

#### PACKERS RETURN HOME TO PLAY THE SAINTS

After back-to-back away games, the Green Bay Packers will host the New Orleans Saints at Lambeau Field on Sunday in the first noon home game this season.

- ► The Packers are 10-2 at home against New Orleans.
- ► It is the Saints' latest trip by date to Wisconsin since playing the Packers in Milwaukee on Nov. 17, 1985.



- ► Each team has scored 20-plus points in each of the last five matchups, with three being decided by eight or fewer points.
- ► As the home team, Green Bay has scored 21-plus points in all 12 games against the Saints.
- ▶The Packers are 4-2 this season, marking the fifth straight season and the 10th time since 2000 that Green Bay has won at least four of its first six games (6-0 in 2011 and 2015 / 5-1 in 2002 and 2007 / 4-2 in 2001, 2009, 2013, 2014 and 2016).
- ► The Packers' four wins are tied for the third most in the NFL this season and the second most in the NFC.
- ► The Packers have won 10 of their last 12 regular-season games and are tied with Kansas City, New England and Pittsburgh for the best record in the NFL over that span.
- ▶ Dating back to 2006, the Packers (31-12, .721) hold the second-best winning percentage in the month of October behind the New England Patriots (41-8, .837).
- ► Green Bay has won 22 of its last 27 games played in the month of October and 12 of the last 13 at home in October.
- ▶The Packers are 17-5 (.773) at home in the month of October since 2006, ranking No. 3 in the NFC (New Orleans, 19-4, .826 / New York Giants, 18-4, .818) and tied for No. 5 in the NFL over that span (New England, 21-2, .913 / Indianapolis, 15-4, .789 / Pittsburgh, 17-5, .773).
- ► Green Bay has outscored opponents by 226 points at home in October since 2006, No. 2 in the NFL over that span (New England, 321).
- ► The Packers rank No. 3 in the NFL in points per game allowed (19.1) in the month of October since 2006.
- ► Green Bay has registered 53 interceptions in the month of October since 2006, tied for No. 3 in the NFL over that span (New York Giants, 61 / New England, 56 / Arizona, 53).
- ► The Packers are the only team with four touchdowns on opening drives this season. Green Bay leads the league with 27 points on opening drives.
- ► The Packers are No. 1 in red-zone efficiency this season (16 TDs on 22 drives, 72.7 percent).

#### **REGULAR-SEASON WEEK 7**

▶The Packers will have a bye in Week 8, the latest bye week for Green Bay since 2014 (Week 9). After the bye, Green Bay will play consecutive games against NFC North opponents. In Week 9, they will host the Detroit Lions on *Monday Night Football*, and then face the Bears in Chicago in Week 10.

#### WITH THE CALL

FOX Sports, now in its 24th season as an NFL network television partner, will broadcast the game.



- ► Play-by-play man **Kenny Albert** joins analyst **Charles Davis** and sideline reporter **Pam Oliver**.
- Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since November 1929, heads up the Packers Radio Network that is made up of 50 stations in five states. Wayne Larrivee (play-by-play) and two-time Packers Pro Bowler Larry McCarren (analyst) call the action. McCarren first joined the team's broadcasts in 1995 and enters his 23rd season calling Packers games. After originally being paired together in 1999, McCarren and Larrivee enter their 19th season of broadcasts together.
- ➤ Westwood One Sports will air the game across the country. **Dan Miller** (play-by-play) and **Ross Tucker** (analyst) will call the action and **Scott Graham** will host pregame and halftime shows.
- ► The broadcast is also available on Sirius Satellite Radio (WTMJ feed).
- ▶ DIRECTV subscribers can watch the game on Channel 709.

#### **HOME SWEET HOME**

Green Bay has a long tradition of playing well at Lambeau Field.

- ► Green Bay is 3-0 at home this season, marking the fifth time in the last seven seasons that the Packers have began the season 3-0 or better at home.
- ► Green Bay finished with a record of .500 or better at home in 10 of the first 11 seasons under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**.

- ► Green Bay's victory in Week 4 vs. Chicago was the 220th at Lambeau Field, the most home wins by any franchise at one stadium in NFL history.
- ► The Packers are 10-2 (.833) in home openers under McCarthy, including 9-1 (.900) when QB **Aaron Rodgers** starts.
- ► Since the start of 2014, Green Bay ranks **No. 1 in the NFL** in winning percentage at home during the regular season:

- ▶ In 2014, Green Bay's plus-155 point differential at home was the highest in franchise history (dating back to 1940), eclipsing the plus-151 in 1996.
- ▶ Dating back to 2014, Green Bay ranks **No. 1 in the NFL** in first-quarter scoring margin (plus-173) at home (according to pro-football-reference. com). The Packers are plus-14 in first-quarter scoring margin at home this season, ranking **No. 7 in the NFL**.
- ▶The Packers recorded 35 points in their last home game. Under McCarthy, Green Bay has scored 30-plus points at home during the regular season 40 times, winning 38 of those contests. The Packers' rank **No. 3 in the league** in home games with 30-plus points since 2006:

- ► WR **Jordy Nelson** has recorded at least one touchdown catch in 16 of the last 19 games he has played in at Lambeau Field, totaling 23 touchdown receptions over that span.
- ▶ Over his career, Nelson has registered at least one touchdown reception in 30 games at Lambeau Field. The Packers are 28-2 in those contests.
- ► Nelson has recorded five touchdown receptions in three home games this season, including two touchdowns in each of the past two home games.
- ▶ Dating back to the 2016 season, Nelson has 14 receiving touchdowns in 11 home games, ranking No. 1 in the NFL. WR Davante Adams is tied for No. 2 in the NFL over that span with eight receiving touchdowns at home.

#### FIRST CAREER START

On Sunday, QB **Brett Hundley** is expected to make his first career start for the Packers. Below are the top passing-yardage totals by a Packers QB in their first start with the team during the Super Bowl era:

- ► The last time a QB besides **Aaron Rodgers** started a regular-season game for Green Bay was QB Matt Flynn on Dec. 22, 2013 vs. Pittsburgh.
- ► Rodgers is the last Packers QB to win his first career start for the team (24-19, vs. Minnesota, Sept. 8, 2008).



#### IN THE CONFERENCE

The Packers have established themselves as one of the best teams in the NEC

- ► Green Bay has won eight of its last 10 regular-season games against NFC opponents.
- ► Under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**, Green Bay tallied a winning record against NFC opponents in 10 of his first 11 seasons (2006-16):

► While LB Clay Matthews passed DE Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila for the franchise sack record earliest this season, his 56 career sacks against NFC teams trails Gbaja-Biamila (56.5) for the most by a Green Bay player since 1982.



Two years after he co-founded the Packers with Curly Lambeau, George Calhoun began writing a piece called The Dope Sheet, which served as the official press release from 1921-24.



#### AT THE HELM

Having led Green Bay to the playoffs in nine of his first 11 seasons as head coach, **Mike McCarthy** is joined by Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl win with a victory over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.

- ► McCarthy guided the Packers to a franchise-record fourth consecutive division title in 2014. In his 11 seasons, he has won six division titles, tying Lombardi for the second most in franchise history.
- ►With a win at Tampa Bay in Week 16 of the 2014 season, McCarthy passed Lombardi for the No. 2 spot in team history as far as overall victories:

- ►The 128 overall wins are the most in the NFC and the second most in the NFL since 2006 (New England, 156).
- ▶ In Week 6, McCarthy recorded his 200th career game as a head coach (including the postseason), Having compiled 128 victories, he tied Bud Grant and Chuck Noll for the sixth-most wins by a head coach through 200 games: Don Shula, 149 / Joe Gibbs, 138 / George Halas, 134 / Tony Dungy, 130 / Curly Lambeau, 130.
- ► McCarthy reached 100 career wins (including playoffs) in just his 155th game. He was the fastest to reach 100 wins in the NFL since George Seifert in 1996 (132 games).
- ► McCarthy's 114 regular-season wins in his first 11 years as a head coach (2006-16) are **tied for No. 3 in NFL history**:

- ► McCarthy recorded his third regular season with 12-plus wins in 2014 (2007, 2011), passing Curly Lambeau (1929, 1931), Lombardi (1962, 1966), Holmgren (1996-97) and Mike Sherman (2001-02) for the most by a coach in franchise history.
- ► McCarthy has guided the Packers to five seasons with 11-plus wins (2007, 2009, 2011-12, 2014), passing Lombardi (1961-63, 1966) and Holmgren (1995-98) for the **most by a coach in franchise history**.
- ► McCarthy's eight regular seasons with 10-plus wins are a **franchise record** (since 1921). Among current NFL head coaches, only Bill Belichick (16) and Andy Reid (11) have more 10-plus win seasons.
- ►McCarthy is the only coach in franchise history to post three or more consecutive 10-win seasons twice in his career (2009-12, 2014-16).
- ► McCarthy joined Pittsburgh's Bill Cowher (2005) as the only Super Bowlwinning coaches to lead their respective teams to three road wins as the No. 6 seed in the postseason en route to a world title.
- ►Including playoffs, McCarthy has a 128-71-1 record since taking over as head coach in 2006, a .643 winning percentage that ranks No. 2 among current NFL head coaches (minimum 100 games):

►McCarthy has coached in 200 games (including playoffs), No. 2 in team history behind Curly Lambeau (339 from 1921-49).

▶In the Week 6 victory over the San Diego Chargers in 2015, McCarthy earned the 100th regular-season win of his career in just his 150th game, making him the seventh-fastest coach in NFL history and the fastest current NFL coach to reach the 100-win plateau:

#### **WINNING WAYS**

- ▶ The Packers are the only NFC team and one of two teams in the league (New England) to make the playoffs each of the past eight seasons (2009-16). Those eight appearances are more than the rest of the NFC North Division combined during that span (Minnesota-three / Detroit-three / Chicago-one).
- ► McCarthy became just the **fourth head coach in NFL history** to lead a single franchise to eight-plus consecutive playoff appearances:

- ►There are seven teams in the NFL with five-plus playoff appearances from 2009-16, with only two in the NFC (New England and Green Bay, eight / Cincinnati and Seattle, six / Baltimore, Denver, Indianapolis, five).
- ► With the victory over Dallas in the 2016 playoffs, McCarthy has led the Packers to 10 wins in the postseason, passing Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren for the **most in team history**:

► The 10 postseason wins since 2007 are tied for No. 2 in the NFL with Baltimore and Seattle (New England, 13). The rest of the NFC North has combined for two postseason wins over the last 10 seasons (Minnesota and Chicago).

#### **COACHES CAPSULES**

MIKE McCARTHY...Is in his 12th year as the Packers' 14th head coach.

- ▶ Led the Packers to their eighth consecutive playoff appearance last season, tied for the third-longest streak in NFL history. Has also led the team to nine playoff appearances in the last 10 years (2007, 2009-16).
- ► Ranks second in franchise history in total victories, trailing only Curly Lambeau.
- ► Guided the Packers to top-10 finishes in scoring in eight straight seasons (2007-14), joining the Patriots as the only other team to accomplish the feat over that time; Packers finished first overall in scoring in 2014.
- Reached the 100-win plateau faster than any active NFL head coach, needing just 155 games.
- ► Joined Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl title with a win over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.

**SEAN PAYTON...**Is in his 11th year as the Saints' 14th head coach.

- ► Has led New Orleans to five playoff appearances, three NFC South titles, two NFC Championship games and a Super Bowl title in his time at the helm of the Saints.
- ►Is the longest-tenured head coach in the NFC South and only three head coaches across the NFL have been with their teams for a longer period of time, including McCarthy, who was hired one week before Payton in 2006.
- ► Has won six postseason games with the Saints since taking over a franchise that had won just once in the postseason in the nearly 40 years prior to his arrival.
- ▶Before joining New Orleans he coached for the Dallas Cowboys from 2003-05, serving as the assistant head coach/quarterbacks the first two years and the assistant head coach/passing game coordinator in his last year.
- ▶Began his coaching career in the NFL as the quarterbacks coach for the Philadelphia Eagles in 1997-98 and then coached for the New York Giants from 1999-2002, serving as the offensive coordinator his last three seasons.

#### THE PACKERS-SAINTS SERIES

- ▶ These clubs launched their series in 1968, when former Vince Lombardi assistants Phil Bengston (Packers) and Tom Fears (Saints) met in Milwaukee. The Packers, one year after winning Super Bowl II, defeated the second-year Saints, 29-7. Fears, a Packers assistant for five seasons, was New Orleans' first head coach.
- ► The Packers are 16-8 all-time against the Saints.
- ► From 1972-1985, Green Bay won nine of the teams' 10 matchups.
- ► Green Bay is 10-2 all-time at home against New Orleans.
- New Orleans is just 1-4 in games played at Lambeau Field.

#### **NOTABLE CONNECTIONS**

Packers head coach Mike McCarthy served as the Saints offensive coordinator from 2000-04...Packers G Jahri Evans spent the first 11 seasons of his career with the Saints, notching six Pro Bowl selections and four first-team All-Pro selections and ranks second among offensive linemen in Saints history with 169 games played...Other members of the Packers staff who coached in New Orleans include: defensive coordinator Dom Capers (1986-91), associate head coach/linebackers Winston Moss (2000-05) and special teams coordinator Ron Zook (2000-01)...Packers offensive line coach James Campen played two seasons in New Orleans (1987-88) after playing collegiately at Tulane...Packers QB Joe Callahan spent time on the Saints' active roster last season...Saints LB A.J. Klein is an Appleton, Wis., native and played at Kimberly High School...New Orleans T Ryan Ramczyk played at Wisconsin and is a native of Stevens Point, Wis. ... - ► For just the third time in NFL history, there were no punts by either team.
- ▶ Despite throwing two interceptions on tipped passes, QB Aaron Rodgers threw for 418 yards (second most in his career), including a 70-yard touchdown to WR Randall Cobb.

QB **Aaron Rodgers** surpassed the 1,500-attempt plateau for his career in 2010, the benchmark to qualify for passer rating in the NFL record book.

- ▶ Dating back to last season, Rodgers completed 27-plus passes in five consecutive games (Weeks 16-17 of 2016 and Weeks 1-3 of 2017), passing Brett Favre (four, Weeks 2-5, 2007) for the longest streak in franchise history.
- ► Rodgers registered the sixth 4,000-yard passing season of his career in 2016, setting the **franchise record** as he surpassed Favre's mark of five 4,000-yard seasons.
- ► Rodgers had 11 zero-INT games last season (min. 15 att.), the third time in his career with 10-plus zero-INT games (13 in 2014, 12 in 2009). The only other QB in team history to have 10 in a season was Bart Starr (10) in 1964.
- ▶In 2016, Rodgers set the single-season franchise record for completions with 401, surpassing Favre's mark of 372 in 2005.
- ►In the Week 7 victory over Chicago (2016), Rodgers set a **single-game franchise record** with 39 completions, besting the previous high of 36 by Favre at Chicago on Dec. 5, 1993.
- ▶ Rodgers went over the 35,000-yard passing mark for his career last season in Week 11 at Washington. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he reached the mark on his 4,446th attempt, the **second-fewest** attempts needed in NFL history behind QB Johnny Unitas (4,388 attempts).

- ▶In 2016, Rodgers posted a season passer rating of 104.2, the seventh time in his career that he had registered a 100-plus passer rating, the most in NFL history (Peyton Manning and Steve Young, six each).
- ▶Rodgers recorded his sixth season with 500-plus attempts and eight or fewer INTs in 2016, the most in NFL history (Tom Brady, three; nine others with one).
- ►The 2016 regular season saw Rodgers become just the second QB in NFL history to have 600-plus passing attempts and seven or fewer INTs in a season (Brady, 624 attempts, seven INTs in 2015).
- ▶In Week 14 of 2016, Rodgers recorded a passer rating of 150.8 in a win over Seattle, marking his fourth career game a passer rating of 150-plus which is the fourth most (min. 10 pass att.) among active quarterbacks (Drew Brees and Brady, five / Ben Roethlisberger, eight).

#### **RODGERS AND TOUCHDOWNS**

QB **Aaron Rodgers** has found the end zone a lot in his career, and that continued this season.

- ▶In Week 2, Rodgers became the 11th NFL player to throw 300 passing touchdowns, reaching the mark in his 144th career game to pass Peyton Manning and Dan Marino (157) for the fewest games needed to reach 300 passing TDs in NFL history.
- ► Rodgers reached 300 passing TDs on his 4,742nd pass attempt, surpassing Peyton Manning (5,306) for the fewest in league history.
- ▶Rodgers also became the first quarterback to reach 300 passing TDs before throwing 100 interceptions. His 73 interceptions passed Tom Brady (115) for the fewest at the time of reaching 300 passing TDs.
- ► With a league-best 40 passing TDs during the 2016 regular season, Rodgers became just the fourth QB in NFL history to record two seasons (also 2011) with 40-plus TD passes (Marino, Manning, Drew Brees). It was his franchise-record fourth season (2011-12, 2014, 2016) with 35-plus TD passes (Brett Favre, three, 1995-97).
- ► In 2016, Rodgers became the first GB quarterback to lead the NFL in TD passes since Favre in 2003.
- ► Rodgers now has five seasons with 4,000-plus passing yards and 30-plus passing TDs (2009, 2011-12, 2014, 2016), further extending his team mark.
- ► In 2016, Rodgers registered his third straight season with 30-plus touchdown passes, the second-longest streak in franchise history (Favre, five straight, 1994-98).
- ► Rodgers has thrown 38-plus TD passes four times in his career, the most in NFL history (Brees and Manning have three each).

#### **RODGERS THE RUNNER**

QB **Aaron Rodgers** uses his feet to not only create more time to throw, but also gain yards.

- ▶ Rodgers is **one of just four QBs in NFL history** to post 35,000-plus passing yards and 2,500-plus rushing yards in his career, joining Fran Tarkenton, John Elway and Donovan McNabb as the only players to accomplish that feat.
- ► Since the start of the 2016 season, Rodgers ranks No. 5 among active NFL quarterbacks with 452 rushing yards.
- ▶Dating back to 2016, Rodgers ranks No. 3 among active NFL quarterbacks with 32 rushing first downs and is tied for No. 3 with 19 runs of 10-plus yards.
- ▶Rodgers recorded a career-high 369 yards rushing during the 2016 regular season, the most by a Green Bay QB since Tobin Rote (398) in 1956.
- ► Rodgers finished the 2016 regular season **No. 3 in the NFL** in rushing vards among guarterbacks.
- ► Rodgers now has four 300-yard rushing seasons, No. 2 in franchise history among QBs behind only Rote (five).

- ► For the second straight season, Nelson had five TD catches through the first four games (2016-17). He joined Don Hutson (1944-45) as the only players in franchise history to have five-plus TD catches in the first four games in back-to-back seasons.
- ► QB Aaron Rodgers and Nelson have connected for 65 touchdowns, the most by a duo in team history (Brett Favre and Antonio Freeman, 57).
- ► In 2016, Nelson joined WR Sterling Sharpe as the **only players in team history** to record two seasons with 95-plus catches.
- ► In 2016, Nelson registered the fourth 1,200-yard (1,257) receiving season of his career, tying James Lofton for the **best mark in team history**.
- ▶ It was the third time in Nelson's career that he recorded 10-plus receiving TDs in a season (2011 and 2014). He joined Sharpe (four) and Hutson (three) as the only players in franchise history to post 10-plus TD catches in three or more seasons.
- ▶ Nelson is the first player in franchise history to record 13-plus receiving touchowns in three different seasons (2011, 2014, 2016). His three seasons of 13-plus TD receptions tie Pro Football Hall of Famers Lance Alworth, Cris Carter and Marvin Harrison for the fourth most in NFL history. Only Pro Football Hall of Famer Jerry Rice (eight), Terrell Owens (seven) and Randy Moss (six) have more such seasons in NFL history.
- ► With at least one touchdown reception in 11 games last season, Nelson tied Sharpe (1992 and 1994) for the most games with at least one TD catch in a single season in franchise history.
- Nelson has 25 100-yard receiving games in his career, passing Hutson (24) for No. 3 in team history. He trails Sharpe (29) for the second most.



#### **CLAY FINDS HIS WAY TO THE BALL**

LB Clay Matthews continues to make an impact on opposing offenses.

► In Week 4, he registered a sack/forced fumble of QB Mike Glennon to move past DE Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila to set the team record:

- ▶ In 2015, Matthews was selected to his sixth Pro Bowl and first as an inside linebacker after recording 6.5 sacks (second on the team), 14 QB hits (No. 1 on the team), and a career-high 84 tackles (No. 2 on the team). He was also one of three players (Micah Hyde, Sam Shields) on the team to have an interception and a fumble recovery.
- ►He is tied for the second-most six-plus-sack seasons in the NFL since 2009:

Packers LB **Nick Perry** leads a pass rush that has recorded multiple sacks in 16 of the past 22 regular-season games.

- ▶ Perry is tied with LB Clay Matthews for the team lead with 2.5 sacks this season.
- ▶ Despite missing two games, Perry registered a team-high 11 sacks, **tied for No. 8 in the NFL**, in 2016. He became the 11th player in team history (since 1982) to register a double-digit sack total in a season.
- ▶ Dating back to the start of 2016, Perry has registered a half-sack or more in 12 regular-season games, tied for No. 6 in the NFL:

- ▶ From 2011-14, he was the only Packer to surpass 100 tackles each season, and despite missing five games in 2015, he tied for the team lead in solo tackles (54) and led the team with 14 total tackles in the postseason. In 2016, he was **No. 1 on the team** in tackles (92) despite missing a game.
- ►He set a single-season career high with three sacks in 2016, No. 2 among safeties according to STATS:

- ► After starting 10 of 16 games and both postseason contests as a rookie, he has started every game since 2015.
- ► Clinton-Dix is **tied for No. 5 among safeties** with 12 interceptions since 2014 (including the postseason):

- ▶It was the most interceptions by a Packers safety in a single season since Charles Woodson (seven) and Charlie Peprah (five) in 2011.
- ►In 2016, Clinton-Dix posted a career-high two interceptions in both Week 9 and Week 15, becoming the first Packer to have multiple two-INT games in a season since Woodson in 2011.
- ▶In Week 9 of 2016, he joined CB Al Harris (vs. New Orleans, Oct. 9, 2005) as the only players to post two INTs in a first quarter for the Packers since 1993.
- ► He was named NFC Defensive Player of the Week for his Week 15 performance in 2016, becoming the first Packers DB to win the award since Woodson in 2010 (Week 4).

#### STATS OF THE WEEK

- ► Green Bay is one of four teams (Atlanta, Buffalo, Tennessee) that has only allowed one touchdown from outside the red zone this season.
- ►The Packers have registered 44 points off of takeaways this season, tied with the Los Angeles Rams for No. 3 in the NFL (Jacksonville, 77 / Detroit, 61).
- ► With 11 takeaways this season, Green Bay is tied with Philadelphia for No. 4 in the NFL (Jacksonville, 16 / Baltimore and Detroit, 14).
- ►The Packers lead the NFL in opponent fumbles recovered this season (seven).
- ▶ P **Justin Vogel** is No. 5 in the NFL in net punting average (44.2) this season.

#### **CONTINUAL IMPACT**

In his career, DT **Mike Daniels** has seen his playing time steadily increase as well as his production, earning him a role as a standout on the defense.

▶ Daniels ranks No. 3 among Packers defensive tackles in sacks (since 1982), according to STATS LLC:

- ▶Daniels is third on the Packers with 21.5 sacks since the start of the 2013 season. He is No. 11 among NFL defensive tackles over that span, according to STATS LLC.
- ► He has started all but two regular-season and postseason games for Green Bay and has played the most defensive snaps among Packers defensive linemen since the start of the 2014 season.
- ►In 2015, Daniels led the Packers' defensive line in tackles (66) and sacks (four). He finished third on the team with 12 QB hits.
- ►In Week 5 versus St. Louis (2015), he tied for the team lead with a career-best nine tackles (eight solo).
- ▶ Daniels registered his first career interception in Week 16 at Arizona (2015), returning it 23 yards. According to STATS LLC, it was the first interception by a Packers DT since Cullen Jenkins on Oct. 18, 2009. Dating back to 1960, his 23-yard interception return was the longest by a Green Bay DT on an interception.
- ►He led Green Bay's defensive line with 5.5 sacks and was the team leader in quarterback hits (19) and pressures (22) during the 2014 regular season.

#### **RACKING UP POINTS**

- K Mason Crosby is moving his way up the record books.
- ► Crosby passed Ryan Longwell in Week 2 of the 2015 season to become the franchise career points leader:

- ► Crosby's 1,267 points from 2007-16 were the **second most by an**NFL player in his first 10 seasons (NE Stephen Gostkowski, 1,330 from 2006-15).
- ► Crosby (1,437) passed Longwell (1,119) for the most points scored in the regular and postseason combined in franchise history.
- ▶Dating back to 2013, Crosby has made 116 field goals during the regular season, No. 7 in the NFL over that span.
- ▶ Crosby recorded 122 points during the 2016 season, giving him the 10th 100-point season of his career and **extending his franchise record**. Crosby's 10 seasons with 100-plus points are the **most in the NFL since 2007**. The only other kickers to have 10 or more consecutive seasons of 100-plus points are Jason Elam (16, 1993-2008) and Adam Vinatieri (13, 1996-2008).

#### ON THE ROAD AGAIN

Green Bay went 7-1 away from Lambeau Field in 2011, with the seven road wins setting a single-season franchise record.

- ▶The Packers have been able to stay above the .500 mark on the road during Head Coach Mike McCarthy's tenure, a notable achievement in the National Football League.
- ►Since 2006, McCarthy's first season as the head coach in Green Bay, only nine of 32 NFL teams have regular-season road records above .500.

#### **329 AND COUNTING**

Another packed house at Lambeau Field against the Chicago Bears in Week 4 brought the stadium's consecutive-sellouts streak to 329 regular-season games (not including replacement games).

- ► The league's longest-tenured stadium, Lambeau Field is hosting its 61st season of football in 2017. For the victory over Dallas in the Divisional round of the 2014 playoffs, Packers fans set a new Lambeau Field paidattendance record (79,704).
- Across American professional sports, only Boston's Fenway Park (1912) and Chicago's Wrigley Field (1914) have longer tenures.

#### THE LAMBEAU ADVANTAGE

The crown jewel of the National Football League, Lambeau Field has long been known as one of the tougher venues to play in, particularly during the harsh Wisconsin winter.

- ▶Re-establishing home-field advantage after a 4-4 mark in 2008 was one of the goals of 2009, and with the Packers finishing 6-2 at home, they accomplished that goal. Green Bay followed that up with a 7-1 mark at Lambeau Field in 2010, a perfect 8-0 record in 2011, the first undefeated home mark since 2002, and a 7-1 mark in 2012. The Packers were one of two teams to finish undefeated at home during the 2014 regular season (Denver).
- ► Head Coach Mike McCarthy stated consistently upon his arrival in Green Bay that one of the team's goals would be to reclaim the mystique of playing at Lambeau Field. Mission accomplished. The team is 68-22-1 (.753) at home in the regular season since 2006, No. 2 in the NFL.
- ► Since Ron Wolf and Mike Holmgren began the revitalization of the franchise in 1992, Green Bay owns the best home record in the NFL. A look at the top regular-season home W-L records since the '92 season:

#### A LOOK AT THE SCHEDULE

The Green Bay Packers' 97th NFL regular-season schedule – highlighted by five prime-time contests (subject to flexible scheduling) – was released April 20 by the National Football League.

- ▶ It will be the first regular season that has the Packers playing home games on a Saturday, Thursday and Monday.
- ► Green Bay's schedule includes six games against 2016 playoff teams. Two of those contests (Detroit, Seattle) are at Lambeau Field, while four (Atlanta, Dallas, Detroit, Pittsburgh) will come on the road. The Packers will play two teams (Atlanta, Dallas) that it played during the 2016 regular and postseason.
- ► For the first time since 2012, the Packers opened the season at home, and will play three of their first four games at Lambeau Field.
- ► In Week 1, Green Bay hosted the Seattle Seahawks, marking the third consecutive regular season that the Packers have played the Seahawks at home. Green Bay improved to 11-3 against the Seahawks at home during the regular and postseason, including eight straight wins.
- ► For the second straight season, the Packers played a prime-time game on the road in Week 2, traveling to Atlanta for an NFC Championship rematch with the Falcons.
- ► Week 3 saw the Cincinnati Bengals play in Green Bay for just the sixth time, and Week 4 had the Packers hosting the Chicago Bears on a Thursday night for the third consecutive season (12th straight year in primetime). The division rivals squared off in a prime-time contest for the 12th straight season.
- ►Green Bay begins October with back-to-back road games. The Packers first traveled to play the Dallas Cowboys, marking the fourth matchup between the two clubs since 2015 (including postseason), and then faced the Vikings in Minnesota in Week 6.
- ► In Week 7, the New Orleans Saints visit Lambeau, their latest trip by date to Wisconsin since playing the Packers in Milwaukee on Nov. 17, 1985.
- ►The Packers have a Week 8 bye, the latest bye week for Green Bay since 2014 (Week 9).
- ►Green Bay hosts the Detroit Lions on *Monday Night Football* in Week 9, marking the third time the two teams have met on *MNF* and the first since 1972. Green Bay swept the regular-season series with the Lions last season for the first time since 2012 and for the seventh time under McCarthy.
- ►In Week 10, Green Bay will face the Bears in Chicago, a place they have won in the regular season each of the last six years.
- ►After welcoming the Baltimore Ravens to Lambeau Field in Week 11 for just the fourth time, the Packers will travel to Pittsburgh to play the Steelers in a Sunday night matchup in Week 12.
- ►After stopping back in Green Bay in Week 13 to play Tampa Bay, the Buccaneers' first December trip to Lambeau since 2000, the Packers will begin a stretch of three road games in four weeks with a trip to Cleveland in Week 14. It is the first time since 2009 that Green Bay will finish the regular season with three of the final four games taking place on the road.
- ►The Packers will finish their slate against the NFC South when they play at the Carolina Panthers in Week 15.
- ▶For the second consecutive season, Green Bay will host the Vikings on a Saturday in Week 16. The Packers have won their last five regularseason games played on Saturdays.
- ►Green Bay will close out the regular season at Detroit for the second consecutive year, marking the first time it has finished the regular season on the road against the same team in back-to-back seasons since 1991-92 (Minnesota).



#### **BREAKING DOWN THE ROSTER**

The Packers currently have an 53-man roster that is composed of 26 offensive players, 24 defensive players and three specialists.

- ▶ Of the 53 players on Green Bay's roster, 33 of them (62.3 percent) were draft picks of the Packers. Dating back to 2007, Green Bay has at least one member of each draft class still on the roster.
- ► Green Bay has 13 players on the roster that began their careers as undrafted free agents, with 11 of those originally signed by Green Bay.
- ► Over a third (35.8 percent) of the players (19 of 53) on Green Bay's roster entered the league as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as an undrafted player.
- ► The Packers have five players on the roster that played in the NFL prior to the 2009 season. Four of those five players were draft picks of the Packers (QB Aaron Rodgers, K Mason Crosby, WR Jordy Nelson and LB Clay Matthews) and three have made at least one Pro Bowl.
- ► Of the 53 players on the roster, 44 began their pro careers with the Packers (83.0 percent).
- ▶ Only 20 of the 53 players on the roster (37.7 percent) were selected in the first three rounds of the draft, with 17 being drafted by the Packers.

WR Jordy Nelson, 10th Year, Kansas State, D2a-08

Became the fourth player in franchise history to reach 500 receptions.

► Has 69 career receiving TDs, No. 2 in Packers history behind Don

Hutson (99).

▶ Became the first player in franchise history to record 13-plus receiving touchowns in three different seasons (2011, 2014, 2016). His three seasons of 13-plus TD receptions tie Pro Football Hall of Famers Lance Alworth, Cris Carter and Marvin Harrison for the fourth most in NFL his-

► Missed all of the 2015 season due to a knee injury.

Finished the 2014 regular season ranked fourth in the NFL in receiving yards (1,519), seventh in receptions (98) and tied for second in receiving touchdowns (13). Earned first selection to the Pro Bowl.

Led the team in 2013 with 85 catches for 1,314 yards and eight TDs.

Ranked No. 10 in the NFL that season in receiving yards.

With 15 TD catches in 2011, became only the third player in franchise history to catch 15 or more TDs in a season, joining WRs Sterling Sharpe (18 in 1994) and Don Hutson (17 in 1942).

# LT David Bakhtiari, 5th Year, Colorado, D4a-13 Named to first career Pro Bowl in 2016.

► Has started all but six games at LT since the start of the 2013 regular season. Missed Weeks 2-5 this season and the final two games of the 2015 regular season due to injury.

► Started all 16 games at left tackle in 2013, the only rookie in the NFL to do so in 2013 and the first Packer rookie to do so since the league went

to a 16-game schedule in 1978.

▶ Became just the fourth Green Bay rookie to start at LT in the season opener since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger and the first since 1985.

LG Lane Taylor, 5th Year, Oklahoma State, FA-13

► Has played in 52 regular-season games for Green Bay with all but two of his 23 starts (LT in Week 4-5 this season) taking place at LG.

► Made the first starts of his career in 2015, opening at RG at Detroit in Week 13 in place of an injured T.J. Lang and at LG in Week 17 vs. Minnesota with Josh Sitton sliding to LT in place of an injured David Bakhtiari.

► A four-year letterman at OSU, starting 47 of 50 games played at right guard. Unanimous first-team All-Big 12 selection by the conference's coaches as a senior.

C Corey Linsley, 4th Year, Ohio State, D5a-14

► Has started every game at C since Week 9 of 2016. Was on reserve/ physically unable to perform for the entire preseason and the first seven regular-season games last season.

► Started 29 games and four postseason contests in his first two seasons. First rookie center to start for Green Bay in Week 1 since the merger.

► Was the first rookie center to start every game for the Packers since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.

Named to PFWA's All-Rookie team, the first Green Bay center to be

honored since its inception in 1974.

RG Jahri Evans, 12th Year, Bloomsburg, UFA (NO)-17

► Selected to six Pro Bowls (2009-14) and has been named first-team All-Pro by The Associated Press four times (2009-12).

► Has started all 175 games he has played in since entering the league in 2006, the most games played by an active NFL offensive lineman over that span.

► Started all 16 games in nine of his 11 seasons in New Orleans (2006-

16), missing just seven contests due to injury

► Helped the Saints finish in the top six in the NFL in total offense in all 11 of his seasons in New Orleans (2006-16), including six No. 1 rankings (2006, 2008-09, 2011, 2014, 2016).
 ► Entered the NFL with New Orleans in 2006 as a fourth-round pick (No. 1008).

108 overall) out of Bloomsburg (Pa.) University, where he was a finalist for the Gene Upshaw Player of the Year Award in both of his final two seasons.

#### RT Bryan Bulaga, 8th Year, Iowa, D1-10

► Has started 46 of 54 games since the start of the 2014 season.

Missed the second part of the 2012 season after suffering a hip injury vs. Arizona on Nov. 4 and missed all of the 2013 season after injuring his knee on Aug. 3.

Started 37 games at RT in his first three seasons in the league.
 Started the final 12 games of 2010 and the entire postseason at right tackle after taking over for veteran Mark Tauscher (shoulder).
 Named to the *Pro Football Weekly*/PFWA All-Rookie team in 2010.

Capped his rookie season by becoming the youngest player at the time. according to STATS LLC, to ever start in the Super Bowl (21 years, 322 days).

TE Martellus Bennett, 10th Year, Texas A&M, UFA (NE)-17

► Ranks No. 4 on the team with 22 receptions this season, which ranks

No. 8 among NFL tight ends.

▶ Posted 50-plus receptions in each season from 2012-16, one of only three tight ends in the league (Greg Olsen, Jason Witten) to do so over that span.

► Posted a career-high three 100-yard receiving games in 2016 with the Patriots, tied for No. 2 in the NFL among TEs, and a career-best seven TD catches, tied for No. 3 in the league among TEs.

► Registered a career-high 90 receptions with the Chicago Bears in 2014, the most among NFL tight ends that season, on his way to earning Pro Bowl recognition.

Entered the NFL in 2008 as a second-round pick (No. 61 overall) with Dallas and went on to play four seasons with the Cowboys (2008-11). Also played one season with the N.Y. Giants (2012), three with the Bears (2013-15) and one with the Patriots (2016).

#### WR Randall Cobb, 6th Year, Kentucky, D2-11

▶ Despite missing a game, ranks No. 2 on the team with 26 receptions this season.

▶Led the team with a 13.5-yard punt-return average in 2016.

► Posted the 12th 100-yard receiving game of his career in Week 4 (108 on nine receptions) and tied his single-game high for receptions (11 for 95 yards and a TD) in Week 7 last season.

▶Led the team in receptions (79), was No. 2 in receiving yards (829) and

was No. 3 in touchdown receptions (six) in 2015.

Set a new single-season career high with five 100-yard receiving games during the 2014 season (three-2012). Earned first trip to the Pro Bowl.

►His career-best 91 receptions in 2014 are the eighth most in team historv

► Finished the regular season tied for fourth in the NFL with 12 touchdown receptions in 2014.

► Set a franchise single-season record with a league-high 2,342 combined net yards in 2012, topping the previous team mark of 2,250 yards by RB Ahman Green in 2003.

QB Aaron Rodgers, 12th Year, California, D1-05

► His career passer rating of 104.1 ranks No. 1 in NFL history.

► In 141 regular-season starts (94-47 record), has posted 52 games with 300-plus passing yards, 83 without an interception and 79 with a 100-plus passer rating (min. 15 attempts).

Earned his sixth selection to the Pro Bowl in 2016, the second-most

selections by a Green Bay quarterback behind Brett Favre's nine (1992-93, 1995-97, 2001-03, 2007).

Finished the 2014 regular season ranked No. 2 in the NFL in passer rating (112.2), touchdown percentage (7.3), No. 1 in interception percent-

age (1.0) and No. 3 in touchdown passes (38).

▶ Recorded a passer rating of at least 120.0 in seven regular-season games in 2014, setting a single-season career high and tying for the third most in a single season in the NFL, dating back to 1960.

Posted 21,332 passing yards from 2008-12, which ranks No. 1 in league

history for the most passing yards by a QB in his first five seasons as a starter (previous record was Peyton Manning, 20,618, 1998-2002).

▶ In 2011, set an NFL record with a 122.5 passer rating and set franchise marks for TD passes (45), passing yards (4,643), completion percentage (68.3), yards per attempt (9.25) and 300-yard games (eight) on his way to earning NFL Most Valuable Player honors from *The Associated* Préss.

RB Ty Montgomery, 2nd Year, Stanford, D3-15

After being converted from wide receiver to running back during the 2016 season, has started 11 games at RB, including five games this season. Missed Week 5 due to injury

In Week 15 at Chicago (2016), rushed for 162 yards on 16 carries and two touchdowns. His 162 yards were the most by a Packers player in a single game since Dec. 11, 2005 (Samkon Gado, 171 yards on 29 carries, 5.9 avg.). Dating back to 1960, his 10.13 yards-per-carry average was the third highest (min. 15 carries) by a Green Bay player.

▶Played in six games with three starts as a rookie in 2015 before an ankle injury contained in Week 6 cidelined him for the remainder of the account.

injury sustained in Week 6 sidelined him for the remainder of the season.

▶Posted 5,190 all-purpose yards at Stanford (334 rushing, 2,125 receiving, 238 PR, 2,493 KOR), the fourth most in school history at the time.

# FB Aaron Ripkowski, 2nd Year, Oklahoma, D6a-15 Has played in 37 career games with eight starts.

Scored his first career rushing touchdown in Week 12 (2016) and followed it up with one in Week 13.

Led the team and set career highs in Week 17 (2016) at Detroit with 61 rushing yards on nine carries (6.8 avg.)

▶ Played in 15 games as a rookie, seeing action primarily on special teams. Was tied for No. 4 on the team with nine special teams tackles.

#### DE Dean Lowry, 2nd Year, Northwestern, D4b-16

Made first career start in the season-opening win over Seattle. Has started five of six games this season.

► Saw action in 15 games as a rookie (2016) and registered 14 tackles (eight solo), two sacks, three tackles for a loss, nine QB pressures and three QB hits. Also appeared in all three postseason contests and posted two tackles (one solo) and a QB pressure.

▶ Posted sacks in back-to-back games in 2016, recording one in Week 13

vs. Houston and one in Week 14 vs. Seattle.

▶ Played in 48 games with 33 starts for Northwestern and registered 134 tackles (83 solo), 311/2 tackles for a loss, 121/2 sacks, three interceptions (one returned for a TD), 21 passes defensed, three fumble recoveries and three forced fumbles.

► Earned second-team All-Big Ten honors as a senior in 2015 after posting 46 tackles (27 solo), 13½ tackles for a loss (second on the team), three sacks, an interception, a fumble recovery and seven passes defensed.

#### NT Kenny Clark, 2nd Year, UCLA, D1-16

►Tied for No. 2 on the team with 30 tackles this season.

▶ Finished the 2016 regular season ranked No. 3 on the GB defensive line in tackles (33).

▶ Became the youngest player to appear in a season opener for the Packers since Arnie Herber (20 years old) in 1930.

► Earned third-team All-America honors from The Associated Press and first-team All-Pacific-12 recognition from the coaches and media as a junior in 2015.

#### DT Mike Daniels, 6th Year, Iowa, D4a-12

Leads Packers defensive linemen with 21.5 sacks since the start of the 2013 regular season.

▶ Led the defensive line in both tackles and sacks in 2014 and 2015.

▶ Returned a fumble 43 yards for a TD vs. Detroit in Week 14 of 2012, the longest fumble return for a TD by a rookie in franchise history.

► Starred as an interior pass rusher at lowa, posting a team-high 24.5 tackles for a loss and 13 sacks from 2010-11.

#### LOLB Clay Matthews, 9th Year, Southern California, D1b-09

► With 75.0 career sacks, passed Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila (74.5) for the most sacks in Packers history.

▶ Despite injuries forcing him to miss four games and limiting him in six others, finished No. 3 on the team with five sacks in 2016.

For the first time in his career, recorded at least one sack in each of the

first three regular-season games he played in (2016). ► Selected to his sixth Pro Bowl and first as an inside linebacker in 2015 after recording 6.5 sacks (second on the team), 15 QB hits (No. 1 on the team) and a career-high 85 tackles (No. 2 on the team).

► With a team-high 11.0 sacks in 2014, is tied for the most 10-plus sack

seasons in franchise history (four).

▶ Is the only player in franchise history to score a defensive TD (interception or fumble return) in each of his first three seasons in the NFL (2009-11).

#### ILB Jake Ryan, 3rd Year, Michigan, D4-15

Tied for No. 2 on the team with 30 tackles this season.

- Finished No. 2 on the team with 84 tackles during the 2016 regular
- ► Started the final five games of the regular season and both playoff contests in 2015.

► Recorded a team-best nine tackles (eight solo) and one fumble recovery in Week 13 (2015) at Detroit in his first pro start.

► Served as a team captain for his final two seasons at Michigan and was a three-time winner (2012-14) of the Roger Zatkoff Award, given to the Wolverines top linebacker. He was the only player to win the award (est. 1991) three times.

► Started 41 of 46 games played in college, appearing at inside linebacker as a senior after spending his first three seasons at outside linebacker and defensive end.

ILB Blake Martinez, 2nd Year, Stanford, D4a-16

▶ Ranks No. 1 on the Packers with 57 total tackles this season.

▶ Set career highs in tackles (14), solo tackles (12) and passes defensed (three) in Week 6 at Minnesota.

► Started nine of 13 games he played in 2016 during the regular season, missing Weeks 12-14 due to injury. Became the first rookie to start on defense for Green Bay in Week 1 since LB Nick Perry in 2012.

Finished collegiate career with 257 tackles (137 solo), 13.5 tackles for a

loss, 6.5 sacks, five interceptions and five forced fumbles in 51 games

Started all 27 games played in his final two seasons, leading the team in tackles as a junior (102) and senior (141).

▶ Led the Pacific-12 and ranked No. 7 nationally with 141 tackles (75 solo) as a senior, averaging a conference-best 10.1 tackles per game.

#### ROLB Nick Perry, 6th Year, Southern California, D1-12

►Tied for the team lead with 2.5 sacks this season.

Led the team with a career-high 11.0 sacks in 2016.

Registered mulitple sacks in each of his first five seasons in the NFL and has posted a two-sack game in each of the last four seasons (2013-16).

► Has totaled seven sacks in eight playoff games, including 3.5 in the 2015 postseason, which tied Clay Matthews (2010) for the franchise record in a single posteason.

► His seven postseason sacks rank No. 3 in franchise history (since 1982) behind Matthews (11) and Reggie White (eight).

#### LCB Davon House, 7th Year, New Mexico State, FA-17

▶ Rejoined the Packers after spending the 2015-16 seasons with the Jacksonville Jaguars, starting 19 of 32 games played.

► In 2015, his first season in Jacksonville, set career highs in starts (15), tackles (60), solo tackles (49), passes defensed (23, franchise singleseason record) and interceptions (four).

Despite missing three regular-season games with a shoulder injury in 2014, his 11 passes defensed tied for No. 4 on the Packers.

After seeing action in two games as a rookie (2011), appeared in 25 games for Green Bay between 2012-13, starting five games in each season.

► Was the first player to be drafted by the Packers out of New Mexico State in franchise history, and was the first Aggie drafted since S Siddeeq Shabazz (Oakland, seventh round) in 2003.

#### RCB Damarious Randall, 3rd Year, Arizona State, D1-15

Leads the team with two interceptions this season.

► Tied for No. 4 in the NFL with two interceptions returned for touchdowns since 2015.

► Was second on the team with three interceptions in 2016 despite missing six games due to injury.

▶ Played in 15 games with nine starts (six at LCB, two at RCB, one in the slot) in 2015 and tied for the team lead and No. 2 among NFL rookies with three interceptions, including one he returned for a TD. Finished with a team-best 16 passes defensed.

► Named the NFL's Defensive Rookie of the Month for November 2015, joining CB Casey Hayward (October 2012) as the only Green Bay defen-

sive backs to win the award.

► Earned first-team All-Pacific-12 honors at safety as a senior in 2014 after he led the Sun Devils in tackles (106) and passes defensed (12) and tied for the team lead with three interceptions.

#### <u>SS Morgan Burnett, 8th Year, Georgia Tech, D3-10</u>

▶Tied for No. 1 among NFL safeties with a career-best three sacks last season. Finished No. 1 on the team in tackles (92)

►Missed five games due to injury in 2015, but finished No. 4 on the team with 54 solo tackles.

▶Totaled a team-high 125 tackles in 2014, the second most of his career (137 in 2012). Ranked No. 2 on the team with 106 tackles (77 solo) in 2013, despité missing the first three games due to injury. Recovered

three fumbles, including one for a TD, and added nine passes defensed.

Participated in all 1,088 plays for Green Bay's defense in 2012, one of only four non-OL in the NFL to appear in 100 percent of his team's snaps.

#### FS Ha Ha Clinton-Dix, 4th Year, Alabama, D1-14

►Tied for No. 2 on the team with 30 tackles this season.

Named to his first career Pro Bowl in 2016. His career-best five interceptions tied for No. 5 in the NFL last season and tied for No. 1 among safeties. It was the most interceptions by a Packers safety in a single season since Charles Woodson (seven) and Charlie Peprah (five) in 2011.

►In 2016, posted a career-high two interceptions in both Week 9 and Week 14, becoming the first Packer to have two two-INT games in a season sínce Woodson in 2011.

▶ Led the team in tackles in 2015 with 117 (97 solo) and was tied for

fourth on the team in interceptions (two). ►According to STATS, his three sacks during the 2015 regular season tied for the fifth most in a single regular season by a Packers safety (since

1982) and the most since Mark Roman recorded 3.5 in 2004. ► Started every game in 2015 after starting 10 of 16 games as a rookie

when he finished second on the team in tackles (95).

▶ Was a consensus All-America selection in 2013 ás a junior, earning first-team recognition from The Associated Press, the Football Writers 16 Association of America and Sporting News.

A marquee season opener between two NFC heavyweights turned into a defensive slugfest, with Daniels landing the momentum-swinging punch. No talk about double moves or stunts. Daniels said he just flat-out beat glard Luke Joeckel to wreak havor in the backfield.

Packers QIB Aaron Rodgers was 28 of 42 for 311 yards and added a 32-yard tourchlown pass to Jordy Nelson to make it an eight-point game late in the third quarter. Rodgers went deep to his favorite receiver on a free play that was extended after Seattle was flagged for having too many

men on the field

But the Green Bay defense fueled the victory.

Seattle managed just three field goals. Wilson was held to 14 of 27 for 158 yards. The Packers held decisive edges in total yardage (370-225) and first downs (26-12). Green Bay held the ball for 39 minutes.

Rodgers' regular-season streak of passes without an interception ended at a career-high 251. The Seahawks' defense, reinforced by the return of safety Earl Thomas, bottled up receivers from making many big plays and put plenty of pressure on Rodgers.

GREEN BAY, Wis. (AP) — Aaron Rodgers burned another defense deep with a free play. The Cincinnati Bengals found their offense and a new

Mason Crosby kicked a 27-yard field goal with 6:26 left in overtime set up by Rodgers' 72-yard pass to Geronimo Allison, and the Green Bay Packers railled to beat Cincinnati, 27-24, on Sunday, Crosby's kick completed the Packers conneback from a 21-7 halftime deficit.

On third-and-10 from the Packers 21, Rodgers took advantage of yet another free play after defensive end Michael Johnson was whistled for offside. Officials let the play continue and the two-time NFL MVP found Allison on about a 40-yard pass before the receiver beat a couple defenders

for more yards.

Crosby, a veteran kicker, finished it off for the Packers (2-1).

The winless Bengals (0-3) won the toss in overline but went three-and-out on their opening drive. It was so loud at Lambeau Field that they had to call timeout before their first overline snap. Rodgers thrived under the pressure.

He connected with Jordy Nelson for a 3-yard foucidown pass with 17 seconds left in regulation to tie the game at 24. Bengals cornerback Dre

Kilpatrick narrowly missed batting away the bullet thrown by the quarterback into the front right corner of the end zone.

Rodgers finished 28 of 42 for 313 yards with three touchdowns and one interception. Allison had six catches for 122 yards.

The Packers filipped the script after the Bengals controlled the first half.

A.J. Green caught a 10-yard scoring pass on the game's opening drive for Cincinnati's first touchdown after two frustrating weeks for the offense. Bill Lazor made his debut as offensive coordinator for the fired Ken Zampese.

Andy Dalton was 21 of 27 for 212 yards and two scores. The Bengals were desperate to avoid their first 0-3 start since 2008. But they couldn't finish the Packers off in the second half.

Green Bay's defense generated a little more pressure on Dalton in the second half, and rookie safety Josh Jones gave the injury-laden defense

Rodgers shook off his early struggles to guide the Packers to another win. He was sacked six times, mostly against just the Bengals' four-man rush, though the protection shored up after halftime.

Rodgers threw just his second career pick-six — and his first at home — when William Jackson returned an interception 75 yards for a toucha boost with two sacks and 12 tackles.

Aaron Rodgers threw four touchdown passes, and the injury-riddled Packers converted three turnovers into scores in an eventful 35-14 victory GREEN BAY, Wis. — The Green Bay Packers keep finding ways to win despite more key injuries. The Chicago Bears never recovered from a

over the Chicago Bears on Thursday night.

Rodgers connected with Davante Adams and Randall Cobb on short touchdown passes to help build a 21-0 lead in the second quarter of a game delayed 45 minutes by lightning between the first two quarters. The Packers overpowered the Bears down the stretch to slog out a win as intermittent rain fell at Lambeau Field.

The Packers (3-1) lost two more key players to injuries. Adams left the field on a stretcher after getting hit in the head during a tackle by Danny Trevathan in the third quarter. Bunning back Ty Montgomery was knocked out in the first quarter with a chest injury.

But the Packers capitalized on an awful start by Glennon, who accounted for four turnovers. He fumbled on his first snap on a strip sack by Clay Matthews. Rodgers hit Cobb for a 2-yard foundrown pass three plays later for a 7-0 lead.

Glennon fumbled on his next series, too, but the Packers couldn't score on that drive. It was only a matter of time because the mistakes kept

Glennon threw his second interception with 2:54 left in the third quarter. Six plays later, receiver Jordy Nelson caught his second touchdown pass,

an 8-yarder from Rodgers, to make it a 28-point lead.

Rodgers was 18 of 26 for 179 yards. He picked apart the Bears (1-3) on short, quick passes, a game plan in part necessitated by a patchwork offensive line. The Packers played without starting tackes David Bakhtiari and Bryan Bulaga, and their three backup tackes are already on injured reserve. The injury to Adams cast a pall late in the third quarter. The game was delayed for about five minutes while medical personnel tended to the receiver, who gave a thumbs-up signal as he was wheeled off the field. The Packers said Adams was conscious and taken to a hospital for evaluation for possible head and neck injuries, and that he had feeling in all of his extremities.

Both the Packers and Bears were coming off overtime wins Sunday, Gleinnon finished 21 of 33 for 216 yards and one touchdown.

The Packers are 95-94-6 against the Bears, their first lead in the series since 1933. It's the oldest rivalry in football, dating to 1923. Matthews' sack on Gleinnon in the first quarter was the 75th of his career, breaking the franchise record (since 1982) held by Kabeer Gbaja-Blamila.

Packers rooke Aaron Jones, a fifth-round draft pick, had a team-high 49 yards on 31 carries and a 2-yard touchdown run in the second quarter. He was the only active running back left on the roster with Montgomery and backup Jamaal Williams (knee) both knocked out of the game.

DALLAS (AP) Aaron Rodgers had more magic in store for the Dallas Cowboys, who can't seem to find the mojo that carried them a year

Rodgers threw a 12-yard touchdown pass to Davante Adams with 11 seconds remaining. Rodgers capped a 75-yard drive in just 1:02, lifting the Packers over Dallas 35-31 on Sunday in another thriller nine months after their divisional playoff win on the same field.

Adams had been in the concussion protocol but was active 10 days after leaving the field on a stretcher on a helmet-to-helmet hit that resulted in a suspension for Chicago linebacker Danny Trevathan. He had seven catches for 66 yards and two touchdowns.

Dak Prescott, who had touchdown passes on Dallas' first three drives, put the Cowboys in front on an 11-yard touchdown run with 1:13 remaining to cap a 17-play drive that lasted almost nine minutes.

But another defensive letdown, just like a year ago in the postseason, left Dallas (2-3) already with the same number of losses from the magical rookie season when Prescott and running back Ezeklel Elliott led the Cowboys to the No. 1 seed in the NFC.

The Packers (4-1) had gone ahead earlier on Damarius Randall's 21-yard interception return for a touchdown, the third of five lead changes in

- Played in 133 regular-season games with 99 starts from 2006-16, registering 493 tackles (345 solo), 53.5 sacks, 12 forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries, 30 passes defensed and three interceptions, one of which he returned for a touchdown.
- Originally entered the NFL with Cincinnati after being selected in the third round of the 2006 NFL Supplemental Draft by the Bengals.
- **2017 SEASON:** Has played in four games with two starts and has registered five tackles (four solo), a sack, two tackles for a loss, five QB pressures and three QB hits.
- ►Vs. Seattle (Sept. 10): Appeared on six snaps on defense and one on special teams before sustaining a concussion in the second quarter that would sideline him for the remainder of the game.

- Recorded his fourth straight 100-tackle season in 2014 with a team-high 125 tackles (99 solo). Was the only Packer to surpass 100 tackles each season from 2011-14.

- Played in all 16 games with two starts as a rookie in 2016 and registered 33 tackles (14 solo), two tackles for a loss, four QB pressures, three QB hits, two fumble recoveries and two passes defensed.
- Became the youngest player to appear in a season opener for the Packers since Arnie Herber (20 years old) in 1930.
- Appeared in all three postseason contests and recorded nine tackles (five solo), including a tackle for a loss, a team-high five QB pressures and a QB hit.

- Played in all 16 games in 2014, starting the final 10 (nine at FS, one at SS). It was the most starts by a Green Bay rookie safety since Nick Collins opened all 16 in 2005.
- Ranked No. 2 on the team in tackles with 95 (73 solo) and was named to the PFWA's All-Rookie team.

- Started all 16 games in 2014 and posted career highs in catches (91), receiving yards (1,287) and receiving TDs (12) on the way to earning his first career Pro Bowl selection (injury replacement for WR Dez Bryant).
- Set a franchise single-season record with a league-high 2,342 combined net yards in 2012, topping the previous team mark of 2,250 yards by RB Ahman Green in 2003.
- With 954 receiving yards and 964 kickoff return yards in 2012, is the only player in NFL history to post 900-plus yards in each category in the same season.

- Has registered a franchise-record 10 straight 100-point seasons, one of only three players in NFL history to register 100-plus points in 10 or more consecutive seasons (Jason Elam, 16, 1993-2008; Adam Vinatieri, 13, 1996-2008).
- Ranks No. 2 in NFL history for the most points by a player in his first 10 seasons (1,267, 2007-16), trailing only Patriots K Stephen Gostkowski (1,330, 2006-2015).
- Is the all-time franchise leader in field goals (268), 50-yard field goals (28) and extra points (496).
- Has kicked the seven longest field goals in franchise history (58-yarder in 2011, two 57-yarders in 2013, 56-yarders in 2010, 2011 and 2015, 55-yarder in 2014).
- Has not missed a game in his career, playing in 165 straight contests in the regular season, the fifth-longest streak in franchise history.
- Set a franchise record with 23 consecutive field goals made (2010-11), topping Chris Jacke's mark of 17 straight in 1993.
- **2017 SEASON:** Has made all six of his field-goal attempts and 15 of 17 extra points...Has posted 21 touchbacks on 31 kickoffs (67.7 percent).
- ►Vs. Seattle (Sept. 10): Connected on his lone FG attempt of the day, a 40-yarder midway through the fourth quarter that gave the Packers a two-score lead (17-6).

- Has started every regular season and postseason game for Green Bay since the start of the 2014 season. Played the most defensive snaps among Packers defensive linemen in each of the past three seasons (2014-16).
- According to STATS, his 23.5 career sacks rank No. 3 (since 1982) among Green Bay defensive tackles (Cullen Jenkins, 29/Santana Dotson, 26).
- According to STATS, he is one of four NFL defensive tackles (Gerald McCoy, Jurrell Casey, Ndamukong Suh) to register four-plus sacks in each of the last four seasons (2013-16).
- **2017 SEASON:** Has started all four games he has appeared in and has registered 21 tackles (12 solo), four tackles for a loss, 1.5 sacks, a forced fumble, six QB hits and two QB pressures.
- ▶Vs. Seattle (Sept. 10): Started and played 38 snaps, tying for the team lead with nine tackles (seven solo), three tackles for a loss, 1.5 sacks, a forced fumble, two QB pressures and two QB hits...Midway through the second quarter, tossed aside C Justin Britt on third down to get to QB Russell Wilson as he put a hit on him and hurried his deep throw to WR Tyler Lockett that went incomplete as the Seahawks were forced to punt... #### 11 Trevor Davis, WR, 2nd Year, California

- seasons (White and Gbaja-Biamila).
- Became the first player in franchise history to earn Pro Bowl recognition in each of his first four seasons in the league (2009-12).

- Returned to action last season after missing the entire 2015 campaign (knee), catching 97 passes for 1,257 yards (13.0 avg.) and a league-leading 14 TDs on his way to winning the NFL Comeback Player of the Year from *The Associated Press*, the first Packer to earn the honor.
- Ranks No. 4 in franchise history in receptions (522), No. 5 in receiving yards (7,656), No. 2 in TD receptions (69) and No. 3 in 100-yard receiving games (25).
- Is one of only two players in franchise history (WR Sterling Sharpe, 1992-94) to register three straight seasons with 85-plus receptions (2013-14, 2016).
- Is the only player in team annals to record three seasons with 13-plus TD receptions (2011, 2014, 2016) and is the only active player in the league to do so.
- Has posted 1,250-plus receiving yards and 13-plus TD catches in the same season three times in his career (2011, 2014, 2016), the fourth most in NFL history behind only Jerry Rice (six), Randy Moss (five) and Terrell Owens (four).
- Ranks No. 2 in the NFL with 63 TD receptions since 2011 despite missing the entire 2015 season due to injury. Has posted 15 games with two or more TD catches since 2011, No. 1 in the league over that span.
- **2017 SEASON:** Has started all six games and has 25 receptions for 290 yards (11.6 avg.) and six TDs...Is tied for the league lead in TD catches and is also tied for No. 1 in the NFL in red-zone TD receptions with five.
- ▶Vs. Seattle (Sept. 10): Started and played 76 of 82 snaps, posting seven receptions for 79 yards (11.3 avg.) and a TD...Late in the third quarter, came out of the slot and got past LB Bobby Wagner and S Earl Thomas to make a 32-yard TD grab down the middle of the field on a free play for

- Is the only quarterback in league history to record a 100-plus passer rating in six consecutive seasons (2009-14), with no other QB doing so in more than four straight seasons. Has posted a 100-plus rating in seven seasons (2009-14, 2016), the most in NFL annals.
- Is one of only four QBs in NFL annals with 35,000-plus passing yards and 2,500-plus rushing yards (Fran Tarkenton, John Elway, Donovan McNabb).
- Is the lone QB in NFL history to throw 40-plus TD passes with seven or fewer INTs in a season, having done it twice in his career (45/6 in 2011, 40/7 in 2016).

- Played in all 16 contests in 2014, seeing limited action on offense at both guard spots and as an extra lineman, and on special teams.
- Was one of three rookie free agents to make Green Bay's opening-day roster in 2013.
- **2017 SEASON:** Has started all six games, opening four at LG and two at LT...Has helped the offense rank No. 1 in red-zone scoring (72.7 percent), tied for No. 4 in first downs (128), No. 7 in third-down conversions (43.2 percent) and No. 10 in scoring (24.5 ppg).
- ►Vs. Seattle (Sept. 10): Started at LG and played all 82 snaps, helping the offense rack up 26 first downs, the top mark by the Packers in a season opener since 2002 (29 vs. Atlanta), and a 39:13 time of possession, the best mark by Green Bay since Week 7 last season vs. Chicago (39:36)... Helped protect QB Aaron Rodgers as he threw for 311 yards and a TD on 28-of-42 passing.
- ►At Atlanta (Sept. 17): Started at LG and played all 76 snaps, helping to protect QB Aaron Rodgers as he threw for 343 yards and two TDs on 33-of-50 passing.
- ▶Vs. Cincinnati (Sept. 24): Started at LG and played 68 of 70 snaps, departing the game for two plays late in the first half due to injury...Helped to block for Rodgers as he posted his franchise-record fifth consecutive 300-yard passing game with 313 yards and three TDs with one INT on 28-of-42 passing for a 102.6 passer rating.
- ▶Vs. Chicago (Sept. 28): Started at LT for the first time in his career, opening in place of an injured David Bakhtiari (hamstring)...Played all 55 snaps, helping to block for Rodgers as he threw a season-high four TD passes on 18-of-26 passing for 179 yards.

- **2017 SEASON:** Has played in four games, seeing time on defense and special teams...Has posted two tackles (two solo) and a half-sack...Has added a tackle on special teams.
- ►Vs. Seattle (Sept. 10): Appeared on five plays on defense and 19 on special teams.

- Signed by Green Bay as an undrafted free agent in May 2017.
- Appeared in 39 games over three seasons at Miami, posting a 43.0-yard gross average on 183 punts.
- Ranked No. 2 in the Atlantic Coast Conference as a senior in 2016 with a career-high 43.8-yard gross average.
- **2017 SEASON:** Has registered a 45.6-yard gross average and a 44.2-yard net average on 27 punts with 10 inside the 20...Ranks No. 4 in the league in net punting average...Has added a tackle on special teams.
- ▶Vs. Seattle (Sept. 10): Punted five times in his NFL debut, posting a 43.8-yard gross average with a 42.4-yard net average...Had a long punt of 57 yards in the second quarter and placed one punt inside the 20...On five punts, allowed only one return for 7 yards by WR Tyler Lockett...Became the first undrafted rookie to punt for the Packers in a regular-season game since Chris Hanson in 1999 (Week 1 vs. Oakland).
- ► At Atlanta (Sept. 17): Punted three times on the evening, recording a 39.7-yard average for gross and net with one inside the 20.
- ▶Vs. Cincinnati (Sept. 24): Posted a 49.3-yard gross average and a 44.2-yard net average on six punts, including two punts inside the 20... Booted a 61-yarder in the second quarter...Added punts of 54, 53, 51 and 50 yards, giving him five punts of 50-plus yards in the game...Posted a tackle on punt coverage.
- ▶Vs. Chicago (Sept. 28): Registered a career-best (min. four punts) 46.2-yard net average (47.6-yard gross) on five punts, highlighted by a career-long 62-yard punt in the first quarter that was fair caught at the Chicago 15...His net average was tied for the sixth-best posted by a Green Bay punter in a game since 1976 (min. four punts)...Became the first Green Bay punter since Tim Masthay in 2013 to record a 60-yard punt in back-to-back games.

- ►At Minnesota (Oct. 15): Posted a 44.7-yard net average on six punts with a career-high four inside the 20-yard line, the most by a Green Bay punter since Tim Masthay registered five inside the 20 vs. Minnesota on Oct. 2, 2014.

#### 30 Jamaal Williams, RB, Rookie, Brigham Young

- Finished his career at Brigham Young as the school's all-time leader in rushing yards (3,901), rushing attempts (726) and 100-yard rushing games (16).
- Is one of only four players in school history to register multiple 1,000-yard rushing seasons, posting 1,233 yards in 2013 and a career-best 1,375 yards in 2016.
- Ranked No. 5 in the nation in 2016 in rushing yards per game (137.5) and registered six 100-yard rushing games, including two with 200-plus yards.
- **2017 SEASON:** Has played in all six games, seeing time on offense and special teams...Has rushed for 33 yards on 10 carries (3.3 avg.) with two receptions for 7 yards (3.5 avg.).
- ►Vs. Seattle (Sept. 10): Had two carries for 9 yards (4.5 avg.) in his NFL debut.
- ►At Atlanta (Sept. 17): Rushed for 6 yards on two carries (3.0 avg.) and posted a 5-yard reception in the fourth quarter, the first catch of his NFL career.
- ►Vs. Cincinnati (Sept. 24): Played five snaps on offense and posted a 6-yard run.
- ▶Vs. Chicago (Sept. 28): Rushed for 11 yards on four carries (2.8 avg.) with a 2-yard reception before leaving the game early in the second quarter due to a knee injury and did not return.
- ►At Dallas (Oct. 8): Had one carry for 1 yard.
- ►At Minnesota (Oct. 15): Played nine snaps on special teams.
