

PACKERS TRAVEL TO CHICAGO TO PLAY THE BEARS

The Packers go on the road for the first time in almost a month (Oct. 15 at Minnesota) to take on the Chicago Bears.

- ► Green Bay has won at Chicago in the regular season each of the last six years. The Packers' six consecutive victories is the team's second-longest winning streak at Soldier Field, trailing a streak of 10 wins that Green Bay recorded from 1994-2004 (does not include the 2002 victory in Champaign, III.)
- ► The Packers have scored 30-plus points at Chicago in each of the last four matchups (33, 38, 31, 30).
- ► Including a 2010 playoff victory at Chicago, Green Bay has won 20 of the last 24 meetings between the rivals at Soldier Field.
- ▶It is the Packers' first November game in Chicago since 2001. Green Bay has won their last two games at Chicago in November (1992).
- ► Sunday will mark game No. 196 in the NFL's oldest rivalry. The Packers hold a 95-94-6 edge in the series, which includes two playoff games (1-1).
- ► Under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**, the Packers are 17-7 against the Bears during the regular and postseason, including wins in 13 of the last 15 games.
- ► In all but one of the 17 wins under McCarthy, Green Bay has scored at least 20 points.
- ► In the first 15 seasons of the NFC North (2002-16), the Packers (nine) and Bears (three) accounted for 12 division titles.
- ▶ Dating back to last season, Green Bay has won three consecutive games over the Bears, outscoring them 91-51 in those contests. The Packers won the first meeting this season, 35-14, at Lambeau Field.
- ► Green Bay has recorded two-plus interceptions in each of the last three games against Chicago, totaling seven over that span.
- ► This is the fourth consecutive season that the game between the two rivals in Chicago will be played at noon CT.
- ▶In 15 regular-season games against the Bears, LB **Clay Matthews** has regisgtered 9.5 sacks, the second most he has recorded against any team (10.0 in 15 games vs. Minnesota). Matthews' three interceptions versus Chicago are two more than he has against another team during the regular season.
- ►WR **Jordy Nelson** has registered 65 receptions for 1,040 yards (16.0 avg.) and eight touchdowns in 16 regular-season games against the Bears. It is the most receiving yardage he has against a single team and the second-most TD receptions (10 in 16 games against Minnesota).
- ►The Packers are 4-4, marking the 11th consecutive season that they have a .500 record or better after eight games.
- ►In Week 11, Green Bay will return to Lambeau Field to host the Baltimore Ravens for the first time since 2009. The Packers are 4-1 against the Ravens, including 3-0 at home.

REGULAR-SEASON WEEK 10

WITH THE CALL

FOX Sports, now in its 24th season as an NFL network television partner, will broadcast the game.

- ► Play-by-play man Thom Brennaman joins analyst Chris

 Spielman and sideline reporter Peter Schrager.
- ▶ Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since November 1929, heads up the Packers Radio Network that is made up of 50 stations in five states. Wayne Larrivee (play-by-play) and two-time Packers Pro Bowler Larry McCarren (analyst) call the action. McCarren first joined the team's broadcasts in 1995 and enters his 23rd season calling Packers games. After originally being paired together in 1999, McCarren and Larrivee enter their 19th season of broadcasts together.
- ► ESPN Radio will air the game across the country. **Jason Benetti** (playby-play) and **Bill Polian** (analyst) will call the action.
- ► The broadcast is also available on Sirius Satellite Radio (WTMJ feed).
- ▶ DIRECTV subscribers can watch the game on Channel 710.

ON THE ROAD

- ► The Packers take to the road for the fourth time in the 2017 regular season, looking to even their record away from Lambeau Field.
- ► Dating back to last season, Green Bay has won four of its past six regular-season away games.
- ► With a 4-4 road record during the 2016 regular season, Green Bay finished with at least a .500 record away from Lambeau Field for the ninth time in the first 11 seasons under Head Coach Mike McCarthy.

STATS OF THE WEEK

►In Week 9, Green Bay held Detroit to 64 yards on 33 carries (1.9 avg.), marking just the fourth time since the merger that the Packers allowed 65 or fewer rushing yards on 30-plus attempts by an opponent:

11/5/78, at Philadelphia, 30-51 (1.7 avg.) 10/22/78, at Minnesota, 32-60 (1.9 avg.) 10/5/09, at Minnesota, 30-63 (2.1 avg.)

- ►The Packers rank No. 5 in the NFL in average yards per rush (4.53) this season.
- ► Green Bay is tied for No. 5 in the NFL in rushing touchdowns (eight) this season.
- ►According to STATS, Green Bay's offense ranks No. 3 in the NFL in percent of rushes gaining four-plus yards (48.3), trailing only Dallas (49.2) and New England (49.3).
- ►QB Brett Hundley became the first quarterback in team history (since 1940) to register a rushing touchdown in both of his first two career starts with the Packers (according to the Elias Sports Bureau).

- ► While LB Clay Matthews passed DE Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila for the franchise sack record earliest this season, his 56 career sacks against NFC teams trails Gbaja-Biamila (56.5) for the most by a Green Bay player since 1982.
- ► CB Damarious Randall is tied for the league lead with three interceptions against NFC teams this season.

MIKE McCarthy...Is in his 12th year as the Packers' 14th head coach.

- ► Led the Packers to their eighth consecutive playoff appearance last season, tied for the third-longest streak in NFL history. Has also led the team to nine playoff appearances in the last 10 years (2007, 2009-16).
- ► Ranks second in franchise history in total victories, trailing only Curly
- ► Guided the Packers to top-10 finishes in scoring in eight straight seasons (2007-14), joining the Patriots as the only other team to accomplish the feat over that time; Packers finished first overall in scoring in 2014.
- ▶ Reached the 100-win plateau faster than any active NFL head coach. needing just 155 games.
- ▶ Joined Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl title with a win over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.

JOHN FOX...Is in his third year as the Bears' 15th head coach.

- ► Ranks third among active NFL head coaches with 139 career wins.
- ► Led the Broncos to four division titles, joining Chuck Knox (L.A. Rams) as the only coaches in NFL history to lead their respective team to four division titles in their first four years with the franchise.
- ▶ Between Carolina and Denver, made seven trips to the postseason. captured six division titles and made three conference championship appearances and two Super Bowl appearances.
- ▶ One of six coaches in NFL history to lead two different teams to Super Bowl appearances (Carolina in 2003 and Denver in 2013).

THE PACKERS-BEARS SERIES

- ▶ One of the most storied rivalries in professional sports, no two teams have met on the gridiron more than the Packers and Bears as Sunday marks the 196th matchup.
- ► Starting in 1923, the clubs met for 59 straight years until both games in 1982 were canceled as part of a strike-shortened season.
- ► Have only met in the postseason twice, with the last meeting coming following the 2010 season. With a berth in Super Bowl XLV on the line, the Packers emerged victorious, 21-14, at Soldier Field.
- After the Green Bay win on Thursday night in Week 4 earlier this season. the Packers lead the all-time series for the first time since 1932.
- After playing 14 consecutive games at Solder Field in either September. December or January, Sunday's matchup will be the Packers' first trip to Chicago's historic venue during the month of November since 2001.

Green Bay offensive coordinator Edgar Bennett played running back in Chicago from 1998-99...Chicago G Josh Sitton was originally drafted by Green Bay in the fourth round (135th overall) of the 2008 NFL Draft and played for the Packers from 2008-15...Packers TE Martellus Bennett played for the Bears from 2013-15...Packers president & chief executive officer Mark Murphy was the athletic director at Northwestern from 2003-07...Green Bay special teams coordinator Ron Zook was the head coach at Illinois from 2005-11...Packers T Bryan Bulaga played at Marian Central Catholic High in Woodstock, Ill. ...Chicago secondary coach Ed Donatell was the defensive coordinator for the Packers from 2000-03...Packers DE Dean Lowry is from Rockford, Ill., and attended Northwestern...Green Bay defensive quality control coach Tim McGarigle attended St. Patrick High School in Chicago and was named the Catholic Metropolitan Conference Defensive Player of the Year as a senior in 2001...McGarigle played at Northwestern and went on to coach at his alma mater before moving on to Illinois...Green Bay WR Geronimo Allison played at Illinois...Bears tight ends coach Frank Smith is from Milwaukee...Smith was an offensive line coach with the Saints during Packers G Jahri Evans' time in New Orleans...Chicago WRs coach Zach Azzanni held the same title at the University of Wisconsin in 2012...Green Bay defensive front assistant Jerry Montgomery played for the Chicago Rush...Packers defensive line coach Mike Trgovac coached with Bears head coach John Fox (2002-08) in Carolina...Păckers head coach Mike McCarthy and Bears special teamś coordinator Jeff Rodgers coached in San Francisco in 2005...Chicago QBs coach Dave Ragone played quarterback for the Houston Texans from 2003-05 when Packers defensive coordinator Dom Capers was the head coach...Capers coached with Chicago defensive coordinator Vic Fangio with the Baltimore Stars (USFL) in 1984, New Orleans (1986-91) and Houston (2002-05)...Bears linebackers coach Glenn Pires was colleagues with Capers in Miami (2006-07)...Fox was the defensive coordinator of the Los Angeles Raiders in 1994 when Packers associate head coach/ linebackers Winston Moss played linebacker...Green Bay tight ends coach Brian Angelichio spent 2014 in Cleveland with Chicago offensive coordinator Dowell Loggains...Donatell was the defensive backs coach in Denver while Packers strength and conditioning assistant Chris Gizzi was on the team in 1998...During the time that Bears general manager Ryan Pace was with the Saints from 2001-14, Packers vice president of football administration/player finance Russ Ball, McCarthy, Moss and Zook were all on staff...Angelichio and Bears offensive assistant Ben McDaniels coached in Tampa Bay from 2012-13...Fox was an assistant under Zook when Zook was Kansas' defensive coordinator in 1983...Fangio coached Packers LB Ahmad Brooks and DT Quinton Dial when Fangio was the 49ers' defensive coordinator...Additionally, Bears assistant DBs coach Roy Anderson, RBs coach Curtis Modkins and assistant special teams coach Derius Swinton III were on the 49ers staff during that time... Swinton III got his NFL coaching career started with the St. Louis Rams while Packers TE Lance Kendricks was a rookie...Kendricks and Bears RB Benny Cunningham spent four years together with the St. Louis and Los Angeles Rams...Packers RBs coach Ben Sirmans was Cunningham's first position coach in the NFL in St. Louis...Evans, Bears DL Akiem Hicks and LB John Jenkins played together with the Saints...McGarigle and Chicago assistant OL coach Ben Wilkerson were teammates with the UFL's Florida Tuskers in 2009...Bennett, Bears WR Victor Cruz, CB Prince Amukamara and WR Rueben Randle teamed together with the Giants in 2012...Amukamara and Packers CB Davon House were in the Jaguars' defensive backfield in 2016...Bears QB Mike Glennon played in Tampa Bay while Angelichio held the same title with the Buccaneers. LAST MEETING, REGULAR SEASON

Sept. 28, 2017, Lambeau Field, Packers won, 35-14.

The Green Bay defense forced three Chicago turnovers on the night.With a sack and a forced fumble on the Bears' opening possession, LB Clay Matthews became the all-time franchise leader with his 75th

▶ QB Aaron Rodgers posted four TD passes and no interceptions for the fourth time in his career against Chicago, joining Fran Tarkenton as the only QBs in league history with four games of four or more touchdown passes against the Bears.

►Two of Rodgers' touchdown passes went to WR Jordy Nelson, his 15th game with two-plus scoring receptions since 2011, the most in

the league during that span.

► Filling in for RB Ty Montgomery, who left with an injury in the first quarter, RB Aaron Jones rushed for his first career touchdown.



AT THE HELM

Having led Green Bay to the playoffs in nine of his first 11 seasons as head coach, **Mike McCarthy** is joined by Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl win with a victory over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.

- ► McCarthy guided the Packers to a franchise-record fourth consecutive division title in 2014. In his 11 seasons, he has won six division titles, tying Lombardi for the second most in franchise history.
- ►With a win at Tampa Bay in Week 16 of the 2014 season, McCarthy passed Lombardi for the No. 2 spot in team history as far as overall victories:

- ►The 128 overall wins are the most in the NFC and the second most in the NFL since 2006 (New England, 158).
- ▶ In Week 6, McCarthy recorded his 200th career game as a head coach (including the postseason), Having compiled 128 victories, he tied Bud Grant and Chuck Noll for the sixth-most wins by a head coach through 200 games: Don Shula, 149 / Joe Gibbs, 138 / George Halas, 134 / Tony Dungy, 130 / Curly Lambeau, 130.
- ► McCarthy reached 100 career wins (including playoffs) in just his 155th game. He was the fastest to reach 100 wins in the NFL since George Seifert in 1996 (132 games).
- ► McCarthy's 114 regular-season wins in his first 11 years as a head coach (2006-16) are **tied for No. 3 in NFL history**:

- ► McCarthy has guided the Packers to five seasons with 11-plus wins (2007, 2009, 2011-12, 2014), passing Lombardi (1961-63, 1966) and Holmgren (1995-98) for the **most by a coach in franchise history**.
- ► McCarthy's eight regular seasons with 10-plus wins are a **franchise record** (since 1921). Among current NFL head coaches, only Bill Belichick (16) and Andy Reid (11) have more 10 plus win seasons.
- ►McCarthy is the only coach in franchise history to post three or more consecutive 10-win seasons twice in his career (2009-12, 2014-16).
- ► McCarthy joined Pittsburgh's Bill Cowher (2005) as the only Super Bowlwinning coaches to lead their respective teams to three road wins as the No. 6 seed in the postseason en route to a world title.
- ►Including playoffs, McCarthy has a 128-73-1 record since taking over as head coach in 2006, a .636 winning percentage that ranks No. 3 among current NFL head coaches (minimum 100 games):

- ► For the second straight season, Nelson had five TD catches through the first four games (2016-17). He joined Don Hutson (1944-45) as the only players in franchise history to have five-plus TD catches in the first four games in back-to-back seasons.
- ▶ QB Aaron Rodgers and Nelson have connected for 65 touchdowns, the most by a duo in team history (Brett Favre and Antonio Freeman, 57).
- ► In 2016, Nelson joined WR Sterling Sharpe as the **only players in team history** to record two seasons with 95-plus catches.

Only Pro Football Hall of Famer Jerry Rice (eight), Terrell Owens (seven) and Randy Moss (six) have more such seasons in NFL history.
- ► With at least one touchdown reception in 11 games last season, Nelson tied Sharpe (1992 and 1994) for the most games with at least one TD catch in a single season in franchise history.
- Nelson has 25 100-yard receiving games in his career, passing Hutson (24) for No. 3 in team history. He trails Sharpe (29) for the second most.

- ►LB Blake Martinez has registered 10-plus tackles in five games this season, including each of the last four (12 vs. Cincinnati, 13 at Dallas, 14 at Minnesota, 15 vs. New Orleans, 10 vs. Detroit).

RACKING UP POINTS

K Mason Crosby is moving his way up the record books.

- ►In Week 9, Crosby played in his 168 straight game for the Packers, moving past LS Rob Davis (167) into the No. 3 spot all-time behind only QB Brett Favre (255) and T Forrest Gregg (187).
- ► Crosby passed Ryan Longwell in Week 2 of the 2015 season to become the franchise career points leader:

- ► Crosby's 1,267 points from 2007-16 were the **second most by an**NFL player in his first 10 seasons (NE Stephen Gostkowski, 1,330 from 2006-15).
- ► Crosby (1,447) passed Longwell (1,119) for the most points scored in the regular and postseason combined in franchise history.
- ► Crosby recorded 122 points during the 2016 season, giving him the 10th 100-point season of his career and **extending his franchise record**. Crosby's 10 seasons with 100-plus points are the **most in the NFL since 2007**. The only other kickers to have 10 or more consecutive seasons of 100-plus points are Jason Elam (16, 1993-2008) and Adam Vinatieri (13, 1996-2008).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

Green Bay went 7-1 away from Lambeau Field in 2011, with the seven road wins setting a single-season franchise record.

- ►The Packers have been able to stay above the .500 mark on the road during Head Coach **Mike McCarthy's** tenure, a notable achievement in the National Football League.
- ► Since 2006, McCarthy's first season as the head coach in Green Bay, only nine of 32 NFL teams have regular-season road records above .500.

331 AND COUNTING

Another packed house at Lambeau Field against the Detroit Lions in Week 9 brought the stadium's consecutive-sellouts streak to 331 regular-season games (not including replacement games).

- ▶The league's longest-tenured stadium, Lambeau Field is hosting its 61st season of football in 2017. For the victory over Dallas in the Divisional round of the 2014 playoffs, Packers fans set a new Lambeau Field paid-attendance record (79,704).
- ► Across American professional sports, only Boston's Fenway Park (1912) and Chicago's Wrigley Field (1914) have longer tenures.

THE LAMBEAU ADVANTAGE

The crown jewel of the National Football League, Lambeau Field has long been known as one of the tougher venues to play in, particularly during the harsh Wisconsin winter.

- ▶ Re-establishing home-field advantage after a 4-4 mark in 2008 was one of the goals of 2009, and with the Packers finishing 6-2 at home, they accomplished that goal. Green Bay followed that up with a 7-1 mark at Lambeau Field in 2010, a perfect 8-0 record in 2011, the first undefeated home mark since 2002, and a 7-1 mark in 2012. The Packers were one of two teams to finish undefeated at home during the 2014 regular season (Denver).
- ► Head Coach Mike McCarthy stated consistently upon his arrival in Green Bay that one of the team's goals would be to reclaim the mystique of playing at Lambeau Field. Mission accomplished. The team is 68-24-1 (.737) at home in the regular season since 2006, No. 2 in the NFL.
- ► Since Ron Wolf and Mike Holmgren began the revitalization of the franchise in 1992, Green Bay owns the best home record in the NFL. A look at the top regular-season home W-L records since the '92 season:

A LOOK AT THE SCHEDULE

The Green Bay Packers' 97th NFL regular-season schedule – highlighted by five prime-time contests (subject to flexible scheduling) – was released April 20 by the National Football League.

- ▶ It will be the first regular season that has the Packers playing home games on a Saturday, Thursday and Monday.
- ► Green Bay's schedule includes six games against 2016 playoff teams. Two of those contests (Detroit, Seattle) are at Lambeau Field, while four (Atlanta, Dallas, Detroit, Pittsburgh) will come on the road. The Packers will play two teams (Atlanta, Dallas) that it played during the 2016 regular and postseason.
- ► For the first time since 2012, the Packers opened the season at home, and will play three of their first four games at Lambeau Field.
- ▶ In Week 1, Green Bay hosted the Seattle Seahawks, marking the third consecutive regular season that the Packers have played the Seahawks at home. Green Bay improved to 11-3 against the Seahawks at home during the regular and postseason, including eight straight wins.
- ► For the second straight season, the Packers played a prime-time game on the road in Week 2, traveling to Atlanta for an NFC Championship rematch with the Falcons.
- ► Week 3 saw the Cincinnati Bengals play in Green Bay for just the sixth time, and Week 4 had the Packers hosting the Chicago Bears on a Thursday night for the third consecutive season (12th straight year in primetime). The division rivals squared off in a prime-time contest for the 12th straight season.
- ► Green Bay begins October with back-to-back road games. The Packers first traveled to play the Dallas Cowboys, marking the fourth matchup between the two clubs since 2015 (including postseason), and then faced the Vikings in Minnesota in Week 6.
- ►In Week 7, the New Orleans Saints visited Lambeau, it was their latest trip by date to Wisconsin since playing the Packers in Milwaukee on Nov. 17, 1985.
- ► The Packers had a Week 8 bye, the latest bye week for Green Bay since 2014 (Week 9).
- ► Green Bay hosted the Detroit Lions on *Monday Night Football* in Week 9, marking the third time the two teams have met on *MNF* and the first since 1972. Green Bay swept the regular-season series with the Lions last season for the first time since 2012 and for the seventh time under McCarthy.
- ►In Week 10, Green Bay will face the Bears in Chicago, a place they have won in the regular season each of the last six years.
- ►After welcoming the Baltimore Ravens to Lambeau Field in Week 11 for just the fourth time, the Packers will travel to Pittsburgh to play the Steelers in a Sunday night matchup in Week 12.
- ►After stopping back in Green Bay in Week 13 to play Tampa Bay, the Buccaneers' first December trip to Lambeau since 2000, the Packers will begin a stretch of three road games in four weeks with a trip to Cleveland in Week 14. It is the first time since 2009 that Green Bay will finish the regular season with three of the final four games taking place on the road.
- ► The Packers will finish their slate against the NFC South when they play at the Carolina Panthers in Week 15.
- ► For the second consecutive season, Green Bay will host the Vikings on a Saturday in Week 16. The Packers have won their last five regular-season games played on Saturdays.
- ►Green Bay will close out the regular season at Detroit for the second consecutive year, marking the first time it has finished the regular season on the road against the same team in back-to-back seasons since 1991-92 (Minnesota).



BREAKING DOWN THE ROSTER

The Packers currently have an 53-man roster that is composed of 25 offensive players, 25 defensive players and three specialists.

- ▶ Of the 53 players on Green Bay's roster, 33 of them (62.3 percent) were draft picks of the Packers. Dating back to 2007, Green Bay has at least one member of each draft class still on the roster.
- ► Green Bay has 14 players on the roster that began their careers as undrafted free agents, with 11 of those originally signed by Green Bay.
- ► Over a third (35.8 percent) of the players (19 of 53) on Green Bay's roster entered the league as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as an undrafted player.
- ► The Packers have four players on the roster that played in the NFL prior to the 2009 season. Three of those four players were draft picks of the Packers (K Mason Crosby, WR Jordy Nelson and LB Clay Matthews) and two have made at least one Pro Bowl.
- ► Of the 53 players on the roster, 44 began their pro careers with the Packers (83.0 percent).
- ▶ Only 19 of the 53 players on the roster (35.8 percent) were selected in the first three rounds of the draft, with 16 being drafted by the Packers.

WR Jordy Nelson, 10th Year, Kansas State, D2a-08

Became the fourth player in franchise history to reach 500 receptions.

► Has 69 career receiving TDs, No. 2 in Packers history behind Don Hutson (99).

▶ Became the first player in franchise history to record 13-plus receiving touchowns in three different seasons (2011, 2014, 2016). His three seasons of 13-plus TD receptions tie Pro Football Hall of Famers Lance Alworth, Cris Carter and Marvin Harrison for the fourth most in NFL his-

► Missed all of the 2015 season due to a knee injury.

Finished the 2014 regular season ranked fourth in the NFL in receiving yards (1,519), seventh in receptions (98) and tied for second in receiving touchdowns (13). Earned first selection to the Pro Bowl.

Led the team in 2013 with 85 catches for 1,314 yards and eight TDs.

Ranked No. 10 in the NFL that season in receiving yards.

With 15 TD catches in 2011, became only the third player in franchise history to catch 15 or more TDs in a season, joining WRs Sterling Sharpe (18 in 1994) and Don Hutson (17 in 1942).

LT David Bakhtiari, 5th Year, Colorado, D4a-13

Named to first career Pro Bowl in 2016.

Has started all but six games at LT since the start of the 2013 regular season. Missed Weeks 2-5 this season and the final two games of the 2015 regular season due to injury.

► Started all 16 games at left tackle in 2013, the only rookie in the NFL to do so in 2013 and the first Packer rookie to do so since the league went

to a 16-game schedule in 1978.

▶ Became just the fourth Green Bay rookie to start at LT in the season opener since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger and the first since 1985.

LG Lane Taylor, 5th Year, Oklahoma State, FA-13

► Has played in 54 regular-season games for Green Bay with all but two of his 25 starts (LT in Week 4-5 this season) taking place at LG.

- ► Made the first starts of his career in 2015, opening at RG at Detroit in Week 13 in place of an injured T.J. Lang and at LG in Week 17 vs. Minnesota with Josh Sitton sliding to LT in place of an injured David Bakhtiari.
- ► A four-year letterman at OSU, starting 47 of 50 games played at right guard. Unanimous first-team All-Big 12 selection by the conference's coaches as a senior.

- C Corey Linsley, 4th Year, Ohio State, D5a-14

 ► Has started every game at C since Week 9 of 2016. Was on reserve/ physically unable to perform for the entire preseason and the first seven regular-season games last season.
- ► Started 29 games and four postseason contests in his first two seasons. First rookie center to start for Green Bay in Week 1 since the merger.
- ► Was the first rookie center to start every game for the Packers since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.
- Named to PFWA's All-Rookie team, the first Green Bay center to be honored since its inception in 1974.

RG Jahri Evans, 12th Year, Bloomsburg, UFA (NO)-17

► Selected to six Pro Bowls (2009-14) and has been named first-team All-Pro by The Associated Press four times (2009-12).

► Has started all 177 games he has played in since entering the league in 2006, the most games played by an active NFL offensive lineman over that span.

► Started all 16 games in nine of his 11 seasons in New Orleans (2006-

16), missing just seven contests due to injury.

► Helped the Saints finish in the top six in the NFL in total offense in all 11 of his seasons in New Orleans (2006-16), including six No. 1 rankings (2006, 2008-09, 2011, 2014, 2016).

► Entered the NFL with New Orleans (2006 as a fourth-round pick (No. 108 overall) out of Please burge (2004).

108 overall) out of Bloomsburg (Pa.) University, where he was a finalist for the Gene Upshaw Player of the Year Award in both of his final two seasons.

RT Bryan Bulaga, 8th Year, Iowa, D1-10

► Has started 48 of 56 games since the start of the 2014 season.

► Missed the second part of the 2012 season after suffering a hip injury vs. Arizona on Nov. 4 and missed all of the 2013 season after injuring his knee on Aug. 3.

Started 37 games at RT in his first three seasons in the league.
 Started the final 12 games of 2010 and the entire postseason at right tackle after taking over for veteran Mark Tauscher (shoulder).
 Named to the *Pro Football Weekly*/PFWA All-Rookie team in 2010.

Capped his rookie season by becoming the youngest player at the time, according to STATS LLC, to ever start in the Super Bowl (21 years, 322 days).

TE Martellus Bennett, 10th Year, Texas A&M, UFA (NE)-17

► Ranks No. 4 on the team with 24 receptions this season.

▶ Posted 50-plus receptions in each season from 2012-16, one of only three tight ends in the league (Greg Olsen, Jason Witten) to do so over that span.

▶ Posted a career-high three 100-yard receiving games in 2016 with the Patriots, tied for No. 2 in the NFL among TES, and a career-best seven

TD catches, tied for No. 3 in the league among TEs.

▶ Registered a career-high 90 receptions with the Chicago Bears in 2014, the most among NFL tight ends that season, on his way to earning Pro

Bowl recognition.

► Entered the NFL in 2008 as a second-round pick (No. 61 overall) with Dallas and went on to play four seasons with the Cowboys (2008-11). Also played one season with the N.Y. Giants (2012), three with the Bear's (2013-15) and one with the Patriots (2016).

WR Randall Cobb, 6th Year, Kentucky, D2-11

▶ Despite missing a game, ranks No. 2 on the team with 33 receptions this season.

▶Led the team with a 13.5-yard punt-return average in 2016.

- Posted the 12th 100-yard receiving game of his career in Week 4 (108) on nine receptions) and tied his single-game high for receptions (11 for 95 yards and a TD) in Week 7 last season.
- ►Led the team in receptions (79), was No. 2 in receiving yards (829) and was No. 3 in touchdown receptions (six) in 2015.
- ►Set a new single-season career high with five 100-yard receiving games
- during the 2014 season (three-2012). Earned first trip to the Pro Bowl. His career-best 91 receptions in 2014 are the eighth most in team history.
- ► Finished the regular season tied for fourth in the NFL with 12 touchdown receptions in 2014.
- ▶ Set a franchise single-season record with a league-high 2,342 combined net yards in 2012, topping the previous team mark of 2,250 yards by RB Ahman Green in 2003.

QB Brett Hundley, 3rd Year, UCLA, D5-15

► Made first career start in Week 7 vs. New Orleans.

- Finished No. 7 in the NFL this past preseason with a passer rating of 88.8 after completing 48 of 76 passes for 482 yards (No. 6 in the NFL) with three touchdowns and an interception.
- Served as the No. 3 quarterback in 2015 and the No. 2 quarterback in 2016.
- ► Ranked No. 2 in the NFL with 630 passing yards in the 2015 preseason, completing 45 of 65 passes (69.2 percent) for seven TDs with one INT for a passer rating of 129.6 (No. 3 in the NFL).

► Finished career at UCLA ranked No. 1 in school history in passing TDs (75), total offense (11,713 yards) and completions (837) despite playing iust three seasons for the Bruins.

► Ranked No. 2 in school annals in passing yards (9,966), 300-yard passing games (10), rushing yards by a QB (1,747) and rushing TDs by a QB (30)

RB Ty Montgomery, 2nd Year, Stanford, D3-15

►After being converted from wide receiver to running back during the 2016 season, has started 11 games at RB, including five games this

season. Missed Week 5 due to injury.

►In Week 15 at Chicago (2016), rushed for 162 yards on 16 carries and two touchdowns. His 162 yards were the most by a Packers player in a single game since Dec. 11, 2005 (Samkon Gado, 171 yards on 29 carries, 5.9 avg.). Dating back to 1960, his 10.13 yards-per-carry average was the third highest (min. 15 carries) by a Green Bay player.

► Played in six games with three starts as a rookie in 2015 before an ankle injury sustained in Week 6 sidelined him for the remainder of the season.

▶ Posted 5,190 all-purpose yards at Stanford (334 rushing, 2,125 receiving, 238 PR, 2,493 KOR), the fourth most in school history at the time.

FB Aaron Ripkowski, 2nd Year, Oklahoma, D6a-15

► Has played in 39 career games with eight starts.

- ► Scored his first career rushing touchdown in Week 12 (2016) and followed it up with one in Week 13.
- Led the team and set career highs in Week 17 (2016) at Detroit with 61 rushing yards on nine carries (6.8 avg.)
- ► Played in 15 games as a rookie, seeing action primarily on special teams. Was tied for No. 4 on the team with nine special teams tackles.
- ▶ Began collegiate career as a walk-on and went on to play in 47 games with 17 starts.

▶ Played in 48 games with 33 starts for Northwestern and registered 134 tackles (83 solo), 311/2 tackles for a loss, 121/2 sacks, three interceptions (one returned for a TD), 21 passes defensed, three fumble recoveries and three forced fumbles.

► Earned second-team All-Big Ten honors as a senior in 2015 after posting 46 tackles (27 solo), 13½ tackles for a loss (second on the team), three sacks, an interception, a fumble recovery and seven passes defensed.

NT Kenny Clark, 2nd Year, UCLA, D1-16

►Third on the team with 41 tackles this season.

▶ Finished the 2016 regular season ranked No. 3 on the GB defensive line in tackles (33).

▶ Became the youngest player to appear in a season opener for the

DT Mike Daniels, 6th Year, Iowa, D4a-12

- Leads Packers defensive linemen with 21.5 sacks since the start of the 2013 regular season.
- ▶ Led the defensive line in both tackles and sacks in 2014 and 2015.
- ▶ Returned a fumble 43 yards for a TD vs. Detroit in Week 14 of 2012, the longest fumble return for a TD by a rookie in franchise history.
- ► Starred as an interior pass rusher at lowa, posting a team-high 24.5 tackles for a loss and 13 sacks from 2010-11.

LOLB Clay Matthews, 9th Year, Southern California, D1b-09

► With 75.0 career sacks, passed Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila (74.5) for the most sacks in Packers history.

▶ Despite injuries forcing him to miss four games and limiting him in six others, finished No. 3 on the team with five sacks in 2016.

For the first time in his career, recorded at least one sack in each of the

first three regular-season games he played in (2016). ► Selected to his sixth Pro Bowl and first as an inside linebacker in 2015 after recording 6.5 sacks (second on the team), 15 QB hits (No. 1 on the team) and a career-high 85 tackles (No. 2 on the team).

► With a team-high 11.0 sacks in 2014, is tied for the most 10-plus sack

seasons in franchise history (four).

ls the only player in franchise history to score a defensive TD (interception or fumble return) in each of his first three seasons in the NFL (2009-11).

ILB Jake Ryan, 3rd Year, Michigan, D4-15

► Tied for No. 4 on the team with 35 tackles this season.

- Finished No. 2 on the team with 84 tackles during the 2016 regular
- ► Started the final five games of the regular season and both playoff contests in 2015.

► Recorded a team-best nine tackles (eight solo) and one fumble recovery

in Week 13 (2015) at Detroit in his first pro start.

- ► Served as a team captain for his final two seasons at Michigan and was a three-time winner (2012-14) of the Roger Zatkoff Award, given to the Wolverines top linebacker. He was the only player to win the award (est. 1991) three times.
- ► Started 41 of 46 games played in college, appearing at inside linebacker as a senior after spending his first three seasons at outside linebacker and defensive end.

ILB Blake Martinez, 2nd Year, Stanford, D4a-16

▶ Ranks No. 1 on the Packers with 82 total tackles this season.

- ► Has registered 10-plus tackles in five games this season, including each of the last four (12 vs. Cincinnati, 13 at Dallas, 14 at Minnesota, 15 vs. New Orleans, 10 vs. Detroit).
- ➤ Started nine of 13 games he played in 2016 during the regular season, missing Weeks 12-14 due to injury. Became the first rookie to start on defense for Green Bay in Week 1 since LB Nick Perry in 2012.

► Finished collegiate career with 257 tackles (137 solo), 13.5 tackles for a loss, 6.5 sacks, five interceptions and five forced fumbles in 51 games played.

► Started all 27 games played in his final two seasons, leading the team in tackles as a junior (102) and senior (141).

► Led the Pacific-12 and ranked No. 7 nationally with 141 tackles (75 solo) as a senior, averaging a conference-best 10.1 tackles per game.

ROLB Nick Perry, 6th Year, Southern California, D1-12

Leads the team with 4.0 sacks this season.

►Led the team with a career-high 11.0 sacks in 2016.

- ▶ Registered mulitple sacks in each of his first five seasons in the NFL and has posted a two-sack game in each of the last four seasons (2013-16).
- ► Has totaled seven sacks in eight playoff games, including 3.5 in the 2015 postseason, which tied Clay Matthews (2010) for the franchise record in a single posteason.
- ► His seven postseason sacks rank No. 3 in franchise history (since 1982) behind Matthews (11) and Reggie White (eight).

<u> CB Davon House, 7th Year, New Mexico State, FA-17</u>

▶ Rejoined the Packers after spending the 2015-16 seasons with the Jacksonville Jaguars, starting 19 of 32 games played.

► In 2015, his first season in Jacksonville, set career highs in starts (15), tackles (60), solo tackles (49), passes defensed (23, franchise singleseason record) and interceptions (four).

▶ Despite missing three regular-season games with a shoulder injury in 2014, his 11 passes defensed tied for No. 4 on the Packers.

► After seeing action in two games as a rookie (2011), appeared in 25 games for Green Bay between 2012-13, starting five games in each

► Was the first player to be drafted by the Packers out of New Mexico State in franchise history, and was the first Aggie drafted since S Siddeeq Shabazz (Oakland, seventh round) in 2003.

RCB Damarious Randall, 3rd Year, Arizona State, D1-15

- Leads the team and is tied for No. 3 in the NFL with three interceptions this season.
- ▶ Tied for No. 4 in the NFL with two interceptions returned for touchdowns since 2015.

► Was second on the team with three interceptions in 2016 despite miss-

ing six games due to injury.

▶ Played in 15 games with nine starts (six at LCB, two at RCB, one in the slot) in 2015 and tied for the team lead and No. 2 among NFL rookies with three interceptions, including one he returned for a TD. Finished with a team-best 16 passes defensed.

► Named the NFL's Defensive Rookie of the Month for November 2015, joining CB Casey Hayward (October 2012) as the only Green Bay defen-

sive backs to win the award.

► Earned first-team All-Pacific-12 honors at safety as a senior in 2014 after he led the Sun Devils in tackles (106) and passes defensed (12) and tied for the team lead with three interceptions.

SS Morgan Burnett, 8th Year, Georgia Tech, D3-10

▶ Tied for No. 1 among NFL safeties with a career-best three sacks last season. Finished No. 1 on the team in tackles (92).

►Missed five games due to injury in 2015, but finished No. 4 on the team with 54 solo tackles.

- ▶Totaled a team-high 125 tackles in 2014, the second most of his career (137 in 2012). Ranked No. 2 on the team with 106 tackles (77 solo) in 2013, despite missing the first three games due to injury. Recovered three fumbles, including one for a TD, and added nine passes defensed.

 Participated in all 1,088 plays for Green Bay's defense in 2012, one of
- only four non-OL in the NFL to appear in 100 percent of his team's snaps.

FS Ha Ha Clinton-Dix, 4th Year, Alabama, D1-14

►Ranks No. 2 on the team with 43 tackles this season.

►Named to his first career Pro Bowl in 2016. His career-best five interceptions tied for No. 5 in the NFL last season and tied for No. 1 among safeties. It was the most interceptions by a Packers safety in a single season since Charles Woodson (seven) and Charlie Peprah (five) in 2011.

►In 2016, posted a career-high two interceptions in both Week 9 and Week 14, becoming the first Packer to have two two-INT games in a season sínce Woodson in 2011

▶Led the team in tackles in 2015 with 117 (97 solo) and was tied for fourth on the team in interceptions (two).

►According to STATS, his three sacks during the 2015 regular season tied for the fifth most in a single regular season by a Packers safety (since 1982) and the most since Mark Roman recorded 3.5 in 2004.

► Started every game in 2015 after starting 10 of 16 games as a rookie when he finished second on the team in tackles (95).

A marquee season opener between two NFC heavyweights turned into a defensive slugfest, with Daniels landing the momentum-swinging punch. No talk about double moves or stunts. Daniels said he just flat-out beat glard Luke Joeckel to wreak havor in the backfield.

Packers QIB Aaron Rodgers was 28 of 42 for 311 yards and added a 32-yard tourchlown pass to Jordy Nelson to make it an eight-point game late in the third quarter. Rodgers went deep to his favorite receiver on a free play that was extended after Seattle was flagged for having too many

men on the field

But the Green Bay defense fueled the victory.

Seattle managed just three field goals. Wilson was held to 14 of 27 for 158 yards. The Packers held decisive edges in total yardage (370-225) and first downs (26-12). Green Bay held the ball for 39 minutes.

Rodgers' regular-season streak of passes without an interception ended at a career-high 251. The Seahawks' defense, reinforced by the return of safety Earl Thomas, bottled up receivers from making many big plays and put plenty of pressure on Rodgers.

GREEN BAY, Wis. (AP) — Aaron Rodgers burned another defense deep with a free play. The Cincinnati Bengals found their offense and a new

Mason Crosby kicked a 27-yard field goal with 6:26 left in overtime set up by Rodgers' 72-yard pass to Geronimo Allison, and the Green Bay Packers railled to beat Cincinnati, 27-24, on Sunday, Crosby's kick completed the Packers conneback from a 21-7 halftime deficit.

On third-and-10 from the Packers 21, Rodgers took advantage of yet another free play after defensive end Michael Johnson was whistled for offside. Officials let the play continue and the two-time NFL MVP found Allison on about a 40-yard pass before the receiver beat a couple defenders

for more yards.

Crosby, a veteran kicker, finished it off for the Packers (2-1).

The winless Bengals (0-3) won the toss in overline but went three-and-out on their opening drive. It was so loud at Lambeau Field that they had to call timeout before their first overline snap. Rodgers thrived under the pressure.

He connected with Jordy Nelson for a 3-yard foucidown pass with 17 seconds left in regulation to tie the game at 24. Bengals cornerback Dre

Kilpatrick narrowly missed batting away the bullet thrown by the quarterback into the front right corner of the end zone.

Rodgers finished 28 of 42 for 313 yards with three touchdowns and one interception. Allison had six catches for 122 yards.

The Packers filipped the script after the Bengals controlled the first half.

A.J. Green caught a 10-yard scoring pass on the game's opening drive for Cincinnati's first touchdown after two frustrating weeks for the offense. Bill Lazor made his debut as offensive coordinator for the fired Ken Zampese.

Andy Dalton was 21 of 27 for 212 yards and two scores. The Bengals were desperate to avoid their first 0-3 start since 2008. But they couldn't finish the Packers off in the second half.

Green Bay's defense generated a little more pressure on Dalton in the second half, and rookie safety Josh Jones gave the injury-laden defense

Rodgers shook off his early struggles to guide the Packers to another win. He was sacked six times, mostly against just the Bengals' four-man rush, though the protection shored up after halftime.

Rodgers threw just his second career pick-six — and his first at home — when William Jackson returned an interception 75 yards for a toucha boost with two sacks and 12 tackles.

Aaron Rodgers threw four touchdown passes, and the injury-riddled Packers converted three turnovers into scores in an eventful 35-14 victory GREEN BAY, Wis. — The Green Bay Packers keep finding ways to win despite more key injuries. The Chicago Bears never recovered from a

over the Chicago Bears on Thursday night.

Rodgers connected with Davante Adams and Randall Cobb on short touchdown passes to help build a 21-0 lead in the second quarter of a game delayed 45 minutes by lightning between the first two quarters. The Packers overpowered the Bears down the stretch to slog out a win as intermittent rain fell at Lambeau Field.

The Packers (3-1) lost two more key players to injuries. Adams left the field on a stretcher after getting hit in the head during a tackle by Danny Trevathan in the third quarter. Bunning back Ty Montgomery was knocked out in the first quarter with a chest injury.

But the Packers capitalized on an awful start by Glennon, who accounted for four turnovers. He fumbled on his first snap on a strip sack by Clay Matthews. Rodgers hit Cobb for a 2-yard foundrown pass three plays later for a 7-0 lead.

Glennon fumbled on his next series, too, but the Packers couldn't score on that drive. It was only a matter of time because the mistakes kept

Glennon threw his second interception with 2:54 left in the third quarter. Six plays later, receiver Jordy Nelson caught his second touchdown pass,

an 8-yarder from Rodgers, to make it a 28-point lead.

Rodgers was 18 of 26 for 179 yards. He picked apart the Bears (1-3) on short, quick passes, a game plan in part necessitated by a patchwork offensive line. The Packers played without starting tackes David Bakhtiari and Bryan Bulaga, and their three backup tackes are already on injured reserve. The injury to Adams cast a pall late in the third quarter. The game was delayed for about five minutes while medical personnel tended to the receiver, who gave a thumbs-up signal as he was wheeled off the field. The Packers said Adams was conscious and taken to a hospital for evaluation for possible head and neck injuries, and that he had feeling in all of his extremities.

Both the Packers and Bears were coming off overtime wins Sunday, Gleinnon finished 21 of 33 for 216 yards and one touchdown.

The Packers are 95-94-6 against the Bears, their first lead in the series since 1933. It's the oldest rivalry in football, dating to 1923. Matthews' sack on Gleinnon in the first quarter was the 75th of his career, breaking the franchise record (since 1982) held by Kabeer Gbaja-Blamila.

Packers rooke Aaron Jones, a fifth-round draft pick, had a team-high 49 yards on 31 carries and a 2-yard touchdown run in the second quarter. He was the only active running back left on the roster with Montgomery and backup Jamaal Williams (knee) both knocked out of the game.

DALLAS (AP) Aaron Rodgers had more magic in store for the Dallas Cowboys, who can't seem to find the mojo that carried them a year

Rodgers threw a 12-yard touchdown pass to Davante Adams with 11 seconds remaining. Rodgers capped a 75-yard drive in just 1:02, lifting the Packers over Dallas 35-31 on Sunday in another thriller nine months after their divisional playoff win on the same field.

Adams had been in the concussion protocol but was active 10 days after leaving the field on a stretcher on a helmet-to-helmet hit that resulted in a suspension for Chicago linebacker Danny Trevathan. He had seven catches for 66 yards and two touchdowns.

Dak Prescott, who had touchdown passes on Dallas' first three drives, put the Cowboys in front on an 11-yard touchdown run with 1:13 remaining to cap a 17-play drive that lasted almost nine minutes.

But another defensive letdown, just like a year ago in the postseason, left Dallas (2-3) already with the same number of losses from the magical rookie season when Prescott and running back Ezeklel Elliott led the Cowboys to the No. 1 seed in the NFC.

The Packers (4-1) had gone ahead earlier on Damarius Randall's 21-yard interception return for a touchdown, the third of five lead changes in

- Posted career highs for receptions (75), receiving yards (997) and receiving TDs (12) last season, finishing tied for No. 2 in the NFL in TD catches behind teammate Jordy Nelson (14).

- Has posted six seasons (2009, 2011-12, 2014-16) with 500-plus passing attempts and eight or fewer INTs, the most in NFL history ahead of Patriots QB Tom Brady (three) and nine QBs (one).
- Has been named the NFL's Most Valuable Player by *The Associated Press* twice in his career (2011, 2014), one of only eight players in league history to win the award multiple times.
- Is the only quarterback in league history to record a 100-plus passer rating in six consecutive seasons (2009-14), with no other QB doing so in more than four straight seasons. Has posted a 100-plus rating in seven seasons (2009-14, 2016), the most in NFL annals.
- Is one of only four QBs in NFL annals with 35,000-plus passing yards and 2,500-plus rushing yards (Fran Tarkenton, John Elway, Donovan McNabb).
- Is the lone QB in NFL history to throw 40-plus TD passes with seven or fewer INTs in a season, having done it twice in his career (45/6 in 2011, 40/7 in 2016).
- In 141 career regular-season starts (since 2008), has posted 52 games with 300-plus passing yards (No. 3 in the NFL over that span), 82 without an interception (No. 1, min. 15 attempts) and 78 with a 100-plus passer rating (No. 2).
- Has been selected to the Pro Bowl in six of the last eight seasons (2009, 2011-12, 2014-16).
- In the franchise record books, holds seven of the top eight single-season marks for passer rating (2009-14, 2016), four of the top six for passing TDs (2011-12, 2014, 2016), six of the top seven for completion percentage (2010-14, 2016) and four of the top six for passing yards (2009, 2011, 2014, 2016).
