

PACKERS STAY ON THE ROAD TO PLAY THE VIKINGS


The Green Bay Packers will take on the Minnesota Vikings in the first regular-season game played at U.S. Bank Stadium. Back in 2003, Green Bay hosted Minnesota in the first regular season game played in a renovated Lambeau Field.

- ▶ It is the first time since 1924 that the Packers have played the first two games of the regular season on the road.
- ▶This is the earliest week of the regular season that the two teams have played each other since 2008, when they met in Week 1 in Green Bav.
- ▶Of the past 28 regular-season meetings between the Packers and Vikings, 19 of those games have been decided by seven points or less.
- ▶Through 111 meetings, which includes two postseason contests (1-1). the Packers hold a 59-50-2 edge over the Vikings in the all-time series.
- ▶The Packers are 10-2-1 in the last 13 games between the teams during the regular and postseason.
- ▶The Packers have scored 30-plus points in seven of their last 11 regularseason games against Minnesota. That included a 30-point effort in the meeting at Minnesota last season, a 42-point game in 2014, a 44-point outing at Minnesota in 2013, the most points ever scored by Green Bay at the Metrodome, and a 45-point effort at Lambeau Field in 2011.
- ► Since Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** took over in 2006, the Packers have a 14-5-1 record (.725) against the Vikings in the regular season.
- ► Since 2006, the Packers have scored 20-plus points against the Vikings in 18 of 20 regular-season games. The Packers' 562 points scored in the regular season since 2006 are the most against the Vikings in the NFL, and Green Bay's 28.1 points per game leads the league among teams that have played Minnesota at least four times over that span.
- ►Including the postseason, Green Bay is 11-5 against Minnesota with Aaron Rodgers as the starting quarterback, and has won 10 of the last 12 contests.
- ▶In 17 games against the Vikings (including playoffs), Rodgers has completed 354 of 514 passes (68.9 percent) for 4,267 yards, 35 TDs and five INTs with a passer rating of 112.7. His passer rating is the highest of any opposing quarterback vs. Minnesota (min. 100 att.).
- ▶Rodgers has recorded a 100-plus passer rating in 10 of the last 14 games against the Vikings, including the postseason.
- ▶In the last seven games versus Minnesota (including playoffs), Rodgers has thrown 15 touchdowns and one interception.
- ►In 2010-11, Rodgers posted a passer rating of 140.0 or better in three contests against Minnesota (146.5 at MIN in 2011 / 141.3 at MIN in 2010 / 140.3 vs. MIN in 2011), becoming the first NFL quarterback since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to register a 140-plus passer rating in three consecutive games against the same opponent (according to the Elias Sports Bureau).
- ►According to STATS, Green Bay is 19-11 when playing indoors during the regular season since 2006. The Packers' .633 winning percentage ranks No. 1 in the NFC and No. 4 in the NFL over that time (New England, 9-3, .750 / New York Jets, 8-3, .727 / Indianapolis, 52-23, .693).
- Sunday marks the last of four consecutive road games (two preseason, two regular season) before hosting the Detroit Lions on Sept. 25. This is the first time Green Bay has closed the preseason as the away team in the final two games and opened the regular season on the road in the first two games.

- ► The broadcast is also available on Sirius Satellite Radio (WTMJ feed) as part of the network's NFL Sunday Drive.

► Green Bay's 37-34 loss at Minnesota in Week 17 of the 2012 season snapped the Packers' 12-game winning streak in regular-season NFC North games, which was the longest divisional winning streak in team history since the league went to a divisional format in 1967:

- ► Green Bay posted a winning record in divisional games in the first nine seasons under McCarthy (2006-14). The only other team in the league to accomplish that feat during that time span was the New England Patriots.
- ►The streak of nine straight seasons with a winning record in divisional games is also a franchise record, topping the previous mark of five straight from 2000-04.
- ► Among active players, Packers QB **Aaron Rodgers** leads the NFL in passer rating and is tied for the lead in passing touchdowns against division opponents since the start of the 2008 season (min. 429 pass att.):

SEPTEMBER STARTS

Under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**, Green Bay has been one of the most successful teams in the league early in the season.

- ► The Packers opened the 2016 season with a 27-23 victory at Jacksonville. It was Green Bay's 55th win in a road opener, further extending the top mark in NFL history.
- ► In 2015, Green Bay went 3-0 in September, marking the third time under McCarthy that the Packers finished the month undefeated (4-0 in 2007 and 3-0 in 2011).
- ► The Packers finished the month of September among the NFL's best in 2015:
 - Passer rating (1st, 135.4)
 - Passing touchdowns (1st, 10)
 - Turnovers (T-1st, 1)
 - Passing plays of 25-plus yards (3rd, 9)
 - Points per game (4th, 32.0)
 - Rushes of 10-plus yards (T-4th, 12)
 - Completion percentage (5th, 73.6)
 - Touchdowns scored (T-5th, 11)
 - Rushing yards per game (9th, 127.7)
- ► Since McCarthy took over in 2006, the Packers have a 23-12 (.657) mark in the month of September. Green Bay's 23 wins rank No. 1 in the NFC and are tied for No. 3 in the NFL:

- ► In the month of September under McCarthy (2006-16), the Packers rank at or near the top of the NFL in the following offensive categories:

- ►In 2015, QB Aaron Rodgers recorded a passer rating of 135.4 in the month of September. Dating back to 1970, it ranks No. 5 among NFL quarterbacks in the month of September (min. 40 pass attempts).
- ► From 2008-16, Rodgers is one of three active quarterbacks in the NFL with a passer rating of 100-plus in the month of September (min. 150 att.).

ON THE ROAD

▶The Packers won their first road game of 2016, a 27-23 victory at Jacksonville. With a 5-3 road record during the 2015 regular season (best since 2011), Green Bay finished with at least a .500 record away from Lambeau Field for the eighth time in the first 10 seasons under McCarthy.

- ► Last season, the Packers won five-plus regular-season road games for the fifth time since 2006.
- ►The Packers' 5-3 road record **tied for No. 5 in the NFL** during the 2015 regular season.
- ► Green Bay is 46-35 in regular-season away games during the McCarthy era. Its .568 road winning percentage since 2006 is No. 2 in the NFC and No. 4 in the NFL over that span:

STAT OF THE WEEK

- ►According to the Elias Sports Bureau, DT **Kenny Clark** became the youngest player to appear in a season opener for the Packers since T Joe Kurth (19 years old) in 1933.
- ►LB **Blake Martinez** became the first rookie to start on defense for Green Bay in Week 1 since LB Nick Perry in 2012.
- ▶The game-time temperature for last weeks game at Jacksonville was 90-degrees. It tied for the third-highest temperature for a Packers game (102 at San Diego in 1978 and at Arizona in 2003 / 90 at Pittsburgh in 1965 and at Tampa Bay in 1992).



MIKE McCarthy...Is in his 11th year as the Packers' 14th head coach.

- ► Joined Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl title with a win over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.
- ► Led the Packers to their seventh consecutive playoff appearance last season, joining New England as the only two NFL teams to do so over that span. Has also led the team to eight playoff appearances in the last nine years (2007, 2009-15).
- ► Guided the Packers to top-10 finishes in scoring in eight straight seasons (2007-14), joining the Patriots as the only other team to accomplish the feat over that time; Packers finished first overall in scoring in 2014.
- ► His .655 winning percentage during the regular season (105-55-1) ranks No. 2 among active NFL head coaches (min. 50 games).
- ► Was named Packers head coach on Jan. 12, 2006, his first head-coaching job after 13 years as an NFL assistant.

MIKE ZIMMER...Is in his third year as the Vikings' 10th head coach.

- ▶ In 2015, led Minnesota to its third NFC North title and first since 2009.
- ► Improved the Vikings' defense from No. 31 (2013) to No. 14 (2014) in his first season as head coach.
- Coordinated the fifth-best defense in the NFL in Cincinnati from 2008-13, allowing 316.7 yards per game.
- ▶ Coached DE Everson Griffen to 22.5 sacks over the past two seasons, the sixth best mark in the NFL over that span.
- ► Guided the Vikings to be one of four defenses to allow less than five 300-yard passers since taking command.
- ► Was the defensive coordinator in Dallas (2000-06), Atlanta (2007) and Cincinnati (2008-13) before being hired as Minnesota's head coach.

THE PACKERS-VIKINGS SERIES

- ► The Packers began the series with six straight wins before Minnesota rattled off 22 victories in 32 contests from 1964-79.
- ► Green Bay began a run of its own in 1979 that saw 16 wins over 21 games and lasted until 1990.
- ► Since winning Super Bowl XXXI, Green Bay has a 25-14-1 record against the Vikings.
- ► Over two Wild Card playoff contests, Green Bay and Minnesota have each scored 41 points and won a game by 14 points.
- ►The last time Green Bay and Minnesota met this early in a season was a Packers 24-19 victory at Lambeau Field in Week 1 of the 2008 season.

Packers DT Letroy Guion played for Minnesota from 2008-13 after being drafted by the Vikings in the fifth round (No. 152 overall) of the 2008 NFL draft...Green Bay RB Jhurell Pressley was signed by Minnesota as an undrafted free agent and spent the 2016 preseason with the Vikings... Packers assistant offensive line coach David Raih grew up in Edina. Minn. ... Packers LB Julius Peppers spent the 2009 season in Carolina with Vikings CB Captain Munnerlyn...Green Bay defensive coordinator Dom Capers coached with Minnesota defensive coordinator George Edwards in Miami for two seasons (2006-07)...Packers associate head coach/offense Tom Clements (2004-05) and quarterbacks coach Alex Van Pelt (2005) were colleagues of Vikings defensive backs coach Jerry Gray in Buffalo...Packers TE Jared Cook caught passes from Minnesota QBs Sam Bradford (2013) and Shaun Hill (2014) while in St. Louis... Green Bay defensive line coach Mike Trgovac coached with Minnesota offensive line coach Tony Sparano in Washington during the 2001 season...Sparano also coached with Green Bay defensive quality control coach Ejiro Evero in San Francisco in 2015...Evero was on the staff in San Francisco when Vikings G Alex Boone played for the 49ers...Packers senior personnel executive Alonzo Highsmith was coached in 1991 by Vikings offensive coordinator Norv Turner in Dallas and wide receivers coach Goerge Stewart in Tampa Bay when Highsmith spent the season as a running back for the Cowboys and Buccaneers...Vikings head coach Mike Zimmer was Atlanta's defensive coordinator in 2007 when Packers secondary-cornerbacks coach Joe Whitt Jr. was the Falcons' assistant defensive backs coach...Whitt Jr. coached with Minnesota assistant defensive backs coach Jonathan Gannon in Atlanta in 2007 and at Louisville from 2003-06...Cook played at South Carolina from 2006-08 with Munnerlyn...Green Bay tight ends coach Brian Angelichio coached with Vikings quality control-offense coach Andrew Janocko for one season at Rutgers (2011) and two in Tampa Bay (2012-13)...Angelichio (2008-10) and Packers wide receivers coach Luke Getsy (2010) coached at Pittsburgh with Minnesota quarterbacks coach Scott Turner...Green Bay special teams coordinator Ron Zook coached at Florida in 1991 with Edwards...Packers DT Kenny Clark (2013), QB Brett Hundley (2012-13) and DE/LB Datone Jones (2011-12) played at UCLA with Vikings LB Anthony Barr...Minnesota LB Eric Kendricks was also UCLA teammates with Clark (2013-14), Hundley (2012-14) and Jones (2011-12)...Hundley (2012) and Jones (2009-12) played with Vikings P Jeff Locke at UCLA... Minnesota LS Kevin McDermott was Bruins teammates with Hundley (2012) and Jones (2011-12)...Packers LB Clay Matthews played at Southern California with Minnesota TE Rhett Ellison and T Matt Kalil for one season (2008) and DE Everson Griffen for two years (2007-08)... Ellison (2009-11), Griffen (2009) and Kalil (2009-11) were Southern California teammates with Packers LB Nick Perry...Green Bay S Chris Banjo and Minnesota FB Zach Line played together at Southern Methodist from 2009-11...Packers LB Jayrone Elliott was a teammate of Vikings C Zac Kerin from 2010-13 at Toledo...Green Bay running backs coach Ben Sirmans and Minnesota assistant wide receivers coach Drew Petzing coached together at Boston College from 2010-11.

LAST MEETING, REGULAR SEASON

Jan. 3, 2016, Lambeau Field, Vikings won, 20-13

- ► Vikings RB Adrian Peterson mustered 67 yards on 19 carries (3.5 avg.) and the game's first TD.
- ► Green Bay held Vikings QB Teddy Bridgewater to 99 yards on 10-of-19 passing (52.6 percent) and one INT (45.7 passer rating).
- ► Minnesota had five sacks, including a strip-sack by DE Everson Griffen that was returned for a 55-yard TD by CB Captain Munnerlyn.
- ► WRs Randall Cobb and James Jones had as many receptions (10) and more yards (139) than Minnesota (99 yards on 10 rec.).



MAKING GAINS

The Packers opened the 2016 season with three pass plays 20-plus yards, including a 29-yard touchdown from QB **Aaron Rodgers** to WR **Davante Adams**. Green Bay registered 13 offensive touchdowns of 20-plus yards during the 2015 regular season, **tied for No. 7 in the NFL**:

- ▶ Rodgers completed a 61-yard touchdown pass to TE **Richard Rodgers** that gave Green Bay a win over Detroit in Week 13 last season. It was the second-longest come-from-behind game-ending touchdown in the fourth quarter from scrimmage in NFL history behind only QB Earl Morrall's 65-yard touchdown pass for Detroit against Baltimore in 1960.
- ► Since the start of 2013, the Packers are **No. 2 in the league** in pass plays of 25-plus yards during the regular season:

- ► Green Bay's big-play ability also involved special teams last season. WR **Jeff Janis** recorded two kickoff returns of 60-plus yards (64, 70) in four attempts over a two-game span (Weeks 11-12). He became the first Packer to post a kickoff return of 60-plus yards in back-to-back games since WR Robert Brooks in 1993 (Oct. 3-Oct. 10).
- ► According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Janis was the first NFL player since Houston Oilers CB Willie Tullis in 1981 to have two kickoff returns of 60-plus yards in his first four career attempts.

DEFENSIVE STRENGTH

Green Bay's defense was a key reason why the Packers won 10 games and made the playoffs last season, and was a big reason they got a victory over Jacksonville this past week.

- ► Green Bay's defense allowed 48 yards rushing on 26 carries (1.85 avg.) in Week 1 at Jacksonville. It was the first time the Jaguars rushed for 48 or fewer yards on 25-plus attempts since Nov. 14, 1999 (vs. Baltimore, 47 yards on 26 attempts).
- ►The Packers gave up the fewest rushing yards of any NFL team in Week 1:

- ►The 1.85 yards-per-carry average against Jacksconville was the seventh lowest by a Green Bay opponent (min. 20 attempts) dating back to 1970.
- ►The Packers registered three sacks against Jacksonville in Week 1. Dating back to 2015, the Packers are tied for No. 3 in the NFL in three-plus sack games:

BREAKING DOWN THE ROSTER

The Packers have a 53-man roster that is composed of 25 offensive players, 25 defensive players and three specialists.

- ▶ Of the 53 players on the roster, 47 began their pro careers with the Packers (88.7 percent) and 35 of them (66.0 percent) were draft picks of the Packers. Dating back to 2009, Green Bay has selected nine players in the first round, seven of which are still on the team.
- ► Green Bay has 15 players on the roster that began their careers as undrafted free agents, with 12 of those originally signed by Green Bay.
- ► Five 2016 undrafted rookie free agents made the opening-day roster, four who were originally signed by Green Bay (S Kentrell Brice, QB Joe Callahan, S Marwin Evans, CB Josh Hawkins) and one who was claimed off of waivers (RB Jhurell Pressley).
- ▶ 39.6 percent of the players (21 of 53) on Green Bay's roster entered the league as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as an undrafted player.
- ▶ The Packers have five players on the roster that played in the NFL prior to the 2009 season. Three of those players were draft picks of the Packers (QB Aaron Rodgers, K Mason Crosby and WR Jordy Nelson) and two (Rodgers, Nelson) have made at least one Pro Bowl.
- ▶ Only 20 of the 53 players on the roster (37.7 percent) were selected in the first three rounds of the draft, with 18 being drafted by the Packers.

TAKING CARE OF THE BALL

Since taking over as the starter in 2008, QB **Aaron Rodgers** has been one of the best in the league when it comes to limiting interceptions. He did not throw one in Week 1 against Jacksonville, threw eight during the 2015 regular season (**tied for No. 6 in the NFL**, min. 300 att.) and **ranked No. 1 in the NFL** during the 2014 regular season with five interceptions, the third fewest in a single regular season (min. 250 att.) in Packers history.

AT THE HELM

Having led Green Bay to the playoffs in eight of his first 10 seasons as head coach, **Mike McCarthy** is joined by Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl win with a victory over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.

- ► McCarthy guided the Packers to a franchise-record fourth consecutive division title in 2014.
- ►With a win at Tampa Bay in Week 16 of the 2014 season, McCarthy passed Lombardi for the No. 2 spot in team history as far as overall victories:

QB **Aaron Rodgers** has proven himself to be among the best quarter-backs in the NFL.

- ► Rodgers opened the 2016 season with a two-touchdown, zero-interception performance at Jacksonville. He finished the 2015 regular season No. 2 in the NFL with seven games with two-plus touchdown passes and zero INTs (New England QB Tom Brady, nine).
- ► Rodgers also rushed for a touchdown in Week 1, marking his 11th game with two-plus passing touchdowns and one-plus rushing touchdowns since 2008, which tied for No. among NFL QBs over that span behind Cam Newton.
- ►His 13 games (min. 15 attempts) without an interception in 2014 were the third most in a regular season in NFL history. He had nine during the 2015 regular season, tied for No. 3 in the NFL (NE QB Tom Brady, 10 / KC QB Alex Smith, 11).
- ▶ Rodgers recorded 11 touchdown passes and zero interceptions through the first four contests of the 2015 regular season to become just the third QB in NFL history to throw 11-plus touchdown passes with zero interceptions in the first four games of a season (Peyton Manning, 16/0 in 2013; Don Meredith, 14/0 in 1966).
- ▶ Rodgers reached 30 passing touchdowns (31) during the 2015 regular season for the fifth time in his career. He ranks second in team history behind Brett Favre's eight. NEW COOK IN TOWN

On top of the return of Nelson, who missed all of last season with a knee injury, the Packers receiver corps also welcomes in TE **Jared Cook**, who signed with Green Bay this past offseason.

- ► Cook was originally a third-round (89th overall) selection of the Tennessee Titans in the 2009 NFL Draft and after four seasons with the Titans spent the past three years with the St. Louis Rams.
- ► He is one of only five active tight ends (Antonio Gates, Jimmy Graham, Rob Gronkowski, Greg Olsen) to record 35 or more receptions in each of the last five seasons (2011-15).
- ► Cook has averaged 12.8 yards per reception in his career, No. 4 among active tight ends since 2009 (min. 140 rec.):

- ► Lacy (758) and Starks (601) gave the Packers two players with 600-plus rushing yards in the same season for the first time since 1985 (Jessie Clark-633 / Eddie Lee Ivery-636).
- ►Green Bay was **one of four teams in the NFL** with two players recording 600-plus rushing yards during the 2015 regular season (Carolina, Cincinnati and Denver).
- ►With 3,075 rushing yards, Lacy was **one of only two players in team history** (RB John Brockington, 3,276) to rush for 3,000-plus yards in his first three seasons in the NFL.
- ▶The Packers have recorded 25-plus carries and 100-plus yards 20 times in the last 29 regular-season games (Weeks 5-8, 10-17 of 2014 and Weeks 1-4, 11-15 of 2015), averaging at least 4 yards a carry 14 times during that span.
- ▶ Dating back to the 2013 regular season, Green Bay is 22-5 in the last 27 games it ran the ball at least 25 times, including 19-4 since the start of the 2014 regular season. The Packers are 82-18-1 under Head Coach Mike McCarthy when running the ball 25-plus times.
- ►In Weeks 11-12 last season, Lacy recorded back-to-back 100-yard rushing games for the first time in his career (100 and 105 yards).
- ► Lacy recorded a season-best 124 yards on 24 carries (5.2 avg.) in Week 14 of 2015. It fueled a rushing attack that produced 230 yards on 44 carries (5.2 avg.), the most rushing yards by the Packers in a regular-season game since Nov. 29, 2004, vs. St. Louis (231 yards on 28 carries).
- ▶In Week 14 against Dallas, Lacy also matched career highs by rushing for nine first downs (at MIN, Nov. 23, 2014) and recording five runs of 10-plus yards (at DAL, Dec. 15, 2013 / vs. MIN, Oct. 2, 2014).
- ► Starks set a career high with 993 yards from scrimmage during the 2015 regular season, surpassing the 794 he recorded in 2011.
- ► Starks was one of only five players in the NFL in 2015 with 600-plus rushing yards and 390-plus receiving yards (Devonta Freeman, Lamar Miller, Mark Ingram, Giovani Bernard).
- ► Starks put together two of the finest rushing games of his career in 2015. In Week 2, he carried the ball 20 times for 95 yards (4.8 avg.), and in Week 6, he racked up 112 yards on just 10 carries (11.2 avg.), becoming the first Packers player to rush for 100-plus yards on 10 or fewer carries since RB Brandon Jackson at Washington on Oct. 10, 2010 (115 yards on 10 carries).

- ► Starks set new career bests in receptions (43), receiving yards (392) and touchdown receptions (three) during the 2015 regular season.

- ▶In Week 11, he tied the single-game team record with five field goals and became the first player in NFL history to have five field goals of 40-plus yards in a game. In the same game, Crosby connected on a 52-yard field goal, extending his career franchise record for the most 50-yard FGs to 26.
- ► Crosby was one of five players (min. 25 att.) to connect on all extra points during the 2015 regular season. Among those five, his 36 attempts were the second most (NE Stephen Gostkowski, 52-52).
- ▶Including 2013, Crosby made 19 consecutive field goals in the regular season, until his final kick against the Bears was blocked in Week 4 of 2014. He now owns the two longest consecutive field-goal streaks in franchise history (23 straight from 2010-11).

- ▶ Peppers is the first player in NFL history with 100 career sacks and four interception returns for touchdowns. In 2014, he became the first linebacker in Packers' history to post two interception returns for touchdowns in the same season.
- ▶ Peppers is the **only player in NFL history** to register at least 10 interceptions and 100.0 sacks (since 1982):

CONTINUAL IMPACT

In his young career, DT **Mike Daniels** has seen his playing time steadily increase as well as his production. After playing in 14 games as a rookie in 2012, he has played in every game since the start of the 2013 season. He led Green Bay's defensive line with 5.5 sacks and was the team leader in quarterback hits (19) and pressures (22) during the 2014 regular season.

- ► In 2015, Daniels led the Packers' defensive line in tackles (66) and sacks (four). He finished third on the team with 12 QB hits.
- ►In Week 5 versus St. Louis last season, he tied for the team lead with a career-best nine tackles (eight solo).
- ▶ Daniels registered his first career interception in Week 16 at Arizona, returning it 23 yards. According to STATS LLC, it was the first interception by a Packers DT since Cullen Jenkins on Oct. 18, 2009. Dating back to 1960, his 23-yard interception return was the longest by a Green Bay DT on an interception.
- ▶Daniels is third on the Packers with 16.0 sacks since the start of the 2013 season (Peppers-17.5 / Matthews-26.0). His 16.0 sacks are tied for No. 9 among NFL defensive tackles over that span, according to STATS LLC:

- ► Green Bay has held opposing starting quarterbacks to a passer rating of less than 80 in 53 of 113 games since 2009, including 14 of its last 33 games. The Packers have a **47-5 mark (.904)** in those contests.
- ▶ During the 2015 regular season, the Packers ranked No. 7 in the NFL in opponent passer rating (80.1).

DEFENSE SHIELD

The Packers' secondary is led by veteran cornerback **Sam Shields**, who earned his first trip to the Pro Bowl after the 2014 season.

- ►With three interceptions during the 2015 regular season (tied for the team high), Shields has registered multiple interceptions in each season from 2010-15.
- ►In 2015, he recorded interceptions in back-to-back games for the first time in his career (Weeks 3-4).
- ►Including playoffs, Shields is tied for No. 2 in the NFL among active players in interceptions since 2010:

► Shields registered an interception during the 2014 NFC Championship Game at Seattle, giving him a franchise-record five career interceptions in the postseason.

ON THE RISE

S Ha Ha Clinton-Dix has been a presence on the Packers defense since his rookie season.

- ► After starting 10 of 16 games and both postseason contests as a rookie, he has started every game since 2015.
- ►Clinton-Dix finished second on the team with 95 tackles (73 solo) in 2014 and led the Packers with 117 tackles (97 solo) last season.
- ► He registered a total of three interceptions last season (including playoffs). He tied for fourth on the team with two during the regular season and registered one in the postseason.
- ► According to STATS LLC, his three sacks during the 2015 regular season were tied for the fifth most in a single regular season by a Packers safety (since 1982) and the most since Mark Roman recorded 3.5 in 2004.
- ► Clinton-Dix's three sacks also tied for **No. 3** in the **NFL** in 2015 among safeties.
- ▶ During the 2015 regular season, he registered eight-plus tackles in eight games, including setting career highs in both total tackles (12) and solo tackles (11) in the Week 10 game vs. Detroit, in which he also registered an interception.

GOOD FIRST IMPRESSION

Packers rookie CBs **Damarious Randall** and **Quinten Rollins** stepped in and contributed early in their careers.

- ► In Week 1 they both tied for the team lead with two passes defensed.
- ▶ Both Randall and Rollins returned an interception for a touchdown last season, marking the first time the Packers had two rookies/first-year players post INT returns for TDs in the same season since 1921 (Nate Abrams, Billy DuMoe).
- ► Randall led the Packers with 16 passes defensed and tied for the team lead with three interceptions. He also registered an interception in the postseason.
- ▶Both players ranked near the top of NFL rookies in interceptions during the 2015 regular season:

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

Green Bay went 7-1 away from Lambeau Field in 2011, with the seven road wins setting a single-season franchise record.

- ►The Packers have been able to stay above the .500 mark on the road during Head Coach Mike McCarthy's tenure, a notable achievement in the National Football League.
- ►Since 2006, McCarthy's first season as the head coach in Green Bay, only nine of 32 NFL teams have regular-season road records above .500.

317 AND COUNTING

Another packed house at Lambeau Field against the Vikings last season in Week 17 brought the stadium's consecutive-sellouts streak to 317 regular-season games (not including replacement games).

- ▶The league's longest-tenured stadium, Lambeau Field is hosting its 60th season of football in 2016. Including the playoffs, a total of 704,818 fans made their way through the turnstiles for the nine games last season. For the victory over Dallas in the Divisional round, Packers fans set a new Lambeau Field paid attendance record (79,704).
- ► Across American professional sports, only Boston's Fenway Park (1912) and Chicago's Wrigley Field (1914) have longer tenures.

THE LAMBEAU ADVANTAGE

The crown jewel of the National Football League, Lambeau Field has long been known as one of the tougher venues to play in, particularly during the harsh Wisconsin winter.

- ▶Re-establishing home-field advantage after a 4-4 mark in 2008 was one of the goals of 2009, and with the Packers finishing 6-2 at home, they accomplished that goal. Green Bay followed that up with a 7-1 mark at Lambeau Field in 2010, a perfect 8-0 record in 2011, the first undefeated home mark since 2002, and a 7-1 mark in 2012. The Packers were one of two teams to finish undefeated at home during the 2014 regular season (Denver).
- ► Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** stated consistently upon his arrival in Green Bay that one of the team's goals would be to reclaim the mystique of playing at Lambeau Field. Mission accomplished. The team is 59-20-1 (.744) at home in the regular season since 2006, **No. 2 in the NFL.**
- ► Since Ron Wolf and Mike Holmgren began the revitalization of the franchise in 1992, Green Bay owns the best home record in the NFL. A look at the top regular-season home W-L records since the '92 season:

A LOOK AT THE SCHEDULE

The Green Bay Packers' 96th NFL regular-season schedule is headlined by five prime-time games (subject to flexible scheduling).

- ► Green Bay's schedule includes five games against 2015 playoff teams. Three of those contests (Minnesota, Houston, Seattle) will be at Lambeau Field, while two (Minnesota, Washington) will come on the road.
- ▶ The Packers kicked off their season on the road for the fourth consecutive year, the longest streak in team history, opening with two road games for the first time since 1924. Green Bay traveled to Jacksonville, playing on the road against an AFC team in Week 1 for the first time since facing the New England Patriots in 1985.
- ► Green Bay faces division opponents in Weeks 2-3, beginning with a trip to Minnesota to face the Vikings in a prime-time game and returning to Lambeau Field for the home opener against the Detroit Lions.
- ► For the second time in four years, the Packers will have their bye in Week 4.
- ▶Green Bay returns to action with three consecutive home games against NFC teams over a 12-day span. In Week 5, the Packers play on Sunday night against the New York Giants. It will be the Giants' first regular-season game at Lambeau Field since 2010. The following week, Green Bay will play the Dallas Cowboys for the fourth consecutive season (including playoffs) and for the second straight year at home in the regular season. The Packers have won five straight games against the Cowboys during the regular and postseason. Green Bay finishes the homestand playing the Chicago Bears on a Thursday night for the second consecutive season (11th straight year in primetime).
- ► Four of the Packers' next five games will be on the road, including three road games in a row for the first time since 2012.
- ▶ After a trip to play the Atlanta Falcons in Week 8, Green Bay will face the Indianapolis Colts at home for the first time since 2008. Five of the last seven matchups between Green Bay and Indianapolis have been decided by seven or fewer points. The Packers make just their third regular-season visit to Tennessee to play the Titans in Week 10. Green Bay is looking for its first victory at the Titans since they moved to Tennessee in 1997
- ► Green Bay will play two prime-time road games in a row, first traveling to play against the Washington Redskins on a Sunday night in Week 11 and then going to Philadelphia to face the Eagles on *Monday Night Football* in Week 12. It marks the 24th consecutive season (1993-2016) that Green Bay is appearing on *MNF*.
- ► Green Bay will play its first game at home in almost a month when it faces the Houston Texans in Week 13 for just the second time ever at home.
- ►Week 14 brings a familiar matchup as the Packers welcome the Seattle Seahawks to Lambeau Field for the second consecutive year. Including the postseason, Green Bay and Seattle will meet for the fifth time in five years.
- ► For the first time since 2006, the Packers will finish the regular season with three straight games against NFC North opponents.
- ►In Week 15, Green Bay will travel to Chicago to play the Bears. The Packers have won four consecutive games against the Bears in December, three of which were played in Chicago.
- ► Green Bay returns home to play the Vikings in Week 16 on Christmas Eve, playing on a Saturday for the first time since 1997. The Packers last played on Christmas Eve in 2004, a 34-31 victory at Minnesota. Including playoffs, Green Bay has a 8-2-1 mark (.773) against the Vikings at Lambeau Field under McCarthy.
- ► The Packers will finish the regular season in Detroit for the first time since 1993. Green Bay has won seven of 10 games at Ford Field under McCarthy. It will be only the third time the Packers have played at the Lions during the regular season in the month of January (1983, 1994).

PACKERS STARTERS - OFFENSE

WR Jordy Nelson, 9th Year, Kansas State, D2a-08

- Registered 50th career touchdown reception in Week 1 to move past WR James Lofton and tie WR Max McGee for No. 6 in Packers history
- ► Missed all of the 2015 season due to a knee injury suffered in the preseason.
- Finished the 2014 regular season ranked fourth in receiving yards (1,519), seventh in receptions (98) and tied for second in receiving touchdowns (13). Earned first selection to the Pro Bowl.

► Led the team in 2013 with 85 catches for 1,314 yards and eight TDs. Ranked No. 10 in the NFL that season in receiving yards.

▶ With 15 TD catches in 2011, became only the third player in franchise history to catch 15 or more TDs in a season, joining WRs Sterling Sharpe (18 in 1994) and Don Hutson (17 in 1942).

Became the first player since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to post three 80-yard TD grabs over an eight-game span in the regular season (Week 16, 2010-Week 6, 2011).

LT David Bakhtiari, 4th Year, Colorado, D4a-13

- ► Has started all but two games at LT since the start of the 2013 regular season. Missed final two games of the 2015 regular season due to injury.
- ► Started all 16 games at left tackle in 2013, the only rookie in the NFL to do so in 2013 and the first Packer rookie to do so since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.
- ▶ Became just the fourth Green Bay rookie to start at LT in the season opener since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger and the first since 1985.

LG Lane Taylor, 4th Year, Oklahoma State, FA-13

- ► Has played in 31 regular-season games for the Packers with three starts.
- ▶ Made the first starts of his career in 2015, opening at RG at Detroit in Week 13 in place of an injured T.J. Lang and at LG in Week 17 vs. Minnesota with Josh Sitton sliding to LT in place of an injured David
- ► A four-year letterman at OSU, starting 47 of 50 games played at right guard. Unanimous first-team All-Big 12 selection by the conference's coaches as a senior.

C J.C Tretter, 4th Year, Cornell, D4b-13

- Set career highs with 16 games played and three starts (all at C) during the 2015 regular season. Also started at LT in the NFC Wild Card game at Washington.
- ► Has seen game action at C, LG and both T spots during his career.
- ► Was on track to be the starting C in 2014, opening at that position for the first three preseason games, but sustained a knee injury vs. Oakland (Aug. 22) that would sideline him for the first half of the season. Returned to play in the final eight games and both postseason contests.
- ► Grew from a high school quarterback, running back and slot receiver into an All-American LT in college, starting 20 consecutive games in his final two seasons at Cornell.

RG T.J. Lang, 8th Year, Eastern Michigan, D4-09

- ► Has started games at four different positions on the line as a pro (48 at RG, 27 at LG, five at RT, two at LT). Played C in Week 10 in 2013.
- ► Has started 79 contests since 2011.
- Started games at both tackle spots in his first season (2009) and became the first Packers rookie to start consecutive games at left tackle since Chad Clifton in 2000.
- ▶ Began his college career as a defensive lineman, but converted to the offensive line as a sophomore and started 36 straight games (10 at RT, 26 at LT) over his final three years.

RT Bryan Bulaga, 7th Year, Iowa, D1-10

- ► Has started 28 of 33 games since the start of the 2014 season.
- ► Missed the second part of the 2012 season after suffering a hip injury vs. Arizona on Nov. 4 and missed all of the 2013 season after injuring his knee on Aug. 3.
- ▶ Started 37 games at RT in his first three seasons in the league.
- ► Started the final 12 games of 2010 and the entire postseason at right tackle after taking over for veteran Mark Tauscher (shoulder).
- ▶ Named to the *Pro Football Weekly*/PFWA All-Rookie team in 2010.
- ► Capped his rookie season by becoming the youngest player at the time, according to STATS LLC, to ever start in the Super Bowl (21 years, 322 days).

TE Richard Rodgers, 3rd Year, California, D3a-14

- ▶ Including the postseason, has registered one or more receptions in 27 of the last 29 games.
- Finished second on the team in 2015 in receptions (58), becoming the fourth TE in team history with 55-plus receptions in a season: Jermichael Finley (three), Paul Coffman (two), Jackie Harris (one).

 Mas 10 career receiving TDs, tied for the most by a Green Bay TE in his

- first two seasons since the 1970 merger (Bubba Franks, 10, 2000-01).

 Set a regular-season franchise record for a tight end with 146 yards on eight receptions (18.3 avg.), including a game-winning 61-yard touch-down catch with no time on the clock, at Detroit in Week 13.
- ► Played in all 16 games with five starts as a rookie in 2014, and became the first rookie TE to start for the Packers in a season opener since Harris opened in a two-tight-end set in 1990.

WR Randall Cobb, 6th Year, Kentucky, D2-11

- ▶Led the team in receptions (79), was No. 2 in receiving yards (829) and was No. 3 in touchdown receptions (six) in 2015.
- ➤ Set a new single-season career high with five 100-yard receiving games during the 2014 season (three-2012). Earned first trip to the Pro Bowl.
- ►His career-best 91 receptions in 2014 were the seventh most in team
- Finished the regular season tied for fourth in the NFL with 12 touchdown receptions in 2014.
- ► Before suffering a knee injury in Week 6 in 2013, led the team in receptions with 29 and was No. 2 in receiving yards with 378
- ▶ Set a franchise single-season record with a league-high 2,342 combined net yards in 2012, topping the previous team mark of 2,250 yards by RB Ahman Green in 2003.

QB Aaron Rodgers, 12th Year, California, D1-05

- ► Earned his fifth selection to the Pro Bowl in 2015, passing Bart Starr (1960-62, 1966) for the second-most selections by a Green Bay quarterback behind Brett Favre's nine (1992-93, 1995-97, 2001-03, 2007).

 His career passer rating of 104.1 ranks No. 1 in NFL history.
- Finished the 2014 regular season ranked No. 2 in the NFL in passer rating (112.2), touchdown percentage (7.3), No. 1 in interception percent-
- age (1.0) and No. 3 in touchdown passes (38).

 ► In 120 regular-season starts (80-40 record), has posted 43 games with 300-plus passing yards, 71 without an interception and 67 with a 100plus passer rating (min. 15 attempts).
- ▶Recorded a passer rating of at least 120.0 in seven regular-season games in 2014, setting a single-season career high and tying for the third most in a single season in the NFL, dating back to 1960

▶ Posted 21,332 passing yards from 2008-12, which ranks No. 1 in league history for the most passing yards by a QB in his first five seasons as a starter (previous record was Peyton Manning, 20,618, 1998-2002).

▶ In 2011, set an NFL record with a 122.5 passer rating and set franchise marks for TD passes (45), passing yards (4,643), completion percentage (68.3), yards per attempt (9.25) and 300-yard games (eight) on his way to earning NFL Most Valuable Player honors from *The Associated* Press.

RB Eddie Lacy, 4th Year, Alabama, D2-13

- ► With 3,075 rushing yards from 2013-15, became one of only two players in team history (RB John Brockington, 3,276) to rush for 3,000-plus yards in his first three seasons in the NFL.
- ▶With 758 rushing yards in 2015, he and James Starks (601) gave the Packers two players with 600-plus rushing yards in the same regular season for the first time since 1985 (Jessie Clark-633/Eddie Lee Ivery-636).

▶Became the first player in team history to post 1,000 rushing yards and 10-plus total TDs in both of his first two seasons.

With 1,139 rushing yards in 2014, became the fifth player in franchise

- history to record consecutive 1,000-yard rushing seasons (Ryan Grant, 2008-09 / Ahman Green, 2000-04 / John Brockington, 1971-73 / Jim Taylor, 1960-64)
- ► Ranks No. 1 in franchise history for the most rushing yards by a rookie (1,178) in a single season, No. 1 in attempts (284), and tied for No. 1 for most 100-yard rushing games with four (Brockington, four in 1971).

FB Aaron Ripkowski, 2nd Year, Oklahoma, D6a-15

- ► Played in 15 games as a rookie, seeing action primarily on special teams.
- Tied for No. 4 on the team with nine special teams tackles last season.
- ▶ Began collegiate career as a walk-on and went on to play in 47 games with 17 starts.



PACKERS STARTERS - DEFENSE

DE Dean Lowry, Rookie, Northwestern, D4b-16

- ▶ Played in 48 games with 33 starts in college and registered 134 tackles (83 solo), including 31.5 tackles for a loss, 12.5 sacks, three interceptions (one returned for a TD), 21 passes defensed, three fumble recoveries and three forced fumbles.
- ► Earned second-team All-Big Ten honors as a senior in 2015 after posting 46 tackles (27 solo), including 13.5 tackles for a loss (second on the team), three sacks, an interception, a fumble recovery and seven passes defensed.
- ▶ Named honorable mention All-Big Ten as a junior in 2014 and was named to ESPN.com's Big Ten All-Freshman team in 2012.

NT Letroy Guion, 9th Year, Florida State, FA-14

- ► Has started 21 of the 30 regular-season games he has played since the start of the 2014 season.
- ➤ Signed with Green Bay during the 2014 offseason after spending his first six NFL seasons with the Minnesota Vikings.
- ► Started all 28 games he appeared in for Minnesota in 2012-13, recording 72 tackles (32 solo) and three sacks over that span.
- ► Was the only Viking to block a field goal in both 2011 and 2012.

DT Mike Daniels, 5th Year, Iowa, D4a-12

- ► Ranks third on the team with 16.0 sacks since the start of the 2013 regular season (LB Julius Peppers-17.5 / LB Clay Matthews-26.0).
- ▶Led the defensive line in both tackles and sacks each of that last two seasons.
- ► Returned a fumble 43 yards for a TD vs. Detroit in Week 14 of 2012, the longest fumble return for a TD by a rookie in franchise history.
- ► Starred as an interior pass rusher at lowa, posting a team-high 24.5 tackles for a loss and 13 sacks from 2010-11.

LOLB Nick Perry, 5th Year, Southern California, D1-12

- ▶ Registered mulitple sacks in each of his first four seasons in the NFL and has posted a two-sack game in each of the last three seasons (2013-15).
- ► Has totaled six sacks in five playoff games, including 3.5 in the 2015 postseason which tied Clay Matthews (2010) for the franchise record in a single posteason.
- ► His six postseason sacks rank No. 3 in franchise history behind Matthews (10) and Reggie White (eight) and are the most in team history (since 1982) by a player in his first five games with Green Bay.

ILB Jake Ryan, 2nd Year, Michigan, D4-15

- ► Started the final five games of the regular season and both playoff contests in 2015.
- ▶ Recorded a team-best nine tackles (eight solo) and one fumble recovery in Week 13 at Detroit in his first pro start.
- ➤ Served as a team captain for his final two seasons at Michigan and was a three-time winner (2012-14) of the Roger Zatkoff Award, given to the Wolverines top linebacker. He was the only player to win the award (est. 1991) three times.
- ► Joined LB John Anderson (first round, 26th overall) as the only Michigan linebackers ever drafted by Green Bay.
- Started 41 of 46 games played in college, appearing at inside linebacker as a senior after spending his first three seasons at outside linebacker and defensive end.

ILB Blake Martinez, Rookie, Stanford, D4a-16

- ▶ Became the first rookie to start on defense for Green Bay in Week 1 since Nick Perry in 2012.
- ► Finished collegiate career with 257 tackles (137 solo), 13.5 tackles for a loss, 6.5 sacks, five interceptions and five forced fumbles in 51 games played.
- Started all 27 games played in his final two seasons, leading the team in tackles as a junior (102) and senior (141).
- ► Led the Pacific-12 and ranked No. 7 nationally with 141 tackles (75 solo) as a senior, averaging a conference-best 10.1 tackles per game.

ROLB Clay Matthews, 8th Year, Southern California, D1b-09

- Selected to his sixth Pro Bowl and first as an inside linebacker in 2015 after recording 6.5 sacks (second on the team), 15 QB hits (No. 1 on the team), and a career-high 85 tackles (No. 2 on the team).
- ► Tied with Reggie White (68.5) for the second most sacks in Packers history (Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila, 74.5).
- ▶ With a team-high 11.0 sacks in 2014, is tied for the most 10-plus sack seasons in franchise history (four).
- ► His six Pro Bowl selections are two more than any other Packers LB.
- ▶ Is the only player in franchise history to score a defensive TD (interception or fumble return) in each of his first three seasons in the NFL (2009-11).
- Named first-team All-Pro by The Associated Press in 2010, the first Green Bay LB to earn that honor since Tim Harris in 1989. Finished second to Pittsburgh safety Troy Polamalu in the AP's Defensive Player of the Year voting.

LCB Damarious Randall, 2nd Year, Arizona State, D1-15

- ▶ Played in 15 games with nine starts (six at LCB, two at RCB, one in the slot) in 2015 and tied for the team lead and No. 2 among NFL rookies with three interceptions, including one he returned for a TD. Finished with a team-best 16 passes defensed.
- Named the NFL's Defensive Rookie of the Month for November 2015, joining CB Casey Hayward (October 2012) as the only Green Bay defensive backs to win the award.
- ► Earned first-team All-Pacific-12 honors at safety as a senior in 2014 after he led the Sun Devils in tackles (106) and passes defensed (12) and tied for the team lead with three interceptions.

RCB Sam Shields, 7th Year, Miami, FA-10

- ▶ Despite missing four games due to injury, tied for the team lead with three interceptions and ranked No. 2 in passes defensed (13) during the 2015 regular season.
- Recorded interceptions in back-to-back games in 2015 (Weeks 3-4) for the first time in his career.
- Finished second on the team with 13 passes defensed in 2014 to go along with two interceptions. Earned first career trip to the Pro Bowl.
- Started all 14 games he appeared in during the 2013 season and led the team with four INTs (tied career high) and a career-best 25 passes defensed.
- ► In Green Bay's NFC Championship Game win over Chicago in the 2010 season, became the first rookie in NFL history to record two INTs and a sack in a postseason contest.

SS Morgan Burnett, 7th Year, Georgia Tech, D3-10

- ► Missed five games due to injury in 2015, but finished No. 4 on the team with 54 solo tackles.
- ▶ Totaled a team-high 125 tackles in 2014, the second most of his career (137 in 2012). Ranked No. 2 on the team with 106 tackles (77 solo) in 2013, despite missing the first three games due to injury. Recovered three fumbles, including one for a TD, and added nine passes defensed.
- ► Participated in all 1,088 plays for Green Bay's defense in 2012, one of only four non-OL in the NFL to appear in 100 percent of his team's snaps.
- ▶ Enjoyed his first full season as a pro in 2011, joining DT B.J. Raji as the only two Green Bay defensive players to start all 16 regular-season games
- ► Started the first four games of the 2010 season at SS before sustaining a season-ending knee injury vs. Detroit in Week 4.

FS Ha Ha Clinton-Dix, 3rd Year, Alabama, D1-14

- ► Led the team in tackles in 2015 with 117 (97 solo) and was tied for fourth on the team in interceptions (two).
- ► According to STATS LLC, his three sacks during the 2015 regular season tied for the fifth most in a single regular season by a Packers safety (since 1982) and the most since Mark Roman recorded 3.5 in 2004.
- Started every game in 2015 after starting 10 of 16 games as a rookie when he finished second on the team in tackles (95).
- ► Was the second safety ever drafted by Green Bay in the first round (Alabama S George Teague, No. 29 overall in 1993).
- Was a consensus All-America selection in 2013 as a junior, earning first-team recognition from The Associated Press, the Football Writers Association of America and Sporting News.

21 Ha Ha Clinton-Dix, S, 3rd Year, Alabama

- Set career highs with 16 starts, two interceptions and a team-leading 117 tackles (97 solo) in 2015. Also recorded a career-best three sacks, the most by a Green Bay safety in a season since Mark Roman had 3½ in 2004.
- Played in all 16 games in 2014, starting the final 10 (nine at FS, one at SS), the most starts by a Green Bay rookie safety since Nick Collins opened all 16 in 2005.
- Ranked No. 2 on the team in tackles with 95 (73 solo) and was named to the PFWA's All-Rookie team.
- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Started at FS and played all 72 snaps, joining fellow S Morgan Burnett as the only Green Bay defenders to do so... Registered five tackles (four solo), a forced fumble and a pass defensed... Drilled WR Allen Robinson near the 5-yard line with just over six minutes remaining in the game to break up a deep pass from QB Blake Bortles... 18 Randall Cobb, WR, 6th Year, Kentucky

- Started all 16 games in 2014 and posted career highs in catches (91), receiving yards (1,287) and receiving TDs (12) on the way to earning his first career Pro Bowl selection (injury replacement for WR Dez Bryant).
- Became just the fifth player in franchise history to register 90-plus receptions in a season, joining WRs Sterling Sharpe, Robert Brooks, Donald Driver and Jordy Nelson.
- Set a franchise single-season record with a league-high 2,342 combined net yards in 2012, topping the previous team mark of 2,250 yards by RB Ahman Green in 2003.
- With 954 receiving yards and 964 kickoff return yards in 2012, became the first player in NFL history to post 900-plus yards in each category in the same season.
- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Was tied for the team lead with six receptions for a team-best 57 yards (9.5 avg.)...Early in the third quarter, found an opening in the middle of the field to catch a team-long 32-yard pass from QB Aaron Rodgers, juggling the ball but securing it as he went to the ground at the Jacksonville 31.

89 Jared Cook, TE, 8th Year, South Carolina

- Signed with the Packers as a free agent in March 2016 after spending three seasons with the St. Louis Rams (2013-15) and four with the Tennessee Titans (2009-12).
- Posted at least 35 receptions each season from 2011-15, one of only five active tight ends in the NFL to do so (Antonio Gates, Jimmy Graham, Rob Gronkowski, Greg Olsen).
- Ranks No. 2 among NFL tight ends with a 13.0-yard receiving average since 2011, trailing only Gronkowski (14.8 avg.) over that span.
- Has made 32 catches of 25-plus yards since '11, tied for No. 3 in the league among TEs over that time period behind only Gronkowski (49) and Graham (41).
- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Started in his Green Bay debut, seeing action on 33 plays with one catch for 7 yards...Drew a critical 30-yard pass-interference penalty on S Johnathan Cyprien late in the first half that helped set up QB Aaron Rodgers' 29-yard TD pass to WR Davante Adams.

2 Mason Crosby, K, 10th Year, Colorado

- With 1,154 career points, ranks No. 1 on the all-time franchise scoring list, having surpassed K Ryan Longwell (1,054) last season vs. Seattle in Week 2
- Ranks No. 2 in NFL history for the most points by a player in his first nine seasons (1,145, 2007-15), trailing only Patriots K Stephen Gostkowski (1,179, 2006-2014).
- Is one of only three players in league history to register three or more 140-point seasons (Gostkowski, David Akers).

- Has registered a franchise-record nine consecutive 100-point seasons, the longest active streak in the NFL.
- Has kicked the seven longest field goals in franchise history (58-yarder in 2011, two 57-yarders in 2013, 56-yarders in 2010, 2011 and 2015, 55-yarder in 2014).
- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Connected on both of his field-goal attempts (25, 20 yards) and all three extra points...Registered four touchbacks on six kickoffs.

76 Mike Daniels, DT, 5th Year, Iowa

- Named an alternate for the Pro Bowl for the first time in his career in 2015 after starting all 16 games and leading the defensive line with 66 tackles (40 solo), four sacks, an interception, a forced fumble and two passes defensed. Finished No. 3 on the team in QB hits (12) and No. 2 in pressures (22).
- Started all 16 games for the first time in his career in 2014 and registered a career-high 69 tackles. Led the team in both QB hits (19) and pressures (22).

- As a junior, earned first-team All-Pacific-12 honors at kick returner from *Phil Steele's College Football* after ranking No. 2 nationally and leading the Pac-12 by averaging 32.6 yards per kickoff return, a school record.

91 Jayrone Elliott, LB, 3rd Year, Toledo

- Set career highs in games played (14), tackles (17), solo tackles (14), interceptions (one), passes defensed (two), forced fumbles (one) and sacks (three) in 2015. Ranked No. 3 on the team with a career-best 11 special teams tackles.
- After making the 53-man roster, played in 13 regular-season games and both postseason contests as a rookie in 2014, contributing primarily on special teams.
- Finished the season with 15 special teams tackles in '14, No. 1 among Packers rookies and No. 2 on the team behind S Sean Richardson (17).
- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Inactive (hamstring).

25 Marwin Evans, S, Rookie, Utah State

- Was one of five rookie free agents to make Green Bay's Week 1 roster.
- Started 13 of 27 games played at Utah State, totaling 83 tackles (36 solo), including 10 for a loss, two sacks, an interception for a 90-yard touchdown return, five pass breakups and three forced fumbles.
- Started all 13 games played as a senior in 2015, recording career highs in tackles (73), solo tackles (33), tackles for a loss (10), sacks (two), interceptions (one), pass breakups (five) and forced fumbles (two).
- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Played six snaps on special teams in his NFL debut.

51 Kyler Fackrell, LB, Rookie, Utah State

- Was named first-team All-Mountain West as a senior in 2015 after ranking first in the nation with five fumble recoveries and posting a school-record 12 QB hurries.

- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Played 24 snaps on defense, registering two tackles (one solo).

28 Josh Hawkins, CB, Rookie, East Carolina

- Was one of five rookie free agents to make Green Bay's opening-day roster.
- Started 28 of 50 career games played at East Carolina, totaling 139 tackles (88 solo), including 3½ for a loss, a forced fumble, nine interceptions and 22 pass breakups.
- Opened 10 of 12 games played as a senior in 2015, logging 42 tackles (27 solo), two interceptions for 100 return yards, and four pass breakups.
- ▶ At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Inactive (hamstring).

7 Brett Hundley, QB, 2nd Year, UCLA

 Served as the No. 3 QB behind Aaron Rodgers and Scott Tolzien in 2015 and was inactive for all 16 regular-season games and both playoff contests.

- Led the NFL with 630 passing yards in the 2015 preseason, completing 45 of 65 passes (69.2 percent) for seven TDs with one INT for a 129.6 passer rating (No. 3 in the NFL).
- Registered a 142.4 passer rating in the preseason finale vs. New Orleans (Sept. 3), connecting on 16 of 23 passes for 236 yards and four TDs with no INTs.
- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Served as the No. 2 QB, but did not see any action.

33 Micah Hyde, DB, 4th Year, Iowa

83 Jeff Janis, WR, 3rd Year, Saginaw Valley State

- Registered seven catches for 145 yards (20.7 avg.) and two TDs in an NFC Divisional playoff contest at Arizona last season, becoming the first player in franchise history to record seven-plus receptions, 140-plus receiving yards and two-plus TD catches in a postseason game.

27 Eddie Lacy, RB, 4th Year, Alabama

- Ranks No. 5 in the league in rushing yards (3,136) and No. 4 in rushing TDs (23) since 2013.
- With 3,075 rushing yards from 2013-15, joined RB John Brockington (3,276, 1971-73) as the only two players in franchise history to rush for 3,000-plus yards in their first three seasons in the NFL.
- Is one of only two NFL players (Bills RB LeSean McCoy) to have three or more 100-yard rushing games each season from 2013-15.
- With 1,178 rushing yards in 2013 and 1,139 in 2014, became just the fifth player in franchise history to register back-to-back 1,000-yard rushing seasons.
- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Led the team with 61 rushing yards on 14 attempts (4.4 avg.), highlighted by a 28-yard run late in the third quarter...Took the handoff to the right side, first cutting left before cutting

right at the second level as he made S Tashaun Gipson miss as he took the ball to the Jacksonville 17, a run that would help set up K Mason Crosby's 20-yard FG...Added a 17-yard catch on a screen pass in the second quarter, bouncing off a tackle attempt by S Johnathan Cyprien and then diving over Gipson at the end of the play.

70 T.J. Lang, G, 8th Year, Eastern Michigan

- Has started $\overline{79}$ games over the past five-plus seasons (2011-16), the most by any Green Bay player on the offensive side of the ball over that span.
- Opened all 15 contests he played in at RG in 2015 and was named a Pro Bowl alternate for the second straight season.
- Has started 82 games during his career, opening contests at four different positions (48 at RG, 27 at LG, five at RT, two at LT).
- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Started at RG and played all 64 snaps... Helped protect QB Aaron Rodgers as he was sacked just one time on the afternoon and as he threw for 199 yards and two TDs on 20-of-34 passing with a rushing TD.

94 Dean Lowry, DE, Rookie, Northwestern

- Earned second-team All-Big Ten honors as a senior in 2015 after posting 46 tackles (27 solo), including 13½ tackles for a loss (second on the team), three sacks, an interception, a fumble recovery and seven passes defensed.
- Set a school single-game record and tied the sixth-best mark in conference history with six tackles for a loss in Northwestern's win at Nebraska in 2015.
- Was an honorable mention All-Big Ten choice as a junior in 2014 after recording 41 tackles (25 solo), including eight tackles for a loss, four sacks, a forced fumble and eight passes defensed.
- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Appeared on seven defensive plays in his NFL debut.

50 Blake Martinez, LB, Rookie, Stanford

- Finished his collegiate career with 257 tackles (137 solo), 13½ tackles for a loss, 6½ sacks, five interceptions and five forced fumbles in 51 games played. Led the team in tackles as a junior (102) and senior (141).
- Led the Pacific-12 and ranked seventh nationally with 141 tackles (75 solo) as a senior, averaging a conference-best 10.1 tackles per game. Recorded 84 more tackles than the No. 2 tackler on the team.

52 Clay Matthews, LB, 8th Year, Southern California

- Is tied for No. 2 in franchise history with 68.5 career sacks (DE Reggie White), trailing only DE Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila (74.5).
- Has earned six Pro Bowl selections in his seven-year career, two more than any Packers linebacker and tied with White for the second-most selections by a defensive player in team history, trailing only S Willie Wood (eight).
- Became the first player in franchise history to earn Pro Bowl recognition in each of his first four seasons in the league (2009-12).
- Is tied for No. 1 in franchise history (since 1982) with four 10-sack seasons (White and Gbaja-Biamila).
- ▶At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Started at LOLB and played 53 snaps, finishing with four tackles (three solo), a sack, a QB pressure and a QB hit...Came from the right side to beat LT Kelvin Beachum for a 10-yard sack of QB Blake Bortles on third-and-2 midway through the first quarter...The sack gave him 68.5 for his career as he moved into a tie with White for No.

2 on the all-time franchise list (since 1982)...Added a tackle for a loss later in the first quarter, powering his way into the backfield to bring down RB T.J. Yeldon for a 7-yard loss.

88 Ty Montgomery, WR, 2nd Year, Stanford

- Played in six games with three starts as a rookie in 2015 before an ankle injury that he sustained in Week 6 vs. San Diego would sideline him for the remainder of the season.
- Caught 15 passes for 136 yards (9.1 avg.) and two TDs and posted a 31.1-yard average on seven kickoff returns last season.
- Finished his career at Stanford as the school's all-time leader in kickoff return yards with 2,493, besting Chris Owusu's mark of 2,132 yards from 2008-11.
- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Played 11 snaps on offense and 14 on special teams, returning one kickoff for 14 yards.

68 Kyle Murphy, T, Rookie, Stanford

- Played in 54 games with 34 starts in four years at Stanford. Named thirdteam All-America by *Phil Steele's College Football* as a senior after serving as a team captain and starting all 14 games at left tackle.
- Started all 13 games at right tackle as a junior and was selected second-team All-Pacific-12 by *Phil Steele's College Football*.
- Played in 14 games with two starts in 2012, joining G Joshua Garnett as the first true freshmen offensive linemen to start at Stanford since 2000.
- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Inactive (healthy scratch).

87 Jordy Nelson, WR, 9th Year, Kansas State

- One of just two players in franchise history (WR Sterling Sharpe, 1989 and 1992) to register two seasons with 85-plus receptions and 1,300-plus receiving yards, having done it in 2011 and 2014.
- Eclipsed the 1,000-yard receiving mark three times over a four-year span (2011, 2013-14).
- Ranks No. 8 in franchise history in receptions (406), No. 9 in receiving yards (6,141) and tied for No. 6 in TD receptions (50).
- Set a single-season franchise record with 1,519 receiving yards in 2014, topping WR Robert Brooks' mark of 1,497 yards in 1995, on the way to being selected to his first career Pro Bowl and earning second-team All-Pro honors from *The Associated Press*.
- Ranked No. 4 in the NFL and No. 2 among wide receivers (Dez Bryant, 50) with 43 TD catches from 2011-14.
- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): After missing the entire 2015 season due to a knee injury, returned to the starting lineup and played 54 snaps, tying for the team lead with six catches for 32 yards (5.3 avg.) and a TD...The TD catch was the 50th of his career and came with just over three minutes remaining in the first half to give the Packers a 14-10 lead as he found an opening in the middle of the end zone.

56 Julius Peppers, LB, 15th Year, North Carolina

- Has been selected to the Pro Bowl nine times during his career, including last season (2004-06, 2008-12, 2015), and has been named first-team All-Pro by *The Associated Press* three times (2004, 2006, 2010). Was named to the NFL's All-Decade Team for the 2000s.
- Has played in 219 games with 216 starts as a pro, appearing in all 16 contests in 12 of his 14 seasons in the NFL. Has missed just two games due to injury during his career.
- Only player in NFL history with 100-plus sacks (136) and 10-plus interceptions (11).
- Since entering the NFL in 2002, ranks No. 1 in the league in sacks (136) and No. 3 in forced fumbles (45). His career sack total is tied with Jared Allen for No. 9 in NFL history (since 1982).
- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Played 29 snaps and posted an assisted tackle.

80 Justin Perillo, TE, 3rd Year, Maine

- Played in a career-high nine games last season and made the first receptions of his career, finishing with 11 catches for 102 yards (9.3 avg.) and a TD.
- Started out the 2015 season on Green Bay's practice squad before being signed to the 53-man roster on Oct. 14, where he remained for the rest of the season.
- Appeared in two games as a rookie in 2014, starting out the season on the practice squad for the first nine contests before being signed to the active roster for the final seven games and both playoff contests.
- ▶ At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Appeared on six plays on special teams.

53 Nick Perry, LB, 5th Year, Southern California

- Tied the franchise record for sacks in a single postseason (LB Clay Matthews, 2010) with 3½ in the 2015 playoffs. His six career postseason sacks rank No. 3 in franchise history behind Matthews (10) and Reggie White (eight), and are the most in team history (since 1982) by a player in his first five games with Green Bay.
- Has posted at least one sack in four of his five career playoff games.
- Has registered a two-sack game in each of the last three seasons (2013-2015), one of only two Packers to do so over that span (Matthews).
- ▶At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Started at ROLB and played 52 snaps, finishing with three tackles (all solo), a sack, a team-high four QB pressures and a team-leading four QB hits...With the Packers leading 27-20 in the fourth quarter, brought down QB Blake Bortles for a 2-yard sack on third-and-11 with just over six minutes remaining to force the Jaguars to settle for a 50-yard FG from K Jason Myers...Dating back to the 2015 postseason, has posted 4½ sacks in the last three games...Added a tackle for a loss early in the fourth quarter, stopping RB T.J. Yeldon for a 2-yard loss on a run up the middle.

26 Jhurell Pressley, RB, Rookie, New Mexico

- Was claimed off waivers from Minnesota on Sept. 4 after he was released by the Vikings in the final roster reduction. Posted a 106-yard kickoff return for a TD for Minnesota in its preseason finale vs. the L.A. Rams.
- Averaged 6.9 yards per carry in his collegiate career at New Mexico, a school record.
- Rushed for 1,083 yards and 12 TDs on just 114 carries as a junior in 2014, leading the nation with a 9.5 yards-per-carry average. Had 5 rushes of 60 or more yards on the season, which was as many or more than every team in the FBS except for four (Wisconsin, Marshall, Georgia Southern and Indiana)
- ▶ At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Inactive (healthy scratch).

23 Damarious Randall, CB, 2nd Year, Arizona State

- Played in 15 games with nine starts (six at LCB, two at RCB, one in the slot) in 2015 and tied for the team lead and No. 2 among NFL rookies with three interceptions, including one he returned for a TD. Finished with a team-best 16 passes defensed.
- Named the NFL's Defensive Rookie of the Month for November 2015, joining CB Casey Hayward (October 2012) as the only Green Bay defensive backs to win the award.
- Earned first-team All-Pacific-12 honors at safety as a senior in 2014 after he led the Sun Devils in tackles (106) and passes defensed (12) and tied for the team lead with three interceptions.
- ▶At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Started at LCB and posted eight tackles (six solo) and two passes defensed (tied for the team lead)...Made the initial hit of WR Allen Hurns on fourth-and-1 with 23 seconds remaining as a group of Packers brought Hurns down for a 1-yard loss to secure the 27-23 victory for Green Bay...Added a tackle on special teams, running down RB Corey Grant at the Jacksonville 31 on a kickoff return early in the fourth quarter that could have gone for a bigger gain.

99 Christian Ringo, DT, 1st Year, Louisiana-Lafayette

- Originally drafted by the Packers as their second selection in the sixth round (210th overall) of the 2015 NFL Draft. Was on Green Bay's practice squad for the entire 2015 season.
- Started all 13 games as a senior in 2014, anchoring a defensive line that

- helped the Ragin' Cajuns lead the Sun Belt in rushing defense while ranking third in sacks.
- Was named the state's Defensive Player of the Year by the Louisiana Sports Writers Association after ranking seventh in the nation in tackles for loss (20) and 12th in the country in sacks (11½). His 11½ sacks tied the school single-season record and he also finished tied for No. 1 in school history with 21.0 career sacks.
- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Played 12 snaps on defense in his NFL debut and posted a solo tackle, stopping RB T.J. Yeldon for a 1-yard loss on a run up the middle in the second quarter.

22 Aaron Ripkowski, FB, 2nd Year, Oklahoma

- Played in 15 games as a rookie last season, seeing action primarily on special teams, and posted nine tackles (tied for No. 4 on the team).
- Was tied with CB Damarious Randall (15) for the most games played by a Green Bay rookie in 2015.
- Began his career at Oklahoma as a walk-on and went on to play in 47 games with 17 starts in four seasons.
- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Played 18 snaps on special teams, tied for the team lead, and eight snaps on offense.

12 Aaron Rodgers, QB, 12th Year, California

- Ranks No. 1 in NFL history (min. 1,500 attempts) in career passer rating (104.1), interception percentage (1.59) and TD/INT ratio (3.98, 259/65).
- Has posted five seasons (2009, 2011-12, 2014-15) with 500-plus passing attempts and eight or fewer INTs, the most in NFL history ahead of Patriots QB Tom Brady (three seasons) and five QBs (one season each).
- Was named the league's Most Valuable Player by *The Associated Press* in 2014 for the second time in his career (2011), becoming the eighth player in league history to win the honor multiple times.
- Is the only quarterback in league history to record a 100-plus passer rating in six consecutive seasons (2009-14), with no other QB doing so in more than four straight years.
- Is one of only eight quarterbacks in NFL annals with 30,000-plus passing yards and 2,000-plus rushing yards.
- In 120 career regular-season starts, has posted 43 games with 300-plus passing yards, 70 without an interception (min. 15 attempts) and 66 with a 100-plus passer rating.
- Has been selected to the Pro Bowl in five of the last seven seasons (2009, 2011-12, 2014-15).
- ▶At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Threw for 199 yards and two TDs on 20-of-34 passing for a 95.1 passer rating...Added a 6-yard rushing TD on Green Bay's opening possession, giving him 11 games with two-plus passing TDs and one-plus rushing TDs since 2008, second most over that span behind only Panthers QB Cam Newton...His TD passes came on back-to-back drives late in the first half...Connected with WR Jordy Nelson for a 6-yard TD pass with just over three minutes remaining in the first half, buying time in the pocket before moving to his right to find Nelson in the middle of the end zone...With CB Jalen Ramsey attempting to pull him down by the back of his jersey, threw a perfectly placed 29-yard TD pass to WR Davante Adams over CB Davon House in the end zone with 13 seconds remaining in the half.

82 Richard Rodgers, TE, 3rd Year, California

- Had 58 receptions in 2015, becoming just the fourth TE in team history to record 55-plus receptions in a season (Paul Coffman, Jermichael Finley, Jackie Harris).
- Was one of only four TEs in the NFL last season to register 55-plus catches, 500-plus receiving yards and eight or more TD receptions (Rob Gronkowski, Jordan Reed, Gary Barnidge).
- Registered 10 TD catches in 2014-15, tied for the most by a Green Bay TE in his first two seasons since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger (Bubba Franks, 2000-01). His eight TD receptions in '15 were tied for the fifth most in a season by a Packers TE.
- Set a single-game franchise record for tight ends with 146 receiving yards last season at Detroit in Week 13, highlighted by his game-winning 61-yard TD catch on the final play of the game.
- ▶At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Appeared on 25 plays on offense and

made 22-yard catch in the third quarter to the Jacksonville 8 that helped set up K Mason Crosby's 25-yard FG...Was covered by S Johnathan Cyprien on the play, extending his arms out to make a diving grab near the sideline.

24 Quinten Rollins, CB, 2nd Year, Miami (Ohio)

- Played in 14 games with four starts (two at LCB, two at RCB) in 2015, recording 35 tackles (25 solo), a sack, two interceptions (one for a TD) and nine passes defensed in his rookie season.
- Was tied for No. 3 on the team in INTs and tied for No. 4 among NFL rookies.
- Finished second among Packers rookies (Aaron Ripkowski, nine) with seven special teams tackles.
- Recorded two interceptions vs. St. Louis last season in Week 5, becoming the first Green Bay rookie to do so since CB Casey Hayward had two at Houston on Oct. 14, 2012. Returned the first interception 45 yards for a TD, becoming the first Packers rookie to record a pick-six since S Marques Anderson in 2002 (vs. Detroit, Nov. 10).
- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Started as the third CB as the defense opened in the nickel and played 47 snaps...Posted two tackles (one solo) and two passes defensed (tied for the team lead)...With less than a minute remaining in the game and the Packers leading, 27-23, made a leaping breakup of QB Blake Bortles' pass intended for WR Allen Robinson in the end zone.

47 Jake Ryan, LB, 2nd Year, Michigan

- Played in 14 games with five starts as a rookie, opening at BLB for the final five contests. Registered 47 tackles (32 solo) and a fumble recovery on defense and six tackles on special teams.
- Started both postseason games and recorded 10 tackles (seven solo). Including the playoffs, tallied six or more tackles in six of the seven games he started in 2015.
- Served as a team captain for his final two seasons and was a three-time winner (2012-14) of the Roger Zatkoff Award, given to Michigan's top LB. He is the only player to win the award, which was established in 1991, three times.
- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Started at ILB and played 43 snaps, finishing with eight tackles (four solo) and his first career pass defensed... Broke up a short pass over the middle from QB Blake Bortles intended for WR Allen Hurns in the second quarter...Helped limit the Jaguars to just 48 yards rushing on 26 carries (1.8 avg.), the first time they had rushed for 48 or fewer yards on 25-plus attempts since Nov. 14, 1999 (vs. Baltimore, 47 yards on 26 attempts).

10 Jacob Schum, P, 2nd Year, Buffalo

- Was claimed off waivers on Aug. 30 from Tampa Bay, where played in all 16 games last season and averaged 41.9 yards per punt (38.0 net average) on 56 attempts with 15 punts inside the 20.
- Was originally signed as an undrafted free agent by the Cleveland Browns in 2013 and also spent time with the New York Jets.
- ► At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Punted four times in his Green Bay debut, posting a 46.0-yard gross average with a net average of 42.5 yards.

37 Sam Shields, CB, 7th Year, Miami

- Has 23 interceptions (including the postseason) since entering the NFL in 2010, tied for No. 2 in the NFL behind Seahawks CB Richard Sherman (28).
- Was tied for the team lead with three interceptions in 2015, his fourth season with three-plus interceptions in the last five years, tied for No. 1 in the NFL over that span (2011-15).
- Earned his first career Pro Bowl selection in 2014, replacing Patriots CB Darrelle Revis, who played in the Super Bowl.
- Recorded a franchise-leading fifth career postseason interception in the 2014 NFC Championship Game at Seattle.
- ► At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Started at RCB and played 62 snaps, finishing with five tackles (four solo)...Left the game late in the fourth quarter after sustaining a concussion.

78 Jason Spriggs, T, Rookie, Indiana

- Played in 48 career games over four seasons with 47 starts at left tackle for the Hoosiers.
- Named first-team All-America by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) and *Phil Steele's College Football* as a senior. Also received the Hoosiers' Chris Dal Sasso Award (outstanding lineman) and was the first Outland Trophy semifinalist in school history.
- In 2014, was named honorable mention All-Big Ten by the media after giving up two sacks in 689 snaps and recording 45 knockdowns.
- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Played five snaps on special teams in his NFL debut.

44 James Starks, RB, 7th Year, Buffalo

- Played in all 16 games for the second straight season in 2015 and recorded career highs in starts (four), rushing yards (601), receptions (43), receiving yards (392), receiving TDs (three) and yards from scrimmage (993).
- Was was one of just five RBs in the league to register 600-plus rushing yards and 390-plus receiving yards in 2015.
- Rushed for 493 yards and a career-high three TDs on 89 carries in 2013, an average of 5.54 yards per carry that ranked No. 1 in the NFL among players with 80-plus attempts.
- Posted a league-leading 315 rushing yards in the 2010 postseason, third most ever by a rookie RB in the postseason behind only Washington's Timmy Smith (342 in 1987) and Baltimore's Jamal Lewis (338 in 2000).
- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Had four carries for 7 yards (1.8 avg.) and a 6-yard catch in 18 snaps of action.

65 Lane Taylor, G, 4th Year, Oklahoma State

- Started the first games of his career in 2015, opening at RG at Detroit in Week 13 in place of an injured T.J. Lang and at LG in Week 17 vs. Minnesota with Josh Sitton sliding to LT in place of an injured David Bakhtiari.
- Played in all 16 contests in 2014, seeing limited action on offense at both guard spots and as an extra lineman, and on special teams.
- Was one of three rookie free agents to make Green Bay's opening-day roster in 2013.
- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Started at LG and played all 64 snaps... Helped protect QB Aaron Rodgers as he was sacked just one time on the afternoon and as he threw for 199 yards and two TDs on 20-of-34 passing with a rushing TD.

48 Joe Thomas, LB, 2nd Year, South Carolina State

- Played in 14 games in 2015 and registered 24 tackles (16 solo), a sack, a forced fumble, five QB hits, four pressures and two passes defensed.
- Added nine tackles on special teams, which was tied for No. 4 on the team.
- Was with the Packers during the 2015 offseason and preseason before being waived on Sept. 5, 2015. Was signed to Green Bay's 53-man roster on Sept. 21, 2015, from the Dallas Cowboys' practice squad.
- Entered the league with the Packers as an undrafted free agent in May 2014. Was on Green Bay's practice squad for the final eight games of the 2014 regular season and both playoff contests.
- ▶At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Played 25 snaps on defense and recorded three tackles (two solo) and his first career interception...The INT came on his first snap of the season when he picked off QB Blake Bortles' pass intended for WR Marqise Lee that was deflected by CB Quinten Rollins at the Jacksonville 41...On the play, initially came on a blitz up the middle before turning back to head up the field and make the interception, returning it 9 yards to help set up the Green Bay offense for its first score of the day...Was one of a host of defenders to bring down WR Allen Hurns for a 1-yard loss on fourth-and-1 with 23 seconds remaining to secure the 27-23 victory for Green Bay.

73 JC Tretter, C/G, 4th Year, Cornell

- Saw the most significant action of his career in 2015, appearing in all 16 games with three starts at center in place of an injured Corey Linsley.
- Has seen game action at center, left guard and both tackle spots during his NFL career.
- Was on track to be the starting center in 2014, opening at that position for the first three preseason contests that year, but sustained a knee injury vs. Oakland (Aug. 22) that would sideline him for the first half of the season.
- Played in the final eight regular-season games and both playoff contests. Spent the majority of his rookie campaign in 2013 on reserve/physically unable to perform after sustaining a significant ankle injury during the first practice of Organized Team Activities in the spring.
- ► At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Started at C and played all 64 snaps... Helped protect QB Aaron Rodgers as he was sacked just one time on the afternoon and as he threw for 199 yards and two TDs on 20-of-34 passing with a rushing TD.
