

PACKERS TAKE ON THE BEARS AT LAMBEAU

The Green Bay Packers will host the Chicago Bears at home in the final contest of a four-game homestand. It is the first time the Packers have played four consecutive home games during a single regular season since 1963 (Games 1-4).



- Green Bay is facing Chicago on a Thursday night for the second consecutive season.
- ► It is the 11th consecutive year that the Packers and Bears will play in prime time.
- ▶ Dating back to 1970, the Packers' 20 prime-time games against the Bears are the most they have played against any team.
- ► Under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**, the Packers are 14-7 against the Bears during the regular and postseason, including wins in 10 of the last 12 games
- ► In all but one of the 14 wins under McCarthy, Green Bay has scored at least 20 points.
- ► The Packers have scored 30-plus points in four of the last five contests (31, 55, 38, 33, 13) against Chicago.
- ► The Packers have won six of the last eight meetings against the Bears at Lambeau Field.
- ► Thursday will mark game No. 193 in the NFL's oldest rivalry. The Bears hold a 94-92-6 edge in the series, which includes two playoff games (1-1).
- ▶ In the 14 seasons of the NFC North (2002-15), the Packers (eight) and Bears (three) have accounted for 11 division titles.
- ► On Thursday, the Packers will debut their color-rush uniform featuring a white jersey, white pants and white socks.
- ▶ Dating back to 2006, the Packers (29-10, .744) hold the second-best winning percentages in the month of October behind the New England Patriots (37-7, .841).
- ► Green Bay has won 11 of their past 12 home games during the month of October.
- Next week, the Packers go on the road to the play the Atlanta Falcons.

RODGERS AND THE BEARS

- ► With **Aaron Rodgers** as the starting quarterback, Green Bay is 13-4 during the regular and postseason against the Bears, with one loss coming in 2013 after Rodgers left the game with an injury after the first series.
- ► In the 17 games against Chicago, Rodgers has an overall passer rating of 104.3 and has thrown for a passer rating of more than 100.0 in six of the last 10 matchups.
- ▶ Of the players that have attempted 175 or more passes against the Bears during the regular and postseason, Rodgers' 104.3 passer rating is No. 1.
- ▶ In the last four games against the Bears, Rodgers has completed 80 of 121 passes for 1,008 yards, 14 touchdowns, one interception and a passer rating of 127.0. He has registered passer ratings of 140.0-plus in three of the four contests (140.5, 145.8, 151.2).

WITH THE CALL

Thursday night's game will be televised to a national audience on CBS and NFL Network, as well as streamed on Twitter, with play-by-play man **Jim Nantz** and analyst **Phil Simms** handling the call from the broadcast booth and **Tracy Wolfson** and **Jay Feely** reporting from the sidelines.



WEEK 7

- ► In Wisconsin, CBS affiliates around the state, including WFRV (Ch. 5) in Green Bay and WDJT (Ch. 58) in Milwaukee, will carry the Thursday night contest.
- ► Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since November 1929, heads up the Packers Radio Network that is made up of 50 stations in five states. Wayne Larrivee (play-by-play) and two-time Packers Pro Bowler Larry McCarren (analyst) call the action. McCarren first joined the team's broadcasts in 1995 and enters his 22nd season calling Packers games. After originally being paired together in 1999, McCarren and Larrivee enter their 18th season of broadcasts together.
- ► Westwood One Sports will air the game across the country. Ian Eagle (play-by-play) and Tony Boselli (analyst) will call the action and Scott Graham will host pregame and halftime shows.
- ►The broadcast is also available on Sirius Satellite Radio (WTMJ feed).

► Green Bay's 37-34 loss at Minnesota in Week 17 of the 2012 season snapped the Packers' 12-game winning streak in regular-season NFC North games, which was the longest divisional winning streak in team history since the league went to a divisional format in 1967:

- ► Green Bay posted a winning record in divisional games in the first nine seasons under McCarthy (2006-14). The only other team in the league to accomplish that feat during that time span was the New England Patriots.
- ► The streak of nine straight seasons with a winning record in divisional games is also a franchise record, topping the previous mark of five straight from 2000-04.
- ► Among active players, Packers QB **Aaron Rodgers** leads the NFL in passer rating and passing touchdowns against division opponents since the start of the 2008 season (min. 429 pass att.):

HOME SWEET HOME

Green Bay has a long tradition of playing well at Lambeau Field. The Packers are in the midst of playing four straight and five of six games at home.

- ► The Packers are 2-1 at home this season, including improving to 9-2 (.818) in home openers under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**.
- ► Green Bay has outscored its opponents, 182-22, in the first quarter in the last 18 regular-season games at Lambeau Field, including a 24-10 margin this season.
- ► Since the start of 2014, Green Bay is **tied for No. 3 in the NFL** in winning percentage at home:

- ► In 2014, Green Bay's plus-155 point differential at home was the highest in franchise history (dating back to 1940), eclipsing the plus-151 in 1996.

- ►In Week 6, Green Bay posted season highs in total first downs (24), passing first downs (17) and third-down percentage (53.8, 7 of 13).
- ► Week 6 also saw WR **Ty Montgomery** set career highs for receptions (10) and receiving yards (98). It was the most receptions by a Packers' player since WR **Davante Adams** recorded 10 for 79 yards versus Detroit on Nov. 15, 2015.
- ►WR **Trevor Davis** registered a 25-yard punt return against Dallas, the longest punt return by Green Bay since DB **Micah Hyde** returned a punt 55 yards for a touchdown vs. Detroit on Dec. 28, 2014.
- ▶In Week 6, S **Morgan Burnett** recorded his first interception since Dec. 8, 2014, vs. Atlanta while also leading the team in tackles (10) and solo tackles (seven).

DEFENSIVE STRENGTH

The Packers defense has been a strength early in the season.

- ► According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Green Bay allowed the second-fewest rushing yards (171) by a team through the first four games since the NFL began compiling individual stats in 1933 (San Francisco, 157 yards on 74 attempts in 1995).
- ► Despite a tough performance against Dallas in Week 6, the Packers still rank high against the run:

IN THE CONFERENCE

The Packers have established themselves as one of the best teams in the NFC. Green Bay is 2-2 against the NFC this season.

► Under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**, Green Bay tallied a winning record against NFC opponents in nine of his first 10 seasons (2006-15):

BREAKING DOWN THE ROSTER

The Packers have a 53-man roster that is composed of 23 offensive players, 27 defensive players and three specialists.

- ▶ Of the 53 players on the roster, 48 began their pro careers with the Packers (90.6 percent) and 36 of them (67.9 percent) were draft picks of the Packers. Dating back to 2009, Green Bay has selected nine players in the first round, seven of which are still on the team.
- ► Green Bay has 14 players on the roster that began their careers as undrafted free agents, with 12 of those originally signed by Green Bay.
- ► Three 2016 undrafted rookie free agents are currently on the roster (S Kentrell Brice, S Marwin Evans, CB Josh Hawkins).
- ▶ 39.6 percent of the players (21 of 53) on Green Bay's roster entered the league as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as an undrafted player.
- ► The Packers have five players on the roster that played in the NFL prior to the 2009 season. Three of those players were draft picks of the Packers (QB Aaron Rodgers, K Mason Crosby and WR Jordy Nelson) and two (Rodgers, Nelson) have made at least one Pro Bowl.
- ▶ Only 20 of the 53 players on the roster (37.7 percent) were selected in the first three rounds of the draft, with 18 being drafted by the Packers.
- ▶ Of the 53 players on the roster, 43 of them (81.1 percent) are 28 years old or younger (as of Oct. 20) and 22 players (41.5 percent) are 24 years old or younger.

MIKE McCARTHY...Is in his 11th year as the Packers' 14th head coach.

- ▶ Joined Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl title with a win over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.
- Led the Packers to their seventh consecutive playoff appearance last season, joining New England as the only two NFL teams to do so over that span. Has also led the team to eight playoff appearances in the last nine years (2007, 2009-15).
- ► Guided the Packers to top-10 finishes in scoring in eight straight seasons (2007-14), joining the Patriots as the only other team to accomplish the feat over that time; Packers finished first overall in scoring in 2014.
- ► His .652 winning percentage during the regular season (107-57-1) ranks No. 3 among active NFL head coaches (min. 50 games).
- ► Had 104 regular-season wins in his first 10 seasons as a head coach, ranking No. 3 in NFL history.

JOHN FOX...Is in his second year as the Bears' 15th head coach.

- ▶ Inherited the 30th-ranked defense and improved the Bears to the No. 14 ranking in the NFL after one season.
- ▶ Led the Broncos to four division titles, joining Chuck Knox (L.A. Rams) as the only coaches in NFL history to lead their respective team to four division titles in their first four years with the franchise.
- ▶ Between Carolina and Denver, made seven trips to the postseason, captured six division titles and made three conference championship appearances and two Super Bowl appearances.
- ▶ One of six coaches in NFL history to lead two different teams to Super Bowl appearances (Carolina in 2003 and Denver in 2013).
- ► Ranks fourth among active NFL head coaches with 134 career wins.

THE PACKERS-BEARS SERIES

- ▶ No two teams have met on the gridiron more than the Packers and Bears, as Thursday marks the 193rd matchup.
- ► Starting in 1923, the clubs met for 59 straight years until both games in 1982 were canceled as part of a strike-shortened season.
- ▶ During the 2010 season, the teams squared off in the playoffs for just the second time in the history of the series. With a berth in Super Bowl XLV on the line, the Packers emerged victorious, 21-14, in the NFC Championship Game at Soldier Field.
- ▶The last time Green Bay led the overall series? On the heels of its three straight NFL championships, 1932, when the Packers led 11-10-5.
- ► Green Bay is 13-4 against Chicago under QB Aaron Rodgers.

Packers LB Julius Peppers played for the Bears from 2010-13...Green Bay offensive coordinator Edgar Bennett played running back in Chicago from 1998-99...Packers president & chief executive officer Mark Murphy was the athletic director at Northwestern from 2003-07...Green Bay special teams coordinator Ron Zook was the head coach at Illinois from 2005-11...Packers T Bryan Bulaga played at Marian Central Catholic High in Woodstock, III. ... Chicago secondary coach Ed Donatell was the defensive coordinator for the Packers from 2000-03...Packers DE Dean Lowry is from Rockford, III., and attended Northwestern...Bears tight ends coach Frank Smith is from Milwaukee, Wis. ... - ► RB Eddie Lacy led all runners with 105 yards on 17 carries (6.2 avg.) and found the end zone on one of his four catches (34 yds., 8.5 avg.) from QB Aaron Rodgers.
- ▶ Bears WR Alshon Jeffery hauled in seven receptions for 90 yards (12.9) avg.) from QB Jay Cutler.



AT THE HELM

Having led Green Bay to the playoffs in eight of his first 10 seasons as head coach, **Mike McCarthy** is joined by Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl win with a victory over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.

- ► McCarthy guided the Packers to a franchise-record fourth consecutive division title in 2014.
- ►With a win at Tampa Bay in Week 16 of the 2014 season, McCarthy passed Lombardi for the No. 2 spot in team history as far as overall victories:

THE RETURN OF JORDY

- ► RB **Eddie Lacy** rushed for 103 yards on 17 carries (6.1 avg.) in Week 3. It was the 11th 100-yard rushing game of his careeer, passing Dorsey Levens (10) for sole possession of the No. 5 spot in franchise history.
- ► Lacy totaled 77 yards in the first half against the Giants in Week 5, the second most in his career in a first half (84 yards at Tampa Bay, Dec. 21, 2014).
- ► Lacy posted a 25-plus yard run in three straight games (Weeks 3, 5-6), becoming the first Packer to accomplish that feat in a single season since RB Ryan Grant (Weeks 12-14) in 2007.

CONTINUAL IMPACT

In his young career, DT Mike Daniels has seen his playing time steadily increase as well as his production. After playing in 14 games as a rookie in 2012, he has played in every game since the start of the 2013 season.

- ▶In Week 2 at Minnesota, he recorded a sack and tied for the team lead with four QB hits. In Week 3, he led the Packers with two QB hits.
- ▶In 2015, Daniels led the Packers' defensive line in tackles (66) and sacks (four). He finished third on the team with 12 QB hits.
- ▶In Week 5 versus St. Louis last season, he tied for the team lead with a career-best nine tackles (eight solo).
- ▶ Daniels registered his first career interception in Week 16 at Arizona. returning it 23 yards. According to STATS LLC, it was the first interception by a Packers DT since Cullen Jenkins on Oct. 18, 2009. Dating back to 1960, his 23-yard interception return was the longest by a Green Bay DT on an interception.
- ► He led Green Bay's defensive line with 5.5 sacks and was the team leader in quarterback hits (19) and pressures (22) during the 2014 regular season.
- ▶Daniels is third on the Packers with 17.0 sacks since the start of the 2013 season (Peppers-20.0 / Matthews-28.0). He is tied for No. 9 among NFL defensive tackles over that span, according to STATS LLC:

DEFENSE SHIELD

The Packers' secondary is led by veteran cornerback Sam Shields, who earned his first trip to the Pro Bowl after the 2014 season.

- ►With three interceptions during the 2015 regular season (tied for the team high), Shields has registered multiple interceptions in each season from 2010-15.
- ▶In 2015, he recorded interceptions in back-to-back games for the first time in his career (Weeks 3-4).
- ► Including playoffs, Shields is **No. 6 in the NFL** among active players in interceptions since 2010:

► Shields registered an interception during the 2014 NFC Championship Game at Seattle, giving him a franchise-record five career interceptions in the postseason.

ON THE RISE

S Ha Ha Clinton-Dix has been a presence on the Packers defense since his rookie season.

- ►After starting 10 of 16 games and both postseason contests as a rookie, he has started every game since 2015.
- ► His three career postseason interceptions rank No. 1 among safeties since he entered the league in 2014, according to STATS.
- ►In 2016, he has registered a forced fumble while recording five-or-more tackles in each contest.
- ► Clinton-Dix finished second on the team with 95 tackles (73 solo) in 2014 and led the Packers with 117 tackles (97 solo) last season.
- ► He registered a total of three interceptions last season (including playoffs). He tied for fourth on the team with two during the regular season and registered one in the postseason.
- ►According to STATS, his three sacks during the 2015 regular season were tied for the fifth most in a single regular season by a Packers safety (since 1982) and the most since Mark Roman recorded 3.5 in 2004.
- ► Clinton-Dix's three sacks also tied for No. 3 in the NFL in 2015 among safeties.
- ▶ During the 2015 regular season, he registered eight-plus tackles in eight games, including setting career highs in both total tackles (12) and solo tackles (11) in the Week 10 game vs. Detroit, in which he also registered an interception.

RACKING UP POINTS

K Mason Crosby is moving his way up the record books.

► Crosby passed Ryan Longwell in Week 2 of the 2015 season to become the franchise career points leader:

- ▶In Week 6, Crosby (306) eclipsed Longwell (277) for the most field goal attempts in Packers' history.
- ►Crosby (1,305) passed Longwell (1,119) for the most points scored in the regular and postseason combined in franchise history.
- ► Crosby recorded 108 points during the 2015 regular season, giving him the ninth 100-point season of his career and passing Ryan Longwell (1997-2004) for the franchise record.
- ▶In Week 11 of 2015, he tied the single-game team record with five field goals and became the first player in NFL history to have five field goals of 40-plus yards in a game. In the same game, Crosby connected on a 52-yard field goal, extending his career franchise record for the most 50-yard FGs to 26.
- ► Crosby is one of 13 players to make all extra points so far this season (min. 10 att.). He was one of five players (min. 25 att.) to connect on all extra points during the 2015 regular season. Among those five, his 36 attempts were the second most (NE Stephen Gostkowski, 52-52).
- ▶Including 2013, Crosby made 19 consecutive field goals in the regular season, until his final kick against the Bears was blocked in Week 4 of 2014. He now owns the two longest consecutive field-goal streaks in franchise history (23 straight from 2010-11).
- ▶Dating back to the 2013 regular season, Crosby made at least one FG in 17 consecutive regular-season games before not getting an attempt in Week 3 at Detroit in 2014. It is the longest streak in team history.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

Green Bay went 7-1 away from Lambeau Field in 2011, with the seven road wins setting a single-season franchise record.

- ►The Packers have been able to stay above the .500 mark on the road during Head Coach **Mike McCarthy's** tenure, a notable achievement in the National Football League.
- ► Since 2006, McCarthy's first season as the head coach in Green Bay, only nine of 32 NFL teams have regular-season road records above .500.

321 AND COUNTING

Another packed house at Lambeau Field against the Dallas Cowboys in Week 6 brought the stadium's consecutive-sellouts streak to 321 regular-season games (not including replacement games).

- ►The league's longest-tenured stadium, Lambeau Field is hosting its 60th season of football in 2016. For the victory over Dallas in the Divisional round of the 2014 playoffs, Packers fans set a new Lambeau Field paid attendance record (79,704).
- ► Across American professional sports, only Boston's Fenway Park (1912) and Chicago's Wrigley Field (1914) have longer tenures.

THE LAMBEAU ADVANTAGE

The crown jewel of the National Football League, Lambeau Field has long been known as one of the tougher venues to play in, particularly during the harsh Wisconsin winter.

- ▶Re-establishing home-field advantage after a 4-4 mark in 2008 was one of the goals of 2009, and with the Packers finishing 6-2 at home, they accomplished that goal. Green Bay followed that up with a 7-1 mark at Lambeau Field in 2010, a perfect 8-0 record in 2011, the first undefeated home mark since 2002, and a 7-1 mark in 2012. The Packers were one of two teams to finish undefeated at home during the 2014 regular season (Denver).
- ► Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** stated consistently upon his arrival in Green Bay that one of the team's goals would be to reclaim the mystique of playing at Lambeau Field. Mission accomplished. The team is 61-21-1 (.741) at home in the regular season since 2006, **No. 2 in the NFL.**
- ► Since Ron Wolf and Mike Holmgren began the revitalization of the franchise in 1992, Green Bay owns the best home record in the NFL. A look at the top regular-season home W-L records since the '92 season:

A LOOK AT THE SCHEDULE

The Green Bay Packers' 96th NFL regular-season schedule is headlined by five prime-time games (subject to flexible scheduling).

- ► Green Bay's schedule includes five games against 2015 playoff teams. Three of those contests (Minnesota, Houston, Seattle) will be at Lambeau Field, while two (Minnesota, Washington) will come on the road
- ► The Packers kicked off their season on the road for the fourth consecutive year, the longest streak in team history, opening with two road games for the first time since 1924. Green Bay traveled to Jacksonville, playing on the road against an AFC team in Week 1 for the first time since facing the New England Patriots in 1985.
- ► Green Bay faced division opponents in Weeks 2-3. They began with a trip to Minnesota to face the Vikings in a prime-time game and returned to Lambeau Field last week for the home opener against the Detroit Lions.
- ▶ For the second time in four years, the Packers had their bye in Week 4.
- ▶Green Bay returns to action with three consecutive home games against NFC teams over a 12-day span. In Week 5, the Packers played on Sunday night against the New York Giants. It was the Giants' first regular-season game at Lambeau Field since 2010. In Week 6, Green Bay played the Dallas Cowboys for the fourth consecutive season (including playoffs) and for the second straight year at home in the regular season. Green Bay finishes the homestand playing the Chicago Bears on a Thursday night for the second consecutive season (11th straight year in primetime).
- ► Four of the Packers' next five games will be on the road, including three road games in a row for the first time since 2012.
- ▶ After a trip to play the Atlanta Falcons in Week 8, Green Bay will face the Indianapolis Colts at home for the first time since 2008. Five of the last seven matchups between Green Bay and Indianapolis have been decided by seven or fewer points. The Packers make just their third regular-season visit to Tennessee to play the Titans in Week 10. Green Bay is looking for its first victory at the Titans since they moved to Tennessee in 1997
- ► Green Bay will play two prime-time road games in a row, first traveling to play against the Washington Redskins on a Sunday night in Week 11 and then going to Philadelphia to face the Eagles on *Monday Night Football* in Week 12. It marks the 24th consecutive season (1993-2016) that Green Bay is appearing on *MNF*.
- ► Green Bay will play its first game at home in almost a month when it faces the Houston Texans in Week 13 for just the second time ever at home.
- ►Week 14 brings a familiar matchup as the Packers welcome the Seattle Seahawks to Lambeau Field for the second consecutive year. Including the postseason, Green Bay and Seattle will meet for the fifth time in five years.
- ► For the first time since 2006, the Packers will finish the regular season with three straight games against NFC North opponents.
- ►In Week 15, Green Bay will travel to Chicago to play the Bears. The Packers have won four consecutive games against the Bears in December, three of which were played in Chicago.
- ► Green Bay returns home to play the Vikings in Week 16 on Christmas Eve, playing on a Saturday for the first time since 1997. The Packers last played on Christmas Eve in 2004, a 34-31 victory at Minnesota. Including playoffs, Green Bay has a 8-2-1 mark (.773) against the Vikings at Lambeau Field under McCarthy.
- ► The Packers will finish the regular season in Detroit for the first time since 1993. Green Bay has won seven of 10 games at Ford Field under McCarthy. It will be only the third time the Packers have played at the Lions during the regular season in the month of January (1983, 1994).

PACKERS STARTERS - OFFENSE

WR Jordy Nelson, 9th Year, Kansas State, D2a-08

- Leads the team in receiving yards (312) and receiving touchdowns (five) this season.
- ► Has 54 career touchdowns, ranking No. 5 in Packers history.
- For the first time in his career, Nelson posted a touchdown reception in each of the first four games the season, becoming the first Packer to do so since WR Bill Schroeder in 2001.
- ▶ Nelson's five touchdown receptions in the first four games this year tied for the fourth most in franchise history.
- ► Missed all of the 2015 season due to a knee injury.
- Finished the 2014 regular season ranked fourth in receiving yards (1,519), seventh in receptions (98) and tied for second in receiving touchdowns (13). Earned first selection to the Pro Bowl.
- ▶ Led the team in 2013 with 85 catches for 1,314 yards and eight TDs. Ranked No. 10 in the NFL that season in receiving yards.
- ► With 15 TD catches in 2011, became only the third player in franchise history to catch 15 or more TDs in a season, joining WRs Sterling Sharpe (18 in 1994) and Don Hutson (17 in 1942).

LT David Bakhtiari, 4th Year, Colorado, D4a-13

- ► Has started all but two games at LT since the start of the 2013 regular season. Missed the final two games of the 2015 regular season due to injury
- ► Started all 16 games at left tackle in 2013, the only rookie in the NFL to do so in 2013 and the first Packer rookie to do so since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.
- ▶ Became just the fourth Green Bay rookie to start at LT in the season opener since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger and the first since 1985.

LG Lane Taylor, 4th Year, Oklahoma State, FA-13

- ► Has played in 35 regular-season games for Green Bay with seven starts.
- ► Made the first starts of his career in 2015, opening at RG at Detroit in Week 13 in place of an injured T.J. Lang and at LG in Week 17 vs. Minnesota with Josh Sitton sliding to LT in place of an injured David
- ► A four-year letterman at OSU, starting 47 of 50 games played at right guard. Unanimous first-team All-Big 12 selection by the conference's coaches as a senior.

C JC Tretter, 4th Year, Cornell, D4b-13

- Set career highs with 16 games played and three starts (all at C) during the 2015 regular season. Also started at LT in the NFC Wild Card game at Washington.
- ► Has seen game action at C, LG and both T spots during his career.
- ► Was on track to be the starting C in 2014, opening at that position for the first three preseason games, but sustained a knee injury vs. Oakland (Aug. 22) that would sideline him for the first half of the season. Returned to play in the final eight games and both postseason contests.
- ► Grew from a high school quarterback, running back and slot receiver into an All-American LT in college, starting 20 consecutive games in his final two seasons at Cornell.

RG T.J. Lang, 8th Year, Eastern Michigan, D4-09

- Has started games at four different positions on the line as a pro (52 at RG, 27 at LG, five at RT, two at LT). Played C in Week 10 in 2013.
- ► Has started 83 contests since 2011.
- ► Started games at both tackle spots in his first season (2009) and became the first Packers rookie to start consecutive games at left tackle since Chad Clifton in 2000.
- ▶ Began his college career as a defensive lineman, but converted to the offensive line as a sophomore and started 36 straight games (10 at RT, 26 at LT) over his final three years.

- RT Bryan Bulaga, 7th Year, Iowa, D1-10

 ► Has started 32 of 37 games since the start of the 2014 season.
- Missed the second part of the 2012 season after suffering a hip injury vs. Arizona on Nov. 4 and missed all of the 2013 season after injuring his knee on Aug. 3.
- ► Started 37 games at RT in his first three seasons in the league.
- ► Started the final 12 games of 2010 and the entire postseason at right tackle after taking over for veteran Mark Tauscher (shoulder).
- ▶ Named to the *Pro Football Weekly*/PFWA All-Rookie team in 2010.
- Capped his rookie season by becoming the youngest player at the time, according to STATS LLC, to ever start in the Super Bowl (21 years, 322) days).

- TE Jared Cook, 8th Year, South Carolina, FA-16

 ➤ Signed with the Packers as a free agent in March 2016 after spending three seasons with the St. Louis Rams (2013-15) and four with the Tennessee Titans (2009-12)
- ► Has posted at least 35 receptions in each of the last five seasons (2011-15), one of only five active tight ends in the NFL to do so (Antonio Gates, Jimmy Graham, Rob Gronkowski, Greg Olsen)
- ►Ranks No. 5 among NFL tight ends with a 12.7-yard receiving average since he entered the league in 2009.
- ► Holds the single-game franchise record for the most receiving yards by a tight end for both the Titans (169 vs. Jacksonville, Dec. 24, 2011) and the Rams (141 vs. Arizona, Sept. 8, 2013).

WR Randall Cobb, 6th Year, Kentucky, D2-11

- Leads the team lead in receptions (28) this season.
- ►Posted the 12th 100-yard receiving game of his career in Week 4, registering season highs in receptions (nine) and receiving yards (108).
- Led the team in receptions (79), was No. 2 in receiving yards (829) and was No. 3 in touchdown receptions (six) in 2015.
- Set a new single-season career high with five 100-yard receiving games during the 2014 season (three-2012). Earned first trip to the Pro Bowl.
- ►His career-best 91 receptions in 2014 were the seventh most in team history.
- ► Finished the regular season tied for fourth in the NFL with 12 touchdown receptions in 2014.
- ▶ Before suffering a knee injury in Week 6 in 2013, led the team in receptions with 29 and was No. 2 in receiving yards with 378.
- Set a franchise single-season record with a league-high 2,342 combined net yards in 2012, topping the previous team mark of 2,250 yards by RB Ahman Green in 2003.

- QB Aaron Rodgers, 12th Year, California, D1-05
 ► In 124 regular-season starts (83-41 record), has posted 43 games with 300-plus passing yards, 72 without an interception and 68 with a 100-plus passer rating (min. 15 attempts).

 Earned his fifth selection to the Pro Bowl in 2015, passing Bart Starr
- (1960-62, 1966) for the second-most selections by a Green Bay quarterback behind Brett Favre's nine (1992-93, 1995-97, 2001-03, 2007).

 His career passer rating of 103.6 ranks No. 1 in NFL history.
- Finished the 2014 regular season ranked No. 2 in the NFL in passer rating (112.2), touchdown percentage (7.3), No. 1 in interception percentage (1.0) and No. 3 in touchdown passes (38)
- ▶ Recorded a passer rating of at least 120.0 in seven regular-season games in 2014, setting a single-season career high and tying for the third most in a single season in the NFL, dating back to 1960.

 Posted 21,332 passing yards from 2008-12, which ranks No. 1 in league
- history for the most passing yards by a QB in his first five seasons as a starter (previous record was Peyton Manning, 20,618, 1998-2002).

 In 2011, set an NFL record with a 122.5 passer rating and set franchise
- marks for TD passes (45), passing yards (4,643), completion percentage (68.3), yards per attempt (9.25) and 300-yard games (eight) on his way to earning NFL Most Valuable Player honors from The Associated Press.

RB Eddie Lacy, 4th Year, Alabama, D2-13

- ►With 3,075 rushing yards from 2013-15, became one of only two players in team history (RB John Brockington, 3,276) to rush for 3,000-plus yards in his first three seasons in the NFL.
- ▶With 758 rushing yards in 2015, he and James Starks (601) gave the Packers two players with 600-plus rushing yards in the same regular season for the first time since 1985 (Jessie Clark-633/Eddie Lee Ivery-636).
- ▶ Became the first player in team history to post 1,000 rushing yards and 10-plus total TDs in both of his first two seasons
- ►With 1,139 rushing yards in 2014, became the fifth player in franchise history to record consecutive 1,000-yard rushing seasons (Ryan Grant, 2008-09 / Ahman Green, 2000-04 / John Brockington, 1971-73 / Jim Taylor, 1960-64)
- ► Ranks No. 1 in franchise history for the most rushing yards by a rookie (1,178) in a single season, No. 1 in attempts (284), and tied for No. 1 for most 100-yard rushing games with four (Brockington, four in 1971).

FB Aaron Ripkowski, 2nd Year, Oklahoma, D6a-15

- ▶ Played in 15 games as a rookie, seeing action primarily on special
- ► Tied for No. 4 on the team with nine special teams tackles last season.
- ▶ Began collegiate career as a walk-on and went on to play in 47 games with 17 starts.



PACKERS STARTERS - DEFENSE

DE Kenny Clark, Rookie, UCLA, D1-16

- ▶ Is tied for the lead on the defensive line in tackles.
- ► Became the youngest player to appear in a season opener for the Packers since Arnie Herber (20 years old) in 1930.
- ► Earned third-team All-America honors from *The Associated Press* and first-team All-Pacific-12 recognition from the coaches and media as a junior in 2015.
- ► Was a team co-captain in '15 and recorded career highs in tackles (75), tackles for a loss (11) and sacks (six). Also ranked third on the team with five pass breakups.

NT Letroy Guion, 9th Year, Florida State, FA-14

- ► Has started 24 of the 33 regular-season games he has played since the start of the 2014 season.
- ➤ Signed with Green Bay during the 2014 offseason after spending his first six NFL seasons with the Minnesota Vikings.
- ► Started all 28 games he appeared in for Minnesota in 2012-13, recording 72 tackles (32 solo) and three sacks over that span.
- ► Was the only Viking to block a field goal in both 2011 and 2012.

DT Mike Daniels, 5th Year, Iowa, D4a-12

- ► Ranks third on the team with 17.0 sacks since the start of the 2013 regular season (LB Julius Peppers-20.0 / LB Clay Matthews-28.0).
- ▶Led the defensive line in both tackles and sacks each of that last two seasons.
- ► Returned a fumble 43 yards for a TD vs. Detroit in Week 14 of 2012, the longest fumble return for a TD by a rookie in franchise history.
- ► Starred as an interior pass rusher at lowa, posting a team-high 24.5 tackles for a loss and 13 sacks from 2010-11.

LOLB Nick Perry, 5th Year, Southern California, D1-12

- ► Tied for No. 10 in the NFL with a team-high 4.5 sacks this season.
- ▶ Registered mulitple sacks in each of his first five seasons in the NFL and has posted a two-sack game in each of the last four seasons (2013-16).
- ► Has totaled six sacks in five playoff games, including 3.5 in the 2015 postseason which tied Clay Matthews (2010) for the franchise record in a single posteason.
- ► His six postseason sacks rank No. 3 in franchise history behind Matthews (10) and Reggie White (eight) and are the most in team history (since 1982) by a player in his first five games with Green Bay.

ILB Jake Ryan, 2nd Year, Michigan, D4-15

- Leads the team with 35 tackles on the season.
- Started the final five games of the regular season and both playoff contests in 2015.
- ▶ Recorded a team-best nine tackles (eight solo) and one fumble recovery in Week 13 last season at Detroit in his first pro start.
- ➤ Served as a team captain for his final two seasons at Michigan and was a three-time winner (2012-14) of the Roger Zatkoff Award, given to the Wolverines top linebacker. He was the only player to win the award (est. 1991) three times.
- ► Joined LB John Anderson (first round, 26th overall) as the only Michigan linebackers ever drafted by Green Bay.
- ➤ Started 41 of 46 games played in college, appearing at inside linebacker as a senior after spending his first three seasons at outside linebacker and defensive end.

ILB Blake Martinez, Rookie, Stanford, D4a-16

- ► Became the first rookie to start on defense for Green Bay in Week 1 since Nick Perry in 2012.
- ► Finished collegiate career with 257 tackles (137 solo), 13.5 tackles for a loss, 6.5 sacks, five interceptions and five forced fumbles in 51 games played.
- ► Started all 27 games played in his final two seasons, leading the team in tackles as a junior (102) and senior (141).
- ► Led the Pacific-12 and ranked No. 7 nationally with 141 tackles (75 solo) as a senior, averaging a conference-best 10.1 tackles per game.

ROLB Clay Matthews, 8th Year, Southern California, D1b-09

- For the first time in his career, Matthews recorded at least one sack in each of the first three regular-season games he played in.
- ➤ Selected to his sixth Pro Bowl and first as an inside linebacker in 2015 after recording 6.5 sacks (second on the team), 15 QB hits (No. 1 on the team), and a career-high 85 tackles (No. 2 on the team).
- ► With 70.5 careeer sacks, passed Reggie White (68.5) for the second most sacks in Packers history (Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila, 74.5).
- ► With a team-high 11.0 sacks in 2014, is tied for the most 10-plus sack seasons in franchise history (four).
- ► His six Pro Bowl selections are two more than any other Packers LB.
- ▶ Is the only player in franchise history to score a defensive TD (interception or fumble return) in each of his first three seasons in the NFL (2009-11).
- Named first-team All-Pro by The Associated Press in 2010, the first Green Bay LB to earn that honor since Tim Harris in 1989. Finished second to Pittsburgh safety Troy Polamalu in the AP's Defensive Player of the Year voting.

LCB Damarious Randall, 2nd Year, Arizona State, D1-15

- ▶ Played in 15 games with nine starts (six at LCB, two at RCB, one in the slot) in 2015 and tied for the team lead and No. 2 among NFL rookies with three interceptions, including one he returned for a TD. Finished with a team-best 16 passes defensed.
- Named the NFL's Defensive Rookie of the Month for November 2015, joining CB Casey Hayward (October 2012) as the only Green Bay defensive backs to win the award.
- ► Earned first-team All-Pacific-12 honors at safety as a senior in 2014 after he led the Sun Devils in tackles (106) and passes defensed (12) and tied for the team lead with three interceptions.

RCB Sam Shields, 7th Year, Miami, FA-10

- ▶ Despite missing four games due to injury, tied for the team lead with three interceptions and ranked No. 2 in passes defensed (13) during the 2015 regular season.
- ▶ Recorded interceptions in back-to-back games in 2015 (Weeks 3-4) for the first time in his career.
- ► Finished second on the team with 13 passes defensed in 2014 to go along with two interceptions. Earned first career trip to the Pro Bowl.
- Started all 14 games he appeared in during the 2013 season and led the team with four INTs (tied career high) and a career-best 25 passes defensed.
- ▶ In Green Bay's NFC Championship Game win over Chicago in the 2010 season, became the first rookie in NFL history to record two INTs and a sack in a postseason contest.

SS Morgan Burnett, 7th Year, Georgia Tech, D3-10

- ► Missed five games due to injury in 2015, but finished No. 4 on the team with 54 solo tackles.
- ▶Totaled a team-high 125 tackles in 2014, the second most of his career (137 in 2012). Ranked No. 2 on the team with 106 tackles (77 solo) in 2013, despite missing the first three games due to injury. Recovered three fumbles, including one for a TD, and added nine passes defensed.
- ▶ Participated in all 1,088 plays for Green Bay's defense in 2012, one of only four non-OL in the NFL to appear in 100 percent of his team's snaps.
- ► Enjoyed his first full season as a pro in 2011, joining DT B.J. Raji as the only two Green Bay defensive players to start all 16 regular-season games.
- ▶ Started the first four games of the 2010 season at SS before sustaining a season-ending knee injury vs. Detroit in Week 4.

FS Ha Ha Clinton-Dix, 3rd Year, Alabama, D1-14

- ▶Led the team in tackles in 2015 with 117 (97 solo) and was tied for fourth on the team in interceptions (two).
- ► According to STATS LLC, his three sacks during the 2015 regular season tied for the fifth most in a single regular season by a Packers safety (since 1982) and the most since Mark Roman recorded 3.5 in 2004.
- ► Started every game in 2015 after starting 10 of 16 games as a rookie when he finished second on the team in tackles (95).
- ► Was the second safety ever drafted by Green Bay in the first round (Alabama S George Teague, No. 29 overall in 1993).
- ► Was a consensus All-America selection in 2013 as a junior, earning first-team recognition from *The Associated Press*, the Football Writers Association of America and *Sporting News*.

GREEN BAY, Wis. — The timing is back for quarterback Aaron Rodgers and the rest of Green Bay's offense. The Packers' pass defense might

need a little work, though.

Rodges threw for 205 yards and four touchdowns, including two in the first half to Jordy Nelson, and the Packers snapped out of their offensive funk before holding off the Detroit Lions for a 34-27 win Sunday.

Rodgers was 15 of 24, leading the Packers to touchdowns on their first three series. Nelson had 101 yards on six catches, returning to the form that made him one of the NFL's best receivers before missing the 2015 season with a knee injury. They moved the ball on the Lions' short-handed defense with ease in the first half. The Packers (2-1) led 31-10 at halftime before the Lions slowly

chipped away.

Marvin Jones' 35-yard touchdown catch with 3:34 left got Detroit (1-2) within seven. But Rodgers had a critical 11-yard run on third-and-8 from the Packers' 27 with 3:22 left to effectively seal the win.

Jones had a career-high 205 yards on six receptions. Matthew Stafford passed for 385 yards and three scores for the Lions, who held advantages in total yardage (418-324) and time of possession, holding the ball for 35 minutes.

But the Packers burned he secondary with big plays to build a big lead, and Eddle Lacy ran for 103 yards on 17 carries.

Coach Mike McCarthy and Rodgers heard questions about the out-of-sync passing game following the 17-14 loss last week to Minnesota. Now the Packers head into an early bye week with renewed confidence after a successful opener at Lambeau Field.

The Lions gained chunks of yardage in the second half after being forced to play catch-up following Green Bay's big early lead. The Packers' defense was also missing four staffers, including linebacker Clay Matthews.

Stafford found holes over the middle of the field. He connected with Jones for a 23-yard completion on the first play from scrimmage in the

second half to the Detroit 46.

But Green Bay's staunch run defense had another big day, albeit against a Lions offense playing without injured tailback Ameer Abdullah. Detroit managed just 50 yards on 23 carries, with a team-high 38 yards on 10 carries by Dwayne Washington.

Jones gave the Lions a boost going into halftime with a 73-yard touchdown pass from Stafford to get Detroit within 31-10. He stiff-armed cornerback Josh Hawkins before sprinting unbuched 45 yards into the end zone.

The Packers' offense accomplished two of McCaffarb bigger goals for this week: Receivers worked the middle of the field, and Lacy got more carries in the running game. Nelson was lined up in the slot on his 8-yard touchdown catch in the first quarter, when Rodgers pump-faked, then stepped up in the pocket to find Nelson. Lacy looked rejuvenated as he bounced off defenders for a 25-yard run in the second quarter.

Dallas dented Green Bay's league-best run defense. The Cowboys rushed for 93 yards in the first half against the Packers, which was already a season high against Green Bay. The Packers had been allowing 42.8 yards per game entering Sunday. Dallas was averaging a league-best 155.2 yards per game.

Provide Ezekiel Elliott finished with 157 yards on 28 carries, giving him 703 yards rushing - the second-most in a player's first six career games, behind only Eric Dickerson (787). Elliott also became the only rookie to rush for at least 130 yards in four consecutive games.

- Appeared in 10 games last season, recording nine receptions for 111 yards (12.3 avg.). Also played in both playoff contests with one start and had six catches for 69 yards (11.5 avg.).

- Caught a career-high 50 passes for a career-best 483 yards (9.7 avg.) and a TD last season despite missing three games due to an ankle injury.
- Played in all 16 games with 11 starts as a rookie in 2014, hauling in 38 receptions for 446 yards (14.2 avg.) and three TDs.
- Set franchise postseason single-game records for the most catches and receiving yards by a rookie when he posted seven grabs for 117 yards (16.7 avg.) and a TD in a 2014 NFC Divisional playoff victory vs. Dallas.
- **2016 SEASON:** Has played in all five games with four starts as the third WR and has 15 catches for 218 yards (14.5 avg.) and three TDs (tied for a career high).
- ▶At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Started as the team opened with three WRs and finished with three catches for 50 yards (16.7 avg.), highlighted by his 29-yard TD catch with 13 seconds in the first half that gave the Packers a 21-17 lead that they would not relinquish...With CB Davon House on his back, made a diving grab in the end zone for the longest TD catch of his career in the regular season as QB Aaron Rodgers fought off a sack attempt from CB Jalen Ramsey.

Also had a 9-yard catch late in the game that helped the Packers clinch the win and run out the clock.

Giants (Oct. 9): Started as the third WR and posted a season-high five receptions for a season-best 85 yards (17.0 avg.) and a TD...His 17.0-yard receiving average was his second-best single-game mark (min. three rec.) behind only his six-catch, 121-yard effort (20.2 avg.) vs. New England on Nov. 30, 2014...Caught a 29-yard TD pass midway through the second quarter, matching the longest TD reception of his career...Beat CB Michael Hunter down the right sideline and hauled in the pass from Rodgers near the 10-yard line, keeping his feet in bounds for the final few yards as he extended the ball past the pylon.
- ►Vs. Dallas (Oct. 16): Started as the third WR and had two receptions for 34 yards (17.0 avg.)...Left the game to be evaluated for a concussion

after absorbing a big hit on his 12-yard catch on a third-and-11 in the third quarter, and did not return.

69 David Bakhtiari, T, 4th Year, Colorado

- Started all 46 games he played in at left tackle for the Packers in his first three seasons in the league and was named a Pro Bowl alternate in 2014.
- In 2013, became the first rookie to start every game at LT for Green Bay since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.
- By starting at San Francisco in the 2013 season opener, he became just the fourth Green Bay rookie to start at LT in Week 1 since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger and the first since Ken Ruettgers in 1985.
- **2016 SEASON:** Has started all five games at LT...Part of a line that has helped the Packers rank tied for No. 5 in the NFL in sacks allowed with nine and No. 1 in third-down conversions (49.3 percent).

- Started all 15 games he played in 2014, a career high, and helped the offense rank No. 1 in the league in scoring (30.4), No. 6 in yards per game (386.1) and tied for No. 1 in giveaways with a franchise-record 13.
- Played in 37 games with 33 starts at right tackle in his first three seasons as a pro.

88 Ty Montgomery, WR, 2nd Year, Stanford

- Played in six games with three starts as a rookie in 2015 before an ankle injury that he sustained in Week 6 vs. San Diego would sideline him for the remainder of the season.
- Caught 15 passes for 136 yards (9.1 avg.) and two TDs and posted a 31.1-vard average on seven kickoff returns last season.
- Finished his career at Stanford as the school's all-time leader in kickoff return yards with 2,493, besting Chris Owusu's mark of 2,132 yards from 2008-11.

- ▶Vs. N.Y. Giants (Oct. 9): Had one kickoff return for 24 yards.
- ►Vs. Dallas (Oct. 16): Played 35 snaps on offense and registered a career-high 10 catches for a career-best 98 yards (9.8 avg.), with six of the catches going for first downs...His catch total was the best by a Packer on the season...Also had 6 rushing yards on three carries (2.0 avg.) and two kickoff returns for 64 yards (32.0 avg.), highlighted by a season-long 40-yard return in the fourth quarter

68 Kyle Murphy, T, Rookie, Stanford

- Played in 54 games with 34 starts in four years at Stanford. Named thirdteam All-America by *Phil Steele's College Football* as a senior after serving as a team captain and starting all 14 games at left tackle.
- Started all 13 games at right tackle as a junior and was selected second-team All-Pacific-12 by *Phil Steele's College Football*.
- Played in 14 games with two starts in 2012, joining G Joshua Garnett as the first true freshmen offensive linemen to start at Stanford since 2000.
 2016 SEASON: Has been inactive for all five games (healthy scratch).

87 Jordy Nelson, WR, 9th Year, Kansas State

- One of just two players in franchise history (WR Sterling Sharpe, 1989 and 1992) to register two seasons with 85-plus receptions and 1,300-plus receiving yards, having done it in 2011 and 2014.
- Eclipsed the 1,000-yard receiving mark three times over a four-year span (2011, 2013-14).
- Ranks No. 7 in franchise history in receptions (426), No. 8 in receiving yards (6,421) and tied for No. 5 in TD receptions (54).
- Set a single-season franchise record with 1,519 receiving yards in 2014, topping WR Robert Brooks' mark of 1,497 yards in 1995, on the way to being selected to his first career Pro Bowl and earning second-team All-Pro honors from *The Associated Press*.
- Ranked No. 4 in the NFL and No. 2 among wide receivers (Dez Bryant, 50) with 43 TD catches from 2011-14.
- **2016 SEASON:** Has started all five games and has caught 26 passes for 312 yards (12.0 avg.) and five TDs...Is tied for No. 1 in the league in TD catches...Leads the team in receiving yards and ranks No. 2 in receptions... Posted five TD receptions in the first four games, tied for the fourth most in franchise history behind only Don Hutson (seven in 1942, six in 1945) and Bob Mann (six in 1951).
- ► At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): After missing the entire 2015 season due to a knee injury, returned to the starting lineup and played 54 snaps, tying

for the team lead with six catches for 32 yards (5.3 avg.) and a TD...The TD catch was the 50th of his career and came with just over three minutes remaining in the first half to give the Packers a 14-10 lead as he found an opening in the middle of the end zone.

- ▶At Minnesota (Sept. 18): Started and played 68 of 71 snaps, pacing the team with 73 yards receiving and a TD on five catches (14.6 avg.)... Caught a 1-yard TD pass from QB Aaron Rodgers in the first quarter, moving him into sole possession of the No. 6 spot in team history with 51 TD catches...It marked the third time in his career that he had caught at least one TD pass in both of the first two games (also 2011 and 2013)... - ▶Vs. Detroit (Sept. 25): Started and played 49 of 54 snaps, leading the team with six catches for 101 yards (16.8 avg.) and two TDs, with all of his receptions coming in the first half...It marked the third time in his career that he had posted 100-plus receiving yards in a first half (Weeks 10-11 in 2014)...Joined WR James Jones as the only Packers over the past 15 sesaons (2002-16) to register at least one TD grab in each of the first three games of the season...On his first TD, an 8-yard grab late in the first quarter, came out of the slot and went to the middle of the end zone before moving to his right to find an opening for a scrambling Rodgers to get him the ball...Helped set up the score with a 49-yard catch, the longest reception by a Packer in the first three games, as he beat LB Thurston Armbrister over the middle to make a leaping grab in stride before taking it down the sideline to the Detroit 11...Late in the first half, beat CB Darius Slay down the right sideline to catch a perfectly thrown ball from Rodgers over his shoulder for the 17-yard score...His two TD catches gave him 53 for his career, moving him into a tie with WR Greg Jennings for the No. 5 spot in franchise history.
- ▶Vs. N.Y. Giants (Oct. 9): Started and played 72 of 80 snaps, finishing with four receptions for 38 yards (9.5 avg.) and a TD with all four catches going for first downs...On Green Bay's opening drive, freed himself from the coverage of CB Eli Apple in the end zone to make a diving grab for a 2-yard TD, making him the first Packer to catch a TD pass in each of the team's first four games since WR Bill Schroeder in 2001.
- ▶Vs. Dallas (Oct. 16): Started and played 64 of 70 snaps...Caught five passes for 68 yards (13.6 avg.), including a 25-yard reception midway through the fourth quarter to help set up a 6-yard TD pass from Rodgers to WR Randall Cobb two plays later...Beat CB Anthony Brown down the sideline on the play to make a leaping grab down to the Dallas 11.

64 Mike Pennel, DT, 3rd Year, Colorado State-Pueblo

- Played in all 16 games with five starts in 2015 and posted 35 tackles (22 solo), a sack, a forced fumble, three QB hits and four pressures.
- Made the team as a rookie free agent and played in 13 games in 2014. One of two undrafted rookie free agents to be on the Packers' 53-man roster for Week 1 (LB Jayrone Elliott).
- **2016 SEASON:** Has played in one game and has registered three tackles (all solo), including two tackles for a loss...Was on reserve/suspended for the first four games of the season.
- ►Vs. Dallas (Oct. 16): Played 13 snaps on defense in his season debut, recording three tackles (all solo), including two tackles for a loss...Tackled G Zack Martin at the Green Bay 34 in the second quarter after Martin recovered a QB Dak Prescott fumble following a 10-yard team sack...Also stopped RB Ezekiel Elliott for a 3-yard loss on a fourth-quarter run.

56 Julius Peppers, LB, 15th Year, North Carolina

- Has been selected to the Pro Bowl nine times during his career, including last season (2004-06, 2008-12, 2015), and has been named first-team All-Pro by *The Associated Press* three times (2004, 2006, 2010). Was named to the NFL's All-Decade Team for the 2000s.
- Has played in 223 games with 218 starts as a pro, appearing in all 16 contests in 12 of his first 14 seasons in the NFL. Has missed just two games due to injury during his career.
- Is the only player in NFL history with 100-plus sacks (138.5) and 10-plus

interceptions (11).

- Since entering the NFL in 2002, ranks No. 1 in the league in sacks (138.5) and No. 3 in forced fumbles (46). His career sack total ranks No. 6 in NFL history (since 1982).
- **2016 SEASON:** Has played in all five games with two starts and ranks No. 3 on the team with 2.5 sacks...Has posted seven tackles (five solo), three tackles for a loss, a forced fumble, four QB hits and four pressures.
- ► At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Played 29 snaps and posted an assisted tackle.
- ►At Minnesota (Sept. 18): Led the team with 1.5 sacks, moving into a tie for No. 7 in NFL history with Dent and Randle (137.5 sacks)...Midway through the second quarter, fought off a block from T Andre Smith to bring down QB Sam Bradford for a 7-yard sack and force a three-and-out... Shared a 9-yard sack with LB Nick Perry on a third-and-11 in the fourth quarter, knocking back Smith on his way to the 9-yard sack of Bradford.
- ►Vs. Detroit (Sept. 25): Started at LOLB with LB Clay Matthews sidelined (ankle/hamstring) and appeared on 32 plays...Posted two tackles (one solo) and a QB pressure.

80 Justin Perillo, TE, 3rd Year, Maine

- Played in a career-high nine games last season and made the first receptions of his career, finishing with 11 catches for 102 yards (9.3 avg.) and a TD.
- Started out the 2015 season on Green Bay's practice squad before being signed to the 53-man roster on Oct. 14, where he remained for the rest of the season.
- Appeared in two games as a rookie in 2014, starting out the season on the practice squad for the first nine contests before being signed to the active roster for the final seven games and both playoff contests.
- **2016 SEASON:** Has played in all five games, seeing limited action on offense and special teams...Has two catches for 17 yards (8.5 avg.).
- ► At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Appeared on six plays on special teams. ► At Minnesota (Sept. 18): Played three snaps on offense and four on special teams.
- ►Vs. Detroit (Sept. 25): Saw increased action on offense with TE Jared Cook departing the game in the second quarter (ankle)...Played 17 snaps and had a 13-yard reception, his first catch of the season.
- ►Vs. N.Y. Giants (Oct. 9): Appeared on 13 plays on offense and seven on special teams.
- ►Vs. Dallas (Oct. 16): Had a 4-yard catch and played 16 snaps on offense...Also appeared on seven plays on special teams.

53 Nick Perry, LB, 5th Year, Southern California

- Tied the franchise record for sacks in a single postseason (LB Clay Matthews, 2010) with 3½ in the 2015 playoffs. His six career postseason sacks rank No. 3 in franchise history behind Matthews (10) and Reggie White (eight), and are the most in team history (since 1982) by a player in his first five games with Green Bay.
- Has posted at least one sack in four of his five career playoff games.
- Has registered a two-sack game in each of the last four seasons (2013-2016), the only player on the Packers to do so over that span.
- **2016 SEASON:** Has started all five games and leads the team with a career-high 4.5 sacks...Is tied for No. 10 in the NFL in sacks...Ranks No. 5 on the defense with 26 tackles (19 solo) and leads the team in tackles for a loss (eight), QB pressures (11) and QB hits (10)...Also has a pass defensed...Part of a run defense that ranks No. 3 in the league in rushing yards allowed per game (72.4), No. 2 in yards allowed per carry (3.04 avg.) and No. 3 in runs of 10-plus yards allowed (eight).
- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Started at ROLB and played 52 snaps, finishing with three tackles (all solo), a sack, a team-high four QB pres-

sures and a team-leading four QB hits...With the Packers leading 27-20 in the fourth quarter, brought down QB Blake Bortles for a 2-yard sack on third-and-11 with just over six minutes remaining to force the Jaguars to settle for a 50-yard FG from K Jason Myers...Dating back to the 2015 postseason, has posted 4½ sacks in the last three games...Added a tackle for a loss early in the fourth quarter, stopping RB T.J. Yeldon for a 2-yard loss on a run up the middle.

- ►At Minnesota (Sept. 18): Started at LOLB and appeared on 49 of 58 plays, recording five tackles (one solo), a half-sack, three pressures and two QB hits..Shared a 9-yard sack with LB Julius Peppers on a third-and-11 in the fourth quarter, knocking back T Matt Kalil on his way to the 9-yard sack of QB Sam Bradford.
- ▶Vs. Detroit (Sept. 25): Started at ROLB and matched his career high with two sacks, the fourth straight season that he has posted a two-sack game (only Green Bay player to do so since 2013)...Both of his sacks came in the fourth quarter, the first on a third-and-6 at the Green Bay 24 when he beat LT Taylor Decker to bring down QB Matthew Stafford for an 8-yard loss as the Lions were forced to settle for a FG...Chased down Stafford on the next series for a zero-yard sack on a third-and-19 to force a Detroit punt...Brought down RB Theo Riddick for a 6-yard loss on a first-quarter run...Two plays later, tackled Riddick again for a 3-yard loss on another run...Late in the first quarter, batted down a QB Matthew Stafford pass near the line of scrimmage...Finished with nine tackles (eight solo), matching his career high set vs. San Francisco (Sept. 9, 2012), and added a QB hit and a pressure.
- ▶Vs. N.Y. Giants (Oct. 9): Started at LOLB and registered a sack, marking his fourth straight game with at least a half-sack, the first time in his career that he had accomplished that feat...Midway through the third quarter, blew by LT Ereck Flowers and drilled QB Eli Manning for a 6-yard loss...Finished with four tackles (three solo), three pressures and three QB hits.
- ►Vs. Dallas (Oct. 16): Started and played 49 snaps, recording five tackles (four solo).

23 Damarious Randall, CB, 2nd Year, Arizona State

- Played in 15 games with nine starts (six at LCB, two at RCB, one in the slot) in 2015 and tied for the team lead and No. 2 among NFL rookies with three interceptions, including one he returned for a TD. Finished with a team-best 16 passes defensed.
- Named the NFL's Defensive Rookie of the Month for November 2015, joining CB Casey Hayward (October 2012) as the only Green Bay defensive backs to win the award.
- Earned first-team All-Pacific-12 honors at safety as a senior in 2014 after he led the Sun Devils in tackles (106) and passes defensed (12) and tied for the team lead with three interceptions.
- **2016 SEASON:** Has started all four games he has played in at LCB and has recorded 14 tackles (12 solo), an interception and three passes defensed (tied for the team lead)...Has added two tackles on special teams.
- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Started at LCB and posted eight tackles (six solo) and two passes defensed (tied for the team lead)...Made the initial hit of WR Allen Hurns on fourth-and-1 with 23 seconds remaining as a group of Packers brought Hurns down for a 1-yard loss to secure the 27-23 victory for Green Bay...Added a tackle on special teams, running down RB Corey Grant at the Jacksonville 31 on a kickoff return early in the fourth quarter that could have gone for a bigger gain.
- ▶At Minnesota (Sept. 18): Started at LCB and played all 58 snaps, joining S Ha Ha Clinton-Dix as the only Green Bay defensive players to do so...Posted five tackles on defense (three solo) and added a stop on special teams, wrapping up WR Cordarrelle Patterson at the Minnesota 44 on a fourth-quarter kickoff return.
- ▶Vs. Detroit (Sept. 25): Started at LCB and played 57 of 68 snaps, missing some time due to illness...Early in the second quarter, perfectly timed it to get his hands in as TE Eric Ebron was attempting to make a catch at the Green Bay 31, ripping the ball out from Ebron and returning the interception 44 yards to the Detroit 25, a career-long INT return...Added two tackles (both solo).
- ▶Vs. N.Y. Giants (Oct. 9): Inactive (groin).
- ▶Vs. Dallas (Oct. 16): Started at LCB and played 18 snaps, but rein-

jured his groin making a tackle of WR Terrance Williams early in the second quarter and did not return...Posted two tackles (both solo).

99 Christian Ringo, DT, 1st Year, Louisiana-Lafayette

- Originally drafted by the Packers as their second selection in the sixth round (210th overall) of the 2015 NFL Draft. Was on Green Bay's practice squad for the entire 2015 season.
- Started all 13 games as a senior in 2014, anchoring a defensive line that helped the Ragin' Cajuns lead the Sun Belt in rushing defense while ranking third in sacks.
- Was named the state's Defensive Player of the Year by the Louisiana Sports Writers Association after ranking seventh in the nation in tackles for loss (20) and 12th in the country in sacks (11½). His 11½ sacks tied the school single-season record and he also finished tied for No. 1 in school history with 21.0 career sacks.

2016 SEASON: Has played in three games and has posted four tackles (one solo).

- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Played 12 snaps on defense in his NFL debut and posted a solo tackle, stopping RB T.J. Yeldon for a 1-yard loss on a run up the middle in the second quarter.
- ▶At Minnesota (Sept. 18): Appeared on six plays on defense.

22 Aaron Ripkowski, FB, 2nd Year, Oklahoma

- Played in 15 games as a rookie last season, seeing action primarily on special teams, and posted nine tackles (tied for No. 4 on the team).
- Was tied with CB Damarious Randall (15) for the most games played by a Green Bay rookie in 2015.
- Began his career at Oklahoma as a walk-on and went on to play in 47 games with 17 starts in four seasons.

2016 SEASON: Has played in all five games with two starts, seeing time primarily on offense and special teams...Has three carries for 17 yards (5.7 avg.).

- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Played 18 snaps on special teams, tied for the team lead, and eight snaps on offense.
- ►At Minnesota (Sept. 18): Appeared on 19 plays on special teams and two on offense.
- ▶Vs. Detroit (Sept. 25): Started his first career game and seemed to be in position for the most significant offensive action of his career, but was limited to just 11 snaps before departing in the second quarter due to a back injury...Was the lead blocker on RB Eddie Lacy's game-long 25-yard run in the second quarter, sealing LB Kyle Van Noy to create a running lane up the middle.
- ▶Vs. N.Y. Giants (Oct. 9): Saw the most significant action of his career, appearing on 25 plays and posting a career-high 17 yards rushing on two carries (8.5 avg.)...Had a career-best 13-yard run midway through the fourth quarter as he dragged a host of defenders on a run up the middle to the New York 10, helping to set up a 25-yard Mason Crosby FG that put Green Bay up, 23-9...Helped clear the way for Lacy's 81 yards rushing on just 11 carries (7.4 avg.), part of a 147-yard rushing effort by the offense, a season high.
- ►Vs. Dallas (Oct. 16): Started and played 18 snaps on offense, carrying the ball once for no gain...Also appeared on 14 plays on special teams.

12 Aaron Rodgers, QB, 12th Year, California

- Ranks No. 1 in NFL history (min. 1,500 attempts) in career passer rating (103.5), interception percentage (1.63) and TD/INT ratio (3.87, 267/69).
- Has posted five seasons (2009, 2011-12, 2014-15) with 500-plus passing attempts and eight or fewer INTs, the most in NFL history ahead of Patriots QB Tom Brady (three seasons) and five QBs (one season each).
- Was named the league's Most Valuable Player by *The Associated Press* in 2014 for the second time in his career (2011), becoming the eighth player in league history to win the honor multiple times.

- Is the only quarterback in league history to record a 100-plus passer rating in six consecutive seasons (2009-14), with no other QB doing so in more than four straight years.
- Is one of only eight quarterbacks in NFL annals with 30,000-plus passing yards and 2,000-plus rushing yards.
- In 124 career regular-season starts (83-41 record), has posted 43 games with 300-plus passing yards, 71 without an interception (min. 15 attempts) and 67 with a 100-plus passer rating.
- Has been selected to the Pro Bowl in five of the last seven seasons (2009, 2011-12, 2014-15).
- **2016 SEASON:** Has completed 109 of 181 passes for 1,170 yards and 10 TDs with four INTs for an 88.4 passer rating...Is tied for No. 8 in the league in TD passes and ranks No. 6 in TD percentage (5.5)...Is tied for No. 3 among NFL quarterbacks with two rushing TDs, and has 89 yards on 20 carries (4.5 avg.), good for No. 7 among QBs in rushing yards per game (17.8).
- ▶At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Threw for 199 yards and two TDs on 20-of-34 passing for a 95.1 passer rating...Added a 6-yard rushing TD on Green Bay's opening possession, giving him 11 games with two-plus passing TDs and one-plus rushing TDs since 2008, second most over that span behind only Panthers QB Cam Newton...His TD passes came on back-to-back drives late in the first half...Connected with WR Jordy Nelson for a 6-yard TD pass with just over three minutes remaining in the first half, buying time in the pocket before moving to his right to find Nelson in the middle of the end zone...With CB Jalen Ramsey attempting to pull him down by the back of his jersey, threw a perfectly placed 29-yard TD pass to WR Davante Adams over CB Davon House in the end zone with 13 seconds remaining in the half.
- ▶At Minnesota (Sept. 18): Connected on 20 of 36 passes for 213 yards and a TD with one INT (70.7 passer rating)...Rushed for 29 yards on three carries (9.7 avg.), highlighted by a 10-yard TD run up the middle early in the fourth quarter...It marked just the third time in his career (Weeks 9-10, 2009; Weeks 2-3, 2010) that he had posted a rushing TD in back-to-back games.
- ▶Vs. Detroit (Sept. 25): Posted a season-high 129.3 passer rating, connecting on 15 of 24 passes for 205 yards and four TDs with no INTs, with all four of the TD passes coming in the first half...It marked just the second time in his career that he had thrown four-plus TD passes in a first half (six vs. Chicago, Nov. 9, 2014)...His 24 passing attempts were the fewest in his career in a game that he threw four-plus TD passes...Threw two TD passes to Nelson, including a perfectly placed 17-yard pass over Nelson's shoulder late in the first half to put Green Bay up, 31-3...With just under 3:30 remaining and the Packers leading 34-27, scrambled to pick up 11 yards on a third-and-8 that helped seal the win...Finished with 22 yards rushing on five carries (4.4 avg.).
- ▶Vs. N.Y. Giants (Oct. 9): Threw for 259 yards and two TDs with two INTs on 23-of-45 passing for a 65.0 passer rating...Threw a 2-yard TD pass to Nelson on the opening drive, his 50th to Nelson in the regular season, the second-most prolific combo in franchise history behind only QB Brett Favre and WR Antonio Freeman (57)...On Green Bay's opening drive, had a key 11-yard run to the Giants' 6 on third-and-10, bouncing around the pocket before taking it down the left sideline for the first down that set up his TD pass to Nelson just two plays later...Midway through the second quarter, perfectly placed a ball over the shoulder of Adams down the right sideline with CB Michael Hunter covering him for a 29-yard score.
- ►Vs. Dallas (Oct. 16): Completed a season-high 31 passes on 42 attempts for a season-best 294 yards and a TD with one INT for a 90.8 passer rating...Completed passes to nine different players, a season high.

82 Richard Rodgers, TE, 3rd Year, California

- Had 58 receptions in 2015, becoming just the fourth TE in team history to record 55-plus receptions in a season (Paul Coffman, Jermichael Finley, Jackie Harris).
- Was one of only four TEs in the NFL last season to register 55-plus catches, 500-plus receiving yards and eight or more TD receptions (Rob Gronkowski, Jordan Reed, Gary Barnidge).
- Registered 10 TD catches in 2014-15, tied for the most by a Green Bay TE in his first two seasons since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger (Bubba Franks,
