### GREEN BAY ENTERS THE DRAFT WITH NINE SELECTIONS

This weekend, the Green Bay Packers will welcome another rookie class to their roster through the NFL Draft, held April 28-30 at the Auditorium Theatre of Roosevelt University in Chicago.

- ▶ Armed with seven of their own selections – plus two compensatory picks – the Packers will have plenty of opportunities to add more talent and depth to their roster. All picks are eligible to be traded except for the compensatory choices.
- ▶ Green Bay enters the draft with a pick in every round, including three selections in the fourth round.
- ▶ For the fourth straight year, the event will begin in prime time on Thursday night, with Round 1 on April 28 beginning at 7 p.m. CT.
- ▶ Rounds 2-3 also will be held in prime time, beginning on Friday, April 29, at 6 p.m. CT. Rounds 4-7 will complete the draft on Saturday, April 30, starting at 11 a.m. CT.
- ▶ Teams will have 10 minutes in between selections in the first round and seven minutes between each choice for Round 2. Rounds 3-6 will allow up to five minutes in between picks and Round 7 will allow four minutes. All compensatory selections in Rounds 3-7 will be four minutes each. ### THOMPSON LEADS PACKERS INTO ANOTHER DRAFT

GM **Ted Thompson** enters his 12th draft with the Packers, and he has long viewed the draft as the most important aspect of player acquisition.

- ▶ Thompson entered his first draft with Green Bay in 2005 armed with seven picks. Through draft-day trades, he wound up with 11 selections, highlighted by a pair of Pro Bowlers in QB **Aaron Rodgers** (first round) and S **Nick Collins** (second).
- ▶ In 2006, Thompson began draft day with seven selections, this time turning those seven picks into 12. The class included another pair of Pro Bowlers in LB **A.J. Hawk** (first) and WR **Greg Jennings** (second).
- ▶ In 2007, Thompson again used draft-day trades to acquire more selections and increase the competition for roster spots. That class included significant contributors such as WR **James Jones** (third), LB **Desmond Bishop** and K **Mason Crosby** (consecutive picks in the sixth round).
- ▶ That strategy was also implemented in 2008, as Thompson turned eight choices into 10 draft picks (nine players and a future pick). Selections such as Pro Bowl WR **Jordy Nelson** (second), TE **Jermichael Finley** (third) and Pro Bowl G **Josh Sitton** (fourth) made a significant impact.
- ▶ In 2009, the Packers entered the draft with nine selections but made one of the most dramatic moves over the course of the weekend when they traded back into the first round. After selecting DT **B.J. Raji** with the No. 9 pick, Thompson moved back into the first round to select LB **Clay Matthews** at No. 26. Though the Packers surrendered

a second-round pick and two third-round choices to New England for the opportunity to draft Matthews plus a fifth-round pick, the Southern California linebacker has proven to be well worth it, earning six selections to the Pro Bowl in his first seven years.

- ▶ In 2010, Green Bay selected T **Bryan Bulaga** in the first round at No. 23. He started 33 games from 2010-12 and 27 of 32 over the last two seasons after missing 2013 due to injury. Thompson moved up in the third round to select S **Morgan Burnett** (No. 71 overall), who has started 71 contests over the past five seasons.
- ▶ Seven of the 10 players in the 2011 draft class went on to appear in a game for Green Bay in their first season, highlighted by WR **Randall Cobb** (second round), who was named to the All-Rookie Team by *Pro Football Weekly*/PFWA as a kickoff returner and earned his first trip to the Pro Bowl in 2014.
- ▶ The Packers entered the 2012 NFL Draft with 12 picks and traded up three times. The draft was highlighted by first-round selection LB **Nick Perry**, who ranks No. 3 in franchise postseason history with six sacks, second-round selection CB **Casey Hayward**, who led all NFL rookies with six INTs in 2012 and became the first Packers CB to be named to the All-Rookie Team by *Pro Football Weekly*/PFWA since the team was first selected in 1974, and fourth-round pick DT **Mike Daniels** who has worked his way into becoming a consistent contributor, starting all 32 games over the past two seasons.
- ▶ In 2013, Thompson entered the draft with eight choices and turned that into 11 picks through draft-day trades, highlighted by RB **Eddie Lacy** (second round), who was named the NFL's Offensive Rookie of the Year by *The Associated Press*, and T **David Bakhtiari** (fourth round), who became the first Green Bay rookie to start every game at LT since the league went to a 16-game slate in 1978.
- ▶ In the 2014 draft, Thompson used four of his first six picks to draft players who all made starts as rookies: S **Ha Ha Clinton-Dix** (10), WR **Davante Adams** (11), TE **Richard Rodgers** (five) and C **Corey Linsley** (16).
- ▶ Thompson followed up the 2014 draft with another class that saw rookies make an immediate impact. Last year's draft saw each of the first four selections earn starts: CBs **Damarious Randall** (nine), **Quinten Rollins** (four), WR **Ty Montgomery** (three) and LB **Jake Ryan** (five).
- ▶ Today's roster consists of 62 players, with 35 being drafted by Thompson. Of the 20 players to start 10 or more games for the Packers in 2015, 19 of them were drafted by Thompson.

## A LOOK INTO THE DRAFT ROOM

General Manager **Ted Thompson** heads up the football operations, and he and Green Bay's coaches are well known to Packers fans. But working with Thompson is a talented and experienced football operations staff.

- Members of the personnel staff have spent months, if not years with some prospects, studying for the 2016 NFL Draft. They visit schools throughout the season, attending practices, dozens of games and pro days in the spring. In each area, they have formed relationships with high school and college coaches, trying to get a better idea of who the person is, not just the football prospect.
- Working closely with Thompson year round is Director-Football Operations **Eliot Wolf** (13th NFL season), Director of Player Personnel **Brian Gutekunst** (18th NFL season), Senior Personnel Executive **Alonzo Highsmith** (18th NFL season), West Regional Scout **Sam Seale** (21st NFL season) and Assistant Director of Pro Personnel **Tim Terry** (13th NFL season).
- Members of the scouting department include area scouts **Jon-Eric Sullivan** (13th NFL season), **John Wojciechowski** (21st NFL season) and **Richmond Williams** (ninth NFL season), pro scouts **Chad Brinker** (seventh NFL season) and **Glenn Cook** (sixth NFL season), college scouts **Mike Owen** (fifth NFL season), **Alonzo Dotson** (fourth NFL season) and **Charles Walls** (fourth NFL season), scouting assistant **Joe Hueber** (second NFL season) and college scouting coordinator **Danny Mock** (29th NFL season).

### WHO HAS BEEN THERE AT NO. 27?

With its 10-6 record and a loss in the NFC Divisional Playoffs, Green Bay will have the No. 27 selection in the first round of the 2016 NFL Draft.

- So when was the last time the Packers chose at No. 27? It was 1996, when Green Bay selected T John Michels.

- While first-round choices certainly can be the cornerstone of a franchise, as Thompson has shown with Pro Bowl selections QB **Aaron Rodgers** (2005), LB **A.J. Hawk** (2006), LB **Clay Matthews** (2009) and DT **B.J. Raji** (2009), and starters T **Bryan Bulaga** (2010) and S **Ha Ha Clinton-Dix**, second-round selections can prove to be just as valuable. WRs **Jordy Nelson** (2008) and **Randall Cobb** (2011) were both picked in the second and became the first duo in NFL history to both have 90-plus receptions, 1,200-plus yards and 12-plus touchdown receptions in the same regular season (2014). Other second-round picks included CB **Casey Hayward** (2012), who became the first CB in franchise history (since 1967) to be named to the All-Rookie Team by *Pro Football Weekly*/PFWA, and RB **Eddie Lacy** (2013), who was named the NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year by *The Associated Press* and earned a Pro Bowl selection in 2014. Lacy is the only Packer to post

1,000-plus rushing yards and 10-plus total touchdowns in both of his first two seasons.

- With 22 starters and a 53-man roster, selections in the third round often turn into significant contributors for a team. WR **James Jones** (2007), TE **Jermichael Finley** (2008), S **Morgan Burnett** (2010) and TE **Richard Rodgers** (2014) were all third-round choices under Thompson.
- The fourth and fifth rounds have also been a spot the Packers have found starters. Of the Packers' five starters on the 2014-15 offensive lines, four were drafted in the fourth or fifth round: G **Josh Sitton** (2008/fourth round), G **T.J. Lang** (2009/fourth round), T **David Bakhtiari** (2013/fourth round) and C **Corey Linsley** (2014/fifth round). A mainstay on the Packers' defensive line over the last few seasons, DT **Mike Daniels** (2012), was also drafted in the fifth round. Green Bay has also found key contributors on both sides of the ball in the fourth and fifth rounds: C/G **JC Tretter** (2013/fourth) DB **Micah Hyde** (2013/fifth), DE **Josh Boyd** (2013/fifth), TE **Andrew Quarless** (2010/fifth) and LB **Jake Ryan** (2015/fourth).
- Green Bay has received contributions from several late-round picks during Thompson's tenure, including DT **Johnny Jolly** (2006/sixth round), LB **Desmond Bishop** (2007/sixth round), K **Mason Crosby** (2007/sixth), QB **Matt Flynn** (2008/seventh), LB **Brad Jones** (2009/seventh), RB **James Starks** (2010/sixth), DE **C.J. Wilson** (2010/seventh), LB **Sam Barrington** (2013/seventh) and WR **Jeff Janis** (2014/seventh).

### 2016 SCHEDULE RELEASED

The Green Bay Packers' 96th NFL regular-season schedule – highlighted by five prime-time contests (subject to flexible scheduling) – was released April 14 by the National Football League.

- Green Bay's schedule includes five games against 2015 playoff teams. Three of those contests (Minnesota, Houston, Seattle) will be at Lambeau Field, while two (Minnesota, Washington) will come on the road.
- The Packers kick off their season on the road for the fourth consecutive year, the longest streak in team history, opening with two road games for the first time since 1924. Green Bay will travel to Jacksonville, playing on the road against an AFC team in Week 1 for the first time since facing the New England Patriots in 1985.
- Green Bay will face division opponents in Weeks 2-3, beginning with a trip to Minnesota to face the Vikings in a prime-time game and returning to Lambeau Field for the home opener against the Detroit Lions.
- For the second time in four years, the Packers will have their bye in Week 4.
- Green Bay returns to action with three consecutive home games against NFC teams over a 12-day span. In Week 5, the Packers play on Sunday night against the New York Giants. It will be the Giants' first regular-season game at Lambeau Field since 2010. The following week, Green Bay will play the Dallas Cowboys for the fourth consecutive season (including playoffs) and for the second straight year at home in the regular season. The Packers have won five straight games against the Cowboys during the regular and postseason. Green Bay finishes the homestand playing the Chicago Bears on a Thursday night for the second consecutive season (11th straight year in primetime).
- Four of the Packers' next five games will be on the road, including three road games in a row for the first time since 2012.
- After a trip to play the Atlanta Falcons in Week 8, Green Bay will face the Indianapolis Colts at home for the first time since 2008. The Packers make just their third regular-season visit to Tennessee to play the Titans in Week 10.
- Green Bay will play two primetime road games in a row, first traveling to play against the Washington Redskins on a Sunday night in Week 11 and then going to Philadelphia to face the Eagles on *Monday Night Football* in Week 12.
- Green Bay will play its first game at home in almost a month when it faces the Houston Texans in Week 13 for just the second time ever at home.
- Week 14 brings a familiar matchup as the Packers welcome the Seattle Seahawks to Lambeau Field for the second consecutive year. Including the postseason, Green Bay and Seattle will meet for the fifth time in five years.
- For the first time since 2006, the Packers will finish the regular season with three straight games against NFC North opponents.
- In Week 15, Green Bay will travel to Chicago to play the Bears. The Packers have won four consecutive games against the Bears in December, three of which were played in Chicago.
- Green Bay returns home to play the Vikings in Week 16 on Christmas Eve, playing on a Saturday for the first time since 1997.
- The Packers will finish the regular season in Detroit for the first time since 1993.
