

### PACKERS SQUARE OFF AGAINST THE LIONS ON MNF

The Green Bay Packers return to Lambeau Field to face anNFC North foe, the Detroit Lions, in a primetime matchup.

- ▶ Both teams enter Week 6 as the only two teams in the division with one loss and two of just five in the NFC (San Francisco, 4-0 / New Orleans and Seattle, 4-1).
- Including a 1994 playoff victory, the Packers are 25-3 against the Lions in the state of Wisconsin since 1992.
- ► Green Bay has a 27-11 overall mark against Detroit since 2000, a .711 winning percentage that is tied for No. 1 among **NFL teams** (Minnesota Vikings) that have played the Lions 10-plus times over that span, according to pro-football-reference.com.
- ▶ The Packers have a 16-3 home record (.842) against Detroit since 2000.
- ▶ QB Aaron Rodgers has led Green Bay to seven wins in nine starts at home against Detroit, throwing 17 touchdowns with just three interceptions and a passer rating of 109.4 in those games.
- ▶ Rodgers has registered a passer rating of 100-plus in six of nine home games versus the Lions.
- Green Bay has started the season with at least four wins in its first five games for the third time in the last five years (4-1 in 2017, 5-0 in 2015) and the seventh time since 2000 (5-0 in 2011, 4-1 in 2007, 2002 and 2001).
- ▶If the Packers win, it will be their first 3-0 start in NFC North games since 2012.
- ▶Out of the 17 teams that have played multiple division games this season, Green Bay is one of four teams with multiple wins against division opponents (New England, 3-0 / Dallas and Seattle, 2-0).

#### **GREEN BAY ON MONDAY NIGHT FOOTBALL**

- ▶ It is the 27th consecutive season (1993-2019) that Green Bay is appearing on Monday Night Football, the second-longest streak in the NFL behind the Denver Broncos (28, 1992-2019).
- ▶ The Packers are 32-32-1 in the regular season on MNF.
- Green Bay has won four of its last five games on MNF.
- ▶ The Packers' .800 winning percentage (4-1) on MNF since 2014 is No. 3 in the NFL over that span (Pittsburgh, 7-0, 1.000; Atlanta, 5-1, .833).
- It is the sixth time in the last seven seasons the Packers have played at Lambeau Field on MNF.
- Green Bay has won six of its last eight home games on MNF.
- ▶ It is the second time in three seasons and the fourth time overall (2017, 1972, 1971) that Green Bay and Detroit will face off on MNF, with the series tied at 1-1-1.
- The Packers have scored 27-plus points in four of the last five MNF games they have played (33, 17, 27, 38, 43).
- ▶ Rodgers has thrown for 300-plus yards and a passer rating of 100-plus in four consecutive MNF games. According to The Elias Sports Bureau, that is the longest streak in MNF history. In those four games (Packers are 4-0), Rodgers has completed 103 of 156 passes (66.0 percent) for 1,398 yards (349.5 per game), 12 TDs and no INTs for a 120.1 passer rating.

### WITH THE CALL

ESPN is in its 14th season as host of the most successful series in sports television history, Monday Night Football. Play-by-play man Joe Tessitore is joined by analyst Booger McFarland for the 50th season of MNF broadcasts, with Lisa Salters reporting from the sidelines.



- ► Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since November 1929, heads up the Packers Radio Network that is made up of 50 stations in four states. Wayne Larrivee (play-by-play), two-time Packers Pro Bowler Larry McCarren (analyst) and three-time Packers Pro Bowler and two-time All-Pro **John Kuhn** (sideline) will call the action. McCarren first joined the team's broadcasts in 1995 and enters his 25th season calling Packers games. After originally being paired together in 1999, McCarren and Larrivee enter their 21st season of broadcasts together. They surpassed Jim Irwin and Max McGee for the most regular-season and postseason games broadcast for the Packers with 313 at the 2018 season opener against Chicago.
- ► The broadcast is also available on Sirius Satellite Radio (WTMJ feed).
- ▶ Westwood One Sports will air the game on radio across the country. Kevin Harlan (play-by-play) and James Lofton (analyst) will call the action, with Hub Arkush reporting from the sidelines and Jim Gray hosting the pregame and halftime shows.

### PACKERS VS. LIONS - WEEK 6

### STATS OF THE WEEK

- ▶RB Aaron Jones totaled 182 scrimmage yards (107 on 19 carries, 5.6 avg. and 75 yards on seven receptions, 10.7 avg.) and a franchise-record-tying four rushing touchdowns in a Week 5 win at Dallas. He was the first Packer to record four rushing TDs in a game since Dorsey Levens tallied four on 1/2/00 in a win over the Arizona Cardinals.
- ► Jones has a rushing TD in four consecutive games, the **longest** active streak in the NFL. He is one game away from matching his career-long streak of five games that he set in 2018 (Weeks 10-14).
- ► Jones was named NFC Offensive Player of the Week for his performance in Dallas, becoming the first Packer RB to earn the honor since Eddie Lacy in 2014 (Week 12).

#### **IMPROVING RUNNING GAME**

- ▶The Packers have rushed for 120-plus yards two times in the last four weeks (144 vs. Minnesota and 120 at Dallas), averaging over 4 yards per carry in both contests.
- ►RB Aaron Jones tied a franchise record with four rushing TDs in Week 5. It was the Packers' first game with four rushing TDs since Dec. 23, 2012, vs. Tennessee.
- ► Green Bay's 144 yards in Week 2 were the most rushing yards by the Packers in either Game 1 or 2 of the regular season since totaling 152 yards against Chicago in Game 2 of the 2004 season.
- ► Since 2016, the Packers rank **No. 4 in the NFL** in rushing average:


- ▶ Jones has two multi-rushing TD performances this season (Weeks 3 and 5) to tie for the most in the NFL.
- ▶ Dating back to 1950, Jones' two multi-rushing-TD performances this season (Week 3 and 5) are **tied for the ninth most** by a Packer in a single season. In 1962, Jim Taylor recorded the most in one season (five) by a Packer, according to pro-football-reference.com.
- ► Jones had nine plays from scrimmage of 10-plus yards in Week 5 at Dallas (six runs, three catches), the most by a Packer since WR Javon Walker on Dec. 19, 2004.
- ► Jones posted a rushing TD in Week 4, marking his sixth straight home game with a rushing TD to surpass Taylor (1964) and Ahman Green (2003) for the longest streak in franchise history.
- ►In Week 2, Jones set a career high with 23 carries for 116 yards (5.0 avg.) and a TD.
- ▶Jones put together an impressive 2018 season before an injury landed him on injured reserve after Week 15. He finished **No. 1 in the NFL** in rushing average (min. 100 att.) for the 2018 season, becoming the first Packer to lead the league in the category since the NFL went to a 16-game schedule in 1978:

▶ Dating back to 1991, Jones recorded the highest percentage of rushing plays that gained 10-plus yards (16.5) in a single season by a Packer in 2018 (min. 50 carries, Sportradar).



### PACKERS VS. LIONS - WEEK 6

### **OFFSEASON ADDITIONS ENHANCE DEFENSE**

Packers General Manager **Brian Gutekunst** and his staff made numerous moves to strengthen the roster this offseason and those moves have impacted the defenses strong start to the season:

- S Adrian Amos (A-miss), who joined the Packers after four seasons with the Chicago Bears. picked off QB Mitchell Trubisky in the end zone in Week 1on the Bears' second-to-last drive of the game to protect a 10-3 lead. He became the first player to record an interception in their first game with the Packers since Bryant Westbrook on October 13, 2002, according to the Elias Sports Bureau.
- ▶ Dating back to Week 9 of the 2018 season (including postseason), Amos is **tied for No. 3 in the NFL** with four interceptions.
- ►LB **Preston Smith** came to Green Bay after playing for the Washington Redskins for the past four years. Smith registered 1.5 sacks in Week 1, including taking down Trubisky on fourth down to seal the victory. It was the third time in his career that Smith recorded at least one sack in Week 1. He followed it up by picking off QB Kirk Cousins in Week 2.
- ► Smith is the **only player in the NFL** with 25-plus sacks, five-plus INTs and five-plus forced fumbles since 2015.
- ► He matched his career high set on Dec. 26, 2015 at Philadelphia with three sacks in Week 3 vs. Denver.
- ►LB Za'Darius (zuh-DARE-ee-us) Smith played in 58 regular-season games with 16 starts in four seasons for the Baltimore Ravens and ranked No. 2 among NFL linebackers in 2018 in QB hits (25) and tied for No. 6 in total pressures (sacks + hurries + knockdowns) with 35
- ► For the third year in a row, Z. Smith registered a sack in the season opener. He is **one of six NFL players** to record a sack in Week 1 each of the last three seasons (2017-19).
- ►Za'Darius recorded two sacks in Week 3 against Denver, marking his fourth career game with two-plus sacks.
- ► In the Week 5 win at Dallas, Preston (one) and Za'Darius (two) combined for three sacks and tied for the team lead with three QB pressures.
- ▶ Dating back to 2017, Z. Smith and P. Smith both rank in the top five among NFL linebackers in QB hits over that span (according to Sportradar):

#### **KENNY KEEPS IMPROVING**

In 2016, DL **Kenny Clark** became the youngest player to appear in a season opener for the Packers since Arnie Herber (20 years old) in 1930. After starting two of 16 games played as a rookie, Clark has started 30 games since the start of the 2017 season.

- ►After recording 4.5 sacks in 2017, Clark was second on the team with a career-high six sacks in 2018. He has started 2019 with 1.5 sacks.
- ► According to NFL Next Gen Stats, Clark ranks in the top five in the NFL among players that line up 75 percent of their snaps on the interior defensive line:

- ►Among players listed as DL, DT or NT on Sportradar, Clark is **tied for** No. 3 in the NFL with one forced fumble this season.
- ▶ Dating back to 2016, Clark has four forced fumbles and four fumble recoveries.
- ► Despite being placed on injured reserve following Week 16, Clark ranked No. 3 on the team in QB hits (seven) in 2018.
- ► Clark was **tied for No. 7 in the NFL** with two opponent fumble recoveries during the 2018 season.
- ► The former All-American from UCLA finished **No. 4 on the team** and led the defensive line with 78 tackles (39 solo) in 2017.





### **GETTING TO THE OB**

▶In 2018, the Packers finished in the top 10 in the NFL in fourth-quarter sacks (t-No. 4), third-down sacks (t-No. 6), sacks per pass attempt (No. 7) and total sacks (t-No. 8). The Green Bay defense has picked the pressure back up this season, ranking in the top 10 in numerous categories:

- ► According to Next Gen Stats, Green Bay ranks **No. 4 in the NFL** with a QB Pressured rate of 33.9 percent.
- ► Via Sportradar, the Packers rank **No. 7 in the NFL** in defender QB hit percentage (1.48).
- ►The Packers registered a season-high six sacks in Week 3, their most since posting six vs. Miami on Nov. 11, 2018.
- ▶ Dating back to 1982, the five sacks Green Bay registered at Chicago marked only the **fourth time** the Packers recorded five-plus sacks in the season opener (six in 2010, seven in 2001 and five in 1995).
- ► Green Bay is **tied for No. 2 in the NFL** this season with two games with five-plus sacks (pro-football-reference.com).
- ▶ Dating back to 1963, the Packers' two games with five-plus sacks are tied for the fourth-most by Green Bay in the first five games, trailing only the three five-plus sack games the Packers had in the first five games of the 2001, 2000 and 1978 seasons.
- ► Green Bay (**Preston Smith**, 5.5 / **Za'Darius Smith**, 5.0) is the only team to have two players register five-plus sacks this season (Sportradar).

### **DEFENSE STARTS STRONG**

After showing improvement in the first season under defensive coordinator **Mike Pettine**, the Green Bay defense has had a strong start to Year 2.

►The Packers have allowed 16 or fewer points three times this season, tied for No. 5 in the NFL.

►Green Bay ranks No. 8 in the NFL in points per game allowed this season:

- ▶Green Bay is tied for No. 8 in the NFL this season in opponent threeand-out drives (12).
- ►The Packers' 11 takeaways this season are their most through five games since 2011 (13).
- ▶The Packers posted four takeaways in Week 2 and three takeaways in Week 3, giving them back-to-back games with three-plus takeaways for the first time since Weeks 4-5 in 2017.
- ► Green Bay has a plus-7 turnover differential this season, **tied for the league lead** and the best by the Packers through the first five games since 2011 (plus-7).
- ►The Packers rank in the top 10 of the NFL in a few takeaway categories this season:

- ▶The three points the Packers have allowed in the first quarter this season are the fewest allowed in the first quarter in the first five games of a season since 2010 (also three points).
- ►In Week 4, Green Bay scored a TD on its opening drive for the third consecutive game, the Packers' longest since a four-game streak in 2017 (Weeks 2-5).
- ▶QB **Aaron Rodgers** ranks near the top of the NFL this season in a few passing categories in the first quarter (min. 20 pass att.):

### PACKERS VS. LIONS - WEEK 6

#### **NEW LEADER**

The Green Bay Packers named **Matt LaFleur** (la-flew-er) the 15th head coach in franchise history on Jan. 8, 2019.

- ►He is the first head coach in franchise history win four of his first five NFL games.
- ► He joined Vince Lombardi (3-0) as the only head coaches in franchise history to win their first three NFL games.
- ►It was the first time since 2015 and just the third time (2011) in the last 12 seasons that Green Bay has started 3-0.
- ►According to the Elias Sports Bureau, LaFleur joined John Harbaugh (2008) and Don Coryell (1973) as the only head coaches since the merger (1970) to win each of their first two games, both against divisional opponents.
- ►With a win at Chicago in Week 1, LaFleur became the sixth head coach in franchise history to win his first game, joining Curly Lambeau, Vince Lombardi, Phil Bengston, Forrest Gregg and Ray Rhodes. He joins Lombardi as the only Packers head coaches to beat the Bears in their first game.
- ► LaFleur became only the second coach to make his head-coaching debut in the NFL's primetime kickoff game (since 2002), joining Jim Zorn who made his debut with Washington in a losing effort against the New York Giants (16-7) in 2008.
- ▶ LaFleur is in his 11th season in the NFL in 2019, having served as an offensive coordinator for two seasons (Los Angeles Rams, 2017; Tennessee Titans, 2018), a quarterbacks coach for six seasons (Washington Redskins, 2010-13; Atlanta Falcons, 2015-16) and an offensive assistant for two seasons (Houston Texans, 2008-09).
- ▶ During his first 10 seasons in the NFL, LaFleur was a part of offensive staffs that helped their teams rank in the top 10 in the league in total yards seven times (2008-09, 2012-13, 2015-17). In three of his last six seasons in the NFL, he was on a staff that helped its offense finish in the top five in the league in scoring, highlighted by No. 1 rankings in 2016 with the Falcons and in 2017 with the Rams.
- ▶The former quarterback began his coaching career in 2003 at his alma mater, Saginaw Valley State. LaFleur has six seasons of coaching experience at the collegiate level, having also worked at Central Michigan (2004-05), Northern Michigan (2006), Ashland University (2007) and Notre Dame (2014).

### THE NEW STAFF

LaFleur explored various avenues to compile his coaching staff, bringing in new coaches and retaining some from the 2018 staff.

- ▶Offensive coordinator Nathaniel Hackett brings 10 years of NFL experience to Green Bay, including five as an offensive coordinator (Buffalo, 2013-14; Jacksonville, 2016-18). In 2017, he guided the Jaguars to a No. 1 league ranking in rushing (141.4 ypg) for the first time in team history on their way to an appearance in the AFC Championship Game.
- ▶ Defensive coordinator **Mike Pettine** was retained after a 2018 season that featured 16 different players with at least a half-sack, the second most in team history (since 1982) behind only the 1987 campaign (strike season) that saw 17 players register a half-sack or more. The defense finished 2018 tied for No. 8 in the league in sacks (44), the most by Green Bay since 2013, and No. 12 in the NFL in pass defense (234.5 ypg) after finishing No. 23 in the category in 2017.
- ► Special teams coordinator **Shawn Mennenga** (MEN-in-guh) begins his eighth season in the NFL and returns to the league after leading the special teams at Vanderbilt last season. From 2011-17, he served as the special teams assistant for the Cleveland Browns, assisting Chris Tabor as the team ranked No. 7 in the league over that span in both punt return average (9.9) and opponent kickoff return average (21.8).
- ▶ Chris Gizzi, who served as a strength and conditioning assistant from 2014-18, was promoted to strength and conditioning coordinator. As a player, he appeared in 23 games for the Packers as a linebacker in 2000-01, ranking No. 5 on the team with eight tackles on special teams in 2000. Gizzi will lead a staff that consists of Mark Lovat, Thadeus Jackson and Grant Thorne.
- ▶Quarterbacks coach Luke Getsy returns to the Packers after spending last season as the offensive coordinator/wide receivers coach for Mississippi State. Over his last two seasons in Green Bay (2016-17), Getsy worked as the wide receivers coach after originally joining the

- Packers in 2014 as the offensive quality control coach.
- ▶ Defensive line coach **Jerry Montgomery** is entering his fifth season with the Packers and second as defensive line coach. He worked as the defensive front assistant for Green Bay from 2015-17. Montgomery has helped with the development of DL Kenny Clark, who recorded 10.5 sacks over the past two seasons, the most among Packers defensive linemen and second most on the team over that span.
- ▶ Inside linebackers coach **Kirk Olivadotti** (ah-luh-vuh-DOT-ee) joins the Packers after coaching for the Washington Redskins for 16 seasons. He is one of 11 members of the Redskins' assistant coach honor roll, which recognizes coaches with at least 10 seasons of service as an assistant in Washington. During his time with the Redskins, Washington ranked in the top 10 in the NFL in overall defense eight times.
- ▶ Tight ends coach **Justin Outten** (OW-ten) was the offensive assistant for the Atlanta Falcons the past two seasons (2017-18). He began with the Falcons as an offensive intern in 2016. Over the last three seasons, Atlanta averaged 27.2 points per game (No. 4 in the NFL over that span) and 389.9 yards per game (No. 3 in the league over that span).
- ▶ Defensive backs coach **Jason Simmons** is entering his ninth season with the Packers having worked in various roles (secondary in 2018, assistant special teams coach from 2015-17, defensive/special teams assistant in 2014 and a coaching administrator from 2011-13). Before coaching, he played for 10 years in the NFL as a defensive back and was a standout on special teams during his career.
- ▶ Running backs coach **Ben Sirmans** is entering his fourth season in that position for the Packers. From 2016-18, Green Bay led the NFL with an average of 4.66 yards per carry, including an average of 5.01 yards per carry in 2018 (No. 2 in the NFL) that was the second-best single-season mark in team history. He joined the Packers after spending the previous four seasons (2012-15) as the running backs coach for the St. Louis Rams.
- ▶Outside linebackers coach **Mike Smith** joins the Packers after spending the last three seasons with the Kansas City Chiefs, first as the assistant defensive line coach in 2016-17 and then coaching outside linebackers last season. In 2018, Smith coached Dee Ford, who was selected to his first Pro Bowl after tying for the NFL lead with seven forced fumbles and tying for No. 2 among NFL linebackers with a career-high 13 sacks.
- ▶Offensive line coach Adam Stenavich (STEN-uh-vitch) comes to the Packers after serving as the assistant offensive line coach for the San Francisco 49ers the last two seasons. He helped coach a line that cleared the way for RB Matt Breida to average 4.96 yards per carry in 2016-17, ranking No. 5 in the NFL over that span (min. 200 att.). The Marshfield, Wis., native played left tackle at Michigan (2002-05) and was named first-team All-Big Ten in 2004-05. Following his collegiate career, Stenavich spent time with a few NFL teams, including a stint on the Packers' practice squad in 2006.
- ► Wide receivers coach Alvis Whitted (WHITT-id), who played wide receiver for nine seasons in the NFL, worked for the last seven years as the wide receivers coach at Colorado State. During his tenure at CSU, Whitted mentored three All-America wide receivers, including two consensus first-team All-Americans who also were finalists for the Biletnikoff Award (Michael Gallup in 2017 and Rashard Higgins in 2014).
- ► Assistant offensive line coach **Luke Butkus** comes to Green Bay after serving as the offensive line coach for the University of Illinois for the past three seasons (2016-18), a position he also held for the Fighting Illini in 2012. Between the two stints at his alma mater, he was the assistant offensive line coach for the Jacksonville Jaguars (2013-15).
- ► Assistant defensive backs coach Ryan Downard begins his second season in Green Bay after serving as the defensive quality control coach last year. He came to Green Bay after working at Bowling Green for two seasons, serving as the safeties coach in 2017 and the director of football operations in 2016.
- ► Assistant special teams coach **Maurice Drayton** was retained and is entering his fourth season coaching in the NFL. He worked as the assistant special teams coach for each of the past three seasons (Green Bay in 2018 and the Indianapolis Colts in 2016-17).
- ▶Offensive assistant Jason Vrable enters his seventh season as an assistant coach in the NFL, previously working for the New York Jets (2017-18) and Buffalo Bills (2013-16).
- The staff also consists of four quality control coaches: Wendel Davis (defense), Kevin Koger (offense), Christian Parker (defense) and Rayna Stewart (special teams).

MATT LaFLEUR...In his first season as the Packers' 15th head coach.

- ▶ In his 11th season in the NFL, having served as an offensive coordinator for two seasons (Los Angeles Rams, 2017; Tennessee Titans, 2018), a quarterbacks coach for six seasons (Washington Redskins, 2010-13; Atlanta Falcons, 2015-16), and an offensive assistat for two seasons (Houston Texans, 2008-09).
- ► Guided the Titans' offense in 2018 to a No. 7 league ranking in rushing (126.4 ypg) as Tennessee registered 11 games with 100-plus rushing yards, tied for No. 2 in the NFL.
- ► Helped the Rams lead the league in scoring with an average of 29.9 points per game in 2017, more than doubling their average from 2016 (14.0 ppg).
- ►Tutored QB Matt Ryan, who led the league in passer rating (117.1) in 2016 on his way to being named NFL Most Valuable Player by The Associated Press.
- ► Coached rookie QB Robert Griffin III with the Redskins in 2012, who became the first QB in team history to win AP Offensive Rookie of the Year.

MATT PATRICIA...Is in his second year as the Lions' 27th head coach.

- ► His first season as head coach featured an improvement in the running game, highlighted by rookie RB Kerryon Johnson, who produced two 100-yard rushing performances and three touchdowns.
- ► Served on the New England Patriots' coaching staff from 2004-17, including six years (2012-17) as defensive coordinator.
- ► Helped lead the Patriots to three Super Bowl championships (XXXIX, XLIX, LI), six AFC championships and 13 AFC East division titles.
- ▶ From 2012-17, led a Patriots defense that ranked third in points allowed (19.2), fourth in games allowing 20 points or fewer (53) and second in games allowing 17 points or fewer (47).

### THE PACKERS-LIONS SERIES

- ► The Week 17 victory in 2016 gave the Packers their 100th win (including playoffs) against the Lions franchise. Green Bay's 100 victories against Detroit are the club's most against any one opponent.
- ► Green Bay won 29 of the first 38 matchups in the series before the Lions reeled off 11 straight wins over a six-year span (1949-54).
- ► The Packers are 39-17 overall and 22-3 at Lambeau Field against Detroit since the start of the 1992 season.
- The teams have met twice in the postseason, with the first playoff matchup in the Wild Card round of the 1993 season. That game saw QB Brett Favre find WR Sterling Sharpe for a game-winning 40-yard score with less than a minute to go, marking the first playoff win for the Packers in more than 10 years.

Additionally, Franklin was a player personnel intern with the Lions in 2008...Green Bay TE Robert Tonyan signed with Detroit as an undrafted free agent in 2017 and spent his first offseason with the Lions...Lions DT Mike Daniels was drafted in the fourth round of the 2012 NFL Draft by Green Bay and played the previous seven seasons for the Packers...Detroit T Rick Wagner is from West Allis, Wis., and was a team captain for the Wisconsin Badgers, starting 37 games during his college career...Lions G Beau Benzschawel is from Grafton, Wis., and made 49 consecutive starts for the Wisconsin Badgers... Lions offensive coordinator Darren Bevell spent six seasons on the Green Bay coaching staff, serving as offensive assistant/quality control coach (2000-01), offensive assistant (2002) and quarterbacks coach (2003-05)... Bevell played quarterback at Wisconsin, where he set 19 school records, and helped lead the Badgers to their first Rose Bowl victory...Lions special teams coordinator John Bonamego served in the same role in Green Bay for three seasons (2003-05)...Lions head equipment manager Tim O'Neil spent six seasons às an equipment assistant in Green Bay (1995-2000)... Lions national scout Mark Olson is from Hudson, Wis., and attended the University of Wisconsin-River Falls...Packers defensive line coach Jerry Montgomery served in the same role at Michigan from 2011-12...Green Bay running backs coach Ben Sirmans coached at Michigan State for two seasons (2005-06)...Detroit defensive backs coach Brian Stewart coached in Houston while Packers secondary coach Jason Simmons played for the Texans (2002-03)...Lions DT Damon Harrison signed as a rookie free agent with the N.Y. - ► Rodgers threw for 422 yards in Week 4 this season, extending his **franchise record** to eight 400-plus yard games. No other quarterback in franchise annals has more than one 400-yard-passing game (four QBs with one).
- ► Since 2018, Rodgers is **tied for No. 1 in the NFL** (Ryan Fitzpatrick) with four 400-yard passing games.
- ►In 2018, Rodgers threw for 442 yards, three touchdowns and zero interceptions at Detroit in Week 5 and then recorded 425 yards, two touchdowns and zero interceptions in Week 6, becoming the first player in NFL history to have back-to-back 400-yard games with no INTs. Rodgers added 442 yards against the Jets in Week 16 to become the first QB in NFL history to have three games with 425-plus passing yards in a season.
- ▶Rodgers reached 40,000 passing yards in his 154th career game (Week 5 at Detroit, 2018). At the time, he had 323 passing TDs, becoming the first quarterback in NFL history to reach 40,000 passing yards and 300 TD passes in fewer than 157 games, the number in which both Peyton Manning and Dan Marino reached the two marks.
- ► Rodgers tied Manning for the **fourth-fewest games to reach 40,000 passing yards**, trailing Matt Ryan (151), Drew Brees (152) and Marino (153), according to the Elias Sports Bureau.

### **RODGERS AND TOUCHDOWNS**

QB Aaron Rodgers has found the end zone a lot in his career.

- ► Rodgers is one of six QBs with six-plus passing TDs and one or fewer interceptions this season.
- ▶ Last season was the first time in his career that Rodgers registered 25-plus touchdowns and two or fewer interceptions in a season (25/2). Dating back to 1920, he was the **third player in the NFL** with 25-plus TDs and two or fewer INTs in a single season (Tom Brady, 28/2 in 2016 and Nick Foles, 27/2 in 2013), according to pro-football-reference.com.
- ▶In Week 2 of 2017, Rodgers became the 11th NFL player to throw 300 passing touchdowns, reaching the mark in his 144th career game to pass Peyton Manning and Dan Marino (157) for the fewest games needed to reach 300 passing TDs in NFL history.
- ► Rodgers reached 300 passing TDs on his 4,742nd pass attempt, surpassing Manning (5,306) for the fewest in league history.
- ► Rodgers also became the first quarterback to reach 300 passing TDs before throwing 100 interceptions. His 73 interceptions passed Brady (115) for the fewest at the time of reaching 300 passing TDs.
- ► With a league-best 40 passing TDs during the 2016 regular season, Rodgers became just the fourth QB in NFL history to record two seasons (also 2011) with 40-plus TD passes (Marino, Manning, Brees). It was his franchise-record fourth season (2011-12, 2014, 2016) with 35-plus TD passes (Brett Favre, three, 1995-97).
- ► Rodgers has five seasons with 4,000-plus passing yards and 30-plus passing TDs (2009, 2011-12, 2014, 2016), the most in team history.
- ► In 2016, Rodgers registered his third straight season with 30-plus touchdown passes, the second-longest streak in franchise history (Favre, five straight, 1994-98).

### **ASCENDING ADAMS**

WR **Davante Adams** has continued to get better as his career has gone on. He is the **only player in the NFL** to record 70-plus receptions, 850-plus receiving yards and 10-plus receiving touchdowns in each of the past three seasons (2016-18), earning Pro Bowl honors in each of the last two seasons.

- ▶ Despite missing the final 10 minutes of the game in Week 4 due to injury, WR **Davante Adams** posted a career-high 180 receiving yards on 10 catches, eclipsing his previous career best of 166 yards receiving at Seattle on Nov. 15, 2018.
- ►Adams joined Don Hutson as the only players in franchise history to have two games with 10-plus receptions and 165-plus receiving yards.
- ►Adams is the only player in the league to have a 10-catch, 165-yard game in both of the last two seasons.
- ►Adams posted 10-plus catches for the eighth time in his career, setting a franchise record (WRs Sterling Sharpe and Donald Driver, seven each).
- ▶ Adams' 107 receiving yards in the first quarter of Week 4 were the most by a Packer in a first quarter since WR Javon Walker registered 121 receiving yards at Indianapolis on Sept. 26, 2004. Adams' 158 receiving yards in the first half were the most by a Packer in a first half since WR Antonio Freeman posted 169 yards vs. Tennessee on Dec. 20, 1998.
- ► With 10-plus receiving touchdowns in each season from 2016-18 (12 in 2016, 10 in 2017 and 13 in 2018), Adams joined Sharpe (1992-94) and Hutson (1941-43) as the only players in franchise history to register 10-plus TD catches in three straight seasons.
- ► Adams joined Steelers WR Antonio Brown as the **only players in the league** to record two seasons with 12-plus receiving TDs from 2016-18.

It was the third time in his career he led the league in lowest interception percentage, tying Bart Starr for the most in team history. Rodgers is tied for No. 3 in NFL history with Starr and four others behind only Sammy Baugh (five times) and Tom Brady (four).
- ▶Rodgers' streak of consecutive attempts without an INT ended at 402 in Week 15 of 2018. He had surpassed Patriots QB Tom Brady (358 in 2010-11) for the longest streak in league history.
- ▶ Rodgers recorded nine straight zero-INT games (min. 15 att.) during the 2018 season (Weeks 5-6, 8-14) to tie for the second-longest streak in NFL history behind only Brady (11 games in 2010).
- ►In 2018, Rodgers did not throw an INT in 13 games, tied for the most (2014) in a season in team annals (min. 15 att.).

▶In Weeks 8 and 11 of the 2018 season, QB **Aaron Rodgers** tied his single-game career high by completing three passes of 40-plus yards. His 16 completions of 40-plus yards in 2018 were tied (2008) for the second most he has thrown in a single-season (17 in 2009).

### **BREAKING DOWN THE ROSTER**

The Packers have a 53-man roster that is composed of 25 offensive players, 25 defensive players and three specialists.

- ▶ Of the 53 players on Green Bay's roster, 28 of them (52.8 percent) were draft picks of the Packers. Green Bay has seven players that were drafted in the first round, including six that were selected by the Packers.
- ► Green Bay has 14 players on the roster that began their careers as undrafted free agents.
- ▶ Over a third of the players (21 of 53, 39.6 percent) on Green Bay's roster entered the league as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as an undrafted player.

► Of the 53 players on the roster, 47 of them (88.7 percent) are 28 years old or younger (as of Oct. 14) and 23 players (43.4 percent) are 24 years old or younger.

### ON THE ROAD AGAIN

Green Bay went 7-1 away from Lambeau Field in 2011, with the seven road wins setting a single-season franchise record.

- ▶ Dating back to 2000, the Packers have been able to stay above the .500 mark on the road, a notable achievement in the National Football League.
- ► Since 2000, Green Bay is one of only six NFL teams to have a regularseason road record above .500.

#### **345 AND COUNTING**

Another packed house at Lambeau Field against the Philadelphia Eagles in Week 4 of 2019 brought the stadium's consecutive-sellouts streak to 345 regular-season games (not including replacement games).

- ▶The league's longest-tenured stadium, Lambeau Field hosts its 63rd season of football in 2019. For the victory over Dallas in the Divisional round of the 2014 playoffs, Packers fans set a new Lambeau Field paid-attendance record (79,704).
- ► Across American professional sports, only Boston's Fenway Park (1912) and Chicago's Wrigley Field (1914) have longer tenures.

#### THE LAMBEAU ADVANTAGE

The crown jewel of the National Football League, Lambeau Field has long been known as one of the tougher venues to play in, particularly during the harsh Wisconsin winter.

- ▶ Re-establishing home-field advantage after a 4-4 mark in 2008 was one of the goals of 2009, and with the Packers finishing 6-2 at home, they accomplished that goal. Green Bay followed that up with a 7-1 mark at Lambeau Field in 2010, a perfect 8-0 record in 2011, the first undefeated home mark since 2002, and a 7-1 mark in 2012. The Packers were one of two teams to finish undefeated at home during the 2014 regular season (Denver).
- ► Green Bay was 5-2-1 (.786) at home in 2018, marking the eighth time in the last 10 seasons that the Packers won five-plus games at home.
- ► Since Ron Wolf and Mike Holmgren began the revitalization of the franchise in 1992, Green Bay owns the best home record in the NFL. A look at the top regular-season home W-L records since the '92 season:

### A LOOK AT THE SCHEDULE

The Green Bay Packers' 2019 NFL regular-season schedule – highlighted by five prime-time contests (subject to flexible scheduling) on the original schedule for the sixth straight year (2014-19) – was released April 17 by the National Football League.

- ► The Packers will face 2018 playoff teams in six games this season (Chicago, Philadelphia, Dallas, Kansas City, L.A. Chargers), with four of those contests taking place on the road.
- ► The Packers opened the season at the Chicago Bears in the NFL's Thursday night regular-season opener. It marked the fourth time in team history that Green Bay opened at Chicago (1979, 1981, 2015).
- ► The Packers opened their home slate in Week 2 against the Minnesota Vikings, marking just the fourth time (2003, 2008, 2018) since the NFC North was formed in 2002 that Green Bay has played division opponents in both of the first two games.
- ►Green Bay stayed at home both of the next two weeks, the first time the Packers have played three straight at home in September since 1990 (Weeks 1-3). They hosted the Denver Broncos in Week 3 and the Philadelphia Eagles in a Thursday night matchup in Week 4.
- ► The Packers traveled to take on the Dallas Cowboys in Week 5. It was the seventh matchup between the two teams (including postseason) since 2013, and Green Bay improved to 6-1 with a win.
- ► For the second time in three seasons, the Packers will host the Detroit Lions on *Monday Night Football*, this time in Week 6. It is the fifth Monday night matchup between the two clubs (1964, 1971, 1972, 2017).
- ►A home game against the Oakland Raiders in Week 7 will be the Packers' fifth at Lambeau in 2019, marking the most home contests for Green Bay in the first seven games of a season since 1978 when it also played five at home (not including the 1987 strike year).
- ▶In Week 8, Green Bay is at Kansas City in a Sunday night matchup.
- ▶The following week, Green Bay travels to Los Angeles to take on the Chargers. While it's the first time the Packers will play the Chargers since they moved to Los Angeles, it is the seventh away game against the Chargers, and Green Bay has won the previous six.
- ► In Week 10, the Packers host the Carolina Panthers in the fourth contest between the two teams in the last six years (2014, 2015, 2017).
- ►Green Bay will have its bye the following week, marking the first Week 11 bye for the Packers and the latest for the team since the bye was reintroduced in 1990.
- ► Over the next two weeks, Green Bay will crisscross the country, playing at the San Francisco 49ers in Week 12 and at the New York Giants in Week 13.
- ►In Week 14, the Packers take on the Washington Redskins in the third matchup between the two in the last five years (including the postseason), but the first in Green Bay since 2013.
- ► Week 15 has the Bears coming to Green Bay. The Packers are 10-2 alltime at home against the Bears in December/January games.
- ►The Packers close out the regular season with two road games for the first time since 2004 when they played at Minnesota and Chicago.
- ►In Week 16, Green Bay is at the Vikings and on MNF for the second time on the season. The Packers last played two Monday games in the same regular season in 2009.
- ► Green Bay will close out the regular season against the Lions for the fourth straight year and the fifth time in the last six seasons.

CHICAGO (AP) — The Green Bay Packers beat the Chicago Bears by on Thursday night, 10-3. And while it was ugly on offense, likely in great part due to the lack of action so many regulars on that side of the ball got in the preseason, it was a thing of beauty for the defenders in green, gold and white. On this night, the Packers were the Monsters of the Midway.

There was plenty of noise heading into Soldier Field about Chicago's D, which was dominant in 2018 as the Bears won the NFC North. And it played quite well against Aaron Rodgers and the Pack, sacking Rodgers the times and yielding only 213 yards.

But the Packers were stingler.

The Packers defense totaled five sacks on a clearly befuddled Mitchell Trubisky. The only turnover of the game was a fourth-quarter

pick in the end zone by former Bears safety Adrian Amos.

Green Bay went into the end zone on an 8-yard jump-ball reception by tight end Jimmny Graham — a former college basketball player who boxed out to perfection on the play. That was the difference, thanks to the stingy Packers D.

The game also was marked by sloppy offense and penalties. But the Packers made the fewest mistakes and now lead the league's longest series 98-95-6. Green Bay has won 16 of the last 19 regular-season meetings, and Rodgers is 17-5.

Chicago's defense hardly slacked, getting five sacks — tying the most it has had against Rodgers. But it could do little with the ball and

Trubisky never found his stride. He even was sacked on Chicago's final offensive play.

Mason Crosby made a 39-yard field goal in the final period for Green Bay, while Chicago got a 38-yarder from Eddy Pineiro. Bears fans rejoiced in relief on the first score of the season: Pineiro's first-quarter field goal. The last such kick on Soldier Field was Cody Parkey's double-doink off the goalpost and crossbar that sent Chicago home from the wild-card round.

Each team had 10 penalties, there was a total of 467 yards of only offense, and several drops. At one point, Chicago had three straight penalties to put it in a first-and-40. No, the Bears didn't convert.

It was a rough staff in the opening series for Green Bay, A run and a pass netted zero yards, then Rodgers was sacked heavily by Royenson-Harris for a 10-yard loss. Rodgers was sacked again on the next three-and-out and Chicago took over at the Packers 36 after a punt. Chicago had forced 17 yards in losses on those series, and the Packers had minus-12 yards through one period.

Rodgers got it going at the start of the second quarter, launching a 47-yard completion to Marquez Valdes-Scantling. Two more completions got the Pack to the 8, and Graham then scored.

By halftime, Green Bay had outgained Chicago 119 yards to 98.

GREEN BAY, Wis. (AP) — All that mattered to Aaron Rodgers on Sunday was that the Packers won.

Rodgers threw two early touchdowns and Green Bay held on for a 21-16 victory over the Minnesota Vikings.

On a day when the Packers honored late hall of Fame Bart Starr at haftime, Rodgers but on quite a show — particularly early. Rodgers completed nine of his first 10 passes for 134 yards and two touchdowns and had a perfect 158.3 rating through the first quarter. He finished 22 of 34 for 209 yards.

Rodgers and new coach Mart LaFleur experimented with Rodgers wearing a playcall wristband in the hope that it would speed up the play-calling

process and get the offense out of the huddle quicker.

After scoring on each of its first three possessions, Green Bay's offense failed to muster another point. But the hot start was enough to win.

The Packers remained unbeaten under LaFleur after opening the NFL's 100th season with a victory at rival Chicago. They also beat the Vikings (1-1) for the fifth time in the past seven games at Lambeau Field.

Minnesota's Dalvin Cook had a career-high 154 yards and a touchdown on 20 carries. It was the third-year pro's second consecutive game with

over 100 yards rushing. Cook also had 37 yards receiving in the loss.

After throwing the ball just 10 times in the opener against Atlanta, Kirk Cousins finished 14 of 32 with 230 yards, a touchdown and two interceptions. Cousins was picked of by Kevin King in the end zone late in the fourth quarter.

The Vikings are 5-2-1 in last their eight meetings against Green Bay.

Rodgers and Davante Adams connected on a 35-yard completion on the Packers first offensive play. Rodgers found running back Jamaal Williams for a 15-yard touchdown to cap a four-play. Z5-yard drive.

Adams finished with 106 yards on seven catches.

Green Bay took over at the Vikings' 33 after defensive lineman Kenny Clark sacked Cousins, forcing a fumble. Dean Lowry recovered the loose ball. The Packers took a commanding 21-0 lead two minutes into the second quarter on a 2-yard run by Aaron Jones.

After rushing for 111 yards and two touchdowns in a win last week against the Falcons, Cook broke out for a 75-yard score following a missed.

GREEN BAY, Wis. (AP) — Aaron Rodgers thought his jersey never looked so clean following a game.

The offensive line kept Rodgers upright, the two-time MVP threw for 235 yards and a touchdown, and Aaron Jones tied a career high by running for two scores to lead the Green Bay Packers to a 27-16 victory over the Denver Broncos on Sunday.

For the third straight game, Von Miller, Bradley Chubb and the Denver defense failed to record a sack or force a turnover.

The Broncos (0-3) fell to 0-6-1 all-time on the road against the Packers.

While Rodgers stayed clean, Joe Flacco did not. Preston Smitt matched a career high with three sacks as Green Bay got to Flacco six times and forced three turnovers to lead the Packers (3-0) to the win despite being dominated in time of possession, 35:34 to 24:26.

Flacco was 20 of 29 for 213 yards with an interception and no touchdowns.

Rodgers found Marquez Valdes-Scantling on a 40-yard strike on the opening drive and finished 17 of 29. Jones' touchdown runs came from 7

yards and 1 yard out.
Following Valdes-Scantling's first score of the season, Flacco and the Broncos' offense spoiled a 60-yard kickoff return by Diontae Spencer, going

more than eight minutes three-and-out on their first possession. But Denver tied it at 7 on a 1-yard run by Phillip Lindsay at the start of the second quarter. The score capped a 15-play, 75-yard drive that ate up

Mason Crosby put the Packers ahead on a 42-yard field goal with 11:19 to go in the first half. The Broncos answered about eight minutes later with a field goal of their own.

Green Bay's new-look defense continued its impressive start to the season. After a sack by Za'Darius Smith, who finished the day with two, fellow newcomer Smith followed with one of his three sacks. Flacco coughed up the ball and Rashan Gary recovered it at the Broncos' 5. Jones ran it in from the 7 and Green Bay took a 17-10 lead into the locker room.

Packers comerback Jaire Alexander opened the third quarter by recording his first career forced fumble recovery after stripping Noah Fant on a 4-yard completion. Green Bay took advantage as Rodgers hit fullback Damy Vitale for a 27-yard gain that put the ball on the 1 before Jones ran it in for his second touchdown to make it 24-10. It was Jones' second career multi-touchdown game. The third-year running back also had two

rushing touchdowns last season against the Dolphins.

Lindsay cut it to 24-16 on a 1-yard run with about six minutes left in the third. Brandon McManus missed the extra point.

Jones had exactly twice as many scrimmage yards as two-time rushing champion Ezeklei Elliott, who finished with 62 yards on the ground after the Cowboys had to abandon the part of the game their offense is built on to try to erase the four-touchdown deficit.

Cooper had a 53-yard touchdown among his 11 catches and Michael Gallup had 113 yards receiving with a 40-yard score. Prescott, who had never lost when throwing for more than 275 yards, was 27 of 44.

The Cowboys finished with 563 yards, the most they we ever had in a loss. It topped the 554 yards they had in a 26-21 loss to Detroit in 1985. Not long after Cooper's miscue landed in Jaire Alexander's arms in a scoreless game early, the Cowboys were behind for good.

#### 17 Davante Adams, WR, 6th Year, Fresno State

- Led the team with a career-high 111 receptions in 2018, the second most in team history behind only WR Sterling Sharpe's 112 in 1993, for a career-best 1,386 yards (12.5 avg.) and a career-high 13 TDs on his way to earning Pro Bowl honors for the second straight year, his first as an original selection.
- Was the only player in the NFL with 70-plus receptions and 10-plus TD catches in each of the last three seasons (2016-18). Joins Sharpe (1992-94) as the only players in team history to accomplish the feat in three straight seasons.
- Has 35 receiving TDs since 2016, No. 2 in the league (WR Antonio Brown, 37) over that span. Has caught at least one TD pass in 28 games since '16, tops in the NFL over that span.
- Is the lone player in the league to have 10-plus receiving TDs each of the past three seasons (2016-18). Joins WR Don Hutson (1941-43) and Sharpe (1992-94) as the only players in team history to do so in three straight seasons.
- Leads the league with 26 receiving TDs in the red zone since 2016, four more than any other player in the NFL.
- Has posted eight games in his career with 10-plus catches, the most in franchise history (WRs Sterling Sharpe and Donald Driver, seven each).
- **2019 SEASON:** Has started all four games he has appeared in and leads the team with 25 receptions for 378 yards (15.1 avg.)...Ranks No. 13 in the NFL in receiving yards despite missing one game...Has picked up a first down on 80 percent of his receptions (20 of 25), good for No. 3 in the league among players with 20-plus catches, with his 20 receiving first downs ranking tied for No. 9 in the league.
- ►At Chicago (Sept. 5): Started and appeared on 62 of 64 snaps, tying for the team lead with four receptions for 36 yards (9.0 avg.), with three of the catches picking up first downs.
- ▶Vs. - ▶Vs. Denver (Sept. 22): Started and played 52 of 57 snaps, finishing with four receptions for 56 yards (14.0 avg.)...Early in the second quarter, made a back-shoulder catch near the sideline for 22 yards to the Denver 28 against CB Chris Harris.
- ▶Vs. Philadelphia (Sept. 26): Started and played 57 of 81 snaps, posting a career-high 180 receiving yards on 10 receptions (18.0 avg.)...It marked his eighth career game with 10-plus receptions as he moved past WRs Sterling Sharpe and Donald Driver (seven each) to set a new team record...Joined Don Hutson as the only players in team history to post two games with 10-plus catches and 165-plus receiving yards...Racked up 107 receiving yards on six catches (17.8 avg.) in the first quarter, the most receiving yards in a first guarter by a Packer since WR Javon Walker registered 121 yards at Indianapolis in the first quarter on Sept. 26, 2004... Finished the first half with 158 receiving yards, the most by a Packer in a first half since WR Antonio Freeman had 169 yards vs. Tennessee on Dec. 20, 1998...Posted two receptions of 40-plus yards for just the third time in his career (Weeks 8 and 11, 2018)...On the Packers' third play from scrimmage, beat CB Sidney Jones down the sideline for a 58-yard gain to the Philadelphia 7 to set up RB Aaron Jones' 3-yard TD run two plays later...Made a 40-yard catch on a third-and-10 in the second quarter, spinning away from CB Avante Maddox to take it down the sideline to the Philadelphia 36...Made a 13-yard catch on a third-and-6 with a little more

than 10 minutes remaining in the game, but sustained a toe injury on the play and did not return.

►At Dallas (Oct. 6): Inactive (toe).

#### 90 Montravius Adams, DL, 3rd Year, Auburn

- Played in all 16 games with one start in 2018, seeing action on defense and special teams. Posted 26 tackles (17 solo), 1½ sacks, six tackles for a loss, a forced fumble and three quarterback pressures.
- After a foot injury sidelined him for most of training camp and the first two regular-season games, saw action in seven games as a rookie in 2017, recording five tackles (one solo) and a QB hit.

- Was named to the PFWA's All-Rookie team after leading the team with 15 passes defensed. Became just the second Packers CB to be honored since 1974 (CB Casey Hayward, 2012).
- Appeared in 13 games with 11 starts as a rookie and ranked No. 2 on the team with 76 tackles (61 solo) while adding a half-sack, three tackles for a loss, an interception and a QB pressure.
- In Week 8 at the Los Angeles Rams, finished with five passes defensed, the most by a Green Bay defender during the 2018 season.
- Earned second-team All-Atlantic Coast Conference recognition as a sophomore in 2016 after posting a team-high five interceptions (tied for No. 11 in the country) along with a career-best 39 tackles (31 solo) and 14 passes defensed.

**2019 SEASON:** Has started all five games and has registered 22 tackles (14 solo), an interception, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and a teamhigh 11 passes defensed.

- ▶ At Chicago (Sept. 5): Started and played all 73 snaps, finishing with six tackles (two solo) and two passes defensed...Late in the first quarter, got his right hand in to break up a pass from QB Mitchell Trubisky intended for WR Taylor Gabriel...Late in the fourth quarter with the Packers holding a 10-3 lead and the Bears driving, broke up a pass from Trubisky intended for TE Adam Shaheen near the sideline at the Green Bay 10.

- Despite being limited to just five games due to injury in 2018, registered a career-best 303 yards receiving and matched his career high with two receiving TDs on 20 receptions (15.2 avg.)
- Led the team with a career-high 122 receiving yards on a career-best six catches (20.3 avg.) in Week 3 vs. Cincinnati in 2017, highlighted by his career-long 72-yard grab in overtime that set up K Mason Crosby's gamewinning 27-yard field goal.

**2019 SEASON:** Has appeared in all five games with one start and has posted 10 receptions for 104 yards (10.4 avg.) and two TDs (tied for team lead) along with one carry for 7 yards...Has registered one tackle on special teams

▶ At Chicago (Sept. 5): Appeared on 32 plays on offense.

▶Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 15): Played 34 snaps and hauled in four passes for 25 yards (6.3 avg.) and a TD...On Green Bay's second possession, made a leaping catch over CB Nate Meadors in the end zone on a pass from QB Aaron Rodgers for a 12-vard TD.

#### 31 Adrian Amos, S, 5th Year, Penn State

- Played in 60 games with 56 starts for the Chicago Bears over four seasons (2015-18), recording 305 tackles (244 solo), 17 passes defensed, three interceptions, three forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries, 13 tackles for a loss, two sacks and seven tackles on special teams.
- Was one of four NFL safeties (Malcolm Jenkins, Eddie Jackson, Mike Adams) to register at least three INTs, three forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries from 2016-18, according to pro-football-reference.com.
- Started all 16 games on a defense that finished No. 1 in the NFL in 2018 in points allowed per game (17.7), yards per play (4.78), takeaways (36) and interceptions (27), and set career highs in passes defensed (eight) and interceptions (two).
- Named to PFWA's All-Rookie team in 2015 after he became the first Bears rookie to lead the team in tackles (based on coaches review) since LB Brian Urlacher in 2000.

**2019 SEASON:** Has started all five games and has registered 30 tackles

(23 solo), four tackles for a loss (tied for team lead), an interception, a pass defensed, a QB hit and a QB pressure...Is tied for No. 2 on the team with three tackles on special teams.

▶At Chicago (Sept. 5): Started and played all 73 snaps, recording five tackles (three solo), a tackle for a loss and an interception...On a third-and-1 play early in the second quarter, teamed with DL Kenny Clark to stuff WR Cordarrelle Patterson in the backfield for a 2-yard loss to force a three-and-out...With just over two minutes remaining in the game and the Packers holding a 10-3 lead, came over the top to intercept a QB Mitchell Trubisky pass intended for WR Allen Robinson in the end zone on a third-and-10 play from the 16...Became the first player to register an INT in his first game with the Packers since CB Bryant Westbrook did so at New England on Oct. 13, 2002...Also led the team with two tackles on special teams.

▶Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 15): Started and played all 65 snaps... Registered four solo tackles, including two tackles for a loss...Late in the third quarter, came up to bring down TE Irv Smith Jr. for a 1-yard loss on a pass in the flat...Added a tackle on special teams.

▶Vs. Denver (Sept. 22): Started and played all 73 snaps, recording a season-high 10 tackles (seven solo) and a QB pressure.

►Vs. Philadelphia (Sept. 26): Started and appeared on all 62 snaps, finishing with seven tackles (five solo), including a tackle for a loss.

▶ At Dallas (Oct. 6): Started and was one of two defensive players (LB Blake Martinez) to play all 72 snaps, posting four tackles (all solo) and a QB hit...On third-and-5 at the Green Bay 36 with 50 seconds remaining in the first half, came on a blitz and drilled QB Dak Prescott just as he released the ball, forcing an incompletion as the Cowboys were forced to settle for a 54-yard FG that they missed.

#### 69 David Bakhtiari, T, 7th Year, Colorado

- Earned first-team All-Pro honors from *The Associated Press* in 2018, the first Packers offensive tackle to earn first-team recognition since Forrest Gregg in 1967.
- Was a second-team *AP* All-Pro selection in 2016 and 2017, making him one of only two Green Bay tackles (Gregg, 1962-67) to earn *AP* All-Pro honors in three consecutive seasons. Joined Chiefs RT Mitchell Schwartz as the only tackles in the league to earn *AP* All-Pro honors in each of the last three seasons (2016-18).
- Was selected to his first career Pro Bowl in 2016, having initially been named a first alternate before being selected as an injury replacement for Eagles T Jason Peters. Was also named a Pro Bowl alternate in 2014 and 2017-18.
- Has started all 94 regular-season games he has appeared in at LT since entering the league in 2013. Opened all 16 regular-season games in four of his first six seasons in the NFL.

**2019 SEASON:** Has started all five games at LT and has played all 317 offensive snaps on the season...Part of a line that has allowed 10 sacks on the season, good for No. 12 in the NFL, and has helped the offense register only four giveaways, tied for No. 2 in the league.

► At Chicago (Sept. 5): Started at LT and played all 64 snaps, helping to protect QB Aaron Rodgers as he connected on 18 of 30 passes for 203 yards and a TD with no INTs for a 91.4 rating.

▶Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 15): Started at LT and played all 74 snaps despite being limited during the week due to a back injury...Helped the offense rack up 144 yards on the ground on 33 attempts (4.4 avg.), highlighted by RB Aaron Jones' season-high 116 yards and a TD on 23 carries (5.0 avg.).

▶At Dallas (Oct. 6): Started at LT and played all 74 snaps, helping to clear the way for Jones' career-high 182 yards from scrimmage (107 rushing, career-best 75 receiving) along with four rushing TDs as Jones matched the single-game franchise record for rushing TDs...Helped the offense control the clock for 36:43, the Packers' top mark in a 60-minute game since Week 1 of 2017 vs. Seattle (39:13).

#### 8 Tim Boyle, QB, 2nd Year, Eastern Kentucky

- Spent his entire rookie season on the Packers' active roster in 2018. Was listed as a gameday inactive for every game with the exception of Week 2 vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16) when he was active but did not play.
- Started 19 of 36 games played over four seasons at Eastern Kentucky (2017) and Connecticut (2013-15).
- Led the Ohio Valley Conference with 2,134 passing yards as a redshirt senior in 2017, good for No. 5 in a single season in school history.

**2019 SEASON:** Has served as the backup QB for all five games, but has not seen any action.

► At Chicago (Sept. 5) – At Dallas (Oct. 6): Served as the No. 2 QB, but did not see any action.

#### 43 Hunter Bradley, LS, 2nd Year, Mississippi State

- As a rookie, handled snapping duties in all 16 games and had one tackle on special teams.
- Played in 41 career games at Mississippi State, serving as the primary long snapper since Week 2 of the 2015 season.
- Entered college as a tight end, but suffered two knee injuries in his first two years and moved to long snapper.

**2019 SEASON:** Has handled snapping duties in all five games and has registered a tackle on special teams.

- ►At Chicago (Sept. 5): Handled snapping duties on all punts and placements, helping P JK Scott register a career-high five punts inside the 20.
- ▶Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 15): Snapped for K Mason Crosby's three extra points and Scott's eight punts (47.6-yard gross average, 42.0-yard net average)...Recorded a tackle on special teams.
- ▶Vs. Denver (Sept. 22): Helped Scott register single-game career highs (min. four attempts) for gross punting average (53.0) and net punting average (47.3) with three of his four punts landing inside the 20.

- Set a franchise record with 23 consecutive field goals made (2010-11), topping K Chris Jacke's mark of 17 straight in 1993.
- Holds the NFL postseason record for most consecutive FGs made with 23 straight from 2010-16.

- Registered 1,310 receiving yards with the New Orleans Saints in 2011, the second most in NFL history by a TE to that point behind only Gronkowski (1,327 in 2011), and posted 16 TD catches in 2013, No. 2 in a

season among TEs behind only Gronkowski (17 in 2011).

 Appeared in 137 games with 101 starts during his first nine NFL seasons, playing in 15 or 16 games in eight of his first nine years in the league.

- His average of 5.47 yards per carry last season was the second-best single-season mark in franchise history among Packers with 100-plus carries behind only RB Gerry Ellis (5.49 in 1985).

first time winning the award, as he became the first Green Bay RB to earn the honor since Lacy in 2014 (Week 12 at Minnesota).

- Set an NFL single-season record in 2018 with his interception percentage of 0.34 (two INTs on 597 attempts), besting the previous mark held by Chiefs QB Damon Huard (0.41 in 2006). Also set a league record last season for consecutive passing attempts without an INT (402).

- Has posted seven seasons (2009, 2011-12, 2014-16, 2018) with 500-plus passing attempts and eight or fewer INTs, the most in NFL history ahead of Patriots QB Tom Brady (four), Redskins QB Alex Smith (two), Falcons QB Matt Ryan (two) and nine QBs (one).
- Has been named the NFL's Most Valuable Player by *The Associated Press* twice in his career (2011, 2014), one of only eight players in league history to win the award multiple times.
- Has been selected to the Pro Bowl in seven of the last 10 seasons (2009, 2011-12, 2014-16, 2018).
- Is the only quarterback in league history to record a 100-plus passer rating in six consecutive seasons (2009-14), with no other QB doing so in more than four straight seasons.
- Is one of only three QBs in NFL history with 40,000-plus passing yards and 2,500-plus rushing yards (Fran Tarkenton, John Elway).
- In 163 career regular-season starts (since 2008), has posted 57 games with 300-plus passing yards (No. 5 in the NFL over that span), 99 without an interception (No. 1, min. 15 attempts) and 87 with a 100-plus passer rating (No. 2).
- In the franchise record books, holds seven of the top eight single-season marks for passer rating (2009-14, 2016), four of the top six for passing TDs (2011-12, 2014, 2016), six of the top seven for completion percentage (2010-14, 2016) and five of the top seven for passing yards (2009, 2011, 2014, 2016, 2018).
- **2019 SEASON:** Has started all five games and has completed 113 of 180 passes (62.8 pct.) for 1,307 yards and six TDs with one INT for a 93.4 rating...Has rushed for 52 yards on 14 carries (3.7 avg.).
- ►At Chicago (Sept. 5): Connected on 18 of 30 passes (60.0 pct.) for 203 yards and a TD with no INTs for a 91.4 rating...On Green Bay's first offensive play of the second quarter, found WR Marquez Valdes-Scantling on a deep pass down the middle of the field for a 47-yard gain to the Chicago 27...Three plays later, connected with TE Jimmy Graham for an 8-yard TD pass...Added 8 rushing yards on three carries (2.7 avg.).

Denver (Sept. 22): Threw for 235 yards and a TD on 17-of-29 passing (58.6 pct.) for a 96.2 rating...It marked his seventh straight game without an INT at Lambeau Field as he brought his streak of passing attempts without an INT at home to 253...On Green Bay's opening drive, found Valdes-Scantling down the middle of the field for a 40-yard TD pass after the Broncos jumped offside.
- ▶Vs. Philadelphia (Sept. 26): Threw for a season-high 422 yards and two TDs with one INT on 34-of-53 passing (64.2 pct.) for a 93.4 rating...It marked his eighth career 400-yard game, further extending his franchise mark...Moved past QB Fran Tarkenton (342) for No. 9 in NFL history for the most career TD passes on his TD throw to WR Geronimo Allison in the second quarter...Connected with Allison on a 19-yard TD over the middle with nine seconds remaining in the first half...Finished the first half with 241 passing yards and a TD on 16-of-22 passing (123.5 rating), his most passing yards in a first half since Dec. 24, 2016, vs. Minnesota (268).... Led the Packers with 46 rushing yards on five carries (9.2 avg.), picking up first downs on three of the carries.
- ▶At Dallas (Oct. 6): Connected on 22 of 34 passes (64.7 pct.) for 238 yards and an 85.2 rating...Completed passes to nine different players, a season high...Posted four completions of 20-plus yards for the third straight game, with each one going to a different player (23-yarder to Graham, 23-yarder to TE Robert Tonyan, 22-yarder to RB Aaron Jones, 22-yarder to Allison).

#### 26 Darnell Savage, S, Rookie, Maryland

- Earned All-Big Ten honors from media and coaches in each of his final two years, being named honorable mention in 2017 and second team in 2018. Started all 36 games over his final three seasons at Maryland.
- In 2018, ranked No. 2 in the Big Ten, trailing only teammate LB Tre

- Watson (five), and No. 13 in the country with four interceptions.
- Led the team with a career-high 11 passes defensed and tied for the team lead with three interceptions as a junior in 2017.
- Set career highs with 59 tackles and 45 solo tackles as a sophomore in 2016 and as a junior in 2017.
- **2019 SEASON:** Has started all five games and has recorded 24 tackles (17 solo), an interception, a forced fumble, four passes defensed, a QB hit and two QB pressures.
- ►At Chicago (Sept. 5): Started and played all 73 snaps, becoming the first rookie safety to start for the Packers in Week 1 since Morgan Burnett in 2010...Registered three tackles (all solo), a pass defensed, a QB pressure and a QB hit...Late in the first half, broke up a QB Mitchell Trubisky pass over the middle intended for WR Allen Robinson on third down to force a Chicago punt.

- Became the first punter in team history to register a punt of 58-plus yards in each of his first three NFL games and was the first NFL punter to do so since Redskins P Tress Way in 2014.
- Holds University of Alabama records for career punting yards (11,074), attempts (243) and average yards per punt (45.6).
- Selected to an All-America team in three of his four seasons at Alabama, earning first-team honors in 2014 and second-team honors in '16 and '17. **2019 SEASON:** Has appeared in all five games and has posted a 48.3-yard gross average and a 44.1-yard net average on 29 punts with 12 inside the 20...Is tied for No. 3 in the NFL for punts inside the 20...Ranks No. 4 in the league in gross punting average and No. 7 in net average.
- ▶At Chicago (Sept. 5): Punted a career-high nine times on the evening posting a 47.6-yard gross average and a 43.6-yard net average with a career-best five punts placed inside the 20...Became the first Packers punter to register five punts inside the 20 since Tim Masthay did so vs. Minnesota on Oct. 2, 2014...Posted a pair of 63-yard punts, including one with under two minutes remaining in the game that put the ball at the Chicago 10 after the Bears were called for a holding on the return.
- ►Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 15): Punted eight times on the afternoon (47.6-yard gross average, 42.0-yard net average) with one inside the 20.
- ▶Vs. #### 10 Darrius Shepherd, WR, Rookie, North Dakota State

- Signed by Green Bay as an undrafted free agent on May 6, 2019, after participating in the team's rookie orientation on a tryout basis
- Played in 57 games with 36 starts over four years at North Dakota State, helping the Bison compile a 54-5 record (.915) from 2015-18 and capture three NCAA Division I FCS national championships (2015, 2017-18) and four consecutive Missouri Valley Football Conference titles.
- Finished second all-time at NDSU with 188 receptions and 2,841 receiving yards (15.1 avg.), and was sixth with 20 career TD receptions. Ended fifth on the NDSU career chart for punt return yards (578) and sixth in punt return attempts (44) and yards per return (13.14).

**2019 SEASON:** Has appeared in three games and was inactive (hamstring) for two contests...Has one punt return for 0 yards and five fair catches.

- ► At Chicago (Sept. 5): Inactive (hamstring).

- Is the only player in the NFL to register 25-plus sacks, five-plus interceptions and five-plus forced fumbles since 2015.
- Played in all 64 games with 50 starts for the Washington Redskins from 2015-18, including starts in all 48 games over the last three seasons.
- With two seasons with eight sacks (2015 and 2017), was tied for the third-most seasons by a LB with eight-plus sacks from 2015-18 (Ryan Kerrigan and Von Miller: four), according to pro-football-reference.com.
- His 24½ sacks were the second most among Washington players from 2015-18 (Kerrigan, 46½).
- **2019 SEASON:** Has started all five games and has registered 25 tackles (14 solo), a team-high 5½ sacks, an interception, a forced fumble, two passes defensed, 16 QB hits (No. 2 on the team) and 14 QB pressures (No. 2 on the team)...Ranks No. 5 in the league in sacks...Joins LB Za'Darius Smith as the first Packers duo to both register five-plus sacks in the first five games of the season...Joins Smith as the only teammate duo in the league this season with five-plus sacks each through Week 5.

- According to Sportradar, ranked No. 3 among NFL linebackers with 25 QB hits and was tied for No. 6 in total pressures (sacks/hurries/knockdowns) with 35 in 2018.

#### 44 Ty Summers, LB, Rookie, Texas Christian

- Played in 51 games with 32 starts for Texas Christian (2014-18) and recorded 319 tackles (168 solo), the second most by a Horned Frog in the first 18 seasons of the tenure of Head Coach Gary Patterson.
- Tallied 14 games with 10-plus tackles from 2015-18, ranking No. 3 in the Big 12 over that time span (Kansas LB Joe Dineen, 22 and TCU LB Travin Howard, 17), according to sports-reference.com.
- Earned second-team All-Big 12 honors in 2016 after ranking No. 2 on the team and in the conference with 121 tackles (59 solo).
- His eight games with 10-plus tackles in 2016 were tied for the most in the Power 5 conferences (ACC, Big 10, Big 12, SEC, Pac-12), according to sports-reference.com.

**2019 SEASON:** Has played in all five games on special teams and leads the team with four tackles.

►At Chicago (Sept. 5): Played 19 snaps on special teams in his NFL debut and registered a tackle.

- Helped clear holes for RB Aaron Jones in 2018, who became the first Packer to lead the league in yards per carry (5.47) since the NFL went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.

► At Chicago (Sept. 5): Started at LG and played all 64 snaps, helping to protect QB Aaron Rodgers as he connected on 18 of 30 passes for 203 vards and a TD with no INTs for a 91.4 rating.

Minnesota (Sept. 15): Started at LG and played 56 of 74 snaps with rookie G Elgton Jenkins rotating in for him periodically during the game...Helped the offense rack up 144 yards on the ground on 33 attempts (4.4 avg.), highlighted by RB Aaron Jones' 116 yards and a TD on 23 carries (5.0 avg.).

#### 85 Robert Tonyan, TE, 2nd Year, Indiana State

- Joined the Packers in December 2017 and spent the final four weeks that season on Green Bay's practice squad. Originally entered the NFL with the Detroit Lions in May 2017 as an undrafted free agent.

**2019 SEASON:** Has played in all five games with one start and has four receptions for 66 yards (16.5 avg.).

- ► At Chicago (Sept. 5): Appeared on 20 plays on offense and posted a 28-yard reception in the fourth quarter... Found an opening in the middle of the field to haul in the pass from QB Aaron Rodgers and take it to the Chicago 40... Also played 13 snaps on special teams and recorded a tackle.
- ►Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 15): Started as the Packers opened up with two TEs and played 21 snaps...Also appeared on 16 plays on special teams. ►Vs. Denver (Sept. 22): Played 15 snaps on offense and had a 4-yard

- Appeared in 20 games with 11 starts for Denver from 2016-18, highlighted by a career-high 16 games played with 11 starts for the Broncos last season.
- Helped block for RB Phillip Lindsay in '18, who ranked No. 3 in the league in yards per carry (5.40), the third-best average among running backs in

franchise history behind only Clinton Portis (5.52 in 2002, 5.49 in 2003).

- Played in 20 games with 14 starts for the Miami Dolphins from 2014-16, including a 2015 campaign that saw him start a career-high 12 games (all at RG).
- **2019 SEASON:** Has started all five games at RG and has played all 317 offensive snaps on the season...Part of a line that has allowed 10 sacks on the season, good for No. 12 in the NFL, and has helped the offense register only four giveaways, tied for No. 2 in the league.

- ▶Vs. Philadelphia (Sept. 26): Started at RG and played all 81 snaps, helping to protect Rodgers as he threw for 422 yards and two TDs on 34-of-53 passing...Part of an offense that registered season highs for total net yards (491) and first downs (31)...Part of a line that allowed one sack/zero sacks in back-to-back games for the first time since a three-game streak in 2016 (Weeks 12-14).
- ▶At Dallas (Oct. 6): Started at RG and played all 74 snaps, helping to clear the way for Jones' career-high 182 yards from scrimmage (107 rushing, career-best 75 receiving) along with four rushing TDs as Jones matched the single-game franchise record for rushing TDs...Sealed off LB Jaylon Smith to create a lane up the middle on Jones' 18-yard TD run in the first quarter...Helped the offense control the clock for 36:43, the Packers' top mark in a 60-minute game since Week 1 of 2017 vs. Seattle (39:13).

#### 83 Marquez Valdes-Scantling, WR, 2nd Year, South Florida

- Posted 38 catches for 581 yards and two TDs in 2018, an average of 15.3 yards per catch that was the top mark posted by a Green Bay rookie (min. 25 rec.) since WR James Lofton's 17.8-yard average in 1978.
- Ranked No. 6 among NFL rookies in receiving yards and had four receptions of 40-plus yards, tied for the most among league rookies (Falcons WR Calvin Ridley, Bills WR Robert Foster).
- Registered two 100-yard receiving games last season, tied for No. 2 in franchise history among rookies behind only Billy Howton (six in 1952).
- Became the first Packer since WR Max McGee in 1959 to register two 100-yard receiving games on three or fewer catches in a season, and was only the third NFL player to accomplish that feat since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger (Rams WR Drew Hill, 1980; Patriots WR Stanley Morgan, 1978, 1980, 1984).
- **2019 SEASON:** Has started all five games and ranks No. 3 on the team with 17 receptions for 235 yards (13.8 avg.) and a TD...Has two receptions of 40-plus yards this season, giving him six 40-yard catches since Week 6 last season, which ranks tied for No. 2 in the NFL over that span behind only Buccaneers WR Mike Evans (eight).
- ▶At Chicago (Sept. 5): Started and played 42 snaps, pacing the team with 52 yards receiving on four catches (13.0 avg.)...On Green Bay's first offensive play of the second quarter, caught a deep pass down the middle of the field for a 47-yard gain to the Chicago 27 with CB Prince Amukamara in coverage, helping to set up QB Aaron Rodgers' 8-yard TD pass to TE Jimmy Graham three plays later that would turn out to be the game-winning TD.
- ►Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 15): Started and played 65 of 74 snaps, posting three receptions for 19 yards (6.3 avg.)...Had a 14-yard catch over the middle on third down on Green Bay's second series with CB Trae Waynes in coverage.
- ▶Vs. Denver (Sept. 22): Started and appeared on 50 of 57 plays, pacing the offense with six receptions for 99 yards (16.5 avg.) and a TD...

Scored on a 40-yard TD pass in the first quarter, matching the longest TD reception of his career...With the Broncos jumping offside and giving the Packers a free play, beat S Kareem Jackson down the middle of the field to make the catch in the end zone for the score...On the next series, made a 27-yard catch near the sideline, tapping both feet in bounds at the Denver 40 to convert a third-and-15.

- ▶Vs. Philadelphia (Sept. 26): Started and played 70 of 81 snaps, finishing with three receptions for 47 yards (15.7 avg.)...Late in the third quarter, beat CB Avante Maddox to make a catch over the middle for a 26-yard gain to the Philadelphia 29 on third-and-7...Beat Maddox on a slant late in the fourth quarter for a 17-yard pickup to the Philadelphia 18.
- ►At Dallas (Oct. 6): Started and appeared on 70 of 74 snaps, recording an 18-yard reception on Green Bay's second drive...Got both feet in bounds near the sideline with CB Byron Jones in tight coverage for the 18-yard pickup to the Dallas 29.

#### 45 Danny Vitale, FB, 4th Year, Northwestern

- Appeared in the final five games of the season for the Packers in 2018 after being signed to the active roster from the practice squad on Dec. 1.
- Played in 24 games with nine starts for the Cleveland Browns in 2016-17, hauling in seven passes for 46 yards (6.6 avg.). Led the Browns with nine tackles on special teams in 2017.
- Was selected by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in the sixth round (No. 197 overall) of the 2016 NFL Draft.
- **2019 SEASON:** Has played in all five games with two starts and has posted four receptions for 51 yards (12.8 avg.) and a 3-yard carry...Has registered a tackle on special teams.
- ►At Chicago (Sept. 5): Started and played 11 snaps on offense...Also appeared on 19 plays on special teams.
- ►Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 15): Appeared on eight plays on offense and 20 on special teams...Registered a tackle on special teams.

#### 22 Dexter Williams, RB, Rookie, Notre Dame

- Led Notre Dame in rushing as a senior in 2018 with a career-high 995 yards on 158 carries (6.3 avg.), an average of 110.6 rushing yards per game.
- Also paced the Fighting Irish in rushing touchdowns with 12 in just nine games, the most by a Notre Dame RB since Jonas Gray posted the same number in 11 games in 2011. Registered a 97-yard TD run at Virginia Tech last season, the second-longest run in school history.
- Posted four games with 140-plus rushing yards in '18, highlighted by his career-high 202-yard output vs. Florida State.
- Was one of only eight FBS players in 2018 to average at least 6.3 yards per attempt (min. 150 carries) with 12-plus rushing TDs.
- **2019 SEASON:** Has been inactive (healthy scratch) for all five games.
- ► At Chicago (Sept. 5): Inactive (healthy scratch).

#### 30 Jamaal Williams, RB, 3rd Year, Brigham Young

• Is one of only three players in team history (RBs Gerry Ellis and Eddie Lacy) to register 400-plus rushing yards and 200-plus receiving yards in both of his first two seasons in the NFL.

- Posted 95 rushing yards and 61 receiving yards at the N.Y. Jets last season in Week 16, becoming just the third Packer since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to have 95-plus rushing yards and 60-plus receiving yards in a game (RB John Brockington, Nov. 17, 1974, at Minnesota; RB Dorsey Levens, Nov. 16, 1997, at Indianapolis).
- Rushed for a team-high 556 yards in 2017, the fourth most by a Green Bay rookie in team history, and four touchdowns on 153 carries (3.6 avg.). Added 262 receiving yards and two TDs on 25 catches (10.5 avg.), the most receiving yards by a Green Bay rookie RB since Keith Woodside totaled 352 yards in 1988.
- After moving into the starting lineup in Week 11 as a rookie, posted 672 yards from scrimmage over that span (No. 11 in the NFL) and 455 rushing yards (No. 10). Registered 100-plus yards from scrimmage in four of the final six games.
- **2019 SEASON:** Has played in four games with one start and has rushed for 87 yards on 26 carries (3.3 avg.)...Has posted eight receptions for 55 yards (6.9 avg.) and a TD...Has been inactive (concussion) for one contest.
- ►At Chicago (Sept. 5): Played 26 snaps on offense and carried the ball five times for 0 yards (0.0 avg.)...Added a pair of receptions for 15 yards (7.5 avg.).

- ▶Vs. Philadelphia (Sept. 26): Made his first start of the season as the Packers opened the game with two RBs...Caught a pass on the Packers' first play from scrimmage, but sustained a concussion on a late hit by Eagles DE Derek Barnett and did not return to the game.
- ►At Dallas (Oct. 6): Inactive (concussion), his first game missed due to injury in his career as his streak of games played came to an end at 36.

#### 53 Tim Williams, LB, 3rd Year, Alabama

- Played in 19 games for the Baltimore Ravens from 2017-19, recording 16 tackles (12 solo), two sacks and two tackles on special teams.
- Was drafted by Baltimore in the third round (No. 78 overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft. Posted 19½ sacks and 28½ tackles for a loss in 30 games over his final two seasons at Alabama.
- **2019 SEASON:** Has been inactive for one contest...Was claimed off waivers from Baltimore on Oct. 2...Played in the first four games of the season for the Ravens and registered two tackles (both solo) on defense.
- ► At Dallas (Oct. 6): Inactive (healthy scratch).

#### 38 Tramon Williams, CB, 13th Year, Louisiana Tech

- Has appeared in 148 regular-season games for the Packers (2007-14, 2018), the fourth most among defensive backs in franchise history behind only LeRoy Butler (181), Willie Wood (166) and Mark Lee (157).
- Has 36 career interceptions (including playoffs), the most among active NFL players.
- Returned to the Packers and started all 16 games in 2018 after spending three seasons with the Cleveland Browns (2015-16) and Arizona Cardinals (2017).
- Has three career TDs, including INT returns of 43 yards (2011) and 70 yards (2010 postseason) and a 94-yard punt return (2007).
- Ranked No. 1 in the NFL with a combined nine interceptions in 2010 (six in regular season, three in postseason) and was chosen for the Pro Bowl as an injury replacement.
- Was one of only two NFL players (CB Terence Newman) to register at least one interception each season from 2007-17.
- **2019 SEASON:** Has played in all five games with one start and has posted 12 tackles (five solo), a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and four passes defensed.

- ▶ At Chicago (Sept. 5): Started at CB and played all 73 snaps, finishing with three tackles (all solo) and two passes defensed...Early in the second quarter, got his right hand in to break up a pass from QB Mitchell Trubisky intended for WR Allen Robinson...Late in the third quarter, came over to drill Robinson as he made a leaping catch near the pylon but landed out of bounds.
- ▶Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 15): Appeared on 21 plays on defense...On the final play of the game, knocked down a WR Stefon Diggs lateral to force a fumble, one that he also recovered at the Minnesota 37 to seal the victory with no time remaining...It marked his first game with a forced fumble and a fumble recovery since Nov. 10, 2013, vs. Philadelphia.
- ►Vs. Denver (Sept. 22): Played 45 snaps on defense and posted two assisted tackles.
- ►Vs. Philadelphia (Sept. 26): Appeared on 48 snaps and registered three tackles (one solo).
- ►At Dallas (Oct. 6): Played 65 of 72 snaps and registered four tackles (one solo) and two passes defensed.
