GREEN BAY (4-2) VS. CAROLINA (3-2-1) Sunday, Oct. 19 ● Lambeau Field ● 12 p.m. CDT

PACKERS RETURN HOME TO FACE THE PANTHERS

The Green Bay Packers will take on the Carolina Panthers in their third home game of the season, only the second game at Lambeau Field in 35 days.



- The Packers have a 7-4 edge in the all-time regular-season series, including a 2-2 mark at home against Carolina. Green Bay also topped Carolina in the 1996 NFC Championship Game at Lambeau Field.
- ► Three of the Packers' four losses to the Panthers have come by four points or less, while five of the eight wins (including the postseason) have been by at least 10 points.
- Green Bay and Carolina will play each other in the month of September or October for the seventh time.
- ▶ This will be the Panthers' sixth trip to Lambeau Field during the regular and postseason, but it will be only the second time the Panthers have played in Green Bay before November (Sept. 29, 2002).
- ► Under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**, the Packers are 66-33-1 against NFC teams during the regular season.
- ► Green Bay's 66 regular-season wins against NFC teams since 2006 are the most in the NFL.
- ▶ Dating back to 2006, the Packers' point differential of plus-539 against NFC teams during the regular season is the second most in the league (New Orleans, plus-569).
- ▶ Four of the Packers' next six games will come against teams that made the playoffs last season, including each of the next two weeks. Of those four teams (Carolina, New Orleans, Philadelphia, New England), three won their division in 2013 and all won at least 10 games. The four teams are a combined 14-8-1 this season.
- Next week, before the Packers' bye week, Green Bay goes back on the road to play the New Orleans Saints.

STARTING STRONG AT HOME

- After victories over the New York Jets and Minnesota Vikings, the Packers look to start 3-0 at Lambeau Field for the second consecutive year.
- ▶ Dating back to 1960, Green Bay has started 3-0 at home in consecutive seasons three times (1965-66 / 1996-97 / 2001-02).
- The Packers have started 3-0 at home 20 times in franchise history.
- Green Bay is one of four NFC teams to be undefeated at home this season (Philadelphia, New Orleans, Arizona).
- The Packers are one of seven NFL teams this season to only play two home games so far (Chicago, Jacksonville, Kansas City, New England, New Orleans, Pittsburgh). Out of those teams, Green Bay and New England are the only teams with above .500 records.

WITH THE CALL

FOX Sports, now in its 21st season as an NFL network television partner, will broadcast the game to a regional audience.



- ► Play-by-play man **Sam Rosen** joins analyst **John Lynch** and sideline reporter **Pam Oliver**.
- ▶ Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since November 1929, heads up the Packers Radio Network that is made up of 50 stations in five states. Wayne Larrivee (play-by-play) and two-time Packers Pro Bowler Larry McCarren (analyst) call the action. McCarren first joined the team's broadcasts in 1995 and enters his 20th season calling Packers' games. McCarren, who is in his 26th year in Green Bay television, has four times been voted Wisconsin Sportscaster of the Year by the National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association. After originally being paired together in 1999, McCarren and Larrivee enter their 16th season of broadcasts together.
- ► Compass Media Networks will air the game across the country. Matt Smith (play-by-play) and Brian Baldinger (analyst) will call the action. Jon Rothstein will host the pre, half, and postgame shows.
- ► The broadcast is also available on Sirius Satellite Radio (WTMJ feed) as part of the network's NFL Sunday Drive.

HOME COOKING

The Packers have won 26 of their last 31 with one tie and 32 of their last 38 games with one tie at Lambeau Field in the regular season.

► Green Bay's .821 winning percentage (34-7-1) at home since 2009 ranks No. 2 in the NFL over that span:

► The Packers have averaged 30.8 points per game at home since 2009, No. 3 in the league over that span. Green Bay has posted 20 games of 30-plus points since '09.

► Green Bay has posted 10 games with 40-plus points at home since 2009. The Packers are 10-0 at home when scoring at least 40 points. Green Bay's 10 games with 40-plus points at home since 2009 are **tied for No. 1 in the NFL** over that span:

► The defense has done its part as well at home since 2009, generating 90 turnovers at Lambeau Field. With Green Bay's offense posting only 43 giveaways over that span, the Packers have a plus-47 turnover ratio at home, which ranks No. 2 in the league since '09:

- ► Green Bay has generated at least two takeaways in 26 of 42 home games since 2009. The Packers have a 24-2 mark (.923) in those games. The Packers have posted four or more takeaways at Lambeau Field in nine of those contests.
- ▶The Packers' win over Tennessee in Week 16 of 2012 gave the team its third straight season with at least seven wins at home. It marked the second-longest streak in franchise history behind only a span of five straight seasons (1994-98) with seven or more victories at home.
- ► A look at the most home victories over a three-season span in franchise history:

JUST IN TIME

In Week 6, the Packers rallied from a seven-point defecit with just over nine minutes left in the fourth quarter to beat Miami 27-24. It was Green Bay's second win in Miami in franchise history (2006).

- ► Following a Dolphins touchdown to take a 24-17, QB **Aaron Rodgers** led Green Bay on an 11-play, 68-yard drive to set up a 30-yard field goal by K **Mason Crosby** to pull the Packers within four points.
- ► Green Bay's defense forced a punt after six plays, giving the Packers the ball at their own 40-yard line with 2:04 remaining.
- ▶Over the final couple minutes the Packers converted a fourth-and-10 and a third-and-10 on a drive that included G **T.J. Lang** diving on a Rodgers fumble and WR **Davante Adams** taking a short pass 12 yards to the Miami 4-yard line, getting out of bounds with six seconds left after a Rodgres fake spike. All that set up a 4-yard touchdown pass from Rodgers to TE **Andrew Quarless** to give the Packers the 27-24 victory.
- ▶The win marked the first time Green Bay won a game on a touchdown with three seconds or less remaining in the fourth quarter since they beat the Bears, 20-19, on a 3-yard TD run by QB Bart Starr with three seconds left on Nov. 15, 1970.
- ▶It also marked Rodgers' seventh fourth-quarter comeback of his career.

BREAKING DOWN THE ROSTER

The Packers' active roster is composed of 24 offensive players, 26 defensive players and three specialists.

- ► Of the 53 players on Green Bay's roster, 33 of them (63.5 percent) were draft picks of the Packers.
- ▶ Green Bay has 18 players on the roster that began their careers as non-drafted free agents, with eight of those originally signed by Green Bay.
- ► Almost 50 percent of the players (25 of 53, 47.2%) on Green Bay's roster entered the league as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as a non-drafted player.
- ► The Packers have 12 players on the roster that played in the NFL prior to the 2009 season, and six of those players began their pro careers as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as a non-drafted player (QB Matt Flynn, K Mason Crosby, CB Tramon Williams, CB Jarrett Bush, FB John Kuhn, LS Brett Goode).
- ▶ Of the 53 players on the roster, 42 began their pro careers with the Packers (79.2 percent).
- ▶ Only 17 of the 52 players on the roster (32.7 percent) were selected in the first three rounds of the draft, with 16 being drafted by the Packers.
- ▶ Of the 53 players on the roster, 43 of them (81.1 percent) are 28 years old or younger (as of Oct. 19) and 20 players (37.7 percent) are 24 years old or younger.

- ► Green Bay's Week 6 victory over Miami marked the Packers' ninth straight win in the month of October, the longest current winning streak by any NFL team in a single calendar month.
- ▶ The Packers have won 15 of their last 16 games played in October.
- ► Under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**, Green Bay ranks in the top five in both points scored and points allowed per game in October:

MR. OCTOBER

Since taking over as the starter in 2008, QB **Aaron Rodgers** has had some success in the month of October.

- ▶ In 11 of his last 14 starts in October, Rodgers has registered a passer rating of at least 100. He has posted six 130-rating games over that span, including a 138.7 rating in a 42-10 win over Minnesota this year in Week 5.
- ▶ Over his last 14 October starts (2011-present), Rodgers has completed 315 of 463 passes (68.0 percent) for 4,110 yards (295.8 ypg) and 39 TDs with just four INTs for a 120.2 passer rating. He has eclipsed the 300-yard mark in seven of those 14 games and thrown three or more TDs in nine of them as well, including this season against Minnesota (three) and Miami (three). Rodgers has a 13-1 record in his last 14 October starts.

STAT OF THE WEEK

WR **Jordy Nelson** continued his great start to the 2014 season in Week 6, recording a game-high nine receptions for 107 yards and a touchdown in the Packers' 27-24 victory at Miami.

- ► It was the fourth time this season Nelson registered at least nine receptions in a game:
 - Week 1 9 receptions for 83 yards
 - Week 2 9 receptions for 209 yards and one touchdown
 - Week 4 10 receptions for 108 yards and two touchdowns
- ►His four games with at least nine receptions are two more than any other player in the NFL this season.
- In franchise history, Nelson's four games with nine-plus receptions are tied for the most a player has registered in an entire regular season:

►Green Bay is 3-1 this season when Nelson records at least nine receptions.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR

- ► The Packers are looking for their fourth consecutive victory. It would be the fifth consecutive season that Green Bay has recorded at least one winning streak of four or more games.
- ► A win would make McCarthy 87-47-1 during the regular season as the Packers' head coach.
- ► Green Bay's defense has recorded eight interceptions in the last four games, the second most in the NFL over that span (NYG, 10).
- ►The Packers' defense is looking to hold the opposing quarterback to a passer rating below 85.0 for the sixth game in a row (MIA-Ryan Tannehill, 81.5 / MIN-Christian Ponder, 45.8 / CHI-Jay Cutler, 82.5 / NYJ-Geno Smith, 64.1 / DET-Matthew Stafford, 61.6).
- ►Over the last three games, Green Bay's offense has scored on 16 of 31 drives, including three of four in the second half against Miami last week.
- ►The Packers have recorded a league-high 180 interception return yards this season.
- ► Green Bay has registered over 120 rushing yards in each of the last two games.

OFFENSE

- ► QB Aaron Rodgers is the first NFL quarterback to throw for 15-plus touchdowns with one or fewer interceptions in the first six games of a season
- ► Rodgers has registered three games with a 100-plus passer rating this season and 54 in his career.
- ▶Rodgers has not thrown an interception in his last 170 pass attempts. It is 11 pass attempts short of his career-best streak (181 in 2010). His only interception this season came in the third quarter at Seattle in Week 1.

- ► Rodgers looks to record the 34th 300-yard passing game of his career during the regular season.
- ►If Rodgers throws for at least three touchdowns, it would tie for the second-most consecutive games with at least three touchdown passes in his career (2012-4 / 2011-5).
- ►WR **Jordy Nelson** is one reception shy of passing WR Max McGee (345) for ninth most in Packers' history.
- ► Nelson is two touchdown receptions short of tying WR Billy Howton (43) for eighth place in franchise history.
- ► Nelson is 201 receiving yards shy of surpassing Carroll Dale (5,422) for 10th place in franchise history.
- ► Nelson has recorded at least nine receptions in four games this season. If Nelson registers one more game with at least nine receptions, it will be the most in a single season in franchise history.
- ► Nelson has registered at least one reception in the last 26 regular-season games he has played in. It is the second-longest streak of his career during the regular season (35 games, 2010 2012).
- ► Since the start of the 2013 regular season, Nelson has nine games with at least seven receptions, including four games this season. It is tied for the fourth-most games with seven-plus receptions in the league over that time span (WAS Pierre Garcon, 12 / NE Julian Edelman, 11 / PIT Antonio Brown, 10 / HOU Andre Johnson, 9).
- ►WR **Randall Cobb** has recorded at least one reception in 30 consecutive regular-season games.
- ► Cobb has nine receiving touchdowns in his last seven regular-season games, dating back to last season.
- ▶ Dating back to last season, RB **Eddie Lacy** has at least one rushing touchdown in 11 of the last 17 regular-season games.

DEFENSE

- ►LB Julius Peppers is the only player in the NFL with at least a sack (1.5), an interception (one), a forced fumble (one), a fumble recovery (two) and a defensive touchdown (one) this season.
- ▶ Peppers is the only player in NFL history with 10 interceptions and at least 100 sacks in his career.
- ▶ Pepppers' 49-yard return for a touchdown in Week 5 was the second-longest interception return of his career (97 yards vs. DEN, Oct. 10, 2004).
- ►He is one of 18 players in the NFL (since 1982) to record at least 120 sacks.
- ▶ Peppers has played in 102 consecutive games, which is the longest active streak among NFL linebackers (NO Curtis Lofton, 101).
- ►LB Clay Matthews (51.0) is three sacks shy of tying DE Aaron Kampman (54.0) for No. 4 on the team's career sacks list.
- ► Matthews needs one more interception to join Peppers as two of five active NFL players with at least six interceptions and 40 sacks (BAL-Terrell Suggs / TEN-Shaun Phillips / PIT-James Harrison).

SPECIAL TEAMS

- ► Cobb needs either a punt return for a touchdown or a kickoff return for a touchdown to take sole possession of second place in Packers history for combined returns for touchdowns (Travis Williams, 6). Cobb, who has three returns for touchdowns, currently is tied with six other players.
- ►K Mason Crosby has played in 118 consecutive games, the longest active streak among kickers.
- ► Crosby looks to extend his consecutive-games-scoring streak to 119 regular-season games. It is the second-longest streak in franchise history (Ryan Longwell, 144).

MIKE McCARTHY...Is in his ninth year as the Packers' 14th head coach.

▶ Joined Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to quide the Packers to a Super Bowl title with a win over Pittsburgh in

Super Bowl XLV.

► Led the Packers to their fifth consecutive playoff appearance last season, joining New England as the only two NFL teams to do so over that span. Has also led the team to six playoff appearances in the last seven years (2007, 2009-13).

► Has guided the Packers to top-10 finishes in scoring each of the past seven seasons (2007-13), joining the Patriots as the only other team

to accomplish the feat.

► His .643 winning percentage during the regular season (85-47-1) ranks No. 5 among active NFL coaches (min. 50 games).

► Was named Packers head coach on Jan. 12, 2006, his first head-coaching job after 13 years as an NFL assistant.

RON RIVERA...Is in his fourth year as the Panthers' fourth head coach.

Last season, he led Carolina to 12 wins, the NFC South division title and its first playoff appearance since 2008.

►In 2013, the Panthers won 11 of their final 12 regular-season games, including a franchise record eight-game winning streak.

► Named NFL Coach of the Year by *The Associated Press* following the 2013 season.

Carolina's record has improved in each of Rivera's first three seasons.

▶Before joining the Panthers, he worked for the San Diego Chargers from 2007-10, coaching inside linebackers before becoming the defensive coordinator midway through the 2008 season.

▶Rivera played nine seasons for the Chicago Bears and was the team's defensive coordinator from 2004-06.

THE PACKERS-PANTHERS SERIES

► The first-ever meeting between the two teams came in the 1996 NFC Championship, when the Packers beat a Panthers team, coached by current Green Bay defensive coordinator Dom Capers, 30-13 at Lambeau Field.

►This will be the 12th contest between the two teams during the regular season, with the Packers holding a 7-4 advantage in the series, including wins in two of the last three.

► Each team has won the last game played at the opposing stadium.

► Including the postseason, Green Bay is 3-2 against Carolina at Lambeau Field. It will be the Panthers' first visit to Green Bay since 2008.

LAST MEETING, REGULAR SEASON

Sept. 18, 2011, at Bank of America Stadium; Packers won, 30-23.

► The Packers fell behind 13-0 but outscored the Panthers 30-10 the rest of the way to come out with the victory.

► With the Packers up by a touchdown in the fourth quarter, Carolina drove to the Packers' 6-yard-line and on fourth-and-four, LB Clay

Matthews stopped a scrambling QB Cam Newton a yard short of the first down. Two plays later, QB Aaron Rodgers connected with WR Jordy Nelson on a 84-yard touchdown to put Green Bay up 30-16 with just over two minutes to play.

▶Rodgers (308) and Newton (432) both threw for over 300 yards.

►The Packers intercepted Newton three times, with CB Charles Woodson recording two of them.

NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

Packers LB Julius Peppers was born in Wilson, N.C., went to Nash High School in Bailey, N.C., attended the University of North Carolina and was selected by the Panthers in the first round (second overall) of the 2002 NFL Draft, who he played for from 2002-09...Packers WR Jarrett Boykin played at Butler High in Charlotte, N.C. ... 

RUNNING THROUGH IT

Over the past two weeks, Green Bay has shown more commitment to the run game, recording over 25 carries and 100 yards in each game. Dating back to the 2013 regular season, Green Bay is 5-1 in the last six games they ran the ball at least 25 times, including 2-0 this season.

- ► The Packers' 62 rushing attempts for 277 yards (4.5 avg.) both rank in the top eight in the NFL over the last two weeks.
- ► Green Bay's run game had a breakout performance in the victory over the Vikings in Week 5, recording 156 yards on 28 carries (5.6 avg.) with two touchdowns.
- ► The Packers ran the ball a season-high 34 times for 121 yards (3.6 avg.) in a Week 6 win at Miami.
- ▶The Packers recorded six runs of 10-plus yards against Minnesota, which tied for the eighth most in a single game this season. Green Bay's 71 runs of 10-plus yards since the start of the 2013 regular season rank No. 8 in the NFL.
- ▶In Week 5, RB **Eddie Lacy** rushed for 105 yards on 13 carries (8.1 avg.) and recorded his second career game with two rushing touchdowns (vs. Pittsburgh, Week 16 in 2013).
- ▶It was the fifth 100-yard rushing game of his career, his lowest attempt total in a 100-yard rushing game and his best per-carry average in a game (min. 10 att.). Lacy's five 100-yard rushing games since the start of 2013 are tied for sixth in the NFL:

- ►He is the only player in the NFL this season to have at least one sack, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery, an interception and a defensive touchdown.
- ▶ For the fifth time in his career, Peppers has recorded a sack, an interception, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery in a season (2004 / 2007 / 2009 / 2013 / 2014). - ►According to the Elias Sports Bureau, **Clinton-Dix** was the first rookie defensive back in franchise history (since 1982) to have a sack, an interception and a fumble recovery in the first three games of a season.
- ►In Week 1, he became the first Packer (since 1982) to register a sack and a fumble recovery in his NFL debut. The turnover helped set up FB **John Kuhn's** 2-yard touchdown run.



ON THE ROAD AGAIN

Green Bay went 7-1 away from Lambeau Field in 2011, with the seven road wins setting a single-season franchise record.

- ►The Packers have been able to stay above the .500 mark on the road during Head Coach **Mike McCarthy's** tenure, a notable achievement in the National Football League.
- ► Since 2006, McCarthy's first season as the head coach in Green Bay, only 11 of 32 NFL teams have regular-season road records above .500.

303 AND COUNTING

Another packed house at Lambeau Field against the Vikings in Week 5 this season brought the stadium's consecutive-sellouts streak to 303 regular-season games (not including replacement games).

- ▶The league's longest-tenured stadium, Lambeau Field is hosting its 58th season of football in 2014. A total of 701,102 fans made their way through the turnstiles for the nine games (including playoffs) in 2013.
- ► Across American professional sports, only Boston's Fenway Park (1912) and Chicago's Wrigley Field (1914) have longer tenures.

THE LAMBEAU ADVANTAGE

The crown jewel of the National Football League, Lambeau Field has long been known as one of the tougher venues to play in, particularly during the harsh Wisconsin winter.

- ▶Re-establishing home-field advantage after a 4-4 mark in 2008 was one of the goals of 2009, and with the Packers finishing 6-2 at home, they accomplished that goal. Green Bay followed that up with a 7-1 mark at Lambeau Field in 2010, a perfect 8-0 record in 2011, the first undefeated home mark since 2002, and a 7-1 mark in 2012.
- ► Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** stated consistently upon his arrival in Green Bay that one of the team's goals would be to reclaim the mystique of playing at Lambeau Field. Mission accomplished. The team is 48-17-1 (.735) at home in the regular-season since 2006.
- ► Since Ron Wolf and Mike Holmgren began the revitalization of the franchise in 1992, Green Bay owns the best home record in the NFL. A look at the top regular-season home W-L records since the '92 season:

A LOOK AT THE SCHEDULE

The Green Bay Packers' 94th NFL regular-season schedule is headlined by five prime-time games (subject to flexible scheduling).

- ► Green Bay's schedule includes five games against 2013 playoff teams, with three of those contests (Carolina, Philadelphia, New England) at Lambeau Field and two on the road (Seattle, New Orleans).
- ► The Packers have three prime-time contests at home (vs. Minnesota on Thursday night in Week 5, vs. Chicago on Sunday night in Week 10 and vs. Atlanta on *Monday Night Football* in Week 14) and two on the road (Thursday night at Seattle in Week 1 and Sunday night at New Orleans in Week 8).
- ▶ The Packers' bye arrives in Week 9 for the first time since 2004.
- ▶ It is the second time in franchise history (1922) that Green Bay opens with three of their first four games on the road.
- ► Two of Green Bay's first five games are played on Thursday night, with the next seven taking place on Sunday, one on the following Monday, and three more on Sunday to close out the regular season.
- ▶ For the second year in a row and just the third time in nine seasons under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** (2010), the Packers opened the season on the road. For the third straight season Green Bay opened against an NFC West team after facing San Francisco each of the last two years.
- ▶ Dating back to 2001, the Packers have always played against an NFC team in Week 1. The last AFC team Green Bay faced in Week 1 was the New York Jets, who visited the Packers in Week 2 for the home opener.
- ► Following the home opener, the Packers went on the road to face two division opponents, Detroit and Chicago, before returning home to face Minnesota in a Thursday night divisional matchup. It was the sixth time in the last seven seasons they have faced off in primetime.
- ► The Packers traveled to Miami for the third time in 23 years and first time since 2006.
- ▶ Before the bye week, Green Bay will play Carolina at home for the first time since 2008 and then travel to New Orleans for a primetime matchup against the Saints.
- ► Following the bye week, the Packers return to Sunday night to host the Bears, who they have beaten five of the last six times at home.
- ▶ Philadelphia comes to Lambeau for the second straight season, which is only the second time in the series that the two clubs have played at Green Bay in back-to-back seasons (1933-34).
- ► For the second consecutive season, Green Bay will play Minnesota in Week 12, traveling to face the Vikings in the first outdoor game (TCF Bank Stadium) between the two in Minnesota since they played at Metropolitan Stadium on Nov. 29, 1981.
- ►The last game in November brings New England to Lambeau Field for the first time since 2006 and only its third visit ever to the stadium (1979).
- ▶ December opens with a Monday night matchup at home versus Atlanta. It marks the 22nd straight season the Packers have appeared on Monday Night Football.
- ► The next two weeks include road games at Buffalo and Tampa Bay. It will be the Packers' first visit to Buffalo since 2006 and first trip to Tampa Bay in the month of December since 1999.
- ► Green Bay closes the regular season at Lambeau Field against Detroit for the fourth time under McCarthy (2007, 2008, 2011).

- ► Made 23 straight field goals from Week 13 of 2010 through Week 10 of 2011, the longest regular-season streak in franchise history.
- ► In 2011, set a franchise record with a 58-yard field goal in Week 7 at Minnesota, eclipsing the mark of 56 yards he held (Week 1 at Philadelphia, 2010; Week 5 at Atlanta, 2011).
- ► For his career, has hit 125 of 137 field goals (91.2 percent) from 39 vards and closer.

- ➤ Set franchise rookie records in 2013 for rushing yards (1,178), rushing TDs (11) and rushing attempts (284).

- ► Was named to his first career Pro Bowl in 2012, becoming the first Green Bay guard to be selected since Marco Rivera in 2004.
- ► Was named 2010 Offensive Lineman of the Year by the NFL Alumni Association.
- ► According to STATS LLC, allowed only 9.0 sacks in his first five seasons as a starter (2009-13).
- ► Was the only Packer on either side of the ball to not miss a snap from 2009-10.

C Corey Linsley, Rookie, Ohio State, D5a-14

- ► First rookie center to start for Green Bay in Week 1 since the merger.
- ► Was one of five team captains and was part of a line that helped the team set school records for points scored (637), yards per carry (6.8), touchdowns (87) and TD passes (38) in '13.
- ►The Ohio native was part of a Buckeye team that won 24 consecutive games from 2012-13.

RG T.J. Lang, 6th Year, Eastern Michigan, D4-09

- ► Has started games at four different positions on the line as a pro (27 at LG, 22 at RG, five at RT, two at LT). Played C in Week 10 last season.
- ► Has started 53 contests since 2011.
- ► Started games at both tackle spots in his first season (2009) and became the first Packers rookie to start consecutive games at left tackle since Chad Clifton in 2000.
- ► Began his college career as a defensive lineman, but converted to the offensive line as a sophomore and started 36 straight games (10 at RT, 26 at LT) over his final three years.

RT Bryan Bulaga, 5th Year, Iowa, D1-10

QB Aaron Rodgers, 10th Year, California, D1-05

- ► Ranks No. 2 in the NFL this season in passer rating (111.4), No. 1 in touchdown percentage (7.9) and is tied for No. 2 in touchdown passes (15).
- ▶ Posted 21,332 passing yards from 2008-12, which ranks No. 1 in league history for the most passing yards by a QB in his first five seasons as a starter (previous record was Peyton Manning, 20,618, 1998-2002).
- ► In 92 regular-season starts (61-31 record), has posted 34 games with 300-plus passing yards, 51 without an interception and 54 with a 100plus passer rating (min. 15 attempts).
- ▶ In 2011, set an NFL record with a 122.5 passer rating and set franchise marks for TD passes (45), passing yards (4,643), completion percentage (68.3), yards per attempt (9.25) and 300-yard games (eight) on his way to earning NFL Most Valuable Player honors from *The Associated Press*.

RB Eddie Lacy, 2nd Year, Alabama, D2-13

- ▶ Ranked No. 1 in the league among rookies and No. 8 among all players with 1,178 rushing yards last season, despite missing one full game and nearly all of another due to a concussion.
- ► Ranks No. 1 in franchise history for the most rushing yards by a rookie in a single season, No. 1 in attempts (284), and tied for No. 1 for most 100-yard rushing games with four (John Brockington, four in 1971).
- ▶ Became the first Green Bay rookie RB to be selected to the Pro Bowl since Brockington in 1971 and was named Rookie of the Year by PFWA.
- ► Finished third in the league with 11 TD runs, with 10 of those scores coming between Weeks 7-17, the most in the league over that span.

FB John Kuhn, 9th Year, Shippensburg, W-07 (Pit)

- ► Has played in 113 of 118 games (124 of 129 including playoffs) during his six-plus seasons in Green Bay, appearing in all 16 regular-season contests in four of those seasons.
- Selected to the Pro Bowl in 2011, becoming the first Green Bay fullback to be honored since William Henderson in 2004.
- Only player on the team to have a rushing and receiving touchdown each season from 2008-11, and was the first Packer to achieve that feat since RB Ahman Green (2001-04).
- ▶ Led the team with four rushing TDs in 2011 and led the running backs with six total TDs.

- ► Was the first UCLA defensive lineman selected in the first round since DT Manu Tuiasosopo in 1979 (No. 18 overall, Seattle).

NT Letroy Guion, 7th Year, Florida State, FA-14

- ► Signed with Green Bay this past offseason after spending his first six NFL seasons with the Minnesota Vikings after being selected in the fifth round of the 2008 NFL Draft.
- Started all 28 games he appeared in for Minnesota over the past two seasons, recording 72 tackles (32 solo) and three sacks over that span.
- ► Was the only Viking to block a field goal in both 2011 and 2012.

RDE Mike Daniels, 3rd Year, Iowa, D4a-12

- ► Leads Green Bay with nine sacks since the start of the 2013 regular season.
- ▶ Played in all 16 games with one start last season and ranked No. 2 on the team with a career-high 6.5 sacks. Was tied for No. 6 in the NFL in sacks among defensive tackles.
- ► Returned a fumble 43 yards for a TD vs. Detroit in Week 14 of 2012, the longest fumble return for a TD by a rookie in franchise history.
- ► Starred as an interior pass rusher at lowa, posting a team-high 24.5 tackles for a loss and 13 sacks from 2010-11.

LOLB Clay Matthews, 6th Year, Southern California, D1b-09

- ► Ranks No. 6 in the NFL since entering the league in 2009 with 51.0 sacks. His sack total ranks No. 5 in team history (since 1982).
- ▶ Became the first Packer in team history to earn Pro Bowl recognition in each of his first four seasons in the NFL (2009-12).
- ► Is the only player in franchise history to score a defensive TD (interception or fumble return) in each of his first three seasons in the NFL (2009-11).
- ▶ Named first-team All-Pro by *The Associated Press* in 2010, the first Green Bay LB to earn that honor since Tim Harris in 1989. Finished second to Pittsburgh safety Troy Polamalu in the *AP's* Defensive Player of the Year voting.

BLB A.J. Hawk, 9th Year, Ohio State, D1-06

- ▶ Ranks No. 1 in franchise history (since 1975) with 1,073 tackles.
- ► His 48 tackles this season are second on the team. Led the team with 153 tackles (112 solo) last season and was tied for No. 3 on the club with a career-high five sacks.
- ► Has either led the team or finished second in tackles in six of his seven seasons in Green Bay. Led the team with 142 tackles (105 solo) in 2012.
- ► Has appeared in 131 of a possible 133 regular-season games in his career, starting 128 of 131.
- ► Has posted 1,073 tackles (769 solo), 17.0 sacks, nine interceptions, 39 passes defensed, three forced fumbles and five fumble recoveries during his career.

MLB Jamari Lattimore, 4th Year, Middle Tenn. St., FA-11

- ▶ Began this season providing depth at inside linebacker but has started each of the last five games, tied for third on the team with 38 tackles. In Week 5 he recorded his first career interception against Minnesota.
- ► Continued to contribute on special teams in 2013, but filled in at inside linebacker for injured LB Brad Jones, recording 38 tackles (31 solo), two sacks and a forced fumble.
- ► Spent the first three years of his career evolving into one of the core players on special teams.
- ► Made the transition from outside linebacker as a rookie in 2011 to inside linebacker in 2012.

- ► Signed with Green Bay during the offseason after playing the last four seasons for Chicago and the first eight of his career for Carolina after being selected as the No. 2 overall pick in 2002.
- ► First player in NFL history with 10 interceptions and at least 100 sacks.
- ► Has been selected to the Pro Bowl eight times (2004-06, 2008-12) and has been named first-team All-Pro by *The Associated Press* three times (2004, 2006, 2010). Was named to the NFL's All-Decade Team for the 2000s.
- ►Enters this week having played in 102 consecutive regular-season games.
- ► Ranks No. 3 in the league in sacks (120.0) and tied for No. 4 in forced fumbles (40) since entering the NFL in 2002. His sack total ranks No. 18 in NFL history (since 1982).
- ► Has blocked 13 kicks (12 field goals, one extra point) during his career.

LCB Tramon Williams, 8th Year, Louisiana Tech, FA-06

- ► Tied for No. 1 in the league in interceptions (20) and ranks No. 2 in the NFL in INT return yards (323) since 2010 (including playoffs).
- ► Started all 16 games last season and led the secondary with a careerhigh 91 tackles (68 solo) and a career-best 2.5 sacks. Added three interceptions, two fumble recoveries, two forced fumbles and 14 passes defensed.
- ▶ Despite suffering a shoulder injury in the 2011 season opener, went on to start 15 games that season and post career highs for tackles (65) and passes defensed (24). Also added four interceptions.
- ► With three interceptions during the 2010 playoffs, tied Joe Laws (1944) and Craig Newsome (1996) for the franchise single-postseason record.

RCB Sam Shields, 5th Year, Miami, FA-10

- Started all 14 games he appeared in last season and led the team with four INTs (tied career high) and a career-best 25 passes defensed.
- ► Was limited to 10 games with eight starts in 2012 due to injury, but registered 38 tackles (28 solo), three interceptions, 15 passes defensed (No. 3 on the team) and a sack.
- ► Made an impact in 2010 after making the team as a non-drafted rookie, earning the nickel CB job despite playing the position only one season in college.
- ► In Green Bay's NFC Championship win over Chicago in the 2010 season, became the first rookie in NFL history to record two INTs and a sack in a postseason contest.

SS Morgan Burnett, 5th Year, Georgia Tech, D3-10

- ▶ Leads the team with 52 tackles this season. Ranked No. 2 on the team with 106 tackles (77 solo) in 2013, despite missing the first three games due to injury. Recovered three fumbles, including one for a TD, and added nine passes defensed.
- ▶ Participated in all 1,088 plays for Green Bay's defense in 2012, one of only four non-offensive linemen in the NFL to appear in 100 percent of his team's snaps.
- ► Enjoyed his first full season as a pro in 2011, joining DT B.J. Raji as the only two Green Bay defensive players to start all 16 regular-season games.
- ► Started the first four games of the 2010 season at SS before sustaining a season-ending knee injury vs. Detroit in Week 4.

FS Micah Hyde, 2nd Year, Iowa, D5a-13


- ► Appeared in all 16 games last season, playing in the most defensive plays (428) among the Packers' defensive rookies.
- ➤ Spent most of his rookie season as the dime or nickel cornerback, helping to fill in for CB Casey Hayward, who missed all but three games due to a hamstring injury.
- ► As the team's primary return man for most of the 2013 season, ranked No. 5 in the NFL in punt return average (12.3) and No. 14 in kickoff return average (24.1). Recorded a 93-yard punt return for a touchdown, which tied for the fourth longest in team history.



SEATTLE - The Super Bowl champion Seattle Seahawks started 2014 the same way they finished last season, with a convincing win.

Marshawn Lynch rushed for 110 yards and a pair of touchdowns, Percy Harvin had 100 combined yards rushing and receiving, and the Seahawks stymed Aaron Rodgers' up-tempo offense in a 36-16 win over the Green Bay Packers to kick off the regular season.

The Seahawks unveiled the first Super Bowl banner in franchise history during a brief pregame ceremony and then began the process of trying to be the first team in a decade to repeat.

Their effort against the Packers - a popular pick to contend in the NFC - will only reinforce the belief Seattle is still the favorite.

Russell Wilson was outstanding in the first half, including a 33-yard touchdown pass to Ricardo Lockette. Harvin got touches as a receiver, running back and returner. He was used all over the field in different formations after never being fully healthy in his first season with Seattle.

Wilson finished 19 of 28 for 191 yards passing and Lynch was at his best. Pete Carroll said earlier this week that Lynch appeared in the best shape of his carrear, and it showed. Lynch averaged 5.5 yards per carry and topped 100 yards for the 20th time in the regular season since joining the Seahawks in 2010.

Lynch, who rail for 1,257 yards and 12 touchdowns last season, barreled through a trio of Packers for the TD with 3:41 left before halftime to give the Seahawks a 17-10 lead and added a second TD run on the first play of the fourth quarter.

Seattle had 207 yards ushing as a team and won for the 18th time in its last 20 regular-season home games. Harvin finished with 11 offensive touches, including four rushes for 41 yards.

Rodges finished 23 of 33 for 189 yards and was isolated to one side of the field. He looked almost exclusively for lordy Nelson matched up against Byron Maxwell and never threw in Richard Sherman's direction. Nelson finished with nine receptions, but Maxwell came up with a third-quarter interception on a past that deflected off Nelson's Nards.

The most action for Sherman came in the first half when he accidently blocked Davon House into Earl Thomas on a punt return causing a fumble recovered by the Packers.

But Seattles deflense did its part. They sacked Rodgers three times, taking advantage of a knee injury suffered by right tackle Bryan Bulaga in the second quarter. His replacement, Derek Sherrod, gave up a fourth-down sack to Oliff Avril to end one drive inside Seattle territory. Following a Seattle punt. Sherrod was beaten by Michael Bennett on Green Bay's next offensive snap. Rodgers was stripped and Sherrod tell on the fumble in the end zone for a safety and a 22-10 lead.

Nine plays later, Lynch walked in from the 3-yard line for a 29-10 Seahawks lead. That happened early in the third when a scrambling Roogers got hit by at least one defender while unleashing an awward, wobbly 34-yard pass that somebow connected with Davante Adams in the end zone.

Cobb had seven catches for 113 yards. Nelson had 10 receptions for 108 yards, and the Packers came away with the win despite allowing 496 yards.

The Bears basically matched Green Bay score for score before Cutler threw those interceptions. He wound up passing for 256 yards and two TDs but fell to 1-10 lifetime

against Green Bay, counting the postseason.

Matt Forte ran' for 122 yards on 23 carries. Martellus Bennett had nine catches for a career-high 134 yards, but Chicago came up short after back-to-back wins at San Francisco and the New York Jest.

Mason Crosby kicked a 63-yard field goal on the opening possession of the second half to extend the Packers' lead to 24-17, and things unraweled for the Bears after that. Chicago had the ball on the Green Bay 24 when Outler hit cornerback Tramon Williams in the cheet with a pass. The ball ricocheted to Clay Matthews, who returned it 45 yards. That led to an 11-yard scoring pass from Rodgers to Nelson, making it 31-17.

Another interception set up another 10 for the Packers. This time, Brandon Marshall went long when Cutler expected him to cut back toward the quarterback. The pass went right to San Shelds, who crossed the field on a 62-yard return to put the ball at the 1.1 Chicago's Jonathan Bostic got called for a hold, negating a field goal by Coasty to start the fourth quarter, and Rodgers the Coab from the 31 to make it 38-17.

The Packers took a 21-17 lead to the locker room after the two teams combined for 508 yards. MIAMI GARDENS, Fla. -- Aaron Rodgers stood facemask to facemask with a teammate, screaming in jubilation at the end of a hot, harrowing

Rodgers had the last word Sunday, throwing a 4-yard touchdown pass to Andrew Quarless with three seconds left to help the Green Bay Packers rally past the Miami Dolphins 27-24.

Green Bay twice gave up leads and trailed 24-17 before Rodgers directed consecutive drives of 68 and 60 yards for the victory. He overcame a fumble and a fourth-and-10 on the Packers' final possession, and taked an intentional spike before throwing a completion that set up the touchdown. Rodgers finished with three touchdown passes and 264 yards while committing no turnovers. The Packers (4-2) earned their third consecutive victory, won in Miami for only the second time ever and remained tied with the Detroit Lions atop the NFC North.

The Dolphins (2-3) lost despite the return of six starters who had missed playing time. They overcame deficits of 10-3 and 17-10 to take a 24-17 lead with nine minutes left when Ryan Tannehill hit Mike Wallace for a 5-yard score.

At that point the Packers appeared to be wilting on a typical fall day in the subtropics -- sunny, humid and 85 degrees.

The Packers kicked a field goal with 4:09 to go, making it 24-20, then forced a punt to start at their 40 with 2:04 left.

Rodgers fumbled when sacked, and teammate T.J. Lang recovered. That set up a fourth-and-10, but Rodgers threw to Jordy Nelson for 18 yards, then hit James Starks on third-and-10 for 10 yards.

With the clock running following another completion, Rodgers taked a spike before throwing to Davante Adams, who gained 12 yards before going

out of bounds with six seconds remaining.

Following a Dolphins timeout, Quarless easily outmaneuvered linebacker Philip Wheeler for the winning catch. Wheeler wasn't thrilled with the defensive scheme, which left him alone on the flank. Playing in his 100th regular-season game, Rodgers also threw for scores of 9 yards to Nelson and 5 yards to Randall Cobb. He has 15 touchdowns

passes and only one interception this season.

With the Packers' secondary depleted, Tannehill threw for two scores and 143 yards in the second half, but he was unable to run out the clock with a 24-20 lead. The Dolphins tried forupasses and ran only three times on their final possession.

Green Bay made a goal-line stand in the first quarter, stopping Miami three consecutive times at the 1, including on fourth down when Morgan Burnett tackled Knowshon Moreno for a loss. Casey Hayward intercepted Tannehill to set up a field goal.

The Packers enjoyed a 14-and-a-half-minute advantage in time of possession, a big change from other games this season. Their run defense was

ranked as the NFL's worst, but Miami's running backs totaled only 63 yards on 20 carries

- With 954 receiving yards and 964 kickoff return yards in 2012, became the first player in NFL history to post 900-plus yards in each category in the same season.
- Ranked No. 2 in the NFL in kickoff return average (27.7) in 2011, setting a franchise rookie record with 941 kickoff return yards on the season.
- **2014 Season:** Has started all six games and has 29 catches for 331 yards (11.4 avg.) and a team-high seven TDs...Leads all NFL wide receivers and ranks No. 2 in the league with the seven TD catches, trailing only Broncos TE Julius Thomas (nine)...Has caught at least one TD pass in five of six games this season and has nine TD grabs over his last seven games...Has returned six punts for 48 yards (8.0 avg.).
- ▶at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Finished with six receptions for 58 yards (9.7 avg), including a 3-yard TD grab in the fourth quarter...Handled puntreturn duties, but did not have any returns (two fair catches).
- ▶vs. N.Y. - ▶vs. Minnesota Vikings (10/2): Tied for the team lead with three receptions for 34 yards (11.3 avg.), highlighted by his 8-yard TD catch in the first quarter that started the Green Bay scoring...Lined up in the slot, made a move in the end zone to shed CB Captain Munnerlyn for the 8-yard scoring grab...The TD was his sixth of the season as he became the first Green Bay player since Howton (seven) in 1956 to post six or more receiv-

ing TDs in the first five games of a season.

▶at Miami Dolphins (10/12): Caught five passes for 58 yards (11.6 avg.), including a 5-yard TD catch late in the third quarter that put Green Bay up 17-10...Working against S Louis Delmas in the end zone on third down, cut to the right and then back to the left to free himself as Rodgers scrambled and found him for the score.

2 Mason Crosby, K, 8th Year, Colorado

- Set an NFL record with 903 points in his first seven seasons (2007-13), topping the previous league record held by Indianapolis K Mike Vanderjagt (874, 1998-2004).
- With 942 career points, ranks No. 2 on the all-time franchise scoring list behind only K Ryan Longwell (1,054).
- Is one of only three players in NFL history to register three or more 140-point seasons (Stephen Gostkowski, David Akers).
- Has kicked the six longest field goals in franchise history (58-yarder in 2011, two 57-yarders in 2013, 56-yarders in 2010 and 2011, 55-yarder in 2014).
- Set a franchise record with 23 consecutive field goals made (Week 13, 2010-Week 12, 2011), topping Chris Jacke's mark of 17 straight in 1993. **2014 Season:** Has converted seven of his eight field-goal attempts and all 18 extra points...Has connected on both of his attempts from 50-plus yards (55, 53), which is tied for No. 4 in the NFL...Has recorded 17 touchbacks on 33 kickoffs (51.5 percent)...Has made one tackle on special teams
- ▶at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Connected on his lone field-goal attempt of the evening, a 23-yarder in the second quarter, to bring his streak of consecutive regular-season field goals made to 15 (ties Chris Jacke, 1989-90, for the third-longest streak in franchise history)...Also marked his franchise-record 16th straight regular-season game with at least one field goal, surpassing Longwell's record of 15 (2004-05)...Added two touchbacks on four kickoffs.
- ▶vs. N.Y. Jets (9/14): Made all three of his field-goal attempts, bringing his streak of consecutive FGs made in the regular season to 18, the second-longest streak in franchise history behind only his own streak of 23 straight from 2010-11...Drilled a 55-yard FG in the second quarter, the longest by a Green Bay player ever at Lambeau Field...It was his 20th FG of 50-plus yards, further extending his team record...Also extended his franchise record by making at least one FG in his 17th consecutive game.
- ▶at Detroit Lions (9/21): Saw his team-record streak of 17 consecutive games with a field goal come to an end as his only points came on a first-quarter extra point...Did not have any field-goal attempts for the first time since Week 1 of 2013...Registered one touchback on two kickoffs.
- ▶at Chicago Bears (9/28): Scored eight points, drilling a 53-yard field goal early in the third quarter and all five of his extra points...Saw his streak of consecutive field goal made come to an end at 19 straight, the second-longest streak in team history, when his 38-yard attempt in the fourth quarter was blocked by DE Willie Young...Posted a season-high five touchbacks on seven kickoffs.
- ▶vs. Minnesota Vikings (10/2): Did not have any field-goal attempts for the second time in three games, but connected on all six of his extra points...Registered two touchbacks on the evening.

- Is the only quarterback in league history to record a 100-plus passer rating in five consecutive seasons (2009-13).
- In 93 career regular-season starts (62-31 record), has posted 34 games with 300-plus passing yards, 52 without an interception (min. 15 attempts) and 54 with a 100-plus passer rating.
- In the franchise record books, holds four of the top five single-season marks for passer rating (2009, 2011-13), two of the top three for passing TDs (2011-12), four of the top five for completion percentage (2010-13) and two of the top three for passing yards (2009, 2011).
- **2014 Season:** Has completed 122 of 189 passes (64.6 percent) for 1,419 yards and 15 TDs with one INT for a 111.4 passer rating...Ranks No. 2 in the NFL this season in passer rating, No. 2 in TD/INT ratio among QBs with 100 attempts (15.00, 15/1) and tied for No. 2 in TD passes.

Was named NFC Offensive Player of the Week for his performance, the ninth time in his career that he had earned the weekly honor.

89 Richard Rodgers, TE, Rookie, California

- Played tight end for his first two seasons at California before moving to inside receiver as a junior in 2013, where he caught a career-high 39 passes for a career-best 608 yards (15.6 avg.) and a TD.
- Led the Golden Bears with 11 receptions of 20-plus yards in 2013.
- Appeared in 35 games with 11 starts during his three seasons at Cal and finished with 59 receptions for 896 yards (15.2 avg.) and two TDs.
- **2014 Season:** Has played in all six games with four starts and has two catches for 52 yards (26.0 avg.).
- ▶at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Became the first Green Bay rookie TE to start a season opener since Jackie Harris opened in a two-tight-end set in 1990...Left the game due to a neck injury sustained in the second quarter, but did return to action...Saw 20 snaps on offense.

- Was named to his first career Pro Bowl in 2012, becoming the first Green Bay guard to be selected since Rivera in 2004.
- **2014 Season:** Has started all six games at LG.
- ►at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Started at LG and appeared on all 62 offensive plays.
- ▶vs. N.Y. Jets (9/14): Played all 71 snaps and protected QB Aaron Rodgers as he threw for 346 yards, the most posted by a QB against the Jets since Saints QB Drew Brees threw for 382 last season in Week 9.
- ►at Detroit Lions (9/21): Started at LG and played all 53 offensive snaps.

44 James Starks, RB, 5th Year, Buffalo

- Rushed for 493 yards and a career-high three TDs on 89 carries in 2013, an average of 5.54 yards per carry that ranked No. 1 in the NFL among players with 80-plus attempts.
- Was tied for No. 2 in the NFL last season with three TD runs of 20-plus yards, trailing only Eagles RB LeSean McCoy (four).
- Rushed for a team-high 1,326 yards over the past three seasons (2011-13), highlighted by his club-high 578 rushing vards in 2011.
- Posted a league-leading 315 rushing yards in the 2010 postseason, third most ever by a rookie RB in the postseason behind only Washington's Timmy Smith (342 in 1987) and Baltimore's Jamal Lewis (338 in 2000).
