

PACKERS TRAVEL TO TAMPA BAY

Green Bay will play its final road game of the regular season this Sunday against the Buccaneers.



- Green Bay leads the regular-season series against the Buccaneers 30-21-1 and won the last meeting, 35-26, in 2011 at Lambeau Field.
- The Packers are looking to record consecutive victories against Tampa Bay for the first time since winning six in a row (including the postseason) from 1996-98.
- This will be the Packers' first visit to Tampa Bay since 2009.
- Green Bay's last victory on the road over the Buccaneers was on Nov. 16, 2003 (20-13).
- Of the 52 games between the two teams during the regular season, 31 have been decided by 10 points or less, including nine of the last 10 contests.
- The Packers are 3-0 this season following a loss.
- A win would give Green Bay at least a .500 record on the road for the fourth regular season in a row and for the seventh time in nine seasons under Head Coach Mike McCarthy.
- Green Bay's 39 road wins during the regular season under McCarthy are tied (N.Y. Giants, New Orleans) for the fifth most in the league since 2006 (New England-49 / Indianapolis, Dallas-41 / Philadelphia-40).
- The Packers have won at least 10 games in six of nine regular seasons under McCarthy, including five of the last six. He is tied with Curly Lambeau (1929-32, 1936, 1941) for the most 10-win seasons as a head coach in franchise history.
- ► Under McCarthy, the Packers are 24-12 in the month of December, including wins in nine of their last 12.
- Dating back to 1995, Green Bay has won 10 or more regular-season games 14 times.
- Packers LB Julius Peppers has played the Buccaneers 16 times in his career due to his many years in the NFC South as a member of the Carolina Panthers. Against Tampa Bay, Peppers has 15.5 sacks, three forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and one interception. He has recorded at least one sack in three of his last four games versus the Buccaneers.
- In Week 17, Green Bay returns to Lambeau Field to take on the Detroit Lions in the final game of the regular season.
- Green Bay clinches a playoff spot with:
- 1) GB win + PHI loss or tie OR
- 2) GB win + DAL win or tie OR
- 3) GB tie + PHI loss OR
- 4) GB tie + PHI tie + DAL win or tie OR
- 5) PHI loss + DAL win or tie

WITH THE CALL

FOX Sports, now in its 21st season as an NFL network television partner, will broadcast the game to a regional audience.

- ▶ Play-by-play man Chris Myers joins analyst Ronde Barber with Jennifer Hale reporting from the sidelines.
- Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since November 1929, heads up the Packers Radio Network that is made up of 50 stations in five states. Wayne Larrivee (play-by-play) and two-time Packers Pro Bowler Larry McCarren (analyst) call the action. McCarren first joined the team's broadcasts in 1995 and enters his 20th season calling Packers' games. McCarren, who is in his 26th year in Green Bay television, has four times been voted Wisconsin Sportscaster of the Year by the National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association. After originally being paired together in 1999, McCarren and Larrivee enter their 16th season of broadcasts together.
- Westwood One will air the game across the country. Kevin Lee (playby-play) and Ross Tucker (analyst) will call the action with Scott Graham hosting pre-game and halftime shows.
- The broadcast is also available on Sirius Satellite Radio (WTMJ feed) as part of the network's NFL Sunday Drive.
- ▶ DIRECTV subscribers can watch the game on channel 712.

STAT OF THE WEEK

- With 1,320 receiving yards this season, WR Jordy Nelson surpassed his career high of 1,314 set in 2013.
- ►He is the second Packers player to record back-to-back 1,300-yard receiving seasons (James Lofton, 1,300 in 1983 and 1,361 in 1984.)
- Nelson also eclipsed 80 receptions for the second season in a row (83 in 2014 and 85 in 2013). He is the fourth player in franchise history to record 80-plus receptions in consecutive seasons (Donald Driver, 2004-07 / Antonio Freeman, 1997-98 / Sterling Sharpe, 1992-94).

BREAKING DOWN THE ROSTER

The Packers' active roster is composed of 24 offensive players, 26 defensive players and three specialists.

- ► Of the 53 players on Green Bay's roster, 32 of them (60.4 percent) were draft picks of the Packers.
- ► Green Bay has 19 players on the roster that began their careers as nondrafted free agents, with nine of those originally signed by Green Bay.
- ► Almost 50 percent of the players (26 of 53, 49.1%) on Green Bay's roster entered the league as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as a non-drafted player.
- The Packers have 12 players on the roster that played in the NFL prior to the 2009 season, and six of those players began their pro careers as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as a non-drafted player (QB Matt Flynn, K Mason Crosby, CB Tramon Williams, CB Jarrett Bush, FB John Kuhn, LS Brett Goode).
- ► Of the 53 players on the roster, 41 began their pro careers with the Packers (77.4 percent).
- Only 16 of the 53 players on the roster (30.2 percent) were selected in the first three rounds of the draft, with 15 being drafted by the Packers.
- ► Of the 53 players on the roster, 43 of them (81.1 percent) are 28 years old or younger (as of Dec. 21) and 20 players (37.7 percent) are 24 years old or younger.

PRETTY GOOD SO FAR

Through 14 games this season, the Packers have put together a fine season and have a chance to finish among the best in many statistical categories. ► Green Bay has scored 436 points this season, which ranks as the fifth

most in franchise history with two games left to play:

► The Packers have scored 52 touchdowns this season, just four behind the second most in franchise history:

- ► Green Bay's offensive line has only given up 28 sacks this season, the fewest since allowing 19 in 2007.
- ► After averaging 4.65 yards per carry in 2013, the Packers are averaging 4.48 rushing yards per carry this season. Green Bay has a chance to record consecutive seasons with a rushing average of 4.40 or better for the first time since the 1963 (4.46) and 1964 (4.60) seasons. It would be the first time the Packers averaged over 4.0 yards per carry in consecutive seasons since 2007-09 (4.12, 4.13, 4.30).
- ► Green Bay has 12 rushing touchdowns on the season. They are three away from registering consecutive seasons (17 in 2013) with 15-plus rushing touchdowns since 1983-85 (15, 18, 16).
- ► Packers RB **Eddie Lacy** has four receiving touchdowns this season. He is one away from the second most by a running back in franchise history:

PACKERS AT BUCCANEERS - WEEK 16

WHAT TO LOOK FOR

- ► Green Bay head coach **Mike McCarthy** needs one win to pass Hall of Fame coach Vince Lombardi (98) for the second-most overall wins (regular and postseason) in franchise history.
- ▶ If the Packers win, it would give McCarthy his fifth regular season with 11-plus wins (2007, 2009, 2011-12), which would pass Lombardi (1961-63, 1966) and Mike Holmgren (1995-98) for the **most by a coach in** franchise history.
- A win would make McCarthy 93-49-1 during the regular season as the Packers' head coach.
- ► The Packers have recorded at least one sack in 34 consecutive games, the longest streak in franchise history (28-1995-97 / 26-1986-88) and the longest active streak in the NFL.
- ►The Packers' defense is looking to hold the opposing starting quarterback to a passer rating below 85.0 for the 11th game this season (BUF-Kyle Orton, 54.2 / MIN-Teddy Bridgewater, 79.8 / PHI-Mark Sanchez, 80.3 / CHI-Jay Cutler, 68.8 / CAR-Cam Newton, 72.6 / MIA-Ryan Tannehill, 81.5 / MIN-Christian Ponder, 45.8 / CHI-Jay Cutler, 82.5 / DET-Matthew Stafford, 61.6 / NYJ-Geno Smith, 64.1).

OFFENSE

- QB Aaron Rodgers needs one more three-touchdown/zero-interception game to pass Patriots QB Tom Brady (eight in 2007) for the most in NFL history in a single season.
- Rodgers has thrown for three or more touchdowns eight times this season. It is tied for the second-most (eight in 2012) three-plus passing touchdown games in a single regular season in his career (10 in 2011).
- Rodgers has recorded a passer rating of at least 120.0 in six games this season. If he records one more, Rodgers will set a single-season career high and tie for the third-most in a single season in the NFL, dating back to 1960.
- ► Rodgers has recorded a 100-plus passer rating nine times this season. He is one away from being tied for the second most (10 in 2009) he has recorded in one regular season (13 in 2011). Green Bay is 9-0 this season when Rodgers registers a 100-plus passer rating.
- ► With seven 300-yard passing games this season, Rodgers is one away from tying his regular season career high of eight (2011). Green Bay is 6-1 this season when Rodgers throws for 300 yards.
- ►WR Jordy Nelson is three receptions away from setting a new career high (85 in 2013). He is seven receptions shy of becoming the fourth Packer to reach 90 receptions in one regular season (Sterling Sharpe 1989, 1992-94 / Robert Brooks 1995 / Donald Driver 2006).
- ► Nelson needs 63 receiving yards to pass Javon Walker (1,382 in 2004) for the fifth most in a single season in franchise history.
- ► Nelson has recorded at least nine receptions in four games this season. If Nelson registers one more game with at least nine receptions, it will be the most in a single season in franchise history.
- ► Nelson has three touchdown receptions of 65 yards or more this season, the most by a Packer since WR Antonio Freeman had four touchdown catches of 65-plus yards in 1998.
- ► Nelson has seven touchdown receptions of 40-plus yards this season, tied for the most in a season in team history with Billy Howton (1952).
- ►WR **Randall Cobb** is five receptions away from a new single-season career high (80 in 2012).
- Cobb has recorded at least one reception in 38 consecutive regularseason games.
- Cobb has caught at least one touchdown in eight games this season. He has 12 receiving touchdowns in his last 15 regular-season games, dating back to last season.
- ► Cobb is two touchdown receptions shy of becoming the 18th player in franchise history to reach 25 receiving touchdowns.
- Cobb is looking for his fifth game this season with at least 100 yards receiving, which would extend his career high (three-2012).
- ► Cobb reached the 1,000-yard recieving mark for the first time in his career this season (1,076). He joined Nelson (1,320) as the first Packers' duo since Donald Driver (1,061) and Greg Jennings (1,113) in 2009 to eclipse 1,000 yards receiving each in the same season.

- ► If Cobb reaches 1,200 yards receiving, they will become the second duo in Packers' history to each reach 1,200 receiving yards in the same season, joining the 2004 duo of Javon Walker (1,382) and Driver (1,208).
- ► Cobb (76) and Nelson (83) could become the second pair of Packers' players to reach 80 receptions each in the same season. They would join Walker (89) and Driver (84), who accomplished the feat in 2004.
- ►RB Eddie Lacy (2,118) is 15 rushing yards shy of passing John Brockington (2,132) for the most rushing yards by a Packers' running back in his first two NFL seasons.
- ► Lacy (940) is 60 yards short of his second straight 1,000-yard rushing season. He would be the fifth player in franchise history to record consecutive 1,000-yard rushing seasons (Ryan Grant, 2008-09 / Ahman Green, 2000-04 / John Brockington, 1971-73 / Jim Taylor, 1960-64).
- ► Over the last seven games, Lacy has 881 yards from scrimmage and eight touchdowns on 136 touches.
- ► Lacy has gone over 100 yards from scrimmage eight times this season, including in each of the last seven games. Green Bay is 6-2 when Lacy has 100 yards or more from scrimmage.
- Lacy has scored at least one touchdown in eight of the last 11 games. **DEFENSE**
- LB Clay Matthews has six sacks in the last seven games.
- Matthew looks to record multiple sacks in back-to-back regular-season games for the third time in his career (Gms. 1-2 in 2010 and 2012).
- With 7.5 sacks this season, is tied (2013) for the fourth-highest regularseason total of his career (13.5 in 2010 / 13.0 in 2012 / 10 in 2009).
- ► Matthews (57.5) is 2.5 sacks away from becoming the third player in franchise history to reach 60.0 career sacks (DE Reggie White, 68.5; DE Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila, 74.5).

SPECIAL TEAMS

►With 1,025 career points, **Mason Crosby** passed NE K Stephen Gostkowski (1,023) for the most points by an NFL player in his first eight seasons.

QUICK OUT OF THE GATE

Green Bay has performed well in the first half this season and that has been fueled by quick starts.

- ► The Packers have scored on their opening drive in eight of the last 11 games (six TDs, two FGs). The Packers are **No. 1 in the NFL** with 48 points on the first offensive possession (San Francisco and St. Louis, 41).
- ► Green Bay scored 89 unanswered points at home in the first quarter, from the Week 2 game vs. NYJ through Week 14 vs. Atlanta. It was the most consecutive points scored at home in the first quarter since the Miami Dolphins scored 93 straight in the 1978-79 seasons.
- ► Green Bay has produced an NFL-leading 137 points in the first quarter this season. It is the most first-quarter points by an NFL team in a single season since St. Louis (140 in 2001).

- Rodgers has thrown 24 touchdowns and zero interceptions in the first half this season.
- Rodgers has thrown for 275-plus yards in the first half four times this season, the most by an NFL quarterback over the past 25 seasons (1990-2014), with no other QB posting more than two in a season.
- ▶Green Bay has recorded at least four scoring drives in the first half in six of the last eight games. The Packers scored on all five first-half drives in Weeks 13 and 14 (six TDs, four FGs).
- ► With 30 points in the first half of the Week 11 victory over Philadephia, Green Bay became the first team in NFL history to score 28-plus points in the first half of four consecutive home games.
- ► In a 55-14, Week 10 victory over the Chicago Bears, the Packers put up a memorable performance in the first half:
 - Green Bay's 42 points scored were the third most in a first half in franchise history and the most since a 49-point performance vs. Tampa Bay on Oct. 2, 1983.
 - The Packers' 42-point lead tied for the second-biggest halftime lead in league history (also Green Bay vs. Tampa Bay on Oct. 2, 1983, 49-7). The NFL record is 45 points by New England vs. Tennessee (45-0) on Oct. 18, 2009.
 - Rodgers' six touchdown passes tied for the most in any half in NFL history (Raiders QB Daryle Lamonica vs. Buffalo on Oct. 19, 1969).

MIKE McCARTHY...Is in his ninth year as the Packers' 14th head coach.

- ► Joined Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl title with a win over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.
- ► Led the Packers to their fifth consecutive playoff appearance last season, joining New England as the only two NFL teams to do so over that span. Has also led the team to six playoff appearances in the last seven years (2007, 2009-13).
- ► Has guided the Packers to top-10 finishes in scoring each of the past seven seasons (2007-13), joining the Patriots as the only other team to accomplish the feat.
- ► His .652 winning percentage during the regular season (92-49-1) ranks No. 3 among active NFL coaches (min. 50 games).
- ► Was named Packers head coach on Jan. 12, 2006, his first headcoaching job after 13 years as an NFL assistant.

LOVIE SMITH...Is in his first year as the Buccaneers' 10th head coach.
 Prior to joining Tampa Bay, Smith spent nine seasons as the head coach of the Chicago Bears. He left Chicago ranked third all-time in coaching victories, behind Hall of Famers George Halas and Mike Ditka.

- ►He led the Bears to three division titles, two NFC Championship Game appearances and the 2006 NFC crown, the team's first Super Bowl apperance in 21 years.
- Guided Chicago to three 11-win seasons during his tenure, including a career-high 13 victories in 2006.
- ► Named the *AP* NFL Coach of the Year in 2005 after he led a worst-tofirst revival in the NFC North. The Bears' six-win improvement from the previous season was tied for the biggest in the NFL that year.
- Came to Chicago from St. Louis, where he served as defensive coordinator from 2001-03, helping the Rams return to the Super Bowl in 2001. Prior to that, coached LBs for Tampa Bay from 1996-2000.

THE PACKERS-BUCCANEERS SERIES

- Sunday marks the 54th overall meeting between these former NFC Central rivals. They launched the series in 1977, when the expansion Bucs moved to the Packers' division after an inaugural 1976 campaign in the AFC West.
- Including a 1997 playoff victory, the Packers hold a 31-21-1 advantage. But since the Bucs shifted to the NFC South before the 2002 season, Tampa has won four of the last six.
- ►From the second meeting in 1992 through the first meeting in 1998, the Packers won 12 of 13 contests. The Bucs' lone win in that stretch came in overtime (Dec. 10, 1995).
- ► The teams have played at least once every year except 1976, 1982, 2004, 2006, 2007, 2010, 2012 and 2013 since Tampa Bay entered the league in 1976.

- ►Green Bay scored a total of 108 points in Weeks 10-11, scoring 55 against Chicago and 53 versus Philadelphia.
- ► The Packers were only the second team in NFL history to score 53-plus points in back-to-back games, joining the Los Angeles Rams (1950).
- ►It marked the first time in franchise history that the Packers registered back-to-back 50-point games. It was the fifth time in NFL history that a team accomplished the feat.
- Green Bay is the only team to score at least 50 points twice this season.

SACKING PACK

Once again, QB **Aaron Rodgers** has put together some masterful performances this season. He has thrown for three-plus touchdowns eight times, has recorded a passer rating over 120.0 six times, and has totaled over 300 yards passing seven times, including the second-highest single-game total of his career with 418 yards in Week 8 at New Orleans.

- ► He has eight three-touchdown/zero-interception games this season, which is tied for first in NFL history with NE QB Tom Brady (2007).
- ► In Week 10, he joined Raiders QB Daryle Lamonica (vs. BUF, Oct. 19, 1969) as the only players in NFL history to throw for six touchdowns in a first half.
- This season he became the first quarterback in NFL history to throw for 18-plus touchdowns with one or fewer INTs in the first seven games of a season.

So far this season, WRs Randall Cobb and Jordy Nelson have led the way for the Packers offense, putting up numbers of historical significance.

USING THE BACKS

Over the course of the season, Green Bay has shown more commitment to getting the running backs involved.

- ► The Packers recorded 25-plus carries and 100 yards nine times since Oct. 2 (Weeks 5-8, 10-15), averaging at least 4 yards a carry in Weeks 7 (4.1), 8 (4.7), 10 (4.1), 11 (4.4), 12 (4.8), 13 (4.5), 14 (6.0) and 15 (6.3).
- Dating back to the 2013 regular season, Green Bay is 11-2 in the last 13 games they ran the ball at least 25 times, including 8-1 this season. The Packers are 71-15-1 under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** when running the ball 25-plus times.
- ►RB Eddie Lacy is tied for third among running backs with 12 touchdowns this season (eight rushing / four receiving).
- ►Green Bay's run game had a breakout performance in the victory over the Vikings in Week 5, recording 156 yards on 28 carries (5.6 avg.) with two touchdowns. Their fourth-highest performance came against Minnesota in Week 12, totaling 155 yards on 32 carries (4.8 avg.).
- ► In Week 14, Green Bay set a season high with 179 yards on 30 carries (6.0 avg.). They followed it up in Week 15 with 158 yards on 25 carries (6.3 avg.) with one touchdown.
- ► Twice this season, Week 7 and Week 14, Lacy and James Starks each averaged over 5 yards a carry and both recorded a rushing touchdown.
- ► Green Bay has utilized the running-back position in the pass game as well:
 - Lacy recorded 123 yards on eight receptions at New Orleans, the second most by a Green Bay running back since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, trailing only Eddie Lee Ivery's 128 yards at Tampa Bay on Oct. 12, 1980.
 - He became the first Green Bay running back to post a 100-yard receiving game since Edgar Bennett (101 yards) on Dec. 18, 1994 (vs. Atlanta).
 - Lacy registered a 67-yard reception against the Saints and a 56-yard touchdown reception versus Chicago to become the first Packers' running back to record 55-yard receptions in consecutive games.
 - Lacy registered 32-yard touchdown reception in a Week 11 victory over Philadelphia.
 - Lacy was the first Packers back ever to record 100 yards from scrimmage and a touchdown reception in three consecutive games (Weeks 10-12).
 - Lacy's four touchdown receptions are the most for a Packers' running back in a single season since Ahman Green had five in 2003.
- Lacy's 182 yards from scrimmage in Week 8 at New Orleans were the most by a Green Bay running back since Najeh Davenport posted 186 vs. St. Louis on Nov. 29, 2004.
- ► In Week 5, Lacy rushed for 105 yards on 13 carries (8.1 avg.) and recorded his second career game with two rushing touchdowns (vs. Pittsburgh, Week 16 in 2013). It was his lowest attempt total in a 100-yard rushing game and his best per-carry average in a game (min. 10 att.).
- ► Lacy recorded the sixth 100-yard rushing game of his career in at Minnesota in Week 12, churning out 125 yards on 25 carries with one rushing touchdown and one receiving touchdown.

- Peppers and Houston Texans DE J.J. Watt are the only players in the NFL this season to have at least one sack (five), a forced fumble (two), a fumble recovery (three), an interception (two) and a defensive touchdown (two).
- ► For the fifth time in his career, Peppers has recorded a sack, an interception, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery in a season (2004 / 2007 / 2009 / 2013 / 2014). 308 AND COUNTING

Another packed house at Lambeau Field against the Falcons in Week 14 this season brought the stadium's consecutive-sellouts streak to 308 regular-season games (not including replacement games).

- ►The league's longest-tenured stadium, Lambeau Field is hosting its 58th season of football in 2014. A total of 701,102 fans made their way through the turnstiles for the nine games (including playoffs) in 2013.
- Across American professional sports, only Boston's Fenway Park (1912) and Chicago's Wrigley Field (1914) have longer tenures.

THE LAMBEAU ADVANTAGE

The crown jewel of the National Football League, Lambeau Field has long been known as one of the tougher venues to play in, particularly during the harsh Wisconsin winter.

- Re-establishing home-field advantage after a 4-4 mark in 2008 was one of the goals of 2009, and with the Packers finishing 6-2 at home, they accomplished that goal. Green Bay followed that up with a 7-1 mark at Lambeau Field in 2010, a perfect 8-0 record in 2011, the first undefeated home mark since 2002, and a 7-1 mark in 2012.
- ► Head Coach Mike McCarthy stated consistently upon his arrival in Green Bay that one of the team's goals would be to reclaim the mystique of playing at Lambeau Field. Mission accomplished. The team is 53-17-1 (.754) at home in the regular-season since 2006.
- Since Ron Wolf and Mike Holmgren began the revitalization of the franchise in 1992, Green Bay owns the best home record in the NFL. A look at the top regular-season home W-L records since the '92 season:

- ► Joined by WR Jordy Nelson as the first duo in franchise history to both catch 10-plus touchdown passes in the same season.
- ▶ Reached the 1,000-yard recieving mark for the first time in his career this season (1,076). He joined Nelson (1,320) as the first Packers' duo since Donald Driver (1,061) and Greg Jennings (1,113) in 2009 to eclipse 1,000 yards receiving each in the same season.

- ► Was the first Packers back to ever to record 100 yards from scrimmage and a touchdown reception in three consecutive games (Weeks 10-12).
- ► Became first Green Bay running back to register receptions of 55 yards or more in consecutive games (2014: at NO and vs. CHI).
- ► His 123 receiving yards at New Orleans in Week 8 this season were the second most by a Green Bay running back since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, trailing only Eddie Lee Ivery's 128 yards at Tampa Bay on Oct. 12, 1980.

- ► Only player in NFL history with at least 10 interceptions and 100 sacks.
- Has been selected to eight Pro Bowls since entering the league in 2002, which ties him with Troy Polamalu and Ray Lewis for the third most among defensive players over that span (Ed Reed, nine/Champ Bailey, 12).
- With eight double-digit sack seasons as a pro, is tied with Jared Allen for the most in the NFL since 2002.
- ► Named first-team All-Pro by *The Associated Press* three times and was selected to the NFL's All-Decade team for the 2000s.

12 AARON RODGERS

- Ranks No. 1 in NFL history with a 105.8 career passer rating.
- Threw six touchdown passes in the first half against the Bears in Week 10 this season, tying Raiders QB Daryle Lamonica (vs. Buffalo, Oct. 19, 1969) for the NFL record for most touchdown passes in a half. It was the second time Rodgers threw for a franchise-best six touchdowns in a game.
- Posted six consecutive zero-interception games this season (Weeks 2-7), tying Bart Starr's franchise record (min. 15 attempts a game) set in 1964.
- ► Joined Patriots QB Tom Brady (2007) as the only players in NFL history to register four straight three-touchdown/zero-interception games in a single season (Weeks 4-7, 2014).
- ►When he hit the 200-TD mark for his career, he had thrown just 53 INTs to that point, the fewest in NFL history as he bested Tom Brady's mark of 88 INTs at the time of his 200th TD pass.

- Ranks fifth in the league in receiving yards (1,320), eighth in receptions (83) and is tied for second in receiving touchdowns (12) this season.

- ▶ With 15 TD catches in 2011, became only the third player in franchise history to catch 15 or more TDs in a season, joining WRs Sterling Sharpe (18 in 1994) and Don Hutson (17 in 1942).
- ▶ Became the first player since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to post three 80-yard TD grabs over an eight-game span in the regular season (Week 16, 2010-Week 6, 2011).

LT David Bakhtiari, 2nd Year, Colorado, D4a-13

Has started every game at LT since the start of the 2013 regular season.

- Started all 16 games at left tackle last season, the only rookie in the NFL to do so in 2013 and the first Packer rookie to do so since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.
- ► Became just the fourth Green Bay rookie to start at LT in the season opener since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger and the first since 1985.
- Earned second-team All-Pacific-12 honors from the conference's coaches each of his last two seasons (sophomore and junior) at Colorado.

LG Josh Sitton, 7th Year, Central Florida, D4b-08

- ► Has started 92 games since 2009, the most by an offensive player in a Green Bay uniform over that span.
- ► Was named to his first career Pro Bowl in 2012, becoming the first Green Bay guard to be selected since Marco Rivera in 2004.
- ► Was named 2010 Offensive Lineman of the Year by the NFL Alumni Association.
- According to STATS LLC, allowed only nine sacks in his first five seasons as a starter (2009-13).
- ► Was the only Packer on either side of the ball to not miss a snap from 2009-10.

C Corey Linsley, Rookie, Ohio State, D5a-14

- First rookie center to start for Green Bay in Week 1 since the merger.
- ► Was one of five team captains and was part of a line that helped the team set school records for points scored (637), yards per carry (6.8), touchdowns (87) and TD passes (38) in '13.
- ► The Ohio native was part of a Buckeye team that won 24 consecutive games from 2012-13.

RG T.J. Lang, 6th Year, Eastern Michigan, D4-09

- Has started games at four different positions on the line as a pro (30 at RG, 27 at LG, five at RT, two at LT). Played C in Week 10 last season.
- ► Has started 60 contests since 2011.
- Started games at both tackle spots in his first season (2009) and became the first Packers rookie to start consecutive games at left tackle since Chad Clifton in 2000.
- Began his college career as a defensive lineman, but converted to the offensive line as a sophomore and started 36 straight games (10 at RT, 26 at LT) over his final three years.

RT Bryan Bulaga, 5th Year, Iowa, D1-10

- Missed the second part of the 2012 season after suffering a hip injury vs. Arizona on Nov. 4 and missed all of the 2013 season after injuring his knee on Aug. 3. Has started all but one game this season.
- Started 37 games at RT in his first three seasons in the league.
- Started the final 12 games of 2010 and the entire postseason at right tackle after taking over for veteran Mark Tauscher (shoulder), the most regularseason starts by a Packers rookie tackle since Tauscher's 14 in 2000.
- ▶ Named to the Pro Football Weekly/PFWA All-Rookie team in 2010.
- Capped his rookie season by becoming the youngest player, according to STATS LLC, to ever start in the Super Bowl (21 years, 322 days).

TE Andrew Quarless, Fifth Year, Penn State, D5a-10

- With Green Bay trailing by four, hauled in the game-winning touchdown with three seconds left at Miami in Week 6.
- ► Has started nine games and has set a single-season career high with three touchdown receptions this season.
- ► Has recorded at least one reception in 13 of 14 games this season.
- ► In 2013, moved into the starting role in Week 8 following TE Jermichael Finley's season-ending neck injury.
- Set career highs in receptions (32), receiving yards (312), games started (10) and games played (16) in 2013.
- At the end of his career at Penn State, held school records for receptions by a tight end in a career (87) and single season (41 in 2009). Finished his career ranked second in school history for receiving yards by a tight end with 1,146.

WR Randall Cobb, 4th Year, Kentucky, D2-11

- ► Is tied for eighth in the NFL with 10 touchdown receptions this season.
- Before suffering a knee injury in Week 6 last season, led the team in receptions with 29 and was No. 2 in receiving yards with 378.
- Set a franchise single-season record with a league-high 2,342 combined net yards in 2012, topping the previous team mark of 2,250 yards by RB Ahman Green in 2003.
- ► With 954 receiving yards and 964 kickoff return yards in 2012, he became the first player in NFL history to post 900-plus yards in each category in the same season.
- ► Led the team in receptions (80) and receiving yards (954) in 2012 and finished second on the squad in TD catches (eight).

QB Aaron Rodgers, 10th Year, California, D1-05

- ► His career passer rating of 105.8 ranks No. 1 in NFL history.
- Ranks No. 1 in the NFL this season in passer rating (111.2), touchdown percentage (7.6), interception percentage (1.1) and is No. 3 in touchdown passes (35).
- Posted 21,332 passing yards from 2008-12, which ranks No. 1 in league history for the most passing yards by a QB in his first five seasons as a starter (previous record was Peyton Manning, 20,618, 1998-2002).
- In 101 regular-season starts (68-33 record), has posted 39 games with 300-plus passing yards, 58 without an interception and 59 with a 100plus passer rating (min. 15 attempts).
- In 2011, set an NFL record with a 122.5 passer rating and set franchise marks for TD passes (45), passing yards (4,643), completion percentage (68.3), yards per attempt (9.25) and 300-yard games (eight) on his way to earning NFL Most Valuable Player honors from *The Associated Press*.

RB Eddie Lacy, 2nd Year, Alabama, D2-13

- ► Tied for No. 3 among running backs with 12 touchdowns this season (eight rushing / four receiving).
- Ranked No. 1 in the league among rookies and No. 8 among all players with 1,178 rushing yards last season, despite missing one full game and nearly all of another due to a concussion.
- ▶ Ranks No. 1 in franchise history for the most rushing yards by a rookie in a single season, No. 1 in attempts (284), and tied for No. 1 for most 100-yard rushing games with four (John Brockington, four in 1971).
- Became the first Green Bay rookie RB to be selected to the Pro Bowl since Brockington in 1971 and was named Rookie of the Year by PFWA.

FB John Kuhn, 9th Year, Shippensburg, W-07 (Pit)

- Has played in 121 of 126 games (132 of 137 including playoffs) during his six-plus seasons in Green Bay, appearing in all 16 regular-season contests in four of those seasons.
- Selected to the Pro Bowl in 2011, becoming the first Green Bay fullback to be honored since William Henderson in 2004.
- Only player on the team to have a rushing and receiving touchdown each season from 2008-11, and was the first Packer to achieve that feat since RB Ahman Green (2001-04).
- Led the team with four rushing TDs in 2011 and led the running backs with six total TDs.

PACKERS STARTERS – DEFENSE

LDE Datone Jones, 2nd Year, UCLA, D1-13

- Overcame an ankle injury during the preseason to play in all 16 games in 2013.
- ► Rotated at defensive end and as one of the interior rushers in the team's sub-defenses, recording 3.5 sacks.
- Blocked an extra point at Cincinnati in Week 3 last year.
- ► Was the first UCLA defensive lineman selected in the first round since DT Manu Tuiasosopo in 1979 (No. 18 overall, Seattle).

NT Letroy Guion, 7th Year, Florida State, FA-14

- ► Signed with Green Bay this past offseason after spending his first six NFL seasons with the Minnesota Vikings after being selected in the fifth round of the 2008 NFL Draft.
- Started all 28 games he appeared in for Minnesota over the past two seasons, recording 72 tackles (32 solo) and three sacks over that span.
- ► Was the only Viking to block a field goal in both 2011 and 2012.

RDE Mike Daniels, 3rd Year, Iowa, D4a-12

- ► Ranks second on the team with 10.5 sacks since the start of the 2013 regular season (LB Clay Matthews-15).
- Played in all 16 games with one start last season and ranked No. 2 on the team with a career-high 6.5 sacks. Was tied for No. 6 in the NFL in sacks among defensive tackles.
- Returned a fumble 43 yards for a TD vs. Detroit in Week 14 of 2012, the longest fumble return for a TD by a rookie in franchise history.
- Starred as an interior pass rusher at Iowa, posting a team-high 24.5 tackles for a loss and 13 sacks from 2010-11.

LOLB Clay Matthews, 6th Year, Southern California, D1b-09

- ► Tied for No. 7 in the NFL since entering the league in 2009 with 57.5 sacks. His sack total ranks No. 3 in team history (since 1982).
- Became the first Packer in team history to earn Pro Bowl recognition in each of his first four seasons in the NFL (2009-12).
- ▶ Is the only player in franchise history to score a defensive TD (interception or fumble return) in each of his first three seasons in the NFL (2009-11).
- ▶ Named first-team All-Pro by *The Associated Press* in 2010, the first Green Bay LB to earn that honor since Tim Harris in 1989. Finished second to Pittsburgh safety Troy Polamalu in the *AP*'s Defensive Player of the Year voting.

BLB A.J. Hawk, 9th Year, Ohio State, D1-06

- Ranks No. 1 in franchise history (since 1975) with 1,112 tackles.
- ► His 87 tackles this season rank No. 3 on the team. Led the team with 153 tackles (112 solo) last season and was tied for No. 3 on the club with a career-high five sacks.
- ► Has either led the team or finished second in tackles in six of his seven seasons in Green Bay. Led the team with 142 tackles (105 solo) in 2012.
- ► Has appeared in 140 of a possible 142 regular-season games in his career, starting 136 of 140.
- Has posted 1,112 tackles (795 solo), 17.0 sacks, nine interceptions, 39 passes defensed, three forced fumbles and five fumble recoveries during his career.

MLB Sam Barrington, 2nd Year, South Florida, D7c-13

- Has provided depth at inside linebacker this season, starting five games and registering a career-best 52 tackles and one sack.
- ► Appeared in seven games as a rookie in 2013, seeing time exclusively on special teams.
- Sustained a season-ending hamstring injury vs. Chicago in Week 9 last year.
- Earned second-team All-Big East recognition as a senior in 2012 after posting a career-high 80 tackles (49 solo), including 6.5 tackles for loss, 3.5 sacks sacks, two forced fumbles and three passes defensed.

ROLB Julius Peppers, 13th Year, North Carolina, FA-14

- Signed with Green Bay during the offseason after playing the last four seasons for Chicago and the first eight of his career for Carolina after being selected as the No. 2 overall pick in 2002.
- First player in NFL history with 10 interceptions and at least 100 sacks.
- ► Has been selected to the Pro Bowl eight times (2004-06, 2008-12) and has been named first-team All-Pro by *The Associated Press* three times (2004, 2006, 2010). Was named to the NFL's All-Decade Team for the 2000s.
- ► Has played in 110 consecutive regular-season games.
- Ranks No. 3 in the league in sacks (123.5) and No. 3 in forced fumbles (42) since entering the NFL in 2002. His sack total ranks No. 16 in NFL history (since 1982).
- Has blocked 13 kicks (12 field goals, one extra point) during his career.

LCB Tramon Williams, 8th Year, Louisiana Tech, FA-06

- ► Ranks No. 2 in the league in interceptions (22) and ranks No. 4 in the NFL in INT return yards (325) since 2010 (including playoffs).
- ► Started all 16 games last season and led the secondary with a careerhigh 91 tackles (68 solo) and a career-best 2.5 sacks. Added three interceptions, two fumble recoveries, two forced fumbles and 14 passes defensed.
- ► Despite suffering a shoulder injury in the 2011 season opener, went on to start 15 games that season and post career highs for tackles (65) and passes defensed (24). Also added four interceptions.
- ▶ With three interceptions during the 2010 playoffs, tied Joe Laws (1944) and Craig Newsome (1996) for the franchise single-postseason record.

RCB Sam Shields, 5th Year, Miami, FA-10

- Started all 14 games he appeared in last season and led the team with four INTs (tied career high) and a career-best 25 passes defensed.
- ► Was limited to 10 games with eight starts in 2012 due to injury, but registered 38 tackles (28 solo), three interceptions, 15 passes defensed (No. 3 on the team) and a sack.
- Made an impact in 2010 after making the team as a non-drafted rookie, earning the nickel CB job despite playing the position only one season in college.
- In Green Bay's NFC Championship win over Chicago in the 2010 season, became the first rookie in NFL history to record two INTs and a sack in a postseason contest.

SS Morgan Burnett, 5th Year, Georgia Tech, D3-10

- ► Leads the team with 110 tackles this season, the second most of his career (137 in 2012). Ranked No. 2 on the team with 106 tackles (77 solo) in 2013, despite missing the first three games due to injury. Recovered three fumbles, including one for a TD, and added nine passes defensed.
- ► Participated in all 1,088 plays for Green Bay's defense in 2012, one of only four non-offensive linemen in the NFL to appear in 100 percent of his team's snaps.
- ► Enjoyed his first full season as a pro in 2011, joining DT B.J. Raji as the only two Green Bay defensive players to start all 16 regular-season games.
- ► Started the first four games of the 2010 season at SS before sustaining a season-ending knee injury vs. Detroit in Week 4.

FS Ha Ha Clinton-Dix, Rookie, Alabama, D1-14

- ► Has started eight of 14 games this season, ranking second on the team in tackles (89).
- ► Was the second safety ever drafted by Green Bay in the first round (Alabama S George Teague, No. 29 overall in 1993).
- ► Was a consensu All-America selection in 2013 as a junior, earning first-team recognition from The Associated Press, the Football Writers Association of America and Sporting News.

SEATTLE - The Super Bowl champion Seattle Seahawks started 2014 the same way they finished last season, with a convincing win. Marshawn Lynch rushed for 110 yards and a pair of touchdowns, Percy Harvin had 100 combined yards rushing and receiving, and the Seahawks stymied Aaron Rodgers up-tempo offense in a 36-16 win over the Green Bay Packers to kick off the regular season. The Seahawks unveiled the first Super Bowl banner in franchise history during a brief pregame ceremony and then began the process of trying to be the first team in a decade to repeat. Their effort against the Packers - a popular pick to contend in the NC - will only reinforce the belief Seattle is still the favorite. Russell Wilson mas outstanding in the first halt, including a 33-yard touchdown pass to Ricardo Lockette. Harvin got touches as a receiver, running back and returner. He was used all over the field in different formations after never being fully healthy in his first season with Seattle. Wilson finished 19 of 28 for 191 yards passing and Lynch was at his best. Pete Caroll said earlier this week that Lynch appeared in the best shape of his career, and it showed. Lynch averaged 5.5 yards per carry and topped 100 yards for the 20th time in the regular season since joining the Seahawks in 2010. 17 Davante Adams, WR, Rookie, Fresno State

• Led the nation in receptions (131) and receptions per game (10.1), while ranking second in the country in receiving yards (1,718) and receiving yards per game (132.2) as a sophomore in 2013.

• Caught 24 TD passes in '13, eight more than any player in the country and the most in school and Mountain West Conference history.

• Set Fresno State career records for receptions (233) and TD catches (38), despite playing just two seasons for the Bulldogs.

2014 Season: Has played in all 14 games with nine starts (as the third WR), and has 36 catches for 429 yards (11.9 avg.) and three TDs.

► at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Saw time on offense and special teams, appearing on nine offensive snaps and nine plays on special teams.

▶vs. N.Y. Jets (9/14): Appeared on 36 snaps on offense and posted five catches for 50 yards (10.0 avg.)...Late in the first half, caught a 24-yard pass down to the Jets' 6-yard line to convert a third-and-10, helping to set up a Randall Cobb 6-yard TD catch two plays later.

▶at Miami Dolphins (10/12): Started for the second straight week as the Packers opened with three WRs, and posted a career-high six receptions for a career-best 77 yards (12.8 avg.) on a career-high 62 snaps, with five of his six grabs going for first downs...Posted a career-long 24-yard reception in the third quarter...Caught a pass from Rodgers at the Miami 37, eluded a tackle attempt by CB Cortland Finnegan, and took it 19 more yards down to the Miami 18, helping set up Rodgers' 5-yard TD pass to WR Randall Cobb...On the Packers' game-winning TD drive with the clock ticking down caught a quick pass off the line from Rodgers after the QB did a fake spike with 12 seconds remaining, and made a move on Finnegan on the sideline to pick up 12 yards down to the Miami 4 with six seconds remaining...The catch set up Rodgers' game-winning 4-yard TD pass to TE Andrew Quarless on the next play.

►vs. Carolina Panthers (10/19): Started as the third wide receiver for the third straight week and caught a 21-yard TD pass over the middle from Rodgers early in the third quarter to give Green Bay a 35-3 lead...Found an opening in the middle of the field near the Carolina 10-yard line, where he caught the pass before taking it in for the score.

► at New Orleans Saints (10/26): Opened the game as the third wide receiver and posted a career-high seven receptions for 75 yards (10.7 avg.), with four of his seven grabs on the night going for first downs.

▶vs. Chicago Bears (11/9): Started and played 38 snaps, catching one pass for 10 yards.

▶vs. Philadelphia Eagles (11/16): Started as the third wideout and caught two passes for 13 yards (6.5 avg.), highlighted by a 6-yard TD catch in the first quarter...Split out wide right and matched up with CB Bradley Fletcher, ran a slant for the TD, absorbing a hit from S Malcolm Jenkins after he made the catch...Blocked S Chris Maragos to help clear a lane for DB Micah Hyde on his 75-yard punt return for a TD in the second quarter.

► at Minnesota Vikings (11/23): Started for the sixth straight game and played 46 snaps...Caught one pass for 10 yards.

▶vs. New England Patriots (11/30): Started and appeared on 59 snaps...Finished with a career-high 121 yards receiving on six catches (20.2 avg.), the best receiving-yardage total posted by a Green Bay rookie since Sterling Sharpe's 124-yard effort vs. Detroit on Nov. 20, 1988... third-and-2...On the catch, used an out-and-up move on CB Logan Ryan and then caught a perfectly thrown pass from Rodgers down the sideline for the big gain...The reception set up Rodgers' 32-yard TD pass to TE Richard Rodgers on the next play to put Green Bay up 13-0...Earlier in the first quarter, broke his route up the field to free himself from Ryan as a scrambling Rodgers found him for a 33-yard gain down the left sideline.

▶vs. Atlanta Falcons (12/8): Started and played 49 snaps...Caught one pass for 6 yards.

► at Buffalo Bills (12/14): Started and played 64 snaps...Caught one pass for 6 yards.

69 David Bakhtiari, T, 2nd Year, Colorado

• Started every game at left tackle for the Packers in 2013, becoming the first rookie to do so for Green Bay since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.

• By starting at San Francisco last season in Week 1, he became just the fourth Green Bay rookie to start the season opener at LT since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger and the first since Ken Ruettgers in 1985.

• Was the only NFL rookie to start all 16 games at left tackle in 2013.

2014 Season: Has started all 14 games at LT...Part of an offense that ranks No. 2 in the NFL in points per game (31.1) and No. 6 in the league in yards per game (383.6).

►at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Opened at LT and played all 62 snaps.

▶vs. N.Y. Jets (9/14): Played all 71 snaps and protected QB Aaron Rodgers as he threw for 346 yards, the most posted by a QB against the Jets since Saints QB Drew Brees threw for 382 last season in Week 9.

►at Detroit Lions (9/21): Started and played all 53 snaps.

► at Chicago Bears (9/28): Appeared on all 52 snaps and helped protect Rodgers as he threw for 302 yards and four TDs on 22-of-28 passing for a 151.2 passer rating, the third-best single-game mark of Rodgers' career (min. 20 attempts) and the fifth-best rating in franchise history... Part of a line that allowed just one sack for 0 yards on the afternoon and helped the offense score on six of seven possessions.

▶vs. Minnesota Vikings (10/2): Helped the offense rack up 42 points and a season-high 156 rushing yards on 28 attempts (5.6 avg.), including RB Eddie Lacy's season-best 105 yards and two TDs on 13 carries (8.1 avg.)...Lacy's average of 8.1 yards per carry was a career high (min. 10 attempts) and was the best average by a Green Bay RB in a 100-yard game since Brandon Jackson rushed for 115 yards on 10 attempts (11.5 avg.) at Washington on Oct. 10, 2010...Sealed DE Everson Griffen to help create a lane for Lacy on his season-long 28-yard run in the first quarter...Played 44 of 54 offensive snaps, departing with just over 10 minutes remaining (coach's decision) and the Packers leading 42-10.

► at Miami Dolphins (10/12): Appeared on all 80 snaps and was part of a line that helped the Green Bay offense rack up a season-high 27 first downs, 369 total yards and a 37:12 time of possession, the best mark posted by the Packers since Week 8 last season at Minnesota (40:54).

▶vs. Carolina Panthers (10/19): Started and helped the offense score TDs on four of its first five possessions as Green Bay got out to a 28-0 lead...Blocked for Rodgers as he completed 19 of 22 passes for 255 yards and three TDs, a career-high completion percentage of 86.4 and a passer rating of 154.5 that was the second best of his career (min. 20 attempts)... Played 49 of 58 offensive snaps, departing after the Packers' final drive of the third quarter (coach's decision).

►at New Orleans Saints (10/26): Played all 68 snaps and helped protect Rodgers on his way to 418 yards on 28-of-39 passing, the secondbest yardage output of the QB's career and tied for the third-best total in franchise history...Helped Lacy (123) and WR Randall Cobb (126) become the first Green Bay RB/WR duo to both post 100 yards receiving in the same game since RB Eddie Lee Ivery (128) and WR Aundra Thompson (102) did so at Tampa Bay on Oct. 12, 1980.

▶vs. Chicago Bears (11/9): Started and played 54 snaps, helping the offense rack up 55 points, which is tied for the third most in franchise

history, and 451 total yards...Part of a line that didn't allow a sack and helped Rodgers throw for six TDs, which tied the single-game franchise record, with all of them coming in the first half as he tied Raiders QB Daryle Lamonica (1969) for the most in a first half in NFL history...Helped the offense score TDs on each of its first five possessions on the way to a 42-0 halftime lead, which tied the second-biggest halftime lead in league history.

▶vs. Philadelphia Eagles (11/16): Started and played 57 snaps, departing in the fourth quarter (coach's decision) with the Packers holding a 53-20 lead...Helped the offense register 475 total yards, its second-highest output of the season, and 53 points as the Packers posted back-to-back 50-point games for the first time in franchise history...Protected Rodgers as he was sacked just once and as he threw for 341 yards and three TDs with no INTs, his seventh game on the season with three-plus TDs/zero INTs (tied for second in NFL history behind only Tom Brady's eight in 2007).

►at Minnesota Vikings (11/23): Started and played all 65 snaps as part of a line that allowed just one sack, bringing Green Bay's total to two sacks given up in the last three games...Helped clear the way for Lacy's season-high 125 rushing yards on 25 carries (5.0 avg.), with 55 of those coming in the fourth quarter, a career high for Lacy...With the Packers leading 24-21, cleared holes for Lacy to rush for 27 yards on five carries as Green Bay ran out the final 3:23 on the clock to clinch the win.

▶vs. New England Patriots (11/30): Started and played all 73 snaps as the offense racked up 478 total yards, the most given up by New England on the season...Protected Rodgers as he threw for 368 yards (a season high at home) and two TDs on 24-of-38 passing, highlighted by 282 yards passing in the first half alone, Rodgers' fourth 275-yard first half in the last five games...Also helped clear the way for Lacy's 98 rushing yards on 21 carries (4.7 avg.), including four runs of 10-plus yards... Delivered a block on LB Akeem Ayers to help create a gaping hole for Lacy on his game-long 24-yard run on Green Bay's opening drive.

▶vs. Atlanta Falcons (12/8): Started and appeared on all 68 snaps, helping the offense rack up season highs for total yards (502) and first downs (28)...Helped clear the way for a season-best 179 rushing yards on 30 attempts (6.0 avg), highlighted by a pair of 70-yard rushers in RBs James Starks (75 yards on 10 carries) and Lacy (73 yards on 13 carries)... • Was limited to just six games in 2013 due to a knee injury. Through Week 6, led the team in receptions with 29 and ranked No. 2 in receiving yards with 378.

• Set a franchise single-season record with a league-high 2,342 combined net yards in 2012, topping the previous team mark of 2,250 yards by RB Ahman Green in 2003.

• With 954 receiving yards and 964 kickoff return yards in 2012, became the first player in NFL history to post 900-plus yards in each category in the same season.

• Ranked No. 2 in the NFL in kickoff return average (27.7) in 2011, setting a franchise rookie record with 941 kickoff return yards on the season.

2014 Season: Has started all 14 games and has 76 catches for a careerhigh 1,076 yards (14.2 avg.) and a career-best 10 TDs...Is tied for No. 8 in the league in TD catches...Five of his 10 TD catches have come on third down, which is tied with three other players for the league lead... Has caught 25 passes for 424 yards (17.0 avg.) on third down, which is tied for the fifth-most receptions in the league on third down...Has eight TD grabs in the red zone, which is tied for No. 2 in the league behind only Broncos TE Julius Thomas (nine)...Of his 76 receptions, 60 have gone for first downs, a 78.9 percentage that leads the team and ranks No. 7 in the NFL...Has returned 12 punts for 110 yards (9.2 avg.) and has 31 rushing yards on 10 carries (3.1 avg.).

▶vs. Minnesota Vikings (10/2): Tied for the team lead with three receptions for 34 yards (11.3 avg.), highlighted by his 8-yard TD catch in the first quarter that started the Green Bay scoring...Lined up in the slot, made a move in the end zone to shed CB Captain Munnerlyn for the 8-yard scoring grab...The TD was his sixth of the season as he became the first Green Bay player since Howton (seven) in 1956 to post six or more receiving TDs in the first five games of a season.

► at Miami Dolphins (10/12): Caught five passes for 58 yards (11.6 avg.), including a 5-yard TD catch late in the third quarter that put Green Bay up 17-10...Working against S Louis Delmas in the end zone on third down, cut to the right and then back to the left to free himself as Rodgers scrambled and found him for the score.

▶vs. Carolina Panthers (10/19): Led the team in both catches (six) and receiving yards (121)...The 121 yards receiving was the second-best total of his career, trailing only his 128-yard output vs. Washington (Sept. 15, 2013)...His average of 20.2 yards per catch was a career high in games with five or more receptions...Had a season-long 47-yard grab in the second quarter, lining up in the slot and running to the flat before moving back to find a hole in the Carolina defense...Caught the pass near midfield, made

►at New Orleans Saints (10/26): Led the team with 126 receiving yards on five grabs (25.2 avg.), highlighted by a career-long 70-yard TD reception on Green Bay's first possession of the game...On third-and-10 at the Green Bay 30, adjusted his route and headed up field as Rodgers scrambled, getting behind CB Keenan Lewis near the sideline and making the catch at the New Orleans 35...Outran Lewis and S Rafael Bush the rest of the way for his career-high ninth TD of the season, surpassing his previous season high (eight in 2012) in just the eighth game of the season...It marked his fifth consecutive game with a TD catch, the first Packer to do so since WR Greg Jennings in 2007...Finished the first quarter with 101 yards receiving on three receptions, the best receiving-yardage total by a Packer in a first quarter since WR Donald Driver registered 111 yards on three grabs (37.0 avg.) at Chicago on Oct. 7, 2002.

▶vs. Chicago Bears (11/9): Caught four passes for 72 yards (18.0 avg.), including a leaping left-handed 18-yard TD catch from Rodgers with CB Demontre Hurst covering him near the end of the first half that put Green Bay up 42-0 at the break...It marked his sixth consecutive game with a TD catch, which is tied for the third-longest streak in franchise history, and he became the first Green Bay player to accomplish the feat since WR Sterling Sharpe did so in six straight in 1994.

▶vs. Philadelphia Eagles (11/16): Posted career highs in both receptions (10) and receiving yards (129), eclipsing his previous highs of nine catches (three times) and 128 yards (vs. Washington, 9/15/13)...Nine of his 10 catches went for first downs, the most by a Packer since WR Javon Walker registered the same number vs. Jacksonville on Dec. 19, 2004... Had three receptions of 20-plus yards (22, 22, 20), with the first 22-yarder converting a third-and-9 in the first quarter...With Rodgers scrambling to the right, made a move to free himself from CB Bradley Fletcher and made a leaping grab near the sideline to pick up the first down...Finished with three receptions for 47 yards (15.7 avg.) on third down on the afternoon, with all three grabs picking up first downs.

►at Minnesota Vikings (11/23): Caught four passes for 58 yards (14.5 avg.), his sixth straight game with 50-plus receiving yards...Caught a 29-yard pass over the middle from Rodgers late in the first quarter to convert a third-and-10 with CB Captain Munnerlyn covering him closely.

• Set an NFL record with 1,025 points in his first eight seasons (2007-14), topping the previous league record held by New England K Stephen Gostkowski (1,023, 2006-13).

• With 1,025 career points, ranks No. 2 on the all-time franchise scoring list behind only K Ryan Longwell (1,054).

• Is one of only three players in NFL history to register three or more 140point seasons (Stephen Gostkowski, David Akers).

• Has kicked the six longest field goals in franchise history (58-yarder in 2011, two 57-yarders in 2013, 56-yarders in 2010 and 2011, 55-yarder in 2014).

• Ranks No. 1 in team annals with 23 field goals of 50-plus yards. Has made nine field goals of 50-plus yards since 2013, which is tied for No. 3 in the NFL over that span.

• Set a franchise record with 23 consecutive field goals made (Week 13, 2010-Week 12, 2011), topping Chris Jacke's mark of 17 straight in 1993. **2014 Season:** Has connected on 25 of 29 field-goal attempts and 47 of 49 extra points (two blocks) for 122 points on the season...Is tied for No. 4 in the league in scoring...Has connected on four of six attempts from 50-plus yards (55, 53, 52, 53)...Is tied for No. 7 in the league with the four FGs of 50-plus yards...Has recorded 37 touchbacks on 89 kickoffs (41.6 percent) and has made two tackles on special teams.

► at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Connected on his lone field-goal attempt of the evening, a 23-yarder in the second quarter, to bring his streak of consecutive regular-season field goals made to 15 (ties Chris Jacke, 1989-90, for the third-longest streak in franchise history)...Also marked his franchise-record 16th straight regular-season game with at least one field goal, surpassing Longwell's record of 15 (2004-05)...Added two touchbacks on four kickoffs.

• Appeared in 14 games as a rookie in 2012 and finished with 19 tackles (11 solo), two sacks, a team-high two fumble recoveries (one for a TD) and a pass defensed.

2014 Season: Has started all 14 games and leads the defensive line with 61 tackles (36 solo)...Leads the defensive line and ranks No. 3 on the team with four sacks...Is tied for the team lead with 16 QB hits and ranks No. 1 on the club with 18 pressures.

► at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Started at RDE and registered a careerhigh eight tackles (five solo), which was tied for the team lead.

►vs. N.Y. • Has posted eight double-digit sack seasons since 2002, which is tied with Bears DE Jared Allen for No. 1 in the league over that span.

2014 Season: Has started all 14 games and has posted 43 tackles (31 solo), five sacks, two interceptions (both returned for TDs), 13 QB hits, 14 pressures, nine passes defensed, a team-high three forced fumbles and a team-best three fumble recoveries...Is tied for the NFL lead with the two INT TDs (four others)...Ranks No. 10 in the NFL among all players and No. 1 among linebackers/defensive linemen with 101 interception return yards...Ranks No. 3 on the team in both QB hits and pressures...Is also tied with CB Casey Hayward for the team lead with five takeaways (three fumble recoveries, two INTs)...Joins Texans DE J.J. 2014 Season: Has started all 12 games he has played in at RCB and has posted 41 tackles (31 solo), two interceptions and 12 passes defensed (No. 2 on the team)...Part of a secondary that has helped Green Bay rank No. 8 in opponent passer rating (83.2) this season.

► at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Appeared on all 70 defensive plays, recording three tackles (one solo) and a team-high two passes defensed.
