

PACKERS HOST THE RAIDERS AT LAMBEAU FIELD

The Green Bay Packers take on the Oakland Raiders to finish off a run of five home games in the first seven weeks of the season, the most home contests for Green Bay in the first seven games of a season since 1978 when it also played five at home (not including the 1987 strike year).



- Sunday starts a stretch of three straight games against
- AFC West teams, the first time the Packers have had three straight games against AFC teams since playing the AFC West in 2003 in Weeks 15-17.
- Green Bay is 14-3 against AFC West teams since 2002, an .824 winning percentage that ranks No. 1 in the NFL over that span.
- Dating back to 1990, the Packers are 7-0 against the Raiders. Green Bay won four of those seven games by 28-plus points (10, 30, 31, 34, 4, 28, 13). The seven-game streak is tied for Green Bay's longest active wins streak vs. an opponent (San Diego/L.A. Chargers).
- Green Bay has scored 30-plus points in each of the last four contests against the Raiders, tied for the longest streak by an NFL team vs. Oakland since 2003.
- ▶ It is only the second time (at Oakland, 1976) the two teams have played in the month of October.
- This marks the second consecutive game where Green Bay will face a team that is coming off its bye week.

GOOD START

- Packers Head Coach Matt LaFleur is the first head coach in franchise history to win five of his first six NFL games.
- Green Bay has started the season with at least five wins in its first six games for the first time since starting 6-0 in 2015 and the seventh time since 1970 (6-0 in 2011, 5-1 in 2007, 2002, 1996 and 1978).
- The Packers have started 3-0 in the NFC North for the first time since 2012 and for just the fourth time (2011 and 2002) since the division was formed in 2002.
- >Out of the 20 teams that have played multiple division games this season, Green Bay joins New England as the only teams to be 3-0, and is one of five teams with multiple wins against division opponents (Dallas and Seattle, 2-0 / Baltimore, 2-1).
- ► Green Bay joins the New England Patriots (6-0), San Francisco 49ers (5-0) and the New Orleans Saints (5-1) as the only NFL teams with at least five wins this season.

OWNING OCTOBER

- Green Bay began October with a 34-24 win over the Dallas Cowboys, marking the second time in the last three years that it started October with a win at Dallas. The Packers picked up their second win of the month last week over the Detroit Lions, 23-22.
- ▶ Dating back to 2008, the Packers (30-12, .714) hold the second-best record in the NFC and the third-best mark in the league in the month of October.
- Green Bay recorded at least a .500 record in the month of October for the 10th time in 12 seasons (2008-19).

REGULAR-SEASON WEEK 7

- ► Green Bay has a .809 winning percentage (17-4) at home in October since 2008, No. 2 in the NFC and No. 3 in the NFL.
- Dating back to 2008, QB Aaron Rodgers leads the NFL (min. 350) pass attempts) in passer rating (106.8) in the month of October, while being tied for No. 1 in passing touchdowns (89), ranking No. 2 passing-touchdown percentage (6.4) and ranking No. 5 in passingyards (11, 488).

WITH THE CALL

CBS will broadcast the game to a regional audience with playby-play man **Jim Nantz** and analyst **Tony Romo** handling the call from the broadcast booth and Tracy Wolfson reporting from the sidelines.



- Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since November 1929, heads up the Packers Radio Network that is made up of 50 stations in four states. Wayne Larrivee (play-by-play), two-time Packers Pro Bowler Larry McCarren (analyst) and three-time Packers Pro Bowler and two-time All-Pro John Kuhn (sideline) will call the action. McCarren first joined the team's broadcasts in 1995 and enters his 25th season calling Packers games. After originally being paired together in 1999, McCarren and Larrivee enter their 21st season of broadcasts together. They surpassed Jim Irwin and Max McGee for the most regular-season and postseason games broadcast for the Packers with 313 at the 2018 season opener against Chicago.
- The broadcast is also available on Sirius Satellite Radio (WTMJ feed). The game can also be seen on DirecTV channel No. 707 with NFL Sunday Ticket.

IMPROVING RUNNING GAME

- ►The Packers have rushed for 120-plus yards three times in the last five weeks (144 vs. Minnesota, 120 at Dallas, 170 vs. Detroit), averaging over 4 yards per carry in each contest.
- ► The Packers have rushed for 120-plus yards in Weeks 5-6 on fewer than 30 attempts. It is only the fourth time since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger that the Packers have posted back-to-back games with 120plus rushing yards on fewer than 30 attempts and the first time since 2006.
- ►Week 6 marked the fifth time since 2017 that the Packers posted 150plus rushing yards on fewer than 30 attempts, which is the most in the league over that span. Green Bay is also the only team in the league to have at least one of those games in each of the last three seasons (2017-19).
- RB Aaron Jones tied a franchise record with four rushing TDs in Week 5. It was the Packers' first game with four rushing TDs since Dec. 23, 2012, vs. Tennessee.
- ► The Packers rushed for a season-high 170 yards on 29 carries (5.9 avg.) in Week 6. They were led by RB **Jamaal Williams**, who posted 104 rushing yards on just 14 attempts (7.4 avg.), the fewest carries needed by a Packer in a 100-yard rushing game since RB James Starks (10-112) vs. San Diego on Oct. 18, 2015. Williams recorded a career-long 45-yard run, the longest by a Packer this season.
- Jones (107 yards in Week 5) and Williams (104 yards in Week 6) going back-to-back with 100-plus yard rushing games marked the first time Green Bay has had different RBs post a 100-yard game in back-to-back weeks since Weeks 2-3 in 2013 (James Starks in Week 2, Johnathan Franklin in Week 3).
- Green Bay ranks in the top 10 in yards per rush since 2018:

► The Packers finished the 2018 season with 1,667 rushing yards on 333 attempts, an average of 5.01 yards per carry that ranked No. 2 for a single season in franchise history and in the NFL for the 2018 season.

JONES JUMPS TO THE FRONT

▶ RB Aaron Jones leads the NFL in rushing TDs this season:

- ► Jones is **tied for No. 7 in the NFL** for the most rushing TDs in a team's first six games (since 2000). It is also the most by a Packer since 2003 when RB Ahman Green had eight rushing TDs in the first six games.
- ► Jones totaled 182 scrimmage yards (107 on 19 carries, 5.6 avg. and 75 yards on seven receptions, 10.7 avg.) and a franchise-record-tying four rushing touchdowns in a Week 5 win at Dallas. He was the first Packer to record four rushing TDs in a game since Dorsey Levens tallied four in a win over the Arizona Cardinals on Jan. 2, 2000.
- ► Jones had recorded a rushing TD in four consecutive games (Weeks 2-5) this season, the second longest streak of his career (five games in 2018, Weeks 10-14).
- ► Jones was named NFC Offensive Player of the Week for his performance in Dallas, becoming the first Packer RB to earn the honor since Eddie Lacy in 2014 (Week 12).
- ► Jones has two multi-rushing TD performances this season (Weeks 3 and 5) to tie for the most in the NFL.
- ► Dating back to 1950, Jones' two multi-rushing-TD performances this season (Week 3 and 5) are **tied for the ninth most** by a Packer in a single season. In 1962, Jim Taylor recorded the most in one season (five) by a Packer, according to pro-football-reference.com.
- ► Jones had nine plays from scrimmage of 10-plus yards in Week 5 at Dallas (six runs, three catches), the most by a Packer since WR Javon Walker on Dec. 19, 2004.
- ► Jones posted a rushing TD in six straight home games (2018-19) to surpass Taylor (1964) and Green (2003) for the **longest streak in** franchise history.
- ► In Week 2, Jones set a career high with 23 carries for 116 yards (5.0 avg.) and a TD.
- Since entering the NFL in 2017, Jones ranks in the top five in yards per carry (min. 200 att.) among running backs:

►Jones put together an impressive 2018 season before an injury landed him on injured reserve after Week 15. He finished No. 1 in the NFL in rushing average (min. 100 att.) for the 2018 season, becoming the first Packer to lead the league in the category since the NFL went to a 16-game schedule in 1978:

- Dating back to 1991, Jones recorded the highest percentage of rushing plays that gained 10-plus yards (16.5) in a single season by a Packer in 2018 (min. 50 carries, Sportradar).
- In Weeks 8-10 of 2018, Jones became the first Packer since QB Tobin Rote in 1951 to have 75-plus rushing yards on 15 or fewer attempts in three straight games.
- ► Jones rushed for a career-high 145 yards on 15 carries (9.7 avg.) with a career-best two rushing TDs in Week 10 of 2018 to become just the sixth Packer since 1950 to rush for 145-plus yards in a game on 15 or fewer carries and the first to accomplish the feat since Green had 15 carries for 163 yards vs. Dallas on Oct. 24, 2004.

PACKERS VS. RAIDERS - WEEK 7

OFFSEASON ADDITIONS ENHANCE DEFENSE

Packers General Manager **Brian Gutekunst** and his staff made numerous moves to strengthen the roster this offseason and those moves have impacted the defenses strong start to the season:

- ►S Adrian Amos (A-miss), who joined the Packers after four seasons with the Chicago Bears, picked off QB Mitchell Trubisky in the end zone in Week 1 on the Bears' second-to-last drive of the game to protect a 10-3 lead. He became the first player to record an interception in their first game with the Packers since Bryant Westbrook on October 13, 2002, according to the Elias Sports Bureau.
- Dating back to Week 9 of the 2018 season (including postseason), Amos is tied for No. 5 in the NFL with four interceptions.
- ►LB **Preston Smith** came to Green Bay after playing for the Washington Redskins for the past four years. Smith registered 1.5 sacks in Week 1, including taking down Trubisky on fourth down to seal the victory. It was the third time in his career that Smith recorded at least one sack in Week 1. He followed it up by picking off QB Kirk Cousins in Week 2.
- Smith is the **only player in the NFL** with 25-plus sacks, five-plus INTs and five-plus forced fumbles since 2015.
- ► He matched his career high set on Dec. 26, 2015 at Philadelphia with three sacks in Week 3 vs. Denver.
- ▶ P. Smith is **tied for No. 1 in the NFL** this season in games with at least 1.5 sacks:

- ►LB Za'Darius (zuh-DARE-ee-us) Smith played in 58 regular-season games with 16 starts in four seasons for the Baltimore Ravens and ranked No. 2 among NFL linebackers in 2018 in QB hits (25) and tied for No. 6 in total pressures (sacks + hurries + knockdowns) with 35.
- ► For the third year in a row, Z. Smith registered a sack in the season opener. He is **one of six NFL players** to record a sack in Week 1 each of the last three seasons (2017-19).
- Za'Darius has registered a sack in four games this season, tied for No.4 in the NFL:

- ► In the Week 5 win at Dallas, Preston (one) and Za'Darius (two) combined for three sacks and tied for the team lead with three QB pressures. They followed it up in Week 6 by combining for 2.5 sacks (Preston, 1.5 and Za'Darius, one).
- Dating back to 2017, Z. Smith and P. Smith both rank in the top five among NFL linebackers in QB hits over that span (according to Sportradar):

KENNY KEEPS IMPROVING

In 2016, DL **Kenny Clark** became the youngest player to appear in a season opener for the Packers since Arnie Herber (20 years old) in 1930. After starting two of 16 games played as a rookie, Clark has started 31 games since the start of the 2017 season.

- ► After recording 4.5 sacks in 2017, Clark was second on the team with a career-high six sacks in 2018. He has started 2019 with 1.5 sacks.
- According to NFL Next Gen Stats, Clark ranks in the top five in the NFL in QB pressures among players that line up 75 percent of their snaps on the interior defensive line:

Among players who play 75 percent of their snaps on the interior defensive line (NFL Next Gen Stats), Clark ranks No. 5 in the NFL with 20 disruptions (the combined total of hurries, pressures or sacks - one per play) this season.

GETTING TO THE QB

In 2018, the Packers finished in the top 10 in the NFL in fourth-quarter sacks (t-No. 4), third-down sacks (t-No. 6), sacks per pass attempt (No. 7) and total sacks (t-No. 8). The Green Bay defense has picked the pressure back up this season, ranking in the top 10 in numerous categories:

- ► Via Sportradar, the Packers rank No. 8 in the NFL in defender QB hit percentage (1.41).
- The Packers registered a season-high six sacks in Week 3, their most since posting six vs. Miami on Nov. 11, 2018.
- ► Dating back to 1982, the five sacks Green Bay registered at Chicago marked only the **fourth time** the Packers recorded five-plus sacks in the season opener (six in 2010, seven in 2001 and five in 1995).
- Green Bay is tied for No. 3 in the NFL this season with two games with five-plus sacks (pro-football-reference.com).
- Dating back to 1963, the Packers' two games with five-plus sacks are tied for the fourth-most by Green Bay in the first six games, trailing only the three five-plus sack games the Packers had in the first six games of the 2001, 2000 and 1978 seasons.
- ►Green Bay (Preston Smith, 7.0 / Za'Darius Smith, 6.0) is the only team to have two players register six-plus sacks this season (Sportradar). The Smiths are the first Green Bay tandem to both register six-plus sacks in the first six games of the season (since 1982).

After showing improvement in the first season under defensive coordinator **Mike Pettine**, the Green Bay defense has had a strong start to Year 2.

►The Packers have allowed 16 or fewer points three times this season, tied for No. 6 in the NFL. ►Green Bay ranks in the top 10 in the NFL in points per game allowed this season:

NEW LEADER

The Green Bay Packers named **Matt LaFleur** (la-flew-er) the 15th head coach in franchise history on Jan. 8, 2019.

- He is the first head coach in franchise history win five of his first six NFL games.
- ► He joined Vince Lombardi (3-0) as the only head coaches in franchise history to win their first three NFL games.
- ► It was the first time since 2015 and just the third time (2011) in the last 12 seasons that Green Bay has started 3-0.
- According to the Elias Sports Bureau, LaFleur joined John Harbaugh (2008) and Don Coryell (1973) as the only head coaches since the merger (1970) to win each of their first two games, both against divisional opponents.
- ►With a win at Chicago in Week 1, LaFleur became the sixth head coach in franchise history to win his first game, joining Curly Lambeau, Vince Lombardi, Phil Bengston, Forrest Gregg and Ray Rhodes. He joins Lombardi as the only Packers head coaches to beat the Bears in their first game.
- ► LaFleur became only the second coach to make his head-coaching debut in the NFL's primetime kickoff game (since 2002), joining Jim Zorn who made his debut with Washington in a losing effort against the New York Giants (16-7) in 2008.
- ►LaFleur is in his 11th season in the NFL in 2019, having served as an offensive coordinator for two seasons (Los Angeles Rams, 2017; Tennessee Titans, 2018), a quarterbacks coach for six seasons (Washington Redskins, 2010-13; Atlanta Falcons, 2015-16) and an offensive assistant for two seasons (Houston Texans, 2008-09).
- During his first 10 seasons in the NFL, LaFleur was a part of offensive staffs that helped their teams rank in the top 10 in the league in total yards seven times (2008-09, 2012-13, 2015-17). In three of his last six seasons in the NFL, he was on a staff that helped its offense finish in the top five in the league in scoring, highlighted by No. 1 rankings in 2016 with the Falcons and in 2017 with the Rams.
- ►The former quarterback began his coaching career in 2003 at his alma mater, Saginaw Valley State. LaFleur has six seasons of coaching experience at the collegiate level, having also worked at Central Michigan (2004-05), Northern Michigan (2006), Ashland University (2007) and Notre Dame (2014).

THE NEW STAFF

LaFleur explored various avenues to compile his coaching staff, bringing in new coaches and retaining some from the 2018 staff.

- Offensive coordinator Nathaniel Hackett brings 10 years of NFL experience to Green Bay, including five as an offensive coordinator (Buffalo, 2013-14; Jacksonville, 2016-18). In 2017, he guided the Jaguars to a No. 1 league ranking in rushing (141.4 ypg) for the first time in team history on their way to an appearance in the AFC Championship Game.
- Defensive coordinator Mike Pettine was retained after a 2018 season that featured 16 different players with at least a half-sack, the second most in team history (since 1982) behind only the 1987 campaign (strike season) that saw 17 players register a half-sack or more. The defense finished 2018 tied for No. 8 in the league in sacks (44), the most by Green Bay since 2013, and No. 12 in the NFL in pass defense (234.5 ypg) after finishing No. 23 in the category in 2017.
- Special teams coordinator Shawn Mennenga (MEN-in-guh) begins his eighth season in the NFL and returns to the league after leading the special teams at Vanderbilt last season. From 2011-17, he served as the special teams assistant for the Cleveland Browns, assisting Chris Tabor as the team ranked No. 7 in the league over that span in both punt return average (9.9) and opponent kickoff return average (21.8).
- Chris Gizzi, who served as a strength and conditioning assistant from 2014-18, was promoted to strength and conditioning coordinator. As a player, he appeared in 23 games for the Packers as a linebacker in 2000-01, ranking No. 5 on the team with eight tackles on special teams in 2000. Gizzi will lead a staff that consists of Mark Lovat, Thadeus Jackson and Grant Thorne.
- Quarterbacks coach Luke Getsy returns to the Packers after spending last season as the offensive coordinator/wide receivers coach for Mississippi State. Over his last two seasons in Green Bay (2016-17), Getsy worked as the wide receivers coach after originally joining the

Packers in 2014 as the offensive quality control coach.

► Defensive line coach Jerry Montgomery is entering his fifth season with the Packers and second as defensive line coach. He worked as the defensive front assistant for Green Bay from 2015-17. Montgomery has helped with the development of DL Kenny Clark, who recorded 10.5 sacks over the past two seasons, the most among Packers defensive linemen and second most on the team over that span.

DOPE SHEET

- Inside linebackers coach Kirk Olivadotti (ah-luh-vuh-DOT-ee) joins the Packers after coaching for the Washington Redskins for 16 seasons. He is one of 11 members of the Redskins' assistant coach honor roll, which recognizes coaches with at least 10 seasons of service as an assistant in Washington. During his time with the Redskins, Washington ranked in the top 10 in the NFL in overall defense eight times.
- ► Tight ends coach Justin Outten (OW-ten) was the offensive assistant for the Atlanta Falcons the past two seasons (2017-18). He began with the Falcons as an offensive intern in 2016. Over the last three seasons, Atlanta averaged 27.2 points per game (No. 4 in the NFL over that span) and 389.9 yards per game (No. 3 in the league over that span).
- Defensive backs coach Jason Simmons is entering his ninth season with the Packers having worked in various roles (secondary in 2018, assistant special teams coach from 2015-17, defensive/special teams assistant in 2014 and a coaching administrator from 2011-13). Before coaching, he played for 10 years in the NFL as a defensive back and was a standout on special teams during his career.
- Running backs coach Ben Sirmans is entering his fourth season in that position for the Packers. From 2016-18, Green Bay led the NFL with an average of 4.66 yards per carry, including an average of 5.01 yards per carry in 2018 (No. 2 in the NFL) that was the second-best singleseason mark in team history. He joined the Packers after spending the previous four seasons (2012-15) as the running backs coach for the St. Louis Rams.
- Outside linebackers coach Mike Smith joins the Packers after spending the last three seasons with the Kansas City Chiefs, first as the assistant defensive line coach in 2016-17 and then coaching outside linebackers last season. In 2018, Smith coached Dee Ford, who was selected to his first Pro Bowl after tying for the NFL lead with seven forced fumbles and tying for No. 2 among NFL linebackers with a career-high 13 sacks.
- ▶Offensive line coach Adam Stenavich (STEN-uh-vitch) comes to the Packers after serving as the assistant offensive line coach for the San Francisco 49ers the last two seasons. He helped coach a line that cleared the way for RB Matt Breida to average 4.96 yards per carry in 2016-17, ranking No. 5 in the NFL over that span (min. 200 att.). The Marshfield, Wis., native played left tackle at Michigan (2002-05) and was named first-team All-Big Ten in 2004-05. Following his collegiate career, Stenavich spent time with a few NFL teams, including a stint on the Packers' practice squad in 2006.
- Wide receivers coach Alvis Whitted (WHITT-id), who played wide receiver for nine seasons in the NFL, worked for the last seven years as the wide receivers coach at Colorado State. During his tenure at CSU, Whitted mentored three All-America wide receivers, including two consensus first-team All-Americans who also were finalists for the Biletnikoff Award (Michael Gallup in 2017 and Rashard Higgins in 2014).
- Assistant offensive line coach Luke Butkus comes to Green Bay after serving as the offensive line coach for the University of Illinois for the past three seasons (2016-18), a position he also held for the Fighting Illini in 2012. Between the two stints at his alma mater, he was the assistant offensive line coach for the Jacksonville Jaguars (2013-15).
- Assistant defensive backs coach Ryan Downard begins his second season in Green Bay after serving as the defensive quality control coach last year. He came to Green Bay after working at Bowling Green for two seasons, serving as the safeties coach in 2017 and the director of football operations in 2016.
- Assistant special teams coach Maurice Drayton was retained and is entering his fourth season coaching in the NFL. He worked as the assistant special teams coach for each of the past three seasons (Green Bay in 2018 and the Indianapolis Colts in 2016-17).
- Offensive assistant Jason Vrable enters his seventh season as an assistant coach in the NFL, previously working for the New York Jets (2017-18) and Buffalo Bills (2013-16).
- The staff also consists of four quality control coaches: Wendel Davis (defense), Kevin Koger (offense), Christian Parker (defense) and Rayna Stewart (special teams).

- Guided the Titans' offense in 2018 to a No. 7 league ranking in rushing (126.4 ypg) as Tennessee registered 11 games with 100-plus rushing yards, tied for No. 2 in the NFL.
- ► Helped the Rams lead the league in scoring with an average of 29.9 points per game in 2017, more than doubling their average from 2016 (14.0 ppg).
- ► Tutored QB Matt Ryan, who led the league in passer rating (117.1) in 2016 on his way to being named NFL Most Valuable Player by *The* Associated Press.
- ► Coached rookie QB Robert Griffin III with the Redskins in 2012, who became the first QB in team history to win *AP* Offensive Rookie of the Year.

JON GRUDEN...Is in his sixth season as the Raiders' 12th head coach.

- Originally served as Oakland's head coach from 1998-2001, leading the Raiders to back-to-back AFC West titles (2000-01) and an AFC Championship Game appearance in 2000.
- ► Tutored quarterback Derek Carr in 2018, who set career single-season highs in completions (381), passing yards (4,049) and completion percentage (68.9).
- Spent seven seasons (2002-08) as the head coach of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, finishing as the franchise's winningest coach and leading the team to three division titles and its first Super Bowl title with a win over Oakland in Super Bowl XXXVII.
- Became the youngest head coach in NFL history to win a Super Bowl in 2002, setting franchise records with 12 regular-season wins and 15 total wins in the process.
- ► The Tampa Bay defense in 2002 became the first since the 1985 Chicago Bears to lead the league in total defense (252.8 avg.), fewest points allowed (12.3 avg.) and total interceptions (31) in the same season.

- Rodgers threw for 422 yards in Week 4 this season, extending his franchise record to eight 400-plus-yard games. No other quarterback in franchise annals has more than one 400-yard passing game (four QBs with one).
- Since 2018, Rodgers is tied for No. 1 in the NFL (Ryan Fitzpatrick) with four 400-yard passing games.
- In 2018, Rodgers threw for 442 yards, three touchdowns and zero interceptions at Detroit in Week 5 and then recorded 425 yards, two touchdowns and zero interceptions in Week 6, becoming the first player in NFL history to have back-to-back 400-yard games with no INTs. Rodgers added 442 yards against the Jets in Week 16 to become the first QB in NFL history to have three games with 425-plus passing yards in a season.
- Rodgers reached 40,000 passing yards in his 154th career game (Week 5 at Detroit, 2018). At the time, he had 323 passing TDs, becoming the first quarterback in NFL history to reach 40,000 passing yards and 300 TD passes in fewer than 157 games, the number in which both Peyton Manning and Dan Marino reached the two marks.
- Rodgers tied Manning for the fourth-fewest games to reach 40,000 passing yards, trailing Matt Ryan (151), Drew Brees (152) and Marino (153), according to the Elias Sports Bureau.

ASCENDING ADAMS

WR **Davante Adams** has continued to get better as his career has gone on. He is the **only player in the NFL** to record 70-plus receptions, 850-plus receiving yards and 10-plus receiving touchdowns in each of the past three seasons (2016-18), earning Pro Bowl honors in each of the last two seasons.

- Despite missing the final 10 minutes of the game in Week 4 due to injury, Adams posted a career-high 180 receiving yards on 10 catches, eclipsing his previous career best of 166 yards receiving at Seattle on Nov. 15, 2018.
- ►Adams joined Don Hutson as the only players in franchise history to have two games with 10-plus receptions and 165-plus receiving yards.
- ►Adams is one of three NFL players (Dallas WR Amari Cooper, New Orleans WR Michael Thomas) in the league to have a 10-catch, 165-yard game in both of the last two seasons.
- ►Adams posted 10-plus catches for the eighth time in his career, setting a franchise record (WRs Sterling Sharpe and Donald Driver, seven each).
- ► Adams' 107 receiving yards in the first quarter of Week 4 were the most by a Packer in a first quarter since WR Javon Walker registered 121 receiving yards at Indianapolis on Sept. 26, 2004. Adams' 158 receiving yards in the first half were the most by a Packer in a first half since WR Antonio Freeman posted 169 yards vs. Tennessee on Dec. 20, 1998.
- ▶ With 10-plus receiving touchdowns in each season from 2016-18 (12 in 2016, 10 in 2017 and 13 in 2018), Adams joined Sharpe (1992-94) and Hutson (1941-43) as the only players in franchise history to register 10-plus TD catches in three straight seasons.
- ► Adams joined Steelers WR Antonio Brown as the only players in the league to record two seasons with 12-plus receiving TDs from 2016-18.
- Adams was the only player in the NFL to register 70-plus receptions and 10-plus receiving touchdowns in each of the past three seasons (2016-18).

- ► In 2017-18 (Weeks 14-15, Weeks 1-6 and 8-9 in 2018), Adams recorded five-plus receptions in 10 consecutive games to rank No. 3 in team history, trailing Sharpe, who recorded 18 consecutive games in 1993-94 and 13 straight games in 1992-93, according to the Elias Sports Bureau.
- Adams became the first player in franchise history to record fiveplus receptions in each of the first eight games of the season (2018).

- ► Green Bay ranked No. 2 in the NFL in 2018 with 15 giveaways (Seattle, 11). It marked the sixth time in the last eight seasons that the Packers had 17 or fewer giveaways. That is tied for the most over that span with New England (six seasons). - Rodgers finished the 2018 season with just two INTs on 597 attempts, a 0.34 interception percentage that set an NFL single-season record among passing qualifiers (Chiefs QB Damon Huard, 0.41 in 2006, 244-1). It was the third time in his career he led the league in lowest interception percentage, tying Bart Starr for the most in team history. - ► Rodgers' streak of consecutive attempts without an INT ended at 402 in Week 15 of 2018. He had surpassed Patriots QB Tom Brady (358 in 2010-11) for the **longest streak in league history**.

- Crosby finished No. 10 in the NFL in scoring in 2018 with 124 points.
- ► Crosby hit five field goals of 50-plus yards in 2018, which tied his career high (2013) and tied for No. 3 in the NFL in 2018 (Baltimore Ravens K Justin Tucker) behind the six made by New York Jets K Jason Myers and and Dallas Cowboys K Brett Maher. It was the second most in a season in team history behind only K Chris Jacke, who made six in 1993.

BREAKING DOWN THE ROSTER

- Of the 53 players on Green Bay's roster, 28 of them (52.8 percent) were draft picks of the Packers. Green Bay has seven players that were drafted in the first round, including six that were selected by the Packers.
- Green Bay has 15 players on the roster that began their careers as undrafted free agents.
- Over a third of the players (21 of 53, 39.6 percent) on Green Bay's roster entered the league as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as an undrafted player.

Two years after he co-founded the Packers with Curly Lambeau, George Calhoun began writing a piece called The Dope Sheet, which served as the official press release from 1921-24.

► Of the 53 players on the roster, 47 of them (88.7 percent) are 28 years old or younger (as of Oct. 20) and 22 players (41.5 percent) are 24 years old or younger.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

Green Bay went 7-1 away from Lambeau Field in 2011, with the seven road wins setting a single-season franchise record.

- ► Dating back to 2000, the Packers have been able to stay above the .500 mark on the road, a notable achievement in the National Football League.

Another packed house at Lambeau Field against the Detroit Lions in Week 6 of 2019 brought the stadium's consecutive-sellouts streak to 346 regular-season games (not including replacement games).

- ►The league's longest-tenured stadium, Lambeau Field hosts its 63rd season of football in 2019. For the victory over Dallas in the Divisional round of the 2014 playoffs, Packers fans set a new Lambeau Field paid-attendance record (79,704).
- Across American professional sports, only Boston's Fenway Park (1912) and Chicago's Wrigley Field (1914) have longer tenures.

THE LAMBEAU ADVANTAGE

The crown jewel of the National Football League, Lambeau Field has long been known as one of the tougher venues to play in, particularly during the harsh Wisconsin winter.

- ► Re-establishing home-field advantage after a 4-4 mark in 2008 was one of the goals of 2009, and with the Packers finishing 6-2 at home, they accomplished that goal. Green Bay followed that up with a 7-1 mark at Lambeau Field in 2010, a perfect 8-0 record in 2011, the first undefeated home mark since 2002, and a 7-1 mark in 2012. The Packers were one of two teams to finish undefeated at home during the 2014 regular season (Denver).
- ► Green Bay was 5-2-1 (.786) at home in 2018, marking the eighth time in the last 10 seasons that the Packers won five-plus games at home.
- ► Since **Ron Wolf** and **Mike Holmgren** began the revitalization of the franchise in 1992, Green Bay owns the best home record in the NFL. A look at the top regular-season home W-L records since the '92 season:

Talk of unrestricted free agency in the early '90s led many to forecast tough times for the small-town Green Bay Packers.

- ►However, Green Bay has remained among the most successful teams since the advent of free agency in 1993. The Packers have won 10 or more games 15 times since '93 and captured 10 division crowns.

The 35-year-old kicker nailed a 23-yard field goal as time expired and jumped into the crowd with a boost from long snapper Hunter Bradley after he finished off a rally for the Green Bay Packers, who benefited from some questionable officiating to edge the

Aaron Rodgers, in his second straight game without top target Davante Adams, completed 24 of 39 passes for 283 yards and two touchdowns, including a beautiful 35-yard throw to Allen Lazard for the first-year pro's first career score. Rodgers linked up with Jamaal Williams for the other ID. Williams finished with 104 yards on 14 carries and four catches for 32 yards for Green Bay (5-1), which captured its first win in five tries against its NFC North rival. The Packers, who are off to their first 3-0 start in the NFC North since 2012, might not have pulled it off if not for two fourth-quarter penalties for illegal hands to the face against Detroit's Trey Flowers, both of them on third down. The first set up Lazard's touchdown, and the second allowed Green Bay to run the clock down to two seconds before Crosby's game-winner. In both cases, replays showed Flowers' hands on the neck or shoulder — not the face — of a Packers lineman. Referee Clete Blakeman said each of the calls was made by umpire Jeff Rice, and he discussed the last one with him. Matt Prater was good fine 18 of 32 for 265 yards and 54 yards for the Lons (2-2-1), who fell to 0-2 under Matt Patricia on Monday night. Kerryon Johnson scored the lone touchdown for the Lions from 1 yard out in the first quarter. Preston Smith and Za Darius Smith each had a sack for Green Bay. Rodgers was sacked once by Damon Harrison Sr. and threw an interception that bounced off the facemask of an open Darrius Shepherd near the goal line. James Coleman snagged the ball and returned it 55 yards, setting up Prater's last field goal that made it 22-13.

17 Davante Adams, WR, 6th Year, Fresno State

• Led the team with a career-high 111 receptions in 2018, the second most in team history behind only WR Sterling Sharpe's 112 in 1993, for a career-best 1,386 yards (12.5 avg.) and a career-high 13 TDs on his way to earning Pro Bowl honors for the second straight year, his first as an original selection.

• Was the only player in the NFL with 70-plus receptions and 10-plus TD catches in each of the last three seasons (2016-18). Joins Sharpe (1992-94) as the only players in team history to accomplish the feat in three straight seasons.

• Has 35 receiving TDs since 2016, No. 2 in the league (WR Antonio Brown, 37) over that span. Has caught at least one TD pass in 28 games since '16, tops in the NFL over that span.

• Is the lone player in the league to have 10-plus receiving TDs each of the past three seasons (2016-18). Joins WR Don Hutson (1941-43) and Sharpe (1992-94) as the only players in team history to do so in three straight seasons.

• Leads the league with 26 receiving TDs in the red zone since 2016.

• Has posted eight games in his career with 10-plus catches, the most in franchise history (WRs Sterling Sharpe and Donald Driver, seven each).

2019 SEASON: Has started all four games he has appeared in and leads the team with 25 receptions for 378 yards (15.1 avg.)...Has picked up a first down on 80 percent of his receptions (20 of 25), good for No. 5 in the league among players with 20-plus catches.

► At Chicago (Sept. 5): Started and appeared on 62 of 64 snaps, tying for the team lead with four receptions for 36 yards (9.0 avg.), with three of the catches picking up first downs.

►Vs. 90 Montravius Adams, DL, 3rd Year, Auburn

• Played in all 16 games with one start in 2018, seeing action on defense and special teams. Posted 26 tackles (17 solo), 1½ sacks, six tackles for a loss, a forced fumble and three quarterback pressures.

• After a foot injury sidelined him for most of training camp and the first two regular-season games, saw action in seven games as a rookie in 2017, recording five tackles (one solo) and a QB hit.

• In Week 8 at the Los Angeles Rams, finished with five passes defensed, the most by a Green Bay defender during the 2018 season.

• Earned second-team All-Atlantic Coast Conference recognition as a sophomore in 2016 after posting a team-high five interceptions (tied for No. 11 in the country) along with a career-best 39 tackles (31 solo) and 14 passes defensed.

2019 SEASON: Has started all six games and has registered 24 tackles (16 solo), an interception, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and a teamhigh 12 passes defensed.

• Led the team with a career-high 122 receiving yards on a career-best six catches (20.3 avg.) in Week 3 vs. Cincinnati in 2017, highlighted by his career-long 72-yard grab in overtime that set up K Mason Crosby's gamewinning 27-yard field goal.

2019 SEASON: Has appeared in all six games with two starts and has posted 13 receptions for 144 yards (11.1 avg.) and two TDs (tied for team lead) along with one carry for 7 yards...Has registered one tackle on special teams.

Was one of four NFL safeties (Malcolm Jenkins, Eddie Jackson, Mike Adams) to register at least three INTs, three forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries from 2016-18, according to pro-football-reference.com.
Started all 16 games on a defense that finished No. 1 in the NFL in 2018 in points allowed per game (17.7), yards per play (4.78), takeaways (36) and interceptions (27), and set career highs in passes defensed (eight) and interceptions (two).

• Named to PFWA's All-Rookie team in 2015 after he became the first Bears rookie to lead the team in tackles (based on coaches review) since LB Brian Urlacher in 2000.

2019 SEASON: Has started all six games and ranks No. 2 on the team with 33 tackles (25 solo), four tackles for a loss (tied for team lead), an interception, a pass defensed, a QB hit and a QB pressure...Is tied for No. 2 on the team with three tackles on special teams.

• Was a second-team *AP* All-Pro selection in 2016 and 2017, making him one of only two Green Bay tackles (Gregg, 1962-67) to earn *AP* All-Pro honors in three consecutive seasons. Joined Chiefs RT Mitchell Schwartz as the only tackles in the league to earn *AP* All-Pro honors in each of the last three seasons (2016-18).

• Was selected to his first career Pro Bowl in 2016, having initially been named a first alternate before being selected as an injury replacement for Eagles T Jason Peters. Was also named a Pro Bowl alternate in 2014 and 2017-18.

• Has started all 95 regular-season games he has appeared in at LT since entering the league in 2013. Opened all 16 regular-season games in four of his first six seasons in the NFL.

2019 SEASON: Has started all six games at LT and has played every offensive snap this season...Part of a line that has allowed 11 sacks on the season, which is tied for No. 9 in the NFL...Has helped the Packers give up just six sacks since Week 2, the fourth fewest in the league over that span. ►At Chicago (Sept. 5): Started at LT and played all 64 snaps, helping to protect QB Aaron Rodgers as he connected on 18 of 30 passes for 203 yards and a TD with no INTs for a 91.4 rating.

• Also spent time on the practice squads of the Indianapolis Colts and Carolina Panthers in 2017. Spent the last week of the 2018 season on Green Bay's practice squad after signing with the Packers on Dec. 26.

2019 SEASON: Has played in three games...Was re-signed to the active roster from the practice squad on Oct. 14...Has been on Green Bay's practice squad for three games this season (Weeks 1-2, 5).

► Vs. Denver (Sept. 22): Made his debut with the Packers, appearing on four plays on special teams and one on offense.

• Registered two 100-yard receiving games last season, tied for No. 2 in franchise history among rookies behind only Billy Howton (six in 1952).

30 Jamaal Williams, RB, 3rd Year, Brigham Young

• Is one of only three players in team history (RBs Gerry Ellis and Eddie Lacy) to register 400-plus rushing yards and 200-plus receiving yards in both of his first two seasons in the NFL.

• Posted 95 rushing yards and 61 receiving yards at the N.Y. Jets last season in Week 16, becoming just the third Packer since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to have 95-plus rushing yards and 60-plus receiving yards in a game (RB John Brockington, Nov. 17, 1974, at Minnesota; RB Dorsey Levens, Nov. 16, 1997, at Indianapolis).

• Rushed for a team-high 556 yards in 2017, the fourth most by a Green Bay rookie in team history, and four touchdowns on 153 carries (3.6 avg.). Added 262 receiving yards and two TDs on 25 catches (10.5 avg.), the most receiving yards by a Green Bay rookie RB since Keith Woodside totaled 352 yards in 1988.

• After moving into the starting lineup in Week 11 as a rookie, posted 672 yards from scrimmage over that span (No. 11 in the NFL) and 455 rushing yards (No. 10). Registered 100-plus yards from scrimmage in four of the

final six games.

Added four receptions for 32 yards (8.0 avg.) and a TD, scoring from 5 yards out as he came in motion and took the pass from QB Aaron Rodgers out of the shotgun midway through the second quarter...His 136 yards from scrimmage was the second-highest single-game output of his career behind only his 156-yard effort at the N.Y. Jets in Week 16 last season.

47 Tim Williams, LB, 3rd Year, Alabama

• Played in 19 games for the Baltimore Ravens from 2017-19, recording 16 tackles (12 solo), two sacks and two tackles on special teams.

• Was drafted by Baltimore in the third round (No. 78 overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft. Posted 19½ sacks and 28½ tackles for a loss in 30 games over his final two seasons at Alabama.

2019 SEASON: Has appeared in one game and was inactive for one contest...Was claimed off waivers from Baltimore on Oct. 2...Played in the first four games of the season for the Ravens and registered two tackles (both solo) on defense.

► At Dallas (Oct. 6): Inactive (healthy scratch).

►Vs. Detroit (Oct. 14): Saw his first action in a Green Bay uniform, appearing on two plays on special teams.

38 Tramon Williams, CB, 13th Year, Louisiana Tech

• Has appeared in 149 regular-season games for the Packers (2007-14, 2018), the fourth most among defensive backs in franchise history behind only LeRoy Butler (181), Willie Wood (166) and Mark Lee (157).

• Has 36 career interceptions (including playoffs), the most among active NFL players.

• Returned to the Packers and started all 16 games in 2018 after spending three seasons with the Cleveland Browns (2015-16) and Arizona Cardinals (2017).

• Has three career TDs, including INT returns of 43 yards (2011) and 70 yards (2010 postseason) and a 94-yard punt return (2007).

• Ranked No. 1 in the NFL with a combined nine interceptions in 2010 (six in regular season, three in postseason) and was chosen for the Pro Bowl as an injury replacement.

• Was one of only two NFL players (CB Terence Newman) to register at least one interception each season from 2007-17.

2019 SEASON: Has played in all six games with one start and has posted 14 tackles (seven solo), a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and five passes defensed.
