## 

For the first time since 1992, the Packers will close out their regular season at Minnesota when they play the Vikings this Sunday.

- The Packers improved to 11-4 on the season with a 55-7 victory over Tennessee on Sunday. Green Bay is currently the No. 2 seed in the NFC and can clinch a first-round bye for the second straight season with a win at Minnesota.

- This marks the fourth time in the history of the series (since 1961) that the two clubs have met in a season finale at Minnesota, with the other meetings coming in 1984, 1991 and 1992. It is the first time the teams have met in the regular-season finale since 1996.
- The 1996 meeting at Lambeau Field was the last time both teams entered the matchup with nine or more wins. Green Bay came into the '96 finale with a 12-3 mark and the Vikings entered the game at 9-6.
The clubs played earlier this month in Week 13 (Dec. 2), as this marks the first time in the series that both games have been in December.
- The Packers have won nine consecutive season finales (2003-11), the longest current streak in the NFL and the longest in franchise history.
- Over the past 18 seasons (1994-2011), Green Bay has won its regularseason finale every year but one (2002).
-The Packers have won at least 10 games each of the last four seasons, which ties the franchise record (1929-32, 1995-98, 2001-04). Green Bay and New England are the only teams in the league with 10 -plus wins each of the last four seasons (2009-12).
-Green Bay has won nine of its last 10 games, which is the second-best record in the league since Week 6 behind only Denver (10-0).
-With their 21-13 win at Chicago in Week 15, the Packers extended their franchise-record divisional winning streak to 12 games (previous mark was eight games). It is tied for the longest divisional winning streak since realignment in 2002 with Indianapolis (2004-06) and Baltimore (2010-12).
- The Packers will be looking to become the first NFL team to go undefeated in its division in back-to-back seasons since the league went to a divsional format in 1967 (according to the Elias Sports Bureau). Green Bay went 6-0 in the NFC North in 2011 and has a 5-0 record this season.
- Green Bay has had a winning record in its division for a franchise-record seven consecutive seasons. New England is the only other team in the NFL to post a winning record in its division each year from 2006-12.
- The Packers have won five straight NFC North regular-season games away from Lambeau Field, the longest streak by the team since a fivegame road divisional streak from 2006-07.
- Green Bay has won 11 of its last 15 (.733) regular-season road contests.
-The Packers have won 28 of their last 33 regular-season games overall (.848), the best record in the league over that span.
- This Sunday's contest will be Green Bay's fifth game indoors this season, the most ever in a season in franchise history (four indoor games in 1987, 1992, 1996, 2004 and 2009).

WEEK 17

FOX Sports, now in its 19th season as an NFL network television partner, will broadcast the game to the majority of the country.

- Play-by-play man Joe Buck and color analyst Troy Aikman will have the call from the broadcast booth with Pam Oliver reporting from the sidelines.
- Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since 1929, heads up the 53 -station Packers
Radio Network, with Wayne Larrivee (play-by-play) and two-time Packers Pro Bowler Larry McCarren (color) calling the action. The duo enters its 14th season of broadcasts together across the Packers Radio Network, which covers 44 markets in six states.
- Dial Global Sports radio will air the game across the country. Kevin Kugler (play-by-play) and Mark Malone (analyst) will call the action, with Scott Graham hosting pregame and halftime shows.
- The broadcast is also available on Sirius Satellite Radio (Channel 104) as part of the network's NFL Sunday Drive.
- DIRECTV subscribers can watch the game in HD on Channel 706.

## PACKERS AT VIKINGS - WEEK 17

## 

With its current 12-game winning streak in regular-season NFC North games, Green Bay has set the franchise record for the longest divisional winning streak since the league went to a divisional format in 1967:

-The Packers' 12-game divisional winning streak is tied for the longest in the league since realignment in 2002. Indianapolis (2004-06) and Baltimore (2010-12) also posted 12-game divisional winning streaks.

- A glance at the top current divisional winning streaks in the NFL:

During their current 12-game divisional winning streak, the Packers have outscored their opponents by a combined total of 340 to 208 and have a turnover differential of plus-14 (29 takeaways, 15 giveaways).
-Green Bay went 6-0 in NFC North games in 2011, the first time that the Packers had posted an undefeated record in their division since the NFL went to a divisional format in 1967. Green Bay became the first team to sweep the NFC North/Central since the 1987 Chicago Bears (7-0).
-The Packers have a 32-9 (.780) regular-season record against NFC North opponents under Head Coach Mike McCarthy, a divisional mark that ranks No. 2 in the NFL since 2006:

-The Packers have won 18 of 21 NFC North games at home under McCarthy, the No. $\mathbf{1}$ home divisional mark in the NFL over that span:

The Packers have won two straight NFC North titles for the first time since 2002-04, when the team captured three consecutive divisional crowns.

- This season's NFC North title marks the Packers' 20th division crown in franchise history.
With the Week 15 win at Chicago, Green Bay clinched its 28th postseason berth in team history and its 15th appearance in the last 20 seasons.
- The Packers have made the playoffs in five of the last six seasons, the only NFC team to accomplish that feat over that span (2007-12).
Green Bay currently ranks No. 3 in NFL history with its 28 playoff appearances, trailing only the N.Y. Giants (31) and Dallas Cowboys (30).
- The Packers' 15 postseason appearances in the free-agency era (since 1993) are the most of any team in the NFL.

Since Head Coach Mike McCarthy took over in 2006, the Packers have been one of the best teams in the league down the stretch.
-The Packers have a 23-9 regular-season record in December/January games since 2006, a . 719 winning percentage that ranks No. 3 in the NFL over that span:

-The Packers have won 10 of their last 11 regular-season games played in December/January.
-Green Bay ranks No. 4 in the league in scoring offense in December/ January since 2006 with an average of 27.4 points per game.
The Packers rank No. 4 in the NFL in scoring defense in December/ January over that span with an average of 18.0 points allowed per game.

## STAT OF THE WEEK

-In Sunday's victory over the Titans, the Packers had their best scoring output of Mike McCarthy's head-coaching tenure.
The 55 points registered in the 55-7 victory were tied for the third most in a game in franchise history. It was the best scoring output by the Packers since they beat Tampa Bay, 55-14, on Oct. 2, 1983, at Lambeau Field.
Green Bay's scoring total on Sunday trails only the Packers' 57 points vs. Detroit on Oct. 7, 1945, and the 56-point output vs. Atlanta on Oct. 23, 1966.
-The Packers' 48-point margin of victory was their largest since a 49-point win over New Orleans at Lambeau Field (52-3) on Oct. 9, 2005. It is tied for the fifth-largest margin of victory in franchise history with a 55-7 win vs. Cleveland in Milwaukee on Nov. 12, 1967.
Sunday's effort by Green Bay was the eighth 50-point game registered by an NFL team this season. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, that is the most in the league in a single season since there were 10 games of 50 -plus points in 1966 .

Sunday's game will be the last of five indoor games for Green Bay this season, an environment the Packers have had success in during Head Coach Mike McCarthy's tenure.

- Since McCarthy took over in 2006, the Packers are 18-7 (.720) in dome games (including playoffs). That ranks No. 2 in the NFL among teams with eight or more road/neutral dome games behind only the N.Y. Jets (7-2, .778).
-McCarthy won his first six dome games as head coach before the Packers fell just short at Minnesota in a 28-27 loss on Nov. 9, 2008.
In 19 of the 25 dome contests, the Packers have posted at least 345 yards of total offense (15-4 record in those games).

-QB Aaron Rodgers has a 116.6 passer rating in 20 career starts in domes (including postseason), with 5,927 passing yards, 49 TDs and just eight INTs on 453-of-659 passing ( 68.7 percent). His career 116.6 rating indoors ranks No. 1 in NFL history (min. 200 attempts).

- Rodgers has posted a passer rating of 100 or better in 17 of his 20 career dome starts. He has eclipsed the 300 -yard passing mark in 13 of 20 games and has thrown three or more TD passes in 10 of them.
In his last nine dome starts (including playoffs), Rodgers has thrown for 2,859 yards and 27 TDs with just two interceptions on 220-of-310 passing (71.0 percent) for a $\mathbf{1 2 6 . 0}$ passer rating. He posted a 100-plus passer rating in all nine of those games, with seven 300-yard games and three-plus TD passes in six of them.

-The Packers' defense has done its part as well, posting 55 takeaways (2.2 per game) and 10 defensive touchdowns in the 25 dome games since ' 06 , including 10 contests with at least three takeaways. That has contributed to Green Bay's plus-26 turnover ratio indoors since 2006.

QB Aaron Rodgers has had a high level of success against NFC North opponents during his career.

- Rodgers has posted a combined 109.1 passer rating against divisional opponents, connecting on 607 of 874 passes ( 69.5 percent) for 7,246 yards and 57 TDs with 15 INTs. A look at where Rodgers ranks in NFL history in several categories against divisional opponents:

- In his last 10 regular-season starts against NFC North opponents, Rodgers has completed 223 of 314 passes ( 71.0 percent) for 2,677 yards and 24 touchdowns with four INTs for a 114.5 passer rating.
$\rightarrow$ Rodgers has a 23-6 record (including playoffs) as a starter against divisional foes.
-In nine career starts vs. Minnesota, Rodgers has a combined 114.2 passer rating. He has completed 202 of 286 passes ( 70.6 percent) for 2,458 yards and 20 TDs with four INTs.

Through 103 meetings, which includes one postseason game, the Packers hold a 54-48-1 advantage over the Vikings in the all-time series.
Fans can bet on a back-and-forth contest when the teams meet. In fact, 15 of the last 20 regular-season meetings have been decided by seven points or less.

- The Packers have swept the season series in four of six seasons under Head Coach Mike McCarthy (2006-07, 2010-11) and will be looking to do it for the fifth time in seven seasons this Sunday.
-Green Bay has won five straight against the Vikings, its longest streak since a five-game winning streak vs. Minnesota from 2006-08.
- The Packers will be looking to match their longest winning streak against the Vikings in the history of the series (since 1961). Green Bay won the first six meetings between the clubs from 1961-63.
-Green Bay's 38-point win (45-7) over Minnesota last season in Week 10 was the largest margin of victory by either team in the history of the series.

MIKE McCARTHY...Is in seventh year as the Packers' 14th head coach.

- Joined Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl title with a win over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.
- Has led the Packers to playoff appearances in four of his six seasons as the helm, and the team's four postseason berths over the past five seasons are the most by an NFC team.
- His . 664 winning percentage (including playoffs) ranks No. 3 among active NFL coaches (min. 50 games).
- One of only two coaches, along with New Orleans' Sean Payton, to have his offense ranked in the top 10 in total yardage each season from 2006-11.
-Was named Packers head coach on Jan. 12, 2006, his first headcoaching job after 13 years as an NFL assistant.
- Became the first Packers coach since Lombardi to lead the team to a championship game in his second season (2007).

LESLIE FRAZIER...Is in third year as the Vikings' eighth head coach (served as the interim coach for the final six games in 2010).
-Served as Minnesota's defensive coordinator for four seasons (200710) and led the Vikings to top-10 finishes in total defense each season from 2008-10.
-Coached with the Philadelphia Eagles (1999-2002), Cincinnati Bengals (2003-04) and Indianapolis Colts (2005-06) before coming to Minnesota. In 12 seasons as NFL coach, has suffered a losing season only twice.

- Has coached on seven playoff teams and been a part of six division championships in his first 13 seasons as an NFL coach.
-Played defensive back for the Chicago Bears (1981-86) and was a member of Chicago's Super Bowl XX team.

This marks the 104th overall meeting between the border rivals.

- The Packers own a slight advantage over the Vikings (54-48-1, including playoffs) in the all-time series.
-Green Bay's current five-game winning streak is the longest by the club since a five-game streak against Minnesota from 2006-08. Prior to that, the longest streak for either team was Green Bay's five-game winning streak from 1983-85.
-The series began when the Vikings entered the league in 1961, and Vince Lombardi's Packers won nine of the first 10.
-Over the last 19 seasons (1994-2012), these teams have accounted for 14 NFC Central/North division championships.

Packers LB Robert Francois entered the league as a non-drafted free agent with the Vikings in 2009...Packers C Jeff Saturday played for the Colts with Vikings G Charlie Johnson and when Vikings head coach Leslie Frazier and defensive coordinator Alan Williams were on the staff in Indianapolis...Packers tight ends coach Jerry Fontenot played for the Bengals in 2004 when Frazier was on Cincinnati's staff...Fontenot was a teammate of Vikings special assistant to the head coach/linebackers Mike Singletary with the Bears...Singletary coached with Packers head coach Mike McCarthy and quarterbacks coach Ben McAdoo on the San Francisco staff in 2005...Vikings tight ends coach Jimmie Johnson played for Kansas City for one season (1994) when McCarthy was an offensive asst. there...Packers assistant offensive line coach Joel Hilgenberg's uncle, Wally, played linebacker for the Vikings for for 12 seasons (196879)...Vikings special teams coordinator Mike Priefer's father, Chuck, was an assistant coach for the Packers from 1984-85...Vikings defensive backs coach Joe Woods held the same post at Western Michigan when Packers WR Greg Jennings played there...Packers defensive coordinator Dom Capers and Vikings linebackers coach Fred Pagac coached on the staff together at Ohio State in the early 1980s...Pagac coached in Oakland when Packers DB Charles Woodson played for the Raiders...Vikings asst. defensive line coach Diron Reynolds' brother, Jamal, was selected in the first round by the Packers in 2001...Packers running backs coach Alex Van Pelt played for the Bills when Vikings running backs coach James Saxon was on Buffalo's staff...Packers defensive line coach Mike Trgovac and Vikings offensive line coach Jeff Davidson coached on the staff together in Carolina...Trgovac was on the staff with Vikings strength and conditioning coach Tom Kanavy in Philadelphia and when Johnson played tight end for the Eagles...Former college teammates include Packers LB Clay Matthews and Vikings DE Everson Griffen, FB Rhett Ellison and T Matt Kalil (Southern California), Packers TE Jermichael Finley and Vikings DE Brian Robison (Texas), Packers DE Ryan Pickett and Vikings CB Antonie Winfield and WR Michael Jenkins (Ohio State), Packers LB A.J. Oct. 23, 2011, at Mall of America Field; Packers won, 33-27.

- QB Aaron Rodgers led the offense with 335 passing yards and three TDs on 24-of-30 passing with no interceptions.
-WR Greg Jennings led the club with seven receptions for 147 yards, highlighted by a 79-yard TD grab early in the second half.
-RB James Starks rushed for 75 yards on 13 carries ( 5.8 avg.), with 55 of those yards coming on the Packers' final drive as they ran the final 2:30 off the clock.
-CB Charles Woodson picked off rookie QB Christian Ponder twice on the afternoon, the sixth multi-INT game of his Green Bay career.
$\rightarrow$ RB Adrian Peterson led the Vikings with 175 yards rushing and a TD on 24 carries ( 7.3 avg. ).

With a win in Week 15 at Chicago, Green Bay posted its fourth straight 10-win season, tying a franchise record (1929-32, 1995-98, 2001-04).
Sunday's win vs. Tennessee brought the Packers' win total over the past four seasons to 47, which ranks second in franchise history:

Green Bay's pass defense has made noticeable strides this season, with the team currently checking in at No. 12 in the NFL (217.7 ypg).
That is more than an 82-yard improvement from Green Bay's average in 2011, when the Packers allowed a league-high 299.8 yards per game.
In their Week 16 win over the Titans, the Packers allowed just 101 net passing yards, the fifth time this season that Green Bay limited its opposition to less than 120 net passing yards. That ranks No. 1 in the league this season:

-Woodson has returned an INT for a touchdown in six straight seasons (2006-11), becoming the first player in NFL history to do so. No other NFL player has accomplished the feat in more than four consecutive seasons.
-Woodson's nine interceptions for TDs from 2006-11 ranked No. 1 in the league over that span, more than double the total of the nine players that tied for the No. 2 spot with four each.
-Woodson's nine interception TDs over the past six seasons (2006-11) were tied for the most by a player over a six-year period in NFL history, matching the mark of Houston Oilers safety Ken Houston (1967-72).
-With his first INT for a TD coming in his rookie season of 1998, the time from Woodson's first INT-TD to his most recent spans 14 seasons (1998-2011). That ranks tied for No. 3 in NFL history behind only Rod Woodson (1987-2002) and Deion Sanders (1990-2004), according to the Elias Sports Bureau.

- His INT return for a score against the Broncos was his ninth career with the Packers, further extending his franchise record. Adderley ranks No. 2 in team annals (seven, 1961-69).
It was also Woodson's 10th defensive TD (nine INTs, one fumble return) in a Green Bay uniform, which further extended his franchise mark.
-He led the Packers with a career-high five forced fumbles in 2010. He was the only defensive back in the NFL to register four or more forced fumbles each season in 2009 and 2010.

Re－establishing home－field advantage after a 4－4 mark in 2008 was one of the goals of 2009，and with the Packers finishing 6－2 at home，they accomplished that goal．Green Bay followed that up with a 7－1 mark at Lambeau Field in 2010，a perfect 8－0 record in 2011，the first undefeated home mark since 2002，and a 7－1 mark this season．
－Head Coach Mike McCarthy stated consistently upon his arrival in Green Bay that one of the team＇s goals would be to reclaim the mystique of playing at Lambeau Field．Mission accomplished．The team is 41－9 （．820）at home over the past 50 regular－season games．

## 2 MASON CROSBY

- His 649 points from 2006-11 rank No. 1 in NFL history for the most points scored by a player in his first five seasons, topping the mark of Washington K Chip Lohmiller (625, 1988-92). Has 752 career points, four shy of setting the NFL record for the most points by a player in his first six seasons (Indianapolis K Mike Vanderjagt, 755, 1998-2003).
In 2011, set a franchise record with a 58 -yard field goal in Week 7 at Minnesota, eclipsing the mark of 56 yards he held (Week 1 at Philadelphia, 2010; Week 5 at Atlanta, 2011).
Ranks No. 5 in team annals with 752 career points, having surpassed Jim Taylor (546) last season at Atlanta in Week 5. Needs nine points to surpass No. 4 Paul Hornung (760).
$\rightarrow$ Reached the 700 -point mark for his career in his 89th game, second fastest to 700 in team history behind only Hornung ( 87 games).
- Ranks No. 2 in team history for the most 100-point seasons with six, trailing only K Ryan Longwell (eight).
- Made 23 straight field goals from Week 13 of 2010 through Week 10 of 2011, the longest regular-season streak in franchise history as he eclipsed Chris Jacke's mark of 17 (1993).
- For his career, has hit 100 of 111 field goals ( 90.1 percent) from 39 yards and closer.
- Has hit 37 of 53 field goals ( 69.8 percent) from 40-49 yards.

Has hit 13 of 32 field goals ( 40.6 percent) from 50 -plus yards.

## 80 DONALD DRIVER

- Has 10,137 career receiving yards, which ranks No. 1 on the franchise's all-time list. Surpassed James Lofton $(9,656)$ at Carolina in Week 2 of 2011.

Surpassed Sterling Sharpe (595) in 2009 to become the franchise's alltime leader in receptions. Driver now has 743 career catches.
Had a reception in 133 consecutive games, besting the franchise's previous long streak of Sharpe's 103 (1988-94), before not catching a pass in Week 7 of 2011 against Minnesota.
-In 2010, had 50-plus receptions for the ninth time, extending his franchise record. Lofton and Sharpe each had seven seasons with 50 -plus catches.
Holds Lambeau Field records for receptions (363) and receiving yards $(5,000)$.
Topped the 1,000-yard receiving mark for a seventh overall season and sixth consecutive in 2009, extending his own team record in each category.

- Ranks No. 2 in team annals with 27 TD catches at Lambeau Field, trailing only WR Antonio Freeman (36) in the stadium's history.
Has 22 career 100-yard receiving games, which is tied for No. 4 in team history. Needs two more games to equal No. 3 Don Hutson (24) on the all-time list.
With 61 career TD receptions, ranks No. 3 in team history behind only Hutson (99) and Sharpe (65).
Is tied for No. 5 in team history with Paul Hornung with 62 overall touchdowns. Is four shy of No. 4 Sharpe (66).
Ranks No. 2 all-time in yards from scrimmage with 10,354, trailing only RB Ahman Green $(11,048)$.
-Ranks No. 2 in team history for the most games played with 204, trailing only QB Brett Favre (255).


## 88 JERMICHAEL FINLEY

Is one of only two tight ends (Paul Coffman) in franchise history to register two 55-catch seasons (2009 and 2011).
-Ranks No. 2 all-time among Green Bay tight ends with three 100-yard receiving games in his career, trailing only Coffman (six).
Ranks No. 3 among TEs in team history with 2,413 receiving yards and needs 182 more yards to surpass No. 2 Ron Kramer $(2,594)$.
Is No. 4 among TEs in team annals with 190 receptions. Needs 13 more catches to move past No. 3 Ed West (202).
In Week 4 vs. New Orleans, surpassed 2,000 career receiving yards in his 52nd career game, fastest among tight ends in franchise history (Coffman, 66 games).

## 85 GREG JENNINGS

-With 12 TD receptions in 2010, joined Sterling Sharpe, Antonio Freeman and Billy Howton as the only Packers to post 12-plus TD catches in two different seasons.
By eclipsing the 1,000-yard receiving mark in 2010, became the fifth player in team history to post three straight 1,000-yard receiving seasons, joining Lofton, Sharpe, Freeman and Driver.

- His four career TD catches of 80-plus yards are a franchise record.

In 2011, had 147 receiving yards in Week 7 at Minnesota for his 22nd career 100-yard game, which moved him into a tie for the No. 4 spot in franchise history with Donald Driver.
In Week 12 vs. Detroit, surpassed 6,000 career receiving yards in his 86th career game, which tied him for the second fastest to 6,000 yards receiving in team annals behind only WR Sterling Sharpe (84 games).

- Ranks No. 7 in team history with 6,417 career receiving yards and needs 235 more yards to surpass No. 6 Antonio Freeman $(6,651)$.
$\rightarrow$ Ranks No. 7 in franchise annals with 417 career catches and needs 15 more receptions to surpass No. 6 Freeman (431).
$\rightarrow$ Ranks No. 5 in team history with 51 TD catches.


## 52 CLAY MATTHEWS

-Only player in team history to score a defensive TD in each of his first three seasons in the league (2009-11).

- His 17 sacks in his first 20 games were the most by an NFL player to start his career, eclipsing the mark of 16.5 set by Leslie O'Neal (1986, 1988) and John Abraham (2000-01).

Is the first NFL player since sacks became an official stat in 1982 to post a double-digit sack total and a defensive TD in each of his first two seasons in the league.
-First player in franchise annals to post 10-plus sacks in each of his first two years in the NFL.
Is tied for No. 5 in team history with 41.5 career sacks. Needs a half-sack to move past No. 5 Ezra Johnson (41.5).

- His 29.5 sacks from 2009-11 were tied for No. 1 in team history with Tony Bennett for the most sacks by a Packer in his first three seasons in the league.
- Ranks No. 5 in the NFL with 41.5 sacks since 2009.
Set a franchise rookie record with 10 sacks in 2009.

## 12 AARON RODGERS

Ranks No. 1 in NFL history with a 104.5 career passer rating.
Set an NFL single-season record in 2011 with a 122.5 passer rating and set team marks for TD passes (45), passing yards $(4,643)$, completion percentage (68.3), yards per attempt (9.25), TD/INT ratio (7.50) and 300 -yard games (eight).
Has posted 20,967 passing yards from 2008-12, the most in NFL history by a quarterback in his first five seasons as a starter.
-Threw a TD pass in 35 straight regular-season games at Lambeau Field from 2008-12, a team record (previous mark was 25 by Brett Favre, 1992-96). It was the second-longest streak in NFL history behind Dan Marino's 39-game streak from 1983-88.

- Tied a single-game franchise record with six TD passes at Houston in Week 6, matching Matt Flynn's mark (Jan. 1, 2012, vs. Detroit).
In 77 regular-season starts, has 27 career 300-yard games, 31 three-TD games and 41 zero-INT games.
- Has posted a 100-plus passer rating 45 times. Set an NFL record for quarterbacks whose careers started since 1970 with 43 games with a 100-plus passer rating in his first 75 starts.
- Posted a 100-plus passer rating in three straight seasons (2009-11), one of only four QBs in league history to accomplish that feat (Steve Young, 1991-94; Peyton Manning, 2004-06; Philip Rivers, 2008-10).
Is the only QB in team history with two 400-yard passing games.
-When he hit the 150-TD mark for his career, he had thrown just 42 INTs to that point, the fewest in NFL history as he surpassed Dan Marino's mark of 69 INTs at the time of his 150th TD pass.
In 2009, became first QB in NFL history to throw 30 or more TDs, seven or fewer INTs, and rush for five TDs in the same season.
-Has registered a passer rating over 110.0 in four or more consecutive games three times in his career (Weeks 3-7, 2009; Week 9, Weeks 11-13, 2010; Weeks 1-7, 9-12, 2011), one of only two quarterbacks in franchise history (Bart Starr, 1966) to accomplish the feat in a single season.
Is the only NFL QB since the 1970 merger to post four straight 110-plus rating games in three straight seasons (2009-11).
$\rightarrow$ Posted four or more rushing TDs in three straight seasons (2008-10), becoming only the second Packers QB to accomplish that feat (Tobin Rote, 1954-56), and eclipsed 300 rushing yards in back-to-back seasons (2009-10), the first since Rote in 1954-56.
- Ranks No. 2 in team history with 167 TD passes, having surpassed Bart Starr (152) in Week 8.
With 18 career rushing TDs, ranks No. 2 in team history among QBs behind only Tobin Rote (29).


## 21 CHARLES WOODSON

His 10 defensive touchdowns with Green Bay (nine interceptions, one fumble recovery) are a team record.
-With nine interception returns for scores, ranks No. 1 on Green Bay's all-time list, eclipsing the previous mark set by Herb Adderley (seven, 1961-69).
-For his career, has 11 INT-return TDs, which ranks tied for No. 2 in NFL history with Darren Sharper behind only Rod Woodson (12).

- Ranks No. 3 in the NFL with 26 interceptions since 2008.
- His five forced fumbles in 2010 were a career high and the most by a Packer since LB/DE Keith McKenzie posted five in 1999.
-In 2009, established career highs in interceptions (9, tied league lead), and interception returns for TDs (3, tied league lead and team record),
and matched a then career high with four forced fumbles.
-Has 55 career interceptions, 38 in 100 games since coming to Green Bay in 2006. Woodson had 17 interceptions in 106 games with Oakland. Is tied for No. 4 in team history with S LeRoy Butler with the 38 interceptions. Needs one more to tie CB Herb Adderley (39) for No. 3.
- Became the fourth player in NFL history since sacks became an official statistic in 1982 to record at least nine interceptions and two sacks in a single season. Is the only player in NFL history to post at least seven interceptions and two sacks in back-to-back seasons.
In 2009, became the first NFC player to win the conference's Defensive Player of the Month award multiple times in one season (Sept., Nov., Dec.).
With nine interceptions in 2009, became only the second player in franchise history to post at least seven interceptions in three different seasons (Bobby Dillon, 1953-57).
-With two interceptions against Minnesota in Week 7 of 2011, recorded the seventh multi-interception game of his career. Six of those games have come with Green Bay.
-Became the first NFL player since sacks became an official statistic in 1982 to record two interceptions, an interception for a touchdown, a sack and a fumble recovery in the same game when he posted all of those statistics at Detroit on Thanksgiving in 2009.
Is the only defensive back in Packers history (since 1982) to register at least two sacks in four straight seasons (2008-11).

## PACKERS PROJECTED STARTERS - OFFENSE

WR Greg Jennings, 7th Year, Western Michigan, D2b-06
Ranks in the top 10 in franchise history in receptions (7th, 417), receiving yards $(7$ th, 6,417$)$ and touchdown catches (5th, 51).
Is tied for No. 5 in the NFL with 59 receptions of 25 -plus yards since 2007 and is tied for No. 5 in the league with 48 TD grabs over that span.

- One of just five receivers in team history to post three consecutive 1,000-yard seasons (2008-10) and one of only four to catch 12 touchdown passes in two different years (2007, 2010).
Has been named to the Pro Bowl each of the past two seasons (2010-11).
LT Marshall Newhouse, 3rd Year, Texas Christian, D5b-10
Has played in all 31 games with 28 starts since 2011, opening 25 contests at LT and three at RT over that span.
- His 13 starts in 2011 were the most by a Green Bay offensive tackle.
-Gameday inactive (healthy scratch) for the first 14 contests of his rookie campaign in 2010 before sustaining a back injury in practice that sent him to injured reserve for the final two games and the entire postseason.
- Was a three-year starter at LT at Texas Christian and earned first-team All-Mountain West honors as a senior.


## LG T.J. Lang, 4th Year, Eastern Michigan, D4-09

One of only two Green Bay offensive linemen to start all 16 games in 2011, opening 15 contests at LG and one at RT.

- Has started games at three different positions on the line as a pro (26 at LG, five at RT, two at LT).
- Played three different positions up front during his rookie campaign of 2009, starting games at both tackle spots and becoming the first Packers rookie to start consecutive games at left tackle since Chad Clifton in 2000.
- Began his college career as a defensive lineman, but converted to the offensive line as a sophomore and started 36 straight games (10 at RT, 26 at $L T$ ) over his final three years.


## C Evan Dietrich-Smith, 3rd Year, Idaho State, FA-10

Has appeared in all 15 games this season with a career-high five starts (four at LG, one at C).

- Has started games at three different positions during his career (five at LG, two at RG, one at C).
Rejoined the Packers in Week 17 of 2010 after being released at the end of training camp that season; spent the first four weeks of the season with Seattle.
- Was the only non-drafted rookie to make the Packers' opening-day roster in 2009.
Set an Idaho State record with 44 starts on the offensive line, playing all five positions in his college career, including the last two years at LT.


## RG Josh Sitton, 5th Year, Central Florida, D4b-08

Has started 61 games since 2009, the most by an offensive lineman in a Green Bay uniform over that span.

- Was named 2010 Offensive Lineman of the Year by the NFL Alumni Association and was selected as a Pro Bowl alternate each of the past two seasons (2010-11).
- According to STATS LLC, has allowed only 7.5 sacks in his three-plus seasons as a starter.
- Was the only Packer on either side of the ball to not miss a snap from 200910.


## RT Don Barclay, Rookie, West Virginia, FA-12

Has started each of the last three games at RT after playing strictly on special teams in the opening 12 games of the season.
Signed by Green Bay as a non-drafted free agent in May 2012.
-Started at LT for three years at West Virginia. Tied a school record by playing in 52 career games, including 39 consecutive starts.

- Earned first-team All-Big East recognition as a senior, helping the Moutaineers finish No. 15 in the country in total offense (469.5 yards per game) and No. 5 in passing offense ( 362.5 yards per game).


## TE Jermichael Finley, 5th Year, Texas, D3-08

- Has played in all 31 contests over the last two seasons and ranks No. 3 on the team this season with 53 catches for 595 yards (11.2 avg.) and two TDs.
- Matched his career high with 55 receptions in 2011, tied for the second most in team history by a tight end behind Paul Coffman's 56 in 1979.
Set a career high with 767 receiving yards last season, the No. 2 mark in franchise annals behind only Coffman's 814 yards in 1983.
-Finished the 2009 season with Green Bay playoff-record 159 receiving yards in NFC Wild Card loss at Arizona, the third-most productive game by a tight end in NFL postseason history.


## WR Jordy Nelson, 5th Year, Kansas State, D2a-08

Posted career highs in every receiving category in 2011, catching 68 passes for 1,263 yards ( 18.6 avg.) and 15 TDs on his way to being named a Pro Bowl alternate.

- Became only the third player in franchise history to catch 15 or more TDs in a season, joining WRs Sterling Sharpe (18 in 1994) and Don Hutson (17 in 1942).
- Is tied for No. 2 in the NFL with 21 TD catches since 2011, trailing only New England TE Rob Gronkowski (27).
- Became the first player since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to post three 80-yard TD grabs over an eight-game span in the regular season (Week 16, 2010-Week 6, 2011).


## QB Aaron Rodgers, 8th Year, California, D1-05

His career passer rating of 104.5 ranks No. 1 in NFL history.

- Ranks No. 1 in the league this season in passer rating (106.2), No. 2 in passing TDs (35), No. 1 in TD/INT ratio (4.38, 35/8), and No. 4 in completion percentage (67.0).
- Has posted 20,967 yards as a starter, which ranks No. 1 in league history for the most passing yards by a QB in his first five seasons as a starter (previous record was Peyton Manning, 20,618, 1998-2002).
- In 77 regular-season starts (52-25 record), has posted 27 games with $300-$ plus passing yards, 42 without an interception and 45 with a 100plus passer rating.
- In 2011, set an NFL record with a 122.5 passer rating and set franchise marks for TD passes (45), passing yards $(4,643)$, completion percentage (68.3), yards per attempt (9.25) and 300-yard games (eight) on his way to earning NFL Most Valuable Player honors from The Associated Press.


## RB Alex Green, 2nd Year, Hawaii, D3-11

Has 464 yards on 135 carries ( 3.4 avg.) this season, including a 41 -yard run at Indianapolis in Week 5, the longest by a Packer this season.

- Appeared in four games as a rookie in 2011 before sustaining a seasonending knee injury blocking on a kickoff return at Minnesota in Week 7.
- Rushed for 1,199 yards and 18 TDs as a senior at Hawaii in 2010, ranking second in school history for rushing yards in a single season and tying the single-season school mark for rushing TDs.
- His average of 8.2 yards per carry in 2010 ranked No. 1 in NCAA Division I-A among players with 100 or more carries.
Attended the same junior college, Butte College in Oroville, Calif., as QB Aaron Rodgers.


## FB John Kuhn, 7th Year, Shippensburg, W-07 (Pit)

Has played in 91 of 95 games (98 of 102 including playoffs) during his five-plus seasons in Green Bay, appearing in all 16 regular-season contests in four of those seasons.
Selected to the Pro Bowl in 2011, becoming the first Green Bay fullback to be honored since William Henderson in 2004.

- Only player on the team to have a rushing and receiving touchdown each of the past four seasons (2008-11), and was the first Packer to achieve that feat since RB Ahman Green (2001-04).
Led the team with four rushing TDs in 2011 and led the running backs with six total TDs.


## PACKERS PROJECTED STARTERS - DEFENSE

LDE Ryan Pickett, 12th Year, Ohio State, UFA-06 (StL)

- Has played in 177 of a possible 191 regular-season games during his career, missing just nine contests due to injury.
- Is the only Green Bay defensive lineman to have started all 15 games this season and leads the line with 68 tackles ( 23 solo)
- Key component of Packers' No. 1-ranked rushing defense in 2009 (franchise-record 83.3 yards allowed per game), the first time in team history that Green Bay led the league in that category.
- Signed with Green Bay as an unrestricted free agent in 2006 after spending five seasons with St. Louis (2001-05). Led all NFL defensive linemen with 115 tackles in 2005.


## NT B.J. Raji, 4th Year, Boston College, D1a-09

Earned his first bid to the Pro Bowl in 2011, becoming the first Green Bay defensive tackle since Bob Brown in 1972 to be voted to the all-star team.

- Has played in 50 games since 2010 (including playoffs), tied for the fifth most in the NFL by a defensive lineman over that span.
- Led all NFL nose tackles with $61 / 2$ sacks in 2010, the third most recorded by a nose tackle since 1990 (according to STATS LLC).
- Named to the Pro Football Weekly/PFWA All-Rookie team in 2009, the first Green Bay defensive lineman to be selected since DE Vonnie Holliday in 1998.


## RDE C.J. Wilson, 3rd Year, East Carolina, D7-10

Has played in 41 games with 11 starts during his three seasons in Green Bay. Has 32 tackles ( 14 solo) and a career-high 2.5 sacks this season.

- Played in all 16 games in 2011 with two starts as he registered a careerhigh 35 tackles (21 solo).
- Appeared in 15 regular-season games and all four playoff contests as a rookie in 2010, starting Super Bowl XLV vs. Pittsburgh with the defense employing a fourth lineman as part of its "Hippo" package.
- Named the Conference USA Defensive Player of the Year by Sporting News each of his final two seasons at East Carolina.

LOLB Erik Walden, 5th Year, Middle Tennessee State, FA-10
-Has played in 67 career games with 26 starts, including 39 games and 26 starts with Green Bay. Ranks No. 5 on the team with 62 tackles ( 36 solo) this season, along with three sacks, which matches his career high, and a career-best two INTs.

- Became a full-time starter for the first time in his career in 2011, opening the first 15 games at ROLB and setting or tying his career highs in every major statistical category.
- Signed by the Packers as a free agent on Oct. 27, 2010, and went on to appear in nine games with two starts along with another three starts in the postseason.
- Originally a sixth-round draft choice by the Dallas Cowboys in 2008, he played in a total of 28 games for Kansas City and Miami from 2008-10.


## BLB A.J. Hawk, 7th Year, Ohio State, D1-06

Has either led the team or finished second in tackles in five of his six seasons in Green Bay. Leads the team with 131 tackles ( 100 solo) in 2012.

- Has appeared in 109 of a possible 111 regular-season games in his career, starting 106 of them.
- Tied for No. 1 among NFL linebackers in 2010 with a career-high three interceptions. Earned first career Pro Bowl selection in 2010.
$\rightarrow$ Has posted 861 tackles ( 617 solo), $13 ½$ sacks, eight interceptions, 34 passes defensed, two forced fumbles and four fumble recoveries during his career.


## MLB Brad Jones, 4th Year, Colorado, D7-09

Came on in relief of D.J. Smith, who sustained a season-ending knee injury in Week 6 at Houston, and made his first career start on the inside (13 starts at OLB) at St. Louis in Week 7. Has registered 89 tackles (62 solo), two sacks and a forced fumble in his nine starts this season.

- Became a core member on special teams in 2011, appearing in a careerhigh 15 games and recording a career-best 11 coverage tackles.
-Worked at OLB for his first three seasons, including his rookie campaign of 2009 that saw him start seven games and register a career-high four sacks.
Began working at inside linebacker during 2012 training camp.


## ROLB Clay Matthews, 4th Year, Southern California, D1b-09

Ranks No. 6 in the league with 12.0 sacks this season, despite missing four games due to a hamstring injury.

- Became the first Packer since RB John Brockington (1971-73) to earn Pro Bowl recognition in each of his first three seasons in the NFL.
Is the only player in franchise history to score a defensive TD (interception or fumble return) in each of his first three seasons in the NFL (2009-11).
- Named first-team All-Pro by The Associated Press in 2010, the first Green Bay LB to earn that honor since Tim Harris in 1989. Finished second to Pittsburgh safety Troy Polamalu in the AP's Defensive Player of the Year voting.


## LCB Tramon Williams, 6th Year, Louisiana Tech, FA-06

Is No. 2 in the league in interceptions (15) and ranks No. 1 in the NFL in INT return yards (296) since 2010 (including playoffs).
Ranks No. 2 on the team with 21 passes defensed this season.

- Despite suffering a shoulder injury in the 2011 season opener, went on to start 15 games last season and post career highs for tackles (65) and passes defensed (24). Also added four interceptions.
- With three interceptions during the 2010 playoffs, tied Joe Laws (1944) and Craig Newsome (1996) for the franchise single-postseason record.
Is the only non-drafted free agent in the NFL to post four or more interceptions each of the past four seasons (2008-11).


## RCB Sam Shields, 3rd Year, Miami, FA-10

$\rightarrow$ Has been limited to nine games with seven starts this season due to injury, but has registered 31 tackles ( 23 solo), three interceptions, 14 passes defensed and a sack.

- Made an impact in 2010 after making the team as a non-drafted rookie, earning the nickel CB job despite playing the position only one season in college.
- In Green Bay's NFC Championship win over Chicago in the 2010 season, became the first rookie in NFL history to record two INTs and a sack in a postseason contest.
Played primarily wide receiver and special teams during his first three seasons at Miami.


## SS Morgan Burnett, 3rd Year, Georgia Tech, D3-10

$\rightarrow$ Ranks No. 2 on the team with a career-high 128 tackles ( 87 solo) and is the only player on the club with a sack (two), an interception (two), a fumble recovery and a forced fumble this season.

- Enjoyed his first full season as a pro in 2011, joining NT B.J. Raji as the only two Green Bay defensive players to start all 16 regular-season games.
- In 2010, became only the second Packers rookie to open the season as a starter at safety since Chuck Cecil in 1988, joining then-teammate and three-time Pro Bowl selection Nick Collins (2005).
Started the first four games of the 2010 season at SS before sustaining a season-ending knee injury vs. Detroit in Week 4.


## FS M.D. Jennings, 2nd Year, Arkansas State, FA-11

Has played in all 15 games with nine starts and has recorded 43 tackles ( 38 solo), an interception that he returned 72 yards for a TD, and five passes defensed.
-One of three non-drafted rookies to make Green Bay's opening-day roster in 2011.

- Tied for second among Packers rookies in 2011 by appearing in 15 games in his first season, becoming a regular on special teams and recording nine tackles on the coverage units.
A three-year starter at Arkansas State, he earned first-team All-Sun Belt recognition as a senior in 2010 when he set or tied career highs in almost every statistical category.
