

#### PACKERS PLAY THE FALCONS IN PRIMETIME

Green Bay will host Atlanta in front of a national audience on Monday Night Football.

- ►This is the 22nd consecutive season (1993-2014) that Green Bay is appearing on Monday Night Football, the second-longest streak in the league behind only Denver's 23-year span (1992-2014). It is the Packers' lone MNF appearance this season.
- ►The Packers are 13-8-1 at home on MNF, including 3-1 under Head Coach Mike McCarthy.
- Green Bay QB Aaron Rodgers has a 3-1 record as the starter at home on MNF, completing 68 of 94 passes for 718 yards, eight touchdowns, two interceptions and a passer rating of 113.7.
- Green Bay and Atlanta will meet on MNF for only the second time, with the first coming at Atlanta on Nov. 22, 1971, a 28-21 Falcons victory.
- ▶The Packers have won 16 consecutive home games during the regular season with Rodgers as the starting quarterback (min. 10 pass att.).
- ►Green Bay is 15-3 at home in the month of December under McCarthy, including 10-1 with Rodgers as the starting quarterback.
- Green Bay has won each of the last three games against the Falcons in the regular and postseason.
- Atlanta's last win in Green Bay came on Oct. 5, 2008, by three points.
- ▶ Dating back to 2001, this will be the 10th meeting between the two teams, including the postseason. It has been an evenly matched series over that time, with Green Bay winning five of the contests and five of the games being decided by three points or less, including last year's contest that the Packers won 22-21.
- ▶This will be the second consecutive season that the Packers and Falcons will meet in Week 14, on Dec. 8th.
- ►Green Bay is tied for the NFC and NFL lead with nine wins this season (Arizona, Denver, New England, Philadelphia).
- ► Entering Week 14, the Packers lead the NFC North by one game over the Detroit Lions (8-4) while the Falcons are tied for the NFC South lead with the New Orleans Saints (5-7).
- ▶ The Packers are currently on a four-game winning streak. Green Bay has posted at least one winning streak of four or more games each of the past six seasons (2009-14), the only NFL team to accomplish that feat over that span.
- The Packers have registered winning streaks of four games twice this season. It marks the ninth time in franchise history that Green Bay has registered two separate winning streaks of four or more games in the same regular season (2012, 2007, 2002, 1997, 1996, 1966, 1961, 1939).
- ►In Week 15, Green Bay travels to Buffalo to take on the Bills. The Packers are 3-0 against AFC teams this season.

#### WITH THE CALL

Date

ESPN is in its ninth season as host of the most successful series in sports television history, Monday Night Football. Play-by-play man Mike Tirico is joined by analyst Jon Gruden for the 45th season of MNF broadcasts, with Lisa Salters reporting from the sidelines.



- ► The contest also will air as a simulcast locally on WBAY (ABC, Ch. 2) in Green Bay and WISN (ABC, Ch. 12) in Milwaukee.
- ► Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since November 1929, heads up the Packers Radio Network that is made up of 50 stations in five states. Wayne Larrivee (play-by-play) and twotime Packers Pro Bowler Larry McCarren (analyst) call the action. McCarren first joined the team's broadcasts in 1995 and enters his 20th season calling Packers' games. McCarren, who is in his 26th year in Green Bay television, has four times been voted Wisconsin Sportscaster of the Year by the National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association. After originally being paired together in 1999, McCarren and Larrivee enter their 16th season of broadcasts together.
- ► Westwood One Sports will air the game across the country. Kevin Harlan (play-by-play) and Dan Fouts (analyst) will call the action with Hub Arkush reporting from the sidelines. Jim Gray will host the pre-game and halftime shows.
- ► The broadcast is also available on Sirius Satellite Radio (WTMJ feed).

#### **HOME SWEET HOME**

Green Bay has excelled at Lambeau Field this season, starting 6-0 at home for the second time in the last 12 seasons (2011) and the fifth time since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger (1996-97, 2002).

- ► The Packers are one of five teams undefeated at home this season (Arizona, Denver, Philadelphia, New England).
- ► Under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**, Green Bay is 52-17-1 at home during the regular season. The Packers' .750 winning percentage ranks **No. 3 in the NFL** over that span:

- ▶ In the last five home games, the Packers have outscored opponents 79-0 in the first quarter and 151-23 in the first half.
- ► Green Bay leads the NFL with 245 points scored at home this season. Dating back to 1940, 245 points at home is the fourth most by the Packers during the regular season:

- ▶ Green Bay scored more than 30 points in each of the first five home games (31, 42, 38, 55, 53). Dating back to 1921, it was the first time the Packers registered at least 30 points in each of their first five home games.
- ►Under McCarthy, Green Bay has scored 30-plus points at home 33 times, winning 31 of those contests. The Packers' 33 home games with at least 30 points are the third most in the league since 2006 (NO, 35 / NE. 37).
- ► The Packers have a plus-nine turnover ratio at home this season to lead the NFL:



►According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Rodgers already has the most games (min. 15 pass att.) with zero interceptions as well as the most games with 100+ passer rating for a player in their first 100 starts:

#### **BREAKING DOWN THE ROSTER**

The Packers' active roster is composed of 24 offensive players, 26 defensive players and three specialists.

- ► Of the 53 players on Green Bay's roster, 32 of them (60.4 percent) were draft picks of the Packers.
- ▶ Green Bay has 19 players on the roster that began their careers as non-drafted free agents, with nine of those originally signed by Green Bay.
- ► Almost 50 percent of the players (26 of 53, 49.1%) on Green Bay's roster entered the league as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as a non-drafted player.
- ► The Packers have 12 players on the roster that played in the NFL prior to the 2009 season, and six of those players began their pro careers as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as a non-drafted player (QB Matt Flynn, K Mason Crosby, CB Tramon Williams, CB Jarrett Bush, FB John Kuhn, LS Brett Goode).
- ▶ Of the 53 players on the roster, 42 began their pro careers with the Packers (79.2 percent).
- ▶ Only 16 of the 53 players on the roster (30.2 percent) were selected in the first three rounds of the draft, with 15 being drafted by the Packers.
- ▶ Of the 53 players on the roster, 43 of them (81.1 percent) are 28 years old or younger (as of Dec. 8) and 19 players (35.8 percent) are 24 years old or younger.

#### QUICK OUT OF THE GATE

Green Bay has performed well in the first half this season and that has been fueled by quick starts.

- ► The Packers have scored on their opening drive in seven of the last nine games (five TDs, two FGs). The Packers are tied for No. 1 in the NFL with 41 points on the first offensive possession (San Francisco, 41).
- ► Green Bay has scored 82 unanswered points at home in the first quarter, dating back to the Week 2 game vs. NYJ. It is the most unanswered first-quarter points at home since San Diego in 2006-07.
- ► Green Bay has produced an NFL-leading 127 points in the first quarter this season:

- ► Rodgers has thrown 22 touchdowns and zero interceptions in the first half this season.
- ► Rodgers has thrown for 275-plus yards in the first half four times this season, the most by an NFL quarterback over the past 25 seasons (1990-2014), with no other QB posting more than two in a season.
- ► With 30 points in the first half of the Week 11 victory over Philadephia, Green Bay became the first team in NFL history to score 28-plus points in the first half of four consecutive home games.
- ► In a 55-14, Week 10 victory over the Chicago Bears, the Packers put up a memorable performance in the first half:
  - Green Bay's 42 points scored were the third most in a first half in franchise history and the most since a 49-point performance vs. Tampa Bay on Oct. 2, 1983.
  - The Packers' 42-point lead tied for the second-biggest halftime lead in league history (also Green Bay vs. Tampa Bay on Oct. 2, 1983, 49-7). The NFL record is 45 points by New England vs. Tennessee (45-0) on Oct. 18, 2009.



#### STAT OF THE WEEK

- ▶ Last week against New England, five different players registered a reception of 25 yards or more. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last time Green Bay had five different players register a reception of 25-plus yards was on December 4, 1983, vs. Chicago.
- ►In all, eight different players recorded at least one reception against the Patriots. The Packers are 7-0 this season when seven or more players register a reception.
- ►Green Bay has completed one or more passes to a running back, tight end and wide receiver in every game this season.
- ▶ Rookie WR **Davante Adams** led the Packers with 121 yards receiving on six receptions (20.2 avg.) against the Patriots. It was the first time this season a player besides **Jordy Nelson** or **Randall Cobb** led the Packers in receiving yards.
- ►Adams' 121 receiving yards were the most by a Packers rookie since WR Sterling Sharpe registered 124 on Nov. 20, 1988, vs. Detroit.

#### WHAT TO LOOK FOR

- ► Green Bay head coach Mike McCarthy needs one win to tie Hall of Fame coach Vince Lombardi (98) for the second-most overall wins (regular and postseason) in franchise history.
- ► A win would make McCarthy 92-48-1 during the regular season as the Packers' head coach.
- ▶The Packers have recorded three home games with 40-plus points. Dating back to 1940, it is tied for the second-most 40-plus point games at home by Green Bay, trailing only the five 40-point games the Packers recorded in 2011.
- ► Green Bay has recorded at least four scoring drives in the first half in five of the last six games. Last week the Packers scored on all five first half drives (two TDs, three FGs).
- ► The Packers have outscored their opponents 151-23 in the first half of the last five home games, including 79-0 in the first quarter:

- ►The Packers have recorded at least one sack in 32 consecutive games, the longest streak in franchise history (28-1995-97 / 26-1986-88) and the longest active streak in the NFL.
- ▶The Packers' defense is looking to hold the opposing starting quarter-back to a passer rating below 85.0 for the 10th game this season (MIN-Teddy Bridgewater, 79.8 / PHI-Mark Sanchez, 80.3 / CHI-Jay Cutler, 68.8 / CAR-Cam Newton, 72.6 / MIA-Ryan Tannehill, 81.5 / MIN-Christian Ponder, 45.8 / CHI-Jay Cutler, 82.5 / DET-Matthew Stafford, 61.6 / NYJ-Geno Smith, 64.1).

#### **OFFENSE**

- ▶QB Aaron Rodgers needs one more three-touchdown/zero-interception game to tie Patriots QB Tom Brady (eight in 2007) for the most in NFL history in a single season.
- ▶ Rodgers looks to extend his NFL records of throwing 360 passes at home without an interception and 31 consecutive touchdown passes at home without an interception.
- ► Rodgers has thrown for three or more touchdowns in six of the last nine games.
- ► Rodgers has recorded a passer rating of at least 120.0 in five games this season.
- ▶Rodgers has registered a passer rating of 100.0-plus in each of the last four games. He is one away from the second-longest streak of consecutive games with a passer rating over 100.0 in his career in a single regular season (12 in 2011 / five in 2009).
- ▶WR Jordy Nelson has recorded at least nine receptions in four games this season. If Nelson registers one more game with at least nine receptions, it will be the most in a single season in franchise history.
- ► Nelson has three touchdown receptions of 65 yards or more this season, the most by a Packer since WR Antonio Freeman had four touchdown catches of 65-plus yards in 1998.
- ► Nelson has six touchdown receptions of 40-plus yards this season, tied

- for the second most in a season in team history behind Billy Howton's seven 40-yard touchdown receptions in 1952.
- ▶ Nelson has a touchdown reception in all six home games this season.
- ►WR Randall Cobb has recorded at least one reception in 36 consecutive regular-season games.
- ► Cobb has caught at least one touchdown in eight of 12 games this season. He has 12 receiving touchdowns in his last 13 regular-season games, dating back to last season.
- ► Cobb is two touchdown receptions shy of becoming the 18th player in franchise history to reach 25 receiving touchdowns.
- ► Cobb is looking for his fifth game this season with at least 100 yards receiving, which would extend his career high (three-2012).
- ▶ Over the last five games, RB **Eddie Lacy** has 18 receptions for 266 yards (14.8 avg.) and three touchdowns. Although he has only played in five games in the last six weeks due to the bye, Lacy's 266 receiving yards rank second among all running backs from Weeks 8-13 (PIT Le'Veon Bell, 304 yards).
- ▶ Lacy has gone over 100 yards from scrimmage six times this season, including in each of the last five games. Green Bay is 5-1 when Lacy has 100 yards or more from scrimmage.
- ► Lacy has scored at least one touchdown in six of the last nine games. **DEFENSE**
- ► LB Clay Matthews has one sack in three of the last five games.
- ► Matthews (54.5) passed DE Aaron Kampman (54.0) for No. 4 on the team's career sacks list. He needs one sack to pass LB Tim Harris (55.0) for No. 3 in franchise history (since 1982).

#### SPECIAL TEAMS

- ►K Mason Crosby eclipsed 1,000 points last week (1,005) to become the second kicker in franchise history to reach the 1,000 career points (Ryan Longwell, 1,054).
- ► Crosby is 19 points shy of passing NE K Stephen Gostkowski (1,023) for the most points by an NFL player in his first eight seasons.
- ►Hyde returned a punt 75 yards for a touchdown in Week 11, the second of his career. He is tied for No. 3 in franchise history behind only WR Desmond Howard and CB Will Blackmon (three each).
- ► Cobb needs either a punt return for a touchdown or a kickoff return for a touchdown to take sole possession of second place in Packers history for combined returns for touchdowns (Travis Williams, six). Cobb, who has three returns for touchdowns, currently is tied with six other players.

MIKE McCARTHY...Is in his ninth year as the Packers' 14th head coach.

- ► Joined Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl title with a win over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.
- ▶ Led the Packers to their fifth consecutive playoff appearance last season, joining New England as the only two NFL teams to do so over that span. Has also led the team to six playoff appearances in the last seven years (2007, 2009-13).
- ► Has guided the Packers to top-10 finishes in scoring each of the past seven seasons (2007-13), joining the Patriots as the only other team to accomplish the feat.
- ► His .654 winning percentage during the regular season (91-48-1) ranks No. 3 among active NFL coaches (min. 50 games).
- Was named Packers head coach on Jan. 12, 2006, his first head-coaching job after 13 years as an NFL assistant.

MIKE SMITH...Is in his seventh year as the Falcons' 14th head coach.

- ► Guided the Falcons to a franchise-record five consecutive winning seasons (2008-12), including three seasons with 11-plus victories.
- ► Led Atlanta to the top seed in the NFC in both 2010 and 2012 with 13-3 records in both of those seasons.
- ►In 2008, guided the Falcons to an 11-5 mark, marking a seven-win turnaround from the previous season. Was named the NFL Coach of the Year by The Associated Press and Sporting News.
- ➤ Served as the defensive coordinator for the Jacksonville Jaguars from 2003-07. Also coached on Baltimore's staff from 1999-2002, which included the Ravens' 2000 Super Bowl season.

#### THE PACKERS-FALCONS SERIES

- ► For a series that began with the Packers cruising to a 56-3 victory over the then-expansion Falcons in their first meeting in 1966, it has evolved into a closely contested rivalry. Including postseason, the Packers lead the all-time series, 16-13.
- ➤ Since the 1990s, Atlanta-Green Bay clashes have proven memorable. In 1994, the Packers defeated the Falcons in the final NFL game in Milwaukee (Dec. 18). QB Brett Favre's lunging, 9-yard TD scramble on the game's final play sealed the 21-17 victory.
- ► A year later, the Packers and Falcons crossed paths in the postseason for the first time on Dec. 31, 1995, at Lambeau Field. With RB Edgar Bennett rushing for 108 yards, the NFC Central champion Packers pulled out a 37-20 win with the aid of a 76-yard punt return for a TD by rookie WR Antonio Freeman.
- ►In the 2010 season, Green Bay topped Atlanta, 48-21, in an NFC Divisional contest at the Georgia Dome as part of its run to a Super Bowl XLV title. The 48 points were a franchise playoff record for the Packers, and it was only the second time that a No. 6 seed topped a No. 1 seed in the NFC since the league went to a 12-team playoff format in 1990.

#### HISTORIC START

So far this season, WRs Randall Cobb and Jordy Nelson have led the way for the Packers offense, putting up numbers of historical significance.

- ► Cobb and Nelson are the first duo in franchise history to both catch 10-plus touchdown passes in the same season.
- ▶ Dating back to 1960, Cobb and Nelson's 10 receiving touchdowns each are tied for the third most by a Packers receiver in the first 12 games of a season, one behind the 11 recorded by Greg Jennings (2010) and Sterling Sharpe (1994).
- ► Cobb set a career high with six consecutive games with a receiving touchdown (Games 4-9). It tied for the third-longest streak by a Packers' player, and the longest since Sterling Sharpe (six) in 1994.
- ▶ Nelson's 1,119 receiving yards this season are the most by a Packer through 12 games since WR Sterling Sharpe's 1,153 yards in 1992.
- ▶ Nelson has three touchdown receptions of 65-plus yards this season, the most by a Packer since Freeman had four in 1998.
- ► Nelson has registered at least nine receptions in four games this season:
  - Week 1 nine receptions for 83 yards
  - Week 2 nine receptions for 209 yards and one touchdown
  - Week 4 10 receptions for 108 yards and two touchdowns
  - Week 6 nine receptions for 107 yards and one touchdown
- ► Green Bay is 3-1 this season when Nelson records at least nine recep-
- ▶In franchise history, Nelson's four games with nine-plus receptions are tied for the most a player has registered in an entire regular season:

- ▶ Nelson has five 100-yard receiving games this season while Cobb has four. Dating back to 1960, they both rank in the top 10 for the most 100yard games by a Packers player through the first 11 games of a season (Nelson, tied for third / Cobb tied for sixth).
- ▶ After setting a career high with 10 receptions in Soldier Field during the 2013 season, Nelson matched it at Chicago in Week 4 this season. He became the first player since Lions WR Calvin Johnson (Jan. 1, 2012) and Dec. 9, 2012, at Lambeau Field) to post 10-plus catches in back-toback games at a visiting stadium.
- ▶ In the Week 2 win over the Jets, Nelson finished with a career-high 209 yards receiving, which tied for the fourth most in a game in franchise history, and were the most by a Packer since Don Beebe registered 220 yards receiving vs. San Francisco on Oct. 14, 1996.

#### **USING THE BACKS**

Over the course of the season, Green Bay has shown more commitment to getting the running backs involved.

- ► The Packers recorded over 25 carries and 100 yards seven times since Oct. 2 (Weeks 5-8, 10-13), averaging at least 4 yards a carry in Weeks 7 (4.1), 8 (4.7), 10 (4.1), 11 (4.4), 12 (4.8) and 13 (4.5).
- ▶ Dating back to the 2013 regular season, Green Bay is 10-1 in the last 11 games they ran the ball at least 25 times, including 7-0 this season. The Packers are 70-14-1 under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** when running the ball 25-plus times.
- ► Green Bay's run game had a breakout performance in the victory over the Vikings in Week 5, recording 156 yards on 28 carries (5.6 avg.) with two touchdowns. Their second-highest performance came against Minnesota in Week 12, totaling 155 yards on 32 carries (4.8 avg.).
- ► The Packers ran the ball a season-high 34 times for 121 yards (3.6 avg.) in a Week 6 win at Miami.
- ►In a Week 7 victory over Carolina, RBs Eddie Lacy and James Starks each averaged over 5 yards a carry and both recorded a rushing touchdown.
- ►In Week 8 at New Orleans, Green Bay ran the ball for 89 yards on 19 attempts. The 4.7 average was the third highest in a single game this season for Green Bay.
- ►Green Bay has utilized the running-back position in the pass game as well:
  - Lacy recorded 123 yards on eight receptions at New Orleans, the second most by a Green Bay running back since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, trailing only Eddie Lee Ivery's 128 yards at Tampa Bay on Oct. 12, 1980.
  - He became the first Green Bay running back to post a 100-yard receiving game since Edgar Bennett (101 yards) on Dec. 18, 1994 (vs. Atlanta)
  - Lacy registered a 67-yard reception against the Saints and a 56-yard touchdown reception versus Chicago to become the first Packers' running back to record 55-yard receptions in consecutive games.
  - Lacy registered 32-yard touchdown reception in a Week 11 victory over Philadelphia.
  - Lacy was the first Packers back to ever to record 100 yards from scrimmage and a touchdown reception in three consecutive games (Weeks 10-12).
  - Lacy's three touchdown receptions are the most for a Packers' running back in a single season since Ahman Green had five in 2003.
- ► Lacy's 182 yards from scrimmage in Week 8 at New Orleans were the most by a Green Bay running back since Najeh Davenport posted 186 vs. St. Louis on Nov. 29, 2004.
- ▶In Week 5, Lacy rushed for 105 yards on 13 carries (8.1 avg.) and recorded his second career game with two rushing touchdowns (vs. Pittsburgh, Week 16 in 2013). It was his lowest attempt total in a 100-yard rushing game and his best per-carry average in a game (min. 10 att.).
- ► Lacy recorded his sixth 100-yard rushing game of his career in at Minnesota in Week 12, churning out 125 yards on 25 carries with one rushing touchdown and one receiving touchdown. Lacy's six 100-yard rushing games since the start of 2013 are **seventh in the NFL**.

- ▶Peppers and Houston Texans DE J.J. Watt are the only players in the NFL this season to have at least one sack (five), a forced fumble (two), a fumble recovery (three), an interception (two) and a defensive touchdown (two).
- ▶ For the fifth time in his career, Peppers has recorded a sack, an interception, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery in a season (2004 / 2007 / 2009 / 2013 / 2014). #### **307 AND COUNTING**

Another packed house at Lambeau Field against the Patriots in Week 13 this season brought the stadium's consecutive-sellouts streak to 307 regular-season games (not including replacement games).

- ▶The league's longest-tenured stadium, Lambeau Field is hosting its 58th season of football in 2014. A total of 701,102 fans made their way through the turnstiles for the nine games (including playoffs) in 2013.
- ► Across American professional sports, only Boston's Fenway Park (1912) and Chicago's Wrigley Field (1914) have longer tenures.

#### THE LAMBEAU ADVANTAGE

The crown jewel of the National Football League, Lambeau Field has long been known as one of the tougher venues to play in, particularly during the harsh Wisconsin winter.

- ▶Re-establishing home-field advantage after a 4-4 mark in 2008 was one of the goals of 2009, and with the Packers finishing 6-2 at home, they accomplished that goal. Green Bay followed that up with a 7-1 mark at Lambeau Field in 2010, a perfect 8-0 record in 2011, the first undefeated home mark since 2002, and a 7-1 mark in 2012.
- ► Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** stated consistently upon his arrival in Green Bay that one of the team's goals would be to reclaim the mystique of playing at Lambeau Field. Mission accomplished. The team is 51-17-1 (.746) at home in the regular-season since 2006.
- ► Since Ron Wolf and Mike Holmgren began the revitalization of the franchise in 1992, Green Bay owns the best home record in the NFL. A look at the top regular-season home W-L records since the '92 season:

#### A LOOK AT THE SCHEDULE

The Green Bay Packers' 94th NFL regular-season schedule is headlined by five prime-time games (subject to flexible scheduling).

- ► Green Bay's schedule includes five games against 2013 playoff teams, with three of those contests (Carolina, Philadelphia, New England) at Lambeau Field and two on the road (Seattle, New Orleans).
- ► The Packers have three prime-time contests at home (vs. Minnesota on Thursday night in Week 5, vs. Chicago on Sunday night in Week 10 and vs. Atlanta on *Monday Night Football* in Week 14) and two on the road (Thursday night at Seattle in Week 1 and Sunday night at New Orleans in Week 8).
- ▶ The Packers' bye arrives in Week 9 for the first time since 2004.
- ▶ It is the second time in franchise history (1922) that Green Bay opens with three of their first four games on the road.
- ► Two of Green Bay's first five games are played on Thursday night, with the next seven taking place on Sunday, one on the following Monday, and three more on Sunday to close out the regular season.
- ▶ For the second year in a row and just the third time in nine seasons under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** (2010), the Packers opened the season on the road. For the third straight season Green Bay opened against an NFC West team after facing San Francisco each of the last two years.
- ▶ Dating back to 2001, the Packers have always played against an NFC team in Week 1. The last AFC team Green Bay faced in Week 1 was the New York Jets, who visited the Packers in Week 2 for the home opener.
- ► Following the home opener, the Packers went on the road to face two division opponents, Detroit and Chicago, before returning home to face Minnesota in a Thursday night divisional matchup. It was the sixth time in the last seven seasons they have faced off in primetime.
- ► The Packers traveled to Miami for the third time in 23 years and first time since 2006. The following week Green Bay hosted Carolina for teh first time since 2008.
- ► Before the bye week, the Packers traveled to New Orleans for a primetime matchup against the Saints.
- ► Following the bye week, the Packers returned to Sunday night to host the Bears, recording a win for the fifth time in the last six games at home.
- ▶ Philadelphia came to Lambeau for the second straight season. It was only the second time in the series that the two clubs have played at Green Bay in back-to-back seasons (1933-34).
- ► For the second consecutive season, Green Bay played Minnesota in Week 12, traveling to face the Vikings in the first outdoor game (TCF Bank Stadium) between the two in Minnesota since they played at Metropolitan Stadium on Nov. 29, 1981.
- ► The last game in November brought New England to Lambeau Field for the first time since 2006 and only its third visit ever to the stadium (1979).
- ▶ December opens with a Monday night matchup at home versus Atlanta. It marks the 22nd straight season the Packers have appeared on *Monday Night Football*.
- ► The next two weeks include road games at Buffalo and Tampa Bay. It will be the Packers' first visit to Buffalo since 2006 and first trip to Tampa Bay in the month of December since 1999.
- ► Green Bay closes the regular season at Lambeau Field against Detroit for the fourth time under McCarthy (2007, 2008, 2011).

#### STREAKS & MILESTONES - REGULAR SEASON

#### **18 RANDALL COBB**

- ► Joined by WR **Jordy Nelson** as the first duo in franchise history to both catch 10-plus touchdown passes in the same season.
- ▶ Dating back to 1960, his 10 receiving touchdowns are **tied for the third most by a Packers receiver** in the first 12 games of a season. One behind the 11 recorded by Greg Jennings (2010) and Sterling Sharpe (1994).
- ▶ Registered a touchdown reception in a career best six consecutive games (Games 4-9). It was the longest by a Packer since WR Sterling Sharpe (six) in 1994.
- ▶ In Week 4 at Chicago, joined Nelson as the first Packers teammates to each have at least 100 receiving yards and two touchdowns in the same game since December 21, 1969 (Carroll Dale and Boyd Dowler).
- ► Set a single-season franchise record with a league-high 2,342 combined net yards in 2012, topping the previous team mark of 2,250 yards by RB Ahman Green in 2003.
- ► With 954 receiving yards and 964 kickoff return yards in 2012, became the first person in NFL history to post 900-plus yards in each category in the same season.
- ► Has three kick return scores (two punts, one kickoff) in his career, which ties him for No. 2 in franchise history behind only RB Travis Williams' six return TDs (one punt, five kickoffs).

#### **2 MASON CROSBY**

- ► Became the second player in franchise history with 1,000 career points (Ryan Longwell, 1,054).
- ► Made six consecutive field goals from 50-plus yards earlier this season, a franchise record.
- ► Tied for No. 1 in team history for the most 100-point seasons with eight (Longwell).
- ► His 903 points from 2007-13 rank No. 1 in NFL history for the most points scored by a player in his first seven seasons, topping the mark of Indianapolis K Mike Vanderjagt (874, 1998-2004).
- ► Made 23 straight field goals from Week 13 of 2010 through Week 10 of 2011, the longest regular-season streak in franchise history.
- ► In 2011, set a franchise record with a 58-yard field goal in Week 7 at Minnesota, eclipsing the mark of 56 yards he held (Week 1 at Philadelphia, 2010; Week 5 at Atlanta, 2011).

#### **50 A.J. HAWK**

- ► Is tied for No. 1 in franchise history for the most seasons leading the team in tackles with five (2006, 2008, 2010, 2012-13), matching the mark of five by LB Nick Barnett (2003-05, 2007, 2009).
- ► Has either led the team or finished second in tackles in six of his seven seasons in Green Bay. Has posted 100-plus tackles in six of seven seasons.
- ► Has 1,104 career tackles, which ranks No. 1 in team history (since defensive stats began to be recorded by coaches in 1975). Moved past John Anderson (1,020, 1978-89) for the franchise record with eight tackles at Chicago in Week 17 last season.

#### **27 EDDIE LACY**

- ► Was the first Packers back to ever to record 100 yards from scrimmage and a touchdown reception in three consecutive games (Weeks 10-12).
- ▶ Became first Green Bay running back to register receptions of 55 yards or more in consecutive games (2014: at NO and vs. CHI).

- ► His 123 receiving yards at New Orleans in Week 8 this season, were the second most by a Green Bay running back since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, trailing only Eddie Lee Ivery's 128 yards at Tampa Bay on Oct. 12, 1980.
- ► Set franchise rookie records in 2013 for rushing yards (1,178), rushing TDs (11) and rushing attempts (284).
- ►Tied the team rookie mark for 100-yard rushing games with four last season.
- Named NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year by The Associated Press and was selected to the Pro Bowl as an injury replacement for Vikings RB Adrian Peterson.
- ▶ Recorded 20-plus carries 10 times during the 2013 regular season, all coming in the the last 13 games. The Packers were 7-2-1 in those games. Dating back to 1960, he tied Dorsey Levens (1997) for the second-most games of 20-plus carries by a Packers' player in one regular season (Ahman Green, 12 in 2003).

#### **8 TIM MASTHAY**

- ► Ranks No. 1 in franchise history (min. 150 punts) with a 44.5-yard gross punting average.
- ► Ranks No. 1 in team annals (since 1976) with 112 punts placed inside the 20-yard line in his career, passing Craig Hentrich (104) in the franchise record book.
- Set a single-season franchise record with his 45.6-yard gross average in 2011, surpassing Craig Hentrich's 45.0-yard mark in 1997.
- ► Tied Sean Landeta's single-season franchise record (1998) by placing 30 punts inside the 20-yard line in 2012.
- ► Holds the top four single-season marks for net punting average in franchise history (since 1976) with a 38.95 average in 2013, a 38.93 average in 2012, a 38.56 average in 2011 and a 37.65 average in 2010.

#### **52 CLAY MATTHEWS**

- ▶ Ranks No. 4 in team history with 54.5 career sacks.
- ► Ranks No. 8 in the NFL with 54.5 sacks since entering the league in 2009
- ▶Only player in franchise history to be named to the Pro Bowl each of his first four seasons in the league (2009-12).
- ▶Only player in team history to score a defensive TD in each of his first three seasons in the league (2009-11).
- ►His 17 sacks in his first 20 games were the most by an NFL player to start his career at the time, eclipsing the mark of 16.5 set by Leslie O'Neal (1986, 1988) and John Abraham (2000-01).
- ▶Is the first NFL player since sacks became an official stat in 1982 to post a double-digit sack total and a defensive TD in each of his first two seasons in the league.
- ► First player in franchise annals to post 10-plus sacks in each of his first two years in the NFL.
- ►His 29.5 sacks from 2009-11 were tied for No. 1 in team history with Tony Bennett for the most sacks by a Packer in his first three seasons in the league.
- ► Set a franchise rookie record with 10 sacks in 2009.



Two years after he co-founded the Packers with Curly Lambeau, George Calhoun began writing a piece called The Dope Sheet, which served as the official press release and game program from 1921-24.

#### **87 JORDY NELSON**

- ► Joined by WR **Randall Cobb** as the first duo in franchise history to both catch 10-plus touchdown passes in the same season.
- ► His 1,119 receiving yards this season are the most by a Packer through 12 games since WR Sterling Sharpe's 1,153 yards in 1992.
- ▶ Nelson has three touchdown receptions of 65-plus yards this season, the most by a Packer since Freeman had four in 1998.
- ► His 22 TD grabs from 2011-12 were the most by a Packer over a twoyear span since WR Antonio Freeman posted 26 TDs from 1997-98.
- ► Caught 15 TD passes in 2011, joining WRs Sterling Sharpe (18 in 1994) and Don Hutson (17 in 1942) as the only players in franchise annals to catch 15-plus TD passes in a season.
- ► With four TD grabs of 80-plus yards during his career, Nelson is tied for the most in team history and No. 1 among active NFL players (Vikings WR Greg Jennings).
- ► Is the 11th player in franchise history to surpass 5,000 career receiving yards.

#### **56 JULIUS PEPPERS**

- ► Is the first player in NFL history with 100 career sacks and four interception returns for touchdowns.
- ▶ Became the first linebacker in Packers' history to post two interception returns for touchdowns in the same season.
- ▶Only player in NFL history with at least 10 interceptions and 100 sacks.
- ► Has been selected to eight Pro Bowls since entering the league in 2002, which ties him with Troy Polamalu and Ray Lewis for the third most among defensive players over that span (Ed Reed, nine/Champ Bailey, 12).
- ► With eight double-digit sack seasons as a pro, is tied with Jared Allen for the most in the NFL since 2002.
- ► Named first-team All-Pro by *The Associated Press* three times and was selected to the NFL's All-Decade team for the 2000s.

#### **12 AARON RODGERS**

- ▶ Ranks No. 1 in NFL history with a 106.5 career passer rating.
- ▶Threw six touchdown passes in the first half against the Bears in Week 10 this season, tying Raiders QB Daryle Lamonica (vs. Buffalo, Oct. 19, 1969) for the NFL record for most touchdown passes in a half. It was the second time Rodgers threw for a franchise-best six touchdowns in a game.
- ▶ Posted six consecutive zero-interception games this season (Weeks 2-7), tying Bart Starr's franchise record (min. 15 attempts a game) set in 1964
- ► Joined Patriots QB Tom Brady (2007) as the only players in NFL history to register four straight three-touchdown/zero-interception games in a single season (Weeks 4-7, 2014).
- ► When he hit the 200-TD mark for his career, he had thrown just 53 INTs to that point, the fewest in NFL history as he bested Tom Brady's mark of 88 INTs at the time of his 200th TD pass.
- ►This season he became the first NFL quarterback to throw for 18-plus touchdowns with one or fewer interceptions in the first seven games of a season.
- ► Ranks No. 2 in NFL history for the most touchdown passes in a player's first 100 games with 203 (MIA QB Dan Marino, 217).
- ► Set an NFL single-season record in 2011 with a 122.5 passer rating and set team marks for TD passes (45), passing yards (4,643), completion

- percentage (68.3), yards per attempt (9.25), TD/INT ratio (7.50) and 300-yard games (eight).
- ► Posted 21,332 passing yards from 2008-12, the most in NFL history by a quarterback in his first five seasons as a starter.
- ►Threw a TD pass in 35 straight regular-season games at Lambeau Field from 2008-12, a team record (previous mark was 25 by Brett Favre, 1992-96). It was the second-longest home streak in NFL history behind Dan Marino's 39-game streak from 1983-88.
- ► Tied a single-game franchise record with six TD passes at Houston in Week 6 of 2012, matching Matt Flynn's mark (Jan. 1, 2012, vs. Detroit).
- ►In 99 regular-season starts, has 38 career 300-yard games, 42 three-TD games and 57 zero-INT games (min. 15 attempts).
- ► Has posted a 100-plus passer rating 58 times. Set an NFL record for quarterbacks whose careers started since 1970 with 43 games with a 100-plus passer rating in his first 75 starts.
- ▶Posted a 100-plus passer rating in five straight seasons (2009-13), the only quarterback in league history to accomplish that feat.

#### **PACKERS STARTERS - OFFENSE**

#### WR Jordy Nelson, 7th Year, Kansas State, D2a-08

- ► Ranks seventh in the league in receiving yards (1,119), 10th in receptions (70) and is tied for third in receiving touchdowns (10) this season.
- ► Led the team in 2013 with a career-high 85 catches for a career-best 1,314 yards and eight TDs. Ranked No. 10 in the NFL last season in receiving yards.
- ► With 15 TD catches in 2011, became only the third player in franchise history to catch 15 or more TDs in a season, joining WRs Sterling Sharpe (18 in 1994) and Don Hutson (17 in 1942).
- ► Became the first player since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to post three 80-yard TD grabs over an eight-game span in the regular season (Week 16, 2010-Week 6, 2011).

#### LT David Bakhtiari, 2nd Year, Colorado, D4a-13

- ► Has started every game at LT since the start of the 2013 regular season.
- ➤ Started all 16 games at left tackle last season, the only rookie in the NFL to do so in 2013 and the first Packer rookie to do so since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.
- ▶ Became just the fourth Green Bay rookie to start at LT in the season opener since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger and the first since 1985.
- ► Earned second-team All-Pacific-12 honors from the conference's coaches each of his last two seasons (sophomore and junior) at Colorado.

#### LG Josh Sitton, 7th Year, Central Florida, D4b-08

- ► Has started 90 games since 2009, the most by an offensive player in a Green Bay uniform over that span.
- ► Was named to his first career Pro Bowl in 2012, becoming the first Green Bay guard to be selected since Marco Rivera in 2004.
- ► Was named 2010 Offensive Lineman of the Year by the NFL Alumni Association.
- According to STATS LLC, allowed only nine sacks in his first five seasons as a starter (2009-13).
- ► Was the only Packer on either side of the ball to not miss a snap from 2009-10.

#### C Corey Linsley, Rookie, Ohio State, D5a-14

- ► First rookie center to start for Green Bay in Week 1 since the merger.
- ► Was one of five team captains and was part of a line that helped the team set school records for points scored (637), yards per carry (6.8), touchdowns (87) and TD passes (38) in '13.
- ►The Ohio native was part of a Buckeye team that won 24 consecutive games from 2012-13.

#### RG T.J. Lang, 6th Year, Eastern Michigan, D4-09

- ► Has started games at four different positions on the line as a pro (28 at RG, 27 at LG, five at RT, two at LT). Played C in Week 10 last season.
- ► Has started 58 contests since 2011.
- ▶ Started games at both tackle spots in his first season (2009) and became the first Packers rookie to start consecutive games at left tackle since Chad Clifton in 2000.
- ► Began his college career as a defensive lineman, but converted to the offensive line as a sophomore and started 36 straight games (10 at RT, 26 at LT) over his final three years.

#### RT Bryan Bulaga, 5th Year, Iowa, D1-10

- ► Missed the second part of the 2012 season after suffering a hip injury vs. Arizona on Nov. 4 and missed all of the 2013 season after injuring his knee on Aug. 3. Has started all but one game this season.
- ► Started 37 games at RT in his first three seasons in the league.
- ► Started the final 12 games of 2010 and the entire postseason at right tackle after taking over for veteran Mark Tauscher (shoulder), the most regularseason starts by a Packers rookie tackle since Tauscher's 14 in 2000.
- ▶ Named to the *Pro Football Weekly*/PFWA All-Rookie team in 2010.
- ► Capped his rookie season by becoming the youngest player, according to STATS LLC, to ever start in the Super Bowl (21 years, 322 days).

#### TE Andrew Quarless, Fifth Year, Penn State, D5a-10

- ► With Green Bay trailing by four, hauled in the game-winning touchdown with three seconds left at Miami in Week 6.
- ► Has started each of the last nine games and has set a single-season career high with three touchdown receptions this season.
- ▶ Recorded at least one reception in 11 of 12 games this season.
- ► In 2013, moved into the starting role in Week 8 following TE Jermichael Finley's season-ending neck injury.
- ► Set career highs in receptions (32), receiving yards (312), games started (10) and games played (16) in 2013.
- At the end of his career at Penn State, held school records for receptions by a tight end in a career (87) and single season (41 in 2009). Finished his career ranked second in school history for receiving yards by a tight end with 1,146.

#### WR Randall Cobb, 4th Year, Kentucky, D2-11

- ▶ Is tied for third in the NFL with 10 touchdown receptions this season.
- ▶ Before suffering a knee injury in Week 6 last season, led the team in receptions with 29 and was No. 2 in receiving yards with 378.
- ➤ Set a franchise single-season record with a league-high 2,342 combined net yards in 2012, topping the previous team mark of 2,250 yards by RB Ahman Green in 2003.
- ► With 954 receiving yards and 964 kickoff return yards in 2012, he became the first player in NFL history to post 900-plus yards in each category in the same season.
- ► Led the team in receptions (80) and receiving yards (954) in 2012 and finished second on the squad in TD catches (eight).

#### QB Aaron Rodgers, 10th Year, California, D1-05

- ► His career passer rating of 106.5 ranks No. 1 in NFL history.
- ► Ranks No. 1 in the NFL this season in passer rating (118.6), touchdown percentage (8.4), interception percentage (0.8), passing yards/attempt (8.75) and is No. 3 in touchdown passes (32).
- ▶ Posted 21,332 passing yards from 2008-12, which ranks No. 1 in league history for the most passing yards by a QB in his first five seasons as a starter (previous record was Peyton Manning, 20,618, 1998-2002).
- ► In 99 regular-season starts (67-32 record), has posted 38 games with 300-plus passing yards, 57 without an interception and 59 with a 100plus passer rating (min. 15 attempts).
- ▶ In 2011, set an NFL record with a 122.5 passer rating and set franchise marks for TD passes (45), passing yards (4,643), completion percentage (68.3), yards per attempt (9.25) and 300-yard games (eight) on his way to earning NFL Most Valuable Player honors from *The Associated Press*.

#### RB Eddie Lacy, 2nd Year, Alabama, D2-13

- ▶ Ranked No. 1 in the league among rookies and No. 8 among all players with 1,178 rushing yards last season, despite missing one full game and nearly all of another due to a concussion.
- ► Ranks No. 1 in franchise history for the most rushing yards by a rookie in a single season, No. 1 in attempts (284), and tied for No. 1 for most 100-yard rushing games with four (John Brockington, four in 1971).
- ▶ Became the first Green Bay rookie RB to be selected to the Pro Bowl since Brockington in 1971 and was named Rookie of the Year by PFWA.
- ► Finished third in the league with 11 TD runs, with 10 of those scores coming between Weeks 7-17, the most in the league over that span.

#### FB John Kuhn, 9th Year, Shippensburg, W-07 (Pit)

- ► Has played in 119 of 124 games (130 of 135 including playoffs) during his six-plus seasons in Green Bay, appearing in all 16 regular-season contests in four of those seasons.
- Selected to the Pro Bowl in 2011, becoming the first Green Bay fullback to be honored since William Henderson in 2004.
- Only player on the team to have a rushing and receiving touchdown each season from 2008-11, and was the first Packer to achieve that feat since RB Ahman Green (2001-04).
- ▶ Led the team with four rushing TDs in 2011 and led the running backs with six total TDs.

#### PACKERS STARTERS - DEFENSE

#### LDE Datone Jones, 2nd Year, UCLA, D1-13

- Overcame an ankle injury during the preseason to play in all 16 games in 2013.
- ▶ Rotated at defensive end and as one of the interior rushers in the team's sub-defenses, recording 3.5 sacks.
- ▶ Blocked an extra point at Cincinnati in Week 3 last year.
- ► Was the first UCLA defensive lineman selected in the first round since DT Manu Tuiasosopo in 1979 (No. 18 overall, Seattle).

#### NT Letroy Guion, 7th Year, Florida State, FA-14

- ► Signed with Green Bay this past offseason after spending his first six NFL seasons with the Minnesota Vikings after being selected in the fifth round of the 2008 NFL Draft.
- ► Started all 28 games he appeared in for Minnesota over the past two seasons, recording 72 tackles (32 solo) and three sacks over that span.
- ► Was the only Viking to block a field goal in both 2011 and 2012.

#### RDE Mike Daniels, 3rd Year, Iowa, D4a-12

- ► Ranks second on the team with 10.5 sacks since the start of the 2013 regular season (LB Clay Matthews-12).
- ▶ Played in all 16 games with one start last season and ranked No. 2 on the team with a career-high 6.5 sacks. Was tied for No. 6 in the NFL in sacks among defensive tackles.
- ► Returned a fumble 43 yards for a TD vs. Detroit in Week 14 of 2012, the longest fumble return for a TD by a rookie in franchise history.
- ► Starred as an interior pass rusher at lowa, posting a team-high 24.5 tackles for a loss and 13 sacks from 2010-11.

#### LOLB Clay Matthews, 6th Year, Southern California, D1b-09

- ► Ranks No. 8 in the NFL since entering the league in 2009 with 54.5 sacks. His sack total ranks No. 4 in team history (since 1982).
- ▶ Became the first Packer in team history to earn Pro Bowl recognition in each of his first four seasons in the NFL (2009-12).
- ▶ Is the only player in franchise history to score a defensive TD (interception or fumble return) in each of his first three seasons in the NFL (2009-11).
- ▶ Named first-team All-Pro by *The Associated Press* in 2010, the first Green Bay LB to earn that honor since Tim Harris in 1989. Finished second to Pittsburgh safety Troy Polamalu in the *AP's* Defensive Player of the Year voting.

#### BLB A.J. Hawk, 9th Year, Ohio State, D1-06

- ▶ Ranks No. 1 in franchise history (since 1975) with 1,107 tackles.
- ► His 81 tackles this season rank No. 2 on the team. Led the team with 153 tackles (112 solo) last season and was tied for No. 3 on the club with a career-high five sacks.
- ► Has either led the team or finished second in tackles in six of his seven seasons in Green Bay. Led the team with 142 tackles (105 solo) in 2012.
- ► Has appeared in 138 of a possible 140 regular-season games in his career, starting 134 of 138.
- ► Has posted 1,107 tackles (791 solo), 17.0 sacks, nine interceptions, 39 passes defensed, three forced fumbles and five fumble recoveries during his career.

#### MLB Sam Barrington, 2nd Year, South Florida, D7c-13

- ► Has provided depth at inside linebacker this season, starting three games and registering 31 tackles and one sack.
- ▶ Appeared in seven games as a rookie in 2013, seeing time exclusively on special teams.
- ► Sustained a season-ending hamstring injury vs. Chicago in Week 9 last year.
- Earned second-team All-Big East recognition as a senior in 2012 after posting a career-high 80 tackles (49 solo), including 6.5 tackles for loss, 3.5 sacks sacks, two forced fumbles and three passes defensed.

#### ROLB Julius Peppers, 13th Year, North Carolina, FA-14

- ► Signed with Green Bay during the offseason after playing the last four seasons for Chicago and the first eight of his career for Carolina after being selected as the No. 2 overall pick in 2002.
- ► First player in NFL history with 10 interceptions and at least 100 sacks.
- ► Has been selected to the Pro Bowl eight times (2004-06, 2008-12) and has been named first-team All-Pro by *The Associated Press* three times (2004, 2006, 2010). Was named to the NFL's All-Decade Team for the 2000s.
- ► Has played in 108 consecutive regular-season games.
- ► Ranks No. 3 in the league in sacks (123.5) and tied for No. 3 in forced fumbles (41) since entering the NFL in 2002. His sack total ranks No. 16 in NFL history (since 1982).
- ► Has blocked 13 kicks (12 field goals, one extra point) during his career.

#### LCB Tramon Williams, 8th Year, Louisiana Tech, FA-06

- ► Ranks No. 2 in the league in interceptions (21) and ranks No. 4 in the NFL in INT return yards (325) since 2010 (including playoffs).
- ► Started all 16 games last season and led the secondary with a career-high 91 tackles (68 solo) and a career-best 2.5 sacks. Added three interceptions, two fumble recoveries, two forced fumbles and 14 passes defensed.
- ▶ Despite suffering a shoulder injury in the 2011 season opener, went on to start 15 games that season and post career highs for tackles (65) and passes defensed (24). Also added four interceptions.
- ► With three interceptions during the 2010 playoffs, tied Joe Laws (1944) and Craig Newsome (1996) for the franchise single-postseason record.

#### RCB Sam Shields, 5th Year, Miami, FA-10

- ► Started all 14 games he appeared in last season and led the team with four INTs (tied career high) and a career-best 25 passes defensed.
- ► Was limited to 10 games with eight starts in 2012 due to injury, but registered 38 tackles (28 solo), three interceptions, 15 passes defensed (No. 3 on the team) and a sack.
- ► Made an impact in 2010 after making the team as a non-drafted rookie, earning the nickel CB job despite playing the position only one season in college.
- ► In Green Bay's NFC Championship win over Chicago in the 2010 season, became the first rookie in NFL history to record two INTs and a sack in a postseason contest.

#### SS Morgan Burnett, 5th Year, Georgia Tech, D3-10

- ▶ Leads the team with 90 tackles this season. Ranked No. 2 on the team with 106 tackles (77 solo) in 2013, despite missing the first three games due to injury. Recovered three fumbles, including one for a TD, and added nine passes defensed.
- ▶ Participated in all 1,088 plays for Green Bay's defense in 2012, one of only four non-offensive linemen in the NFL to appear in 100 percent of his team's snaps.
- ► Enjoyed his first full season as a pro in 2011, joining DT B.J. Raji as the only two Green Bay defensive players to start all 16 regular-season games.
- ► Started the first four games of the 2010 season at SS before sustaining a season-ending knee injury vs. Detroit in Week 4.

#### FS Micah Hyde, 2nd Year, Iowa, D5a-13

- ▶ Registered his first career interception this season (Week 10 vs. CHI). Followed up with the second of his career in Week 12 at Minnesota.
- ► Appeared in all 16 games last season, playing in the most defensive snaps (428) among the Packers' defensive rookies.
- ► Spent most of his rookie season as the dime or nickel cornerback, helping to fill in for CB Casey Hayward, who missed all but three games due to a hamstring injury.
- After returning a punt 75 yards for a touchdown in Week 11 this season, is tied for third in team history with two punt return touchdowns.





### Tie Game

SEATTLE - The Super Bowl champion Seattle Seahawks started 2014 the same way they finished last season, with a convincing win.

Marshawn Lynch rushed for 110 yards and a pair of touchdowns, Percy Harvin had 100 combined yards rushing and receiving, and the Seahawks stymed Aaron Rodgers' up-tempo offense in a 36-16 win over the Green Bay Packers to kick off the regular season.

The Seahawks unveiled the first Super Bowl banner in franchise history during a brief pregame ceremony and then began the process of trying to be the first team in a decade to repeat.

Their effort against the Packers - a popular pick to contend in the NFC - will only reinforce the belief Seattle is still the favorite.

Russell Wilson was outstanding in the first half, including a 33-yard touchdown pass to Ricardo Lockette. Harvin got touches as a receiver, running back and returner. He was used all over the field in different formations after never being fully healthy in his first season with Seattle.

Wilson finished 19 of 28 for 191 yards passing and Lynch was at his best. Pete Carroll said earlier this week that Lynch appeared in the best shape of his carrear, and it showed. Lynch averaged 5.5 yards per carry and topped 100 yards for the 20th time in the regular season since joining the Seahawks in 2010.

Lynch, who rail for 1,257 yards and 12 touchdowns last season, barreled through a trio of Packers for the TD with 3:41 left before halftime to give the Seahawks a 17-10 lead and added a second TD run on the first play of the fourth quarter.

Seattle had 207 yards ushing as a team and won for the 18th time in its last 20 regular-season home games. Harvin finished with 11 offensive touches, including four rushes for 41 yards.

Rodges finished 23 of 33 for 189 yards and was isolated to one side of the field. He looked almost exclusively for lordy Nelson matched up against Byron Maxwell and never threw in Richard Sherman's direction. Nelson finished with nine receptions, but Maxwell came up with a third-quarter interception on a past that deflected off Nelson's Nards.

The most action for Sherman came in the first half when he accidently blocked Davon House into Earl Thomas on a punt return causing a fumble recovered by the Packers.

But Seattles deflense did its part. They sacked Rodgers three times, taking advantage of a knee injury suffered by right tackle Bryan Bulaga in the second quarter. His replacement, Derek Sherrod, gave up a fourth-down sack to Oliff Avril to end one drive inside Seattle territory. Following a Seattle punt. Sherrod was beaten by Michael Bennett on Green Bay's next offensive snap. Rodgers was stripped and Sherrod tell on the fumble in the end zone for a safety and a 22-10 lead.

Nine plays later, Lynch walked in from the 3-yard line for a 29-10 Seahawks lead. Cobb had seven catches for 113 yards. Nelson had 10 receptions for 108 yards, and the Packers came away with the win despite allowing 496 yards.

The Bears basically matched Green Bay score for score before Cutler threw those interceptions. He wound up passing for 256 yards and two TDs but fell to 1-10 lifetime

against Green Bay, counting the postseason.

Matt Forte ran' for 122 yards on 23 carries. Martellus Bennett had nine catches for a career-high 134 yards, but Chicago came up short after back-to-back wins at San Francisco and the New York Jest.

Mason Crosby kicked a 63-yard field goal on the opening possession of the second half to extend the Packers' lead to 24-17, and things unraweled for the Bears after that. Chicago had the ball on the Green Bay 24 when Outler hit cornerback Tramon Williams in the cheet with a pass. The ball ricocheted to Clay Matthews, who returned it 45 yards. That led to an 11-yard scoring pass from Rodgers to Nelson, making it 31-17.

MIAMI GARDENS, Fla. -- Aaron Rodgers stood facemask to facemask with a teammate, screaming in jubilation at the end of a hot, harrowing

Rodgers had the last word Sunday, throwing a 4-yard touchdown pass to Andrew Quarless with three seconds left to help the Green Bay Packers rally past the Miami Dolphins 27-24.

Green Bay twice gave up leads and trailed 24-17 before Rodgers directed consecutive drives of 68 and 60 yards for the victory. He overcame a fumble and a fourth-and-10 on the Packers' final possession, and taked an intentional spike before throwing a completion that set up the touchdown. Rodgers finished with three touchdown passes and 264 yards while committing no turnovers. The Packers (4-2) earned their third consecutive victory, won in Miami for only the second time ever and remained tied with the Detroit Lions atop the NFC North.

The Dolphins (2-3) lost despite the return of six starters who had missed playing time. They overcame deficits of 10-3 and 17-10 to take a 24-17 lead with nine minutes left when Ryan Tannehill hit Mike Wallace for a 5-yard score.

At that point the Packers appeared to be wilting on a typical fall day in the subtropics -- sunny, humid and 85 degrees.

The Packers kicked a field goal with 4:09 to go, making it 24-20, then forced a punt to start at their 40 with 2:04 left.

Rodgers fumbled when sacked, and teammate T.J. Lang recovered. That set up a fourth-and-10, but Rodgers threw to Jordy Nelson for 18 yards, then hit James Starks on third-and-10 for 10 yards.

With the clock running following another completion, Rodgers taked a spike before throwing to Davante Adams, who gained 12 yards before going

out of bounds with six seconds remaining.

Following a Dolphins timeout, Quarless easily outmaneuvered linebacker Philip Wheeler for the winning catch. Wheeler wasn't thrilled with the defensive scheme, which left him alone on the flank. Playing in his 100th regular-season game, Rodgers also threw for scores of 9 yards to Nelson and 5 yards to Randall Cobb. He has 15 touchdowns

passes and only one interception this season.

With the Packers' secondary depleted, Tannehill threw for two scores and 143 yards in the second half, but he was unable to run out the clock with a 24-20 lead. The Dolphins tried forupasses and ran only three times on their final possession.

Green Bay made a goal-line stand in the first quarter, stopping Miami three consecutive times at the 1, including on fourth down when Morgan Burnett tackled Knowshon Moreno for a loss. Casey Hayward intercepted Tannehill to set up a field goal.

The Packers enjoyed a 14-and-a-half-minute advantage in time of possession, a big change from other games this season. Their run defense was

ranked as the NFL's worst, but Miami's running backs totaled only 63 yards on 20 carries

NEW ORLEANS - The Saints were deflated in Detroit one week. Sublime in the Superdome the next.

And just like that, Drew Brees and the suddenly resurgent New Orleans Saints have first place in the NFC South division within their immediate grasp.

Brees completed 27 of 22 passes for 311 yards and three touchdowns. New Orleans defense produced big plays in the clutch and the Saints ended the Green Bay Parkers' four-game winning streak. 44-23 on Sunday right.

Philadelphia (7-3) was held to 11 points below its NFC-leading scoring average by a Packers defense rejuvenated since Matthews started getting more time at inside lineback. Matthews finished with five backes and a sack after rushing from his traditional outside spot unabated to Sanchez.

Green Bay's others was in good thands spain with Rodgers, who hove from Bardy's NH, record of 288 straight passes at home without an interception. Rodgers finished 22 of 36.

The Eagles insuly reached the end zone after Sanchez hit receiver Jordan Matthews for a 10-yard touchdown pass to make it 39-13 with 2-21 left in the third quarter. The Packers lad no such problems.

Rodgers found Jordy Nelson streaking down the right sideline for a 64-yard completion on the game's third play from scrimmage - the pass attempt that allowed Rod to brack Brady's record.

He connected with Richard Rodgers and Jordy Nelson for long touchdowns for Green Bay 9-3.

Brady finished 22 of 35, connecting with Brandon LaFell for the two scores for New England (9-3), which had its seven-game winning streak snapped. The second touchdown came from 15 yards early in the fourth quarter to get within 23-21.

The deficit could have been wider for the Packers if not for some hickcips in the red zone.

Green Bay settled for four field goals from Mason Crosby of 35 yards or less, including a 28-yarder to make it a five-point lead with 8:41 left. That Total But he was celebrating at the end. Green Bay has won four in a row and eight of nine.

Rodgers ininsted 24 of 38, while Lacy had 98 yards on 2 carries, including 26 on the ground in the fourth-quarter drive that led to Crosby's field goal. Adams had a career-best 121 yards on receptions.

### 17 Davante Adams, WR, Rookie, Fresno State

- Led the nation in receptions (131) and receptions per game (10.1), while ranking second in the country in receiving yards (1,718) and receiving yards per game (132.2) as a sophomore in 2013.
- Caught 24 TD passes in '13, eight more than any player in the country and the most in school and Mountain West Conference history.
- Set Fresno State career records for receptions (233) and TD catches (38), despite playing just two seasons for the Bulldogs.
- **2014 Season:** Has played in all 12 games with seven starts (as the third WR), and has 34 catches for 417 yards (12.3 avg.) and three TDs.
- ▶at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Saw time on offense and special teams, appearing on nine offensive snaps and nine plays on special teams.
- ▶vs. N.Y. Jets (9/14): Appeared on 36 snaps on offense and posted five catches for 50 yards (10.0 avg.)...Late in the first half, caught a 24-yard pass down to the Jets' 6-yard line to convert a third-and-10, helping to set up a Randall Cobb 6-yard TD catch two plays later.
- ►at Detroit Lions (9/21): Played 34 snaps and caught two passes for 11 yards (5.5 avg.).

- ▶vs. Carolina Panthers (10/19): Started as the third wide receiver for the third straight week and caught a 21-yard TD pass over the middle from Rodgers early in the third quarter to give Green Bay a 35-3 lead...Found an opening in the middle of the field near the Carolina 10-yard line, where he caught the pass before taking it in for the score.
- ►at New Orleans Saints (10/26): Opened the game as the third wide receiver and posted a career-high seven receptions for 75 yards (10.7 avg.), with four of his seven grabs on the night going for first downs.
- ►vs. Chicago Bears (11/9): Played 38 snaps and caught one pass for 10 yards.
- ▶vs. Philadelphia Eagles (11/16): Started as the third wideout for the fifth straight game and caught two passes for 13 yards (6.5 avg.), highlighted by a 6-yard TD catch in the first quarter...Split out wide right and matched up with CB Bradley Fletcher, ran a slant for the TD, absorbing a hit from S Malcolm Jenkins after he made the catch...Blocked S Chris Maragos to help clear a lane for DB Micah Hyde on his 75-yard punt return for a TD in the second quarter.

Earlier in the first quarter, broke his route up the field to free himself from Ryan as a scrambling Rodgers found him for a 33-yard gain down the left sideline.

### 69 David Bakhtiari, T, 2nd Year, Colorado

- Started every game at left tackle for the Packers in 2013, becoming the first rookie to do so for Green Bay since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.
- By starting at San Francisco last season in Week 1, he became just the fourth Green Bay rookie to start the season opener at LT since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger and the first since Ken Ruettgers in 1985.
- Was the only NFL rookie to start all 16 games at left tackle in 2013.
- **2014 Season:** Has started all 12 games at LT...Part of an offense that ranks No. 2 in the NFL in points per game (31.7) and No. 7 in the league in yards per game (377.9).
- ▶at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Opened at LT and played all 62 snaps.
- ▶vs. N.Y. Jets (9/14): Played all 71 snaps and protected QB Aaron Rodgers as he threw for 346 yards, the most posted by a QB against the Jets since Saints QB Drew Brees threw for 382 last season in Week 9.
- ▶at Detroit Lions (9/21): Started and played all 53 snaps.
- ▶at Chicago Bears (9/28): Appeared on all 52 snaps and helped protect Rodgers as he threw for 302 yards and four TDs on 22-of-28 passing for a 151.2 passer rating, the third-best single-game mark of Rodgers' career (min. 20 attempts) and the fifth-best rating in franchise history... Part of a line that allowed just one sack for 0 yards on the afternoon and helped the offense score on six of seven possessions.
- ▶vs. Minnesota Vikings (10/2): Helped the offense rack up 42 points and a season-high 156 rushing yards on 28 attempts (5.6 avg.), including RB Eddie Lacy's season-best 105 yards and two TDs on 13 carries (8.1 avg.)...Lacy's average of 8.1 yards per carry was a career high (min. 10 attempts) and was the best average by a Green Bay RB in a 100-yard game since Brandon Jackson rushed for 115 yards on 10 attempts (11.5 avg.) at Washington on Oct. 10, 2010...Sealed DE Everson Griffen to help create a lane for Lacy on his season-long 28-yard run in the first quarter...Played 44 of 54 offensive snaps, departing with just over 10 minutes remaining (coach's decision) and the Packers leading 42-10.
- ▶at Miami Dolphins (10/12): Appeared on all 80 snaps and was part of a line that helped the Green Bay offense rack up a season-high 27 first downs, 369 total yards and a 37:12 time of possession, the best mark posted by the Packers since Week 8 last season at Minnesota (40:54).
- ▶vs. Carolina Panthers (10/19): Started and helped the offense score TDs on four of its first five possessions as Green Bay got out to a 28-0 lead...Blocked for Rodgers as he completed 19 of 22 passes for 255 yards and three TDs, a career-high completion percentage of 86.4 and a passer rating of 154.5 that was the second best of his career (min. 20 attempts)... Played 49 of 58 offensive snaps, departing after the Packers' final drive of the third quarter (coach's decision).
- ▶at New Orleans Saints (10/26): Played all 68 snaps and helped protect Rodgers on his way to 418 yards on 28-of-39 passing, the second-best yardage output of the QB's career and tied for the third-best total in franchise history...Helped Lacy (123) and WR Randall Cobb (126) become the first Green Bay RB/WR duo to both post 100 yards receiving in the same game since RB Eddie Lee Ivery (128) and WR Aundra Thompson (102) did so at Tampa Bay on Oct. 12, 1980.
- ▶vs. Chicago Bears (11/9): Started and played 54 snaps, helping the offense rack up 55 points, which is tied for the third most in franchise history, and 451 total yards...Part of a line that didn't allow a sack and helped Rodgers throw for six TDs, which tied the single-game franchise record, with all of them coming in the first half as he tied Raiders QB

Daryle Lamonica (1969) for the most in a first half in NFL history...Helped the offense score TDs on each of its first five possessions on the way to a 42-0 halftime lead, which tied the second-biggest halftime lead in league history.

▶vs. Philadelphia Eagles (11/16): Started and played 57 snaps, departing in the fourth quarter (coach's decision) with the Packers holding a 53-20 lead...Helped the offense register 475 total yards, its second-highest output of the season, and 53 points as the Packers posted back-to-back 50-point games for the first time in franchise history...Protected Rodgers as he was sacked just once and as he threw for 341 yards and three TDs with no INTs, his seventh game on the season with three-plus TDs/zero INTs (tied for second in NFL history behind only Tom Brady's eight in 2007).

▶at Minnesota Vikings (11/23): Started and played all 65 snaps as part of a line that allowed just one sack, bringing Green Bay's total to two sacks given up in the last three games...Helped clear the way for Lacy's season-high 125 rushing yards on 25 carries (5.0 avg.), with 55 of those coming in the fourth quarter, a career high for Lacy...With the Packers leading 24-21, cleared holes for Lacy to rush for 27 yards on five carries as Green Bay ran out the final 3:23 on the clock to clinch the win.

▶vs. New England Patriots (11/30): Started and played all 73 snaps as the offense racked up 478 total yards, the most given up by New England on the season...Protected Rodgers as he threw for 368 yards (a season high at home) and two TDs on 24-of-38 passing, highlighted by 282 yards passing in the first half alone, Rodgers' fourth 275-yard first half in the last five games...Also helped clear the way for Lacy's 98 rushing yards on 21 carries (4.7 avg.), including four runs of 10-plus yards... Delivered a block on LB Akeem Ayers to help create a gaping hole for Lacy on his game-long 24-yard run on Green Bay's opening drive.

### 58 Sam Barrington, LB, 2nd Year, South Florida

- Appeared in seven games as a rookie in 2013, seeing time exclusively on special teams, before sustaining a season-ending hamstring injury vs. Chicago in Week 9.
- Registered three tackles on special teams last season.

- ▶vs. Carolina Panthers (10/19): Started his first NFL game, opening up at FS...Was one of only two defensive players (LB A.J. Hawk) to play all 69 snaps...Led the team for the second straight game with nine tackles (eight solo), matching his career high...Added a tackle on special teams.
- ▶at New Orleans Saints (10/26): Started for the second straight week, opening at SS in place of an injured Morgan Burnett (calf)...Led the secondary with eight tackles (four solo).

### 18 Randall Cobb, WR, 4th Year, Kentucky

- Was limited to just six games in 2013 due to a knee injury. Through Week 6, led the team in receptions with 29 and ranked No. 2 in receiving vards with 378.
- Set a franchise single-season record with a league-high 2,342 combined net yards in 2012, topping the previous team mark of 2,250 yards by RB Ahman Green in 2003.
- With 954 receiving yards and 964 kickoff return yards in 2012, became the first player in NFL history to post 900-plus yards in each category in the same season
- Ranked No. 2 in the NFL in kickoff return average (27.7) in 2011, setting a franchise rookie record with 941 kickoff return yards on the season.
- **2014 Season:** Has started all 12 games and has 65 catches for 922 yards (14.2 avg.) and a career-high 10 TDs...Is tied for third in the league in TD catches, trailing only Broncos TE Julius Thomas (12) and Steelers WR Antonio Brown (11)...Dating back to last season, has 12 TD grabs over his last 13 games...Five of his 10 TD catches have come on third down, which is tied with three other players for the league lead...Has eight TD grabs in the red zone, which is tied for No. 2 in the league behind only Thomas (nine)...Of his 65 receptions, 50 have gone for first downs, a 76.8 percentage that leads the team and ranks No. 7 in the NFL...Has returned 11 punts for 105 yards (9.5 avg.).
- ▶at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Finished with six receptions for 58 yards (9.7 avg), including a 3-yard TD grab in the fourth quarter...Handled puntreturn duties, but did not have any returns (two fair catches).
- ▶vs. N.Y. Jets (9/14): Caught two TD passes, his third straight regularseason game with a TD catch and his second two-TD game over that span...The first score came with six seconds remaining in the first half when he hauled in a 6-yard pass from Rodgers...The second, which came with just under six minutes remaining in the third quarter, was a 1-yard grab that put the Packers up 22-21...Caught a pass from Rodgers on the next play for the two-point conversion, Green Bay's first since Sept. 9, 2012, vs. San Francisco (Rodgers-Jordy Nelson pass).
- ▶at Detroit Lions (9/21): Appeared on 44 plays and caught three passes for 29 yards (9.7 avg.)...Posted a season-long 22-yard punt return early in the first quarter.
- ▶at Chicago Bears (9/28): Played all 52 offensive snaps and caught seven passes for 113 yards (16.1 avg.) and two TDs, his third game with two TD catches in the last five contests...Had a game-long 46-yard grab down to the Chicago 2 in the fourth quarter...Made the catch over the

middle at the Chicago 33 before evading CB Kyle Fuller with a fake and taking it down the sideline to the 2-yard line...Went over the 2,000-yard receiving mark for his career on the 46-yarder...Hauled in a 22-yard TD grab over CB Isaiah Frey in the end zone late in the first half to give Green Bay a 21-17 edge, a lead they would never relinquish...Also caught a 3-yard TD pass early in the fourth quarter, bringing his season total to five TD catches, the first Packer to catch five TD passes in the first four games of a season since Billy Howton and Gary Knafelc both did so in 1956...Joined Jordy Nelson as they became the first Green Bay players to both register 100 receiving yards and two TD catches in the same game since Carroll Dale and Boyd Dowler hit those marks vs. the St. Louis Cardinals on Dec. 21, 1969.

▶vs. Minnesota Vikings (10/2): Tied for the team lead with three receptions for 34 yards (11.3 avg.), highlighted by his 8-yard TD catch in the first quarter that started the Green Bay scoring...Lined up in the slot, made a move in the end zone to shed CB Captain Munnerlyn for the 8-yard scoring grab...The TD was his sixth of the season as he became the first Green Bay player since Howton (seven) in 1956 to post six or more receiving TDs in the first five games of a season.

▶at Miami Dolphins (10/12): Caught five passes for 58 yards (11.6 avg.), including a 5-yard TD catch late in the third quarter that put Green Bay up 17-10...Working against S Louis Delmas in the end zone on third down, cut to the right and then back to the left to free himself as Rodgers scrambled and found him for the score.

▶vs. Carolina Panthers (10/19): Led the team in both catches (six) and receiving yards (121)...The 121 yards receiving was the second-best total of his career, trailing only his 128-yard output vs. Washington (Sept. 15, 2013)...His average of 20.2 yards per catch was a career high in games with five or more receptions...Had a season-long 47-yard grab in the second quarter, lining up in the slot and running to the flat before moving back to find a hole in the Carolina defense...Caught the pass near midfield, made a nifty cutback move to evade CB Antoine Cason and LB Luke Kuechly, and cut across the field and down the sideline to the Carolina 17...Capped that drive off with a 3-yard TD catch from Rodgers, matching his single-season career high set in 2012 (eight)...With the eight TD grabs, has recorded the most by a Packer through the first seven games of the season since Howton had nine in 1956...Marked his fourth consecutive game with a TD catch, matching his career high set in 2012...Also posted a season-long 24-yard punt return in the second quarter.

▶at New Orleans Saints (10/26): Led the team with 126 receiving yards on five grabs (25.2 avg.), highlighted by a career-long 70-yard TD reception on Green Bay's first possession of the game...On third-and-10 at the Green Bay 30, adjusted his route and headed up field as Rodgers scrambled, getting behind CB Keenan Lewis near the sideline and making the catch at the New Orleans 35...Outran Lewis and S Rafael Bush the rest of the way for his career-high ninth TD of the season, surpassing his previous season high (eight in 2012) in just the eighth game of the season...It marked his fifth consecutive game with a TD catch, the first Packer to do so since WR Greg Jennings in 2007...Finished the first quarter with 101 yards receiving on three receptions, the best receiving-yardage total by a Packer in a first quarter since WR Donald Driver registered 111 yards on three grabs (37.0 avg.) at Chicago on Oct. 7, 2002.

▶vs. Chicago Bears (11/9): Caught four passes for 72 yards (18.0 avg.), including a leaping left-handed 18-yard TD catch from Rodgers with CB Demontre Hurst covering him near the end of the first half that put Green Bay up 42-0 at the break...It marked his sixth consecutive game with a TD catch, which is tied for the third-longest streak in franchise history, and he became the first Green Bay player to accomplish the feat since WR Sterling Sharpe did so in six straight in 1994.

▶vs. Philadelphia Eagles (11/16): Posted career highs in both receptions (10) and receiving yards (129), eclipsing his previous highs of nine catches (three times) and 128 yards (vs. Washington, 9/15/13)...Nine of his 10 catches went for first downs, the most by a Packer since WR Javon Walker registered the same number vs. Jacksonville on Dec. 19, 2004... Had three receptions of 20-plus yards (22, 22, 20), with the first 22-yarder

converting a third-and-9 in the first quarter...With Rodgers scrambling to the right, made a move to free himself from CB Bradley Fletcher and made a leaping grab near the sideline to pick up the first down...Finished with three receptions for 47 yards (15.7 avg.) on third down on the afternoon, with all three grabs picking up first downs.

▶at Minnesota Vikings (11/23): Caught four passes for 58 yards (14.5 avg.), his sixth straight game with 50-plus receiving yards...Caught a 29-yard pass over the middle from Rodgers late in the first quarter to convert a third-and-10 with CB Captain Munnerlyn covering him closely.

▶vs. New England Patriots (11/30): Led the team with seven receptions for 85 yards (12.1 avg.), with five of the catches going for first downs...Had five grabs for 71 yards (14.2 avg.) on third down, highlighted by his game-clinching 7-yard grab on third-and-4 that allowed the Packers to run out the clock for the win...On the play, lined up in the backfield before the snap before moving into the slot...Beat CB Logan Ryan off the line and continued to move across the field to the left as Rodgers found him for the reception between Ryan and CB Devin McCourty...Lined up in the backfield and beat DE Rob Ninkovich on a wheel route down the right sideline for a 33-yard catch on a third-and-5 early in the second quarter... Added 8 rushing yards on two carries (4.0 avg.).

### 2 Mason Crosby, K, 8th Year, Colorado

- Set an NFL record with 903 points in his first seven seasons (2007-13), topping the previous league record held by Indianapolis K Mike Vanderjagt (874, 1998-2004).
- With 1,005 career points, ranks No. 2 on the all-time franchise scoring list behind only K Ryan Longwell (1,054).
- Is one of only three players in NFL history to register three or more 140-point seasons (Stephen Gostkowski, David Akers).
- Has kicked the six longest field goals in franchise history (58-yarder in 2011, two 57-yarders in 2013, 56-yarders in 2010 and 2011, 55-yarder in 2014).
- Ranks No. 1 in team annals with 22 field goals of 50-plus yards.
- Set a franchise record with 23 consecutive field goals made (Week 13, 2010-Week 12, 2011), topping Chris Jacke's mark of 17 straight in 1993.

**2014 Season:** Has connected on 20 of 23 field-goal attempts and 42 of 43 extra points (one block) for 102 points on the season...Ranks No. 7 in the league in scoring...Has connected on three of four attempts from 50-plus yards (55, 53, 52)...Is tied for No. 9 in the league with the three FGs of 50-plus yards...Has recorded 34 touchbacks on 76 kickoffs (44.7 percent) and has made one tackle on special teams.

▶at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Connected on his lone field-goal attempt of the evening, a 23-yarder in the second quarter, to bring his streak of consecutive regular-season field goals made to 15 (ties Chris Jacke, 1989-90, for the third-longest streak in franchise history)...Also marked his franchise-record 16th straight regular-season game with at least one field goal, surpassing Longwell's record of 15 (2004-05)...Added two touchbacks on four kickoffs.

▶vs. N.Y. Jets (9/14): Made all three of his field-goal attempts, bringing his streak of consecutive FGs made in the regular season to 18, the second-longest streak in franchise history behind only his own streak of 23 straight from 2010-11...Drilled a 55-yard FG in the second quarter, the longest by a Green Bay player ever at Lambeau Field...It was his 20th FG of 50-plus yards, further extending his team record...Also extended his franchise record by making at least one FG in his 17th consecutive game.

►at Detroit Lions (9/21): Saw his team-record streak of 17 consecutive games with a field goal come to an end as his only points came on a first-quarter extra point...Did not have any field-goal attempts for the first time since Week 1 of 2013...Registered one touchback on two kickoffs.

▶at Chicago Bears (9/28): Scored eight points, drilling a 53-yard field goal early in the third quarter and all five of his extra points...Saw his streak of consecutive field goal made come to an end at 19 straight, the second-longest streak in team history, when his 38-yard attempt in the fourth quarter was blocked by DE Willie Young...Posted a season-high five touchbacks on seven kickoffs.

- ▶vs. Minnesota Vikings (10/2): Did not have any field-goal attempts for the second time in three games, but connected on all six of his extra points...Registered two touchbacks on the evening.
- ▶at Miami Dolphins (10/12): Connected on both of his field-goal attempts, including a 30-yarder with 4:09 remaining to cut Miami's lead to 24-20...Recorded touchbacks on three of his six kickoffs...Posted his first tackle of the season on special teams, bringing down WR Jarvis Landry at the Green Bay 49 on Miami's first kickoff return.
- ▶vs. Carolina Panthers (10/19): Made his lone field-goal attempt of the afternoon, a 34-yarder late in the third quarter, and all five extra points...Matched his season high with five touchbacks on seven kickoffs.
- ▶at New Orleans Saints (10/26): Posted 11 points, connecting on all three of his field-goal attempts (31, 49, 27) and both extra points...Posted touchbacks on each of his four kickoffs.
- ▶vs. Chicago Bears (11/9): Registered 13 points, connecting on both of his field-goal attempts and all seven of his extra points...Drilled a 52-yarder in the third quarter, his sixth consecutive make from 50 yards or more, the longest streak in franchise history.
- ►vs. Philadelphia Eagles (11/16): Posted 11 points, connecting on field goals from 27 and 33 yards out and five extra points (one blocked)... Recorded a season-high six touchbacks on 10 kickoffs.
- ▶at Minnesota Vikings (11/23): Connected on his lone field-goal attempt of the afternoon, a 48-yarder late in the third quarter, to extend Green Bay's lead to 17-13...Added three extra points.
- ▶vs. New England Patriots (11/30): Made four of his five field-goal attempts and both extra points for a season-high 14 points...Went over the 1,000-point mark for his career, joining Longwell as the only player in team history to eclipse that plateau...Also cleared the 100-point mark on the season for the eighth time in his career, tying Longwell (1997-2004) for the franchise record.

### 76 Mike Daniels, DT, 3rd Year, Iowa

- Emerged as a force in his second season in 2013, tying for sixth in the NFL among DTs with 6.5 sacks, the most in a season by a Green Bay defensive lineman since DT B.J. Raji posted the same total in 2010.
- Appeared in 14 games as a rookie in 2012 and finished with 19 tackles (11 solo), two sacks, a team-high two fumble recoveries (one for a TD) and a pass defensed.
- **2014 Season:** Has started all 12 games and leads the defensive line with 51 tackles (31 solo)...Leads the defensive line and ranks No. 3 on the team with four sacks...Leads the team in both QB hits (16) and pressures (18).
- ▶at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Started at RDE and registered a careerhigh eight tackles (five solo), which was tied for the team lead.
- ▶vs. N.Y. ▶vs. New England Patriots (11/30): Posted 98 yards rushing on 21 carries (4.7 avg.), including four runs of 10-plus yards...On the Packers' third play from scrimmage, found a big hole on the left side on his gamelong 24-yard run...Accounted for 51 of Green Bay's 58 yards on the opening drive (39 rushing, 12 receiving).

#### 70 T.J. Lang, G, 6th Year, Eastern Michigan

- Has started 58 games since 2011, which is tied for No. 1 on the team over that span (CB Tramon Williams).
- In his first three seasons as a starter (2011-13), helped the Packers rank No. 3 in the NFL in scoring (29.4 ppg), No. 6 in total offense (388.2 ypg) and No. 4 in passing offense (275.9 ypg) over that span.
- Has started 62 games as a pro, opening contests at four different positions (28 at RG, 27 at LG, five at RT, two at LT).
- Saw the first action of his career at center in 2013 and has now played all five positions in a game during his NFL career.
- **2014 Season:** Has started all 12 games at RG...Part of an offense that ranks No. 2 in the NFL in points per game (31.7) and No. 7 in the league in yards per game (377.9).
- ▶at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Started at RG and played all 62 snaps. ▶vs. N.Y. Jets (9/14): Played all 71 snaps and protected QB Aaron Rodgers as he threw for 346 yards, the most registered by a QB against the Jets since Saints QB Drew Brees threw for 382 last season in Week 9. ▶at Detroit Lions (9/21): Started at RG and appeared on all 53 offensive snaps.

#### 57 Jamari Lattimore, LB, 4th Year, Middle Tenn. State

- Has evolved into one of the club's core players on special teams, having played in 29 games over the past two seasons (2012-13) and posted 15 coverage tackles, two onside kick recoveries and a blocked punt over that span.
- Was voted as one of six postseason captains by his teammates on the eve of the 2012 playoffs, joining CB Jarrett Bush as the two representatives for the special-teams units.
- Made the transition from outside linebacker as a rookie in 2011 to the inside in 2012 and continues to provide depth at both positions.
- **2014 Season:** Has played in 11 games with five starts...Has registered 43 tackles (26 solo), an interception and two passes defensed...Has added four tackles on special teams.

- ▶at New Orleans Saints (10/26): Appeared on 23 defensive snaps and 12 on special teams, recording two tackles (one solo) on defense.
- ▶vs. Chicago Bears (11/9): Inactive (healthy scratch).

- Was named first-team All-Big Ten by both the coaches and the media as a senior in 2013, helping the Buckeyes rank No. 5 in the nation in rushing (308.6 yards per game).
- One of five team captains, he was part of an Ohio State line that helped the team set school records for points scored (637), yards per carry (6.8), touchdowns (87) and TD passes (38) in '13.
- **2014 Season:** Has started all 12 games at center...Part of an offense that ranks No. 2 in the NFL in points per game (31.7) and No. 7 in the league in yards per game (377.9).
- ▶at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Became the first Green Bay rookie to open at C in Week 1 since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger...Became the first NFL rookie drafted in the fifth round or later to start at center in the season opener since Philadelphia's Jason Kelce in 2011...Appeared on all 62 offensive snaps.
- ▶vs. N.Y. Jets (9/14): Played all 71 snaps and protected QB Aaron Rodgers as he threw for 346 yards, the most posted by a QB against the Jets since Saints QB Drew Brees threw for 382 last season in Week 9.
- ►at Detroit Lions (9/21): Started at C and appeared on all 53 offensive snaps.
- ▶at Chicago Bears (9/28): Appeared on all 52 snaps and helped protect Rodgers as he threw for 302 yards and four TDs on 22-of-28 passing for a 151.2 passer rating, the third-best single-game mark of Rodgers' career (min. 20 attempts) and the fifth-best rating in franchise history... Part of a line that allowed just one sack for 0 yards on the afternoon and helped the offense score on six of seven possessions.

- ▶vs. Minnesota Vikings (10/2): Helped the offense register 42 points and a season-high 156 rushing yards on 28 attempts (5.6 avg.), including RB Eddie Lacy's season-best 105 yards and two TDs on 13 carries (8.1 avg.)...Lacy's average of 8.1 yards per carry was a career high (min. 10 attempts) and was the best average by a Green Bay RB in a 100-yard game since Brandon Jackson rushed for 115 yards on 10 attempts (11.5 avg.) at Washington on Oct. 10, 2010...Quickly got to the second level to block LB Anthony Barr and help spring Lacy for a 17-yard gain in the first quarter.
- ▶at Miami Dolphins (10/12): Appeared on all 80 snaps and was part of a line that helped the Green Bay offense rack up a season-high 27 first downs, 369 total yards and a 37:12 time of possession, the best mark posted by the Packers since Week 8 last season at Minnesota (40:54).
- ▶vs. Carolina Panthers (10/19): Started and played all 58 snaps, helping the offense score TDs on four of its first five possessions as Green Bay got out to a 28-0 lead...Blocked for Rodgers as he completed 19 of 22 passes for 255 yards and three TDs, a career-high completion percentage of 86.4 and a passer rating of 154.5 that was the second best of his career (min. 20 attempts).
- ▶at New Orleans Saints (10/26): Played all 68 snaps and helped protect Rodgers on his way to 418 yards on 28-of-39 passing, the second-best yardage output of the QB's career and tied for the third-best total in franchise history...Helped Lacy (123) and WR Randall Cobb (126) become the first Green Bay RB/WR duo to both post 100 yards receiving in the same game since RB Eddie Lee Ivery (128) and WR Aundra Thompson (102) did so at Tampa Bay on Oct. 12, 1980.
- ▶vs. Chicago Bears (11/9): Started and played all 67 snaps, helping the offense rack up 55 points, which is tied for the third most in franchise history, and 451 total yards...Part of a line that didn't allow a sack and helped Rodgers throw for six TDs, which tied the single-game franchise record, with all of them coming in the first half as he tied Raiders QB Daryle Lamonica (1969) for the most in a first half in NFL history...Helped the offense score TDs on each of its first five possessions on the way to a 42-0 halftime lead, which tied the second-biggest halftime lead in league history...Delivered a key block on LB Lance Briggs to help spring Lacy on a second-quarter screen pass that he took 56 yards for a touchdown.
- ▶vs. Philadelphia Eagles (11/16): Started and played all 68 snaps, one of only two offensive players (T Bryan Bulaga) to do so...Helped the offense register 475 total yards, its second-highest output of the season, and 53 points as the Packers posted back-to-back 50-point games for the first time in franchise history...Protected Rodgers as he was sacked just once and as he threw for 341 yards and three TDs with no INTs, his seventh game on the season with three-plus TDs/zero INTs (tied for second in NFL history behind only Tom Brady's eight in 2007).
- ▶at Minnesota Vikings (11/23): Started and played all 65 snaps as part of a line that allowed just one sack, bringing Green Bay's total to two sacks given up in the last three games...Helped clear the way for Lacy's season-high 125 rushing yards on 25 carries (5.0 avg.), with 55 of those coming in the fourth quarter, a career high for Lacy...With the Packers leading 24-21, cleared holes for Lacy to rush for 27 yards on five carries as Green Bay ran out the final 3:23 on the clock to clinch the win.
- ▶vs. New England Patriots (11/30): Started and played all 73 snaps as the offense racked up 478 total yards, the most given up by New England on the season...Protected Rodgers as he threw for 368 yards (a season high at home) and two TDs on 24-of-38 passing, highlighted by 282 yards passing in the first half alone, Rodgers' fourth 275-yard first half in the last five games...Also helped clear the way for Lacy's 98 rushing yards on 21 carries (4.7 avg.), including four runs of 10-plus yards...Got up the field to block LB Jamie Collins as the line created a gaping hole for Lacy on his game-long 24-yard run on Green Bay's opening drive.

### 8 Tim Masthay, P, 5th Year, Kentucky

- Ranks No. 1 in team history (min. 150 attempts) in both career gross punting average (44.5) and career net punting average (38.6).
- Set a franchise record (since 1976) with a 38.95-yard net punting average in 2013, and now holds the top four single-season marks (2010-13)

in team annals.

- Holds two of the top four single-season gross punting averages in team history (44.6 in 2013).
- Ranks No. 1 in team annals (since 1976) for the most career punts placed inside the 20 with 112, having surpassed Craig Hentrich's mark (104) in Week 5 vs. Minnesota.
- **2014 Season:** Has registered a 45.5-yard gross average and a net average of 39.1 yards on 37 punts this season...Has placed 12 punts inside the 20 on the season...His 37 punts on the season are the fewest by any punter in the league that has played in 10 or more games...Has also served as the holder in all 12 games.
- ▶at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Punted four times on the evening and posted a 38.3-yard gross average and a net average of 37.5...Booted a 57-yarder in the fourth quarter and placed one punt inside the 20...Also kicked off once on the evening.
- ▶vs. N.Y. Jets (9/14): Posted a career-best (min. four punts) net punting average of 46.5 yards, topping his previous high of 46.2 yards at Kansas City on Dec. 18, 2011...The 46.5-yard net average was also the third-best mark in team history (since 1976)...Had a 49.3-yard gross average on his four punts.
- ►at Detroit Lions (9/21): Punted five times and recorded a gross average of 43.0 and a net average of 39.8...Placed two punts inside the 20.
- ►at Chicago Bears (9/28): Did not have any punts on the afternoon, the second straight season he has had a game with zero punts (at Minnesota, Oct. 27, 2013).
- ▶vs. Minnesota Vikings (10/2): Tied a franchise record (since 1976) with five punts placed inside the 20, matching his mark set at the N.Y. Jets (Oct. 31, 2010) and David Beverly's set vs. Chicago (Oct. 28, 1978)...With the five punts inside the 20, brought his career total to 108 as he surpassed Hentrich (104) for the franchise record...Posted three 58-yard punts, with all of them coming in the first half...Finished with a 45.8-yard net average on the night, his career high for a game with six-plus punts.
- ►at Miami Dolphins (10/12): Posted a 43.0-yard gross average on his four punts with one inside the 20, but saw his net average (30.4) affected by a blocked punt in the second quarter, his first since Oct. 14, 2012, at Houston.
- ▶vs. Carolina Panthers (10/19): Registered a season-high gross average of 55.2 yards on five punts and a 44.0-yard net average, his third game this season with a net average of 44.0 yards or better.
- ▶at New Orleans Saints (10/26): For the second time in five games, did not have any punts...It marked the first time in the Super Bowl era that the Packers posted two zero-punt games in a single season.
- ►vs. Chicago Bears (11/9): Posted a 40.3-yard gross average and a 36.0-yard net average on his three punts, including one placed inside the 20.
- ►vs. Philadelphia Eagles (11/16): Punted once for 40 yards...Had a punt blocked in the fourth quarter.
- ▶at Minnesota Vikings (11/23): Recorded a 42.3-yard gross average and a net average of 41.0 yards on four punts, highlighted by two punts placed inside the 20-yard line...Had a 41-yarder downed at the Vikings' 10-yard line in the first quarter and a 40-yarder downed at the Minnesota 12 in the second quarter.
- ▶vs. New England Patriots (11/30): Punted once for 38 yards (35.0-yard net), the third time in the last five games that he either did not punt or only punted once.

#### 52 Clay Matthews, LB, 6th Year, Southern California

- Ranks fourth in franchise history with 54.5 career sacks.
- Became the first player in franchise history to earn Pro Bowl recognition in each of his first four seasons in the league (2009-12).
- Ranks No. 8 in the league in sacks since entering the league in 2009 with 54.5.
- Is the only player in franchise history to score a defensive TD (interception or fumble return) in each of his first three seasons in the league.
- Named first-team All-Pro by *The Associated Press* in 2010, the first Green

- Bay LB to earn that honor since Tim Harris in 1989. Finished second to Pittsburgh safety Troy Polamalu in the *AP's* Defensive Player of the Year voting in 2010.
- **2014 Season:** Has started all 12 games, opening four at LOLB, four at ROLB and four at MLB, and has recorded 52 tackles (38 solo), 4.5 sacks, an interception, two forced fumbles (tied for the team lead), six passes defensed, 13 QB hits and 14 pressures...Ranks No. 5 on the team in tackles and No. 2 in sacks, QB hits and pressures.
- ▶at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Brought down WR Percy Harvin for a 2-yard loss on a short pass early in the second quarter, also forcing a fumble on the play, one that Harvin recovered...Finished the game with five tackles (three solo) and a pressure.
- ▶vs. N.Y. Jets (9/14): Started at ROLB as the Packers opened in a 4-3 alignment and registered five tackles (four solo), a sack, a pass defensed, a QB hit and two pressures...Came free from the right side early in the fourth quarter and batted down a Geno Smith pass...On the Jets' next series, chased down QB Michael Vick for a 3-yard sack.

- ▶vs. Minnesota Vikings (10/2): Played 56 snaps and registered two tackles (one solo), three QB hits and a pressure.
- ▶at Miami Dolphins (10/12): Appeared on 49 snaps and recorded a forced fumble, a QB hit and a pass defensed...Batted a QB Ryan Tannehill pass at the line intended for WR Mike Wallace late in the fourth quarter... Later on the series, put a hit on Tannehill as he flushed him from the pocket and forced the QB to throw the ball out of bounds, helping to preserve time on the clock for an offense that would need it on its game-winning drive... On the final play of the game, forced a fumble by RB Lamar Miller as he attempted a lateral to C Samson Satele, a fumble that was recovered by LB Julius Peppers at the Miami 47.
- ▶vs. Carolina Panthers (10/19): Shared a 7-yard sack of QB Cam Newton in the fourth quarter with LB Julius Peppers, walking back LT David Foucalt to get to Newton...Posted four tackles (three solo), two QB hits and a team-high three pressures.
- ▶at New Orleans Saints (10/26): Started at ROLB and recorded five tackles (three solo) and a sack...On the sack, came off the right side to beat T Terron Armstead before chasing down QB Drew Brees and tripping him up for a 5-yard loss on first down late in the first half as the Saints were forced to settle for a field goal.
- ▶vs. Chicago Bears (11/9): Started on the inside for the first time in his career, opening at MLB next to BLB A.J. Hawk...Recorded 10 tackles (nine solo), a sack, a QB hit and two pressures...Lined up at ROLB late in the first quarter, beat T Jermon Bushrod to get to QB Jay Cutler and bring him down for a 5-yard loss on third down to force a Chicago punt...From his spot on the inside, came around the right side of the line untouched on an end-around to WR Chris Williams, perfectly diagnosing the run and delivering a punishing tackle for an 8-yard loss on the play...Helped limit the Bears to a season-low average of 2.3 yards per carry as they ran for just 55 yards on 24 attempts.
- ▶vs. Philadelphia Eagles (11/16): Started at MLB for the second straight week, registering five tackles (four solo), a sack, a QB hit and a pass defensed...On third-and-2 at the Green Bay 5 early in the second quarter, came free off the left side to sack QB Mark Sanchez for a 10-yard loss as the Eagles were forced to settle for a field goal...The sack gave him 54.5 for his career as he moved past DE Aaron Kampman (54.0) for the No. 4 spot on the all-time franchise list (since 1982)...Helped limit the Eagles

to an average of 3.5 yards per carry on 31 rushing attempts, Philadelphia's lowest average in five games this season with 30-plus attempts.

- ►at Minnesota Vikings (11/23): Opened at MLB for the third straight game and posted four tackles (two solo), two QB hits, two pressures and a pass defensed.
- ▶vs. New England Patriots (11/30): Started at MLB for the fourth straight contest and registered six tackles (five solo), a QB hit and a pressure...In the second quarter, came from the ROLB spot to beat T Marcus Cannon on his way to QB Tom Brady, getting a piece of the ball as it came out of Brady's arm and forcing it to fall well short of his intended target, WR Julian Edelman...In the fourth quarter, fought off a block by G Ryan Wendell to stop RB Brandon Bolden for a 1-yard loss.

#### 55 Andy Mulumba, LB, 2nd Year, Eastern Michigan

- Appeared in 14 games with three starts as a rookie in 2013, recording 34 tackles (17 solo), a sack and a fumble recovery.
- One of three rookie free agents to make the opening-day roster last season, he was tied with CB Micah Hyde for the most starts by a Green Bay rookie on the defensive side of the ball with three.
- Was tied for No. 6 on the team with five tackles on special teams in 2013. **2014 Season:** Appeared in the first two games on special teams and registered one tackle...Was placed on season-ending injured reserve on Sept. 19 due to a knee injury.
- ▶at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Saw seven snaps on special teams.
- ▶vs. N.Y. Jets (9/14): Appeared on 21 plays on special teams...Brought WR Jalen Saunders down for no gain at the New York 36 on a fourth-quarter punt...Sustained a significant knee injury, one that would end his season, in the fourth quarter covering the next Tim Masthay punt.

#### 96 Mike Neal, LB/DE, 5th Year, Purdue

- Made the move from DE to a hybrid OLB/DE role in 2013 and established personal bests for games played (16), starts (10), tackles (61), solo tackles (39), sacks (five) and INTs (one).
- Appeared in 11 games in 2012, finishing with 18 tackles (10 solo) and ranking second on the team behind LB Clay Matthews with 4½ sacks.
- **2014 Season:** Has played in all 12 games with three starts and has registered 34 tackles (21 solo), 3.5 sacks, six QB hits and nine pressures... Ranks No. 4 on the team in sacks and tied for No. 4 in pressures.
- ►at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Registered five tackles (three solo) and two pressures.
- ▶vs. N.Y. Jets (9/14): Started at RDE as the defense opened in a 4-3 alignment...Posted three tackles (two solo), two QB hits and a pressure.
- ▶at Detroit Lions (9/21): Posted his first sack of the season, bringing down QB Matthew Stafford for a 2-yard loss on a third down in the second quarter to force the Lions to settle for a field goal...On the play, ran a stunt with LB Clay Matthews and beat LT Riley Reiff before chasing Stafford down from behind at the Green Bay 12...Finished with five tackles (three solo) and a pressure.
- ►at Chicago Bears (9/28): Appeared on 39 defensive snaps and posted two solo tackles.

- ▶at Miami Dolphins (10/12): Posted his second sack of the season, coming off the right side to beat LT Branden Albert and fight off a block by RB Knowshon Moreno on his way to dropping QB Ryan Tannehill for a 7-vard loss late in the first half.
- ►vs. Carolina Panthers (10/19): Played 32 snaps, recording a solo tackle and two pressures.
- ►at New Orleans Saints (10/26): Appeared on 33 plays and registered two assisted tackles.

#### 87 Jordy Nelson, WR, 7th Year, Kansas State

- Posted a career-high 85 catches for a career-best 1,314 yards (15.5 avg.) last season, becoming just the fourth player in franchise history to register 85-plus receptions and 1,300-plus receiving yards in the same season.
- Led the NFL with 19 catches of 25-plus yards in 2013, the most by a Green Bay player since STATS LLC began recording the statistic in 1994.
- Ranks No. 4 in the league and No. 2 among wide receivers (Dez Bryant, 44) with 40 TD catches since 2011.
- Ranks No. 8 in franchise history in receptions (372), No. 9 in receiving yards (5,709) and No. 8 in TD catches (46).
- **2014 Season:** Has started all 12 games and leads the team in receptions (70) and receiving yards (1,119)...Ranks No. 7 in the league in receiving yards and No. 10 in the NFL in receptions...Has caught 10 TD passes, which is tied for No. 3 in the league...Has caught at least one TD pass in all six home games this season...Has recorded four games with nine-plus receptions, which ties the single-season franchise record...Ranks No. 8 in the league with 48 receiving first downs this season...Has three TD receptions of 65-plus yards, the most by a Packer since Freeman had four in 1998...Ranks No. 1 in the league with six TD catches of 40-plus yards this season, which is also tied for No. 2 in franchise history behind only Billy Howton's mark of seven in 1952.
- ▶at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Led the team with nine receptions for 83 yards (9.2 avg.), the most catches he has ever posted in a season opener... It marked his second straight game with nine or more receptions (a careerhigh 10 at Chicago in Week 17 in 2013), the first Green Bay player to accomplish that feat since WR Donald Driver in 2004.
- ▶vs. N.Y. Jets (9/14): Posted a career-best 209 yards on nine receptions (23.2 avg.), only the 11th 200-yard receiving game in the history of the franchise and the highest total since Don Beebe's 220-yard output vs. San Francisco on Oct. 14, 1996...Marked his third straight game with nine or more catches as he joined Don Hutson (three straight in 1942) as the only players in franchise history to accomplish that feat...With the game tied at 24 late in the third guarter, caught a game-winning 80-yard TD pass from Aaron Rodgers on the opening play of the drive...It marked his fourth TD catch of 80-plus yards during his career, which ties WR Greg Jennings for the franchise record...On the play, ran an out-and-up move at the Green Bay 30 to beat CB Dee Milliner, caught the ball near midfield and then made a cutback move on S Calvin Prvor as he took it the rest of the way for the score...Set a team record for the most receptions in the first two games of a season with 18, topping Ken Payne's mark of 17 in 1975, and his 292 receiving yards are the second most in franchise annals through two games behind only James Lofton's 323-yard total in 1983.
- ▶at Detroit Lions (9/21): Led the team in receptions for the third straight game this season the fourth straight game dating back to last season, hauling in five passes for a team-high 59 yards (11.8 avg.)...With the five catches, brought his three-game total to 23, a franchise record for the most catches by a Green Bay player through the first three contests (previous high was 21 by three players).
- ▶at Chicago Bears (9/28): Matched his career high with 10 receptions for 108 yards (10.8 avg.) and two TDs, his second 10-catch game in the last five contests (at Chicago, Dec. 29, 2013)...Brought his four-game total

to 33 receptions, a franchise record for the most catches in the first four games of a season (RB Edgar Bennett, 29 in 1994)...Caught a 3-yard TD pass in the second quarter, beating CB Kyle Fuller on a fade in the left corner of the end zone...Made a leaping grab for an 11-yard score in the third quarter, absorbing a hit from CB Tim Jennings on the catch near the back of the end zone...Joined Randall Cobb as they became the first Green Bay players to both post 100 receiving yards and two TD catches in the same game since Carroll Dale and Boyd Dowler hit those marks vs. the St. Louis Cardinals on Dec. 21, 1969...Went over the 5,000-yard mark for his career on a 15-yard reception on a third-and-8 in the second quarter...Appeared on all 52 offensive snaps.

▶vs. Minnesota Vikings (10/2): His lone reception of the evening was an impactful one, catching a 66-yard TD pass from Rodgers in the first quarter to put Green Bay up 14-0...Sped past CB Captain Munnerlyn, who passed him off to S Harrison Smith, before making an out-and-up move on Smith to get open and catch Rodgers' deep pass perfectly in stride at the Minnesota 20 before taking it the rest of the way for the score.

▶at Miami Dolphins (10/12): Led the team in receptions (nine) and receiving yards (107), his fourth game with nine-plus receptions on the season and his third 100-yard game...Tied the single-season franchise record with his fourth nine-catch game on the season (six other times in team history)...Brought his season receiving total to 43 receptions, which is tied with WR Sterling Sharpe (1993) for the most catches through six games in team history...Caught a 9-yard TD pass over the middle on Green Bay's opening drive, his third straight game with a TD grab as he tied his career high for consecutive games with a TD catch...On the Packers' game-winning TD drive late in the fourth quarter, made an 18-yard grab down the right sideline on fourth-and-10 with just over a minute remaining to keep the drive alive...Seven of his nine receptions on the day went for first downs.

▶at New Orleans Saints (10/26): Caught three passes for 25 yards (8.3 avg.)...With the three receptions, brought his career total to 352 and moved past RB Ahman Green (350) for No. 8 on the all-time franchise list. ▶vs. Chicago Bears (11/9): Led the team with six receptions for a team-high 152 yards (25.3 avg.) and two TDs...All of his yardage came in the first half, his career high for any half, and was tied for the secondmost by a Packer in a first half (James Jones, vs. Washington, Sept. 15, 2013) since WR Antonio Freeman posted 169 yards in the first half vs. Tennessee on Dec. 20, 1998...Posted TD catches of 73 and 40 yards, both early in the second quarter, the first time in his career that he had posted two TD grabs of 40-plus vards in a game...On the 73-varder, came free off the line against CB Tim Jennings on third-and-11, who passed him off in coverage, before running wide open down the sideline and catching the ball at the Chicago 40...Made a cutback move on S Brock Vereen near the Chicago 30 before taking it down the middle of the field to the end zone... On the next series, was again matched up with Jennings, who passed him off in coverage with S Rvan Mundy arriving late to help...Utilized good footwork to keep both feet in bounds on the side of the end zone as he caught the pass from Rodgers, who rolled to his right on the play...On RB Eddie Lacy's 56-yard TD catch, sprinted down the sideline to Lacy's left and delivered a key block of CB Kyle Fuller at the Chicago 5 to clear the way for Lacy to the end zone.

- Played in all 12 games with 10 starts at CSU-Pueblo as a senior in 2013 and recorded 36 tackles (15 solo), including six for a loss, three sacks, three forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and four passes defensed.

- Since entering the NFL in 2002, ranks No. 3 in the league in sacks (123.5) and is tied for No. 3 in forced fumbles (41).
- Is the only player in NFL history (since 1982) to register 100 sacks (123.5) and 10 interceptions (11). Is also the only NFL player to record 100 sacks and four INT returns for TDs.
- Has posted eight double-digit sack seasons since 2002, which is tied with Bears DE Jared Allen for No. 1 in the league over that span.
- 2014 Season: Has started all 12 games and has posted 36 tackles (25 solo), a team-leading five sacks, two interceptions (both returned for TDs), 10 QB hits, 13 pressures, eight passes defensed, two forced fumbles and a team-high three fumble recoveries...Is tied for the NFL lead with the two INT TDs (four others)...Ranks No. 7 in the NFL among all players and No. 1 among linebackers/defensive linemen with 101 interception return yards... Leads the team in fumble recoveries, is tied for the team lead in forced fumbles and ranks No. 3 in both QB hits and pressures...Is also tied with CB Casey Hayward for the team lead with five takeaways (three fumble recoveries, two INTs)...Joins Texans DE J.J. Watt as the only players in the NFL this season to have a sack, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery, an interception and a defensive TD.
- ▶at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Started at ROLB in his Green Bay debut, recording four tackles (all solo), a QB hit and a pressure.

- Is the only quarterback in league history to record a 100-plus passer rating in five consecutive seasons (2009-13).

- In 99 career regular-season starts (67-32 record), has posted 37 games with 300-plus passing yards, 57 without an interception (min. 15 attempts) and 59 with a 100-plus passer rating.
- In the franchise record books, holds four of the top five single-season marks for passer rating (2009, 2011-13), two of the top three for passing TDs (2011-12), four of the top five for completion percentage (2010-13) and two of the top three for passing yards (2009, 2011).

**2014 Season:** Has completed 252 of 380 passes (66.3 percent) for 3,325 yards and 32 TDs with three INTs for a 118.6 passer rating...Ranks No. 1 in the NFL this season in passer rating, yards/attempt (8.75), and TD/INT ratio (10.67, 32/3), and No. 3 in TD passes...Has thrown three TD passes of 70-plus yards this season (No. 1 in the league), and ranks No. 1 in NFL history with 16 TD passes of 70-plus yards...Has posted seven games with three-plus TDs and zero INTs, which is tied for No. 2 in NFL history behind only Patriots QB Tom Brady's eight games in 2007...Has posted a league-high 10 zero-INT games this season (min. 15 attempts).

▶at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Connected on 23 of 33 passes (69.7 percent) for 189 yards and a TD with one INT for an 81.5 passer rating.

Was named NFC Offensive Player of the Week for his performance, the ninth time in his career that he had earned the weekly honor.

▶vs. Minnesota Vikings (10/2): Completed 12 of 17 passes for 156 yards and three TDs with no INTs for a 138.7 passer rating, his sixth 130-plus rating game in his last seven starts against Minnesota...His 11-yard TD pass to WR Davante Adams in the second quarter was the 200th of his career as he reached that mark in his 99th career game, the second fastest in NFL history behind only Dolphins QB Dan Marino (89 games)...Set an NFL record for the fewest INTs by a quarterback at the time of his 200th career TD pass with 53, topping the previous mark held by Patriots QB Tom Brady (88) by 35 INTs...Connected with Nelson on a 66-yard TD pass in the second quarter, Rodgers' 21st of 60-plus yards since 2008, No. 1 in the NFL over that span...Posted his fourth straight zero-INT game, his longest streak since a four-gamer in 2012 (Weeks 14-17)...His 17 attempts on the evening tied his career low (vs. Detroit, Oct. 3, 2010) for a game

he did not depart early due to injury...Exited the game after a seven-play, 52-yard TD drive that put Green Bay up 42-0 late in the third quarter.

▶at Miami Dolphins (10/12): Appearing in his 100th career regularseason game, led the Packers on an 11-play, 60-yard game-winning drive that was capped off with his 4-yard TD pass to TE Andrew Quarless with three seconds remaining in the 27-24 win...It marked the first time the Packers won a game on a TD with three seconds or less remaining in the fourth quarter since they beat the Bears, 20-19, on a 3-yard TD run by QB Bart Starr with three seconds left on Nov. 15, 1970...Completed 24 of 42 passes on the day for 264 yards and three TDs with zero INTs, his fifth consecutive start with no interceptions as he matched his career high set in 2010...The three TD passes brought his career total to 203, the second most in NFL history through 100 games behind only Dolphins QB Dan Marino (217)...On his 5-yard TD pass to Cobb in the third guarter, moved up in the pocket to avoid DE Cameron Wake, scrambled to his right to elude DE Olivier Vernon and LB Koa Misi, and then threw across his body to find Cobb in the end zone...On the game-winning TD drive, found Nelson for an 18-yard gain down the right sideline to convert a fourth-and-10... After finding Cobb four plays later for a 4-yard gain to the Miami 16, raced up to the line to down the ball and stop the clock, but instead faked a spike with 12 seconds left before throwing to WR Davante Adams on the right sideline for a 12-vard pickup to the Miami 4...On the next play, went to Quarless, who was split out wide to the right and matched up with LB Philip Wheeler, on a back-shoulder throw in the end zone for the winning score...Added 34 rushing yards on the afternoon on seven attempts (4.9 avg.), his best rushing-yardage total since a 57-yard day at Indianapolis on Oct. 7, 2012.

▶vs. Carolina Panthers (10/19): Threw for 255 yards and three TDs on 19-of-22 passing for a 154.5 passer rating, the second-highest rating of his career (min. 20 attempts) and the third best in team annals...His 86.4 completion percentage was a career high and the third-best mark in team history...Posted his fourth straight three-TD/zero-INT game, joining Patriots QB Tom Brady (2007) as the only QBs in NFL history to accomplish the feat in a single season...Posted his sixth straight zero-INT game. tying Bart Starr's franchise record (min. 15 attempts per game) set in 1964...With 22 attempts and no interceptions, brought his streak of consecutive attempts without an interception to 192, his career high and the second-best mark in franchise history (Starr, 294, 1964-65)...His three TD passes gave him 18 for the season as he became the first QB in NFL history to throw for 18 TD passes in the first seven games of the season with one or zero interceptions...Joined Brady (2007) as the only QBs in NFL history to register two 150-rating outings in the first seven games of the season... Completed three passes of 30-plus yards on the afternoon, highlighted by a 59-yard TD pass to Nelson on the opening drive...Also found Cobb for gains of 47 and 33 yards...Did not play in the fourth quarter (coach's decision), departing with a 38-3 lead...Was named NFC Offensive Player of the Week for his performance, the second time on the season he earned the weekly award and the 10th time he has received the honor in his career.

▶at New Orleans Saints (10/26): Threw for 418 yards and a TD on 28-of-39 passing with two INTs, the second-highest yardage output of his career...Marked the fourth 400-yard passing game of his career, with no other QB in franchise annals having more than one 400-vard game...Saw his streak of passing attempts without an interception come to an end at 212, the second-longest streak in franchise history...Found WR Randall Cobb for a 70-yard TD pass on the opening drive of the game, his 15th career TD pass of 70-plus yards as he matched QB Brett Favre for the franchise record...Also tied Favre and QB Peyton Manning for the most 70-yard TD passes in NFL history...Connected with RB Eddie Lacy on a 65-vard screen pass on Green Bay's second series, becoming the first NFL guarterback since Warner (vs. Miami, Sept. 14, 2008) to complete a 65-yard pass on both of the first two series...Posted 203 passing yards in the first quarter alone, his career high for any quarter, topping his previous best of 197 yards in the second quarter vs. Washington on Sept. 15, 2013... His 278 yards passing in the first half were his second most in either half behind only his 335-yard output in the first half against the Redskins in

2013...With Lacy (123) and Cobb (126) both recording 100-yard days, it marked the first time Green Bay had a RB/WR duo each register 100 yards receiving in the same game since RB Eddie Lee Ivery (128) and WR Aundra Thompson (102) accomplished the feat on Oct. 12, 1980, at Tampa Bay... Sustained a hamstring injury on a 7-yard scramble that picked up a first down with about nine minutes left in the third quarter, but remained in the game...Scored on a 14-yard run with 5:07 left in the contest, his first rushing TD since Dec. 23, 2012, vs. Tennessee.

▶vs. Chicago Bears (11/9): Tied the franchise single-game record with six TD passes (Rodgers, Matt Flynn), with all of them coming in the first half as he tied the NFL record (Raiders QB Daryle Lamonica, first half, 1969) for the most in a half...Completed TD passes to five different players, a franchise record...Threw TD passes of 73, 40 and 56 yards, becoming the first Green Bay QB to throw three or more TD passes of 40-plus yards since Cecil Isbell had four vs. the Chicago Cardinals on Nov. 1, 1942... The 73-vard TD pass to Nelson early in the second quarter was his 16th career TD pass of 70-plus yards, the most in NFL history as he surpassed Manning and Favre (15 each)...With his six TD passes, he brought his season total to 10 TDs and zero INTs against the Bears, the first QB in NFL history to throw 10 TDs and no INTs against an opponent in a single season...Racked up 315 passing yards in the first half, the second-best total of his career for either half behind only his 335-yard output vs. Washington in the first half on Sept. 15, 2013...Departed the game with just under 11 minutes remaining in the third quarter (coach's decision), finishing the evening with 315 yards and six TDs on 18-of-27 passing for a 145.8 passer rating...Despite injuring his hamstring in the Week 8 game at New Orleans, showed no effects as he utilized his scrambling ability to elude DE Willie Young on his 4-vard TD pass to Quarless in the first guarter and as he rolled to his right to make a throw on the run on his 40-yard strike to Nelson in the second quarter...Posted his 10th straight zero-INT game at Lambeau Field as he brought his streak to 286 attempts without an INT at the stadium...Completed 5 of 7 passes for 108 yards and three TDs on third down (153.3 rating), which combined with his outing at Chicago earlier in the season, gave him a perfect 158.3 rating against the Bears on third down this season (12 of 14, 187 yards, five TDs)...Was named NFC Offensive Player of the Week for his performance, the third time on the season he earned the weekly award and the 11th time he has received the honor in his career.

▶vs. Philadelphia Eagles (11/16): Completed 22 of 36 passes for 341 vards and three TDs with no INTs for a 120.3 passer rating...It marked his seventh game with three-plus TDs/zero INTs on the season, tying him for second in NFL history behind only Brady's eight games in 2007...With 36 attempts and no interceptions, brought his streak of passes at home without an interception to 322, an NFL record as he surpassed Brady's mark of 288 attempts at home from 2002-04...Also further extended his NFL record for TD passes at home without an INT to 29...Threw for 279 vards in the first half, making him the only QB in the last 25 seasons (1990-2014) to throw for 275-plus yards in the first half of three games in a season (he has done it in three straight)...Threw a 6-yard TD pass to Adams in the first quarter, a 27-yarder to Nelson in the second quarter and a 32-yarder to Lacy in the fourth quarter...Found Nelson for a 64-yard gain down the right sideline on the third play of the game to help set up a Mason Crosby FG as the Packers scored on their opening drive for the fifth straight game... Added 32 rushing yards on three carries (10.7 avg.), picking up a pair of first downs...Matched his season-long with a 16-yard scramble in the second guarter...Departed the game early in the fourth guarter (coach's decision) with the Packers leading 53-20.

▶at Minnesota Vikings (11/23): Connected on 19 of 29 passes for 209 yards and two TDs with no INTs for a 109.7 passer rating...It marked the seventh 100-plus passer-rating game in his last eight regular-season starts vs. Minnesota...Also marked his fourth consecutive zero-INT game against the Vikings...His first TD pass came with just over five minutes remaining in the first half when he rolled out to his right and lofted a pass to wide-open TE Richard Rodgers in the back-left corner of the end zone for a 1-yard TD...Connected with Lacy on a shovel pass that went for a

10-yard TD to put Green Bay up 24-14 midway through the fourth quarter. ▶vs. New England Patriots (11/30): Threw for 368 yards, a season high at home this season, and two TDs with zero INTs on 24-of-38 passing for a 112.6 passer rating...Reached the 3.000-vard passing mark for the season, the sixth time he has done so in his career (2008-12, 2014)... Posted a 100-plus passer rating for the fourth straight game and registered his fourth consecutive zero-INT game...Threw for 282 yards in the first half alone, the fourth time in the last five games that he had thrown for 275-plus yards in the first half...No other NFL quarterback has posted more than two 275-vard first halves in the last 25 seasons (1990-2014)... On third down, completed 10 of 13 passes for 184 yards and a TD for a 143.9 passer rating...Threw a 32-yard TD pass to Rodgers late in the first quarter and a 45-yarder to Nelson late in the first half...The TD gave Nelson 10 TD catches on the season as he joined Cobb as the first duo in franchise history both post 10 TD grabs in the same season...Completed passes of 25-plus vards to five different players, the first Green Bay QB to do so since Lynn Dickey on Dec. 4, 1983, vs. Chicago.

#### 89 Richard Rodgers, TE, Rookie, California

- Played tight end for his first two seasons at California before moving to inside receiver as a junior in 2013, where he caught a career-high 39 passes for a career-best 608 yards (15.6 avg.) and a TD.
- Led the Golden Bears with 11 receptions of 20-plus yards in 2013.
- Appeared in 35 games with 11 starts during his three seasons at Cal and finished with 59 receptions for 896 yards (15.2 avg.) and two TDs.
- **2014 Season:** Has played in all 12 games with five starts and has 13 catches for 172 yards (12.5 avg.) and two TDs.
- ▶at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Became the first Green Bay rookie TE to start a season opener since Jackie Harris opened in a two-tight-end set in 1990...Left the game due to a neck injury sustained in the second quarter, but did return to action...Saw 20 snaps on offense.
- ▶vs. N.Y. Jets (9/14): Started, appearing on 34 plays, and helped protect QB Aaron Rodgers as he threw for 346 yards and three TDs with no INTs.
- ▶at Detroit Lions (9/21): Started and appeared on 11 offensive snaps. ▶at Chicago Bears (9/28): Started and posted the first two receptions of his career, with both coming on Green Bay's opening drive...Hauled in a 9-yarder on the Packers' first offensive play and then caught a deep pass that went for 43 yards on the next snap, the longest reception by a rookie tight end in franchise history.
- ►vs. Minnesota Vikings (10/2): Appeared on 19 offensive plays but did not record any statistics.
- ▶at Miami Dolphins (10/12): Played 34 snaps on offense.
- ▶vs. Carolina Panthers (10/19): Playing against his father, Richard Sr. (special teams coordinator for the Panthers), appeared on 32 plays and caught a 1-yard pass...Also helped the offense rush for 122 yards on 30 carries (4.1 avg.)...Delivered a punishing block on S Roman Harper to help spring WR Randall Cobb for extra yardage on his season-long 47-yard reception in the second guarter.
- ▶at New Orleans Saints (10/26): Played 34 snaps and registered a career-high four catches for a career-best 58 yards (14.5 avg.)...Lined up in the slot, found an opening down the left sideline for a 22-yard gain to the New Orleans 40 in the second quarter...Added a 14-yard grab over the middle at the end of the drive on third-and-20 to help set up Mason Crosby's 27-yard field goal.
- ►vs. Chicago Bears (11/9): Started as the Packers opened up with two tight ends (Andrew Quarless)...Played a season-high 51 snaps and caught two passes for 6 vards (3.0 avg.).
- ▶vs. Philadelphia Eagles (11/16): Played 43 snaps and caught a 19-yard pass in the first quarter to convert a third-and-10 on a drive that was later capped off with Rodgers' 6-yard TD pass to WR Davante Adams...On the play, came out of the slot on the right side with S Malcolm Jenkins covering him as Rodgers found him moving to his left for the 19-vard gain to the Philadelphia 16.
- ▶at Minnesota Vikings (11/23): Scored his first pro TD when he

caught a 1-yard pass from Rodgers with just over five minutes remaining in the first half...Even though it was just a 1-yard grab, the ball traveled much farther than that as the QB rolled out to his right before looking back to find the wide-open TE in the back-left corner of the end zone for the score.

▶vs. New England Patriots (11/30): Played 29 snaps and caught a TD pass for the second straight game, hauling in a 32-yarder from Rodgers at the end of the first quarter to put Green Bay up 13-0...Went down the seam and made an over-the-shoulder grab in the end zone with S Eugene Chung covering him...Finished with two receptions for 35 yards (17.5 avg.).

#### 37 Sam Shields, CB, 5th Year, Miami

- Had his finest statistical season in 2013, setting new career highs for starts (14), tackles (64), solo tackles (57) and passes defensed (a teamhigh 25), and tied his previous career best with four INTs.
- Entered the NFL as a non-drafted free agent and earned the nickel corner-back job in 2010 as a rookie despite playing defense for just one season in college.
- Has 19 interceptions since 2010 (including playoffs), which ranks No. 3 in the NFL among active players behind only Seahawks CB Richard Sherman (23) and teammate Tramon Williams (21).
- **2014 Season:** Has started all 10 games he has played in at RCB and has posted 35 tackles (28 solo), two interceptions and 11 passes defensed (ranks second on the team)...Part of a secondary that has helped Green Bay rank No. 6 in opponent passer rating (82.0) this season.
- ▶at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Appeared on all 70 defensive plays, recording three tackles (one solo) and a team-high two passes defensed.
- ►vs. N.Y. Jets (9/14): Played 70 of 71 defensive snaps and registered a solo tackle and a pass defensed...Part of a secondary that helped limit the Jets to 166 net passing yards.
- ▶at Detroit Lions (9/21): Appeared on 74 of 75 defensive snaps and helped limit WR Calvin Johnson to 82 yards on six receptions, his lowest yardage total of the season...Posted a season-high six tackles (all solo).

- ▶at Miami Dolphins (10/12): Posted two tackles (one solo) and his second interception of the season...Late in the second quarter, ran stride for stride with WR Brian Hartline and made a leaping interception of QB Ryan Tannehill's deep pass intended for Hartline at the Green Bay 32...Left the game with just under four minutes remaining in the third quarter due to a knee injury and did not return.
- ▶vs. Carolina Panthers (10/19): Inactive due to the knee injury.
- ▶at New Orleans Saints (10/26): Inactive (knee) for the second straight game.
- ▶vs. Chicago Bears (11/9): Returned to action after missing two games due to a knee injury, sliding back into his customary starting spot at RCB...Led the secondary with seven tackles (six solo) and added a pass defensed on 60 snaps...The pass defensed came when he nearly intercepted Cutler's pass intended for WR Alshon Jeffery near the goal line on fourth-and-goal from the 6 with just under eight minutes remaining in the first guarter.
- ▶vs. Philadelphia Eagles (11/16): Started and played 72 snaps, tied for second most on the team...Registered seven tackles (all solo), includ-

ing a stop of WR Jeremy Maclin for a 1-yard loss on a fourth-quarter pass. ►at Minnesota Vikings (11/23): Started and played 67 of 68 snaps, recording two solo tackles and a pass defensed.

▶vs. New England Patriots (11/30): Started, but departed early in the second quarter after sustaining a concussion as he tried to make a tackle of RB Brandon Bolden on a run...Posted an assisted tackle and a pass defensed on 10 snaps.

#### 71 Josh Sitton, G, 7th Year, Central Florida

- Was named second-team All-Pro by *The Associated Press* last season, the first Green Bay offensive lineman to be honored by *AP* since G Marco Rivera (second team) in 2003.
- Made the transition to left guard in 2013, starting all 16 games there after spending his first five seasons at right guard for the Packers.
- Has started 90 of a possible 92 games since 2009, the most by a Packers offensive lineman over that span.
- Was named to his first career Pro Bowl in 2012, becoming the first Green Bay guard to be selected since Rivera in 2004.
- **2014 Season:** Has started all 12 games at LG...Part of an offense that ranks No. 2 in the NFL in points per game (31.7) and No. 7 in the league in yards per game (377.9).
- ►at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Started at LG and appeared on all 62 offensive plays.
- ▶vs. N.Y. Jets (9/14): Played all 71 snaps and protected QB Aaron Rodgers as he threw for 346 yards, the most posted by a QB against the Jets since Saints QB Drew Brees threw for 382 last season in Week 9.
- ►at Detroit Lions (9/21): Started at LG and played all 53 offensive snaps.
- ▶at Chicago Bears (9/28): Appeared on all 52 snaps and helped protect Rodgers as he threw for 302 yards and four TDs on 22-of-28 passing for a 151.2 passer rating, the third-best single-game mark of Rodgers' career (min. 20 attempts) and the fifth-best rating in franchise history... Part of a line that allowed just one sack for 0 yards on the afternoon and helped the offense score on six of seven possessions.
- ▶vs. Minnesota Vikings (10/2): Helped the offense record 42 points and a season-high 156 rushing yards on 28 attempts (5.6 avg.), including RB Eddie Lacy's season-best 105 yards and two TDs on 13 carries (8.1 avg.)...Lacy's average of 8.1 yards per carry was a career high (min. 10 attempts) and was the best average by a Green Bay RB in a 100-yard game since Brandon Jackson rushed for 115 yards on 10 attempts (11.5 avg.) at Washington on Oct. 10, 2010...Delivered a cut block on DT Linval Joseph to help spring Lacy for a 17-yard run in the first quarter...Sealed off DT Sharrif Floyd on Lacy's season-long 28-yard run in the first quarter...Played 44 of 54 offensive snaps, departing with just over 10 minutes remaining (coach's decision) and the Packers leading 42-10.
- ▶at Miami Dolphins (10/12): Appeared on all 80 snaps and was part of a line that helped the Green Bay offense rack up a season-high 27 first downs, 369 total yards and a 37:12 time of possession, the best mark by the Packers since Week 8 last season at Minnesota (40:54).
- ▶vs. Carolina Panthers (10/19): Started and helped the offense score TDs on four of its first five possessions as Green Bay got out to a 28-0 lead...Blocked for Rodgers as he completed 19 of 22 passes for 255 yards and three TDs, a career-high completion percentage of 86.4 and a passer rating of 154.5 that was the second best of his career (min. 20 attempts)... Played 49 of 58 offensive snaps, departing after Green Bay's final drive of the third quarter (coach's decision).
- ▶at New Orleans Saints (10/26): Started and played 66 of 68 snaps, helping protect Rodgers on his way to 418 yards on 28-of-39 passing, the second-best yardage output of the QB's career and tied for the third-best total in franchise history...Helped Lacy (123) and WR Randall Cobb (126) become the first Green Bay RB/WR duo to both post 100 yards receiving in the same game since RB Eddie Lee Ivery (128) and WR Aundra Thompson (102) did so at Tampa Bay on Oct. 12, 1980...Did not play on Green Bay's final series (two snaps) due to a toe injury.
- ▶vs. Chicago Bears (11/9): Was in the starting lineup despite miss-

ing practice time during the week due to the toe injury sustained at New Orleans in Week 8...Played 44 snaps, helping the offense rack up 55 points, which is tied for the third most in franchise history, and 451 total yards...Part of a line that didn't allow a sack and helped Rodgers throw for six TDs, which tied the single-game franchise record, with all of them coming in the first half as he tied Raiders QB Daryle Lamonica (1969) for the most in a first half in NFL history...Helped the offense score TDs on each of its first five possessions on the way to a 42-0 halftime lead, which tied the second-biggest halftime lead in league history...Got up the field to block LB Jonathan Bostic and help spring Lacy on a second-quarter screen pass that he took 56 yards for a touchdown.

- ▶vs. Philadelphia Eagles (11/16): Started and played 57 snaps, departing in the fourth quarter (coach's decision) with the Packers holding a 53-20 lead...Helped the offense register 475 total yards, its second-highest output of the season, and 53 points as the Packers posted back-to-back 50-point games for the first time in franchise history...Protected Rodgers as he was sacked just once and as he threw for 341 yards and three TDs with no INTs, his seventh game on the season with three-plus TDs/zero INTs (tied for second in NFL history behind only Tom Brady's eight in 2007).
- ▶at Minnesota Vikings (11/23): Started and played all 65 snaps as part of a line that allowed just one sack, bringing Green Bay's total to two sacks given up in the last three games...Helped clear the way for Lacy's season-high 125 rushing yards on 25 carries (5.0 avg.), with 55 of those coming in the fourth quarter, a career high for Lacy...With the Packers leading 24-21, cleared holes for Lacy to rush for 27 yards on five carries as Green Bay ran out the final 3:23 on the clock to clinch the win.

- Rushed for a team-high 1,326 yards over the past three seasons (2011-13), highlighted by his club-high 578 rushing yards in 2011.
- Posted a league-leading 315 rushing yards in the 2010 postseason, third most ever by a rookie RB in the postseason behind only Washington's Timmy Smith (342 in 1987) and Baltimore's Jamal Lewis (338 in 2000).

- One of three non-drafted rookie free agents to make Green Bay's openingday roster in 2013, he went on to appear in 10 games last season.
- Played primarily on special teams but also saw limited action at right guard in his first season.

**2014 Season:** Has played in all 12 games, seeing action on offense and special teams.

▶at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Saw limited action on special teams.

▶vs. N.Y. Jets (9/14): Appeared on 10 plays on special teams.

▶at Detroit Lions (9/21): Played six snaps on special teams.

▶at Chicago Bears (9/28): Appeared on 13 plays on special teams.

▶vs. Minnesota Vikings (10/2): Saw the most significant action of his career on offense, appearing on 10 snaps at LG for Josh Sitton (coach's decision) in the fourth quarter...Entered the game with just over 10 minutes remaining.

#### 73 JC Tretter, C/G, 2nd Year, Cornell

- Has started 58 consecutive regular-season games for the Packers, the longest active streak with Green Bay among players on the defensive side of the ball.
- Ranked No. 1 in the NFL with a combined nine interceptions in 2010 (six in regular season, three in postseason).
- Posted 63 tackles, six interceptions and 23 passes defensed on his way to being selected to his first Pro Bowl in 2010 as an injury replacement.
- **2014 Season:** Has started all 12 games at LCB and has registered 66 tackles (51 solo), two interceptions and a team-high 12 passes defensed... Part of a secondary that has helped Green Bay rank No. 6 in the NFL in opponent passer rating (82.0) this season.
- ▶at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Played all 70 defensive snaps and registered three tackles (all solo) and a pass defensed.
- ▶vs. N.Y. Jets (9/14): Appeared on 70 of 71 defensive plays and recorded six tackles (four solo), two QB hits, an interception and two passes defensed...His interception proved to be a momentum-turning play, one that came with the Jets driving late in the first half with a 21-9 lead...

- ▶vs. Philadelphia Eagles (11/16): Played 60 snaps, recording six tackles (four solo) and an interception...Matched up against WR Jeremy Maclin in the fourth quarter, got in front of him as Maclin slipped to pick off QB Mark Sanchez's pass near the sideline.
- ▶at Minnesota Vikings (11/23): Appeared on 64 plays, tying for the team lead with two passes defensed while adding three solo tackles.
- ▶vs. New England Patriots (11/30): Played all 56 snaps and matched his season high with a team-best nine tackles (eight solo)...Brought down WR Julian Edelman on a short pass over the middle late in the first quarter after he picked up 4 yards on third-and-5 to force a three-and-out.
