

PACKERS AND RAVENS FACE OFF AT LAMBEAU

The Packers return to Green Bay to host the Baltimore Ravens at Lambeau Field.

- ▶It is the second opponent from the AFC that the Packers have faced this season after defeating the Cincinnati Bengals, 27-24, in overtime in Week 3.
- ►Green Bay will face three teams from the AFC North in its next four games, traveling to Pittsburgh in Week 12 and then to Cleveland in Week 14.
- ▶The Packers are 4-1 against the Ravens, including 3-0 at home.
- ► Baltimore is playing at Lambeau Field for the first time since 2009, a 27-14 Green Bay victory.
- ►The Ravens first played in Green Bay in 1998, a 28-10 win for the Packers.
- ►The last time the two teams met was in 2013, a 19-17 Packers win in Baltimore.
- ► This will be the first time in the series that the two teams will meet in the month of November.
- ► Four of the Packers' last five games against AFC opponents have been decided by eight points or less. Green Bay is 3-2 in those contests, including wins in the last two games.
- ► Under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**, the Packers have scored 20-plus points in 35 of 46 games (including the postseason) against AFC teams, including 20 games of 30-plus points.
- ► Green Bay has eclipsed 20 points in each of the last six contests against AFC opponents.
- ►The Packers have recorded a .500 or better record against AFC teams in each season under McCarthy except for two (1-3 in 2006 and 2008).
- ►In four of the last six seasons (2011-12, 2014-15), Green Bay has gone 3-1 against the AFC.
- ► For the ninth time in 12 seasons under McCarthy, the Packers are above .500 through the first nine games of the season, including the eighth time in the last nine seasons.
- ► Green Bay has won the turnover battle in five of the last six games, recording a turnover margin of plus-eight over that span.
- ▶In the 23-16 victory at Chicago last week, QB **Brett Hundley** completed 18 of 25 passes for 212 yards, a touchdown and a passer rating of 110.8. It marked the highest passer rating by a Green Bay quarterback (min. 20 pass att.) other than **Aaron Rodgers** since Matt Flynn registered a rating of 113.1 in a win at Dallas on Dec. 15, 2013.
- ►WR **Jordy Nelson** needs a reception to pass James Lofton (530, 1978-86) for the third most in Packers history behind Sterling Sharpe (595, 1988-94) and Donald Driver (743, 1999-2012).

REGULAR-SEASON WEEK 11

➤ Sunday, the Packers will wear a re-creation of the team's uniform from 1927-48 for the third time (San Diego, Week 5 in 2015 / Dallas, Week 6 in 2016). It is navy blue and gold, and includes a gold yoke across the shoulders with faded gold pants and high navy socks. Green Bay is 8-4 when wearing a third jersey, including wins in seven of the last nine.

WITH THE CALL

CBS will broadcast the game to a regional audience with play-by-play man **Kevin Harlan** and analyst **Rich Gannon** handling the call from the broadcast booth and **Jenny Dell** reporting from the sidelines.



- ► Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since November 1929, heads up the Packers Radio Network that is made up of 50 stations in five states. Wayne Larrivee (play-by-play) and two-time Packers Pro Bowler Larry McCarren (analyst) call the action. McCarren first joined the team's broadcasts in 1995 and enters his 23rd season calling Packers games. After originally being paired together in 1999, McCarren and Larrivee enter their 19th season of broadcasts together.
- Westwood One Sports will air the game on radio across the country. Tom McCarthy (play-by-play) and Ross Tucker (analyst) will call the action, with Scott Graham hosting the pregame and halftime shows.
- ▶ The broadcast is also available on Sirius Satellite Radio (WTMJ feed).
- ▶ DIRECTV subscribers can watch the game on Channel 706.

FACING THE AFC

The Green Bay Packers have played well against AFC teams. Under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**, the Packers are 27-18 during the regular and postseason against teams from the AFC, including 1-0 this season.

- ► Green Bay's 27 wins versus the AFC are tied (Philadelphia) for the second most among NFC teams since 2006 (Dallas, 28).
- ► The Packers' .600 winning percentage against AFC teams since 2006 ranks No. 2 in the NFC and No. 5 in the NFL.

STATS OF THE WEEK

- ▶LB **Nick Perry** registered a career-high three sacks against the Chicago Bears last week. It was the first time a Packers player had three-plus sacks in a game since LB A.J. Hawk (three) on Oct. 13, 2013, at Baltimore.
- ▶Perry has a team-high seven sacks on the season, the most he has recorded through the team's first nine games in his career.
- ▶Green Bay registered five sacks at Chicago in Week 10, the most by the Packers in a single regular-season game since accumulating six at Minnesota on Nov. 22, 2015.
- ▶The Green Bay defense held Chicago to 55 yards rushing on 17 carries (3.2) a week after holding Detroit to 64 yards on 33 carries (1.9). Over the last two weeks, the Packers rank **No. 3 in the NFL** in average yards allowed per carry (2.38), trailing only the Philadelphia Eagles (1.84) and Seattle Seahawks (1.81).

DON'T GIVE IT AWAY

- ► Green Bay is tied for the fourth-fewest giveaways this season with nine.
- ► The Packers have only lost two fumbles this year, tied for the fewest in the NFL.
- ► The Packers have come out even or ahead in the turnover battle in seven of nine games this season, holding a 5-2 record in those contests.



Two years after he co-founded the Packers with Curly Lambeau, George Calhoun began writing a piece called The Dope Sheet, which served as the official press release from 1921-24.



HOME SWEET HOME

Green Bay has a long tradition of playing well at Lambeau Field.

- ►The Packers' three home wins are tied for the fifth most in the NFL this season.
- ► Green Bay started 3-0 at home this season, marking the fifth time in the last seven seasons that the Packers began the season 3-0 or better at home.
- ► Green Bay finished with a record of .500 or better at home in 10 of the first 11 seasons under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**.

- ► Green Bay's victory in Week 4 vs. Chicago was the 220th at Lambeau Field, the most home wins by any franchise at one stadium in NFL history.
- ► Since the start of 2014, Green Bay is **tied for No. 3 in the NFL** in winning percentage at home during the regular season:

- ► In 2014, Green Bay's plus-155 point differential at home was the highest in franchise history (dating back to 1940), eclipsing the plus-151 in 1996.
- ▶ Dating back to 2014, Green Bay ranks **No. 1 in the NFL** in first-quarter scoring margin (plus-180) at home (according to pro-football-reference. com). The Packers are plus-14 in first-quarter scoring margin at home this season, **tied for No. 4 in the NFL**.

► Under McCarthy, Green Bay has scored 30-plus points at home during the regular season 40 times, winning 38 of those contests. The Packers' rank **No. 3 in the league** in home games with 30-plus points since 2006:

- ► WR **Jordy Nelson** has recorded at least one touchdown catch in 16 of the last 21 games he has played in at Lambeau Field, totaling 23 touchdown receptions over that span.
- ▶ Over his career, Nelson has registered at least one touchdown reception in 30 games at Lambeau Field. The Packers are 28-2 in those contests.
- ► Nelson has recorded five touchdown receptions in five home games this
- ▶ Dating back to the 2016 season, Nelson has 14 receiving touchdowns in 13 home games, ranking No. 1 in the NFL. WR Davante Adams is tied for No. 4 in the NFL over that span with eight receiving touchdowns at home:

AT THE HELM

Having led Green Bay to the playoffs in nine of his first 11 seasons as head coach, **Mike McCarthy** is joined by Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl win with a victory over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.

- ► McCarthy guided the Packers to a franchise-record fourth consecutive division title in 2014. In his 11 seasons, he has won six division titles, tying Lombardi for the second most in franchise history.
- ►With a win at Tampa Bay in Week 16 of the 2014 season, McCarthy passed Lombardi for the No. 2 spot in team history as far as overall victories:

- ►The 129 overall wins are the most in the NFC and the second most in the NFL since 2006 (New England, 159).
- ▶ In Week 6, McCarthy recorded his 200th career game as a head coach (including the postseason), Having compiled 128 victories, he tied Bud Grant and Chuck Noll for the **sixth-most wins by a head coach** through 200 games: Don Shula, 149 / Joe Gibbs, 138 / George Halas, 134 / Tony Dungy, 130 / Curly Lambeau, 130.
- ► McCarthy reached 100 career wins (including playoffs) in just his 155th game. He was the fastest to reach 100 wins in the NFL since George Seifert in 1996 (132 games).
- ► McCarthy's 114 regular-season wins in his first 11 years as a head coach (2006-16) are **tied for No. 3 in NFL history**:

- ► McCarthy recorded his third regular season with 12-plus wins in 2014 (2007, 2011), passing Lambeau (1929, 1931), Lombardi (1962, 1966), Holmgren (1996-97) and Mike Sherman (2001-02) for the most by a coach in franchise history.
- ► McCarthy has guided the Packers to five seasons with 11-plus wins (2007, 2009, 2011-12, 2014), passing Lombardi (1961-63, 1966) and Holmgren (1995-98) for the most by a coach in franchise history.
- ► McCarthy's eight regular seasons with 10-plus wins are a **franchise record** (since 1921). Among current NFL head coaches, only Bill Belichick (16) and Andy Reid (11) have more 10-plus-win seasons.
- ►McCarthy is the only coach in franchise history to post three or more consecutive 10-win seasons twice in his career (2009-12, 2014-16).
- ► McCarthy joined Pittsburgh's Bill Cowher (2005) as the only Super Bowlwinning coaches to lead their respective teams to three road wins as the No. 6 seed in the postseason en route to a world title.
- ►Including playoffs, McCarthy has a 129-73-1 record since taking over as head coach in 2006, a .638 winning percentage that ranks No. 3 among current NFL head coaches (minimum 100 games):

►McCarthy has coached in 203 games (including playoffs), No. 2 in team history behind Lambeau (339 from 1921-49).

▶In the Week 6 victory over the San Diego Chargers in 2015, McCarthy earned the 100th regular-season win of his career in just his 150th game, making him the seventh-fastest coach in NFL history and the fastest current NFL coach to reach the 100-win plateau:

WINNING WAYS

- ▶ The Packers are the only NFC team and one of two teams in the league (New England) to make the playoffs each of the past eight seasons (2009-16). Those eight appearances are more than the rest of the NFC North Division combined during that span (Minnesota-three / Detroit-three / Chicago-one).
- ► McCarthy became just the **fourth head coach in NFL history** to lead a single franchise to eight-plus consecutive playoff appearances:

- ►There are seven teams in the NFL with five-plus playoff appearances from 2009-16, with only two in the NFC (New England and Green Bay, eight / Cincinnati and Seattle, six / Baltimore, Denver, Indianapolis, five).
- ► With the victory over Dallas in the 2016 playoffs, McCarthy has led the Packers to 10 wins in the postseason, passing Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren for the **most in team history**:

► The 10 postseason wins since 2007 are tied for No. 2 in the NFL with Baltimore and Seattle (New England, 13). The rest of the NFC North has combined for two postseason wins over the last 10 seasons (Minnesota and Chicago).

MIKE McCARTHY...Is in his 12th year as the Packers' 14th head coach.

- ▶ Led the Packers to their eighth consecutive playoff appearance last season, tied for the third-longest streak in NFL history. Has also led the team to nine playoff appearances in the last 10 years (2007, 2009-16).
- ► Ranks second in franchise history in total victories, trailing only Curly Lambeau.
- ► Guided the Packers to top-10 finishes in scoring in eight straight seasons (2007-14), joining the Patriots as the only other team to accomplish the feat over that time; Packers finished first overall in scoring in 2014.
- ► Reached the 100-win plateau faster than any active NFL head coach, needing just 155 games.
- ► Joined Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl title with a win over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.

JOHN HARBAUGH...Is in his 10th year as the Ravens' third head coach.

- ► Has guided the Ravens to a playoff berth in six of his first nine seasons with the club, helping Baltimore win its second Super bowl title following the 2012 season.
- ▶ During Harbaugh's tenure with the Ravens, Baltimore is one of seven teams with at least six playoff berths since 2008.
- ►His 10 playoff victories since 2008 are the second most in the NFL during that span.
- ► Spent his first 10 NFL seasons with Philadelphia (1998-2007). Also coached collegiately at Western Michigan (1984-86), Pittsburgh (1987), Morehead State (1988), Cincinnati (1989-96) and Indiana (1997).

THE PACKERS-RAVENS SERIES

- ► This Sunday will mark just the sixth meeting between the Packers and Ravens, who moved to Baltimore from Cleveland following the 1995 season.
- ► The Packers won a pair of October clashes at Lambeau Field in 1998 and 2001 as well as a MNF contest at Lambeau in December 2009 and a 2013 Week 6 matchup at M&T Bank Stadium. The Ravens' lone win in the series came in a December 2005 meeting in Baltimore on MNF. Sunday's game will be Baltimore's first trip to Lambeau Field since 2009.
- As the NFL's Cleveland Browns, these franchises first met in 1953 and played 15 times, including the 1965 NFL Championship at Lambeau Field, RB Jim Brown's last game. Once the team moved to Baltimore before the 1996 season, the NFL kept the Browns' records and history in a trust until the Cleveland franchise could return as an expansion team in 1999. Officially, the Baltimore Ravens launched their franchise history in 1996.

NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

Packers defensive coordinator Dom Capers coached on the staff of the USFL's Philadelphia/Baltimore Stars from 1984-85...Packers S Jermaine Whitehead spent some time on the Ravens' practice squad in 2015... Baltimore offensive coordinator/QBs coach Marty Mornhinweg was Green Bay's QBs coach during the club's Super Bowl XXXI-winning season...That same year, as his position coach, Mornhinweg helped Brett Favre win the 1996 NFL MVP...Ravens DB/LB Anthony Levine Sr. entered the NFL with the Packers as an undrafted free agent in 2010 and spent time on Green Bay's practice squad in 2010 and 2011... Ravens running backs coach Thomas Hammock began his coaching career as an offensive graduate assistant at Wisconsin from 2003-04... Hammock would come back to Madison from 2011-13 where he served as the Badgers' assistant head coach/recruiting coordinator...Packers defensive line coach Mike Trgovac held the same title at Navy in 1989, where he coached alongside Ravens defensive coordinator Dean Pees... Trgovac coached on the Notre Dame staff with Ravens linebackers coach Don Martindale and Pees once again in 1994...With the Eagles in 1998, Trgovac and Pees coached together at their third different stop, where they joined Ravens head coach John Harbaugh in Philadelphia...Pees and Packers RBs coach Ben Sirmans coached together at Kent State from 2000-03...Additionally, Pees was New England's defensive coordinator in 2008 while Capers was the Patriots' special assistant/secondary coach... Capers was also in New England with Ravens TE Benjamin Watson... GROUP EFFORT

The Packers have a history of relying on many receivers over the years and that has continued.

- ► So far this season, 12 different players have recorded a reception. In Week 10, QB **Brett Hundley** connected with nine different players.
- ► Green Bay is one of four teams in the league to have five or more players with 23-plus catches this season (New England, San Francisco, Washington).
- ►WR Davante Adams leads the Packers with 42 receptions and 494 receiving yards this season and is tied with WR Jordy Nelson for the team lead in receiving touchdowns (six)
- ► For the first time in his career, Adam's registered a receiving touchdown in three consecutive regular-season games (Games 4-6). Adam's totaled five receiving touchdowns over that span.

- ▶ For the second straight season, Nelson had five TD catches through the first four games (2016-17). He joined Don Hutson (1944-45) as the only players in franchise history to have five-plus TD catches in the first four games in back-to-back seasons.
- ▶ QB Aaron Rodgers and Nelson have connected for 65 touchdowns, the most by a duo in team history (Brett Favre and Antonio Freeman, 57).
- ► In 2016, Nelson joined WR Sterling Sharpe as the **only players in team history** to record two seasons with 95-plus catches.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

Green Bay went 7-1 away from Lambeau Field in 2011, with the seven road wins setting a single-season franchise record.

- ►The Packers have been able to stay above the .500 mark on the road during Head Coach **Mike McCarthy's** tenure, a notable achievement in the National Football League.
- ► Since 2006, McCarthy's first season as the head coach in Green Bay, only nine of 32 NFL teams have regular-season road records above .500.

331 AND COUNTING

Another packed house at Lambeau Field against the Detroit Lions in Week 9 brought the stadium's consecutive-sellouts streak to 331 regular-season games (not including replacement games).

- ▶The league's longest-tenured stadium, Lambeau Field is hosting its 61st season of football in 2017. For the victory over Dallas in the Divisional round of the 2014 playoffs, Packers fans set a new Lambeau Field paid-attendance record (79,704).
- ► Across American professional sports, only Boston's Fenway Park (1912) and Chicago's Wrigley Field (1914) have longer tenures.

THE LAMBEAU ADVANTAGE

The crown jewel of the National Football League, Lambeau Field has long been known as one of the tougher venues to play in, particularly during the harsh Wisconsin winter.

- ▶ Re-establishing home-field advantage after a 4-4 mark in 2008 was one of the goals of 2009, and with the Packers finishing 6-2 at home, they accomplished that goal. Green Bay followed that up with a 7-1 mark at Lambeau Field in 2010, a perfect 8-0 record in 2011, the first undefeated home mark since 2002, and a 7-1 mark in 2012. The Packers were one of two teams to finish undefeated at home during the 2014 regular season (Denver).
- ► Head Coach Mike McCarthy stated consistently upon his arrival in Green Bay that one of the team's goals would be to reclaim the mystique of playing at Lambeau Field. Mission accomplished. The team is 68-24-1 (.737) at home in the regular season since 2006, No. 2 in the NFL.
- ► Since Ron Wolf and Mike Holmgren began the revitalization of the franchise in 1992, Green Bay owns the best home record in the NFL. A look at the top regular-season home W-L records since the '92 season:

- ► However, Green Bay has remained among the most successful teams since the advent of free agency in 1993. The Packers have won 10 or more games 15 times since '93 and captured 10 division crowns.

A LOOK AT THE SCHEDULE

The Green Bay Packers' 97th NFL regular-season schedule – highlighted by five prime-time contests (subject to flexible scheduling) – was released April 20 by the National Football League.

- ▶ It will be the first regular season that has the Packers playing home games on a Saturday, Thursday and Monday.
- ► Green Bay's schedule includes six games against 2016 playoff teams. Two of those contests (Detroit, Seattle) are at Lambeau Field, while four (Atlanta, Dallas, Detroit, Pittsburgh) will come on the road. The Packers will play two teams (Atlanta, Dallas) that it played during the 2016 regular and postseason.
- ► For the first time since 2012, the Packers opened the season at home, and will play three of their first four games at Lambeau Field.
- ► In Week 1, Green Bay hosted the Seattle Seahawks, marking the third consecutive regular season that the Packers have played the Seahawks at home. Green Bay improved to 11-3 against the Seahawks at home during the regular and postseason, including eight straight wins.
- ► For the second straight season, the Packers played a prime-time game on the road in Week 2, traveling to Atlanta for an NFC Championship rematch with the Falcons.
- ► Week 3 saw the Cincinnati Bengals play in Green Bay for just the sixth time, and Week 4 had the Packers hosting the Chicago Bears on a Thursday night for the third consecutive season (12th straight year in primetime). The division rivals squared off in a prime-time contest for the 12th straight season.
- ► Green Bay begins October with back-to-back road games. The Packers first traveled to play the Dallas Cowboys, marking the fourth matchup between the two clubs since 2015 (including postseason), and then faced the Vikings in Minnesota in Week 6.
- ►In Week 7, the New Orleans Saints visited Lambeau, it was their latest trip by date to Wisconsin since playing the Packers in Milwaukee on Nov. 17, 1985.
- ► The Packers had a Week 8 bye, the latest bye week for Green Bay since 2014 (Week 9).
- ▶Green Bay hosted the Detroit Lions on Monday Night Football in Week 9, marking the third time the two teams have met on MNF and the first since 1972. Green Bay swept the regular-season series with the Lions last season for the first time since 2012 and for the seventh time under McCarthy.
- ► In Week 10, Green Bay faced the Bears in Chicago, recording a win in the regular season for the seventh consecutive year.
- ►After welcoming the Baltimore Ravens to Lambeau Field in Week 11 for just the fourth time, the Packers will travel to Pittsburgh to play the Steelers in a Sunday night matchup in Week 12.
- ►After stopping back in Green Bay in Week 13 to play Tampa Bay, the Buccaneers' first December trip to Lambeau since 2000, the Packers will begin a stretch of three road games in four weeks with a trip to Cleveland in Week 14. It is the first time since 2009 that Green Bay will finish the regular season with three of the final four games taking place on the road.
- ►The Packers will finish their slate against the NFC South when they play at the Carolina Panthers in Week 15.
- ► For the second consecutive season, Green Bay will host the Vikings on a Saturday in Week 16. The Packers have won their last five regular-season games played on Saturdays.
- ►Green Bay will close out the regular season at Detroit for the second consecutive year, marking the first time it has finished the regular season on the road against the same team in back-to-back seasons since 1991-92 (Minnesota).



BREAKING DOWN THE ROSTER

The Packers currently have an 52-man roster that is composed of 24 offensive players, 25 defensive players and three specialists.

- ▶ Of the 52 players on Green Bay's roster, 33 of them (63.5 percent) were draft picks of the Packers. Dating back to 2007, Green Bay has at least one member of each draft class still on the roster.
- ► Green Bay has 14 players on the roster that began their careers as undrafted free agents, with 11 of those originally signed by Green Bay.
- ► Over a third (36.5 percent) of the players (19 of 52) on Green Bay's roster entered the league as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as an undrafted player.
- ► The Packers have three players on the roster that played in the NFL prior to the 2009 season. All three players were draft picks of the Packers (K Mason Crosby, WR Jordy Nelson and LB Clay Matthews) and two have made at least one Pro Bowl.
- ► Of the 52 players on the roster, 44 began their pro careers with the Packers (84.6 percent).
- ▶ Only 18 of the 52 players on the roster (34.6 percent) were selected in the first three rounds of the draft, with 16 being drafted by the Packers.

WR Jordy Nelson, 10th Year, Kansas State, D2a-08

Became the fourth player in franchise history to reach 500 receptions.

► Has 69 career receiving TDs, No. 2 in Packers history behind Don Hutson (99).

▶ Became the first player in franchise history to record 13-plus receiving touchowns in three different seasons (2011, 2014, 2016). His three seasons of 13-plus TD receptions tie Prò Football Hall of Famers Lance Alworth, Cris Carter and Marvin Harrison for the fourth most in NFL his-

► Missed all of the 2015 season due to a knee injury.

Finished the 2014 regular season ranked fourth in the NFL in receiving yards (1,519), seventh in receptions (98) and tied for second in receiv-

ing touchdowns (13). Earned first selection to the Pro Bowl.

▶ Led the team in 2013 with 85 catches for 1,314 yards and eight TDs. Ranked No. 10 in the NFL that season in receiving yards.

► With 15 TD catches in 2011, became only the third player in franchise history to catch 15 or more TDs in a season, joining WRs Sterling Sharpe (18 in 1994) and Don Hutson (17 in 1942).

LT David Bakhtiari, 5th Year, Colorado, D4a-13 ► Named to first career Pro Bowl in 2016.

► Has started all but six games at LT since the start of the 2013 regular season. Missed Weeks 2-5 this season and the final two games of the 2015 regular season due to injury

► Started all 16 games at left tackle in 2013, the only rookie in the NFL to do so in 2013 and the first Packer rookie to do so since the league went

to a 16-game schedule in 1978.

▶ Became just the fourth Green Bay rookie to start at LT in the season opener since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger and the first since 1985.

LG Lane Taylor, 5th Year, Oklahoma State, FA-13

► Has played in 55 regular-season games for Green Bay with all but two of his 26 starts (LT in Week 4-5 this season) taking place at LG.

- ► Made the first starts of his career in 2015, opening at RG at Detroit in Week 13 in place of an injured T.J. Lang and at LG in Week 17 vs. Minnesota with Josh Sitton sliding to LT in place of an injured David
- ► A four-year letterman at OSU, starting 47 of 50 games played at right guard. Unanimous first-team All-Big 12 selection by the conference's coaches as a senior.

- C Corey Linsley, 4th Year, Ohio State, D5a-14

 ► Has started every game at C since Week 9 of 2016. Was on reserve/ physically unable to perform for the entire preseason and the first seven regular-season games last season.
- ► Started 29 games and four postseason contests in his first two seasons. First rookie center to start for Green Bay in Week 1 since the merger.
- ► Was the first rookie center to start every game for the Packers since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.
- Named to PFWA's All-Rookie team, the first Green Bay center to be honored since its inception in 1974.

RG Jahri Evans, 12th Year, Bloomsburg, UFA (NO)-17

► Selected to six Pro Bowls (2009-14) and has been named first-team All-Pro by *The Associated Press* four times (2009-12).

► Has started all 178 games he has played in since entering the league in 2006, the most games played by an active NFL offensive lineman over

Started all 16 games in nine of his 11 seasons in New Orleans (2006-

16), missing just seven contests due to injury.

► Helped the Saints finish in the top six in the NFL in total offense in all 11 of his seasons in New Orleans (2006-16), including six No. 1 rankings (2006, 2008-09, 2011, 2014, 2016).

Entered the NFL with New Orleans in 2006 as a fourth-round pick (No. 108 overall) out of Bloomsburg (Pa.) University, where he was a finalist for the Gene Upshaw Player of the Year Award in both of his final two seasons.

RT Justin McCray, 1st Year, Central Florida, FA-17

- ► Has seen action in all nine games with five starts (three at RT, two at LG).
- ► Signed by Green Bay as a free agent this past offseason.
- ▶ Played for the Orlando Predators of the Arena Football League in 2016.

Spent the 2015 season out of football.

- Entered the league as an undrafted free agent with the Tennessee Titans in 2014 and spent that season on Tennessee's practice squad.

 Appeared in 45 games with 32 starts in four seasons at Central Florida
- (2010-13), with 23 of the starts coming at RG.
- Twin brother, Jordan, spent time on the Packers' practice squad in 2014.

TE Lance Kendricks, 7th Year, Wisconsin, FA-17

► Has started three of nine games played this season

► Scored on a 1-yard reception in the first quarter of the Week 3 win over Cincinnati, his first TD catch as a Packer. He also recorded a 51-yard reception against the Bengals, the second-longest catch of his career (80 yards at Tampa Bay, Dec. 23, 2012).

► In 2016, set career highs in starts (16) and receptions (50).

- Originally drafted by the Rams in the second round, and in six seasons posted 17 touchdown receptions, the second most by a tight end in franchise history behind only Damone Johnson (18, 1986-92)
- ▶ Played at the University of Wisconsin, starting 20 games and registering 78 receptions for 1,160 yards (14.9 avg.) and eight touchdowns.
- ► A native of Milwaukee, Wis., he attended Rufus King High School in Milwaukee and earned all-state honors as a senior in 2005.

WR Randall Cobb, 6th Year, Kentucky, D2-11

- ▶ Despite missing a game, ranks No. 2 on the team with 36 receptions this season.
- ▶Led the team with a 13.5-yard punt-return average in 2016.
- ▶Posted the 12th 100-yard receiving game of his career in Week 4 (108 on nine receptions) and tied his single-game high for receptions (11 for 95 yards and a TD) in Week 7 last season.
- ►Led the team in receptions (79), was No. 2 in receiving yards (829) and was No. 3 in touchdown receptions (six) in 2015.
- ►Set a new single-season career high with five 100-yard receiving games during the 2014 season (three-2012). Earned first trip to the Pro Bowl.
- ►His career-best 91 receptions in 2014 are the eighth most in team his-
- ▶ Finished the regular season tied for fourth in the NFL with 12 touchdown receptions in 2014.
- ► Set a franchise single-season record with a league-high 2,342 combined net yards in 2012, topping the previous team mark of 2,250 yards by RB Ahman Green in 2003.

QB Brett Hundley, 3rd Year, UCLA, D5-15

► Made first career start in Week 7 vs. New Orleans.

- ▶Finished No. 7 in the NFL this past preseason with a passer rating of 88.8 after completing 48 of 76 passes for 482 yards (No. 6 in the NFL) with three touchdowns and an interception.
- Served as the No. 3 quarterback in 2015 and the No. 2 quarterback in
- ► Ranked No. 2 in the NFL with 630 passing yards in the 2015 preseason, completing 45 of 65 passes (69.2 percent) for seven TDs with one INT for a passer rating of 129.6 (No. 3 in the NFL).

► Finished career at UCLA ranked No. 1 in school history in passing TDs (75), total offense (11,713 yards) and completions (837) despite playing just three seasons for the Bruins.

► Ranked No. 2 in school annals in passing yards (9,966), 300-yard passing games (10), rushing yards by a QB (1,747) and rushing TDs by a QB (30).

RB Ty Montgomery, 2nd Year, Stanford, D3-15

►After being converted from wide receiver to running back during the 2016 season, has started 11 games at RB, including five games this season. Missed Week 5 due to injury.

►In Week 15 at Chicago (2016), rushed for 162 yards on 16 carries and two touchdowns. His 162 yards were the most by a Packers player in a single game since Dec. 11, 2005 (Samkon Gado, 171 yards on 29 carries, 5.9 avg.). Dating back to 1960, his 10.13 yards-per-carry average was the third highest (min. 15 carries) by a Green Bay player.

►Played in six games with three starts as a rookie in 2015 before an ankle injury sustained in Week 6 sidelined him for the remainder of the season.

►Posted 5,190 all-purpose yards at Stanford (334 rushing, 2,125 receiving, 238 PR, 2,493 KOR), the fourth most in school history at the time.

FB Aaron Ripkowski, 2nd Year, Oklahoma, D6a-15

► Has played in 40 career games with eight starts.

- ► Scored his first career rushing touchdown in Week 12 (2016) and followed it up with one in Week 13.
- ► Led the team and set career highs in Week 17 (2016) at Detroit with 61 rushing yards on nine carries (6.8 avg.)
- ► Played in 15 games as a rookie, seeing action primarily on special teams. Was tied for No. 4 on the team with nine special teams tackles.

▶ Posted sacks in back-to-back games in 2016, recording one in Week 13

▶ Played in 48 games with 33 starts for Northwestern and registered 134 tackles (83 solo), 311/2 tackles for a loss, 121/2 sacks, three interceptions (one returned for a TD), 21 passes defensed, three fumble recoveries and three forced fumbles.

Second on the team with 46 tackles this season.

▶ Finished the 2016 regular season ranked No. 3 on the GB defensive line in tackles (33)

▶ Became the youngest player to appear in a season opener for the Packers since Arnie Herber (20 years old) in 1930.

► Earned third-team All-America honors from The Associated Press and first-team All-Pacific-12 recognition from the coaches and media as a junior in 2015.

DT Mike Daniels, 6th Year, Iowa, D4a-12

Leads Packers defensive linemen with 22.5 sacks since the start of the 2013 regular season.

▶ Led the defensive line in both tackles and sacks in 2014 and 2015.

- ▶ Returned a fumble 43 yards for a TD vs. Detroit in Week 14 of 2012, the longest fumble return for a TD by a rookie in franchise history.
- ► Starred as an interior pass rusher at lowa, posting a team-high 24.5 tackles for a loss and 13 sacks from 2010-11.

LOLB Clay Matthews, 9th Year, Southern California, D1b-09

► With 75.0 career sacks, passed Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila (74.5) for the most sacks in Packers history.

▶ Despite injuries forcing him to miss four games and limiting him in six others, finished No. 3 on the team with five sacks in 2016.

For the first time in his career, recorded at least one sack in each of the

first three regular-season games he played in (2016). ► Selected to his sixth Pro Bowl and first as an inside linebacker in 2015

after recording 6.5 sacks (second on the team), 15 QB hits (No. 1 on the team) and a career-high 85 tackles (No. 2 on the team).

► With a team-high 11.0 sacks in 2014, is tied for the most 10-plus sack seasons in franchise history (four).

▶ Is the only player in franchise history to score a defensive TD (interception or fumble return) in each of his first three seasons in the NFL (2009-11).

ILB Jake Ryan, 3rd Year, Michigan, D4-15

► Ranks No. 5 on the team with 39 tackles this season.

- Finished No. 2 on the team with 84 tackles during the 2016 regular
- ► Started the final five games of the regular season and both playoff contests in 2015.

► Recorded a team-best nine tackles (eight solo) and one fumble recovery

in Week 13 (2015) at Detroit in his first pro start.

- ► Served as a team captain for his final two seasons at Michigan and was a three-time winner (2012-14) of the Roger Zatkoff Award, given to the Wolverines top linebacker. He was the only player to win the award (est. 1991) three times.
- ► Started 41 of 46 games played in college, appearing at inside linebacker as a senior after spending his first three seasons at outside linebacker and defensive end.

ILB Blake Martinez, 2nd Year, Stanford, D4a-16

▶ Ranks No. 1 on the Packers with 87 total tackles this season.

- ► Has registered 12-plus tackles in five games this season (12 vs. Cincinnati, 13 at Dallas, 14 at Minnesota, 15 vs. New Orleans, 12 vs. Detroit).
- ► Started nine of 13 games he played in 2016 during the regular season, missing Weeks 12-14 due to injury. Became the first rookie to start on defense for Green Bay in Week 1 since LB Nick Perry in 2012.

► Finished collegiate career with 257 tackles (137 solo), 13.5 tackles for a loss, 6.5 sacks, five interceptions and five forced fumbles in 51 games played.

Started all 27 games played in his final two seasons, leading the team in tackles as a junior (102) and senior (141).
 Led the Pacific-12 and ranked No. 7 nationally with 141 tackles (75 solo) as a senior, averaging a conference-best 10.1 tackles per game.

ROLB Nick Perry, 6th Year, Southern California, D1-12

Leads the team with 7.0 sacks this season. Registered a career-high three sacks against the Chicago Bears in Week 10. It was the first time a Packers player had three-plus sacks in a game since LB A.J. Hawk (three) on Oct. 13, 2013, at Baltimore.

Led the team with a career-high 11.0 sacks in 2016.

Registered mulitple sacks in each of his first five seasons in the NFL and

has posted a two-sack game in each of the last four seasons (2013-16).

Has totaled seven sacks in eight playoff games, including 3.5 in the 2015 postseason, which tied Clay Matthews (2010) for the franchise record in a single posteason.

► His seven postseason sacks rank No. 3 in franchise history (since 1982)

behind Matthews (11) and Reggie White (eight).

LCB Davon House, 7th Year, New Mexico State, FA-17

▶ Registered the third sack of his career in Week 10 at Chicago. Also recorded a career-high nine tackles (eight solo) for the second straight week (Week 9 vs. Detroit).

▶ Rejoined the Packers after spending the 2015-16 seasons with the Jacksonville Jaguars, starting 19 of 32 games played.

▶ In 2015, his first season in Jacksonville, set career highs in starts (15), tackles (60), solo tackles (49), passes defensed (23, franchise single-season record) and interceptions (four).

► Despite missing three regular-season games with a shoulder injury in 2014, his 11 passes defensed tied for No. 4 on the Packers.

► After seeing action in two games as a rookie (2011), appeared in 25 games for Green Bay between 2012-13, starting five games in each season.

■ Was the first player to be drafted by the Packers out of New Mexico State in franchise history, and was the first Aggie drafted since S Siddeeq Shabazz (Oakland, seventh round) in 2003.

RCB Damarious Randall, 3rd Year, Arizona State, D1-15

► Leads the team and is tied for No. 4 in the NFL with three interceptions this season.

► Tied for No. 4 in the NFL with two interceptions returned for touchdowns since 2015.

► Was second on the team with three interceptions in 2016 despite miss-

ing six games due to injury.

▶ Played in 15 games with nine starts (six at LCB, two at RCB, one in the slot) in 2015 and tied for the team lead and No. 2 among NFL rookies with three interceptions, including one he returned for a TD. Finished with a team-best 16 passes defensed.

Named the NFL's Defensive Rookie of the Month for November 2015, joining CB Casey Hayward (October 2012) as the only Green Bay defen-

sive backs to win the award.

► Earned first-team All-Pacific-12 honors at safety as a senior in 2014 after he led the Sun Devils in tackles (106) and passes defensed (12) and tied for the team lead with three interceptions.

SS Morgan Burnett, 8th Year, Georgia Tech, D3-10

► Tied for No. 1 among NFL safeties with a career-best three sacks last season. Finished No. 1 on the team in tackles (92).

►Missed five games due to injury in 2015, but finished No. 4 on the team with 54 solo tackles.

▶Totaled a team-high 125 tackles in 2014, the second most of his career (137 in 2012). Ranked No. 2 on the team with 106 tackles (77 solo) in 2013, despite missing the first three games due to injury. Recovered three fumbles, including one for a TD, and added nine passes defensed. ▶ Participated in all 1,088 plays for Green Bay's defense in 2012, one of only four non-OL in the NFL to appear in 100 percent of his team's snaps.

FS Ha Ha Clinton-Dix, 4th Year, Alabama, D1-14

▶ Ranks No. 3 on the team with 45 tackles this season.

▶ Named to his first career Pro Bowl in 2016. His career-best five interceptions tied for No. 5 in the NFL last season and tied for No. 1 among safeties. It was the most interceptions by a Packers safety in a single season since Charles Woodson (seven) and Charlie Peprah (five) in 2011.

►In 2016, posted a career-high two interceptions in both Week 9 and Week 14, becoming the first Packer to have two two-INT games in a season since Woodson in 2011.

► Led the team in tackles in 2015 with 117 (97 solo) and was tied for fourth on the team in interceptions (two). According to STATS, his three sacks during the 2015 regular season tied

for the fifth most in a single regular season by a Packers safety (since 1982) and the most since Mark Roman recorded 3.5 in 2004.

Started every game in 2015 after starting 10 of 16 games as a rookie

when he finished second on the team in tackles (95).

A marquee season opener between two NFC heavyweights turned into a defensive slugfest, with Daniels landing the momentum-swinging punch. No talk about double moves or stunts. Daniels said he just flat-out beat glard Luke Joeckel to wreak havor in the backfield.

Packers QIB Aaron Rodgers was 28 of 42 for 311 yards and added a 32-yard tourchlown pass to Jordy Nelson to make it an eight-point game late in the third quarter. Rodgers went deep to his favorite receiver on a free play that was extended after Seattle was flagged for having too many

men on the field

But the Green Bay defense fueled the victory.

Seattle managed just three field goals. Wilson was held to 14 of 27 for 158 yards. The Packers held decisive edges in total yardage (370-225) and first downs (26-12). Green Bay held the ball for 39 minutes.

Rodgers' regular-season streak of passes without an interception ended at a career-high 251. The Seahawks' defense, reinforced by the return of safety Earl Thomas, bottled up receivers from making many big plays and put plenty of pressure on Rodgers.

GREEN BAY, Wis. (AP) — Aaron Rodgers burned another defense deep with a free play. The Cincinnati Bengals found their offense and a new

Mason Crosby kicked a 27-yard field goal with 6:26 left in overtime set up by Rodgers' 72-yard pass to Geronimo Allison, and the Green Bay Packers railled to beat Cincinnati, 27-24, on Sunday, Crosby's kick completed the Packers conneback from a 21-7 halftime deficit.

On third-and-10 from the Packers 21, Rodgers took advantage of yet another free play after defensive end Michael Johnson was whistled for offside. Officials let the play continue and the two-time NFL MVP found Allison on about a 40-yard pass before the receiver beat a couple defenders

for more yards.

Crosby, a veteran kicker, finished it off for the Packers (2-1).

The winless Bengals (0-3) won the toss in overline but went three-and-out on their opening drive. It was so loud at Lambeau Field that they had to call timeout before their first overline snap. Rodgers thrived under the pressure.

He connected with Jordy Nelson for a 3-yard foucidown pass with 17 seconds left in regulation to tie the game at 24. Bengals cornerback Dre

Kilpatrick narrowly missed batting away the bullet thrown by the quarterback into the front right corner of the end zone.

Rodgers finished 28 of 42 for 313 yards with three touchdowns and one interception. Allison had six catches for 122 yards.

The Packers filipped the script after the Bengals controlled the first half.

A.J. Green caught a 10-yard scoring pass on the game's opening drive for Cincinnati's first touchdown after two frustrating weeks for the offense. Bill Lazor made his debut as offensive coordinator for the fired Ken Zampese.

Andy Dalton was 21 of 27 for 212 yards and two scores. The Bengals were desperate to avoid their first 0-3 start since 2008. But they couldn't finish the Packers off in the second half.

Green Bay's defense generated a little more pressure on Dalton in the second half, and rookie safety Josh Jones gave the injury-laden defense

Rodgers shook off his early struggles to guide the Packers to another win. He was sacked six times, mostly against just the Bengals' four-man rush, though the protection shored up after halftime.

Rodgers threw just his second career pick-six — and his first at home — when William Jackson returned an interception 75 yards for a toucha boost with two sacks and 12 tackles.

DALLAS (AP) Aaron Rodgers had more magic in store for the Dallas Cowboys, who can't seem to find the mojo that carried them a year

Rodgers threw a 12-yard touchdown pass to Davante Adams with 11 seconds remaining. Rodgers capped a 75-yard drive in just 1:02, lifting the Packers over Dallas 35-31 on Sunday in another thriller nine months after their divisional playoff win on the same field.

Adams had been in the concussion protocol but was active 10 days after leaving the field on a stretcher on a helmet-to-helmet hit that resulted in a suspension for Chicago linebacker Danny Trevathan. He had seven catches for 66 yards and two touchdowns.

Dak Prescott, who had touchdown passes on Dallas' first three drives, put the Cowboys in front on an 11-yard touchdown run with 1:13 remaining to cap a 17-play drive that lasted almost nine minutes.

But another defensive letdown, just like a year ago in the postseason, left Dallas (2-3) already with the same number of losses from the magical rookie season when Prescott and running back Ezeklel Elliott led the Cowboys to the No. 1 seed in the NFC.

The Packers (4-1) had gone ahead earlier on Damarius Randall's 21-yard interception return for a touchdown, the third of five lead changes in

GREEN BAY – Matthew Stafford passed for 361 yards and two touchdowns to Marvin Jones, and the Lions snapped a three-game losing streak with a 30-17 win on Monday right over the Green Bay Packers. Stafford was 26 of 33, including 12 of 14 in the first half with a 25-yard touchdown pass to Jones. Amere Abdullah anded a 4-yard touchdown run for Detroit (4-4). Green Bay (4-4) finally got in the end zone on Brett Hundley's 1-yard quarterback sneak with 9:52 left.

The Lions answered with Stafford's 11-yard touchdown pass to Jones with 8:06 remaining, putting the game out of reach with a 17-point lead. Jones had seven catches for 107 yards.

The Packers have lost three straight games. Their once-potent offense has struggled since Aaron Rodgers broke his right collarbone on Oct. 15 at Minnesota. Hundley finished 26 of 38 for 245 yards. Cornerback Darius Slay blanketed Jordy Nelson when the Packers did try to throw long while

the game was still competitive.

Abdullan fumbled the ball away in the third quarter, but the Packers went three-and-out on the ensuing drive. Familiar problems in the red zone Abdullan fumbled the ball away in the third quarter, but the Packers 1, forceing them to settle for a field goal for a 17-point lead with 12-25 left.

The first scoring strike to Jones was the 200th touchdown pass in 117 career games for Stafford, the sixth quickest in NFL history to reach the milestone. Stafford, who turns 30 in February, is also fourth in NFL history for career touchdown passes before age 30 behind Dan Marino, Peyton Manning and Brett Favre.

Special teams didn't help the Packers. Working in their third long snapper of the season because of injuries, Green Bay had a 38-yard field goal blocked in the first quarter on a play that started with a low snap. Trevor Davis didn't get past the 22 on three kickoff returns in the first half.

WR Golden Tate Joined Jones over the 100-yard mark with seven receptions for 113 yards. Abdullah had 21 carries for 48 yards.

The Packers' playmaking receivers did have more opportunities, though most came on short passess. Randall cobb finished with 58 yards on five receptions, including a catch-and-run for a 46-yard gain that set up Hundley's TD run. Davante Adams had seven catches for 53 yards.

17 Davante Adams, WR, 4th Year, Fresno State

- Posted career highs for receptions (75), receiving yards (997) and receiving TDs (12) last season, finishing tied for No. 2 in the NFL in TD catches behind teammate Jordy Nelson (14).
- Registered at least one TD catch in nine games last season, tied for No. 2 in the league behind Nelson (11), and recorded a career-high four 100-yard receiving games and a career-best 10 catches of 25-plus yards.
- Had 13 catches in Week 7 vs. Chicago and 12 receptions in Week 8 at Atlanta last season, becoming the first player in team history to register 12-plus catches in back-to-back games.
- Posted 163 receptions from 2014-16, the fourth most in franchise history by a player in his first three NFL seasons behind WRs Sterling Sharpe (212), Greg Jennings (178) and James Lofton (171).

- In 2013, became the first rookie to start every game at LT for Green Bay since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.
- **2017 SEASON:** Has started at LT in the five games he has appeared in this season...Has helped the offense rank No. 3 in red-zone scoring (69.0 percent), tied for No. 9 in first downs per game (20.3), No. 6 in yards per carry (4.50) and tied for No. 5 in rushing TDs (nine).

- Played in 133 regular-season games with 99 starts from 2006-16, registering 493 tackles (345 solo), 53.5 sacks, 12 forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries, 30 passes defensed and three interceptions, one of which he returned for a touchdown.
- Originally entered the NFL with Cincinnati after being selected in the third round of the 2006 NFL Supplemental Draft by the Bengals.
- **2017 SEASON:** Has played in five games with two starts and has registered five tackles (four solo), a sack, two tackles for a loss, a pass defensed, five QB pressures and three QB hits.

- Opened all 12 games he appeared in at RT in 2015, blocking for RBs Eddie Lacy (758) and James Starks (601), the first Green Bay duo since 1985 to both rush for 600-plus yards in the same season.
- Started 15 contests in 2014, helping the offense rank No. 1 in the league in scoring (30.4 ppg) and No. 9 in the NFL in sacks allowed with 30, the fewest given up by Green Bay in a season since '07.
- Opened the final 12 games of 2010 and the entire postseason at RT after taking over for injured veteran Mark Tauscher (shoulder), the most regular-season starts by a Packers rookie tackle since Tauscher's 14 in 2000, and was named to the *Pro Football Weekly*/PFWA All-Rookie team.

12 Aaron Rodgers, QB, 13th Year, California

- Ranks No. 1 in NFL history (min. 1,500 attempts) in career passer rating (104.1), interception percentage (1.55) and TD/INT ratio (4.13, 310/75).
- Has posted six seasons (2009, 2011-12, 2014-16) with 500-plus passing attempts and eight or fewer INTs, the most in NFL history ahead of Patriots QB Tom Brady (three) and nine QBs (one).
- Has been named the NFL's Most Valuable Player by *The Associated Press* twice in his career (2011, 2014), one of only eight players in league history

to win the award multiple times.

- Is the only quarterback in league history to record a 100-plus passer rating in six consecutive seasons (2009-14), with no other QB doing so in more than four straight seasons. Has posted a 100-plus rating in seven seasons (2009-14, 2016), the most in NFL annals.
- Is one of only four QBs in NFL annals with 35,000-plus passing yards and 2,500-plus rushing yards (Fran Tarkenton, John Elway, Donovan McNabb).
- Is the lone QB in NFL history to throw 40-plus TD passes with seven or fewer INTs in a season, having done it twice in his career (45/6 in 2011, 40/7 in 2016).
- In 141 career regular-season starts (since 2008), has posted 52 games with 300-plus passing yards (No. 3 in the NFL over that span), 82 without an interception (No. 1, min. 15 attempts) and 78 with a 100-plus passer rating (No. 2).
- Has been selected to the Pro Bowl in six of the last eight seasons (2009, 2011-12, 2014-16).
- In the franchise record books, holds seven of the top eight single-season marks for passer rating (2009-14, 2016), four of the top six for passing TDs (2011-12, 2014, 2016), six of the top seven for completion percentage (2010-14, 2016) and four of the top six for passing yards (2009, 2011, 2014, 2016).
- **2017 SEASON:** Has completed 128 of 193 passes (66.7 percent) for 1,385 yards and 13 TDs with three INTs for a 103.2 passer rating... Through Week 6, was tied for No. 2 in the league in TD passes and ranked No. 2 in TD percentage (6.7)...Has posted a 120.4 passer rating in the second half/OT, connecting on 73 of 106 passes (68.9 percent) for nine TDs and no INTs...Has added 83 rushing yards on 18 carries (4.6 avg.)... Was placed on injured reserve on Oct. 20 (collarbone).
- ▶Vs. Seattle (Sept. 10): Threw for 311 yards and a TD with one INT on 28-of-42 passing for an 86.5 rating...It marked his fifth 300-yard passing game in his last seven home openers...Dating back to last season, it also marked his third straight 300-yard passing effort, which is tied for the second-longest streak in team history behind his own streak of four games in 2011...Was his 50th career 300-yard passing game, second in franchise history to only Brett Favre (55)...Late in the third quarter, found WR Jordy Nelson for a 32-yard TD pass down the middle of the field on a free play for the Packers (12 men on the field for Seattle)...Completed 6 of 9 passes on third down for 109 yards and a TD for a 145.1 passer rating...Added 21 rushing yards on seven carries (3.0 avg.)...Saw his streak of consecutive attempts without an INT end at 251, the second-longest streak in franchise history behind only QB Bart Starr (294, 1964-65).
- ▶At Atlanta (Sept. 17): Connected on 33 of 50 passes for 343 yards and two TDs with one INT for a 90.7 passer rating...Threw his 300th career TD pass, a 1-yard left-handed shovel pass to RB Ty Montgomery in the fourth quarter, to become the fastest to 300 TD passes in league history by doing so on his 4,742nd career attempt (Peyton Manning, 5,306 attempts) and in his 144th career game (Manning and Dan Marino, 157 games)... Also set the NFL mark for the fewest career INTs at the time of his 300th TD pass with 74, easily besting the previous mark of 115 INTs by Brady... - ▶Vs. Cincinnati (Sept. 24): Posted his fifth consecutive 300-yard passing game, a franchise record as he surpassed his own mark of four straight games in 2011...Connected on 28 of 42 passes for 313 yards and three TDs with one INT for a 102.6 rating...Has now posted 300-plus passing yards in each of the first three games of the season for the first time in his career...It marked his fifth straight game with 27-plus completions, a franchise record as he bested Favre's mark of four straight in 2007 (Weeks 2-5)...Posted a 122.5 passer rating in the second half/OT, completing 19 of 27 passes for 240 yards and two TDs with no INTs...Posted his first career win against the Bengals, giving him a victory against all 31 other teams in the league...His first TD pass came on the opening drive, a 1-yard throw

- to a wide-open TE Lance Kendricks off a play-action fake...Threw two TD passes to WR Jordy Nelson, with the second one capping off a 12-play, 75-yard drive that tied the game at 24 and sent it to overtime...Completed nine passes on the game-tying drive, rolling out to his right on the TD to Nelson as he completed the pass near the pylon just past the outstretched arms of CB Dre Kirkpatrick...On the offense's opening drive in overtime, drew DE Michael Johnson offside on third down, giving the Packers a free play as he found WR Geronimo Allison down the sideline near the Cincinnati 45 before Allison cut it back and took it down the field for a 72-yard gain to the 7-yard line to set up K Mason Crosby's game-winning 27-yard FG two plays later...Added 23 rushing yards on four attempts (5.8 avg.).
- ▶Vs. Chicago (Sept. 28): Threw four TD passes with no INTs on 18-of-26 passing for 179 yards and a 128.0 passer rating...It marked his fourth career game against the Bears with four-plus TD passes and zero INTs, one of two opponents he has done that against (Minnesota, four games)... Found Adams for a 5-vard score on the Packers' opening drive and then connected with WR Randall Cobb for a 2-vard TD less than a minute later after a Green Bay takeaway...His final two TD passes came to Nelson, a 4-yarder late in the third quarter and then an 8-yard TD early in the fourth. ▶At Dallas (Oct. 8): Threw for 221 yards and three TDs on 19-of-29 passing (65.5 percent), his third straight game with three-plus TD passes... 82 Richard Rodgers, TE, 4th Year, California

- Is one of only two tight ends in franchise history (Bubba Franks) to register 20-plus catches in each of his first three seasons in the NFL.
- Has not missed a game in his NFL career, appearing in all 48 regularseason games and seven postseason contests since joining the Packers in 2014.
- Had 58 receptions in 2015, becoming just the fourth TE in team history to record 55-plus receptions in a season (Paul Coffman, Jermichael Finley, Jackie Harris).
- Was one of only four TEs in the league in '15 to register 55-plus catches, 500-plus receiving yards and eight or more TD receptions (Rob Gronkowski, Jordan Reed, Gary Barnidge).
- **2017 SEASON:** Has played in all nine games and has five catches for 51 yards (10.2 avg.).
- ►Vs. Seattle (Sept. 10): Appeared on five plays on offense and three on special teams.
- ►At Atlanta (Sept. 17): Played 10 snaps on offense, recording two catches for 22 yards (11.0 avg.)...On Green Bay's opening possession, came out of the backfield and across the field to catch a short pass from QB Aaron Rodgers and pick up 14 yards on third-and-7.
