

PACKERS HOST COWBOYS IN DIVISIONAL CONTEST

Green Bay will play Dallas in the postseason for the seventh time and the first time since 1996. This will be only the second time the Packers have played against the Cowboys at home in the playoffs.



- The only time Dallas visited Green Bay in the postseason was for the 1967 NFL Championship, most commonly known as the 'Ice Bowl.' Kickoff temperature was recorded as minus-13 with a minus-46 wind chill, the coldest game in league annals. Bart Starr's game-winning TD, a 1-yard dive with 13 seconds left, sealed Green Bay's third straight championship en route to its second consecutive Super Bowl title.
- ►The two storied franchises both rank in the top four in postseason victories (Dallas-34 / Pittsburgh-33 / Green Bay-30 / San Francisco-30).
- Sunday will be the first playoff game in NFL history with a team that finished 8-0 at home during the regular season hosting a team that was 8-0 on the road during the regular season.
- It will only be the third NFL playoff game with a team that was undefeated at home during the regular season hosting a team that was undefeated on the road (1948: 6-0 Chicago Cardinals at 6-0 Philadelphia Eagles / 1972: 7-0 Miami Dolphins at 7-0 Pittsburgh Steelers).
- ► Green Bay is 15-16 against the Dallas in the overall series, but has won three straight over the Cowboys, including the last matchup, 37-36, at Dallas last season.
- ▶Of the Cowboys' 13 road games against the Packers, only one has taken place in December or January, the 'Ice Bowl' on Dec. 31, 1967. This will be the latest date Dallas has played at Green Bay.
- ►The Packers have won four of the last five against the Cowboys at Lambeau Field, scoring over 40 points in three of the wins.
- Green Bay is 16-5 all-time at home during the postseason. The Packers' 16 postseason wins at home are the fifth most in the NFL.
- The Packers enter the postseason having won their last two games and seven of the final eight.
- Dating back to 1978, Green Bay's seven wins in Games 9-16 are tied for the most by the Packers (1984, 1997, 2009, 2011).
- ► Green Bay and Seattle were the only teams to go 7-1 over the final eight games of the 2014 regular season.

BACK IN THE POSTSEASON

Green Bay's 30th postseason berth in team history marks the franchise's 17th appearance in the last 22 seasons and the seventh in nine seasons under McCarthy.

- The Packers are the only team in the NFC to win its division each of the last four seasons (2011-14) and one of only three NFL teams to do so over that span (Denver, New England).
- Green Bay tied a franchise record with its sixth consecutive playoff berth (1993-98).
- The Packers join the Patriots as the only teams to make the playoffs each of the last six years.

WITH THE CALL

FOX Sports, now in its 21st season as an NFL network television partner, will broadcast the game to a national audience.



- ► Play-by-play man Joe Buck joins analyst Troy Aikman with Erin Andrews and Chris Myers reporting from the sidelines.
- ▶ Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since November 1929, heads up the Packers Radio Network that is made up of 50 stations in five states. Wayne Larrivee (play-by-play) and two-time Packers Pro Bowler Larry McCarren (analyst) call the action. McCarren first joined the team's broadcasts in 1995 and enters his 20th season calling Packers' games. McCarren, who is in his 26th year in Green Bay television, has four times been voted Wisconsin Sportscaster of the Year by the National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association. After originally being paired together in 1999, McCarren and Larrivee enter their 16th season of broadcasts together.
- ► Westwood One will air the game across the country. Kevin Harlan (play-by-play) and Dan Fouts (analyst) will call the action with Hub Arkush (sideline) while Scott Graham will host pre-game and halftime shows.
- ► The broadcast is also available on Sirius Satellite Radio (WTMJ feed) as part of the network's NFL Sunday Drive.
- ► The game will broadcast across the country in Spanish on ESPN Deportes with Kenneth Garay (play-by-play) and Sebastian Martinez Christensen (analyst) calling the action.

A HISTORY OF SUCCESS

With their 20-3 victory at Tampa Bay in Week 16, the Packers secured their 30th postseason berth in the history of the franchise, third most in league annals:

► Green Bay has now made the postseason each of the last six seasons, joining New England as the only team in the league to accomplish that feat each year from 2009-14. The streak of six consecutive postseason appearances is **tied for No. 1 in team history**:

HOW THEY HAVE FARED

Since the NFL went to a 12-team playoff format in 1990, the Packers have been the No. 2 seed in the NFC three times (1997, 2007, 2014).

- ► This will be the fifth time that the Packers have earned a bye to the divisional round in their 17 playoff appearances since 1990. Green Bay has a 2-2 mark under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** in divisional playoff games.
- ► A breakdown of the Packers' playoff seeds, and their postseason record as that seed, from 1990-2013:

POSTSEASON PROFICIENCY

As productive as QB **Aaron Rodgers** has been during the regular season in his seven years as the starter, he has also carried that over to the playoffs.

- ▶ Rodgers capped off the 2010 postseason with a 304-yard, three-TD effort vs. Pittsburgh that earned him Super Bowl MVP honors. He became just the **fourth quarterback in NFL history** to throw for 300 yards and three TDs with no INTs in a Super Bowl, joining Joe Montana, Steve Young and Jake Delhomme.
- ▶ Rodgers has posted a 110-plus passer rating in four of his eight career postseason starts. That already **ties him for sixth in league history** behind Montana (six in 23 starts), Tom Brady (six in 26 starts), Brett Favre (five in 24 starts), Troy Aikman (five in 16 starts) and Terry Bradshaw (five in 19 starts).



GOOD SECOND HALF

The Packers' 12-win regular season was fueled by winning seven of the final eight games. It was the third time Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** guided the Packers to a 7-1 record in the second half of the regular season (2009, 2011).

- ▶ Dating back to 1978, when the NFL went to a 16-game schedule, RB **Eddie Lacy's** nine touchdowns in the final eight games of the season are tied for the second most by a Packers' player (Ahman Green: nine in 2003 and 10 in 2000).
- ► Green Bay rushed for 1,137 yards in the final eight games of the season, the fourth most by the Packers since 1978.
- ► Lacy rushed for 592 yards on 117 attempts (5.1 avg.) over the final six games, No. 3 in the NFL over that span behind only Broncos RB C.J. Anderson (648) and Cowboys RB DeMarco Murray (612).
- ► Lacy's 929 yards from scrimmage in the final eight regular-season games are the fourth most by a Packers' player since 1978 and the most since Ahman Green's 1,098 in 2003.
- ►The Packers' offensive line allowed the second-fewest sacks (nine) in the final eight games this season behind only Denver (eight in final eight). Dating back to 1983, it tied for the second fewest Green Bay had allowed in Games 9-16 (2007, six / 2004, nine).
- ▶ Dating back to 1982, LB **Clay Matthews**' 8.5 sacks in Games 9-16 tied Ezra Johnson (1983) for the third most in the second half of the regular season in franchise history, and were the most since DE Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila had 11.0 in 2004. Matthews tied for the fifth most in the NFL this season in Games 9-16.
- ▶ Over the last eight games of the regular season, Green Bay's defense ranked in the top 10 in rushing yards allowed (691, sixth), rushing average (3.60, seventh) and rushing touchdowns (two, tied for first).

BREAKING DOWN THE ROSTER

The Packers' active roster is composed of 24 offensive players, 26 defensive players and three specialists.

- ▶ Of the 53 players on Green Bay's roster, 32 of them (60.4 percent) were draft picks of the Packers.
- ► Green Bay has 19 players on the roster that began their careers as non-drafted free agents, with nine of those originally signed by Green Bay.
- ► Almost 50 percent of the players (26 of 53, 49.1%) on Green Bay's roster entered the league as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as a non-drafted player.
- ► The Packers have 12 players on the roster that played in the NFL prior to the 2009 season, and six of those players began their pro careers as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as a non-drafted player (QB Matt Flynn, K Mason Crosby, CB Tramon Williams, CB Jarrett Bush, FB John Kuhn, LS Brett Goode).
- ► Of the 53 players on the roster, 41 began their pro careers with the Packers (77.4 percent).



HOME SWEET HOME

Green Bay excelled at Lambeau Field this season, finishing 8-0 at home for the second time in the last 12 seasons (2011) and the fifth time since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger (1996-97, 2002).

- ► The Packers were one of two teams to go undefeated at home during the 2014 regular season season (Denver).
- ► Under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**, Green Bay is 54-17-1 at home during the regular season. The Packers' .757 winning percentage ranks **No. 3 in the NFL** over that span:

- ► In the final seven home games, the Packers outscored opponents 93-7 in the first quarter and 189-30 in the first half.
- ▶ Green Bay led the NFL with 288 points scored at home during the 2014 regular season. It is the third-most points scored at home during the regular season in NFL history:

► The Packers were one of three teams in the NFL with a home point differential over 100 at home during the regular season:

- ► Green Bay's plus-155 point differential at home was the highest in franchise history (dating back to 1940), eclipsing the +151 in 1996.
- ► The Packers scored more than 40 points in four home games this season, which tied New England for the NFL lead in 2014. They were one behind the most by a Green Bay team since 1940 (five in 2011).
- ► Green Bay scored more than 30 points in each of the first five home games (31, 42, 38, 55, 53). Dating back to 1921, it was the first time the Packers registered at least 30 points in each of their first five home games.
- ► The Packers finished the regular season with seven 30-plus point games at home to lead the NFL and tie 2011 for the most by a Packers' team (dating back to 1940).
- ► Under McCarthy, Green Bay has scored 30-plus points at home 35 times, winning 33 of those contests. The Packers' 35 home games with at least 30 points are the third most in the league since 2006 (NO, 35 / NE, 38).

►The Packers had a plus-nine turnover ratio at home during the 2014 regular season to tie for the NFL lead:

- ▶QB Aaron Rodgers threw 24 touchdowns with zero interceptions on 240 attempts, joining Patriots QB Tom Brady (241 attempts in 2003) as the only QBs in NFL history to throw 200-plus passes at home in a season with no interceptions.
- ▶ Rodgers recorded a passer rating of 133.2 at home during the 2014 regular season, the highest in NFL history:

MIKE McCARTHY...Is in his ninth year as the Packers' 14th head coach.

- ▶ Joined Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl title with a win over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.
- ► Led the Packers to their sixth consecutive playoff appearance this season, joining New England as the only two NFL teams to do so over that span. Has also led the team to seven playoff appearances in the last eight years (2007, 2009-14).
- ► Has guided the Packers to top-10 finishes in scoring each of the past eight seasons (2007-14), joining the Patriots as the only other team to accomplish the feat.
- ► His .656 winning percentage during the regular season ranks No. 2 among active NFL coaches (min. 50 games).
- ► Was named Packers head coach on Jan. 12, 2006, his first headcoaching job after 13 years as an NFL assistant.

JASON GARRETT...Is in his fourth full season as the Cowboys' eighth head coach. Was the interim head coach for the final eight games in 2010.

- ▶Is the only former Cowboys player to be the team's head coach.
- ► Garrett has helped guide the Cowboys to a top-10 offensive ranking five times (2007, 2009, 2010, 2012, 2014) in his tenure as offensive coordinator and then head coach.
- ► Was named NFL Assistant Coach of the Year by *Pro Football Weekly* for the 2007 season.
- ▶ Played quarterback for the Cowboys (1992-99), the N.Y. Giants (2000-03), the Tampa Bay Buccaneers (2004) and the Miami Dolphins (2004). Was a member of three Super Bowl teams with Dallas.

THE PACKERS-COWBOYS SERIES

- ▶ These clubs squared off in one of the most famous games in league history, the 1967 NFL Championship, dubbed the 'Ice Bowl.' Kickoff temperature was recorded as minus-13 with a minus-46 wind chill, the coldest game in league annals. Bart Starr's game-winning TD, a 1-yard dive with 13 seconds left, sealed Green Bay's third straight championship en route to its second consecutive Super Bowl title.
- ▶ Green Bay won 10 of the first 15 in the series, in which Tom Landry and Vince Lombardi - former assistants on the same N.Y. Giants staff in the 1950s - turned it into one of the NFL's preeminent rivalries.
- ► The Packers are 9-4 against the Cowboys at home during the regular and postseason, including wins in four of the last five games.
- ► The 2007 meeting marked the eighth time in league history that two 10-1 clubs met, just the second such instance since the 1970 merger.

NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

Packers GM Ted Thompson is a native of Atlanta, Texas, about 175 miles east of Dallas, and attended SMU...Packers S Chris Banjo attended Kempner High School in Sugar Land, Texas, and played at SMU...Packers G Lane Taylor is a native of Arlington, Texas, and attended Martin High School in the city...CB Demetri Goodson is from Spring, Texas, and played at Baylor University...Other native Texans on the Green Bay roster include K Mason Crosby (Georgetown) and QB Matt Flynn (Tyler)... Packers special teams coordinator Shawn Slocum was born in Bryan. Texas, and played and coached at Texas A&M...Packers tight ends coach Jerry Fontenot was a three-time all-conference selection at Texas A&M...Packers senior personnel executive Alonzo Highsmith played for the Cowboys from 1990-91...From 2003-11, Packers area scout John Wojciechowski was the Northeast area scout for the Cowboys...Cowboys QB Tony Romo is a Burlington, Wis., native, while Cowboys T Doug Free is from Manitowoc, Wis. ... Cowboys C Travis Frederick (Sharon, Wis.) and DT Nick Hayden (Hartland, Wis.) both played at the University of Wisconsin...Cowboys assistant head coach/defense Monte Kiffin coached the linebackers in Green Bay in 1983...Cowboys asst. secondary coach Joe Baker was Green Bay's secondary/safeties coach in 2005 and also coached at the University of Wisconsin in 1999...Baker coached on the staff in New Orleans with Packers head coach Mike McCarthy and assistant head coach/linebackers coach Winston Moss...Packers running backs coach Sam Gash, secondary-safeties coach Darren Perry and Cowboys running backs coach Gary Brown were teammates at Penn State...Cowboys offensive coordinator/offensive line Bill Callahan coached on the staff at the University of Wisconsin from 1990-94... - ▶The 45 points matched the most ever scored by Green Bay against the Cowboys (1964, 1997) and the 38-point win was the largest margin of victory by either team in the series, eclipsing the record of 34 points by the Packers in their 41-7 win over Dallas on Nov. 13, 1960.
- ►QB Aaron Rodgers connected on 27 of 34 passes for 289 yards and three TDs with no INTs for a 131.5 passer rating.
- ►WR James Jones led the offense with eight catches for 123 yards and a TD and WR Greg Jennings added seven grabs for 80 yards and a TD.
- ►RB Brandon Jackson posted a rushing TD and a receiving TD for the second time in his career.
- ► Green Bay received TDs from its special teams and its defense, with S Nick Collins returning a fumble 26 yards for a TD on a Dallas kickoff return and LB Clay Matthews returning a QB Jon Kitna interception 62 yards for a TD in the fourth quarter. It was Matthews' first career INT.



NICELY DONE

The Packers put together a fine regular season, finishing with 12 wins and a franchise record fourth consecutive division title. They also finished among the best in many statistical categories.

► Green Bay scored 486 points in 2014, which is the second most in franchise history. The top three have all come under the direction of Head Coach Mike McCarthy.

- ► Green Bay set a single-season franchise mark for fewest giveaways in the regular season with 13, besting the mark of 14 in 2011.
- ► The Packers finished with 6,178 total yards on the season, the fourth most in a season in team history. Four of the six 6,000-yard seasons have come under the direction (2009, 2011, 2013-14) of McCarthy.
- ► Green Bay set a single-season franchise record with 356 first downs on the season, surpassing the previous mark of 354 first downs in 2004.
- ► Green Bay's offensive line only gave up 30 sacks this season, the fewest since allowing 19 in 2007.
- ▶ After averaging 4.65 yards per carry in 2013, the Packers averaged 4.41 rushing yards per carry this season. Green Bay recorded consecutive seasons with a rushing average of 4.40 or better for the first time since the 1963 (4.46) and 1964 (4.60) seasons. It was also the first time the Packers averaged over 4.0 yards per carry in consecutive seasons since 2007-09 (4.12, 4.13, 4.30).
- ► Green Bay had 14 rushing touchdowns on the season, registering consecutive seasons (17 in 2013) with 14-plus rushing touchdowns for the first time since 1983-85 (15, 18, 16).
- ►QB **Aaron Rodgers** went over the 4,000-yard passing mark for the season, giving him five 4,000-yard seasons in his career, which tied Brett Favre for the franchise record.
- ► Rodgers threw for 38 touchdowns and tied Favre (1995) for the fourth most in a single regular season in franchise history. It was the third most Rodgers had thrown in his career (2011: 45 / 2012: 39).
- ► Rodgers threw for a career-best five interceptions, the third fewest in a single regular season in Packers' history.



- ▶ Rodgers extended his NFL record by finishing the regular season with a passer rating above 100.0 for the sixth season in a row. Rodgers' 112.2 passer rating was the second-best mark in a season in team history, trailing only his own rating of 122.5 in 2011.
- ▶ Rodgers extended the streak he started in 2012 of passes at home without an interception to 418 and consecutive touchdown passes at home without an interception to 36, both NFL records.
- ► Rodgers threw three or more touchdowns eight times during the regular season. It tied for the second-most (eight in 2012) three-plus passing touchdown games in a single regular season in his career (10 in 2011).
- ► Rodgers recorded a passer rating of at least 120.0 in seven regularseason games, setting a franchise record and tying for the third-most in a single season in the NFL, dating back to 1960.
- ► Rodgers recorded a 100-plus passer rating 11 times this season, the second most he recorded in one regular season (13 in 2011). Green Bay was 11-0 in the regular season when Rodgers registered a 100-plus passer rating.
- ► With eight 300-yard passing games this season, Rodgers tied his franchise record (2011). Green Bay was 7-1 in the regular season when Rodgers threw for 300 yards.
- ►WR **Jordy Nelson** set a franchise record for receiving yards in a single season (1,519) and became the eighth player in NFL history with 95-plus receptions (98), 1,500-plus receiving yards and 13-plus receiving touchdowns (13).
- ▶ Nelson and WR **Randall Cobb** becamse the first duo in NFL history to record 90-plus receptions, 1,200-plus yards and 12-plus touchdown receptions in the same regular season.
- ► Cobb and Nelson became just the third set of teammates in NFL history with at least 1,200 receiving yards and 10 touchdowns each in the same season, joining Minnesota's Cris Carter and Randy Moss in 1999 and Denver's Demaryius Thomas and Eric Decker in 2013.
- ▶RB **Eddie Lacy** (2,317) passed John Brockington (2,132) for the most rushing yards by a Packers' running back in his first two NFL seasons.
- ► Lacy became the first player in franchise history to rush for at least 1,000 yards and score 10-plus scrimmage touchdowns in each of his first two seasons.
- ► Lacy (1,139) became the fifth player in franchise history to record consecutive 1,000-yard rushing seasons (Ryan Grant, 2008-09 / Ahman Green, 2000-04 / John Brockington, 1971-73 / Jim Taylor, 1960-64).
- ► Lacy's two 1,000-yard rushing seasons are tied for the fourth most in Packers' history.



OUICK OUT OF THE GATE

During the 2014 regular season, Green Bay performed well in the first half of games and that was fueled by quick starts.

- ► The Packers scored on their opening drive in eight of the final 13 games (six TDs, two FGs). The Packers finished No. 2 in the NFL with 48 points on the first offensive possession (San Francisco, 55).
- ► Green Bay scored 89 unanswered points at home in the first quarter from the Week 2 game vs. the N.Y. Jets through Week 14 vs. Atlanta. It was the most consecutive points scored at home in the first quarter since the Miami Dolphins scored 93 straight in the 1978-79 seasons.
- ► Green Bay produced an NFL-leading 151 points in the first quarter this regular season. It was the most first-quarter points by an NFL team in a single regular season, dating back to 1991:

Having led Green Bay to the playoffs in seven of his nine seasons as head coach, **Mike McCarthy** is joined by Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl win with a victory over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.

- ► McCarthy guided the Packers to a franchise-record fourth consecutive division title in 2014.
- ► With a win at Tampa Bay in Week 16, McCarthy passed Lombardi for the No. 2 spot in team history as far as overall victories:



This season, the Packers have been able to put up points.

- ► Green Bay **led the league** in points per play in the regular season (0.486).
- ► The Packers ranked No. 1 in the league in points per game (30.4) and tied for the lead the NFL in touchdowns scored per game (3.63).
- ► At home, Green Bay was even better during the 2014 regular season, averaging 39.8 points per game to lead the league.
- ► The Packers became the first team in NFL history to score 23-plus points in the first half in six consecutive home games in a single season.
- ► Green Bay scored a total of 108 points in Weeks 10-11, scoring 55 against Chicago and 53 versus Philadelphia.
- ► The Packers were only the second team in NFL history to score 53-plus points in back-to-back games, joining the Los Angeles Rams (1950).
- ►It marked the first time in franchise history that the Packers registered back-to-back 50-point games. It was the fifth time in NFL history that a team accomplished the feat.
- ► Green Bay was the only team to score at least 50 points twice during the 2014 regular season.
- ▶ Dating back to the AFL-NFL merger of 1970, it was the eighth time a team scored 50 or more points multiple times in one regular season (Denver-three in 2013 / New England-two in 2012 / Seattle-two in 2012 / New England-two in 2007 / Cincinnati-two in 1989 / Dallas-two in 1980 / New England-two in 1979).

SACKING PACK

With **Dom Capers** as defensive coordinator (2009-14), the Packers have recorded 245 sacks, which is **No. 5 in the NFL** over that span.

►Green Bay's 41 sacks on the season, tied for No. 9 in the NFL during the regular season, are only a partial representation to how much pressure they are putting on opposing quarterbacks. Once again, QB **Aaron Rodgers** put together some masterful performances during the regular season. He threw for three-plus touchdowns eight times, recorded a passer rating over 120.0 seven times and totaled over 300 yards passing eight times, including the second-highest singlegame total of his career with 418 yards in Week 8 at New Orleans.

- ►He had eight three-touchdown/zero-interception games in the regular season, which tied for first in NFL history with NE QB Tom Brady (2007).
- ►In Week 10, he joined Raiders QB Daryle Lamonica (vs. BUF, Oct. 19, 1969) as the only players in NFL history to throw for six touchdowns in a first half.

- ► His 13 games (min. 15 attempts) without an interception were the third most in a regular season in NFL history.

- ►Since 2008, Rodgers leads the league with 24 touchdown passes of 60-plus yards (NYG-Eli Manning, 18).

GOOD COMBO

The Packers' top two receivers, Jordy Nelson and Randall Cobb, have both had strong individual seasons to form one of the best receiving tandems in the league this year.

- ▶ The two have combined to record 189 of the team's 349 receptions (54.2 percent) and tally 2,806 of the Packers' 4,447 receiving yards (63.1 percent).
- ▶ Of QB Aaron Rodgers' 38 touchdown passes in the regular season, 25 went to Cobb or Nelson (65.8 percent). The 25 touchdown receptions were the second most by two players on the same team this season (DAL: Dez Bryant and Terrance Williams). Green Bay was the only team to have two wide receivers each record 10-plus touchdown receptions during the 2014 regular season.
- ▶ The Packers were one of two teams to have two players in the top 10 in receiving touchdowns this season (Denver's TE Julius Thomas and WR Demaryius Thomas).
- ▶ The Packers and Broncos were also the only teams in the NFL to have two players ranked in the top 10 in receptions (DEN D. Thomas and Emmanuel Sanders).
- ► Green Bay was once again joined by the Broncos as the only teams with two wide receivers in the top 15 in receiving yards this year.

HISTORIC SEASON

WRs Randall Cobb and Jordy Nelson led the way for the Packers offense during the 2014 regular season, putting up numbers of historical significance.

- ► Cobb (91) and Nelson (98) were the first duo in franchise history to both catch 90-plus passes in the same season. Nelson's 98 receptions were the fourth most in a single season in franchise history and the most since Robert Brooks recorded 102 in 1995.
- ►Cobb reached the 1,000-yard recieving mark for the first time in his career this season (1,287). He joined Nelson (1,519) as the the first duo in Packers' history to each reach 1,250 receiving yards in the same season.
- ▶ Nelson passed Robert Brooks (1,497 in 1995) for the most receiving yards in a single season in franchise history.
- ▶ Cobb (12) and Nelson (13) are the first duo in franchise history to both catch 10-plus touchdown passes in the same season. The 25 touchdown receptions are the most by a Packers' duo, passing the 24 that Nelson (15) and Greg Jennings (nine) combined for in 2011.
- ▶ They became just the third set of teammates in NFL history with at least 1,200 receiving yards and 10 touchdowns each in the same season, joining Minnesota's Cris Carter and Randy Moss in 1999 and Denver's Demaryius Thomas and Eric Decker in 2013.
- ► Cobb and Nelson are the first duo in NFL history to record 90-plus receptions, 1,200-plus yards and 12-plus touchdown receptions in the same regular season.
- ▶ Nelson is the second player in team history to register two seasons with 13-plus touchdown catches (13 in 2014 / 15 in 2011), joining WR Sterling Sharpe (1992 and 1994).
- ▶ Nelson's 13 receiving touchdowns are tied for the sixth most by a Packers receiver in a single regular season.
- ► Cobb set a career high with six consecutive games with a receiving touchdown (Games 4-9). It tied for the third-longest streak by a Packers' player, and was the longest since Sharpe (six) in 1994.
- ▶ Nelson had three touchdown receptions of 65-plus yards this season, the most by a Packer since Freeman had four in 1998.
- ► In franchise history, Nelson's five games with nine-plus receptions were the most a player has registered in an entire regular season.
- Week 1 nine receptions for 83 yards
- Week 2 nine receptions for 209 yards and one touchdown
- Week 4 10 receptions for 108 yards and two touchdowns
- · Week 6 nine receptions for 107 yards and one touchdown
- Week 16 nine receptions for 113 yards and one touchdown
- ►Green Bay was 4-1 this season when Nelson recorded at least nine
- ► Nelson had a career-high seven 100-yard receiving games this season while Cobb had five. They both rank in the top 10 for the most 100-yard games by a Packers player in a single regular season (Nelson, tied for second / Cobb tied for ninth).
- ► After setting a career high with 10 receptions at Soldier Field during the 2013 season, Nelson matched it at Chicago in Week 4 this season. He became the first player since Lions WR Calvin Johnson (Jan. 1, 2012 and Dec. 9, 2012, at Lambeau Field) to post 10-plus catches in back-toback games at a visiting stadium.
- ▶ In the Week 2 win over the Jets, Nelson finished with a career-high 209 yards receiving, which tied for the fourth most in a game in franchise history, and were the most by a Packer since Don Beebe registered 220 yards receiving vs. San Francisco on Oct. 14, 1996.

USING THE BACKS

As the 2014 regular season wore on, Green Bay's backfield elevated their play.

- The Packers recorded 25-plus carries and 100 yards 11 times since Oct. 2 (Weeks 5-8, 10-17), averaging at least 4 yards a carry in Weeks 7 (4.1), 8 (4.7), 10 (4.1), 11 (4.4), 12 (4.8), 13 (4.5), 14 (6.0), 15 (6.3) and 17 (4.0).
- ▶ Dating back to the 2013 regular season, Green Bay is 13-2 in the last 15 games they ran the ball at least 25 times, including 10-1 during the 2014 regular season. The Packers are 73-15-1 under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** when running the ball 25-plus times.
- ►RB Eddie Lacy finished tied for third among running backs with 13 touchdowns in 2014 (nine rushing / four receiving):

- ▶In Week 14, Green Bay set a season high with 179 yards on 30 carries (6.0 avg.). They followed it up in Week 15 with 158 yards on 25 carries (6.3 avg.) with one touchdown. Green Bay finished off the regular season with 152 yards on 32 carries (4.0 avg.) in Week 17, including Lacy becoming only running back to record 100 yards rushing against Detroit this regular season.
- ► Twice this season, Week 7 and Week 14, Lacy and James Starks each averaged over 5 yards a carry and both recorded a rushing touchdown.
- ► Lacy set a franchise record by surpassong 100-plus scrimmage yards in nine consecutive games (Games 8-16).
- ► Lacy tallied 10 games with 100-plus scrimmage yards during the 2014 regular season, which tied for the **fourth most in the NFL**.

- ► Lacy became the **first player in team history** to post 1,000 rushing yards and 10-plus total TDs in both of his first two seasons.

 - He became the first Green Bay running back to post a 100yard receiving game since Edgar Bennett (101 yards) on Dec. 18, 1994 (vs. Atlanta).

- Lacy registered a 67-yard reception against the Saints and a 56-yard touchdown reception versus Chicago to become the first Packers' running back to record 55-yard receptions in consecutive games.
- Lacy registered 32-yard touchdown reception in a Week 11 victory over Philadelphia.
- Lacy was the first Packers back ever to record 100 yards from scrimmage and a touchdown reception in three consecutive games (Weeks 10-12).
- Lacy's four touchdown receptions are the most for a Packers' running back in a single season since Ahman Green had five in 2003.
 His 427 receiving yards were the most since Green's 594 in 2001.
- ► Lacy's 182 yards from scrimmage in Week 8 at New Orleans were the most by a Green Bay running back since Najeh Davenport posted 186 vs. St. Louis on Nov. 29, 2004.
- ▶In Week 5, Lacy rushed for 105 yards on 13 carries (8.1 avg.) and recorded his second career game with two rushing touchdowns (vs. Pittsburgh, Week 16 in 2013). It was his lowest attempt total in a 100-yard rushing game and his best per-carry average in a game (min. 10 att.).
- ► Lacy recorded seven 100-yard rushing games during the 2013-14 regular seasons, tied for the sixth most in the NFL over that span.
- ► According to STATS LLC, the Packers recorded 67 runs of 10-plus yards during the 2014 regular season, the **second most in the NFL**. Lacy accounted for 38 of those, **No. 3 in the league this season**:

This past offseason the Packers signed LB **Julius Peppers**. The former Carolina Panther and Chicago Bear has shown throughout his career the ablity to do a little bit of everything on defense, and this year was no different.

- ▶Peppers and Houston Texans DE J.J. Watt were the only players in the NFL this season to have at least one sack (seven), a forced fumble (four), a fumble recovery (three), an interception (two) and a defensive touchdown (two).
- ▶For the fifth time in his career, Peppers recorded a sack, an interception, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery in a season (2004 / 2007 / 2009 / 2013 / 2014). Dating back to 2002 when he entered the league, that is **tied for the second-most seasons in the NFL** to record a stat in all four categories:

- ► He tied for No. 7 in the NFL with five takeaways this season.
- ▶In his first NFC North game for the Packers, Peppers forced a fumble that he recovered on a sack of Lions QB Matthew Stafford in Week 3. Against Chicago in Week 10, he did the same thing to QB Jay Cutler.
- ▶ Peppers had 2.5 sacks in division games this season. Since joining the NFC North in 2010, Peppers is tied for the **10th-most sacks** against division opponents (19.0).
- ▶Peppers is No. 4 among active players with 125.5 career sacks during the regular season:

- ▶ Peppers is No. 16 in NFL history (since 1982) in sacks. He is one sack behind Derrick Thomas (126.5) for 15th place.
- Peppers returned an interception 49 yards for a touchdown in the Week 5 win over Minnesota.
- ▶In Week 11 against the Eagles, Peppers recorded his 11th career interception, returning it 52 yards for touchdown to become the first player in NFL history with 100 career sacks and four interception returns for touchdowns. He also became the first linebacker in Packers' history to post two interception returns for touchdowns in the same season.
- ► He is the only player in NFL history to register at least 10 interceptions and 100.0 sacks (since 1982):

CONTINUAL IMPACT

In his young career, DT **Mike Daniels** has seen his playing time steadily increase as well as his production. After playing in 14 games as a rookie in 2012, he played in all 16 last season and started all 16 this season. He led Green Bay's defensive line with 5.5 sacks and was the team leader in quarterback hits (19) and pressures (22) during the regular season.

▶ Daniels is second on the Packers with 12.0 sacks since the start of the 2013 season (Matthews-18.5). His 12.0 sacks are No. 7 among NFL defensive tackles over that span, according to STATS LLC:

GOOD START

Third-year CB **Casey Hayward** has found a way to get his hands on the football in his young career. He tied for the team lead with three interceptions this season, including one returned 82 yards for a touchdown in Week 10.

- ▶In Week 11, Hayward returned a fumble 49 yards for a touchdown against the Eagles. He became the first Green Bay defensive player to score a touchdown in back-to-back games since LB Keith McKenzie in 1999 (Weeks 13-14).
- ► Hayward, who also had two fumble recoveries, tied for No. 6 in the NFL this season in total takeaways with five.
- ► Although he has only played in 34 games, Hayward's nine interceptions tied for the sixth most by a Packers' player in their first three NFL seasons, dating back to 1970:

- ►The Packers have been able to stay above the .500 mark on the road during Head Coach **Mike McCarthy's** tenure, a notable achievement in the National Football League.
- ►Since 2006, McCarthy's first season as the head coach in Green Bay, only 10 of 32 NFL teams have regular-season road records above .500.

309 AND COUNTING

Another packed house at Lambeau Field against the Lions in Week 17 this season brought the stadium's consecutive-sellouts streak to 309 regular-season games (not including replacement games).

- ►The league's longest-tenured stadium, Lambeau Field is hosting its 58th season of football in 2014. A total of 625,114 fans made their way through the turnstiles for the eight games in 2014.
- ► Across American professional sports, only Boston's Fenway Park (1912) and Chicago's Wrigley Field (1914) have longer tenures.

THE LAMBEAU ADVANTAGE

The crown jewel of the National Football League, Lambeau Field has long been known as one of the tougher venues to play in, particularly during the harsh Wisconsin winter.

- ▶ Re-establishing home-field advantage after a 4-4 mark in 2008 was one of the goals of 2009, and with the Packers finishing 6-2 at home, they accomplished that goal. Green Bay followed that up with a 7-1 mark at Lambeau Field in 2010, a perfect 8-0 record in 2011, the first undefeated home mark since 2002, and a 7-1 mark in 2012. This season the Packers were one of two teams to finish undefeated at home during the regular season (Denver).
- ► Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** stated consistently upon his arrival in Green Bay that one of the team's goals would be to reclaim the mystique of playing at Lambeau Field. Mission accomplished. The team is 54-17-1 (.757) at home in the regular-season since 2006.
- ► Since Ron Wolf and Mike Holmgren began the revitalization of the franchise in 1992, Green Bay owns the best home record in the NFL. A look at the top regular-season home W-L records since the '92 season:

A LOOK AT THE SCHEDULE

The Green Bay Packers' 94th NFL regular-season schedule was headlined by five prime-time games (subject to flexible scheduling).

- ► Green Bay's schedule includes five games against 2013 playoff teams, with three of those contests (Carolina, Philadelphia, New England) at Lambeau Field and two on the road (Seattle, New Orleans).
- ► The Packers have three prime-time contests at home (vs. Minnesota on Thursday night in Week 5, vs. Chicago on Sunday night in Week 10 and vs. Atlanta on Monday Night Football in Week 14) and two on the road (Thursday night at Seattle in Week 1 and Sunday night at New Orleans in Week 8).
- ► The Packers' bye arrived in Week 9 for the first time since 2004.
- ▶ It is the second time in franchise history (1922) that Green Bay opens with three of their first four games on the road.
- ► Two of Green Bay's first five games are played on Thursday night, with the next seven taking place on Sunday, one on the following Monday, and three more on Sunday to close out the regular season.
- For the second year in a row and just the third time in nine seasons under Head Coach Mike McCarthy (2010), the Packers opened the season on the road. For the third straight season Green Bay opened against an NFC West team after facing San Francisco each of the last two years.
- ▶Dating back to 2001, the Packers have always played against an NFC team in Week 1. The last AFC team Green Bay faced in Week 1 was the New York Jets, who visited the Packers in Week 2 for the home opener.
- Following the home opener, the Packers went on the road to face two division opponents, Detroit and Chicago, before returning home to face Minnesota in a Thursday night divisional matchup. It was the sixth time in the last seven seasons they have faced off in primetime.
- ▶ The Packers traveled to Miami for the third time in 23 years and first time since 2006. The following week Green Bay hosted Carolina for teh first time since 2008.
- ▶ Before the bye week, the Packers traveled to New Orleans for a primetime matchup against the Saints.
- ▶ Following the bye week, the Packers returned to Sunday night to host the Bears, recording a win for the fifth time in the last six games at home.
- ▶ Philadelphia came to Lambeau for the second straight season. It was only the second time in the series that the two clubs have played at Green Bay in back-to-back seasons (1933-34).
- ► For the second consecutive season, Green Bay played Minnesota in Week 12, traveling to face the Vikings in the first outdoor game (TCF Bank Stadium) between the two in Minnesota since they played at Metropolitan Stadium on Nov. 29, 1981.
- ► The last game in November brought New England to Lambeau Field for the first time since 2006 and only its third visit ever to the stadium (1979).
- ▶ December opened with a Monday night matchup at home versus Atlanta. It marked the 22nd straight season the Packers appeared on Monday Night Football.
- ▶ The next week, Green Bay traveled to Buffalo for the first time since 2006. The Packers' final road trip of the regular season was to play the Buccaneers, Green Bay's first trip to Tampa Bay in the month of December since 1999.
- ► Green Bay closed the regular season at Lambeau Field against Detroit for the fourth time under McCarthy (2007, 2008, 2011).

12 AARON RODGERS

- ▶ Ranks No. 1 in NFL history with a 106.0 career passer rating.

- ► Ranks second on the team with 12.0 sacks since the start of the 2013 regular season (LB Clay Matthews-18.5).
- ➤ Started all 16 games for the first time in his career in 2014 and finished first on the Packers defensive line with 5.5 sacks while setting a career high with 69 tackles.
- ► Returned a fumble 43 yards for a TD vs. Detroit in Week 14 of 2012, the longest fumble return for a TD by a rookie in franchise history.
- ► Starred as an interior pass rusher at lowa, posting a team-high 24.5 tackles for a loss and 13 sacks from 2010-11.

LOLB Clay Matthews, 6th Year, Southern California, D1b-09

posting a career-high 80 tackles (49 solo), including 6.5 tackles for loss, 3.5 sacks sacks, two forced fumbles and three passes defensed.

ROLB Julius Peppers, 13th Year, North Carolina, FA-14

- ► Signed with Green Bay during the offseason after playing the last four seasons for Chicago and the first eight of his career for Carolina after being selected as the No. 2 overall pick in 2002.
- ▶ Only player in NFL history with 10 interceptions and at least 100 sacks.
- ► Has been selected to the Pro Bowl eight times (2004-06, 2008-12) and has been named first-team All-Pro by *The Associated Press* three times (2004, 2006, 2010). Was named to the NFL's All-Decade Team for the 2000s.
- ► Has played in 112 consecutive regular-season games.
- ► Ranks No. 3 in the league in sacks (125.5) and No. 3 in forced fumbles (43) since entering the NFL in 2002. His sack total ranks No. 16 in NFL history (since 1982).
- ► Has blocked 13 kicks (12 field goals, one extra point) during his career.

LCB Tramon Williams, 8th Year, Louisiana Tech, FA-06

- ► Ranks No. 2 in the league in interceptions (22) and ranks No. 4 in the NFL in INT return yards (325) since 2010 (including playoffs).
- ► Started all 16 games for the third season in a row and tied for the team lead with three interceptions.
- ► Led the secondary with a career-high 91 tackles (68 solo) and a career-best 2.5 sacks in 2013. Added three interceptions, two fumble recoveries, two forced fumbles and 14 passes defensed.
- ► With three interceptions during the 2010 playoffs, tied Joe Laws (1944) and Craig Newsome (1996) for the franchise single-postseason record.

RCB Sam Shields, 5th Year, Miami, FA-10

- ► Finished second on the team with 13 passes defensed in 2014 to go along with two interceptions.
- Started all 14 games he appeared in last season and led the team with four INTs (tied career high) and a career-best 25 passes defensed.
- ► Was limited to 10 games with eight starts in 2012 due to injury, but registered 38 tackles (28 solo), three interceptions, 15 passes defensed (No. 3 on the team) and a sack.
- ► Made an impact in 2010 after making the team as a non-drafted rookie, earning the nickel CB job despite playing the position only one season in college.
- ► In Green Bay's NFC Championship win over Chicago in the 2010 season, became the first rookie in NFL history to record two INTs and a sack in a postseason contest.

SS Morgan Burnett, 5th Year, Georgia Tech, D3-10

- ▶Finished with a team-high 125 tackles this season, the second most of his career (137 in 2012). Ranked No. 2 on the team with 106 tackles (77 solo) in 2013, despite missing the first three games due to injury. Recovered three fumbles, including one for a TD, and added nine passes defensed.
- ▶Participated in all 1,088 plays for Green Bay's defense in 2012, one of only four non-offensive linemen in the NFL to appear in 100 percent of his team's snaps.
- ► Enjoyed his first full season as a pro in 2011, joining DT B.J. Raji as the only two Green Bay defensive players to start all 16 regular-season games.
- ► Started the first four games of the 2010 season at SS before sustaining a season-ending knee injury vs. Detroit in Week 4.

FS Ha Ha Clinton-Dix, Rookie, Alabama, D1-14

- ► Started 10 of 16 games this season, finishing second on the team in tackles (95).
- ► Was the second safety ever drafted by Green Bay in the first round (Alabama S George Teague, No. 29 overall in 1993).
- ► Was a consensus All-America selection in 2013 as a junior, earning first-team recognition from *The Associated Press*, the Football Writers Association of America and *Sporting News*.



SEATTLE - The Super Bowl champion Seattle Seahawks started 2014 the same way they finished last season, with a convincing win.

Marshawn Lynch rushed for 110 yards and a pair of touchdowns, Percy Harvin had 100 combined yards rushing and receiving, and the Seahawks stymed Aaron Rodgers' up-tempo offense in a 36-16 win over the Green Bay Packers to kick off the regular season.

The Seahawks unveiled the first Super Bowl banner in franchise history during a brief pregame ceremony and then began the process of trying to be the first team in a decade to repeat.

Their effort against the Packers - a popular pick to contend in the NFC - will only reinforce the belief Seattle is still the favorite.

Russell Wilson was outstanding in the first half, including a 33-yard touchdown pass to Ricardo Lockette. Harvin got touches as a receiver, running back and returner. He was used all over the field in different formations after never being fully healthy in his first season with Seattle.

Wilson finished 19 of 28 for 191 yards passing and Lynch was at his best. Pete Carroll said earlier this week that Lynch appeared in the best shape of his carrear, and it showed. Lynch averaged 5.5 yards per carry and topped 100 yards for the 20th time in the regular season since joining the Seahawks in 2010.

Lynch, who rail for 1,257 yards and 12 touchdowns last season, barreled through a trio of Packers for the TD with 3:41 left before halftime to give the Seahawks a 17-10 lead and added a second TD run on the first play of the fourth quarter.

Seattle had 207 yards ushing as a team and won for the 18th time in its last 20 regular-season home games. Harvin finished with 11 offensive touches, including four rushes for 41 yards.

w for 302 yards and four touchdowns, and Green Bay shook off one of its worst offensive performances in years with a 38-17 victory over the Chicago

Bears on Sunday aftermoon.

The Packers (2-2) scored on their first six possessions to build a 38-17 lead. They racked up 358 yards after being held to 223, their lowest total since 2008, a week earlier in a 19-7 loss at Defroit.

They intercapted Jay Cutler twice in the third quarter to pull away from the Bears (2-2). That gave Green Bay five straight wins at Soldier Field, including the NFC title game four years ago and a playoffs-or-bust finale for both teams last season.

Roogers capted of Packers faints to take a deep breath during the week, and he gave them reason to exhale with this performance.

Roogers posted a 151.2 rating for the game, completing 22 of 28 passes, and had all the time he needed with five-time Pro Bowl defensive end Jared Allen sitting out because of an illness.

He Inter two touchdown passes each to Randall Cobb and Jordy Nelson, and a fifth got called back by a penalty. That happened early in the third when a scrambling Roogers got hit by at least one defender while unleashing an awward, wobbly 34-yard pass that somebow connected with Davante Adams in the end zone.

Cobb had seven catches for 113 yards. Nelson had 10 receptions for 108 yards, and the Packers came away with the win despite allowing 496 yards.

The Bears basically matched Green Bay score for score before Cutler threw those interceptions. He wound up passing for 256 yards and two TDs but fell to 1-10 lifetime

against Green Bay, counting the postseason.

Matt Forte ran' for 122 yards on 23 carries. Martellus Bennett had nine catches for a career-high 134 yards, but Chicago came up short after back-to-back wins at San Francisco and the New York Jest.

Mason Crosby kicked a 63-yard field goal on the opening possession of the second half to extend the Packers' lead to 24-17, and things unraweled for the Bears after that. Chicago had the ball on the Green Bay 24 when Outler hit cornerback Tramon Williams in the cheet with a pass. The ball ricocheted to Clay Matthews, who returned it 45 yards. That led to an 11-yard scoring pass from Rodgers to Nelson, making it 31-17.

Another interception set up another 10 for the Packers. This time, Brandon Marshall went long when Cutler expected him to cut back toward the quarterback. Rodgers had the last word Sunday, throwing a 4-yard touchdown pass to Andrew Quarless with three seconds left to help the Green Bay Packers rally past the Miami Dolphins 27-24.

The Packers (4-2) earned their third consecutive victory, won in Miami for only the second time ever and remained tied with the Detroit Lions atop the NFC North.

The Dolphins (2-3) lost despite the return of six starters who had missed playing time. They overcame deficits of 10-3 and 17-10 to take a 24-17 lead with nine minutes left when Ryan Tannehill hit Mike Wallace for a 5-yard score.

At that point the Packers appeared to be wilting on a typical fall day in the subtropics -- sunny, humid and 85 degrees.

The Packers kicked a field goal with 4:09 to go, making it 24-20, then forced a punt to start at their 40 with 2:04 left.

Rodgers fumbled when sacked, and teammate T.J. Lang recovered. That set up a fourth-and-10, but Rodgers threw to Jordy Nelson for 18 yards, then hit James Starks on third-and-10 for 10 yards.

With the clock running following another completion, Rodgers taked a spike before throwing to Davante Adams, who gained 12 yards before going

out of bounds with six seconds remaining.

Following a Dolphins timeout, Quarless easily outmaneuvered linebacker Philip Wheeler for the winning catch. Wheeler wasn't thrilled with the defensive scheme, which left him alone on the flank. Playing in his 100th regular-season game, Rodgers also threw for scores of 9 yards to Nelson and 5 yards to Randall Cobb. He has 15 touchdowns

passes and only one interception this season.

With the Packers' secondary depleted, Tannehill threw for two scores and 143 yards in the second half, but he was unable to run out the clock with a 24-20 lead. The Dolphins tried forupasses and ran only three times on their final possession.

Green Bay made a goal-line stand in the first quarter, stopping Miami three consecutive times at the 1, including on fourth down when Morgan Burnett tackled Knowshon Moreno for a loss. Casey Hayward intercepted Tannehill to set up a field goal.

The Packers enjoyed a 14-and-a-half-minute advantage in time of possession, a big change from other games this season. Their run defense was

ranked as the NFL's worst, but Miami's running backs totaled only 63 yards on 20 carries

GREEN BAY, Wis. -- Aaron Rodgers handed off to Eddie Lacy, turned and started jogging to the sideline before his running back had crossed the goal line for a 1-yard buchdown. It was as if the Green Bay quarterback knew what was going to happen, Just another first-half score and big early lead for the Packers set at Lambeau Field.

Rodgers passed for 341 yards and three buchdowns, Lacy accounted for two scores, and the Packer scores and big early lead for the Packers set and the Indi-oceane Philadelphia Eagles for a 53-20 win Sunday.

The Packers (7-3) blew out another opponent in the cold comfort of home after a fast start.

The matchup of MFC contenders quickly turned lopsided after Green Bay took a 30-6 halftime lead. Rodgers threw for two buchdowns in the first half, while Micah Hyde scored on a 75-yard punt return.

Julius Peppers finished off the Eagles by returning Mark Sanchez's pass 52 yards for a 33-6 lead in the third quarter, the second interception return for a score this season for the veteral return.

Philadelphia (7-3) was held to 11 points below its NFC-leading scoring average by a Packers defense rejuvenated since Matthews started getting more time at inside lineback. Matthews finished with five backes and a sack after rushing from his traditional outside spot unabated to Sanchez.

Green Bay's others was in good thands sagin with Rodgers, who hove from Bardy's NH, record of 288 straight passes at home without an interception. Rodgers finished 22 of 36.

The Packers also got to Sanchez early with sacks on Philadelphia's first three drives.

It was the Eagles worst loss under second-year coach Chip Kelly. The previous low was a 52-20 thrashing at Derver in Week 4 last season, and Kelly is now the o coach in team history to allow 50 points twice.

The Eagles insuly reached the end zone after Sanchez hit receiver Jordan Matthews for a 10-yard touchdown pass to make it 39-13 with 2-21 left in the third quarter. The Packers lad no such problems.

Rodgers found Jordy Nelson streaking down the right sideline for a 64-yard completion on the game's third play from scrimmage - the pass attempt that allowed Rod to brack Brady's record.

The deficit could have been wider for the Packers if not for some hickcips in the red zone.

Green Bay settled for four field goals from Mason Crosby of 35 yards or less, including a 28-yarder to make it a five-point lead with 8:41 left. That Total But he was celebrating at the end. Green Bay has won four in a row and eight of nine.

Rodgers ininsted 24 of 38, while Lacy had 98 yards on 2 carries, including 26 on the ground in the fourth-quarter drive that led to Crosby's field goal. Adams had a career-best 121 yards on receptions.

A 21-13 loss to Buffalo a week ago cost Green Bay (11-4) sole possession of first place in the division. It also hurt its chances for earning home-field advantage throughout the NFC playoffs. Green Bay closes the regular season at home against Detroit (11-4), with a victory giving the Packers another NFC North crown.

Rodgers rebounded from the only game this season in which he's failed to throw for a touchdown, completing 31 of 40 passes without an interception. He threw 24 yards to Nelson on third-and-13 to extend the drive that produced Lacy's long TD run, and a 19-yard completion to Nelson set up Rodgers' 36th TD pass of the year.

The Buss (2-13) have lost five straight and remain in contention for the first overall pick in the 2015 draft. Their sputtering offense was outgained 154-6 in the opening quarter; Josh McCown was sacked seven times and intercepted once; and Doug Martin was held to 17 yards rushing on 10 attempts.

Tampa Bay kept it close with a solid defensive performance, forcing Rodgers' fourth turnover in two weeks with Michael Johnson's sack-fumble in the opening half. A goal-line stand denied the Packers points in the third quarter after Lacy gained 5 yards on first down to the Bucs 1. Lacy and John Kuhn were stopped for no gain on the next two plays, and Rodgers threw an incompletion in the end zone on fourth down.

Nevertheless, the Packers wound up with 431 yards total offense.

McCown, meanwhile, was 12 of 26 for 147 yards. Mike Evans had four receptions for 49 yards and Vincent Jackson had three for 60 yards, moving both of them to the brink of 1,000-yard seasons.

- ▶at Miami Dolphins (10/12): Caught five passes for 58 yards (11.6 avg.), including a 5-yard TD catch late in the third quarter that put Green Bay up 17-10...Working against S Louis Delmas in the end zone on third down, cut to the right and then back to the left to free himself as Rodgers scrambled and found him for the score.

Also posted a season-long 24-yard punt return in the second quarter.

▶at New Orleans Saints (10/26): Led the team with 126 receiving yards on five grabs (25.2 avg.), highlighted by a career-long 70-yard TD reception on Green Bay's first possession of the game...On third-and-10 at the Green Bay 30, adjusted his route and headed up field as Rodgers scrambled, getting behind CB Keenan Lewis near the sideline and making the catch at the New Orleans 35...Outran Lewis and S Rafael Bush the rest of the way for his career-high ninth TD of the season, surpassing his previous season high (eight in 2012) in just the eighth game of the season...It marked his fifth consecutive game with a TD catch, the first Packer to do so since WR Greg Jennings in 2007...Finished the first quarter with 101 yards receiving on three receptions, the best receiving-yardage total by a Packer in a first quarter since WR Donald Driver registered 111 yards on three grabs (37.0 avg.) at Chicago on Oct. 7, 2002.

- Set an NFL record with 1,037 points in his first eight seasons (2007-14), topping the previous league record held by New England K Stephen Gostkowski (1,023, 2006-13).
- With 1,034 career points, ranks No. 2 on the all-time franchise scoring list behind only K Ryan Longwell (1,054).
- Is one of only three players in NFL history to register three or more 140-point seasons (Stephen Gostkowski, David Akers).
- Has kicked the six longest field goals in franchise history (58-yarder in 2011, two 57-yarders in 2013, 56-yarders in 2010 and 2011, 55-yarder in 2014).
- Ranks No. 1 in team annals with 23 field goals of 50-plus yards. Has made nine field goals of 50-plus yards since 2013, which is tied for No. 6 in the NFL over that span.
- Set a franchise record with 23 consecutive field goals made (Week 13, 2010-Week 12, 2011), topping Chris Jacke's mark of 17 straight in 1993. **2014 Season:** Connected on 27 of 33 (81.8 percent) field-goal attempts and 53 of 55 extra points (two blocks) for 134 points on the season...Was tied for No. 4 in the league in scoring...Made four of seven attempts from 50-plus yards (55, 53, 52, 53), finishing tied for No. 8 in the league in field goals of 50-plus yards....Rrecorded 41 touchbacks on 99 kickoffs (41.4 percent), the second-most touchbacks in a season in his career behind onl hte 49 in 2011...Made two tackles on special teams.

- ▶vs. Chicago Bears (11/9): Started and played all 67 snaps, helping the offense rack up 55 points, which is tied for the third most in franchise history, and 451 total yards...Part of a line that didn't allow a sack and helped Rodgers throw for six TDs, which tied the single-game franchise record, with all of them coming in the first half as he tied Raiders QB Daryle Lamonica (1969) for the most in a first half in NFL history...Helped the offense score TDs on each of its first five possessions on the way to a 42-0 halftime lead, which tied the second-biggest halftime lead in league history...Delivered a key block on LB Lance Briggs to help spring Lacy on a second-quarter screen pass that he took 56 yards for a touchdown.

- Set a franchise record (since 1976) with a 38.95-yard net punting average in 2013, and holds the top four single-season marks (2010-13) in team annals.
- Holds two of the top four single-season gross punting averages in team history (45.6 in 2011, 44.6 in 2013).
- Ranks No. 1 in team annals (since 1976) for the most career punts placed inside the 20 with 114, having surpassed Craig Hentrich's mark (104) in Week 5 vs. Minnesota.
- **2014 Season:** Registered a 44.1-yard gross average and a net average of 37.0 yards on 49 punts on the season...Placed 14 punts inside the 20 with just four touchbacks, matching the fewest of his career (2011)...His 49 punts on the season were the fewest by any punter in the league that played in 10 or more games...Also served as the holder in all 16 games.
- ▶at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Punted four times on the evening and posted a 38.3-yard gross average and a net average of 37.5...Booted a 57-yarder in the fourth quarter and placed one punt inside the 20...Also kicked off once on the evening.
- ▶vs. N.Y. Jets (9/14): Posted a career-best (min. four punts) net

punting average of 46.5 yards, topping his previous high of 46.2 yards at Kansas City on Dec. 18, 2011...The 46.5-yard net average was also the third-best mark in team history (since 1976)...Had a 49.3-yard gross average on his four punts.

52 Clay Matthews, LB, 6th Year, Southern California

- Ranks third in franchise history with 61.0 career sacks.
- Has registered a double-digit sack total four times in his career (2009-10, 2012, 2014), tying DEs Reggie White and Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila for the franchise record (since 1982).
- Became the first player in franchise history to earn Pro Bowl recognition in each of his first four seasons in the league (2009-12). Has been named to the Pro Bowl five times in six seasons (also 2014).
- Is tied for No. 5 in the league in sacks since entering the league in 2009 with 61.0.
- Is the only player in franchise history to score a defensive TD (interception or fumble return) in each of his first three seasons in the league.
- Named first-team All-Pro by *The Associated Press* in 2010, the first Green Bay LB to earn that honor since Tim Harris in 1989. Finished second to Pittsburgh safety Troy Polamalu in the *AP's* Defensive Player of the Year

voting in 2010.

- **2014 Season:** Started all 16 games, opening four at LOLB, six at ROLB and six at MLB, and recorded 69 tackles (53 solo), a team-best 11.0 sacks, an interception, two forced fumbles, six passes defensed, 17 QB hits and 21 pressures...Was named to the Pro Bowl for the fifth time in his career... Ranked No. 5 on the team in tackles, tied for No. 2 in QB hits and No. 2 in pressures...Was tied for No. 12 in the league in sacks...Posted 6.5 sacks in the month of December, which ranked No. 4 in the league...Was one of only three players in the NFL with at least 10 sacks, an interception and a forced fumble (Texans DE J.J. 87 Jordy Nelson, WR, 7th Year, Kansas State

- One of just two players in franchise history (WR Sterling Sharpe, 1989 and 1992) to register two seasons with 85-plus receptions and 1,300-plus receiving yards (2011, 2014). Also joins Sharpe as the only players in team history to record two seasons with 13-plus TD catches (2011, 2014).
- Led the NFL with 19 catches of 25-plus yards in 2013, the most by a Green Bay player since STATS LLC began recording the statistic in 1994.
- Ranks No. 4 in the league and No. 2 among wide receivers (Dez Bryant, 50) with 43 TD catches since 2011.
- Ranks No. 8 in franchise history in receptions (400), No. 9 in receiving yards (6.109) and tied for No. 7 in TD catches (49).

- Is the only player in NFL history (since 1982) to register 100 sacks (125.5) and 10 interceptions (11). Is also the only NFL player to record 100 sacks and four INT returns for TDs.
- Has posted eight double-digit sack seasons since 2002, which is tied with Bears DE Jared Allen and Broncos DE DeMarcus Ware for No. 1 in

the league over that span.

2014 Season: Started all 16 games for the 10th time in his career and posted 45 tackles (33 solo), seven sacks, two interceptions (both returned for TDs), 17 QB hits, 17 pressures, a career-high 11 passes defensed, a team-high four forced fumbles and a team-best three fumble recoveries... - Moved into a starting role in 2013 in Week 8 following TE Jermichael Finley's season-ending neck injury and responded with career highs in every category, catching 32 passes for 312 yards (9.8 avg.) and two TDs.
- Was sidelined for the entire 2012 campaign as he continued his rehabilitation from a significant knee injury sustained at the N.Y. Giants in Week 13 of the 2011 season.
- Played in 23 games with five starts in his first two seasons (2010-11).
- **2014 Season:** Played in all 16 games with 11 starts and led Green Bay's tight ends with 29 catches for 323 yards (11.1 avg.) and a career-high three TDs.
- ▶at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Didn't start, but saw action on 46 plays, the most by a Green Bay tight end...Caught three passes for 26 yards (8.7 avg.), highlighted by an 18-yard grab over the middle in the second quarter.
- ▶vs. N.Y. Jets (9/14): Played 37 snaps and had an 8-yard reception.

- **2014 Season:** Played in five games and recorded four assisted tackles, a QB hit, three pressures and a pass defensed...Was placed on injured reserve on Dec. 8 due to a calf injury...Was inactive for three contests (healthy scratch)...Spent the first four games on Green Bay's practice squad.
- ▶vs. Minnesota Vikings (10/2): Signed to the 53-man roster the afternoon of the game, had a hand in one of the key plays in the game on his third snap as a pro...Lined up at LDE, he fought off blocks by G Vladimir Ducasse and T Phil Loadholt to get in QB Christian Ponder's face and get a piece of the ball that was intercepted by LB Julius Peppers, an INT that Peppers took 49 yards for a TD and a 21-0 Green Bay lead with 6:51 remaining in the second quarter...Appeared on 35 snaps in his NFL debut, finishing with an assisted tackle, a QB hit, three pressures and the pass defensed.
- ►at Miami Dolphins (10/12): Saw limited action on defense, appearing on two plays.
- ▶vs. Carolina Panthers (10/19): Played 21 snaps on defense, recording a season-high three tackles (all assisted).

12 Aaron Rodgers, QB, 10th Year, California

- His career passer rating of 106.0 ranks No. 1 in NFL history (min. 1,500 attempts), more than eight points ahead of No. 2 Peyton Manning (97.6).
- Ranks No. 1 in league history in career INT percentage (1.64) and TD/INT ratio (3.96, 226/57) and ranks No. 3 in completion percentage (65.8) and yards per attempt (8.22).
- Is the only quarterback in league history to record a 100-plus passer rating in six consecutive seasons (2009-14), with no other QB doing so in more than four straight seasons.

- Is one of only three QBs in NFL history to register two seasons with a 110-plus passer rating (2011, 2014), joining Manning (2007, 2013) and Patriots QB Tom Brady (2007, 2010).
- In 103 career regular-season starts (70-33 record), has posted 39 games with 300-plus passing yards, 60 without an interception (min. 15 attempts) and 62 with a 100-plus passer rating.
- In the franchise record books, holds six of the top seven single-season marks for passer rating (2009-14), three of the top five for passing TDs (2011-12, 2014), five of the top six for completion percentage (2010-14) and three of the top five for passing yards (2009, 2011, 2014). Also holds five of the top seven streaks in team history for most consecutive passing attempts without an interception.
- Has posted five 4,000-yard passing seasons (2008-09, 2011-12, 2014), which is tied with Brett Favre for the franchise record.
- Is the only QB in NFL history to register three seasons with 500-plus attempts and seven or fewer INTs (2009, 2011, 2014), with no other quarterback having done it more than once. Is also the only 4,000-yard passer in league history to throw six or fewer INTs, having done it twice (2011 and 2014).
- Has current streaks of 418 consecutive passing attempts and 36 consecutive TD passes at home without an interception, both NFL records.
- In games that he has had five-plus passing attempts, has led the Packers to 18 straight wins at Lambeau Field in the regular season and victories in 30 of the last 31 home contests in the regular season.
- Has posted the top three single-season passer-rating marks at home in NFL history (min. 100 attempts), highlighted by his NFL-record 133.2 rating in 2014 (128.5 in 2011, 126.4 in 2013).
- Has helped the Packers average 28.5 points per game in his 103 career regular-season starts, No. 1 among quarterbacks since 1950 (min. 100 starts).
- Was named NFC Offensive Player of the Month for November, his seventh Player of the Month award. He is tied with Brady for the second most since the award was created in 1986 (Manning, eight).

2014 Season: Completed 341 of 520 passes (65.6 percent) for 4.381 vards and 38 TDs with five INTs for a 112.2 passer rating... Was named to his fourth Pro Bowl...Ranked No. 1 in the NFL this season in TD/INT ratio (7.60, 38/5), No. 2 in passer rating and yards/attempt (8.43), and No. 3 in TD passes...Was the only QB in the NFL to finish in the top three in all four of those categories...His TD/INT ratio was the fifth-best single-season mark in NFL history and No. 2 among QBs with 30-plus passing TDs, trailing only Brady's mark of 9.00 (36/4) in 2010...Posted eight games with three-plus TDs and zero INTs, which is tied with Brady (2007) for No. 1 in NFL single-season history...Was tied for No. 1 in the league this season (Manning) with eight three-TD passing games...Posted a league-high 13 zero-INT games this season (min. 15 attempts), the third most in a season in NFL history behind only Brady (14 in 2010) and Chiefs QB Steve DeBerg (14 in 1990)...Ranked No. 1 in the NFL with an interception percentage of 0.96, the seventh-best single-season mark in NFL history (min. 224 attempts) and the top mark in team annals (min. 200 attempts)...Became the first QB in NFL history to have 500-plus passing attempts and five or fewer INTs in a season...Ranked No. 1 in the NFL with a 121.7 passer rating on third down, connecting on 81 of 134 passes for 1,228 yards and 15 TDs with two INTs...Threw three TD passes of 70-plus yards this season (No. 1 in the league), and ranks No. 1 in NFL history with 16 TD passes of 70-plus yards...Posted a franchise-record seven games with a 120-plus passer rating, which was tied with Cowboys QB Tony Romo for No. 1 in the league this season...Also is tied for the third most by an NFL QB in a season since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger behind only Brady (eight in 2007) and Chargers QB Philip Rivers (eight in 2008)...Recorded a passer rating of 133.2 at home on the season (141 of 260, 2,334 yards, 25 TDs, zero INTs), the best single-season home mark (min. 100 attempts) in franchise history...Tied for the league lead with 15 completions of 40-plus yards on the season (Colts QB Andrew Luck, Steelers QB Ben Roethlisberger).

▶at Seattle Seahawks (9/4): Connected on 23 of 33 passes (69.7 percent) for 189 yards and a TD with one INT for an 81.5 passer rating.

- ▶vs. N.Y. Jets (9/14): Threw for 346 yards and three TDs with no INTs on 25-of-42 passing for a 109.8 passer rating, the fourth straight year that he posted a 100-plus passer rating in the home opener...Became just the third QB in franchise history to eclipse 3,000 career passing attempts, joining Brett Favre (8,754) and Bart Starr (3,149)...Set an NFL record with 53 INTs at the time of his 3,000th career attempt, besting the previous mark of 59 INTs by Neil O'Donnell...With his 346 passing yards, it brought his career total to 24,732 as he moved past Starr (24,718) for No. 2 on the all-time franchise list...Connected with WR Jordy Nelson on a game-winning 80-yard TD pass late in the third quarter, Rodgers' 14th career TD pass of 70-plus yards, one shy of the franchise record (Favre, 15)...Led the team back from an 18-point deficit (21-3), the biggest comeback of his career as a starter and tied for the fourth-largest comeback in franchise history.
- ▶at Detroit Lions (9/21): Completed 16 of 27 passes for 162 yards and a TD for a passer rating of 88.8...His TD pass came late in the first quarter when he threw a 10-yard bullet to TE Andrew Quarless over the middle for the score on third-and-1.
- ▶at Chicago Bears (9/28): Completed 22 of 28 passes for 302 yards and four TDs with no INTs for a 151.2 passer rating, the second-best rating of his career and the fourth best in team history...Went over the 25,000-yard mark for his career on his 15-yard completion to Nelson on a third-and-8 in the second guarter...The pass was the 3,065th attempt of his career as he set the NFL record for the fewest attempts needed to reach 25,000 passing yards, topping Kurt Warner's mark of 3,076...Became the first QB in team history to throw for 300-plus yards and four-plus TDs and register a 150-plus passer rating in the same game...Threw a pair of TD passes to both Nelson and WR Randall Cobb as they became the first Green Bay players to both post 100 receiving yards and two TD catches in the same game since Carroll Dale and Boyd Dowler hit those marks vs. the St. Louis Cardinals on Dec. 21, 1969...Led the offense to six scores (five TDs, one FG) on seven possessions...Connected on 7 of 7 passes on third down for 79 yards and two TDs for a 153.3 passer rating... Was named NFC Offensive Player of the Week for his performance, the ninth time in his career that he had earned the weekly honor.
- ▶vs. Minnesota Vikings (10/2): Completed 12 of 17 passes for 156 yards and three TDs with no INTs for a 138.7 passer rating, his sixth 130-plus rating game in his last seven starts against Minnesota...His 11-yard TD pass to WR Davante Adams in the second quarter was the 200th of his career as he reached that mark in his 99th career game, the second fastest in NFL history behind only Dolphins QB Dan Marino (89 games)...Set an NFL record for the fewest INTs by a quarterback at the time of his 200th career TD pass with 53, topping the previous mark held by Patriots QB Tom Brady (88) by 35 INTs...Connected with Nelson on a 66-yard TD pass in the second quarter, Rodgers' 21st of 60-plus yards since 2008, No. 1 in the NFL over that span...Posted his fourth straight zero-INT game, his longest streak since a four-gamer in 2012 (Weeks 14-17)...His 17 attempts on the evening tied his career low (vs. Detroit, Oct. 3, 2010) for a game he did not depart early due to injury...Exited the game after a seven-play, 52-yard TD drive that put Green Bay up 42-0 late in the third quarter.
- ▶at Miami Dolphins (10/12): Appearing in his 100th career regularseason game, led the Packers on an 11-play, 60-yard game-winning drive that was capped off with his 4-yard TD pass to TE Andrew Quarless with three seconds remaining in the 27-24 win...It marked the first time the Packers won a game on a TD with three seconds or less remaining in the fourth quarter since they beat the Bears, 20-19, on a 3-yard TD run by QB Bart Starr with three seconds left on Nov. 15, 1970...Completed 24 of 42 passes on the day for 264 yards and three TDs with zero INTs, his fifth consecutive start with no interceptions as he matched his career high set in 2010...The three TD passes brought his career total to 203, the second most in NFL history through 100 games behind only Dolphins QB Dan Marino (217)...On his 5-yard TD pass to Cobb in the third quarter, moved up in the pocket to avoid DE Cameron Wake, scrambled to his right to elude DE Olivier Vernon and LB Koa Misi, and then threw across his body to find Cobb in the end zone...On the game-winning TD drive, found Nelson for an 18-vard gain down the right sideline to convert a fourth-and-10...

After finding Cobb four plays later for a 4-yard gain to the Miami 16, raced up to the line to down the ball and stop the clock, but instead faked a spike with 12 seconds left before throwing to WR Davante Adams on the right sideline for a 12-yard pickup to the Miami 4...On the next play, went to Quarless, who was split out wide to the right and matched up with LB Philip Wheeler, on a back-shoulder throw in the end zone for the winning score...Added 34 rushing yards on the afternoon on seven attempts (4.9 avg.), his best rushing-yardage total since a 57-yard day at Indianapolis on Oct. 7, 2012.

▶vs. Carolina Panthers (10/19): Threw for 255 yards and three TDs on 19-of-22 passing for a 154.5 passer rating, the second-highest rating of his career (min. 20 attempts) and the third best in team annals...His 86.4 completion percentage was a career high and the third-best mark in team history...Posted his fourth straight three-TD/zero-INT game, joining Brady (2007) as the only QBs in NFL history to accomplish the feat in a single season...Posted his sixth straight zero-INT game, tving Bart Starr's franchise record (min. 15 attempts per game) set in 1964...With 22 attempts and no interceptions, brought his streak of consecutive attempts without an interception to 192, his career high and the second-best mark in franchise history (Starr, 294, 1964-65)...His three TD passes gave him 18 for the season as he became the first QB in NFL history to throw for 18 TD passes in the first seven games of the season with one or zero interceptions...Joined Brady (2007) as the only QBs in NFL history to register two 150-rating outings in the first seven games of the season...Completed three passes of 30-plus yards on the afternoon, highlighted by a 59-yard TD pass to Nelson on the opening drive...Also found Cobb for gains of 47 and 33 yards...Did not play in the fourth quarter (coach's decision), departing with a 38-3 lead...Was named NFC Offensive Player of the Week for his performance, the second time on the season he earned the weekly award and the 10th time he has received the honor in his career.
