PACKERS TAKE ON THE SAINTS IN PRIMETIME

The Green Bay Packers travel to New Orleans to play the Saints in the Packers' final game before the bye week. It will be Green Bay's first visit to New Orleans since 2008 and the second in the last 12 seasons.



- ▶ It will be the Packers' fifth road game of the season. Green Bay has won each of its last two road games (at Chicago and at Miami).
- The Packers are currently on a four-game winning streak. Green Bay has posted at least one winning streak of four or more games each of the past six seasons (2009-14), the only NFL team to accomplish that feat over that span.
- ►The Packers are 16-7 all-time against the Saints, including winning the last two matchups.
- Sunday will mark the third meeting between the two teams in primetime. They split the two previous matchups (2008 at New Orleans / 2011 at Green Bay) with both teams winning at home. In each contest the winning team scored more than 40 points.
- ►Green Bay last won in New Orleans in 1995 (34-23). The Packers are 6-5 all-time on the road against the Saints.
- ▶In the three games since 2008, Green Bay and New Orleans have combined for 70.3 points per game. According to the Elias Sports Bureau it is the second-highest points per game scored between opposing teams that have played each other at least three times since 2008 behind Giants-Saints (75.7 in three games).
- ▶ Dating back to 2006, each team has scored at least 27 points in each of the four games.
- ►In the four games since 2006, the Packers have Saints have combined for more than 750 total yards in each game (895 / 876 / 759 / 765).
- ▶Out of Green Bay's 16 wins against the Saints, nine have come by 10-plus points, including five by at least 20 points.
- ▶ Green Bay has finished in the top 10 in total offense in seven of the last eight seasons while New Orleans has finished in the top 10 in all eight seasons (2006-13).
- ► The Packers have scored 20 or more points 20 times against the Saints and at least 30 nine times.
- ▶In the last five meetings between the two clubs (2005, 2006, 2008, 2011, 2012), the teams combined to score a total of 327 points, an average of 65.4 points per game. That included a 52-point outing by Green Bay in '05 and a 51-point showing by New Orleans in '08.
- ▶ Dating back to 2006, the Packers' point differential of plus-560 against NFC teams during the regular season is the second most in the league (New Orleans, plus-568).
- ▶The Packers are in Game No. 2 of a six-game stretch that includes four contests against teams that made the playoffs last season. Of those four teams (Carolina, New Orleans, Philadelphia, New England), three won their division in 2013 and all won at least 10 games.

WITH THE CALL

NBC will broadcast the game to a national audience. Playby-play man Al Michaels joins color commentator Cris Collinsworth in the booth with Michele Tafoya reporting from the sidelines.



- ► Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since November 1929, heads up the Packers Radio Network that is made up of 50 stations in five states. Wayne Larrivee (play-by-play) and two-time Packers Pro Bowler Larry McCarren (analyst) call the action. McCarren first joined the team's broadcasts in 1995 and enters his 20th season calling Packers' games. McCarren, who is in his 26th year in Green Bay television, has four times been voted Wisconsin Sportscaster of the Year by the National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association. After originally being paired together in 1999, McCarren and Larrivee enter their 16th season of broadcasts together.
- ► Westwood One Sports will air the game across the country. Kevin Kugler (play-by-play) and James Lofton (analyst) will call the action, with Chris Doering reporting from the sidelines. Scott Graham hosts pregame and halftime shows.
- ▶ The broadcast is also available on Sirius Satellite Radio (WTMJ feed) as part of the network's NFL Sunday Drive.

Dating back to 2006 when Green Bay hired **Mike McCarthy** as head coach and New Orleans hired Sean Payton, both teams have been among the best in the league on offense.

- ▶In 2011, the Packers led the league in scoring with a franchise-record 560 points, with the Saints checking in at No. 2 in the league with 547 points. It marked the **first time in NFL history** that two teams each scored 525-plus points in a season.

SUNDAY NIGHT SUCCESS

This week's game against New Orleans is the first of two Sunday night matchups for Green Bay in the next three weeks. After the bye week, the Packers return home to play Chicago in primetime.

- ► The Packers have won eight of their last 10 games played on Sunday night, including both of the last two.
- ► Under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**, the Packers are 9-4 overall (.692) on Sunday night.
- ► Green Bay is 21-6 all-time in Sunday night contests, a .778 winning percentage that ranks **No. 1 in NFL history** (since 1978).

- ► The Packers have scored 25-plus points in eight of their last nine Sunday night games, averaging 31.4 points per game over that span while allowing an average of 23.3 points per contest.
- ▶ In 10 career regular-season starts on Sunday night, QB **Aaron Rodgers** has completed 210 of 318 passes (66.0 percent) for 2,752 yards and 22 TDs with just three INTs for a 112.3 passer rating.

BREAKING DOWN THE ROSTER

The Packers' active roster is composed of 24 offensive players, 26 defensive players and three specialists.

- ► Of the 53 players on Green Bay's roster, 33 of them (63.5 percent) were draft picks of the Packers.
- ► Green Bay has 18 players on the roster that began their careers as non-drafted free agents, with eight of those originally signed by Green Bay.
- ► Almost 50 percent of the players (25 of 53, 47.2%) on Green Bay's roster entered the league as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as a non-drafted player.
- ► The Packers have 12 players on the roster that played in the NFL prior to the 2009 season, and six of those players began their pro careers as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as a non-drafted player (QB Matt Flynn, K Mason Crosby, CB Tramon Williams, CB Jarrett Bush, FB John Kuhn, LS Brett Goode).
- ► Of the 53 players on the roster, 42 began their pro careers with the Packers (79.2 percent).
- ▶ Only 17 of the 52 players on the roster (32.7 percent) were selected in the first three rounds of the draft, with 16 being drafted by the Packers.
- ▶ Of the 53 players on the roster, 43 of them (81.1 percent) are 28 years old or younger (as of Oct. 26) and 20 players (37.7 percent) are 24 years old or younger.

- ► Green Bay's Week 7 victory over Carolina marked the Packers' 10th straight win in the month of October, the longest current winning streak by any NFL team in a single calendar month.
- ▶ The Packers have won 16 of their last 17 games played in October.

MR. OCTOBER

Since taking over as the starter in 2008, QB **Aaron Rodgers** has had some success in the month of October.

- ▶ In 12 of his last 15 starts in October, Rodgers has registered a passer rating of at least 100. He has posted seven 130-plus rating games over that span, including a 138.7 rating in a 42-10 win vs. Minnesota in Week 5 and a 154.5 rating in a victory vs. Carolina in Week 7.
- ▶ Over his last 15 October starts (2011-present), Rodgers has completed 334 of 485 passes (68.9 percent) for 4,365 yards (291.0 ypg) and 42 TDs with just four INTs for a 122.4 passer rating. He has eclipsed the 300-yard mark in seven of those 15 games and thrown three or more TDs in 10 of them as well, including this season against Minnesota (three), Miami (three) and Carolina (three). Rodgers has a 14-1 record in his last 15 October starts.

PACKERS AT SAINTS - WEEK 8

STAT OF THE WEEK

- ►QB **Aaron Rodgers** posted his sixth consecutive zero-interception game in the Week 7 win over Carolina, tying Bart Starr's franchise record (min. 15 attempts a game) set in 1964.
- ► He brought his streak of consecutive attempts without an interception to 192, a career high and the second-best mark in franchise annals (Starr, 294, 1964-65). His only interception this season came in the third quarter at Seattle in Week 1.
- ► Rodgers joined Patriots QB Tom Brady (2007) as the only players in NFL history to register four straight three-touchdown/zero-interception games in a single season.
- ►With 18 touchdown passes and one interception this season, Rodgers became the first player in league history to throw for 18-plus touchdowns and one or zero interceptions in the first seven games of a season.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR

- ► A win would make McCarthy 88-47-1 during the regular season as the Packers' head coach.
- ►The Packers are looking for their fifth consecutive win. It would tie for the third-longest winning streak during a single season under McCarthy (2009-5 / 2012-5 / 2007-6 / 2011-13).
- ▶The Packers' defense is looking to hold the opposing starting quarter-back to a passer rating below 85.0 for the seventh game in a row (CAR-Cam Newton, 72.6 / MIA-Ryan Tannehill, 81.5 / MIN-Christian Ponder, 45.8 / CHI-Jay Cutler, 82.5 / DET-Matthew Stafford, 61.6 / NYJ-Geno Smith, 64.1).
- ▶If Green Bay wins, it would give them six wins in the first eight games of the season for the third time in the last eight years (2011-8 / 2007-7).
- ► The Packers are looking for their first three-game road winning streak since 2012 (Weeks 6-7, 11).
- ►Over the last four games, Green Bay's offense has scored on 22 of 43 drives, including four of the first five to begin the game last week.
- ► Green Bay's defense has recorded nine interceptions in the last five weeks, the second most in the NFL over that span (NYG, 11).
- ► The Packers have recorded a league-high 201 interception return yards this season.
- ► Green Bay has registered over 120 rushing yards in each of the last three games.
- ► The Packers are looking for their third consecutive win over the Saints but only their first win at New Orleans since 1995.

OFFENSE

- ►QB **Aaron Rodgers** has registered four games with a 100-plus passer rating this season and 55 in his career.
- ► Rodgers looks to record the 34th 300-yard passing game of his career during the regular season.
- ►If Rodgers throws for at least three touchdowns, it would tie for the most consecutive games with at least three touchdown passes in a single season in his career (2011-5).
- ►WR **Jordy Nelson** is two touchdown receptions short of passing WR Billy Howton (43) for eighth place in franchise history.
- ► Nelson is two receptions shy of passing Ahman Green (350) for the eighth most in team history.

- ► Nelson is 121 receiving yards shy of surpassing Carroll Dale (5,422) for 10th place in franchise history.
- ► Nelson has recorded at least nine receptions in four games this season. If Nelson registers one more game with at least nine receptions, it will be the most in a single season in franchise history.
- ► Nelson has a touchdown catch in a career-best four straight games. The last Packer to have a touchdown reception in five straight games was WR Greg Jennings in 2007.
- Nelson has registered at least one reception in the last 27 regular-season games he has played in. It is the second-longest streak of his career during the regular season (35 games, 2010 - 2012).
- ► Since the start of the 2013 regular season, Nelson has nine games with at least seven receptions, including four games this season. It is tied for the fourth-most games with seven-plus receptions in the league over that time span (WAS Pierre Garcon, 12 / NE Julian Edelman, 11 / PIT Antonio Brown, 11 / HOU Andre Johnson, 9 / DAL Dez Bryant, 9 / DEN Demaryius Thomas, 9).
- ►WR **Randall Cobb** has recorded at least one reception in 31 consecutive regular-season games.
- ► Cobb has caught at least one touchdown in six of seven games this season. He has 10 receiving touchdowns in his last eight regular-season games, dating back to last season.
- ▶ Dating back to last season, RB **Eddie Lacy** has at least one rushing touchdown in 12 of the last 18 regular-season games.
- ▶ Lacy has recorded four rushing touchdowns in the last four games.

DEFENSE

- ▶LB **Julius Peppers** is the only player in the NFL with at least a sack (three), an interception (one), a forced fumble (one), a fumble recovery (two) and a defensive touchdown (one) this season.
- ▶ Peppers is the only player in NFL history with 10 interceptions and at least 100 sacks in his career.
- ▶ Peppers has played in 103 consecutive games, which is the longest active streak among NFL linebackers (NO Curtis Lofton, 102).
- ►LB Clay Matthews (51.5) is three sacks shy of passing DE Aaron Kampman (54.0) for No. 4 on the team's career sacks list.
- ► Matthews needs one more interception to join Peppers as two of five active NFL players with at least six interceptions and 40 sacks (BALTerrell Suggs / TEN-Shaun Phillips / PIT-James Harrison).
- ►CB Casey Hayward looks to tie his career high by recording an interception for the third straight game (Weeks 5-7, 2012).

SPECIAL TEAMS

- ► Cobb needs either a punt return for a touchdown or a kickoff return for a touchdown to take sole possession of second place in Packers history for combined returns for touchdowns (Travis Williams, 6). Cobb, who has three returns for touchdowns, currently is tied with six other players.
- ►K Mason Crosby has played in 119 consecutive games, the longest active streak among kickers.
- ► Crosby looks to extend his consecutive-games-scoring streak to 120 regular-season games. It is the second-longest streak in franchise history (Ryan Longwell, 144).

MIKE McCARTHY...Is in his ninth year as the Packers' 14th head coach.

- ▶ Joined Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl title with a win over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.
- ▶ Led the Packers to their fifth consecutive playoff appearance last season, joining New England as the only two NFL teams to do so over that span. Has also led the team to six playoff appearances in the last seven years (2007, 2009-13).
- ► Has guided the Packers to top-10 finishes in scoring each of the past seven seasons (2007-13), joining the Patriots as the only other team to accomplish the feat.
- ► His .648 winning percentage during the regular season (87-47-1) ranks No. 5 among active NFL coaches (min. 50 games).
- ► Was named Packers head coach on Jan. 12, 2006, his first head-coaching job after 13 years as an NFL assistant.

SEAN PAYTON...Is in his eighth year as the Saints' 14th head coach.

- ► Has led New Orleans to five playoff appearances, three NFC South titles, two NFC Championship games and a Super Bowl title in his first seven seasons as head coach.
- ▶Leads an offense that has ranked among the top 10 in the NFL each season he has been there, including ranking No. 1 in the league four times.
- ▶ Before joining New Orleans he coached for the Dallas Cowboys from 2003-05, serving as the assistant head coach/quarterbacks the first two years and the assistant head coach/passing game coordinator in his last year
- ▶Began his coaching career in the NFL as the quarterbacks coach for the Philadelphia Eagles in 1997-98 and then coached for the New York Giants from 1999-2002, serving as the offensive coordinator his last three seasons.
- ► Coached collegiately at San Diego State (1988-89, 1992-93), Indiana State (1990-91), Miami of Ohio (1994-95) and Illinois (1996).

THE PACKERS-SAINTS SERIES

These teams meet for the sixth time in 10 seasons after having met only once in the previous nine years.

- ► These clubs launched their series in 1968, when former Vince Lombardi assistants Phil Bengston (Packers) and Tom Fears (Saints) met in Milwaukee. The Packers, one year after winning Super Bowl II, defeated the second-year Saints, 29-7. Fears, who coached Super Bowl I hero Max McGee with the Packers from 1962-65, was New Orleans' first head coach.
- Green Bay's 52-3 victory in 2005 was the most lopsided in the series history, eclipsing the Packers' 35-7 victory in New Orleans on Dec. 13, 1981.

NOTABLE CONNECTIONS



- ►In Week 5, Lacy rushed for 105 yards on 13 carries (8.1 avg.) and recorded his second career game with two rushing touchdowns (vs. Pittsburgh, Week 16 in 2013).
- ▶It was the fifth 100-yard rushing game of his career, his lowest attempt total in a 100-yard rushing game and his best per-carry average in a game (min. 10 att.). Lacy's five 100-yard rushing games since the start of 2013 are **tied for sixth in the NFL**.

RACKING UP POINTS

Including 2013, K **Mason Crosby** made 19 consecutive field goals in the regular season, until his final kick against the Bears was blocked in Week 4. He now owns the two longest consecutive field-goal streaks in franchise history (23 straight from 2010-11).

- ► He is the only player in the NFL this season to have at least one sack (three), a forced fumble (one), a fumble recovery (two), an interception (one) and a defensive touchdown (one).
- ▶ For the fifth time in his career, Peppers has recorded a sack, an interception, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery in a season (2004 / 2007 / 2009 / 2013 / 2014). - ►According to STATS LLC, he was one of seven safeties to record an interception and and at least one sack in the first six weeks this season (ARI Rashad Johnson / CIN Reggie Nelson / MIN Harrison Smith / NO Kenny Vaccaro / SF Antoine Bethea / TEN Michael Griffin).
- ►According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Clinton-Dix was the first rookie defensive back in franchise history (since 1982) to have a sack, an interception and a fumble recovery in the first three games of a season.
- ►In Week 1, he became the first Packer (since 1982) to register a sack and a fumble recovery in his NFL debut. The turnover helped set up FB **John Kuhn's** 2-yard touchdown run.



ON THE ROAD AGAIN

Green Bay went 7-1 away from Lambeau Field in 2011, with the seven road wins setting a single-season franchise record.

- ►The Packers have been able to stay above the .500 mark on the road during Head Coach **Mike McCarthy's** tenure, a notable achievement in the National Football League.
- ► Since 2006, McCarthy's first season as the head coach in Green Bay, only 11 of 32 NFL teams have regular-season road records above .500.

Another packed house at Lambeau Field against the Panthers in Week 7 this season brought the stadium's consecutive-sellouts streak to 304 regular-season games (not including replacement games).

- ►The league's longest-tenured stadium, Lambeau Field is hosting its 58th season of football in 2014. A total of 701,102 fans made their way through the turnstiles for the nine games (including playoffs) in 2013.
- ► Across American professional sports, only Boston's Fenway Park (1912) and Chicago's Wrigley Field (1914) have longer tenures.

THE LAMBEAU ADVANTAGE

The crown jewel of the National Football League, Lambeau Field has long been known as one of the tougher venues to play in, particularly during the harsh Wisconsin winter.

- ▶Re-establishing home-field advantage after a 4-4 mark in 2008 was one of the goals of 2009, and with the Packers finishing 6-2 at home, they accomplished that goal. Green Bay followed that up with a 7-1 mark at Lambeau Field in 2010, a perfect 8-0 record in 2011, the first undefeated home mark since 2002, and a 7-1 mark in 2012.
- ► Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** stated consistently upon his arrival in Green Bay that one of the team's goals would be to reclaim the mystique of playing at Lambeau Field. Mission accomplished. The team is 49-17-1 (.739) at home in the regular-season since 2006.
- ► Since Ron Wolf and Mike Holmgren began the revitalization of the franchise in 1992, Green Bay owns the best home record in the NFL. A look at the top regular-season home W-L records since the '92 season:

A LOOK AT THE SCHEDULE

The Green Bay Packers' 94th NFL regular-season schedule is headlined by five prime-time games (subject to flexible scheduling).

- ► Green Bay's schedule includes five games against 2013 playoff teams, with three of those contests (Carolina, Philadelphia, New England) at Lambeau Field and two on the road (Seattle, New Orleans).
- ► The Packers have three prime-time contests at home (vs. Minnesota on Thursday night in Week 5, vs. Chicago on Sunday night in Week 10 and vs. Atlanta on *Monday Night Football* in Week 14) and two on the road (Thursday night at Seattle in Week 1 and Sunday night at New Orleans in Week 8).
- ▶ The Packers' bye arrives in Week 9 for the first time since 2004.
- ▶ It is the second time in franchise history (1922) that Green Bay opens with three of their first four games on the road.
- ► Two of Green Bay's first five games are played on Thursday night, with the next seven taking place on Sunday, one on the following Monday, and three more on Sunday to close out the regular season.
- ▶ For the second year in a row and just the third time in nine seasons under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** (2010), the Packers opened the season on the road. For the third straight season Green Bay opened against an NFC West team after facing San Francisco each of the last two years.
- ▶ Dating back to 2001, the Packers have always played against an NFC team in Week 1. The last AFC team Green Bay faced in Week 1 was the New York Jets, who visited the Packers in Week 2 for the home opener.
- ► Following the home opener, the Packers went on the road to face two division opponents, Detroit and Chicago, before returning home to face Minnesota in a Thursday night divisional matchup. It was the sixth time in the last seven seasons they have faced off in primetime.
- ► The Packers traveled to Miami for the third time in 23 years and first time since 2006. The following week Green Bay hosted Carolina for teh first time since 2008.
- ► Before the bye week, the Packers will travel to New Orleans for a primetime matchup against the Saints.
- ► Following the bye week, the Packers return to Sunday night to host the Bears, who they have beaten five of the last six times at home.
- ▶ Philadelphia comes to Lambeau for the second straight season, which is only the second time in the series that the two clubs have played at Green Bay in back-to-back seasons (1933-34).
- ► For the second consecutive season, Green Bay will play Minnesota in Week 12, traveling to face the Vikings in the first outdoor game (TCF Bank Stadium) between the two in Minnesota since they played at Metropolitan Stadium on Nov. 29, 1981.
- ►The last game in November brings New England to Lambeau Field for the first time since 2006 and only its third visit ever to the stadium (1979).
- ▶ December opens with a Monday night matchup at home versus Atlanta. It marks the 22nd straight season the Packers have appeared on Monday Night Football.
- ► The next two weeks include road games at Buffalo and Tampa Bay. It will be the Packers' first visit to Buffalo since 2006 and first trip to Tampa Bay in the month of December since 1999.
- ► Green Bay closes the regular season at Lambeau Field against Detroit for the fourth time under McCarthy (2007, 2008, 2011).

- ► Reached the 900-point mark for his career in his 112th game, third fastest in NFL history (Gino Cappelletti, 106; Stephen Gostkowski, 108).
- ► Ranks No. 2 in team history for the most 100-point seasons with seven, trailing only Longwell (eight).
- ► Made 23 straight field goals from Week 13 of 2010 through Week 10 of 2011, the longest regular-season streak in franchise history.
- ► In 2011, set a franchise record with a 58-yard field goal in Week 7 at Minnesota, eclipsing the mark of 56 yards he held (Week 1 at Philadelphia, 2010; Week 5 at Atlanta, 2011).
- ► For his career, has hit 126 of 138 field goals (91.3 percent) from 39 vards and closer.
- ► Has made 45 of 63 field goals (71.4 percent) from 40-49 yards.
- ► Has hit 21 of 42 field goals (50.0 percent) from 50-plus yards.

50 A.J. HAWK

- ► Is tied for No. 1 in franchise history for the most seasons leading the team in tackles with five (2006, 2008, 2010, 2012-13), matching the mark of five by LB Nick Barnett (2003-05, 2007, 2009).
- ► Has either led the team or finished second in tackles in six of his seven seasons in Green Bay. Has posted 100-plus tackles in six of seven seasons.
- ► Has 1,079 career tackles, which ranks No. 1 in team history (since defensive stats began to be recorded by coaches in 1975). Moved past John Anderson (1,020, 1978-89) for the franchise record with eight tackles at Chicago in Week 17 last season.

27 EDDIE LACY

- ► Set franchise rookie records in 2013 for rushing yards (1,178), rushing TDs (11) and rushing attempts (284).

- ► Set a single-season franchise record with his 45.6-yard gross average in 2011, surpassing Craig Hentrich's 45.0-yard mark in 1997.
- ► Tied Sean Landeta's single-season franchise record (1998) by placing 30 punts inside the 20-yard line in 2012.
- ► Holds the top four single-season marks for net punting average in franchise history (since 1976) with a 38.95 average in 2013, a 38.93 average in 2012, a 38.56 average in 2011 and a 37.65 average in 2010.

52 CLAY MATTHEWS

- ►Only player in franchise history to be named to the Pro Bowl each of his first four seasons in the league (2009-12).

- ►His 17 sacks in his first 20 games were the most by an NFL player to start his career at the time, eclipsing the mark of 16.5 set by Leslie O'Neal (1986, 1988) and John Abraham (2000-01).

- ▶ Dating back to 1960, Nelson's 47 receptions and 712 receiving yards are both the second most by a Packers receiver in the first seven games of a season.
- ► His 22 TD grabs from 2011-12 were the most by a Packer over a twoyear span since WR Antonio Freeman posted 26 TDs from 1997-98.
- ► Caught 15 TD passes in 2011, joining WRs Sterling Sharpe (18 in 1994) and Don Hutson (17 in 1942) as the only players in franchise annals to catch 15-plus TD passes in a season.
- ► With four TD grabs of 80-plus yards during his career, Nelson is tied for the most in team history and No. 1 among active NFL players (Vikings WR Greg Jennings).

- ▶Only player in NFL history with at least 10 interceptions and 100 sacks.

- ► With eight double-digit sack seasons as a pro, is tied with Jared Allen for the most in the NFL since 2002.
- ► Named first-team All-Pro by *The Associated Press* three times and was selected to the NFL's All-Decade team for the 2000s.

12 AARON RODGERS

- ► Ranks No. 1 in NFL history with a 105.8 career passer rating.
- ► When he hit the 200-TD mark for his career, he had thrown just 53 INTs to that point, the fewest in NFL history as he bested Tom Brady's mark of 88 INTs at the time of his 200th TD pass.
- ▶This season he became the first quarterback to throw for 18-plus touchdowns with one or fewer interceptions in the first seven games of a season.
- ► Ranks No. 2 in NFL history for the most touchdown passes in a player's first 100 games with 203 (MIA QB Dan Marino, 217).
- ►Set an NFL single-season record in 2011 with a 122.5 passer rating and set team marks for TD passes (45), passing yards (4,643), completion percentage (68.3), yards per attempt (9.25), TD/INT ratio (7.50) and 300-yard games (eight).
- ► Posted 21,332 passing yards from 2008-12, the most in NFL history by a quarterback in his first five seasons as a starter.
- ►Threw a TD pass in 35 straight regular-season games at Lambeau Field from 2008-12, a team record (previous mark was 25 by Brett Favre, 1992-96). It was the second-longest home streak in NFL history behind Dan Marino's 39-game streak from 1983-88.
- ►Tied a single-game franchise record with six TD passes at Houston in Week 6 of 2012, matching Matt Flynn's mark (Jan. 1, 2012, vs. Detroit).

LG Josh Sitton, 7th Year, Central Florida, D4b-08

- ► Has started 85 games since 2009, the most by an offensive player in a Green Bay uniform over that span.
- ► Was named to his first career Pro Bowl in 2012, becoming the first Green Bay guard to be selected since Marco Rivera in 2004.
- ► Was named 2010 Offensive Lineman of the Year by the NFL Alumni Association.
- According to STATS LLC, allowed only nine sacks in his first five seasons as a starter (2009-13).
- ► Was the only Packer on either side of the ball to not miss a snap from 2009-10.

C Corey Linsley, Rookie, Ohio State, D5a-14

- ► First rookie center to start for Green Bay in Week 1 since the merger.
- ► Was one of five team captains and was part of a line that helped the team set school records for points scored (637), yards per carry (6.8), touchdowns (87) and TD passes (38) in '13.
- ►The Ohio native was part of a Buckeye team that won 24 consecutive games from 2012-13.

RG T.J. Lang, 6th Year, Eastern Michigan, D4-09

- ► Has started games at four different positions on the line as a pro (27 at LG, 23 at RG, five at RT, two at LT). Played C in Week 10 last season.
- ► Has started 54 contests since 2011.
- ▶ Started games at both tackle spots in his first season (2009) and became the first Packers rookie to start consecutive games at left tackle since Chad Clifton in 2000.
- ► Began his college career as a defensive lineman, but converted to the offensive line as a sophomore and started 36 straight games (10 at RT, 26 at LT) over his final three years.

RT Bryan Bulaga, 5th Year, Iowa, D1-10

- ► In 2013, moved into the starting role in Week 8 following TE Jermichael Finley's season-ending neck injury.

QB Aaron Rodgers, 10th Year, California, D1-05

- ► His career passer rating of 105.8 ranks No. 1 in NFL history.
- ► Ranks No. 2 in the NFL this season in passer rating (117.3), No. 2 in touchdown percentage (7.9) and No. 3 in touchdown passes (18).
- ▶ Posted 21,332 passing yards from 2008-12, which ranks No. 1 in league history for the most passing yards by a QB in his first five seasons as a starter (previous record was Peyton Manning, 20,618, 1998-2002).
- ▶ In 94 regular-season starts (63-31 record), has posted 34 games with 300-plus passing yards, 53 without an interception and 55 with a 100-plus passer rating (min. 15 attempts).
- ► In 2011, set an NFL record with a 122.5 passer rating and set franchise marks for TD passes (45), passing yards (4,643), completion percentage (68.3), yards per attempt (9.25) and 300-yard games (eight) on his way to earning NFL Most Valuable Player honors from *The Associated Press*.

RB Eddie Lacy, 2nd Year, Alabama, D2-13

- ► Ranked No. 1 in the league among rookies and No. 8 among all players with 1,178 rushing yards last season, despite missing one full game and nearly all of another due to a concussion.
- ► Ranks No. 1 in franchise history for the most rushing yards by a rookie in a single season, No. 1 in attempts (284), and tied for No. 1 for most 100-yard rushing games with four (John Brockington, four in 1971).
- ▶ Became the first Green Bay rookie RB to be selected to the Pro Bowl since Brockington in 1971 and was named Rookie of the Year by PFWA.
- ► Finished third in the league with 11 TD runs, with 10 of those scores coming between Weeks 7-17, the most in the league over that span.

FB John Kuhn, 9th Year, Shippensburg, W-07 (Pit)

- ► Has played in 114 of 119 games (125 of 130 including playoffs) during his six-plus seasons in Green Bay, appearing in all 16 regular-season contests in four of those seasons.
- ➤ Selected to the Pro Bowl in 2011, becoming the first Green Bay fullback to be honored since William Henderson in 2004.
- ► Only player on the team to have a rushing and receiving touchdown each season from 2008-11, and was the first Packer to achieve that feat since RB Ahman Green (2001-04).
- ▶ Led the team with four rushing TDs in 2011 and led the running backs with six total TDs.

NT Letroy Guion, 7th Year, Florida State, FA-14

- ► Signed with Green Bay this past offseason after spending his first six NFL seasons with the Minnesota Vikings after being selected in the fifth round of the 2008 NFL Draft.
- Started all 28 games he appeared in for Minnesota over the past two seasons, recording 72 tackles (32 solo) and three sacks over that span.
- ► Was the only Viking to block a field goal in both 2011 and 2012.

RDE Mike Daniels, 3rd Year, Iowa, D4a-12

- ► Leads Green Bay with nine sacks since the start of the 2013 regular season.
- ▶ Played in all 16 games with one start last season and ranked No. 2 on the team with a career-high 6.5 sacks. Was tied for No. 6 in the NFL in sacks among defensive tackles.
- ► Returned a fumble 43 yards for a TD vs. Detroit in Week 14 of 2012, the longest fumble return for a TD by a rookie in franchise history.
- ► Starred as an interior pass rusher at lowa, posting a team-high 24.5 tackles for a loss and 13 sacks from 2010-11.

LOLB Clay Matthews, 6th Year, Southern California, D1b-09

- ► Tied for No. 7 in the NFL since entering the league in 2009 with 51.5 sacks. His sack total ranks No. 5 in team history (since 1982).
- ▶ Became the first Packer in team history to earn Pro Bowl recognition in each of his first four seasons in the NFL (2009-12).
- ► Is the only player in franchise history to score a defensive TD (interception or fumble return) in each of his first three seasons in the NFL (2009-11).
- ▶ Named first-team All-Pro by *The Associated Press* in 2010, the first Green Bay LB to earn that honor since Tim Harris in 1989. Finished second to Pittsburgh safety Troy Polamalu in the *AP's* Defensive Player of the Year voting.

BLB A.J. Hawk, 9th Year, Ohio State, D1-06

- ▶ Ranks No. 1 in franchise history (since 1975) with 1,079 tackles.
- ► His 54 tackles this season are second on the team. Led the team with 153 tackles (112 solo) last season and was tied for No. 3 on the club with a career-high five sacks.
- ► Has either led the team or finished second in tackles in six of his seven seasons in Green Bay. Led the team with 142 tackles (105 solo) in 2012.
- ► Has appeared in 131 of a possible 133 regular-season games in his career, starting 128 of 131.
- ► Has posted 1,079 tackles (774 solo), 17.0 sacks, nine interceptions, 39 passes defensed, three forced fumbles and five fumble recoveries during his career.

MLB Jamari Lattimore, 4th Year, Middle Tenn. St., FA-11

- ▶ Began this season providing depth at inside linebacker but has started five of the last six games. In Week 5, he recorded his first career interception against Minnesota.
- ► Continued to contribute on special teams in 2013, but filled in at inside linebacker for injured LB Brad Jones, recording 38 tackles (31 solo), two sacks and a forced fumble.
- Spent the first three years of his career evolving into one of the core players on special teams.
- ► Made the transition from outside linebacker as a rookie in 2011 to inside linebacker in 2012.

ROLB Julius Peppers, 13th Year, North Carolina, FA-14

- ► Signed with Green Bay during the offseason after playing the last four seasons for Chicago and the first eight of his career for Carolina after being selected as the No. 2 overall pick in 2002.
- ► First player in NFL history with 10 interceptions and at least 100 sacks.
- ► Has been selected to the Pro Bowl eight times (2004-06, 2008-12) and has been named first-team All-Pro by *The Associated Press* three times (2004, 2006, 2010). Was named to the NFL's All-Decade Team for the 2000s.
- ► Enters this week having played in 103 consecutive regular-season games.
- ► Ranks No. 3 in the league in sacks (121.5) and tied for No. 4 in forced fumbles (40) since entering the NFL in 2002. His sack total ranks No. 18 in NFL history (since 1982).
- ► Has blocked 13 kicks (12 field goals, one extra point) during his career.

LCB Tramon Williams, 8th Year, Louisiana Tech, FA-06

- ► Tied for No. 1 in the league in interceptions (20) and ranks No. 2 in the NFL in INT return yards (323) since 2010 (including playoffs).
- ► Started all 16 games last season and led the secondary with a careerhigh 91 tackles (68 solo) and a career-best 2.5 sacks. Added three interceptions, two fumble recoveries, two forced fumbles and 14 passes defensed.
- ▶ Despite suffering a shoulder injury in the 2011 season opener, went on to start 15 games that season and post career highs for tackles (65) and passes defensed (24). Also added four interceptions.
- ► With three interceptions during the 2010 playoffs, tied Joe Laws (1944) and Craig Newsome (1996) for the franchise single-postseason record.

RCB Sam Shields, 5th Year, Miami, FA-10

- Started all 14 games he appeared in last season and led the team with four INTs (tied career high) and a career-best 25 passes defensed.
- ► Was limited to 10 games with eight starts in 2012 due to injury, but registered 38 tackles (28 solo), three interceptions, 15 passes defensed (No. 3 on the team) and a sack.
- ► Made an impact in 2010 after making the team as a non-drafted rookie, earning the nickel CB job despite playing the position only one season in college.
- ► In Green Bay's NFC Championship win over Chicago in the 2010 season, became the first rookie in NFL history to record two INTs and a sack in a postseason contest.

SS Morgan Burnett, 5th Year, Georgia Tech, D3-10

- ► Leads the team with 59 tackles this season. Ranked No. 2 on the team with 106 tackles (77 solo) in 2013, despite missing the first three games due to injury. Recovered three fumbles, including one for a TD, and added nine passes defensed.
- ▶ Participated in all 1,088 plays for Green Bay's defense in 2012, one of only four non-offensive linemen in the NFL to appear in 100 percent of his team's snaps.
- ► Enjoyed his first full season as a pro in 2011, joining DT B.J. Raji as the only two Green Bay defensive players to start all 16 regular-season games.
- ► Started the first four games of the 2010 season at SS before sustaining a season-ending knee injury vs. Detroit in Week 4.

FS Micah Hyde, 2nd Year, Iowa, D5a-13

- ► Appeared in all 16 games last season, playing in the most defensive plays (428) among the Packers' defensive rookies.
- ➤ Spent most of his rookie season as the dime or nickel cornerback, helping to fill in for CB Casey Hayward, who missed all but three games due to a hamstring injury.
- ► As the team's primary return man for most of the 2013 season, ranked No. 5 in the NFL in punt return average (12.3) and No. 14 in kickoff return average (24.1). Recorded a 93-yard punt return for a touchdown, which is tied for the fourth longest in team history.



SEATTLE - The Super Bowl champion Seattle Seahawks started 2014 the same way they finished last season, with a convincing win.

Marshawn Lynch rushed for 110 yards and a pair of touchdowns, Percy Harvin had 100 combined yards rushing and receiving, and the Seahawks stymed Aaron Rodgers' up-tempo offense in a 36-16 win over the Green Bay Packers to kick off the regular season.

The Seahawks unveiled the first Super Bowl banner in franchise history during a brief pregame ceremony and then began the process of trying to be the first team in a decade to repeat.

Their effort against the Packers - a popular pick to contend in the NFC - will only reinforce the belief Seattle is still the favorite.

Russell Wilson was outstanding in the first half, including a 33-yard touchdown pass to Ricardo Lockette. Harvin got touches as a receiver, running back and returner. He was used all over the field in different formations after never being fully healthy in his first season with Seattle.

Wilson finished 19 of 28 for 191 yards passing and Lynch was at his best. Pete Carroll said earlier this week that Lynch appeared in the best shape of his carrear, and it showed. Lynch averaged 5.5 yards per carry and topped 100 yards for the 20th time in the regular season since joining the Seahawks in 2010.

Lynch, who rail for 1,257 yards and 12 touchdowns last season, barreled through a trio of Packers for the TD with 3:41 left before halftime to give the Seahawks a 17-10 lead and added a second TD run on the first play of the fourth quarter.

Seattle had 207 yards ushing as a team and won for the 18th time in its last 20 regular-season home games. Harvin finished with 11 offensive touches, including four rushes for 41 yards.

Rodges finished 23 of 33 for 189 yards and was isolated to one side of the field. He looked almost exclusively for lordy Nelson matched up against Byron Maxwell and never threw in Richard Sherman's direction. Nelson finished with nine receptions, but Maxwell came up with a third-quarter interception on a past that deflected off Nelson's Nards.

The most action for Sherman came in the first half when he accidently blocked Davon House into Earl Thomas on a punt return causing a fumble recovered by the Packers.

But Seattles deflense did its part. They sacked Rodgers three times, taking advantage of a knee injury suffered by right tackle Bryan Bulaga in the second quarter. His replacement, Derek Sherrod, gave up a fourth-down sack to Oliff Avril to end one drive inside Seattle territory. Following a Seattle punt. Sherrod was beaten by Michael Bennett on Green Bay's next offensive snap. Rodgers was stripped and Sherrod tell on the fumble in the end zone for a safety and a 22-10 lead.

Nine plays later, Lynch walked in from the 3-yard line for a 29-10 Seahawks lead. Bears on Sunday aftermoon.

The Packers (2-2) scored on their first six possessions to build a 38-17 lead. They racked up 358 yards after being held to 223, their lowest total since 2008, a week earlier in a 19-7 loss at Defroit.

They intercapted Jay Cutler twice in the third quarter to pull away from the Bears (2-2). That gave Green Bay five straight wins at Soldier Field, including the NFC title game four years ago and a playoffs-or-bust finale for both teams last season.

Roogers capted of Packers faints to take a deep breath during the week, and he gave them reason to exhale with this performance.

Roogers posted a 151.2 rating for the game, completing 22 of 28 passes, and had all the time he needed with five-time Pro Bowl defensive end Jared Allen sitting out because of an illness.

He Inter two touchdown passes each to Randall Cobb and Jordy Nelson, and a fifth got called back by a penalty. That happened early in the third when a scrambling Roogers got hit by at least one defender while unleashing an awward, wobbly 34-yard pass that somebow connected with Davante Adams in the end zone.

Cobb had seven catches for 113 yards. Nelson had 10 receptions for 108 yards, and the Packers came away with the win despite allowing 496 yards.

The Bears basically matched Green Bay score for score before Cutler threw those interceptions. He wound up passing for 256 yards and two TDs but fell to 1-10 lifetime

against Green Bay, counting the postseason.

Matt Forte ran' for 122 yards on 23 carries. Martellus Bennett had nine catches for a career-high 134 yards, but Chicago came up short after back-to-back wins at San Francisco and the New York Jest.

Mason Crosby kicked a 63-yard field goal on the opening possession of the second half to extend the Packers' lead to 24-17, and things unraweled for the Bears after that. Chicago had the ball on the Green Bay 24 when Outler hit cornerback Tramon Williams in the cheet with a pass. The ball ricocheted to Clay Matthews, who returned it 45 yards. That led to an 11-yard scoring pass from Rodgers to Nelson, making it 31-17.

Another interception set up another 10 for the Packers. This time, Brandon Marshall went long when Cutler expected him to cut back toward the quarterback. The pass went right to San Shelds, who crossed the field on a 62-yard return to put the ball at the 1.1 Chicago's Jonathan Bostic got called for a hold, negating a field goal by Coasty to start the fourth quarter, and Rodgers the Coab from the 31 to make it 38-17.

The Packers took a 21-17 lead to the locker room after the two teams combined for 508 yards. Chicago missed a touchdown by inches when Bennett got stopped just short of the end zone on an 8-yard end catch. Cutler thought Bennett reached across the goal line before getting taken down, but the call was upheld after a review.

Then, in the third quarter, Green Bay created some breathing room.

MIAMI GARDENS, Fla. -- Aaron Rodgers stood facemask to facemask with a teammate, screaming in jubilation at the end of a hot, harrowing

Rodgers had the last word Sunday, throwing a 4-yard touchdown pass to Andrew Quarless with three seconds left to help the Green Bay Packers rally past the Miami Dolphins 27-24.

Green Bay twice gave up leads and trailed 24-17 before Rodgers directed consecutive drives of 68 and 60 yards for the victory. He overcame a fumble and a fourth-and-10 on the Packers' final possession, and taked an intentional spike before throwing a completion that set up the touchdown. Rodgers finished with three touchdown passes and 264 yards while committing no turnovers. The Packers (4-2) earned their third consecutive victory, won in Miami for only the second time ever and remained tied with the Detroit Lions atop the NFC North.

The Dolphins (2-3) lost despite the return of six starters who had missed playing time. They overcame deficits of 10-3 and 17-10 to take a 24-17 lead with nine minutes left when Ryan Tannehill hit Mike Wallace for a 5-yard score.

At that point the Packers appeared to be wilting on a typical fall day in the subtropics -- sunny, humid and 85 degrees.

The Packers kicked a field goal with 4:09 to go, making it 24-20, then forced a punt to start at their 40 with 2:04 left.

Rodgers fumbled when sacked, and teammate T.J. Lang recovered. That set up a fourth-and-10, but Rodgers threw to Jordy Nelson for 18 yards, then hit James Starks on third-and-10 for 10 yards.

With the clock running following another completion, Rodgers taked a spike before throwing to Davante Adams, who gained 12 yards before going

out of bounds with six seconds remaining.

Following a Dolphins timeout, Quarless easily outmaneuvered linebacker Philip Wheeler for the winning catch. Wheeler wasn't thrilled with the defensive scheme, which left him alone on the flank. Playing in his 100th regular-season game, Rodgers also threw for scores of 9 yards to Nelson and 5 yards to Randall Cobb. He has 15 touchdowns

passes and only one interception this season.

With the Packers' secondary depleted, Tannehill threw for two scores and 143 yards in the second half, but he was unable to run out the clock with a 24-20 lead. The Dolphins tried forupasses and ran only three times on their final possession.

Green Bay made a goal-line stand in the first quarter, stopping Miami three consecutive times at the 1, including on fourth down when Morgan Burnett tackled Knowshon Moreno for a loss. Casey Hayward intercepted Tannehill to set up a field goal.

The Packers enjoyed a 14-and-a-half-minute advantage in time of possession, a big change from other games this season. Their run defense was

ranked as the NFL's worst, but Miami's running backs totaled only 63 yards on 20 carries

17 Davante Adams, WR, Rookie, Fresno State

- Led the nation in receptions (131) and receptions per game (10.1), while ranking second in the country in receiving yards (1,718) and receiving yards per game (132.2) as a sophomore in 2013.
- Caught 24 TD passes in '13, eight more than any player in the country and the most in school and Mountain West Conference history.
- Set Fresno State career records for receptions (233) and TD catches (38), despite playing just two seasons for the Bulldogs.
- **2014 Season:** Has played in all seven games with three starts, appearing on offense and special teams, and has 17 catches for 188 yards (11.1 avg.) and two TDs.

▶vs. Minnesota Vikings (10/2): Tied for the team lead with three receptions for 34 yards (11.3 avg.), highlighted by his 8-yard TD catch in the first quarter that started the Green Bay scoring...Lined up in the slot, made a move in the end zone to shed CB Captain Munnerlyn for the 8-yard scoring grab...The TD was his sixth of the season as he became the first Green Bay player since Howton (seven) in 1956 to post six or more receiving TDs in the first five games of a season.

▶at Miami Dolphins (10/12): Caught five passes for 58 yards (11.6 avg.), including a 5-yard TD catch late in the third quarter that put Green Bay up 17-10...Working against S Louis Delmas in the end zone on third down, cut to the right and then back to the left to free himself as Rodgers scrambled and found him for the score.

in the second quarter.

2 Mason Crosby, K, 8th Year, Colorado

- Set an NFL record with 903 points in his first seven seasons (2007-13), topping the previous league record held by Indianapolis K Mike Vanderjagt (874, 1998-2004).
- With 950 career points, ranks No. 2 on the all-time franchise scoring list behind only K Ryan Longwell (1,054).
- Is one of only three players in NFL history to register three or more 140point seasons (Stephen Gostkowski, David Akers).
- Has kicked the six longest field goals in franchise history (58-yarder in 2011, two 57-yarders in 2013, 56-yarders in 2010 and 2011, 55-yarder in 2014).
- Set a franchise record with 23 consecutive field goals made (Week 13, 2010-Week 12, 2011), topping Chris Jacke's mark of 17 straight in 1993.

2014 Season: Has converted eight of his nine field-goal attempts (a blocked FG) and all 23 extra points for 47 points on the season...Has connected on both of his attempts from 50-plus yards (55, 53), which is tied for No. 4 in the NFL...Has recorded 22 touchbacks on 40 kickoffs (55.0 percent)...Has made one tackle on special teams.

▶at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Connected on his lone field-goal attempt of the evening, a 23-yarder in the second quarter, to bring his streak of consecutive regular-season field goals made to 15 (ties Chris Jacke, 1989-90, for the third-longest streak in franchise history)...Also marked his franchise-record 16th straight regular-season game with at least one field goal, surpassing Longwell's record of 15 (2004-05)...Added two touchbacks on four kickoffs.

- Played in all 12 games with 10 starts at CSU-Pueblo as a senior in 2013 and recorded 36 tackles (15 solo), including six for a loss, three sacks, three forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and four passes defensed.
- **2014 Season:** Has played in four games, was inactive for two contests and dressed but did not play in the other...Has registered nine tackles (six solo), two QB hits and a pressure.

- Since entering the NFL in 2002, ranks No. 3 in the league in sacks (121.5) and is tied for No. 4 in forced fumbles (40).
- Is the only player in NFL history (since 1982) to register 100 sacks (119.5) and 10 interceptions (10).
- Has posted eight double-digit sack seasons since 2002, which is tied with Bears DE Jared Allen for No. 1 in the league over that span.
- **2014 Season:** Has started all seven games and has posted 23 tackles (15 solo), three sacks, an interception that he returned for a TD, seven QB hits, six pressures, three passes defensed, a forced fumble and a teamhigh two fumble recoveries.
- ►at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Started at ROLB in his Green Bay debut, recording four tackles (all solo), a QB hit and a pressure.

- Is the only quarterback in league history to record a 100-plus passer rating in five consecutive seasons (2009-13).
- In 94 career regular-season starts (63-31 record), has posted 34 games with 300-plus passing yards, 53 without an interception (min. 15 attempts) and 55 with a 100-plus passer rating.
- In the franchise record books, holds four of the top five single-season marks for passer rating (2009, 2011-13), two of the top three for passing TDs (2011-12), four of the top five for completion percentage (2010-13) and two of the top three for passing yards (2009, 2011).
- **2014 Season:** Has completed 141 of 211 passes (66.8 percent) for 1,674 yards and 18 TDs with one INT for a 117.3 passer rating...Ranks No. 2 in the NFL this season in passer rating, No. 1 in TD/INT ratio among QBs with 100 attempts (18.00, 18/1) and No. 3 in TD passes.

as a starter and tied for the fourth-largest comeback in franchise history. ▶at Detroit Lions (9/21): Completed 16 of 27 passes for 162 yards and a TD for a passer rating of 88.8...His TD pass came late in the first quarter when he threw a 10-yard bullet to TE Andrew Quarless over the middle for the score on third-and-1.

Was named NFC Offensive Player of the Week for his performance, the ninth time in his career that he had earned the weekly honor.

▶vs. Minnesota Vikings (10/2): Completed 12 of 17 passes for 156 yards and three TDs with no INTs for a 138.7 passer rating, his sixth 130-plus rating game in his last seven starts against Minnesota...His 11-yard TD pass to WR Davante Adams in the second quarter was the 200th of his career as he reached that mark in his 99th career game, the second fastest in NFL history behind only Dolphins QB Dan Marino (89 games)...Set an NFL record for the fewest INTs by a quarterback at the time of his 200th career TD pass with 53, topping the previous mark held by Patriots QB Tom Brady (88) by 35 INTs...Connected with Nelson on a 66-yard TD pass in the second quarter, Rodgers' 21st of 60-plus yards since 2008, No. 1 in the NFL over that span...Posted his fourth straight zero-INT game, his longest streak since a four-gamer in 2012 (Weeks 14-17)...His 17 attempts on the evening tied his career low (vs. Detroit, Oct. 3, 2010) for a game he did not depart early due to injury...Exited the game after a seven-play, 52-yard TD drive that put Green Bay up 42-0 late in the third quarter.

▶at Miami Dolphins (10/12): Appearing in his 100th career regularseason game, led the Packers on an 11-play, 60-yard game-winning drive that was capped off with his 4-vard TD pass to TE Andrew Quarless with three seconds remaining in the 27-24 win...It marked the first time the Packers won a game on a TD with three seconds or less remaining in the fourth quarter since they beat the Bears, 20-19, on a 3-yard TD run by QB Bart Starr with three seconds left on Nov. 15, 1970...Completed 24 of 42 passes on the day for 264 yards and three TDs with zero INTs, his fifth consecutive start with no interceptions as he matched his career high set in 2010...The three TD passes brought his career total to 203, the second most in NFL history through 100 games behind only Dolphins QB Dan Marino (217)...On his 5-yard TD pass to Cobb in the third quarter, moved up in the pocket to avoid DE Cameron Wake, scrambled to his right to elude DE Olivier Vernon and LB Koa Misi, and then threw across his body to find Cobb in the end zone...On the game-winning TD drive, found Nelson for an 18-yard gain down the right sideline to convert a fourth-and-10... After finding Cobb four plays later for a 4-yard gain to the Miami 16, raced up to the line to down the ball and stop the clock, but instead faked a spike with 12 seconds left before throwing to WR Davante Adams on the right sideline for a 12-yard pickup to the Miami 4...On the next play, went to Quarless, who was split out wide to the right and matched up with LB Philip Wheeler, on a back-shoulder throw in the end zone for the winning score...Added 34 rushing yards on the afternoon on seven attempts (4.9 avg.), his best rushing-yardage total since a 57-yard day at Indianapolis on Oct. 7, 2012.

►vs. Carolina Panthers (10/19): Threw for 255 yards and three TDs on 19-of-22 passing for a 154.5 passer rating, the second-highest rating of his career (min. 20 attempts) and the third best in team annals...His

89 Richard Rodgers, TE, Rookie, California

- Played tight end for his first two seasons at California before moving to inside receiver as a junior in 2013, where he caught a career-high 39 passes for a career-best 608 yards (15.6 avg.) and a TD.
- Led the Golden Bears with 11 receptions of 20-plus yards in 2013.
- Appeared in 35 games with 11 starts during his three seasons at Cal and finished with 59 receptions for 896 yards (15.2 avg.) and two TDs.

2014 Season: Has played in all seven games with four starts and has three catches for 53 yards (17.7 avg.).

▶at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Became the first Green Bay rookie TE to start a season opener since Jackie Harris opened in a two-tight-end set in 1990...Left the game due to a neck injury sustained in the second quarter, but did return to action...Saw 20 snaps on offense.

▶vs. N.Y. Jets (9/14): Started, appearing on 34 plays, and helped protect QB Aaron Rodgers as he threw for 346 yards and three TDs with no INTs

- 2014 Season: Has started all seven games at LG.
