

#### PACKERS FACE FIRST ROAD TEST AT WASHINGTON

The Green Bay Packers go on the road to face the Redskins, marking Green Bay's first September visit to Washington. It is the first time since 2012 that Green Bay's road opener has come in Week 3.



- Including the postseason, it is the third game between the two in the last four seasons, with all three taking place at Washington.
- The Packers have won five of the last seven regular-season contests between the two clubs.
- Green Bay is 18-14-1 (.563) against Washington during the regular season.
- While the Redskins have won the past two regular-season home games against the Packers, Green Bay won the 2015 NFC Wild Card contest at Washington, 35-18.
- Including the postseason, the Packers and Redskins have combined for 50-plus points in each of the last three matchups, with the winning team scoring 35-plus points.
- It is the fifth time Green Bay and Washington have played in the month of September (1933, 1950, 2001, 2013), but this will be the first time the Packers are the road team.
- Green Bay holds a 3-0-1 record in September against Washington.
- Including the postseason, the Packers are 2-2 against the Redskins with Aaron Rodgers as the starting quarterback. He has thrown a total of 10 TDs and one interception against Washington while finishing with a passer rating above 90.0 three times (146.0, 115.0, 93.5).
- Green Bay is opening the season with three NFC opponents for the first time since 2012.
- ► If the Packers win on Sunday, they will open up without a loss through the first three games of the season for the 22nd time since 1919 and just the eighth time since 1970. Out of the previous 21 times, Green Bay held a record of 2-0-1 after three games just four times (1967, 1943, 1932, 1920).
- Green Bay will return to Lambeau Field to play the Buffalo Bills on Sunday, Sept. 30, at 12 p.m. CDT.

#### **AGAINST THE NFC EAST**

- Including the postseason, Green Bay has won four consecutive games against NFC East teams and 10 of the last 12.
- ► Under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**, the Packers are 20-11 against teams from the NFC East in the regular and postseason, a .645 winning percentage that ranks No. 1 in the NFC and No. 3 in the NFL since 2006 (San Diego/Los Angeles Chargers, 10-2, .833 pct.; New England Patriots, 10-5, .667 pct.).
- Including the postseason, QB Aaron Rodgers has thrown 52 TDs, 10 INTs and ranks No. 3 among active QBs with a passer rating of 103.9 against NFC East teams since 2008 (min. 300 pass att.)

#### WITH THE CALL

FOX Sports, now in its 25th season as an NFL network television partner, will broadcast the game.



**REGULAR-SEASON WEEK 3** 

- Play-by-play man Kevin Burkhardt joins analyst Charles Davis and sideline reporter Pam Oliver.
- Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since November 1929, heads up the Packers Radio Network that is made up of 50 stations in four states. Wayne Larrivee (play-by-play) and two-time Packers Pro Bowler Larry McCarren (analyst) call the action. McCarren first joined the team's broadcasts in 1995 and enters his 24th season calling Packers games. After originally being paired together in 1999, McCarren and Larrivee enter their 20th season of broadcasts together. In Week 1, they surpassed Jim Irwin and Max McGee for the most regular-season and postseason games broadcast for the Packers.
- Compass Media Networks will air the game on radio across the country. Chris Carrino (play-by-play) and Brian Baldinger (analyst) will call the action with Jon Rothstein handling the pregame, halftime and postgame duties.
- The broadcast is also available on Sirius Satellite Radio (WTMJ feed).
- DIRECTV subscribers can watch the game on Channel 714.

# **PACKERS AT REDSKINS - WEEK 3**

#### SEPTEMBER STARTS

Under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**, Green Bay has been one of the most successful teams in the league early in the season.

- The Packers are 11-0-1 in their last 12 games at Lambeau Field in the month of September. In those 12 games, QB Aaron Rodgers has recorded a 100-plus passer rating nine times while throwing for threeplus touchdowns eight times.
- Overall, Green Bay has a 9-2-1 record in its last 12 games in the month of September.
- The Packers opened the 2016 season with a 27-23 victory at Jacksonville. It was Green Bay's 55th win in a road opener, further extending the top mark in NFL history. Green Bay concluded its 2016 September schedule with a 2-1 record. Last season, the Packers went 3-1 in the season's opening month.
- ▶ In 2015, Green Bay went 3-0 in September, marking the third time under McCarthy that the Packers finished the month undefeated (4-0 in 2007 and 3-0 in 2011).
- Since McCarthy took over in 2006, the Packers have a 28-14-1 (.667) mark in the month of September, ranking in the top five of the NFL in both wins and winning percentage:

► In the month of September under McCarthy (2006-18), the Packers rank at or near the top of the NFL in the following categories:

- Turnover differential (2nd, plus-22)
- Points per game (3rd, 26.3)
- Defensive interceptions (t-2nd, 49)
- Point differential (5th, plus-161)
- Net passing yards (5th, 10,965)

In 2015, Rodgers recorded a passer rating of 135.4 in the month of September. Dating back to 1970, it ranks No. 5 among NFL quarterbacks in the month of September (min. 65 pass attempts), according to SportRadar.

► Since 2008, Rodgers is one of four active quarterbacks in the NFL with a passer rating of 100-plus in the month of September (min. 150 att.).

So far this September, Rodgers ranks No. 5 in the NFL in passer rating and is one of five quarterbacks to not throw an interception this season (min. 20 pass att.).

Dating back to 2016, WR Davante Adams has six receiving TDs in the month of September, tied for No. 4 in the league over that time span.

#### IN THE CONFERENCE

The Packers have established themselves as one of the best teams in the NFC.

- ► Green Bay has 201 wins against the NFC since 1992, the most in the league over that time span (Philadelphia / Dallas, 178).
- ► Green Bay's 30 regular-season wins against NFC opponents since 2014 are tied for No. 1 in the NFL (five other teams).
- Under Head Coach Mike McCarthy, Green Bay tallied a winning record against NFC opponents in 10 of his first 12 seasons (2006-17):

- Dating back to 2008, QB Aaron Rodgers has a passer rating of 106.2 against NFC teams, ranking No. 1 in the NFL over that span.
- ► Since entering the NFL in 2014, WR **Davante Adams** has 23 receiving TDs against NFC teams, **No. 4 in the NFL**.
- While LB Clay Matthews not only passed DE Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila for the franchise sack record last season, his 59 career sacks against NFC teams eclipsed Gbaja-Biamila (56.5) for the most by a Green Bay player since 1982. It also ranks No. 2 in the NFL among active players vs. NFC teams since 2009 (Julius Peppers, 63.0).

### **BREAKING DOWN THE ROSTER**

The Packers have a 53-man roster that is composed of 25 offensive players, 25 defensive players and three specialists.

- Of the 53 players on Green Bay's roster, 30 of them (56.6 percent) were draft picks of the Packers. Green Bay has nine players that were drafted in the first round, including seven that were selected by the Packers.
- Green Bay has 38 players on the roster that were draft picks (71.7 percent), including 22 players that were selected in the first three rounds (41.5 percent).
- Over a third of the players (19 of 53, 35.8 percent) on Green Bay's roster entered the league as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as an undrafted player.
- ► Of the 53 players on the roster, 41 of them (77.4 percent) are 28 years old or younger (as of Sept. 23) and 27 players (50.9 percent) are 24 years old or younger.
- The Packers have 11 players that have made at least one Pro Bowl, with seven of those players being draft picks of Green Bay (Davante Adams, David Bakhtiari, Ha Ha Clinton-Dix, Randall Cobb, Mike Daniels, Clay Matthews, Aaron Rodgers).
- ► Of the 53 players on the roster, 39 began their pro careers with the Packers (73.6 percent).
- ► Over half the roster consists of rookie or first-year players (33 of 53, 62.3 percent).

# **PACKERS AT REDSKINS - WEEK 3**

#### AT THE HELM

Having led Green Bay to the playoffs in nine of his first 12 seasons as head coach, **Mike McCarthy** is joined by Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl win with a victory over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.

►McCarthy's 121 regular-season wins in his first 12 years as a head coach (2006-17) are No. 4 in NFL history (according to the Elias Sports Bureau):

- McCarthy guided the Packers to a franchise-record fourth consecutive division title in 2014. In his first 12 seasons, he won six division titles, tying Lombardi for the second most in franchise history.
- ►With a win at Tampa Bay in Week 16 of the 2014 season, McCarthy passed Lombardi for the No. 2 spot in team history as far as overall victories:

- The 132 overall wins are the most in the NFC and tied for the second most in the NFL since 2006 (New England, 167 / Pittsburgh, 132).
- In Week 6 of the 2017 season, McCarthy recorded his 200th career game as a head coach (including the postseason), Having compiled 128 victories, he tied Bud Grant and Chuck Noll for the sixth-most wins by a head coach through 200 games: Don Shula, 149 / Joe Gibbs, 138 / George Halas, 134 / Tony Dungy, 130 / Curly Lambeau, 130.
- McCarthy reached 100 career wins (including playoffs) in just his 155th game. He was the fastest to reach 100 wins in the NFL since George Seifert in 1996 (132 games).
- McCarthy recorded his third regular season with 12-plus wins in 2014 (2007, 2011), passing Lambeau (1929, 1931), Lombardi (1962, 1966), Holmgren (1996-97) and Mike Sherman (2001-02) for the most by a coach in franchise history.
- McCarthy has guided the Packers to five seasons with 11-plus wins (2007, 2009, 2011-12, 2014), passing Lombardi (1961-63, 1966) and Holmgren (1995-98) for the most by a coach in franchise history.
- McCarthy's eight regular seasons with 10-plus wins are a franchise record (since 1921). Among current NFL head coaches, only Bill Belichick (17) and Andy Reid (12) have more 10-plus-win seasons.
- McCarthy is the only coach in franchise history to post three or more consecutive 10-win seasons twice in his career (2009-12, 2014-16).
- McCarthy joined Pittsburgh's Bill Cowher (2005) as the only Super Bowlwinning coaches to lead their respective teams to three road wins as the No. 6 seed in the postseason en route to a world title.
- Including playoffs, McCarthy has a 132-78-2 record since taking over as head coach in 2006, a .627 winning percentage that ranks No. 3 among current NFL head coaches (minimum 100 games):

McCarthy has coached in 212 games (including playoffs), No. 2 in team history behind Lambeau (339 from 1921-49). In the Week 6 victory over the San Diego Chargers in 2015, McCarthy earned the 100th regular-season win of his career in just his 150th game, making him the seventh-fastest coach in NFL history and the fastest current NFL coach to reach the 100-win plateau:

#### WINNING WAYS

- The Packers were the only NFC team and one of two teams in the league (New England) to make the playoffs each season from 2009-16. Those eight appearances were more than the rest of the NFC North Division combined during that span (Minnesota-three / Detroit-three / Chicagoone).
- McCarthy became just the fourth head coach in NFL history to lead a single franchise to eight-plus consecutive playoff appearances:

- There are five teams in the NFL with six-plus playoff appearances from 2009-17, with only two in the NFC (New England, nine / Green Bay, eight / Cincinnati, Pittsburgh, Seattle, six).
- With the victory over Dallas in the 2016 playoffs, McCarthy has led the Packers to 10 wins in the postseason, passing Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren for the most in team history:

The 10 postseason wins since 2007 are tied for No. 2 in the NFL with Baltimore and Seattle (New England, 13). The rest of the NFC North has combined for two postseason wins over the last 10 seasons (Minnesota and Chicago, one each).

#### **COACHES CAPSULES**

MIKE McCARTHY...Is in his 13th year as the Packers' 14th head coach.

- ► Led Green Bay to their eighth consecutive playoff appearance in 2016, tied for the fourth-longest streak in NFL history. Has led the team to nine playoff appearances in the last 11 years (2007, 2009-16).
- ► Ranks second in franchise history in total victories, trailing only Curly Lambeau.
- Guided the Packers to top-10 finishes in scoring in eight straight seasons (2007-14), joining the Patriots as the only other team to accomplish the feat over that span; Packers led the league in scoring in 2014.
- ► Reached the 100-win plateau faster than any active NFL head coach, needing just 155 games.
- Joined Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl title with a win over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.

JAY GRUDEN...Is in his fifth year as the Redskins' 29th head coach.

- ► Led Washington to an 8-7-1 record in 2016, giving the club consecutive winning seasons for the first time in 20 years. Gruden's offenses also set franchise records in numerous categories, including net passing yards (4,758) and total net yards (6,545).
- ► In 2015, guided the Redskins to an NFC East Championship, posting a 9-7 record. Gruden became the sixth coach in team history to lead Washington to a playoff berth within the first two years at the helm.
- ► As Bengals offensive coordinator, coached QB Andy Dalton to a 30-18 record as the Bengals' starting QB from 2011-13, the fifth-most wins for a QB in the NFL over that span.
- ► Coached under his brother, Jon, in Tampa Bay, winning Super Bowl XXXVII as an offensive assistant for the Buccaneers.

#### **THE PACKERS-REDSKINS SERIES**

- The Packers first met the Redskins (then Boston Braves) in 1932, five days after Franklin D. Roosevelt won his first presidential election.
- The clubs met memorably in the 1936 NFL championship game. That year, Redskins owner George Preston Marshall, upset with his fans' lack of support, was moving his team to Washington and didn't want to host the championship in Boston. The NFL moved the game to New York's Polo Grounds, where Green Bay claimed its fourth world championship, 21-6.
- ► The teams played in the highest-scoring game in *Monday Night Football* history on Oct. 17, 1983, at Lambeau Field, a contest that featured 11 TDs and six FGs in the 48-47 Green Bay win.

#### **NOTABLE CONNECTIONS**

Packers president & CEO Mark Murphy played eight seasons (1977-84) with the Redskins, serving as co-captain from 1980-84, playing on the Super Bowl XVII championship team and earning All-Pro and Pro Bowl honors in 1983...Green Bay executive vice president/director of football operations Russ Ball spent the 2001 season as director of football administration for Washington...Packers LB Oren Burks is from Lorton, Va. ... Green Bay S Raven Greene is from Virginia Beach, Va., and played collegiately at James Madison...Packers T/G Alex Light is a Salem, Va. native, and played at the University of Richmond...Packers special teams coordinator Ron Zook coached at Virginia Tech in 1987...Redskins assistant head coach/offensive line Bill Callahan coached the Wisconsin Badgers' offensive line from 1990-94...Callahan, Washington offensive coordinator Matt Cavanaugh and special teams coordinator Ben Kotwica coached alongside Green Bay defensive coordinator Mike Pettine with the N.Y. - Rodgers registered the sixth 4,000-yard passing season of his career in 2016, setting the **franchise record** as he surpassed Favre's mark of five 4,000-yard seasons.
- ► Three times Rodgers has had 10-plus zero-INT games (min. 15 att.) in a season (11 in 2016, 13 in 2014, 12 in 2009). The only other QB in team history to have 10 in a season was Bart Starr (10) in 1964.
- ► In 2016, Rodgers set the single-season franchise record for completions with 401, surpassing Favre's mark of 372 in 2005.
- In the Week 7 victory over Chicago (2016), Rodgers set a single-game franchise record with 39 completions, besting the previous high of 36 by Favre at Chicago on Dec. 5, 1993.
- According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Rodgers reached the 35,000-yard passing mark on his 4,446th attempt (2016), the second-fewest attempts needed in NFL history behind QB Johnny Unitas (4,388 attempts).
- Rodgers, who has 39,069 passing yards and 317 passing TDs in 151 career games, is looking to become the first quarterback in NFL history to reach 40,000 passing yards and 300 TD passes in fewer than 157 games, the number in which both Peyton Manning and Dan Marino reached the two marks.

#### **RODGERS AND TOUCHDOWNS**

QB **Aaron Rodgers** has found the end zone a lot in his career, and that continued this season as he opened up with a three-TD performance in Week 1 and found the end zone again in Week 2.

- ► In Week 2 of 2017, Rodgers became the 11th NFL player to throw 300 passing touchdowns, reaching the mark in his 144th career game to pass Peyton Manning and Dan Marino (157) for the fewest games needed to reach 300 passing TDs in NFL history.
- Rodgers reached 300 passing TDs on his 4,742nd pass attempt, surpassing Manning (5,306) for the fewest in league history.
- ►Rodgers also became the first quarterback to reach 300 passing TDs before throwing 100 interceptions. His 73 interceptions passed Tom Brady (115) for the fewest at the time of reaching 300 passing TDs.
- ► With a league-best 40 passing TDs during the 2016 regular season, Rodgers became just the fourth QB in NFL history to record two seasons (also 2011) with 40-plus TD passes (Marino, Manning, Drew Brees). It was his franchise-record fourth season (2011-12, 2014, 2016) with 35-plus TD passes (Brett Favre, three, 1995-97).
- Rodgers now has five seasons with 4,000-plus passing yards and 30-plus passing TDs (2009, 2011-12, 2014, 2016), further extending his team mark.
- ► In 2016, Rodgers registered his third straight season with 30-plus touchdown passes, the second-longest streak in franchise history (Favre, five straight, 1994-98).

#### **ASCENDING ADAMS**

Despite playing in just 14 games in 2017, WR **Davante Adams** led the Packers in all three major receiving categories with 74 receptions (one shy of career-best 75 from 2016) for 885 yards (12.0 avg.) and 10 touchdowns (**tied for No. 2 in the NFL**), resulting in his first appearance in the Pro Bowl.

► Adams opened the 2018 season with a TD reception in both contests, which extends his streak of consecutive regular-season games with a TD catch to four, dating back to last season. He has five TD catches during the current streak. It is the longest streak of his career, besting the run of three games he had in 2017 (Games 4-6) when he totaled five receiving touchdowns.

### THE CONTRIBUTIONS OF COBB

Packers WR **Randall Cobb** has been a versatile weapon for the team over his career. While he has contributed as a kick and punt returner and out of the backfield, most of his production has come as a wide reciever.

- ►In Week 1, he led the Packers with a career-high 142 receiving yards on nine receptions (15.8 avg.), including the game-winning 75-yard TD catch that was a career long.
- ►On third down in Week 1, Cobb finished with a career-high 110 yards on four receptions (27.5 avg.), the most by a Packer since WR Antonio Freeman posted 124 yards on five third-down receptions (24.8 avg.) vs. Tampa Bay on Oct. 10, 1999.
- Cobb's receiving-yardage total in Week 1 was the most by a Packer in a season opener since WR James Lofton recorded 154 yards receiving at Houston on Sept. 4, 1983.
- Since 2014, Cobb ranks **No. 2 among NFL wide receivers** (min. 150 receptions) in average yards after the catch (according to SportRadar):

- ► Cobb was one of just six wide receivers to register four-plus touchdowns in each season from 2012-17 (Brown, Green, IND T.Y. Hilton, Tate, Thomas).

#### **ON THE ROAD**

The Packers take to the road for the first time in 2018. They are looking to win the first road game of the season for the first time since 2015.

- ► Since 2006, the Packers have finished .500 or better on the road nine times.
- ► In the first 12 seasons under head coach Mike McCarthy (2006-17), the Packers finished the season ranked in the top 10 in points per game as the away team nine times, including five finishes in the top five:

#### **ODDS AND ENDS**

- ► WR **Davante Adams** caught a 9-yard TD pass in Week 2, giving him a TD reception in three straight games against the Vikings.
- ► TE Jimmy Graham led the team with 95 yards on six receptions (15.8 avg.) in Week 2, his best single-game yardage total since Nov. 7, 2016, (103 yards on eight receptions vs. Buffalo) when he was with Seattle.
- ►CB Jaire Alexander shared a sack of Minnesota QB Kirk Cousins with LB Reggie Gilbert in the first quarter, the first half-sack of Alexander's career.
- ►WR Geronimo Allison's blocked punt in the first quarter of Week 2 was recovered in the end zone by CB Josh Jackson. It was the first blocked punt for a TD by Green Bay since Oct. 28, 2012, vs. Jacksonville (blocked by CB Davon House and recovered in the end zone by LB Dezman Moses).
- ►K Mason Crosby tied his career high (two previous times) and matched the single-game franchise record with five field goals in Week 2 (37, 40, 31, 48, 36). He finished with a career-high 17 points, the most by a Packers kicker since Ryan Longwell recorded 17 at Arizona on Sept. 24, 2000.

### **STATS OF THE WEEK**

- The Week 2 game between the Packers and Vikings ended in a 29-29 tie, Green Bay's first tie game since Nov. 24, 2013, which was also against Minnesota at Lambeau Field (26-26).
- It marked just the third tie game between the two teams in the 58-year history of the series (1961-2018).
- It marked the Packers' fourth overtime game in the last 16 regularseason contests. Green Bay has a 3-0-1 mark in those games.
- The tie between the Packers and Vikings marked the second consecutive week with a tie (Cleveland-Pittsburgh in Week 1). This is the first season to feature a tie in each of the first two weeks since 1971, which saw Miami and Denver tie 10-10 in Week 1 and Atlanta and the Los Angeles Rams tie 20-20 in Week 2.

- ▶ P JK Scott's 63-yard punt in the second quarter of Week 2 was the longest by a Packer since P Jacob Schum's 65-yarder vs. Indianapolis on Nov. 6, 2016. Scott finished the game with a 51.8-yard gross average and a net average of 45.2 yards on five punts.
- Scott currently ranks **No. 9 in the NFL** with an average of 50.1 yards per punt.
- The Packers are tied for No. 8 in the NFL with six sacks this season.

- The Packers posted the second-largest comeback win in team history at Lambeau Field (21 vs. New Orleans on Sept. 17, 1989), coming back from a 20-point deficit to top the Chicago Bears, 24-23, in Week 1. It was just the fifth time in franchise history that Green Bay posted a comeback win of 20-plus points.
- ► Week 1 marked the first time in franchise history that the Packers won after trailing by 17-plus points entering the fourth quarter (per the Elias Sports Bureau).
- ►QB Aaron Rodgers recorded a passer rating of 130-plus for the third time in a Week 1 game, the most in the NFL since 2008 (according to pro-football-reference.com).
- ► In the fourth quarter of Week 1, Rodgers completed 9 of 12 passes (75.0 pct.) for 212 yards with three touchdowns and a passer rating of 156.3. According to SportRadar, it marked the 18th time in his career that he recorded a passer rating of 150.0-plus in the fourth quarter.

#### **CLAY FINDS HIS WAY TO THE BALL**

LB **Clay Matthews** continues to make an impact on opposing offenses. He is tied with LB **Reggie Gilbert** for the team lead with five QB pressures this season.

- In 2017, Matthews recorded a sack in three consecutive games that he appeared in (Weeks 11, 13-14), marking the eighth time he has recorded a sack in at least three straight games that he has played in during the same regular season.
- ► For the seventh time in his career, Matthews registered at least six sacks (team-high 7.5) and forced a fumble in 2017, which **tied for the second-most seasons** with six-plus sacks and one or more forced fumbles since 2009 (Julius Peppers, nine).
- ► In Week 4 of 2017, Matthews registered a sack/forced fumble of Bears QB Mike Glennon to move past DE Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila to set the team record:

Packers LB **Nick Perry** is a big part of a pass rush that has recorded a sack in 17 of the last 18 games, including six sacks through two games this season.

- He sealed the Week 1 victory over the Bears with a sack/forced fumble of QB Mitchell Trubisky on fourth-down-and-10 with 1:06 on the clock and the ball at the Chicago 46-yard line. The fumble was recovered by DL Kenny Clark.
- Perry has registered at least one sack in each of the last three season openers, totalling 3.5 sacks in those games.

#### **ON THE RISE**

S **Ha Ha Clinton-Dix** has been a presence on the Packers defense since his rookie season and earned his first trip to the Pro Bowl and second-team All-Pro recognition from *The Associated Press* in 2016.

- After starting 10 of 16 games and both postseason contests as a rookie, he has started every game since 2015.
- Clinton-Dix has an interception this season, was tied for No. 2 on the team with three INTs in 2017 and is tied for No. 2 among safeties since 2016 with nine interceptions during the regular season:

- His three career postseason interceptions rank No. 1 among safeties since he entered the league in 2014, according to STATS.
- His career-best five interceptions were tied for No. 5 in the NFL in 2016 and tied for No. 2 among safeties. It was the most interceptions by a Packers safety in a single season since Charles Woodson (seven) and Charlie Peprah (five) in 2011.
- ►In 2016, Clinton-Dix posted a career-high two interceptions in both Week 9 and Week 15, becoming the first Packer to have multiple two-INT games in a season since Woodson in 2011.
- ► In Week 9 of 2016, he joined CB AI Harris (vs. New Orleans, Oct. 9, 2005) as the only players to post two INTs in a first quarter for the Packers since 1993.

#### **KENNY KEEPS IMPROVING**

In 2016, DL **Kenny Clark** became the youngest player to appear in a season opener for the Packers since Arnie Herber (20 years old) in 1930. After starting two of 16 games played as a rookie, Clark started all 17 games he has played in since the start of the 2017 season.

- Against Minnesota in Week 2, he sacked QB Kirk Cousins. He has 5.5 sacks since Week 13 of 2017, tied with Carolina DT Kawann Short for the most sacks by a defensive tackle over that span (according to STATS).
- In Week 1, he recovered a fumble forced by LB Nick Perry on a sack of Chicago QB Mitchell Trubisky on fourth down late in the fourth quarter.
- ► The former All-American from UCLA finished **No. 4 on the team** and led the defensive line with 78 tackles (39 solo) in 2017.
- According to STATS, Clark's 4.5 sacks in December 2017 were the most by a Packer defensive tackle in the month of December in a single season (since 1982).
- ►With two sacks vs. Minnesota in Week 16, Clark became the first Packers defensive tackle to register two sacks in a single regular-season game since **Mike Daniels** recorded two Oct. 27, 2013, at Minnesota (according to STATS).

#### **CONTINUAL IMPACT**

In his career, DL **Mike Daniels** has seen his playing time steadily increase as well as his production, earning him a role as a standout on the defense.

- After being selected as an alternate each of the past three seasons (2015-17), he was named to the 2017 Pro Bowl as an injury replacement for Los Angeles Rams DT Aaron Donald.
- He finished No. 4 on the team with five sacks in 2017, the third-most sacks of his career (6.5 in 2013, 5.5 in 2014), and recorded a career best 72 tackles.
- Daniels has recorded at least four sacks in each season since 2013, which is tied for No. 1 in the NFL among defensive tackles (according to pro-football-reference.com):

#### **RACKING UP POINTS**

K Mason Crosby is moving his way up the record books.

- Crosby tied his career high (two previous times) and matched the singlegame franchise record with five field goals in Week 2 (37, 40, 31, 48, 36). He finished with a career-high 17 points, the most by a Packers kicker since Ryan Longwell recorded 17 at Arizona on Sept. 24, 2000.
- Crosby has played in 178 straight games for the Packers, the third most all-time behind only QB Brett Favre (255) and T Forrest Gregg (187).
- Crosby passed Ryan Longwell in Week 2 of the 2015 season to become the franchise career points leader:

- Crosby's 1,345 points from 2007-17 were the second most by an NFL player in his first 11 seasons (NE Stephen Gostkowski, 1,457 from 2006-16), according to pro-football-reference.com.
- Crosby (1,505) passed Longwell (1,119) for the most points scored in the regular and postseason combined in franchise history.
- Crosby recorded 122 points during the 2016 season, giving him the 10th 100-point season of his career and extending his franchise record. Crosby's 10 seasons with 100-plus points are tied for the most in the NFL since 2007 (Gostkowski). The only other kickers to have 10 or more consecutive seasons of 100-plus points are Jason Elam (16, 1993-2008) and Adam Vinatieri (13, 1996-2008).

#### **ON THE ROAD AGAIN**

Green Bay went 7-1 away from Lambeau Field in 2011, with the seven road wins setting a single-season franchise record.

- ► The Packers have been able to stay above the .500 mark on the road during Head Coach Mike McCarthy's tenure, a notable achievement in the National Football League.
- ►Since 2006, McCarthy's first season as the head coach in Green Bay, only eight of 32 NFL teams have regular-season road records at or above .500.

## **336 AND COUNTING**

Another packed house at Lambeau Field against the Minnesota Vikings in Week 2 of 2018 brought the stadium's consecutive-sellouts streak to 336 regular-season games (not including replacement games).

- ► The league's longest-tenured stadium, Lambeau Field is hosting its 62nd season of football in 2018. For the victory over Dallas in the Divisional round of the 2014 playoffs, Packers fans set a new Lambeau Field paid-attendance record (79,704).
- Across American professional sports, only Boston's Fenway Park (1912) and Chicago's Wrigley Field (1914) have longer tenures.

## THE LAMBEAU ADVANTAGE

The crown jewel of the National Football League, Lambeau Field has long been known as one of the tougher venues to play in, particularly during the harsh Wisconsin winter.

- ► Re-establishing home-field advantage after a 4-4 mark in 2008 was one of the goals of 2009, and with the Packers finishing 6-2 at home, they accomplished that goal. Green Bay followed that up with a 7-1 mark at Lambeau Field in 2010, a perfect 8-0 record in 2011, the first undefeated home mark since 2002, and a 7-1 mark in 2012. The Packers were one of two teams to finish undefeated at home during the 2014 regular season (Denver).
- Head Coach Mike McCarthy stated consistently upon his arrival in Green Bay that one of the team's goals would be to reclaim the mystique of playing at Lambeau Field. Mission accomplished. The team is 70-26-2 (.724) at home in the regular season since 2006, No. 3 in the NFL.
- Since Ron Wolf and Mike Holmgren began the revitalization of the franchise in 1992, Green Bay owns the best home record in the NFL. A look at the top regular-season home W-L records since the '92 season:

- Despite missing a game, was No. 2 on the team with 66 receptions in 2017. It was the fourth consecutive season he registered 60-plus receptions
- ► Led the team with a 13.5-yard punt-return average in 2016.
- Led the team in receptions (79), was No. 2 in receiving yards (829) and was No. 3 in touchdown receptions (six) in 2015.
- Set a new single-season career high with five 100-yard receiving games during the 2014 season (three-2012). Earned first trip to the Pro Bowl.
- His career-best 91 receptions in 2014 are the eighth most in team historv
- Set a franchise single-season record with a league-high 2,342 combined net yards in 2012, topping the previous team mark of 2,250 yards by RB Ahman Green in 2003.

- LT David Bakhtiari, 6th Year, Colorado, D4a-13
   ▶ Earned second-team All-Pro honors from *The Associated Press* in 2016 and 2017, joining Forrest Gregg (1959-60, 1962-67) as the only Green Bay tackles to be named to an AP All-Pro team in consecutive seasons.
- Named to first career Pro Bowl in 2016.
- Has started all but six games at LT since the start of the 2013 regular season. Missed Weeks 2-5 during the 2017 season and the final two games of the 2015 regular season due to injury.
- Started all 16 games at left tackle in 2013, the only rookie in the NFL to do so in 2013 and the first Packer rookie to do so since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.
- Became just the fourth Green Bay rookie to start at LT in the season opener since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger and the first since 1985.

#### <u>\_G Lane Taylor, 6th Year, Oklahoma State, FA-13</u>

- Has played in 64 regular-season games for Green Bay, with all but two of his 35 starts (LT in Week 4-5 last season) taking place at LG.
- ► Made the first starts of his career in 2015, opening at RG at Detroit in Week 13 in place of an injured T.J. Lang and at LG in Week 17 vs. Minnesota with Josh Sitton sliding to LT in place of an injured David Bakhtiari.
- ► A four-year letterman at OSU, starting 47 of 50 games played at right guard. Unanimous first-team All-Big 12 selection by the conference's coaches as a senior.

#### C Corey Linsley, 5th Year, Ohio State, D5a-14

- ► Has started every game at C since Week 9 of 2016. Was the only Packers offensive lineman to start every game during the 2017 season.
- ► Was on reserve/physically unable to perform for the entire preseason and the first seven regular-season games of the 2016 season.
- Started 29 games and four postseason contests in his first two seasons.
- Was the first rookie center to start every game for the Packers since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.
- ► Named to PFWA's All-Rookie team, the first Green Bay center to be honored since its inception in 1974.

#### RG Justin McCray, 2nd Year, Central Florida, FA-17

- Signed by Green Bay as a free agent during the 2017 offseason and has seen action in 15 games with 10 starts (five at RT, two at LG, three at RG)
- ▶ Played for the Orlando Predators of the Arena Football League in 2016.
- Spent the 2015 season out of football.
- Entered the league as an undrafted free agent with the Tennessee Titans in 2014 and spent that season on Tennessee's practice squad.
- Appeared in 45 games with 32 starts in four seasons at Central Florida (2010-13), with 23 of the starts coming at RG.

#### RT Bryan Bulaga, 9th Year, Iowa, D1-10

- Has played in 87 career regular-season games with 83 starts at right tackle, the most games played and started among starting offensive linemen on Green Bay's current roster.
- Started 43 of 48 regular-season games from 2014-16 and five games in 2017 before a knee injury in Week 9 ended his season. ►Missed the second part of the 2012 season after suffering a hip injury
- vs. Arizona on Nov. 4 and missed all of the 2013 season after injuring his knee on Aug. 3.
- Started 37 games at RT in his first three seasons in the league.
- ▶ Named to the Pro Football Weekly/PFWA All-Rookie team in 2010.
- Capped his rookie season by becoming the youngest player at the time, according to STATS LLC, to ever start in the Super Bowl (21 years, 322 days).

#### TE Jimmy Graham, 9th Year, Miami, FA-18

- His 69 career touchdowns rank No. 4 in NFL history among tight ends
- Last season, led NFL tight ends with 10 receiving TDs, which marked his fourth season with 10-plus touchdown receptions to tie Antonio Gates for the second most 10-touchdown catch seasons among tight ends (Rob Gronkowski, five).
- Has been selected to the Pro Bowl five times in his career (2011, 2013, 2014, 2016, 2017) and was named first-team All-Pro by The Associated Press in 2013.
- Is the only tight end in NFL history to have two seasons with 1,200-plus
- receiving yards and 10-plus receiving TDs (2011, 2013). Over the last three seasons (2015-17), he played for the Seattle Seahawks but entered the NFL with New Orleans in 2010 as a thirdround pick (No. 95 overall) and played five seasons (2010-14) for the Saints.

#### WR Davante Adams, 5th Year, Fresno State, D2-14

- Recorded the fourth-most receptions (237) and receiving touchdowns (26) by a Green Bay player in their first four seasons (2014-17) in the NFL (according to the Elias Sports Bureau).
- Selected to his first Pro Bowl in 2017 after leading the Packers with 74 receptions for 885 yards (12.0 avg.) and 10 receiving touchdowns (tied for No. 2 in the NFL).

   Ranked No. 1 in the NFL with a combined nine interceptions in 2010 (six)
- in regular season, three in postseason) and was chosen for the Pro Bowl as an injury replacement.

- CB Kevin King, 2nd Year, Washington, D1-17 ▶ Appeared in nine games with five starts as a rookie in 2017, registering 31 tackles (23 solo), a tackle for a loss and eight passes defensed before being placed on injured reserve (shoulder) on Dec. 6.

#### 17 Davante Adams, WR, 5th Year, Fresno State

• Has 24 receiving touchdowns since 2016, No. 1 in the league over that span. Has caught at least one TD pass in 19 games since '16, tops in the NFL over that span.

• Was the only player in the NFL with 70-plus receptions and 10-plus TD catches in both of the last two seasons (2016-17).

• Posted 237 catches from 2014-17, the fourth most in franchise history by a player in his first four NFL seasons behind WRs Sterling Sharpe (281), Greg Jennings (246) and James Lofton (242).

• Led the team with 74 catches for a team-high 885 yards (12.0 avg.) and 10 TDs in 2017. Was tied for No. 2 in the NFL in TD receptions and was named to his first career Pro Bowl (injury replacement for Falcons WR Julio Jones).

**2018 SEASON:** Has started both games and is tied for the team lead with 13 receptions for 152 yards (11.7 avg.) and a team-high two TDs.

►Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9): Started and played 59 of 60 snaps, hauling in five passes for 88 yards (17.6 avg.) and a TD...It marked his fourth straight game with a receiving TD againt the Bears, giving him five TDs over that span...Early in the fourth quarter, created separation on a double move, beating CB Prince Amukamara as he hauled in QB Aaron Rodgers' pass near the Green Bay 40 before taking it down the middle of the field to the Chicago 24 for a 51-yard gain...Three plays later, caught a short pass from Rodgers just inside the 10 before beating Amukamara down the sideline as he got to the pylon for the 12-yard TD.

►Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16): Started and played 75 of 77 snaps, leading the team with eight receptions for 64 yards (8.0 avg.) and a TD...It marked his third straight game with a TD catch against the Vikings and his career-high fourth consecutive regular-season game overall with a TD reception...Early in the second quarter, caught a quick-out from Rodgers near the 2-yard line, eluding LB Anthony Barr and CB Xavier Rhodes on his way to the end zone for the score.

#### 90 Montravius Adams, DL, 2nd Year, Auburn

• Saw action in seven games as a rookie in 2017, recording five tackles (one solo) and a quarterback hit.

• After a foot injury sidelined him for most of training camp and the first two regular-season games, made professional debut in Week 3 vs. Cincinnati.

• Earned first-team All-Southeastern Conference honors from *The Associated Press* as a senior in 2016 after recording 44 tackles (26 solo), 8½ tackles for a loss, 4½ sacks, a forced fumble, two fumble recoveries (one for a TD) and an interception.

**2018 SEASON:** Has played in both games, seeing limited action on defense...Has posted a solo tackle.

►Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9): Appeared on two plays on defense and posted a solo tackle.

**Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16):** Played six snaps on defense.

#### 23 Jaire Alexander, CB, Rookie, Louisville

• Played in 31 games with 19 starts during his three seasons at Louisville and registered 77 tackles (58 solo), two tackles for a loss, seven interceptions, 22 passes defensed, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery.

• Posted a 9.9-yard average on 44 punt returns during his collegiate career, highlighted by a 10.5-yard average on 20 returns as a sophomore in '16 that included a 69-yard touchdown return vs. Florida State (Sept. 17).

• Earned second-team All-Atlantic Coast Conference recognition as a sophomore in 2016 after posting a team-high five interceptions (tied for No. 11 in the country) along with a career-best 39 tackles (31 solo) and 14 passes defensed.

**2018 SEASON:** Has appeared in both games and is tied for third on the team with 13 tackles (10 solo)...Has added a half-sack, a QB pressure and a tackle for a loss...Has posted one tackle on special teams.

►Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9): Played 49 snaps on defense and 10 on special

teams in his NFL debut, finishing with three tackles (all solo) and a pass defensed.

►Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16): Appeared on 56 snaps on defense and 16 on special teams, leading the team with a career-high 10 tackles (seven solo)...Added a tackle for a loss, a half-sack and a QB pressure...Midway through the first quarter on a third-and-10, came on a blitz from the slot and shook off a block from RB Dalvin Cook for a shared 6-yard sack of QB Kirk Cousins with LB Reggie Gilbert to force a punt...In overtime, drilled WR Stefon Diggs for a 1-yard loss on a pass in the flat on second-and-2... Also posted a tackle on kickoff coverage.

#### 81 Geronimo Allison, WR, 3rd Year, Illinois

• Led the team with a career-high 122 receiving yards on a career-best six catches (20.3 avg.) last season in Week 3 vs. Cincinnati, highlighted by his career-long 72-yard grab in overtime that set up K Mason Crosby's game-winning 27-yard FG.

• Appeared in a career-best 15 games with two starts in 2017 and posted a career-high 23 receptions for 253 yards (11.0 avg.).

• Played in 10 games with two starts as a rookie in 2016, posting 12 catches for 202 yards (16.8 avg.) and two TDs. Started as the third WR in the final two regular-season games, posting eight catches for 157 yards (19.6 avg.) and a TD, with all eight receptions going for first downs.

**2018 SEASON:** Has started both games as the third WR and has posted 11 receptions for 133 yards (12.1 avg.) and a TD...Blocked a punt that was recovered for a TD in Week 2.

►Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9): Started as the third WR and played 42 snaps...Finished with five receptions for 69 yards (13.8 avg.), highlighted by a 39-yard TD catch early in the fourth quarter, the longest TD of his pro career...Made a diving catch near the right corner of the end zone with CB Kyle Fuller in tight coverage for the score.

►Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16): Started as the third WR and matched his career high with six receptions for 64 yards (10.7 avg.)...Midway through the first quarter, came off the left end up the middle to block P Matt Wile's punt with his right hand...The ball hung in the air after it was blocked and then was caught by CB Josh Jackson in the end zone for the TD, the first blocked punt for a TD by the Packers since Oct. 28, 2012, vs. Jacksonville (blocked by CB Davon House, recovered by LB Dezman Moses).

#### 69 David Bakhtiari, T, 6th Year, Colorado

• Earned second-team All-Pro honors from *The Associated Press* both of the last two seasons, becoming only the second offensive tackle in team history (Forrest Gregg; 1959-60, 1962-67) to earn *AP* All-Pro recognition in consecutive seasons.

• Has started all 76 regular-season games he has appeared in at LT since entering the league in 2013.

• Started all 12 games he played in at LT in 2017, helping Green Bay rank No. 3 in the NFL in red-zone scoring (61.9 percent) and No. 5 in rushing yards per carry (4.47 avg.).

• Was selected to his first career Pro Bowl in 2016, having initially been named a first alternate before being selected as an injury replacement for Eagles T Jason Peters.

2018 SEASON: Has started both games at LT.

► Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9): Started at LT and played all 60 snaps, helping to protect QB Aaron Rodgers as he connected on 20 of 30 passes (66.7 percent) for 286 yards and three TDs with no INTs for a 130.7 passer rating...Part of a line that did not allow a sack in the second half.

• Has been named the NFL's Most Valuable Player by *The Associated Press* twice in his career (2011, 2014), one of only eight players in league history to win the award multiple times.

• Is the only quarterback in league history to record a 100-plus passer rating in six consecutive seasons (2009-14), with no other QB doing so in more than four straight seasons. Has posted a 100-plus rating in seven seasons (2009-14, 2016), tied with Saints QB Drew Brees for the most in NFL history.

• Is one of only four QBs in NFL annals with 35,000-plus passing yards and 2,500-plus rushing yards (Fran Tarkenton, John Elway, Donovan McNabb).

• Is the lone QB in NFL history to throw 40-plus TD passes with seven or fewer INTs in a season, having done it twice in his career (45/6 in 2011, 40/7 in 2016).

• In 143 career regular-season starts (since 2008), has posted 52 games with 300-plus passing yards (No. 4 in the NFL over that span), 83 without an interception (No. 2, min. 15 attempts) and 79 with a 100-plus passer rating (No. 2).

Completed 17 of 23 passes for 273 yards and three TDs in the second half (152.7 rating), with all three of his TD passes coming in the fourth quarter, a career high...Early in the fourth quarter, connected with WR Geronimo Allison on a 39-vard TD pass. lofting the ball to Allison in the right corner of the end zone over CB Kyle Fuller...On the next drive, found WR Davante Adams for a 51-yard completion to the Chicago 24 and then connected with him again three plays later for a 12-yard TD pass...Led the offense to a third straight TD drive, with all three taking less than three minutes, threading the ball to WR Randall Cobb on a short pass over the middle as Cobb took it down the middle of the field for a game-winning 75-vard TD with 2:13 remaining...It marked his 10th TD pass of 75-plus yards since 2008, tied with Giants QB Eli Manning for the most in the league over that span. **Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16):** Playing with a brace on his injured left knee, completed 30 of 42 passes (71.4 percent) for 281 yards and a TD with no INTs for a 97.4 rating...Also rushed three times for 8 yards (2.7

avg.), including a 7-yard run late in the first quarter on a third-and-7... Completed passes to eight different receivers, with three players recording 60-plus receiving yards for the second straight game (TE Jimmy Graham, 6-95; Adams, 8-64; Allison, 6-64).

Selected to an All-American team in three of his four seasons at Alabama, earning first-team honors in 2014 and second-team honors in '16 and '17.
Voted first-team All-Southeastern Conference by the coaches three times (2014, 2016-17).

**2018 SEASON:** Has played in both games, averaging 50.1 yards on nine punts with a 41.4-yard net average...Has played three punts inside the 20 with one touchback...Ranks No. 11 in the NFL in gross punting average.

• Was the only Green Bay rookie on the offensive side of the ball to appear in all 16 regular-season contests in 2016.

►Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9): Appeared on four plays on special teams.

**Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16):** Played nine snaps on special teams.

#### 19 Equanimeous St. Brown, WR, Rookie, Notre Dame

• Started 25 of the 32 games he played in over three seasons at Notre Dame, catching 92 passes for 1,484 yards (16.1 avg.) and 13 touchdowns.

• Named Notre Dame's Offensive Player of the Year as a sophomore in 2016 after leading the Irish with 58 receptions for 961 yards (16.5 avg.) and nine TDs.

• In 2016, ranked No. 6 in receiving yards, tied for No. 6 in TD receptions and No. 7 in receiving yards per game (80.1) among FBS freshmen and sophomores.

**2018 SEASON:** Has played in one game and was inactive for the other. ►Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9): Played two snaps on special teams in his NFL debut.

►Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16): Inactive (healthy scratch).

#### 65 Lane Taylor, G, 6th Year, Oklahoma State

• Started all 31 games he played in during the 2016-17 seasons, the most by a Green Bay offensive lineman over that span. Has opened games at three different spots on the offensive line (31 at LG, two at LT, one at RG) during his career.

• In his first two seasons as a starter (2016-17), helped the Packers rank No. 4 in the NFL over that span with an average of 4.51 yards per carry.

• Started all 15 games he appeared in last season, opening 13 at LG and two at LT, the first starts of his career at LT.

• Started a career-high 16 games at LG in 2016, one of three Green Bay linemen (David Bakhtiari, Bryan Bulaga) to open every game on the season. **2018 SEASON:** Has started both games at LG.

► Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9): Started at LG and played all 60 snaps, helping to protect QB Aaron Rodgers as he connected on 20 of 30 passes (66.7 percent) for 286 yards and three TDs with no INTs for a 130.7 passer rating...Part of a line that did not allow a sack in the second half.

►Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16): Started at LG and appeared on all 77 snaps, blocking for Rodgers as he completed 30 of 42 passes (71.4 percent) for 281 yards and a TD with no INTs for a 97.4 rating.

#### 85 Robert Tonyan, TE, 1st Year, Indiana State

• Spent the final four weeks of the 2017 season on Green Bay's practice squad. Entered the league as an undrafted free agent with the Detroit Lions in 2017.

• Finished his four-year career at Indiana State as the program's leader in career touchdown receptions (20), single-season touchdown receptions (10, 2016) and most consecutive games with a reception (21, 2015-16). Also ranks No. 2 in school history with 2,047 receiving yards.

• Earned second-team All-Missouri Valley Football Conference honors as a senior WR in 2016 after leading the team in receptions (56), receiving yards (699) and receiving TDs (10).

**2018 SEASON:** Has played in both games, seeing time on special teams...Has registered one tackle on special teams.

►Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9): Appeared on 11 snaps on special teams in his NFL debut.

►Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16): Played 16 snaps on special teams and posted a tackle.

#### 56 Korey Toomer, LB, 5th Year, Idaho

• Signed with the Packers as a free agent on Sept. 3 after spending the offseason and preseason with the San Francisco 49ers. Played in 46 games with 16 starts from 2014-17 and registered 115 total tackles (68 solo), two sacks, an interception he returned 59 yards for a touchdown, five forced fumbles, a fumble recovery and 14 special teams tackles.

• Was originally drafted by the Seattle Seahawks in the fifth round (No. 154 overall) of the 2012 NFL Draft out of the University of Idaho. Toomer spent a few weeks of his rookie season on Seattle's practice.

• Appeared in one game for the Dallas Cowboys and seven games for the St. Louis Rams in 2014. Played in 10 games for the Oakland Raiders in 2015 and appeared in 28 contests with 16 starts for the San Diego/Los Angeles Chargers in 2016-17.

**2018 SEASON:** Has appeared in both games, seeing time on defense and special teams...Has posted three tackles (two solo) on defense and a tackle on special teams.

► Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9): Played 19 snaps on special teams in his Green Bay debut.

►Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16): Appeared on seven plays on defense and 22 on special teams...Recorded three tackles (two solo) on defense and a tackle on special teams.

#### 83 Marquez Valdes-Scantling, WR, Rookie, South Florida

• Posted an average of 17.3 yards per catch on his 75 receptions at South Florida, the top mark in school history (min. 70 receptions).

• Set the school single-season record with 879 yards on a team-high 53 receptions (16.6 avg.) with six touchdowns for the Bulls as a senior in 2017.

• Ranks No. 10 in school history for career receiving yards (1,294) and No. 6 in TD catches (11) despite only playing two seasons for the Bulls.

**2018 SEASON:** Has played in both games...Has one catch for 3 yards and one kickoff return for 21 yards.

►Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9): Played two snaps on offense and 11 on special teams in his NFL debut...Returned one kickoff for 21 yards.

►Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16): Appeared on six plays on offense and seven on special teams...Posted his first NFL reception, hauling in a 3-yard pass near the sideline from QB Aaron Rodgers in the first quarter.

### 35 Jermaine Whitehead, S, 2nd Year, Auburn

• After spending the first six games of the 2017 season on Green Bay's practice squad, was signed to the active roster and played in 10 contests, seeing time on defense and special teams. Was tied for No. 2 on the team with six special teams tackles.

• Played in two games for the Packers in 2016 while spending 14 regularseason games and three postseason contests on Green Bay's practice squad.

• Originally signed by San Francisco as an undrafted free agent on May 5, 2015, and spent most of his rookie season on the 49ers' practice squad before being signed to the Baltimore Ravens' active roster on Dec. 23, where he was inactive for the final two games.

**2018 SEASON:** Has played in both games, seeing time on defense and special teams...Has posted four tackles (all solo) on defense and is tied for the team lead with two passes defensed...Leads the team with two tackles on special teams.

►Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9): Appeared on 25 snaps on defense and a teamhigh 23 on special teams...Posted a solo tackle and a pass defensed...Led the team with two tackles on special teams, including a stop of RB Benny Cunningham at the Chicago 18 on a kickoff return after the Packers had taken a 24-23 lead with just over two minutes remaining.

►Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16): Played 25 snaps on defense and a team-

high 29 on special teams...Registered three tackles (all solo) and a pass defensed on defense, breaking up a pass in the flat intended for RB Dalvin Cook late in the fourth quarter.

#### 96 Muhammad Wilkerson, DL, 8th Year, Temple

• The former Pro Bowler (2015) and second-team All-Pro member (*The Associated Press* in 2013 and 2015) joins the Packers after spending the first seven seasons of his career with the N.Y. Jets, who selected him in the first round (No. 30 overall) of the 2011 NFL Draft.

• Registered three-plus sacks and at least one forced fumble in six different seasons, tied for the most among defensive linemen since 2011.

• From 2011-17, was part of a defense that ranked No. 4 in the league over that span in opponent rushing average (3.84). Helped the Jets rank No. 6 in the league (103.7 ypg) in run defense from 2011-17.

• Has registered 50-plus tackles in each of his seven seasons, including 90-plus tackles twice (90 in 2012 and 91 in 2013).

**2018 SEASON:** Has started both games and has posted five tackles (four solo), a tackle for a loss and two QB hits.

►Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9): Started and played 43 snaps in his Green Bay debut, finishing with four tackles (three solo), a tackle for a loss and a QB hit.

► Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16): Started and played 49 snaps, posting a solo tackle and a QB hit...Part of a line that helped limit the Vikings to just 68 yards on 18 carries (3.8 avg.).

#### 30 Jamaal Williams, RB, 2nd Year, Brigham Young

• Rushed for a team-high 556 yards last season, the fourth most by a Green Bay rookie in team history, and four TDs on 153 carries (3.6 avg.).

• Added 262 receiving yards and two TDs on 25 catches (10.5 avg.), the most receiving yards by a Green Bay rookie running back since Keith Woodside totaled 352 yards in 1988.

• Became the first rookie in team history to register a rushing TD/receiving TD in two games (Week 12 at Pittsburgh, Week 14 at Cleveland).

• After moving into the starting lineup in Week 11, posted 672 yards from scrimmage over that span (No. 11 in the NFL) and 455 rushing yards (No. 10). Registered 100-plus yards from scrimmage in four of the final six games.

**2018 SEASON:** Has started both games and leads the team with 106 rushing yards on 31 carries (3.4 avg.)...Also has three receptions for 12 yards (4.0 avg.)

►Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9): Started and led the team with 47 rushing yards on 15 carries (3.1 avg.)...Had a key blitz pickup on QB Aaron Rodgers' 51-yard completion to WR Davante Adams in the fourth quarter, stuffing LB Danny Trevathan as he came up the middle to give Rodgers a clean look on the big gain.

►Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16): Started and rushed for a team-high 59 yards on 16 carries (3.7 avg.), picking up a career-high six first downs... Also caught three passes for 12 yards (4.0 avg.).

### 38 Tramon Williams, CB, 12th Year, Louisiana Tech

• Has 32 career interceptions, tied for No. 4 among active NFL players. Is the only active player in the NFL to have at least one interception in each of the last 11 seasons (2007-17).

• Returns to the Packers after spending the last three seasons with the Cleveland Browns (2015-16) and Arizona Cardinals (2017). The former undrafted free agent and practice-squad player appeared in 127 regular-season games for the Packers from 2007-14.

• Has three career TDs, including INT returns of 43 yards (2011) and 70 yards (2010 postseason) and a 94-yard punt return (2007).

• Ranked No. 1 in the NFL with a combined nine interceptions in 2010 (six in regular season, three in postseason) and was chosen for the Pro Bowl as an injury replacement.

• Was the only undrafted free agent in the NFL to post four-plus INTs each season from 2008-11. Was tied for No. 4 in the NFL with 19 INTs over that span.

**2018 SEASON:** Has started both games and is tied for No. 3 on the team with 13 tackles (10 solo).

►Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9): Started and played all 70 snaps, one of five Green Bay defenders to do so...Finished third on the team with seven tackles (five solo).

►Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16): Started and was one of four Green Bay defensive players to appear on all 73 snaps...Finished with six tackles (five solo).
