honor the off day Sunday, giving the team two days of rest heading into the week.
- "We're going to take this opportunity to get the players back and just keep our install schedule going," McCarthy said Saturday night. "I'm very pleased with the number of reps that we were able to attain last week in practice. We feel as a coaching staff, just during the delay having an opportunity to meet with the coordinators and some of the coaches, we feel that we are ahead of schedule in some areas. Really the health of our football team is the priority right now."

### PHYSICAL TONE SET IN FIRST WEEK

Part of the reason the coaching staff was able to give the team rest Saturday and Sunday was just how physical the opening week of camp had been.

- "I think we may have fallen under the classification of 'live' in segments of our practice," McCarthy said after Saturday's cancellation. "I have been very pleased with the nature of our practices, the extra reps in the particular situations that we felt we needed the extra work. I like the attitude and the temperament of our football team right now."
- Players agree, as many are saying this has been the most physical camp in the McCarthy tenure. The first week was highlighted by nine practices – seven in full pads – and a number of skirmishes in practice.
- "This has been as physical a camp as I've been in since I got here," LB **A.J. Hawk** said. "It's been good so far. That's why having (Family Night) canceled isn't going to hurt us as maybe it would in years past because of how physical we've been and the number of plays we've taken so far in camp."
- The second night practice, on Aug. 4, featured three separate fights that stopped the action each time.
- "I thought the defense had a heck of a night tonight," McCarthy said following the Tuesday night practice. "I probably shouldn't even say this, but we were 6-10 last year, and we didn't have a damn fight all training camp. So, I guess we're off to a hell of a start."

### RAJI REMAINS UNSIGNED

Packers NT **B.J. Raji**, the No. 9 overall pick in the 2009 NFL Draft, remains unsigned and as of Monday had missed the first 10 practices.

- Raji was in Green Bay for an install of the defensive system this offseason, though none of that work was in full pads.
- Coaches had planned to work Raji at both the nose tackle and end position in the 3-4 defense. An All-Atlantic Coast Conference selection in 2008, Raji led Boston College in sacks (eight) and anchored a run defense that ranked No. 7 nationally. Nearly one-third (32.5 of 105) of his tackles in college were behind the line of scrimmage.

### WHERE THEY'LL BE SATURDAY NIGHT

Coaches often use the preseason as a test to see where coaches are best utilized, especially with a new staff. Coach McCarthy is on the sidelines, but here's a look at where the rest of the staff will be Saturday:

- **Press Box:** Dom Capers (defensive coordinator), Jerry Fontenot (asst. offensive line), Scott McCurley (defensive quality control), Chad Morton (administrator), Joe Philbin (offensive coordinator), John Rushing (offensive quality control), and Joe Whitt (secondary - cornerbacks).
- **Sideline:** Edgar Bennett (running backs), James Campen (offensive line), Tom Clements (quarterbacks), Mike Eayrs (research and development), Curtis Fuller (special teams asst.), Kevin Greene (outside linebackers), Ben McAdoo (tight ends), Winston Moss (inside linebackers/asst. head coach), Darren Perry (secondary - safeties), Jimmy Robinson (wide receivers), Shawn Slocum (special teams coordinator) and Mike Trgovac (defensive line).



### AHEAD THIS WEEK

The Packers hit the practice field five times this week, including twice each on Tuesday and Thursday.

- Four of those practices will be in full pads, though the health of the team heading into Saturday night's matchup against the Browns will determine if those numbers stay the same.
- Whether padded or in shells, the team will have 14 practices under its belt before the Cleveland matchup.

### THE INJURY REPORT

The Packers did have S **Anthony Smith** and DE **Justin Harrell** return Monday.

- Outside linebacker could be down a couple of players this weekend, as both **Clay Matthews** (hamstring) and **Jeremy Thompson** (groin, arm) only took part in the jog-through Monday. Both are considered day-to-day.
- Remaining out Monday were CB **Pat Lee** (back), RBs **Brandon Jackson** (shoulder) and **DeShawn Wynn** (knee - bone bruise), WRs **Ruvel Martin** (groin) and **Patrick Williams** (hamstring), TE **Tory Humphrey** (forearm), DE **Johnny Jolly** (ankle), LBs **Nick Barnett** (knee/PUP) and **Brad Jones** (back/PUP), and Raji (unsigned).
- Humphrey is out after the fourth-year pro broke his forearm earlier in the week, while Barnett will be out as well as he gets back to full strength coming off ACL surgery.

**MIKE MCCARTHY...**Is in fourth year as the Packers' 14th head coach.

- ▶ Was named Packers head coach on Jan. 12, 2006, his first head coaching job after 13 years as an NFL assistant.
- ▶ Honored as the 2007 Motorola NFL Coach of the Year and NFL Alumni Coach of the Year.
- ▶ Became the first Packers coach since Vince Lombardi to lead the team to a championship game in his second season.
- ▶ One of only three head coaches to lead an offense ranked in the top 10 in the league each of the past three years.

**ERIC MANGINI...**Is in first year as the Browns' 12th head coach.

- ▶ Served as head coach of the N.Y. Jets the past three seasons, posting two winning records and earning one postseason berth (2006).
- ▶ In six seasons as an assistant coach with the New England Patriots (2000-05), was part of three Super Bowl championship teams.
- ▶ Began his NFL coaching career with the Browns in 1995.
- ▶ Served as head coach and defensive coordinator for a semi-pro team in Australia, the Keweenaw Colts, who won back-to-back titles under his leadership.

### THE PACKERS-BROWNS SERIES

The two teams have met a total of 17 times dating back to 1953.

- ▶ That includes one postseason meeting, the 1965 NFL Championship played in Green Bay and won by the Packers, 23-12.
- ▶ The 1965 title game marked Cleveland's first and only trip to Green Bay until 2001. From 1953-83, the Packers played host to the Browns in Milwaukee five times.
- ▶ The Packers own the longest winning streak in the series, five straight from 1961-67 (including 1965 title game).
- ▶ The Browns' win in 2005 was the franchise's first at Lambeau Field in three tries.

### NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

Browns DE Corey Williams played for the Packers for four seasons (2004-07) after being selected by Green Bay in the sixth round of the 2004 Draft. He was traded to the Browns for a second-round pick in 2008, which turned out to be QB Brian Brohm...Browns LB David Bowens played for the Packers in 2000 and RB Noah Herron played for Green Bay

for two seasons (2005-06) before missing the 2007 season with a knee injury and then being released at the end of training camp last summer... Browns WR Paul Hubbard and T Joe Thomas played collegiately at the University of Wisconsin... Browns QB Brady Quinn and Packers LB A.J. Hawk are brothers-in-law, with Hawk's wife Laura being Quinn's sister... Browns QB Derek Anderson and Packers LB Nick Barnett were college teammates at Oregon State... Packers T Chad Clifton used to block for Browns RB Jamal Lewis in college at Tennessee... Browns LB Kaluka Maiava and Packers LB Clay Matthews played in the same LB corps at USC and were both drafted this year... Browns WR Mohamed Massaquoi and Packers RB Kregg Lumpkin and DE Jarius Wynn were college teammates at Georgia. Massaquoi and Wynn were both drafted this past April... Browns LB Bo Ruud and Packers RB Brandon Jackson were college teammates at Nebraska, as were Packers LB Brandon Chillar and Browns DL Kenyon Coleman at UCLA... Packers offensive coordinator Joe Philbin tutored Browns OL Eric Steinbach at Iowa.

### INDIVIDUALLY VS. BROWNS

WR Donald Driver had six receptions for 105 yards, including a 42-yard touchdown, in the 2005 meeting... LB Nick Barnett led the defense with six tackles, and DE Cullen Jenkins blocked a PAT attempt.

### LAST MEETING, REGULAR SEASON

Sept. 18, 2005, at Lambeau Field; Browns won, 26-24.

- ▶ The Packers took an early 7-0 lead on Donald Driver's 42-yard TD grab, but Cleveland scored 19 straight points, capped by Trent Dilfer's 80-yard TD pass to rookie Braylon Edwards late in the third quarter.
- ▶ Brett Favre threw for 342 yards and three TDs for Green Bay, but Dilfer countered with 336 yards and three scores, including two to Steve Heiden, the last a 62-yarder with 1:50 left to give the Browns a nine-point lead.
- ▶ Driver finished with six receptions for 105 yards on a day Reggie White's No. 92 was officially retired by the franchise in a halftime ceremony.
- ▶ Favre's 4-yard TD pass to Tony Fisher with 4 seconds left in the game broke John Elway's single-stadium NFL touchdown record of 180. Favre also surpassed 50,000 career passing yards in the contest.

### LAST MEETING, PRESEASON

Aug. 15, 2003, at Cleveland Browns Stadium; Packers won, 38-31.

- ▶ Two second-half touchdowns by Herbert "Whisper" Goodman on an 8-yard run and 13-yard reception helped the Packers rally from a 21-14 deficit for the win. Goodman finished with 19 rushes for 80 yards and four receptions for 56 yards.
- ▶ The Packers also got a touchdown from Donald Driver on a 22-yard reception. Running backs Ahman Green and Nick Luchey each scored on 1-yard runs.



## 2009 TRAINING CAMP

## STAFF CHANGES HEADLINE OFFSEASON

On the heels of a disappointing 6-10 season, a new defensive staff and scheme headlined the changes this offseason at 1265 Lombardi Ave.

- **Dom Capers** was brought in as defensive coordinator, and the Packers began the transition to a 3-4 scheme in offseason workouts.
- Joining Capers on the defensive staff are **Mike Trgovac** (defensive line), who spent the last six years in Carolina as defensive coordinator; outside linebackers coach **Kevin Greene**, third on the NFL's all-time sacks list and a former player under Capers; and safeties coach **Darren Perry**, who most recently coached in Oakland and also played under Capers in Pittsburgh. Assistant head coach/inside linebackers coach **Winston Moss** remains on the staff, as does **Joe Whitt Jr.**, who spent 2008 as defensive quality control before his promotion to cornerbacks coach this offseason.
- **Shawn Slocum** was promoted to special teams coordinator after serving as the unit's assistant each of the last three seasons. **Curtis Fuller**, a former Packers safety and training camp coaching intern, will serve as his assistant. New strength and conditioning coordinator **Dave Redding** is entering his 23rd season at the NFL level, while **Scott McCurley** (defense) and **John Rushing** (offense) will serve as the quality control coaches.



## MORE ON DOM CAPERS

Charged with revamping the Packers' defense is veteran coach **Dom Capers**, who is entering his 24th season on the NFL level in 2009, his 17th as a defensive coordinator or head coach.

- Noted around the league as one of the game's best defensive minds, Capers will transition the Packers to a 3-4 defense. Much of the depth chart on defense returns, including all 11 primary starters. The offseason was heavily focused on learning the new system, including position changes for some. None will receive more attention this month than Pro Bowler **Aaron Kampman**, who makes the switch to outside linebacker from defensive end.
- In addition to serving as the head coach of two different expansion franchises (Carolina and Houston), Capers brings an impressive résumé as a coordinator. Pittsburgh ranked No. 22 in overall defense in 1991, the year before Capers' arrival. The Steelers' defense rose up in the defensive rankings to 13th in 1992, Capers' first season as a defensive coordinator in the NFL. The unit rose to No. 3 in 1993 and No. 2 in 1994, earning the moniker "Blitzburgh" with one of the decade's most feared defenses.
- Capers' instant impact was also seen in his stint as defensive coordinator with Jacksonville (1999-00) and Miami (2006-07). Ranking 25th in overall defense in 1998, the Jaguars' unit rose immediately under Capers in '99 to No. 4 overall in addition to allowing the fewest points in the NFL. The Dolphins ranked No. 18 in overall defense in 2005 but rose to No. 4 in 2006 under Capers, with DE Jason Taylor earning Defensive Player of the Year honors that season as well.

## SOME NEW FACES SURROUND MANY FAMILIAR ONES

While coaches get familiar with their surroundings in Green Bay, much of the Packers' young core remains intact.

- In fact, 21 of 22 primary starters from last season remain on the team, as do many backups who saw significant action in '08.
- Ten starters return on offense, while all 11 return on defense. But that doesn't mean there won't be some serious competition for playing time – and roster spots – this month.
- As has been the case under General Manager **Ted Thompson**, most

new players have come this offseason via the draft. 2009 will mark the first time since 1993 that the team has two first-round picks, and both NT **B.J. Raji** (No. 9 overall) and LB **Clay Matthews** (No. 26 overall) are expected to compete for playing time immediately.

- On offense, G/T **T.J. Lang** (fourth round) and T **Jamon Meredith** (fifth round) will be in the mix along the offensive line, while FB **Quinn Johnson** (fifth round) could push for a starting job.
- With an almost entirely new defensive staff, DE **Jarius Wynn** (sixth round), CB **Brandon Underwood** (sixth round) and LB **Brad Jones** (seventh round) will all get a chance at their respective positions.

► Joining the Packers via free agency were C/G **Duke Preston** and S **Anthony Smith**. Preston spent four seasons with the Buffalo Bills after being drafted by the Bills in the fourth round of the 2005 NFL Draft. He appeared in 59 games, starting 20 of them, including a career-high 11 starts in 2008.

► Smith, a third-round draft choice by Pittsburgh in 2006, spent three seasons with the Steelers. He appeared in 46 games, including 14 starts.

## REST AND RECOVERY

In addition to the traditional days off after a pre-season game, Coach McCarthy has built in three off days to help players recuperate.

► The team receives the first three Wednesdays (Aug. 5, 12, and 19) off before settling into a routine more closely mirroring the regular season.

► On those days, the team gathers in the morning for weight lifting, meetings, and film review, and then has the afternoon and evening off before two practices the next day.

## 2009 TRAINING CAMP

### ST. NORBERT AND THE PACKERS

Continuing a tradition started under Packers coach Scooter McLean in 1958, the Green Bay Packers will call St. Norbert College home for a 52nd consecutive training camp this summer. The relationship between the private college in De Pere, Wis., and the Green Bay Packers marks the longest continual use of any training camp facility by an NFL team.

- Players will take up residence in Victor McCormick Hall, a 60-room coed dormitory used to house 225 students during the academic year.
- St. Norbert, founded in 1898 by Abbot Bernard Pennings, celebrated its 110th anniversary last October.
- The Packers use their own practice and team-meeting facilities at Lambeau Field during training camp, with the college serving as housing headquarters.
- Players return to St. Norbert via cars and vans every evening for team dinner.
- The 6.62-mile commute is estimated at 11 minutes each way.
- The team will travel roughly 264.8 miles between the college and practice facility during training camp...that's almost 4,660 lengths of a football field. It will take an estimated 7 hours, 20 minutes for the team to commute to and from the college...roughly the time of two-and-a-half NFL games.

### NATIONALLY TELEVISED GAMES HEADLINE 2009 SCHEDULE

The Green Bay Packers' regular-season schedule – containing five nationally televised games – was released in April by the National Football League.

- The Packers will play each of their NFC North opponents in front of a national audience, including a primetime opener in Week 1 against the Chicago Bears at Lambeau Field and a Thanksgiving game in Detroit against the Lions in Week 12.
- Green Bay also will travel to Minnesota to take on the rival Vikings in Week 4 for the first of two appearances on *Monday Night Football*.
- "It's great to see that the NFL and our network partners feel strongly about the national appeal and popularity of the Packers, with five of our games slated for national broadcasts," President and CEO **Mark Murphy** said. "For those taking in games at Lambeau Field, we'll now begin our detailed planning with our sponsors for creating the great gameday fan experience."
- The Packers' other appearance on Monday night comes Dec. 7 in a Week 13 showdown with the Baltimore Ravens at Lambeau Field. It marks the first *MNF* game played at Lambeau Field in the month of December.
- 2009 marks the 17th consecutive season the Packers have appeared on *Monday Night Football*, the NFC's longest active streak.
- Green Bay's fifth game in front of a national TV audience comes against the Dallas Cowboys in Week 10. The Nov. 15 game will kick off at 3:15 p.m. on FOX. The fifth home game on the schedule, the Cowboys contest is slated as a Gold Package (Milwaukee season-ticket holders) game. Cincinnati comes to Lambeau Field in Week 2 for the other Gold Package game.
- "I'm excited for the 2009 regular season – we have a great opportunity starting with two home games and three early division games," Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** said. "Playing on Monday night after Thanksgiving will give us a chance for another break before the final month. Historically we've been strong in December, and we'll look to rise to that challenge."
- Green Bay's final four games of the season, including matchups at Super Bowl XLIII opponents Arizona and Pittsburgh, as well as the club's final division game of the season in Chicago, are all subject to the NFL's flexible scheduling.
- Built into the schedule for Sundays from Weeks 11-17, flex changes must be announced 12 days prior to kickoff, except for Week 17, which is announced on six days' notice.

- Green Bay is not a candidate to be flexed in Week 11 against San Francisco because the team plays just four days later against Detroit on Thanksgiving. The Packers also are not a candidate to be flexed in Week 13 because of the Monday night matchup against the Ravens.

### SCHEDULE NUGGETS

- Green Bay's bye week – which occurs in Week 5 – is the earliest bye for the team since 1999, when it had its bye in Week 4.
- Though their bye week comes early, the Packers will get some extra rest coming off the Week 12 Thanksgiving contest. They won't play until the following Monday night, Dec. 7, at home.
- The Packers have five games against playoff teams from a year ago (Week 4 at Minnesota, Week 8 vs. Minnesota, Week 13 vs. Baltimore, Week 15 at Pittsburgh and Week 17 at Arizona).
- The first four games of the season will be broadcast on four different networks. After the bye week, Green Bay has seven straight games on FOX and could have 11 of the last 12 on the network, pending the NFL's flex scheduling. Also dependent upon the flex scheduling is the amount of 12 noon starts, which at this point is set for 10 games. An 11th, at Detroit, is set for 11:30 a.m.
- Green Bay plays three of the four teams who played in last season's conference championships. All three games (vs. Baltimore, at Pittsburgh, at Arizona) occur in the season's final five weeks. Making the season's final stretch tougher too is the fact that three of the final four games will be on the road.
- For the first time since 2003, the Packers will not play a division opponent in the season's final three weeks.

## POSITION-BY-POSITION

### BY THE NUMBERS

Nothing gets more attention during training camp, both from fans and media, than positional battles. Here's a look at the Packers' current roster, and how things are shaping up after one week. Just a quick note – the first number is the number of players at that position currently on the roster, while the second is the number at the position during Week 1 last season.

#### Quarterback – 3 (3)

- ▶ **Aaron Rodgers** begins his second year under center for the Packers and looks more comfortable in the offense than he did a year ago. That may not be good news for opponents considering the statistical milestones Rodgers eclipsed in 2008. His stated goals this offseason were to improve on his consistency and to work with play-caller **Mike McCarthy** to expand his role in the offensive game plan, which he'll now get a chance to do in preseason action.
- ▶ Behind Rodgers there will be a competition between second-year signal callers **Matt Flynn** and **Brian Brohm** for the backup role. Flynn, a 2008 seventh-round selection, beat out Brohm, a 2008 second-round selection, last summer.
- ▶ Both went through their first year of McCarthy's quarterback school this offseason and split reps during OTAs this spring. Each will get a long look at No. 2 this August.

#### Running back – 5 (3)

- ▶ **Ryan Grant** enters entrenched as the clear starter and under much different circumstances than a year ago. Grant missed all of the offseason work prior to the 2008 season because of contract issues, and then proceeded to hurt his hamstring in one of his first training camp practices.
- ▶ That hamstring caused Grant to come out of the gates a bit slow, but he still managed to become just the fourth player in team history to top the 1,200-yard mark.
- ▶ Now Grant will get preseason action under his belt, which could help him return to the explosive form he showed in 2007.
- ▶ Vying for carries behind Grant will be a trio of returning veterans – **Brandon Jackson**, **Kregg Lumpkin** and **DeShawn Wynn** – along with rookie free agent **Tyrell Sutton**. Jackson and Wynn have both been fighting through injuries, meaning Lumpkin and Sutton should both get plenty of opportunities.

#### Fullback – 3 (2)

- ▶ Last year the team kept two fullbacks, but with two veterans returning and a rookie draft pick in his first training camp, this position figures to be among the most competitive battles for a roster spot.
- ▶ Both **Korey Hall** and **John Kuhn** will be in the mix having been valuable contributors from scrimmage and on special teams each of the last two seasons.
- ▶ A knee injury suffered early in the season ultimately cost Hall five games last season, but the third-year pro has returned healthy this offseason. Kuhn saw his most extended action in '08 since arriving in Green Bay, but whether the team can afford to keep both for another season will be sorted out this summer.
- ▶ Also added to the mix this spring was **Quinn Johnson**, the team's fifth-round pick in the 2009 NFL Draft. Lauded as a traditional fullback, Johnson paved the way for a 1,100-yard rusher in each of his final two seasons at LSU while also proving to be a reliable option in short-

yardage situations and as a pass catcher.

#### Tight end – 6 (3)

- ▶ Tight end is always an interesting position to keep an eye on because of the way McCarthy likes to utilize the position on offense, especially with multiple tight-end sets.
- ▶ **Donald Lee**, the unit's primary starter each of the last two seasons, might be one of the more unheralded players at the position across the NFL. His numbers over the past two seasons (87 catches, 878 yards, 11 touchdowns) prove as much.
- ▶ One of the players on the roster most will be keeping an eye on is **Jermichael Finley**, a prime candidate to have a breakout season. Entering his second season and still only 22, Finley showed flashes of his potential at the end of his rookie season and is certainly a big, athletic target for Rodgers.
- ▶ With the injury to **Tory Humphrey**, both **Spencer Havner** and **Evan Moore** should see plenty of game action. Havner is trying to make the conversion from linebacker, while Moore is a tall and athletic target who spent last season on injured reserve.



#### Offensive line – 14 (9)

- ▶ An opportunity for someone to emerge at the right tackle spot will dominate the talk along the offensive line, but there's also plenty to watch along the interior of the line.
- ▶ **Jason Spitz**, who has started at each of the three inside positions in his first three years in the league, has been competing with veteran **Scott Wells** at center. Wells battled through an injury-riddled campaign in 2008, and offseason shoulder surgery kept the veteran out of offseason workouts. Spitz, who slid over to center in Wells' absence, is making the move to center not only because of his ability there, but because of the emergence of **Josh Sitton** at right guard.
- ▶ Sitton first cracked the starting lineup last summer in his first training camp, and the second-year pro will have every opportunity to win the job at right guard this summer. At

this point, all three seem to be in a rotation with the first unit. Veterans **Chad Clifton** and **Daryn Colledge** make up the left side of the line, with Clifton having 126 career starts in the Green and Gold. In three seasons, Colledge has 44 career starts.

- ▶ A new starter will take over the spot at right tackle, and it appears to be mainly a competition between **Allen Barbre** and **Breno Giacomini**. Barbre, a third-year pro, spent the entire offseason with the No. 1 offense, while Giacomini spent the offseason rehabbing an ankle injury. Rookie **T.J. Lang** has been a bright spot thus far at both guard and tackle and could become a factor at the spot.

#### Defensive end – 7 (6)

- ▶ Defensive end will have a much different look both in responsibility and in roster numbers in defensive coordinator **Dom Capers'** 3-4 defense. The Packers kept six on the opening-day roster for 2008, but that number may drop this season.
- ▶ **Cullen Jenkins**, who has played both inside and outside, has looked outstanding thus far in camp in his return from a pectoral injury that cut short what was promising to be a career season in 2008. Jenkins appeared in the first four games, with the Packers' defense collecting nine sacks over that time. The team accumulated 18 sacks in the 12 games Jenkins missed.
- ▶ Two players who may get the chance to start opposite Jenkins are

**Johnny Jolly** and **Justin Harrell**. Both former defensive tackles in the old scheme, Jolly has the edge in experience with 32 games played, including 23 starts, in his first three NFL campaigns. Harrell has appeared in just 13 games since arriving in Green Bay as a first-round pick in 2007 but has been given a lot of reps thus far in camp, especially with Jolly suffering an ankle injury in the first week.

- ▶ Another player who could see significant time at end is first-round pick **B.J. Raji**, though he remains unsigned at this point. Raji spent significant time at end once he arrived in Green Bay this offseason and appears as though he will spend time both inside and outside in his first season.
- ▶ Veterans **Alfred Malone** and **Michael Montgomery** will get a chance to earn backup roles. As with any position on the roster this time of year, the duo has some competition from younger players in **Jarius Wynn**, a sixth-round draft pick from Georgia, and rookie free agent **Ronald Talley**.

### Nose tackle – 4 (3)

- ▶ The Packers kept only three defensive tackles last season in their 4-3 scheme, but there isn't really an accurate way of predicting just what the coaching and personnel staff will decide to do in the 3-4.
- ▶ Raji will obviously see time at the position once he enters camp but is now well behind starter **Ryan Pickett** in reps. Like Raji, Pickett could see time at multiple positions along the line, but he has practiced exclusively at nose tackle thus far.
- ▶ Both **Dean Muhtadi** and **Anthony Toribio** provide some depth at the position, and it remains to be seen whether Capers and the staff will take a look at any of the ends – Harrell, Jenkins or Jolly – at the nose tackle position.



### Linebacker – 12 (6)

- ▶ No position may look more different in 2009 than it did in 2008 than linebacker. Whether it be former defensive ends converting to the outside or veterans adjusting to new responsibilities, it will be one of the most highly watched position groups in camp.
- ▶ The team will most likely keep more than the total it did last year and should have considerable competition at both inside and outside spots.
- ▶ Converted from defensive end were **Aaron Kampman** and **Jeremy Thompson**, both of whom have lined up with the first-team defense. Kampman, one of the NFL's most productive pass rushers over the past three seasons, will be under a media microscope all summer as he converts to playing without his hand on the ground.
- ▶ Thompson seems like an ideal fit for the position and was praised by coaches for his quick transition to the position. Still, Thompson is entering just his second season, and has already split first-team reps with first-round draft pick **Clay Matthews**. Both should be major contributors on various special-teams units.
- ▶ In the middle will be veterans **Nick Barnett** and **A.J. Hawk**, though Barnett remains on PUP. **Desmond Bishop** and **Brandon Chillar** have enjoyed outstanding starts to their respective training camps, giving the team great depth along the inside.
- ▶ **Spencer Havner** and **Danny Lamsanah** both were valuable members of the special-teams units a year ago and remain in the mix inside. Veteran **Brady Poppinga** could earn reps on the outside and some pass-rush opportunities, where he will be competing with rookie draft

pick **Brad Jones**, who has thus far been on PUP, and free agent **Cyril Obiozor**.

### Cornerback – 9 (6)

- ▶ While the team may no longer play as much press coverage as it had become known for in prior seasons, this group is still led by Pro Bowlers **Al Harris** and **Charles Woodson**. Both have been impressive in the earlygoing and seem to have grasped the new system quickly.
- ▶ Behind the veteran duo is a group of young corners, led by third-year man **Tramon Williams**. When Harris was sidelined last season with a spleen injury, Williams stepped up in his absence and finished the season with five interceptions.
- ▶ After Williams, a number of young corners will be looking to establish themselves in sub packages and on special teams. **Will Blackmon**, the team's primary return specialist, and **Pat Lee**, a second-round pick in

2008, will have every chance to earn those opportunities this August. So too will **Joe Porter**, who appeared in his first game action last season after spending portions of the previous two seasons on the practice squad, sixth-round draft pick **Brandon Underwood** from the University of Cincinnati, and rookie free agent **Trevor Ford**.

### Safety – 5 (4)

- ▶ All five safeties on the roster have NFL experience, and when you include **Jarrett Bush**, who will play both corner and safety and is a top player on the Packers' special-teams units, this could be one of the most competitive positions in camp.
- ▶ **Nick Collins** is coming off a career season in which he earned his first Pro Bowl berth, and the fifth-year player remains neck-and-neck with Woodson for the interception lead thus far in camp. Collins, who must make more calls and checks in the new scheme, will be under close watch to see how quickly he can transition to the new defense.
- ▶ At the other safety position, **Atari Bigby** will look to regain the form he had two seasons ago after suffering through an injury-plagued '08. Competing for reps at both spots will be veterans **Charlie Peprah** and **Aaron Rouse**, who saw time in the secondary last season in Bigby's absence. Joining the team this offseason as a free agent was **Anthony Smith**, who spent his first three NFL seasons in the 3-4 in Pittsburgh.

### Specialists – 4 (3)

- ▶ Though no specialist job in the NFL could ever be deemed secure, kicker **Mason Crosby** and long snapper **Brett Goode** are the only players at their respective positions on the roster. With a solid performance in camp and in preseason action, each should be back for another season.
- ▶ Where the competition lies will be at punter, where incumbent **Jeremy Kapinos** will try to hold off **Durant Brooks**. Kapinos punted in the last four games for the team last season and does cause return men some problems as a left-footed kicker. Brooks was a sixth-round draft pick in 2008 by the Washington Redskins and punted in six games for the team before he was released. Both have been a bit shaky thus far in practices and will be under close watch now that the live action begins.
