

PACKERS TAKE ON THE 49ERS IN PRIMETIME

The Green Bay Packers come off the bye week to face the San Francisco 49ers, who are tied with New England for the league's best record.

- According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last time the Packers entered a game this late in the season (through 10 games or later) where both teams had a winning percentage of .800-plus was in 2007 when Green Bay and Dallas both entered their matchup with 10-1 records (.909).
- Green Bay has won five of its last six at the 49ers, including its last trip in 2015 (17-3).
- It is the first of two straight road games for the Packers, marking the second straight year they played on the road in the first two games after the bye week.
- It will be the second regular-season game for Green Bay at Levi's Stadium (2015).
- Dating back to 1996, Green Bay is 11-2 against San Francisco during the regular season.
- Since 2007, the Packers have won the game going into the bye and coming out of the bye five times (2016, 2012, 2011, 2010, 2007).
- Green Bay faces an NFC opponent (San Francisco) for the ninth time after the bye since 2006. This is the second year in a row that the Packers will travel to California in the week after the bye (Los Angeles Rams in 2018).
- The Packers have won six of the previous eight matchups against NFC teams in the week after the bye.
- In games immediately following its bye week, Green Bay has won 16 of its last 23 (.696), including wins in seven of the last 10.
- Since 2009, Green Bay is 58-39-1 (.597) overall after the bye.
- ► The Packers have not turned the ball over for four straight games. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, it ties (2014, 2016) for the most consecutive games without a turnover by the Packers since 1933, the first year turnovers were tracked.
- Green Bay has not fumbled in four straight games. The last time the Packers did not have a fumble in four straight games in a single season was 1967 (Oct. 15-Nov. 5).
- This is the fifth time in the last six seasons that the Packers have played a night game coming out of the bye.
- This week's game was originally scheduled for 3:25 p.m. CST, but for the second time this season (vs. Carolina in Week 10), the Packers' game time was flexed by the NFL. It will be the fifth time Green Bay appears in primetime this season, with a sixth appearance scheduled for Week 16. The Packers are 3-1 in primetime contests so far in 2019.

GOOD START

- ▶ Green Bay has won eight of its first 10 games, marking the sixth time the Packers have won at least eight of their first 10 games of the regular season since 1970 (10-0 in 2011, 9-1 in 2007 and 8-2 in 2002, 1997 and 1996).
- With a win, Head Coach **Matt LaFleur** (8-2) would tie Mike Holmgren and Mike Sherman (9-7) for the most NFL wins by a Packer head coach in their first season.
- Green Bay is one of seven NFL teams with at least eight wins this season, with five of those teams residing in the NFC.

REGULAR-SEASON WEEK 12

- ► The Packers are 6-1 this season in Sunday games, joining San Francisco (7-0) and New England (7-1) as the only teams with one of fewer losses this season in games played on Sundays.
- The Packers are 3-1 on the road this season, a .750 winning percentage that ranks No. 8 in the NFL. This is the first time since 2011 (4-0) that Green Bay has won at least three of its first four road games.

WITH THE CALL

NBC will broadcast the game to a national audience. Play-byplay man **AI Michaels** joins analyst **Cris Collinsworth** in *C* the booth with **Michele Tafoya** reporting from the sidelines.



- Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since November 1929, heads up the Packers Radio Network that is made up of 50 stations in four states. Wayne Larrivee (play-by-play), two-time Packers Pro Bowler Larry McCarren (analyst) and three-time Packers Pro Bowler and two-time All-Pro John Kuhn (sideline) will call the action. McCarren first joined the team's broadcasts in 1995 and enters his 25th season calling Packers games. After originally being paired together in 1999, McCarren and Larrivee enter their 21st season of broadcasts together. They surpassed Jim Irwin and Max McGee for the most regular-season and postseason games broadcast for the Packers with 313 at the 2018 season opener against Chicago.
- ► The broadcast is also available on Sirius Satellite Radio (WTMJ feed).
- Westwood One Sports will air the game on radio across the country. Kevin Kugler (play-by-play) and Jason Taylor (analyst) will call the action with Scott Graham hosting the pregame and halftime shows.

PACKERS AT 49ERS - WEEK 12

VERSATILE BACKS

The Packers' backfield trio of RBs **Aaron Jones** and **Jamaal Williams** and FB **Danny Vitale** combines skill sets in the run and pass game.

- ►Green Bay has rushed for over 115 yards in four of the last six games, tied for No. 5 in the NFL since Week 5.
- ► In Week 10, the Packers posted 163 rushing yards and three TDs on 27 carries (6.0 avg.), just the **fifth time** since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger that the team registered 160-plus rushing yards and three-plus rushing TDs on 30 or fewer attempts. Jones (93 yards on 13 att.) and Williams (63 yards on 13 att.) became the **first Green Bay duo** to rush for 60-plus yards each on 15 or fewer carries each in the same game since RB Paul Ott Carruth and FB Gerry Ellis did so vs. Minnesota on Dec. 7, 1986.
- Green Bay has 13 rushing TDs this season, tied for No. 4 in the NFL this season and tied for the most by the Packers through the first 10 games of the season since the merger (1971 and 2003).

► Jones (three) and Williams (five, No. 2 in the NFL among running backs) are the only RB tandem in the NFL to both have at least three-plus receiving TDs this season. The last time the Packers had two RBs/FBs with three-plus TD receptions in a season was 2003 when Ahman Green had five and William Henderson had three.

►With Jones (943, 14) and Williams (457, six), the Packers join the Los Angeles Chargers as the only two NFL teams to have two running backs with 450-plus yards from scrimmage and five total touchdowns this season (pro-football-reference.com). Williams registered a receiving TD in four straight games (Weeks 6-9), joining Green (2003) as the only RBs in Packers history to have a TD catch in four consecutive games in a single season.

- ► In Week 8, Jones had two receiving TDs and Williams had one, marking the first time the Packers have had three TD receptions in a game by RBs since Nov. 12, 1995, vs. Chicago (Edgar Bennett with two, Dorsey Levens with one).
- ►Among fullbacks/running backs with five-plus receptions (six), Vitale ranks No. 1 in the league in yards per catch (15.7 avg.):

- Vitale has three receptions for 20-plus yards, tied for No. 9 in the NFL among RBs/FBs.
- The Packers rushed for 120-plus yards in Weeks 5-6 on fewer than 30 attempts. It was only the fourth time since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger that the Packers had posted back-to-back games with 120-plus rushing yards on fewer than 30 attempts and the first time since 2006.
- ►Week 6 marked the fifth time since 2017 that the Packers posted 150plus rushing yards on fewer than 30 attempts, which is tied for the most in the league over that span (Kansas City, San Francisco). Green Bay is also the only team in the league to have at least one of those games in each of the last three seasons (2017-19).
- ► Jones tied a franchise record with four rushing TDs in Week 5. It was the Packers' first game with four rushing TDs since Dec. 23, 2012, vs. Tennessee.
- ► The Packers rushed for a season-high 170 yards on 29 carries (5.9 avg.) in Week 6. They were led by Williams, who posted 104 rushing yards on just 14 attempts (7.4 avg.), the fewest carries needed by a Packer in a 100-yard rushing game since RB James Starks (10-112) vs. San Diego on Oct. 18, 2015. Williams recorded a career-long 45-yard run, the longest by a Packer this season.
- ►Jones (107 yards in Week 5) and Williams (104 yards in Week 6) going back-to-back with 100-plus-yard rushing games marked the first time Green Bay has had different RBs post a 100-yard game in back-to-back weeks since Weeks 2-3 in 2013 (Starks in Week 2, Johnathan Franklin in Week 3).

- ► Jones' career-best 11 rushing TDs are the most by a Packer in the first 10 games of the season since FB Jim Taylor recorded 14 in 1962.
- ▶Per the Elias Sports Bureau, Jones' 14 total TDs (11 rushing, three receiving) this season are tied for the second most in team history through 10 games behind only WR Don Hutson (17 in 1942).
- ► In Week 10, Jones recorded three rushing TDs, marking the second time this season that Jones recorded three-plus rushing TDs in a game (four at Dallas) to make him the first Packer since Taylor in 1962 (three games) to have multiple games with three-plus rushing TDs in a season.
- ► Jones is the only player in the NFL this season with multiple games with three-plus rushing TDs:

Since entering the NFL in 2017, Jones ranks in the top five in yards per carry (min. 200 att.) among running backs:

In Week 8, Jones posted a career-high 159 receiving yards and two TDs on seven receptions (22.7 avg.), the second-most receiving yards in a game by a RB in franchise history behind only Andy Uram (174 yards, vs. Chicago Cardinals on Nov. 1, 1942).

- ► Jones added 67 rushing yards on 13 carries (5.2 avg.), giving him a career-best 226 yards from scrimmage, the **fourth-best single-game total in team annals** and the best mark since RB Ahman Green's 227-yard game vs. Denver on Dec. 28, 2003.
- ► Jones' average of 11.3 yards per touch set a single-game franchise mark among RBs with 200-plus yards from scrimmage (Elias Sports Bureau):

- ► Jones joined Rams RB Todd Gurley (at Tennessee on Dec. 24, 2017) as the **only NFL players since 1950** to have 65-plus rushing yards, 150-plus receiving yards, seven-plus receptions and two receiving TDs in a single game.
- ► Jones had two receptions of 50-plus yards in Week 8, the first Green Bay RB to do so since Paul Hornung at Baltimore on Dec. 12, 1965.
- ► Jones totaled 182 scrimmage yards (107 on 19 carries, 5.6 avg. and 75 yards on seven receptions, 10.7 avg.) and a **franchise-record-tying** four rushing touchdowns in a Week 5 win at Dallas. He was the first Packer to record four rushing TDs in a game since Dorsey Levens tallied four in a win over the Arizona Cardinals on Jan. 2, 2000.
- ► Jones recorded a rushing TD in four consecutive games (Weeks 2-5) this season, the second-longest streak of his career (five games in 2018, Weeks 10-14).
- ► Jones was named NFC Offensive Player of the Week for his performance in Dallas (Week 5), becoming the first Packer RB to earn the honor since Eddie Lacy in 2014 (Week 12).
- ► Jones has three multi-rushing TD performances this season (Weeks 3, 5 and 10) to **tie for the most in the NFL**:

- ► Jones had nine plays from scrimmage of 10-plus yards in Week 5 at Dallas (six runs, three catches), the most by a Packer since WR Javon Walker on Dec. 19, 2004.
- ► Jones posted a rushing TD in six straight home games (2018-19) to surpass Taylor (1964) and Green (2003) for the **longest streak in franchise history**.
- ► In Week 2, Jones set a career high with 23 carries for 116 yards (5.0 avg.) and a TD.
- ► Jones put together an impressive 2018 season before an injury landed him on injured reserve after Week 15. He finished **No. 1 in the NFL** in rushing average (min. 100 att.) for the 2018 season, becoming the first Packer to lead the league in the category since the NFL went to a 16-game schedule in 1978:
- ► Dating back to 1991, Jones recorded the highest percentage of rushing plays that gained 10-plus yards (16.5) in a single season by a Packer in 2018 (min. 50 carries, Sportradar).

PACKERS AT 49ERS - WEEK 12

NEW LEADER

The Green Bay Packers named **Matt LaFleur** (la-flew-er) the 15th head coach in franchise history on Jan. 8, 2019.

- He is the first head coach in franchise history to win seven of his first eight NFL games and the first to win his first three road NFL contests.
- ► LaFleur is the 19th NFL head coach and the first since Jim Harbaugh in 2011 to win at least seven of his first eight games (Elias Sports Bureau).
- ► He joined Vince Lombardi (3-0) as the only head coaches in franchise history to win their first three NFL games.
- ► It was the first time since 2015 and just the third time (2011) in the last 12 seasons that Green Bay has started 3-0.
- According to the Elias Sports Bureau, LaFleur joined John Harbaugh (2008) and Don Coryell (1973) as the only head coaches since the merger (1970) to win each of their first two games, both against divisional opponents.
- ►With a win at Chicago in Week 1, LaFleur became the sixth head coach in franchise history to win his first game, joining Curly Lambeau, Vince Lombardi, Phil Bengston, Forrest Gregg and Ray Rhodes. He joins Lombardi as the only Packers head coaches to beat the Bears in their first game.
- ► LaFleur became only the second coach to make his head-coaching debut in the NFL's primetime kickoff game (since 2002), joining Jim Zorn who made his debut with Washington in a losing effort against the New York Giants (16-7) in 2008.
- ►LaFleur is in his 11th season in the NFL in 2019, having served as an offensive coordinator for two seasons (Los Angeles Rams, 2017; Tennessee Titans, 2018), a quarterbacks coach for six seasons (Washington Redskins, 2010-13; Atlanta Falcons, 2015-16) and an offensive assistant for two seasons (Houston Texans, 2008-09).
- ► During his first 10 seasons in the NFL, LaFleur was a part of offensive staffs that helped their teams rank in the top 10 in the league in total yards seven times (2008-09, 2012-13, 2015-17). In three of his last six seasons in the NFL, he was on a staff that helped its offense finish in the top five in the league in scoring, highlighted by No. 1 rankings in 2016 with the Falcons and in 2017 with the Rams.
- ►The former quarterback began his coaching career in 2003 at his alma mater, Saginaw Valley State. LaFleur has six seasons of coaching experience at the collegiate level, having also worked at Central Michigan (2004-05), Northern Michigan (2006), Ashland University (2007) and Notre Dame (2014).

THE NEW STAFF

LaFleur explored various avenues to compile his coaching staff, bringing in new coaches and retaining some from the 2018 staff.

- Offensive coordinator Nathaniel Hackett brings 10 years of NFL experience to Green Bay, including five as an offensive coordinator (Buffalo, 2013-14; Jacksonville, 2016-18). In 2017, he guided the Jaguars to a No. 1 league ranking in rushing (141.4 ypg) for the first time in team history on their way to an appearance in the AFC Championship Game.
- ► Defensive coordinator **Mike Pettine** was retained after a 2018 season that featured 16 different players with at least a half-sack, the second most in team history (since 1982) behind only the 1987 campaign (strike season) that saw 17 players register a half-sack or more. The defense finished 2018 tied for No. 8 in the league in sacks (44), the most by Green Bay since 2013, and No. 12 in the NFL in pass defense (234.5 ypg) after finishing No. 23 in the category in 2017.
- Special teams coordinator Shawn Mennenga (MEN-in-guh) begins his eighth season in the NFL and returns to the league after leading the special teams at Vanderbilt last season. From 2011-17, he served as the special teams assistant for the Cleveland Browns, assisting Chris Tabor as the team ranked No. 7 in the league over that span in both punt return average (9.9) and opponent kickoff return average (21.8).
- Chris Gizzi, who served as a strength and conditioning assistant from 2014-18, was promoted to strength and conditioning coordinator. As a player, he appeared in 23 games for the Packers as a linebacker in 2000-01, ranking No. 5 on the team with eight tackles on special teams in 2000. Gizzi will lead a staff that consists of Mark Lovat, Thadeus Jackson and Grant Thorne.
- Quarterbacks coach Luke Getsy returns to the Packers after spending last season as the offensive coordinator/wide receivers coach for Mississippi State. Over his last two seasons in Green Bay (2016-17), Getsy worked as the wide receivers coach after originally joining the

Packers in 2014 as the offensive quality control coach.

Defensive line coach Jerry Montgomery is entering his fifth season with the Packers and second as defensive line coach. He worked as the defensive front assistant for Green Bay from 2015-17. Montgomery has helped with the development of DL Kenny Clark, who recorded 10.5 sacks in 2017-18, the most among Packers defensive linemen.

DOPE SHEET

- Inside linebackers coach Kirk Olivadotti (ah-luh-vuh-DOT-ee) joins the Packers after coaching for the Washington Redskins for 16 seasons. He is one of 11 members of the Redskins' assistant coach honor roll, which recognizes coaches with at least 10 seasons of service as an assistant in Washington. During his time with the Redskins, Washington ranked in the top 10 in the NFL in overall defense eight times.
- ► Tight ends coach Justin Outten (OW-ten) was the offensive assistant for the Atlanta Falcons the past two seasons (2017-18). He began with the Falcons as an offensive intern in 2016. Over the last three seasons, Atlanta averaged 27.2 points per game (No. 4 in the NFL over that span) and 389.9 yards per game (No. 3 in the league over that span).
- Defensive backs coach Jason Simmons is entering his ninth season with the Packers having worked in various roles (secondary in 2018, assistant special teams coach from 2015-17, defensive/special teams assistant in 2014 and a coaching administrator from 2011-13). Before coaching, he played for 10 years in the NFL as a defensive back and was a standout on special teams during his career.
- Running backs coach Ben Sirmans is entering his fourth season in that position for the Packers. From 2016-18, Green Bay led the NFL with an average of 4.66 yards per carry, including an average of 5.01 yards per carry in 2018 (No. 2 in the NFL) that was the second-best singleseason mark in team history. He joined the Packers after spending the previous four seasons (2012-15) as the running backs coach for the St. Louis Rams.
- Outside linebackers coach Mike Smith joins the Packers after spending the last three seasons with the Kansas City Chiefs, first as the assistant defensive line coach in 2016-17 and then coaching outside linebackers last season. In 2018, Smith coached Dee Ford, who was selected to his first Pro Bowl after tying for the NFL lead with seven forced fumbles and tying for No. 2 among NFL linebackers with a career-high 13 sacks.
- Offensive line coach Adam Stenavich (STEN-uh-vitch) comes to the Packers after serving as the assistant offensive line coach for the San Francisco 49ers the last two seasons. He helped coach a line that cleared the way for RB Matt Breida to average 4.96 yards per carry in 2016-17, ranking No. 5 in the NFL over that span (min. 200 att.). The Marshfield, Wis., native played left tackle at Michigan (2002-05) and was named first-team All-Big Ten in 2004-05. Following his collegiate career, Stenavich spent time with a few NFL teams, including a stint on the Packers' practice squad in 2006.
- Wide receivers coach Alvis Whitted (WHITT-id), who played wide receiver for nine seasons in the NFL, worked for the last seven years as the wide receivers coach at Colorado State. During his tenure at CSU, Whitted mentored three All-America wide receivers, including two consensus first-team All-Americans who also were finalists for the Biletnikoff Award (Michael Gallup in 2017 and Rashard Higgins in 2014).
- Assistant offensive line coach Luke Butkus comes to Green Bay after serving as the offensive line coach for the University of Illinois for the past three seasons (2016-18), a position he also held for the Fighting Illini in 2012. Between the two stints at his alma mater, he was the assistant offensive line coach for the Jacksonville Jaguars (2013-15).
- Assistant defensive backs coach Ryan Downard begins his second season in Green Bay after serving as the defensive quality control coach last year. He came to Green Bay after working at Bowling Green for two seasons, serving as the safeties coach in 2017 and the director of football operations in 2016.

- ▶ In 2016, helped the Falcons reach Super Bowl LI and guided the Atlanta offense to franchise records in vards per game (415.8), points scored (540), net passing yards per game (295.3) and yards per play (6.7).
- Was named Assistant Coach of the Year in 2016 by both The Associated Press and the Pro Football Writers of America.

THE PACKERS-49ERS SERIES

Originally dating back to 1950, the series featured two games per season from 1953-66 with the teams trading dominant stretches.

- San Francisco won 13 times in a span of 15 games between 1950-58. while the Packers won 10 of 11 games between 1959-64.
- In more recent times, the series has been noted for its postseason clashes, including several defining moments in Packers history. Green Bay's 27-17 triumph in the 1995 NFC Divisional playoff was considered the breakthrough victory that established the Packers as an elite team for the next several years. The Packers also won the next two postseason meetings, a 35-14 home victory in the 1996 NFC Divisional playoff en route to the Super Bowl XXXI title, and a 23-10 win at San Francisco in the 1997 NFC Championship game.
- The two teams met in the playoffs for a fourth straight season in 1998, with the 49ers winning, 30-27, on QB Steve Young's last-second TD pass to WR Terrell Owens.
- The clubs faced off in the playoffs in back-to-back seasons (2012-13), with San Francisco coming away with wins in both.

- ► In Week 7, Rodgers set a single-game franchise record with a perfect 158.3 passer rating after connecting on 25 of 31 passes for 429 yards and five TDs with no INTs. It eclipsed the previous single-game team record of 155.4 by Rodgers at Cleveland on Oct. 25, 2009.
- ►Rodgers also posted a rushing TD in Week 7, making him just the second QB in NFL history (Redskins QB Mark Rypien; Nov. 10, 1991) to throw for 400-plus yards with five-plus passing TDs, a rushing TD and no INTs.
- Dating back to 1950, Rodgers is just the sixth NFL QB to register 400plus passing yards and a perfect passer rating in a game, according to pro-football-reference.com.
- ►Rodgers' average of 13.84 yards per attempt in Week 7 was a singlegame career high (min. 15 att.) and was the best by a Green Bay QB since Brett Favre registered a 14.52-yard average (363 yards on 25 att.) at Indianapolis on Nov. 16, 1997. Rodgers' 13.84-yard average was the best in team history in a game with 30-plus attempts.
- ►Weeks 7-8 marked the sixth time in his career that Rodgers has had two or more consecutive games with 300-plus passing yards, three-plus passing TDs and no INTs. No other QB in team history has done it once.

- Rodgers reached 40,000 passing yards in his 154th career game (Week 5 at Detroit, 2018). At the time, he had 323 passing TDs, becoming the first quarterback in NFL history to reach 40,000 passing yards and 300 TD passes in fewer than 157 games, the number in which both Peyton Manning and Dan Marino reached the two marks.
- Rodgers tied Manning for the fourth-fewest games to reach 40,000 passing yards, trailing Matt Ryan (151), Drew Brees (152) and Marino (153), according to the Elias Sports Bureau.
- Rodgers threw for 400-plus yards in Week 7 to extend his franchise record to nine 400-plus-yard games. No other quarterback in franchise annals has more than one 400-yard passing game (four QBs with one).
- ►In Week 4, Rodgers passed Hall of Fame QB Fran Tarkenton (342) to rank No. 9 in NFL history in touchdown passes. He (354) trails Giants QB Eli Manning (362) for the No. 8 spot and Steelers QB Ben Roethlisberger (363) for No. 7 in NFL history.
- Rodgers reached 5,000 career attempts in Week 3 of 2018. At the time of his 5,000th career attempt, he had 319 TD passes and 78 INTs, setting the record for the most (Johnny Unitas, 284) and fewest (Donovan McNabb, 107) in each category in NFL history at the time of the 5,000th attempt

- ► In Week 7, Rodgers completed TD passes to two different running backs (Aaron Jones and Jamaal Williams) in a game for the first time in his career. COMING UP

- ► The Packers will finish the regular season with four away games and two home contests. Green Bay (3-1) is one of 11 teams to have a record above .500 on the road this season.
- All six teams Green Bay faces in the final six weeks are in the NFC.
- ► In Weeks 12-13, the Packers will crisscross the country, playing at the San Francisco 49ers and then at the New York Giants.
- ► The Packers' final two regular-season home games will take place in Weeks 14-15. First, they take on the Washington Redskins in the third matchup between the two in the last five years (including the postseason), but the first in Green Bay since 2013.
- ► Week 15 has the Bears coming to Green Bay and starts a run of three straight divisional games to finish the regular season for the third time since the NFC North was formed in 2002 (2006, 2016).
- ► The Packers close out the regular season with two road games for the first time since 2004 when they played at Minnesota and Chicago. In Week 16, Green Bay is at the Vikings and on *MNF* for the second time. Green Bay will close out the regular season against the Lions for the fourth straight year and the fifth time in the last six seasons.

ALL-PRO TACKLE

- ►T David Bakhtiari was named first-team All-Pro by *The Associated Press* in 2018. It was the first time he was named to the first team but the third year in a row he was named All-Pro by the *AP*.
- Bakhtiari was the first Packers offensive tackle to earn first-team honors since Forrest Gregg in 1967.
- Bakhtiari was also named to the All-NFL team by the Pro Football Writers of America.

RACKING UP POINTS

K Mason Crosby continues to move his way up the record books.

- ► Crosby hit a game-winning field goal in Week 6 to give him a gamewinning field goal in each of the last four seasons (2016 at Chicago, 2017 vs. Cincinnati, 2018 vs. San Francisco).
- ► In Week 5, Crosby became the **24th player in league history** to reach 1,500 career points. He is **one of five active players** to have 1,500-plus career points.
- Crosby has made 13 of 14 field goals this season, ranking No. 6 in the NFL with a .929 FG percentage.
- ► In Week 14 of 2018, Crosby connected on the 300th regular-season field goal of his career, becoming the 32nd player in league history with 300plus career field goals (319).
- Crosby has played in 202 straight games for the Packers, the second most all-time behind only QB Brett Favre (255).
- Crosby has been named NFC Special Teams Player of the Week a teamrecord seven times in his career, including in 2018 after hitting a gamewinning field goal in Week 6.
- Crosby finished No. 10 in the NFL in scoring in 2018 with 124 points.
- Crosby hit five field goals of 50-plus yards in 2018, which tied his career high (2013) and tied for No. 3 in the NFL in 2018 (Baltimore Ravens K Justin Tucker) behind the six made by New York Jets K Jason Myers and and Dallas Cowboys K Brett Maher. It was the second most in a season in team history behind only K Chris Jacke, who made six in 1993.

OFFSEASON ADDITIONS ENHANCE DEFENSE

Packers General Manager **Brian Gutekunst** and his staff made numerous moves to strengthen the roster this offseason and those moves have impacted the defense this season:

- S Adrian Amos (A-miss), who joined the Packers after four seasons with the Chicago Bears, picked off QB Mitchell Trubisky in the end zone in Week 1 on the Bears' second-to-last drive of the game to protect a 10-3 lead. He became the first player to record an interception in their first game with the Packers since Bryant Westbrook on October 13, 2002, according to the Elias Sports Bureau.
- Dating back to Week 9 of the 2018 season (including postseason), Amos is tied for No. 10 in the NFL among S/DB with four interceptions.
- ►LB **Preston Smith** came to Green Bay after playing for the Washington Redskins for the past four years. Smith registered 1.5 sacks in Week 1, including taking down Trubisky on fourth down to seal the victory. It was the third time in his career that Smith recorded at least one sack in Week 1. He followed it up by picking off QB Kirk Cousins in Week 2.
- Smith is the **only player in the NFL** with 25-plus sacks (34.5), fiveplus INTs (five) and five-plus forced fumbles (five) since 2015.
- Smith has already set a career high with 10 sacks this season. He matched his single-game career high set on Dec. 26, 2015, at Philadelphia with three sacks in Week 3 vs. Denver.
- ►LB Za'Darius (zuh-DARE-ee-us) Smith played in 58 regular-season games with 16 starts in four seasons for the Baltimore Ravens and ranked No. 2 among NFL linebackers in 2018 in QB hits (25) and tied for No. 6 in total pressures (sacks + hurries + knockdowns) with 35.
- ►For the third year in a row, Z. Smith registered a sack in the season opener. He is one of six NFL players to record a sack in Week 1 each of the last three seasons (2017-19).
- Z. Smith's 8.5 sacks have tied his career high set last season.
- P. Smith has registered a sack in six games this season, tied for No.6 in the NFL.
- ► In the Week 5 win at Dallas, Preston (one) and Za'Darius (two) combined for three sacks and tied for the team lead with three QB pressures. They followed it up in Week 6 by combining for 2.5 sacks (Preston, 1.5 and Za'Darius, one).

It was the most by an NFL player since Rams WR Tavon Austin (2-138) on Nov. 10, 2013.
- ► In Week 7, Valdes-Scantling also tied a career franchise record with his third 100-yard receiving game on three or fewer catches.
- ► Valdes-Scantling's 74-yard TD reception in the fourth quarter of Week 7 was Green Bay's longest play from scrimmage this season and the longest catch of his career. It was his fifth reception of 40-plus yards this season, giving him nine career catches of 40-plus yards.
- ► In Week 7, Valdes-Scantling (74, 59) became the first Packer with a pair of 50-plus-yard receptions in a game since WR Greg Jennings at St. Louis on Sept. 27, 2009.

Two years after he co-founded the Packers with Curly Lambeau, George Calhoun began writing a piece called The Dope Sheet, which served as the official press release from 1921-24.

ODDS AND ENDS

- In Week 10, WR Davante Adams registered 118 receiving yards on seven receptions (16.9 avg.), the 14th 100-yard receiving game of his career.
- Adams returned from injury in Week 9 and over his first two weeks back in action, he had 14 receptions (tied for No. 8 in the NFL in Weeks 9-10) for 159 yards.
- Green Bay is tied for No. 9 in the NFL in total touchdowns (30) this season.
- Since Week 4, the Packers rank in the top 10 in the NFL in yards per play (No. 3, 6.22), points per game (No. 5, 27.4) and first downs (No. 9, 156).
- The Packers averaged 8.75 yards per play vs. Oakland in Week 7, the best average by Green Bay since Nov. 16, 1997, at Indianapolis (10.02).
- Green Bay has allowed two or fewer sacks in seven games this season, tied for No. 5 in the NFL.
- LB Blake Martinez totaled 20 tackles (10 solo) in Week 7, the most by a Packer in a game since LB Desmond Bishop had 20 tackles vs. St. Louis on Oct. 16, 2011.
- Martinez has a team-best 133 tackles on the season (85 solo), marking the third consecutive year he has surpassed 130 tackles (158 in 2017 and 147 in 2018).
- ► TE Jimmy Graham recorded a reception of 54 yards in 2018 and of 48 yards in Week 10 this season, becoming the first Packer TE to register a reception of 45-plus yards in two consecutive seasons since Ron Kramer tallied one in four straight seasons (1961-64).
- Graham posted a pair of 25-plus-yard receptions (29, 25) in Week 7 for his second time in a Green Bay uniform (Week 2 vs. Minnesota in 2018), finishing with four catches for 65 yards (16.3 avg.) and a TD.
- Graham has three receiving TDs this season, tied for No. 9 in the NFL among tight ends.

BREAKING DOWN THE ROSTER

The Packers have a 53-man roster that is composed of 25 offensive players, 25 defensive players and three specialists.

- Of the 53 players on Green Bay's roster, 29 of them (54.7 percent) were draft picks of the Packers. Green Bay has seven players that were drafted in the first round, including six that were selected by the Packers.
- Green Bay has 12 players on the roster that began their careers as undrafted free agents.
- Over a third of the players (19 of 53, 35.8 percent) on Green Bay's roster entered the league as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as an undrafted player.
- Of the 53 players on the roster, 47 of them (88.7 percent) are 28 years old or younger (as of Nov. 24) and 23 players (43.4 percent) are 24 years old or younger.

348 AND COUNTING

Another packed house at Lambeau Field against the Carolina Panthers in Week 10 of 2019 brought the stadium's consecutive-sellouts streak to 348 regular-season games (not including replacement games).

- ► The league's longest-tenured stadium, Lambeau Field is hosting its 63rd season of football in 2019. For the victory over Dallas in the Divisional round of the 2014 playoffs, Packers fans set a new Lambeau Field paid-attendance record (79,704).
- Across American professional sports, only Boston's Fenway Park (1912) and Chicago's Wrigley Field (1914) have longer tenures.

THE LAMBEAU ADVANTAGE

The crown jewel of the National Football League, Lambeau Field has long been known as one of the tougher venues to play in, particularly during the harsh Wisconsin winter.

- ► Re-establishing home-field advantage after a 4-4 mark in 2008 was one of the goals of 2009, and with the Packers finishing 6-2 at home, they accomplished that goal. Green Bay followed that up with a 7-1 mark at Lambeau Field in 2010, a perfect 8-0 record in 2011, the first undefeated home mark since 2002, and a 7-1 mark in 2012. The Packers were one of two teams to finish undefeated at home during the 2014 regular season (Denver).
- ► Green Bay was 5-2-1 (.786) at home in 2018, marking the eighth time in the last 10 seasons that the Packers won five-plus games at home.
- Since Ron Wolf and Mike Holmgren began the revitalization of the franchise in 1992, Green Bay owns the best home record in the NFL. A look at the top regular-season home W-L records since the '92 season:



Detroit Lions, 23-22, on Monday night GREEN BAY, Wis. (AP) — It took Mason Crosby 13 seasons to perform his first Lambeau Leap. The 35-year-old kicker nailed a 23-yard field goal as time expired and jumped into the crowd with a boost from long snapper Hunter Bradley after he finished off a rally for the Green Bay Packers, who benefited from some questionable officiating to edge the

Aaron Rodgers, in his second straight game without top target Davante Adams, completed 24 of 39 passes for 283 yards and two touchdowns, including a beautiful 35-yard throw to Allen Lazard for the first-yaar pro's first career score. Rodgers linked up with Jamaal Williams for the other TD. Williams finished with 104 yards on 14 carries and four catches for 32 yards for Green Bay (5-1), which captured its first with in five tries against its NFC North firal. The Packers, who are off to their first 3-0 start in the NFC North since 2012, might not have pulled it off if not for two fourth-quarter penalties for illegal hands to the face against Detroit's Trey Flowers, both of them on third down. The first set up Lazard's touchdown,

and the second allowed Green Bay to run the clock down to two seconds before Crosby's game-winner. In both cases, replays showed Flowers' hands on the neck or shoulder — not the face — of a Packers lineman. Referee Clete Blakeman said each of the calls was made by umpire Jeff Rice, and he discussed the last one with him. Matt Prater was good from 26, 22, 41, 51 and 54 yards for the Lions (2-2-1), who fell to 0-2 under Matt Patricia on Monday night. Detroit lost its last Monday night game to the Jets, 48-17, last year. Matthew Stafford finished 18 of 32 for 265 yards and was sacked three times.

Kerryon Johnson scored the lone touchdown for the Lions from 1 yard out in the first quarter. Preston Smith and Za Darius Smith each had a sack for Green Bay. Preston Smith and Kyler Fackrell combined for the other. Rodgers was sacked once by Damon Harrison Sr. and threw an interception that bounced off the facemask of an open Darrius Shephera near the goal line. James Coleman snagged the ball and returned it 55 yards, setting up Prater's last field goal that made it 22-13.

30 Jamaal Williams, RB, 3rd Year, Brigham Young

• Is one of only three players in team history (RBs Gerry Ellis and Eddie Lacy) to register 400-plus rushing yards and 200-plus receiving yards in both of his first two seasons in the NFL.

• Posted 95 rushing yards and 61 receiving yards at the N.Y. Jets last season in Week 16, becoming just the third Packer since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to have 95-plus rushing yards and 60-plus receiving yards in a game (RB John Brockington, Nov. 17, 1974, at Minnesota; RB Dorsey Levens, Nov. 16, 1997, at Indianapolis).

• Rushed for a team-high 556 yards in 2017, the fourth most by a Green Bay rookie in team history, and four touchdowns on 153 carries (3.6 avg.). Added 262 receiving yards and two TDs on 25 catches (10.5 avg.), the most receiving yards by a Green Bay rookie RB since Keith Woodside totaled 352 yards in 1988.

• After moving into the starting lineup in Week 11 as a rookie, posted 672 yards from scrimmage over that span (No. 11 in the NFL) and 455 rushing yards (No. 10). Registered 100-plus yards from scrimmage in four of the final six games.

Detroit (Oct. 14): Returned to action and paced the team with 104 rushing yards on just 14 carries (7.4 avg.), the fewest attempts by a Green Bay player in a 100-yard rushing game since RB James Starks (10-112) vs. San Diego on Oct. 18, 2015...Posted a career-long 45-yard run in the second quarter, Green Bay's longest carry of the season, as he took it up the middle and made a cut to make S Tavon Wilson miss on his way to the Detroit 10 to help set up a 37-yard Mason Crosby FG just before halftime.... Added four receptions for 32 yards (8.0 avg.) and a TD, scoring from 5 yards out as he came in motion and took the pass from QB Aaron Rodgers out of the shotgun midway through the second quarter...His 136 yards from scrimmage was the second-highest single-game output of his career behind only his 156-yard effort at the N.Y. Jets in Week 16 last season.

►Vs. Oakland (Oct. 20): Was tied for the team lead with four receptions for 26 yards (6.5 avg.) and a TD, scoring from 2 yards out on a pass in the flat from Rodgers late in the first half for his career-high third TD catch of the season...Rushed three times for 5 yards (1.7 avg.).

►At Kansas City (Oct. 27): Rushed for 22 yards and a TD on seven carries (3.1 avg.) and added three catches for 14 yards (4.7 avg.) and a score, his third career game with a rushing TD/receiving TD (two in 2017)...Late in the first quarter, took the shotgun handoff from Rodgers for a 1-yard TD run up the middle...Early in the fourth quarter on third-and-1 from the Kansas City 3, initially came across the middle before circling to the back corner of the end zone to make a diving TD catch with LB Ben Niemann in coverage.

Chargers (Nov. 3): Started as the Packers opened with two RBs, finishing with 10 rushing yards on two carries (5.0 avg.) and six receptions for 39 yards (6.5 avg.) and a TD...Caught a 10-yard TD pass with 6:21 remaining in the game, giving him a TD reception for the fourth consecutive game as he tied Green (2003) for the longest single-season streak by a RB in team history.

► Vs. Carolina (Nov. 10): Rushed for 63 yards on 13 carries (4.8 avg.), picking up a season-high five first downs.

38 Tramon Williams, CB, 13th Year, Louisiana Tech

• Has appeared in 153 regular-season games for the Packers (2007-14, 2018), the fourth most among defensive backs in franchise history behind only LeRoy Butler (181), Willie Wood (166) and Mark Lee (157).

• Has 37 career interceptions (including playoffs), tied for the most among active NFL players (49ers CB Richard Sherman).

• Returned to the Packers and started all 16 games in 2018 after spending three seasons with the Cleveland Browns (2015-16) and Arizona Cardinals (2017).

• Has three career TDs, including INT returns of 43 yards (2011) and 70 yards (2010 postseason) and a 94-yard punt return (2007).

• Ranked No. 1 in the NFL with a combined nine interceptions in 2010 (six in regular season, three in postseason) and was chosen for the Pro Bowl as an injury replacement.

• Was one of only two NFL players (CB Terence Newman) to register at least one interception each season from 2007-17.

2019 SEASON: Has played in all 10 games with three starts and has posted 24 tackles (10 solo), an interception, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and six passes defensed.
