TRAINING CAMP SET TO BEGIN IN GREEN BAY

A day circled on the calendar of every sports fan – the official beginning of the NFL season – will arrive this Saturday when the Green Bay Packers kick off the 2014 campaign at Ray Nitschke Field.

- ▶ Coming off a 2013 season that saw Green Bay post its fifth straight winning season and its third consecutive NFC North title, the Packers will begin to write this season's story in front of fans at Nitschke Field.
- ▶ A tradition first started under Curly Lambeau in 1946, training camp in Green Bay remains one of the most intimate settings in all of professional sports. 2014 marks the sixth summer at the newly constructed Nitschke Field, just a short bike ride away from the team facility.
- ▶ Nitschke boasts the same playing surface as Lambeau Field and seating for 1,500 fans with unobstructed views and sideline access to their favorite players.
- ▶ Just as it does at Lambeau Field, new traditions blend with historic ones at Packers training camp, as players continue to ride children's bicycles to practice, a tradition first started under the legendary Vince Lombardi. Players continue to stay in the dorms at St. Norbert College, the NFL's longest training-camp relationship between a team and school.
- ▶ According to the Greater Green Bay Convention and Visitors Bureau, training camp, along with Packers Family Night, will attract nearly 90,000 visitors from across the nation and as many as 20 foreign countries from July 26 through the final open practice on Aug. 27. With an economic impact estimated at \$9 million, training camp is a financial boost to many area businesses.

2014 TRAINING CAMP

THE MONTH AHEAD

Green Bay's training camp schedule features 17 open practices, including an evening practice, Family Night and four preseason games.

- ▶ The first 10 practices of training camp will all be open to the public, with the first six practices taking place at 8:20 a.m. Packers Family Night will be on Saturday, Aug. 2 at 6:25 p.m., and the only other evening session will take place Monday, Aug. 4, at 5:30 p.m. The final two open practices before the first preseason game at Tennessee on Aug. 9 at 7 p.m. will be at 12 p.m. on Aug. 5 and at 11:45 a.m. on Aug. 6.
- ▶ The next week the Packers will have two practices open to the public (12 p.m. on Aug. 12 and 11:45 a.m. on Aug. 13) before the second preseason game at St. Louis on Aug. 16 at 3 p.m.
- ▶ The three Packers practices before the preseason home opener vs. Oakland on Aug. 22 at 7 p.m. will all be open to the public (12 p.m. on Aug. 18, 11:45 a.m. on Aug. 19 and 10:15 a.m. on Aug. 21).
- ▶ The final week of camp will feature two open practices (11:45 a.m. on Aug. 25 and 10:15 a.m. on Aug. 27) prior to the preseason finale vs. Kansas City on Aug. 28 at 6 p.m.

2014 TRAINING CAMP

BREAKING DOWN THE ROSTER

The Packers enter training camp with an 89-man roster that is composed of 44 offensive players, 42 defensive players and three specialists.

- ▶ Of the 89 players on Green Bay's roster, 41 of them (46.1 percent) were draft picks of the Packers. Dating back to 2009, Green Bay has selected seven players in the first round, all of which are still on the team.
- ▶ Green Bay has 44 players on the roster that began their careers as non-drafted free agents, with 28 of those originally signed by Green Bay.
- ▶ Over 60 percent of the players (55 of 89, 61.8 percent) on Green Bay's roster entered the league as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as a non-drafted player.
- ▶ The Packers have nine players on the roster that played in the NFL prior to the 2009 season, and four of those players began their pro careers as non-drafted free agents (CB Tramon Williams, CB Jarrett Bush, FB John Kuhn, LS Brett Goode).
- ▶ Of the 89 players on the roster, 69 began their pro careers with the Packers (77.5 percent).
- ▶ Only 20 of the 89 players on the roster (22.5 percent) were selected in the first three rounds of the draft, with 19 being drafted by the Packers.
- ▶ Of the 89 players on the roster, 79 of them (88.8 percent) are 28 years old or younger (as of Aug. 1) and 52 players (58.4 percent) are 24 years old or younger.

MEET THE DRAFT PICKS

Training-camp storylines always hover around new players and just how they figure into the depth chart. This past May, the Packers added to an already deep and talented roster with a nine-man draft class.

- ▶ **S Ha Ha Clinton-Dix**, the second safety ever drafted by the Packers in the first round (Alabama S George Teague, No. 29 in 1993), was a consensus All-America selection in 2013 as a junior, earning first-team recognition from *The Associated Press*, the Football Writers Association of America and *Sporting News*. He played in 38 games with 20 starts in his three seasons at Alabama and registered 100 tackles (58 solo), including four tackles for a loss, seven interceptions, a forced fumble and 17 passes defended. He was part of an Alabama team that won back-to-back national titles. The Orlando, Fla. native led the conference with a career-high five interceptions as a sophomore in 2012.

- ▶ The Packers selected WR **Davante Adams** out of Fresno State in the second round, making him one of two Fresno State receivers (Henry Ellard, 1983) to ever be picked in the first two rounds of the draft. In 2013, he led the nation in receptions (131) and receptions per game (10.1), while ranking second in the country in receiving yards (1,718) and receiving yards per game (132.2). He also registered 24 TD receptions, eight more than any player in the country and the most in school and Mountain West Conference history.
- ▶ Green Bay drafted DT **Khyri Thornton** with the first of two selections in the third round. He earned second-team All-Conference USA honors and was a finalist for the Conerly Trophy, which is given to the state's top collegiate player, as a senior in 2013. Thornton is the highest-drafted defensive end from Southern Mississippi since Richard Byrd was chosen in the second round by the Houston Oilers in 1985.
- ▶ With their second pick in the third round, the Packers selected TE **Richard Rodgers** out of the University of California-Berkeley. Rodgers, who played tight end for his first two seasons before moving to inside receiver in 2013, recorded at least one reception in 19 consecutive games to end his career. He played in 35 games with 11 starts in three seasons at Cal and totaled 59 receptions for 896 yards (15.2 avg.) and two TDs.
- ▶ Green Bay selected LB **Carl Bradford** out of Arizona State in the fourth round. The former Sun Devil earned first-team All-Pacific-12 honors at defensive end as a junior in 2013 after recording 61 tackles (45 solo), including 19 tackles for a loss, 8½ sacks, three forced fumbles, an interception that he returned for a touchdown, and five passes defended. Bradford posted 40½ tackles for a loss over his final two seasons at Arizona State (2012-13), which was tied for fourth in the country over that span.
- ▶ The Packers picked C **Corey Linsley** out of Ohio State with the first of two selections in the fifth round. He was named first-team All-Big Ten by both the coaches and the media as a senior. Linsley was one of five team captains and was part of a line that helped the team set school records for points scored (637), yards per carry (6.8), touchdowns (87) and TD passes (38) in '13. The Ohio native was part of a Buckeye team that won 24 consecutive games from 2012-13.
- ▶ Green Bay drafted WR **Jared Abbrederis** out of the University of Wisconsin with its second selection in the fifth round, making him the first Wisconsin native drafted by Green Bay since T Mark Tauscher (Marshfield, Wis.) in 2000. The former walk-on finished his career at Wisconsin tied for the school record for receptions (202) and ranked No. 2 all-time in receiving yards (3,140) and TD receptions (23). He also ranks No. 8 all-time among Big Ten players in receiving yards.
- ▶ The Packers selected CB **Demetri Goodson** out of Baylor with their sixth-round choice. After playing just eight games in his first two seasons at Baylor due to season-ending injuries both years, he was granted an extra year of eligibility and earned All-Big 12 recognition in 2013 after appearing in 11 games with 10 starts and posting career highs in tackles (26), interceptions (three) and passes defended (16). Before playing football for the Bears, he spent three seasons playing basketball at Gonzaga (2008-11).
- ▶ With their final pick of the draft the Packers selected WR **Jeff Janis** out of Saginaw Valley State in the seventh round. The first wide receiver from SVS ever to be selected in the NFL Draft finished his career as the school's all-time leader in receptions (241), receiving yards (4,274) and receiving TDs (46). Janis was twice named the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference's Back of the Year. He was also selected to the Little All-America team by *The Associated Press* in 2013.

2014 TRAINING CAMP

ST. NORBERT AND THE PACKERS

Continuing a tradition started under Packers coach Scooter McLean in 1958, the Green Bay Packers will call St. Norbert College home for a 57th consecutive training camp this summer. The relationship between the private college in De Pere, Wis., and the Green Bay Packers marks the longest continual use of any training-camp facility by an NFL team.

- ▶ Players will take up residence in Victor McCormick Hall, a 60-room coed dormitory used to house 225 students during the academic year.
- ▶ St. Norbert, founded in 1898 by Abbot Bernard Pennings, borders the Fox River and enrolls around 2,000 students.
- ▶ The Packers use their own practice and team-meeting facilities at Lambeau Field during training camp, with the college serving as housing headquarters.
- ▶ Players return to St. Norbert via cars and vans every evening for team dinner.
- ▶ The 6.62-mile commute is estimated at 11 minutes each way.

A LOOK AT THE SCHEDULE

The Green Bay Packers' 94th NFL regular-season schedule is headlined by five prime-time games (subject to flexible scheduling), including opening the season on Thursday night in Seattle, marking the first time the Packers have faced the defending Super Bowl champions in Week 1.

- ▶ Green Bay's schedule includes five games against 2013 playoff teams, with three of those contests (Carolina, Philadelphia, New England) at Lambeau Field and two on the road (Seattle, New Orleans). All five play-off teams that the Packers play won at least 10 games last season, and four won their division.
- ▶ The Packers have three prime-time contests at home (vs. Minnesota on Thursday night in Week 5, vs. Chicago on Sunday night in Week 10 and vs. Atlanta on *Monday Night Football* in Week 14) and two on the road (Thursday night at Seattle in Week 1 and Sunday night at New Orleans in Week 8).
- ▶ The Packers' bye arrives in Week 9 for the first time since 2004.
- ▶ It is the second time in franchise history (1922) that Green Bay opens with three of their first four games on the road.
- ▶ Two of Green Bay's first five games are played on Thursday night, with the next seven taking place on Sunday, one on the following Monday, and three more on Sunday to close out the regular season.
- ▶ For the second year in a row and just the third time in nine seasons under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** (2010), the Packers will open the season on the road. For the third straight season Green Bay will open against an NFC West team after facing San Francisco each of the last two years.
- ▶ Dating back to 2001, the Packers have always played against an NFC team in Week 1. The last AFC team Green Bay faced in Week 1 was the New York Jets, who will visit the Packers in Week 2 for the home opener.
- ▶ Following the home opener the Packers will go on the road to face two division opponents, Detroit and Chicago, before returning home to face

Minnesota in a Thursday night divisional matchup. It will be the sixth time in the last seven seasons they have faced off in primetime.

- ▶ Green Bay will play two of the next three on the road prior to the Week 9 bye. The Packers travel to Miami for the third time in 23 years and first time since 2006, and to New Orleans in a game on Sunday night, marking the third primetime meeting between the two in the last four contests. Between the two road games, Carolina will travel to Lambeau Field for the first time since 2008.
- ▶ After the bye week, the Packers return to Sunday night to host the Bears, who they have beaten five of the last six times at home.
- ▶ Philadelphia comes to Lambeau for the second straight season, which is only the second time in the series that the two clubs have played at Green Bay in back-to-back seasons (1933-34).
- ▶ For the second consecutive season, Green Bay will play Minnesota in Week 12, traveling to face the Vikings in the first outdoor game (TCF Bank Stadium) between the two in Minnesota since they played at Metropolitan Stadium on Nov. 29, 1981.
- ▶ The last game in November brings New England to Lambeau Field for the first time since 2006 and only its third visit ever to the stadium (1979).
- ▶ December opens with a Monday night matchup at home versus Atlanta. It marks the 22nd straight season the Packers have appeared on *Monday Night Football*.
- ▶ The next two weeks include road games at Buffalo and Tampa Bay. It will be the Packers' first visit to Buffalo since 2006 and first trip to Tampa Bay in the month of December since 1999.
- ▶ Green Bay closes the regular season at Lambeau Field against Detroit for the fourth time under McCarthy (2007, 2008, 2011).

IN THE PRESEASON

The Packers' preseason schedule is highlighted by a nationally televised contest at Lambeau Field against the Oakland Raiders on Friday, Aug. 22.

- This is the first time since 2003 that the Packers have opened the pre-season with two games outside of Green Bay and closed the pre-season with two home games. That year the Packers opened the pre-season in the Hall of Fame game in Canton, Ohio, then played two road games before finishing with two games at Lambeau Field.
- Dating back to 1970, this will be only the third time the Packers have opened both the pre-season and the regular season as the away team (1981 and 1985).
- Green Bay opens the pre-season at Tennessee, marking the first time they have played the Titans in the pre-season since 2009. This will mark the ninth time since 2002 that the Packers and Titans have played in the pre-season but the first time it won't be in the final week.
- The Packers travel to play at St. Louis in the second week of the pre-season for the second year in a row.
- This year will mark the 65th annual Upper Midwest Shrine Game (32-29-3) and will be the third time the Packers have played the Oakland Raiders in the game (1981 and 1998).
- The Packers and Chiefs will play each other in the pre-season finale for the fourth consecutive year.
- Green Bay is 28-24-1 in Bishop's Charities Games and have recorded wins in four of the last five games. The Chiefs will be the Packers' opponent in the game for the third time in the last four years.

FINAL THOUGHTS ON THE 2013 SEASON

The Packers won their third consecutive NFC North title in 2013, the first time Green Bay won its division in three straight years since the club captured three consecutive NFC North crowns from 2002-04.

- Green Bay had a winning record in each of its last five seasons (2009-13), joining New England as the only two teams in the league to accomplish that feat.
- The Packers are the only NFC team to win its division each of the last three seasons (2011-13) and one of only three teams in the league to do so over that span (Denver, New England).
- For the eighth straight season the Packers posted a winning record in the division last year. New England was the only other team in the NFL to accomplish that feat over the past eight seasons (2006-13).
- The Packers generated 6,404 yards of total offense in 2013, the second most in franchise history behind only the 6,482 yards posted in 2011. Green Bay ranked No. 3 in the league in total offense with its average of 400.3 yards per game.
- For Green Bay, it marked its seventh top-10 finish in total offense in the past eight seasons.
- The Packers ranked No. 7 in the league in rushing offense with an average of 133.5 yards per game, the team's best finish in the league rankings since it finished third in the NFL in 2003.
- By also finishing No. 6 in the NFL in passing offense last year, it marked the first time since 2004 (No. 3 passing/No. 10 rushing) that it finished in the top 10 in the NFL in both categories.
