PACKERS RETURN HOME TO PLAY THE REDSKINS

After a bye week and two road games, the Packers will play their first home game in almost a month when they take on Washington this Sunday.



- It will be the third matchup between the two teams in the last five years (including the postseason), but the first in Green Bay since 2013.
- ► The Packers have won four straight home games against the Redskins, outscoring Washington, 122-43, in those contests.
- It is the first time Washington has played at Lambeau in December.
- ► Green Bay is 2-1 against the NFC East this season. With a win, the Packers would tie 2010 and 2007 (3-1, .750) for their best record in a single regular season against the NFC East (min. two games) since the divisions were realigned in 2002.
- ► Packers Head Coach **Matt LaFleur** coached quarterbacks for Washington from 2010-13.
- It will be the fifth game Green Bay has played at noon CT this season, having won the previous four contests.
- ▶ QB Aaron Rodgers has a career passer rating of 111.2 in regularseason home games in Dec.-Jan., ranking No. 1 in NFL history (min. 200 pass att.) according to the Elias Sports Bureau.
- ▶ This is the first of the Packers' final two home games of the regular season. Next week they will take on the Chicago Bears at Lambeau Field to start a run of three straight divisional games to finish the regular season for the third time since the NFC North was formed in 2002 (2006, 2016).

KEEPING IT GOING

- ► Green Bay has won nine of its first 12 games, marking the eighth time the Packers have won at least nine of their first 12 games of the regular season since 1970 (12-0 in 2011, 10-2 in 2007 and 9-3 in 2014, 2002, 2001, 1997 and 1996).
- ► With a win, LaFleur (9-3) would pass Mike Holmgren and Mike Sherman (9-7) for the most NFL wins by a Packer head coach in their first season.
- ► Green Bay is one of seven NFL teams with at least nine wins this season, with four of those teams residing in the NFC.
- ► The Packers are 7-2 this season in Sunday games, a .778 winning percentage that is **tied for No. 5 in the NFL** in 2019.
- ► Green Bay is 6-2 against NFC teams this season with a .750 winning percentage that ranks No. 4 among NFC teams. The Packers' six wins against NFC teams are tied for the fourth most in the NFL this season.
- The Packers have started 3-0 in the NFC North for the first time since 2012 and for just the fourth time (2011 and 2002) since the division was formed in 2002.

REGULAR-SEASON WEEK 14

► Green Bay joins Dallas (4-0), Kansas City (4-0), New England (4-0), and Seattle (3-0) as the only teams to be undefeated in division games this season.

WITH THE CALL

FOX Sports, now in its 26th season as an NFL network television partner, will broadcast the game.



- ► Play-by-play man **Kenny Albert** joins analyst **Ronde Barber** and sideline reporter **Lindsay Czarniak**.
- Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since November 1929, heads up the Packers Radio Network that is made up of 50 stations in four states. Wayne Larrivee (play-by-play), two-time Packers Pro Bowler Larry McCarren (analyst) and three-time Packers Pro Bowler and two-time All-Pro John Kuhn (sideline) will call the action. McCarren first joined the team's broadcasts in 1995 and enters his 25th season calling Packers games. After originally being paired together in 1999, McCarren and Larrivee enter their 21st season of broadcasts together. They surpassed Jim Irwin and Max McGee for the most regular-season and postseason games broadcast for the Packers with 313 at the 2018 season opener against Chicago.
- ► The broadcast is also available on Sirius Satellite Radio (WTMJ feed).
- ▶ DIRECTV subscribers can watch the game on Channel 711.

HOME SWEET HOME

Green Bay has a long tradition of playing well at Lambeau Field, and it has continued this season with a 5-1 record at home, an .833 winning percentage that is **tied for No. 3 in the NFL**:

- ▶ Dating back to 2018, the Packers are 10-3-1 at home during the regular season, a .750 winning percentage that is **No. 6** in the **NFL** over that span. Green Bay's three losses are **tied for the second fewest** at home in the NFL since 2018.
- ► Green Bay has 231 victories at Lambeau Field, the most home wins by any franchise at one stadium in NFL history.
- ► The victory over Oakland in Week 7 was the 15th in the last 18 games the Packers have played against an AFC team at Lambeau Field.
- ► With the win over the Minnesota Vikings in Week 2 of 2019, Green Bay has won seven straight home openers (2013-19). Since 2007, the Packers are 12-1 in their first game of the season at Lambeau Field.
- ► Green Bay will finish with a record of .500 or better at home for the 13th consecutive season:

- ►The Packers are No. 1 in the NFL in sacks allowed at home (seven) this season
- ▶ QB Aaron Rodgers has started 84 home games during the regular season for Green Bay, with the Packers holding a 66-17-1 record in those contests. He has completed 1,889 of 2,856 passes (66.1 pct.) for 22,915 yards (272.8 per game), 193 touchdowns, 35 interceptions and a passer rating of 108.1.
- ► Rodgers ranks **No. 2 in the NFL** since 1970 in passer rating at home as a starter (min. 500 pass att.), according to Sportradar:

- ► Rodgers has a passer rating of 105.8 at home this season, **No. 6 in the NFL** (min. 100 pass att., Sportradar).
- ▶ Rodgers has led Green Bay to a 16-3-1 record in his last 20 starts at home, recording a passer rating of 100-plus in 11 of those games, including the first perfect passer rating (158.3) of his career in a Week 7 win over Oakland.

RODGERS AND TOUCHDOWNS

QB **Aaron Rodgers** has found the end zone a lot in his career and that has continued this season.

► Rodgers is **one of two QBs** with 15-plus passing TDs and two or fewer interceptions this season:

- ► Rodgers has thrown a TD pass in 10 games this season, tied for No. 5 in the NFL.
- ▶Rodgers is **tied for No. 6 in the NFL** in TD passes this season.
- ▶ Dating back to 2018, Rodgers has thrown 47 TDs and just four interceptions. He is the **only player in the NFL** to throw 20-plus TDs and fewer than eight interceptions since 2018.
- ▶ Last season was the first time in his career that Rodgers registered 25-plus touchdowns and two or fewer interceptions in a season (25/2). Dating back to 1920, he was the **third player in the NFL** with 25-plus TDs and two or fewer INTs in a single season (Tom Brady, 28/2 in 2016 and Nick Foles, 27/2 in 2013), according to pro-football-reference.com.
- ►With his fourth TD pass in Week 7, Rodgers became the ninth player in NFL history to throw 350 career TD passes. He reached 350 TD passes in his 172nd game, surpassing Saints QB Drew Brees (180 games) as the fastest to 350 TD passes in league history.
- ► Rodgers is tied for No. 2 in the NFL in games with four-plus TD passes and zero interceptions this season:

➤ Rodgers has thrown four-plus touchdowns in a game a franchise-record 23 times. That is tied for the fourth most in the NFL since 1950 and ranks No. 3 among active quarterbacks (according to pro-football-reference.com):

- ▶ Dating back to 2014, Rodgers is No. 1 in the NFL in games with fourplus TD passes (11).
- ▶In Week 7, Rodgers completed TD passes to two different running backs (Aaron Jones and Jamaal Williams) in a game for the first time in his career. It was the first time the Packers had two different RBs/FBs catch a TD pass in the same game since Nov. 14, 2004, vs. Minnesota (RB Tony Fisher and FB William Henderson). Rodgers, Jones and Williams duplicated the effort in Week 8.

- ► With a league-best 40 passing TDs during the 2016 regular season, Rodgers became just the fourth QB in NFL history to record two seasons (also 2011) with 40-plus TD passes (Marino, Manning, Brees). It was his franchise-record fourth season (2011-12, 2014, 2016) with 35-plus TD passes (Brett Favre, three, 1995-97).
- ► Rodgers has five seasons with 4,000-plus passing yards and 30-plus passing TDs (2009, 2011-12, 2014, 2016), the most in team history.
- ▶ Rodgers has thrown 38-plus TD passes four times in his career, the most in NFL history:

- ► Rodgers recorded three-plus passing TDs in Games 7-8, **one of nine**NFL QBs to register consecutive games with three-plus passing TDs this season.
- ▶ Rodgers has registered three-plus passing touchdowns in at least three consecutive games in a single season six times (five: Games 6-10 in 2011 / four: Games 4-7 in 2012 and 2014 / three: Games 14-16 in 2012, Games 6-8 in 2016 and Games 3-5, 2017).
- ▶ Rodgers is tied for No. 4 in the NFL in games with three-plus passing touchdowns since 2016:

► The Week 1 comeback win over Chicago last season marked the first time in Rodgers' career that he threw three TDs in the fourth quarter.





TAKING HIS PLACE AMONG THE GAME'S BEST

QB **Aaron Rodgers** surpassed the 1,500-attempt plateau for his career in 2010, the benchmark to qualify for passer rating in the NFL record book.

► Rodgers ranks No. 1 in NFL history in career passer rating:

- ▶In Week 7, Rodgers set a single-game franchise record with a perfect 158.3 passer rating after connecting on 25 of 31 passes for 429 yards and five TDs with no INTs. It eclipsed the previous single-game team record of 155.4 by Rodgers at Cleveland on Oct. 25, 2009.
- ▶ Rodgers also posted a rushing TD in Week 7, making him just the second QB in NFL history (Redskins QB Mark Rypien; Nov. 10, 1991) to throw for 400-plus yards with five-plus passing TDs, a rushing TD and no INTs.
- ▶Dating back to 1950, Rodgers is just the sixth NFL QB to register 400plus passing yards and a perfect passer rating in a game, according to pro-football-reference.com.
- ▶Rodgers' average of 13.84 yards per attempt in Week 7 was a single-game career high (min. 15 att.) and was the best by a Green Bay QB since Brett Favre registered a 14.52-yard average (363 yards on 25 att.) at Indianapolis on Nov. 16, 1997. Rodgers' 13.84-yard average was the best in team history in a game with 30-plus attempts.
- ► Weeks 7-8 marked the sixth time in his career that Rodgers has had two or more consecutive games with 300-plus passing yards, three-plus passing TDs and no INTs. No other QB in team history has done it once.

- ▶ Rodgers reached 40,000 passing yards in his 154th career game (Week 5 at Detroit, 2018). At the time, he had 323 passing TDs, becoming the first quarterback in NFL history to reach 40,000 passing yards and 300 TD passes in fewer than 157 games, the number in which both Peyton Manning and Dan Marino reached the two marks.
- ▶ Rodgers tied Manning for the fourth-fewest games to reach 40,000 passing yards, trailing Matt Ryan (151), Drew Brees (152) and Marino (153), according to the Elias Sports Bureau.
- ► Rodgers threw for 400-plus yards in Week 7 to extend his **franchise record** to nine 400-plus-yard games. No other quarterback in franchise annals has more than one 400-yard passing game (four QBs with one).
- ▶In Week 4, Rodgers passed Hall of Fame QB Fran Tarkenton (342) to rank **No. 9 in NFL history** in touchdown passes. He (359) trails Giants QB Eli Manning (362) for the No. 8 spot and Steelers QB Ben Roethlisberger (363) for No. 7 in NFL history.
- ▶Rodgers reached 5,000 career attempts in Week 3 of 2018. At the time of his 5,000th career attempt, he had 319 TD passes and 78 INTs, setting the record for the most (Johnny Unitas, 284) and fewest (Donovan McNabb, 107) in each category in NFL history at the time of the 5,000th attempt
- ▶ Rodgers ranks No. 10 in the NFL this season in completions (266). He finished the 2018 season with 372 completions, tied for the second most in a season in team history behind his franchise mark of 401 (2016).
- ▶ Rodgers finished 2018 with 4,442 passing yards, 25 passing touch-downs and just two interceptions, marking his sixth season with 4,000-plus passing yards, 25-plus passing TDs and 10 or fewer interceptions, the most by an NFL player since 1920, according to pro-football-reference.com:

PACKERS VS. REDSKINS - WEEK 14

NEW LEADER

The Green Bay Packers named **Matt LaFleur** (la-flew-er) the 15th head coach in franchise history on Jan. 8, 2019.

- ► With a win, LaFleur (9-3) would pass Mike Holmgren and Mike Sherman (9-7) for the most NFL wins by a Packer head coach in their first season.
- ►He is the first head coach in franchise history to win seven of his first eight NFL games and the first to win his first three road NFL contests.
- ► LaFleur is the 19th NFL head coach and the first since Jim Harbaugh in 2011 to win at least seven of his first eight games (Elias Sports Bureau).
- ► He joined Vince Lombardi (3-0) as the only head coaches in franchise history to win their first three NFL games.
- ►It was the first time since 2015 and just the third time (2011) in the last 12 seasons that Green Bay has started 3-0.
- ► According to the Elias Sports Bureau, LaFleur joined John Harbaugh (2008) and Don Coryell (1973) as the only head coaches since the merger (1970) to win each of their first two games, both against divisional opponents.
- ►With a win at Chicago in Week 1, LaFleur became the sixth head coach in franchise history to win his first game, joining Curly Lambeau, Vince Lombardi, Phil Bengston, Forrest Gregg and Ray Rhodes. He joins Lombardi as the only Packers head coaches to beat the Bears in their first game.
- ► LaFleur became only the second coach to make his head-coaching debut in the NFL's primetime kickoff game (since 2002), joining Jim Zorn, who made his debut with Washington in a losing effort against the New York Giants (16-7) in 2008.
- ▶ LaFleur is in his 11th season in the NFL in 2019, having served as an offensive coordinator for two seasons (Los Angeles Rams, 2017; Tennessee Titans, 2018), a quarterbacks coach for six seasons (Washington Redskins, 2010-13; Atlanta Falcons, 2015-16) and an offensive assistant for two seasons (Houston Texans, 2008-09).
- ▶ During his first 10 seasons in the NFL, LaFleur was a part of offensive staffs that helped their teams rank in the top 10 in the league in total yards seven times (2008-09, 2012-13, 2015-17). In three of his last six seasons in the NFL, he was on a staff that helped its offense finish in the top five in the league in scoring, highlighted by No. 1 rankings in 2016 with the Falcons and in 2017 with the Rams.
- ▶The former quarterback began his coaching career in 2003 at his alma mater, Saginaw Valley State. LaFleur has six seasons of coaching experience at the collegiate level.

THE NEW STAFF

LaFleur explored various avenues to compile his coaching staff, bringing in new coaches and retaining some from the 2018 staff.

- ▶ Offensive coordinator Nathaniel Hackett brings 10 years of NFL experience to Green Bay, including five as an offensive coordinator (Buffalo, 2013-14; Jacksonville, 2016-18). In 2017, he guided the Jaguars to a No. 1 league ranking in rushing (141.4 ypg) for the first time in team history on their way to an appearance in the AFC Championship Game.
- ▶ Defensive coordinator **Mike Pettine** was retained after a 2018 season that featured 16 different players with at least a half-sack, the second most in team history (since 1982) behind only the 1987 campaign (strike season) that saw 17 players register a half-sack or more. The defense finished 2018 tied for No. 8 in the league in sacks (44), the most by Green Bay since 2013, and No. 12 in the NFL in pass defense (234.5 ypg) after finishing No. 23 in the category in 2017.
- Special teams coordinator **Shawn Mennenga** (MEN-in-guh) begins his eighth season in the NFL and returns to the league after leading the special teams at Vanderbilt last season. From 2011-17, he served as the special teams assistant for the Cleveland Browns, assisting Chris Tabor as the team ranked No. 7 in the league over that span in both punt return average (9.9) and opponent kickoff return average (21.8).
- ▶ Chris Gizzi, who served as a strength and conditioning assistant from 2014-18, was promoted to strength and conditioning coordinator. As a player, he appeared in 23 games for the Packers as a linebacker in 2000-01, ranking No. 5 on the team with eight tackles on special teams in 2000. Gizzi will lead a staff that consists of Mark Lovat, Thadeus Jackson and Grant Thorne.
- ▶Quarterbacks coach Luke Getsy returns to the Packers after spending last season as the offensive coordinator/wide receivers coach for Mississippi State. Over his last two seasons in Green Bay (2016-17), Getsy worked as the wide receivers coach after originally joining the

- Packers in 2014 as the offensive quality control coach.
- ▶ Defensive line coach **Jerry Montgomery** is entering his fifth season with the Packers and second as defensive line coach. He worked as the defensive front assistant for Green Bay from 2015-17. Montgomery has helped with the development of DL Kenny Clark, who recorded 10.5 sacks in 2017-18, the most among Packers defensive linemen.
- ▶ Inside linebackers coach **Kirk Olivadotti** (ah-luh-vuh-DOT-ee) joins the Packers after coaching for the Washington Redskins for 16 seasons. He is one of 11 members of the Redskins' assistant coach honor roll, which recognizes coaches with at least 10 seasons of service as an assistant in Washington. During his time with the Redskins, Washington ranked in the top 10 in the NFL in overall defense eight times.
- ▶ Tight ends coach **Justin Outten** (OW-ten) was the offensive assistant for the Atlanta Falcons the past two seasons (2017-18). He began with the Falcons as an offensive intern in 2016. Over the last three seasons, Atlanta averaged 27.2 points per game (No. 4 in the NFL over that span) and 389.9 yards per game (No. 3 in the league over that span).
- ▶ Defensive backs coach **Jason Simmons** is entering his ninth season with the Packers having worked in various roles (secondary in 2018, assistant special teams coach from 2015-17, defensive/special teams assistant in 2014 and a coaching administrator from 2011-13). Before coaching, he played for 10 years in the NFL as a defensive back and was a standout on special teams during his career.
- ▶ Running backs coach **Ben Sirmans** is entering his fourth season in that position for the Packers. From 2016-18, Green Bay led the NFL with an average of 4.66 yards per carry, including an average of 5.01 yards per carry in 2018 (No. 2 in the NFL) that was the second-best single-season mark in team history. He joined the Packers after spending the previous four seasons (2012-15) as the running backs coach for the St. Louis Rams.
- ▶ Outside linebackers coach **Mike Smith** joins the Packers after spending the last three seasons with the Kansas City Chiefs, first as the assistant defensive line coach in 2016-17 and then coaching outside linebackers last season. In 2018, Smith coached Dee Ford, who was selected to his first Pro Bowl after tying for the NFL lead with seven forced fumbles and tying for No. 2 among NFL linebackers with a career-high 13 sacks.
- ▶Offensive line coach Adam Stenavich (STEN-uh-vitch) comes to the Packers after serving as the assistant offensive line coach for the San Francisco 49ers the last two seasons. He helped coach a line that cleared the way for RB Matt Breida to average 4.96 yards per carry in 2016-17, ranking No. 5 in the NFL over that span (min. 200 att.). The Marshfield, Wis., native played left tackle at Michigan (2002-05) and was named first-team All-Big Ten in 2004-05. Following his collegiate career, Stenavich spent time with a few NFL teams, including a stint on the Packers' practice squad in 2006.
- ► Wide receivers coach Alvis Whitted (WHITT-id), who played wide receiver for nine seasons in the NFL, worked for the last seven years as the wide receivers coach at Colorado State. During his tenure at CSU, Whitted mentored three All-America wide receivers, including two consensus first-team All-Americans who also were finalists for the Biletnikoff Award (Michael Gallup in 2017 and Rashard Higgins in 2014).
- Assistant offensive line coach **Luke Butkus** comes to Green Bay after serving as the offensive line coach for the University of Illinois for the past three seasons (2016-18), a position he also held for the Fighting Illini in 2012. Between the two stints at his alma mater, he was the assistant offensive line coach for the Jacksonville Jaguars (2013-15).
- ► Assistant defensive backs coach Ryan Downard begins his second season in Green Bay after serving as the defensive quality control coach last year. He came to Green Bay after working at Bowling Green for two seasons, serving as the safeties coach in 2017 and the director of football operations in 2016.
- ► Assistant special teams coach **Maurice Drayton** was retained and is entering his fourth season coaching in the NFL. He worked as the assistant special teams coach for each of the past three seasons (Green Bay in 2018 and the Indianapolis Colts in 2016-17).
- ▶Offensive assistant Jason Vrable enters his seventh season as an assistant coach in the NFL, previously working for the New York Jets (2017-18) and Buffalo Bills (2013-16).
- The staff also consists of four quality control coaches: Wendel Davis (defense), Kevin Koger (offense), Christian Parker (defense) and Rayna Stewart (special teams).

nator for two seasons (Los Angeles Rams, 2017; Tennessee Titans, 2018), a quarterbacks coach for six seasons (Washington Redskins, 2010-13; Atlanta Falcons, 2015-16), and an offensive assistant for two seasons (Houston Texans, 2008-09).

► Guided the Titans' offense in 2018 to a No. 7 league ranking in rushing (126.4 ypg) as Tennessee registered 11 games with 100-plus rushing

yards, tied for No. 2 in the NFL.

► Helped the Rams lead the league in scoring with an average of 29.9 points per game in 2017, more than doubling their average from 2016 (14.0 ppg)

►Tutored QB Matt Ryan, who led the league in passer rating (117.1) in 2016 on his way to being named NFL Most Valuable Player by The

Associated Press.

Coached rookie QB Robert Griffin III with the Redskins in 2012, who became the first QB in team history to win AP Offensive Rookie of the

BILL CALLAHAN...Was named Redskins' interim head coach in Week 6 of the 2019 NFL season.

- ▶In his 21st season in the NFL, where he has served as offensive coordinator on two occasions (Oakland Raiders, 1998-2001; Dallas Cowboys, 2012-14), offensive line coach (Philadelphia Eagles, 1998; N.Y. Jets, 2008-11) and two seasons as head coach of the Oakland Raiders (2002-03) prior to his time in Washington.
- ► Was named by the team as assistant head coach following a 2016 season where the Redskins set single-season franchise records in yards per game (403.4) and yards per play (6.40), while also racking up three 500-yard games.
- ▶Led the Oakland Raiders to an 11-5 regular-season record as a firstyear head coach in 2002 en route to an appearance in Super Bowl
- ► Spent four seasons as the head coach for the University of Nebraska (2004-07), where the Cornhuskers made two bowl appearances and advanced to the 2006 Big 12 Championship Game.

THE PACKERS-REDSKINS SERIES

► The Packers first met the Redskins (then Boston Braves) in 1932, five days after Franklin D. Roosevelt won his first presidential election.

- ►The clubs met memorably in the 1936 NFL championship game. That year, Redskins owner George Preston Marshall, upset with his fans' lack of support, was moving his team to Washington and didn't want to host the championship in Boston. The NFL moved the game to New York's Polo Grounds, where Green Bay claimed its fourth world championship, 21-6.
- The teams played in what was then the highest-scoring game in Monday Night Football history on Oct. 17, 1983, at Lambeau Field, a contest that featured 11 TDs and six FGs in the 48-47 Green Bay win.

Jets (2010-11)...Pettine and Cavanaugh also coached together at the University of Pittsburgh in 1993...Callahan was the head coach of Oakland when Packers wide receivers coach Alvis Whitted played for the team (2002-03)...Additionally, Redskins running backs coach Randy Jordan and director of football operations Paul Kelly were assistants on the Oakland staff in 2003...Pettine and Cavanaugh also worked together on the Baltimore staff for three seasons (2002-04)...Redskins special teams coordinator Nate Kaczor held the same position in Tampa Bay when the team drafted Packers FB Danny Vitale in 2016...Kaczor was the assistant special teams coordinator in Jacksonville when Packers TE Marcedes Lewis was on the team (2008-11)...Redskins offensive quality control Chris O'Hara was the offensive coaching associate in Jacksonville when Packers offensive coordinator Nathaniel Hackett and were on the staff (2015-16) and Lewis played for the team (2014-16)...Pettine, special teams coordinator Shawn Mennenga and defensive backs assistant coach Ryan Downard coached alongside Redskins offensive coordinator Kevin O'Connell in Cleveland for one year (2015). Additionally, O'Connell was a quarterback with the N.Y. OFFSEASON ADDITIONS ENHANCE DEFENSE

Packers General Manager **Brian Gutekunst** and his staff made numerous moves to strengthen the roster this offseason including bringing the Smiths to Green Bay.

►The Packers are the only team in the league to have two players with 10-plus sacks this season:

- ►The Smiths are only the **second tandem in Packers history** (since 1982) to each have 10-plus sacks in a season (Reggie White, 13.0 and Bryce Paup, 11.0 in 1993).
- ▶LB Preston Smith is the only player in the NFL with 25-plus sacks (35.0), five-plus INTs (five) and five-plus forced fumbles (five) since 2015.
- ▶P. Smith has already set a career high with 10.5 sacks this season. He matched his single-game career high set on Dec. 26, 2015, at Philadelphia with three sacks in Week 3 vs. Denver.
- ▶P. Smith registered 1.5 sacks in Week 1, including taking down Trubisky on fourth down to seal the victory. It was the third time in his career that Smith recorded at least one sack in Week 1. He followed it up by picking off QB Kirk Cousins in Week 2.
- ►LB **Za'Darius** (zuh-DARE-ee-us) **Smith's** 10.0 sacks have surpassed his career high of 8.5 that he set last season.
- ► For the third year in a row, Z. Smith registered a sack in the season opener. He is **one of six NFL players** to record a sack in Week 1 each of the last three seasons (2017-19).
- ▶ P. Smith and Z. Smith have each registered a sack in six games this season, making the Packers **one of five teams** to have multiple players record a sack in six or more games.
- ▶In the Week 5 win at Dallas, Preston (one) and Za'Darius (two) combined for three sacks and tied for the team lead with three QB pressures. They followed it up in Week 6 by combining for 2.5 sacks (Preston, 1.5 and Za'Darius, one).

VERSATILE BACKS

The Packers' backfield trio of RBs **Aaron Jones** and **Jamaal Williams** and FB **Danny Vitale** combines skill sets in the run and pass game.

- ► Jones (39) and Williams (36) are the **only RB duo in the league** to have 35-plus receptions each this season.
- ► They are the first Packers RB duo to each have 30-plus receptions since Ryan Grant (30) and Vernand Morency (30) in 2007.
- ► Green Bay has rushed for over 115 yards in five of the last eight games, tied for No. 3 in the NFL since Week 5.
- ▶In Week 10, the Packers posted 163 rushing yards and three TDs on 27 carries (6.0 avg.), just the **fifth time** since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger that the team registered 160-plus rushing yards and three-plus rushing TDs on 30 or fewer attempts. Jones (93 yards on 13 att.) and Williams (63 yards on 13 att.) became the **first Green Bay duo** to rush for 60-plus yards each on 15 or fewer carries each in the same game since RB Paul Ott Carruth and FB Gerry Ellis did so vs. Minnesota on Dec. 7,
- ▶Green Bay has 13 rushing TDs this season, tied for No. 7 in the NFL.

- ► Williams registered a receiving TD in four straight games (Weeks 6-9), joining Green (2003) as the only RBs in Packers history to have a TD catch in four consecutive games in a single season.
- ►Williams has registered 200-plus receiving yards in each of his first three seasons in the league to tie Jessie Clark (1983-85) for the most consecutive seasons with 200-plus yards by a Packers RB to start their career (according to the Elias Sports Bureau).
- ►In Week 8, Jones had two receiving TDs and Williams had one, marking the first time the Packers have had three TD receptions in a game by RBs since Nov. 12, 1995, vs. Chicago (Edgar Bennett with two, Dorsey Levens with one).

- ►Vitale has three receptions for 20-plus yards, tied for No. 11 in the NFL among RBs/FBs.
- ►The Packers rushed for 120-plus yards in Weeks 5-6 on fewer than 30 attempts. It was only the fourth time since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger that the Packers had posted back-to-back games with 120-plus rushing yards on fewer than 30 attempts and the first time since 2006.
- ▶Week 6 marked the fifth time since 2017 that the Packers posted 150-plus rushing yards on fewer than 30 attempts, which is tied for the most in the league over that span (Kansas City, San Francisco). Green Bay is also the only team in the league to have at least one of those games in each of the last three seasons (2017-19).
- ▶ Jones tied a franchise record with four rushing TDs in Week 5. It was the Packers' first game with four rushing TDs since Dec. 23, 2012, vs. Tennessee.
- ▶The Packers rushed for a season-high 170 yards on 29 carries (5.9 avg.) in Week 6. They were led by Williams, who posted 104 rushing yards on just 14 attempts (7.4 avg.), the fewest carries needed by a Packer in a 100-yard rushing game since RB James Starks (10-112) vs. San Diego on Oct. 18, 2015. Williams recorded a career-long 45-yard run, the longest by a Packer this season.
- ▶Jones (107 yards in Week 5) and Williams (104 yards in Week 6) going back-to-back with 100-plus-yard rushing games marked the first time Green Bay has had different RBs post a 100-yard game in back-to-back weeks since Weeks 2-3 in 2013 (Starks in Week 2, Johnathan Franklin in Week 3).

COMING UP

- ► The Packers will finish the regular season with two away games and two home contests. Green Bay (4-2, .667) is one of 10 teams to have a record above .500 on the road this season.
- ► All four teams Green Bay faces in the final four weeks are in the NFC.
- ► Week 15 has the Bears coming to Green Bay and starts a run of three straight divisional games to finish the regular season for only the third time since the NFC North was formed in 2002 (2006, 2016).
- ▶ The Packers close out the regular season with two road games for the first time since 2004 when they played at Minnesota and Chicago. In Week 16, Green Bay is at the Vikings and on MNF for the second time. Green Bay will close out the regular season against the Lions for the fourth straight year and the fifth time in the last six seasons.

- ► Jones had two receptions of 50-plus yards in Week 8, the first Green Bay RB to do so since Paul Hornung at Baltimore on Dec. 12, 1965.
- ▶ Jones totaled 182 scrimmage yards (107 on 19 carries, 5.6 avg. and 75 yards on seven receptions, 10.7 avg.) and a **franchise-record-tying** four rushing touchdowns in a Week 5 win at Dallas. - ► Since 2000, Green Bay is one of only six NFL teams to have a regularseason road record above .500.

348 AND COUNTING

Another packed house at Lambeau Field against the Carolina Panthers in Week 10 of 2019 brought the stadium's consecutive-sellouts streak to 348 regular-season games (not including replacement games).

- ▶The league's longest-tenured stadium, Lambeau Field is hosting its 63rd season of football in 2019. For the victory over Dallas in the Divisional round of the 2014 playoffs, Packers fans set a new Lambeau Field paid-attendance record (79,704).
- ► Across American professional sports, only Boston's Fenway Park (1912) and Chicago's Wrigley Field (1914) have longer tenures.

THE LAMBEAU ADVANTAGE

The crown jewel of the National Football League, Lambeau Field has long been known as one of the tougher venues to play in, particularly during the harsh Wisconsin winter.

- ▶ Re-establishing home-field advantage after a 4-4 mark in 2008 was one of the goals of 2009, and with the Packers finishing 6-2 at home, they accomplished that goal. Green Bay followed that up with a 7-1 mark at Lambeau Field in 2010, a perfect 8-0 record in 2011, the first undefeated home mark since 2002, and a 7-1 mark in 2012. The Packers were one of two teams to finish undefeated at home during the 2014 regular season (Denver).
- ► Green Bay was 5-2-1 (.786) at home in 2018, marking the eighth time in the last 10 seasons that the Packers won five-plus games at home.
- ► Since Ron Wolf and Mike Holmgren began the revitalization of the franchise in 1992, Green Bay owns the best home record in the NFL. A look at the top regular-season home W-L records since the '92 season:

A LOOK AT THE SCHEDULE

The Green Bay Packers' 2019 NFL regular-season schedule – highlighted by five prime-time contests (subject to flexible scheduling) on the original schedule for the sixth straight year (2014-19) – was released April 17 by the National Football League.


- ► The Packers will face 2018 playoff teams in six games this season (Chicago, Philadelphia, Dallas, Kansas City, L.A. Chargers), with four of those contests taking place on the road.
- ► The Packers opened the season at the Chicago Bears in the NFL's Thursday night regular-season opener. It marked the fourth time in team history that Green Bay opened at Chicago (1979, 1981, 2015).
- ►The Packers opened their home slate in Week 2 against the Minnesota Vikings, marking just the fourth time (2003, 2008, 2018) since the NFC North was formed in 2002 that Green Bay has played division opponents in both of the first two games.
- ►Green Bay stayed at home both of the next two weeks, the first time the Packers have played three straight at home in September since 1990 (Weeks 1-3). They hosted the Denver Broncos in Week 3 and the Philadelphia Eagles in a Thursday night matchup in Week 4.
- ► The Packers traveled to take on the Dallas Cowboys in Week 5. It was the seventh matchup between the two teams (including postseason) since 2013, and Green Bay improved to 6-1 with a win.
- ► For the second time in three seasons, the Packers hosted the Detroit Lions on *Monday Night Football*, this time in Week 6. It was the fourth matchup on *Monday Night Football* between the two clubs (1971, 1972, 2017).
- ► A home game against the Oakland Raiders in Week 7 was the Packers' fifth at Lambeau in 2019, marking the most home contests for Green Bay in the first seven games of a season since 1978 when it also played five at home (not including the 1987 strike year).
- ▶In Week 8, Green Bay was at Kansas City for a Sunday night matchup.
- ►In Week 9, Green Bay traveled to Los Angeles to take on the Chargers. While it was the first time the Packers played the Chargers since they moved to Los Angeles, it is the seventh away game against the Chargers.
- ▶In Week 10, the Packers hosted the Carolina Panthers in the fourth contest between the two teams in the last six years (2014, 2015, 2017).
- ► Green Bay had its first Week 11 bye and the latest for the team since the bye was reintroduced in 1990.
- ►Over the next two weeks, Green Bay crisscrossed the country. They played at the San Francisco 49ers in Week 12 and visited the New York Giants in Week 13.
- ▶In Week 14, the Packers take on the Washington Redskins in the third matchup between the two teams in the last five years (including the postseason), but the first in Green Bay since 2013.
- ► Week 15 has the Bears coming to Green Bay. The Packers are 10-2 all-time at home against the Bears in December/January games.
- ►The Packers close out the regular season with two road games for the first time since 2004 when they played at Minnesota and Chicago.
- ► In Week 16, Green Bay is at the Vikings and on MNF for the second time on the season. The Packers last played two Monday games in the same regular season in 2009.
- ► Green Bay will close out the regular season against the Lions for the fourth straight year and the fifth time in the last six seasons.

CHICAGO (AP) — The Green Bay Packers beat the Chicago Bears by on Thursday night, 10-3. And while it was ugly on offense, likely in great part due to the lack of action so many regulars on that side of the ball got in the preseason, it was a thing of beauty for the defenders in green, gold and white. On this night, the Packers were the Monsters of the Midway.

There was plenty of noise heading into Soldier Field about Chicago's D, which was dominant in 2018 as the Bears won the NFC North. And it played quite well against Aaron Rodgers and the Pack, sacking Rodgers the times and yielding only 213 yards.

But the Packers were stingler.

The Packers defense totaled five sacks on a clearly befuddled Mitchell Trubisky. The only turnover of the game was a fourth-quarter

pick in the end zone by former Bears safety Adrian Amos.

Green Bay went into the end zone on an 8-yard jump-ball reception by tight end Jimmny Graham — a former college basketball player who boxed out to perfection on the play. That was the difference, thanks to the stingy Packers D.

The game also was marked by sloppy offense and penalties. But the Packers made the fewest mistakes and now lead the league's longest series 98-95-6. Green Bay has won 16 of the last 19 regular-season meetings, and Rodgers is 17-5.

Chicago's defense hardly slacked, getting five sacks — tying the most it has had against Rodgers. But it could do little with the ball and

Trubisky never found his stride. He even was sacked on Chicago's final offensive play.

Mason Crosby made a 39-yard field goal in the final period for Green Bay, while Chicago got a 38-yarder from Eddy Pineiro. Bears fans rejoiced in relief on the first score of the season: Pineiro's first-quarter field goal. The last such kick on Soldier Field was Cody Parkey's double-doink off the goalpost and crossbar that sent Chicago home from the wild-card round.

Each team had 10 penalties, there was a total of 467 yards of only offense, and several drops. At one point, Chicago had three straight penalties to put it in a first-and-40. No, the Bears didn't convert.

It was a rough staff in the opening series for Green Bay, A run and a pass netted zero yards, then Rodgers was sacked heavily by Royenson-Harris for a 10-yard loss. Rodgers was sacked again on the next three-and-out and Chicago took over at the Packers 36 after a punt. GREEN BAY, Wis. (AP) — All that mattered to Aaron Rodgers on Sunday was that the Packers won.

Rodgers threw two early touchdowns and Green Bay held on for a 21-16 victory over the Minnesota Vikings.

On a day when the Packers honored late hall of Fame Bart Starr at haftime, Rodgers but on quite a show — particularly early. Rodgers completed nine of his first 10 passes for 134 yards and two touchdowns and had a perfect 158.3 rating through the first quarter. He finished 22 of 34 for 209 yards.

Rodgers and new coach Mart LaFleur experimented with Rodgers wearing a playcall wristband in the hope that it would speed up the play-calling

process and get the offense out of the huddle quicker.

After scoring on each of its first three possessions, Green Bay's offense failed to muster another point. But the hot start was enough to win.

The Packers remained unbeaten under LaFleur after opening the NFL's 100th season with a victory at rival Chicago. They also beat the Vikings (1-1) for the fifth time in the past seven games at Lambeau Field.

Minnesota's Dalvin Cook had a career-high 154 yards and a touchdown on 20 carries. It was the third-year pro's second consecutive game with

over 100 yards rushing. Cook also had 37 yards receiving in the loss.

After throwing the ball just 10 times in the opener against Atlanta, Kirk Cousins finished 14 of 32 with 230 yards, a touchdown and two interceptions. Cousins was picked of by Kevin King in the end zone late in the fourth quarter.

The Vikings are 5-2-1 in last their eight meetings against Green Bay.

Rodgers and Davante Adams connected on a 35-yard completion on the Packers first offensive play. Rodgers found running back Jamaal Williams for a 15-yard touchdown to cap a four-play. Z5-yard drive.

Adams finished with 106 yards on seven catches.

After rushing for 111 yards and two touchdowns in a win last week against the Falcons, Cook broke out for a 75-yard score following a missed.

GREEN BAY, Wis. (AP) — Aaron Rodgers thought his jersey never looked so clean following a game.

The offensive line kept Rodgers upright, the two-time MVP threw for 235 yards and a touchdown, and Aaron Jones tied a career high by running for two scores to lead the Green Bay Packers to a 27-16 victory over the Denver Broncos on Sunday.

For the third straight game, Von Miller, Bradley Chubb and the Denver defense failed to record a sack or force a turnover.

The Broncos (0-3) fell to 0-6-1 all-time on the road against the Packers.

While Rodgers stayed clean, Joe Flacco did not. Preston Smitt matched a career high with three sacks as Green Bay got to Flacco six times and forced three turnovers to lead the Packers (3-0) to the win despite being dominated in time of possession, 35:34 to 24:26.

Flacco was 20 of 29 for 213 yards with an interception and no touchdowns.

Rodgers found Marquez Valdes-Scantling on a 40-yard strike on the opening drive and finished 17 of 29. Jones' touchdown runs came from 7

yards and 1 yard out.
Following Valdes-Scantling's first score of the season, Flacco and the Broncos' offense spoiled a 60-yard kickoff return by Diontae Spencer, going

more than eight minutes three-and-out on their first possession. But Denver tied it at 7 on a 1-yard run by Phillip Lindsay at the start of the second quarter. The score capped a 15-play, 75-yard drive that ate up

Mason Crosby put the Packers ahead on a 42-yard field goal with 11:19 to go in the first half. The Broncos answered about eight minutes later with a field goal of their own.

Green Bay's new-look defense continued its impressive start to the season. After a sack by Za'Darius Smith, who finished the day with two, fellow newcomer Smith followed with one of his three sacks. Flacco coughed up the ball and Rashan Gary recovered it at the Broncos' 5. Jones ran it in from the 7 and Green Bay took a 17-10 lead into the locker room.

ARLINGTON, Texas — The "Aarons" were quite comfortable in a 34-24 victory over the Cowboys on Sunday — Aaron Rodgers because he won again at AT&T Stadium nine years after his first victory in the retractable-roof stadium was the 2011 Super Bowl, Aaron Jones because the West Texas kid felt right at home.

Not quite the same drama this time after the Packers (4-1) built a 31-3 lead, although Dak Prescott (463 yards passing) and Amari Cooper (226 yards receiving) set career highs trying to keep things interesting in the fourth quarter.

The last hope for Dallas ended with 1:41 left when Brett Maher missed his second field goal — a 33-yarder that would have given the Cowboys a shot at

Missing his biggest threat in Davante Adams because of a toe injury. Rodgers threw for 238 yards without an interception — to the delight of a large contingent of Green Bay fans that pulled off several "Go Pack Go" chains without much resistance from the home crowd.

Prescott, on the other hand, matched a career high with three interceptions, although the first was a drop by Cooper on what should have been a big play early.

The Cowboys (3-2) lost their second straight game and dropped into a tie with Philadelphia atop the NFC East after winning their first three, just as the Packers had done.

Green Bay, Also coming off its frist loss, took sole possession of first in the NFC North with Chicago's 24-21 loss to Dakland. The Packers opened the season with a vin over the Bears.

Jones had a career-high 182 scrimmage yards — 107 rushing and 75 receiving — and opened the scoring with an 18-yard run after being held to 19 and 21 yards sushing the previous two weeks. His four rushing touchdowns led a Cereen Bay franchise record.

On the touchdown that surpassed his previous career high of two and gave Green Bay a 24-0 lead early in the second half. Aaron Jones gestured toward byron Jones while beating him to the pylon on a 5-yard run. The fourth 1D was a 1-yard plungt.

The Cowboys finished with 563 yards, the most they we ever had in a loss. It topped the 554 yards they had in a 26-21 loss to Detroit in 1985. Not long after Cooper's miscue landed in Jaire Alexander's arms in a scoreless game early, the Cowboys were behind for good.

Detroit Lions, 23-22, on Monday night GREEN BAY, Wis. (AP) — It took Mason Crosby 13 seasons to perform his first Lambeau Leap.

The 35-year-old kicker nailed a 23-yard field goal as time expired and jumped into the crowd with a boost from long snapper Hunter Bradley after he finished off a rally for the Green Bay Packers, who benefited from some questionable officiating to edge the

Aaron Rodgers, in his second straight game without top target Davante Adams, completed 24 of 39 passes for 283 yards and two touchdowns, including a beautiful 35-yard throw to Allen Lazard for the first-year pro's first career score.

Rodgers linked up with Jamaal Williams for the other TD. Williams finished with 104 yards on 14 carries and four catches for 32 yards for Green Bay (5-1), which captured its first win in five tries against its NFC North rival.

The Packers, who are off to their first 3-0 start in the NFC North since 2012, might not have pulled it off if not for two fourth-quarter penalties for illegal hands to the face against Detroit 8 Trey Flowers, both of them on third down. The first set up Lazard's touchdown, and the second allowed Green Bay to run the clock down to two seconds before Crosby's game-winner. In both cases, replays showed Flowers' hands on the neck or shoulder — not the face — of a Packers lineman.

Referee Clete Blakeman said each of the calls was made by umpire Jeff Rice, and he discussed the last one with him. Matt Prater was good from 26, 22, 41, 51 and 54 yards for the Lions (2-2-1), who fell to 0-2 under Matt Patricia on Monday night. Detroit lost its last Monday night game to the Jets, 48-17, last year.

Matthew Stafford finished 18 of 32 for 265 yards and was sacked three times.

Kerryon Johnson scored the lone touchdown for the Lions from 1 yard out in the first quarter.

Preston Smith and Za'Darius Smith each had a sack for Green Bay, Preston Smith and Kyler Fackrell combined for the other.

Rodgers was sacked once by Damon Harrison Sr. and threw an interception that bounced off the facemask of an open Darrius Shepherd near the goal line. James Coleman snagged the ball and returned it 55 yards, setting up Prater's last field goal that made it 22-13.

with Aaron Rodgers at the helm. And it was scary. GREEN BAY, Wis. (AP) — The Green Bay Packers gave the rest of the NFL its first true glimpse of what Matt LaFleur's offense can look like

Rodgers had his best game by far under the new Packers coach, throwing for 429 yards and five touchdowns and running for another as Green Bay beat the Oakland Raiders, 42-24, on Sunday.

Rodgers completed 25 of 31 passes to eight different targets and finished with the first perfect passer rating of his career, leading LaFleur's

offense to a season high in points

Even with top target Daviante Adams sidelined for the third straight game with turf toe, Rodgers threw for his most touchdowns in a game since Sept. 28, 2015, against the Chiefs.

Derek Carr finished 22-07-07-28 for 283 yards, two touchdowns and two costly turnovers for the Raiders (3-3), who lost their eighth straight against Green Bay, dating back to 1990. The Packers (6-1) have scored 30-plus points in each of their last five games against the Raiders. Green Bay took the lead for good on a 2-yard touchdown from Rodgers to Jamal Williams with 3:27 to go in the first half. The score capped an 11-play, 82-yard drive that took up 8:06— the Packers' longest drive of the season— and madeit 14-10.

Carr put the Raiders in position to retake the lead with a 48-yard completion down the middle to Darren Waller, giving Oakland first and goal at the 3.0 n second down, as Carr scrambled for the pylon, Blake Martinez for ceal a fumble and the ball went through the end zone for a touchback. Rodgers made Oakland pay, finding Jake Kumerow for a 37-yard touchdown to make it 21-10 at halftime.

The Raiders had seven penalties for 87 yards in the first half. They finished with eight penalties for 97 yards.

Rodgers opened the second half with a 59-yard completion to Marquez Valdes-Scantling. Four plays later, Rodgers crossed the goal line on a 2-yard touchback.

It was supposed to be a prime-time showdown between the Green Bay Packers and Kansas City Chiefs, division leaders each led by two

of the most talented and exciting quarterbacks in the INFL.

Aaron Rodgers and the Packers lived up to the billing, Patrick Mahomes never got the chance.

Radgers threw for 365 yards and three touchdowns, two of them to Aaron Jones on a big night for the Green Bay running back, and the Packers held off fill-in quarterback Matt Moore and the rest of the banged-up Chiefs for a 31-24 victory Sunday night.

Jones had seven catches for 159 yards and added 67 on the ground — a big chunk of them in the closing minutes, when the Packers (7-1) sealed their first win at Arrowhead Stadium since Nov. 4, 2007.

The Chiefs (5-3) hoped Mahomes could make a miraculous recovery 10 days after dislocation his kneecap in Denver in time to play. But after the league MVP was limited all week in pactice, coach Andy Reid amnounced Friday his franchise quarterback would be inactive for the game.

Moore took the relies of the high-powered offense and fared well, throwing for 267 yards with two touchdowns and no picks in the ex-high school coach's first text in once them housens. start in more than two years.

It wasn't the folgers Malonnes matchup everyone wanted, but Moore and Co. made sure it was still an entertaining game between teams with Super Bowl aspirations. It started like most outside the walls of 1 Arrowhead Drive expected, with Rodgers slicing up the defense and Green Bay marching for two quick touchdowns. But after a slady start by Mohore, the journeyman quarterback found a groove. He led the Chiefs on an 89-yard drive that ended with a make-il-rain 29-yard outshown pass to Travil's Keipe, then found Mecole Hardman on a 30-yard pitch-and-catch to knot the game.

The Chiefs led 17-14 at halftime, raising some eyebrows across the league.

Packers head coach Mart Lafetur made a couple adjustments, though, and Rodgers and Co. began to move the hall once more. They used a 15-play drive that saaked up more than half the third quarter to get a tying field goal, then got the ball back when LeSean McCoy fumbled on the very next play.

The players later. Prodgers conjurted up more of his magic.

With third down at the 3, he dropped back and was flushed from the pocket. He rolled to his right and threw a blind pass to the back comer of the end zone, where Lenal Williams somehow took the ball away from Chiefs inebacker Ben Niemann while tapping both feet inbounds.

Rodgers was tying flat on his back, staring at the sky, as the official signaled touchdown.

The Chiefs answered with another long drive, and just when it appeared they had finally been stopped, the Packers' Tramon Williams was flagged for illegal use of hands. That gave Kansas City the ball inside the 5, and bannen Williams scored on the next play to te it again.

It took the Packers all of 56 seconds to score the eventual winner.

Rodgers again found Jones out of the backfield, and this time he found a lane through the entire Kansas City secondary, It was a foot race from there, and the Speedy running back hop-skipped over the goal line to finish of the Parket of buchdown reception.

SANTA CLARA, Calif. — A strip sack on the opening drive that set up a touchdown got the San Francisco 49ers off to a rousing start. A near flawless performance by Jimmy Garoppolo and a dominant performance by the defense finished off Aaron Rodgers and the Green Bay

Packers.
Garcopolo threw two long touchdown passes and the San Francisco defense harassed Rodgers into one of the worst performances of his brilliant career, leading the 49ers to a 37-8 victory over the Packers on Sunday.
Garcopolo connected on a 42-yard touchdown strike to Deebo Samuel in the second quarter and a 61-yarder to George Kittle in the third to start this stretch for San Francisco (10-1) off on a high note.
Rodgers lost a fumble on the opening drive on one of the five sacks he took and failed to convert a single third down on 13 tries before getting pulled late in the fourth quarter. He finished 20 for 33 for 104 yards and Green Bay averaged an anemic 1.7 yards per pass play when he was in the

game.
San Francisco allowed 198 yards on 70 plays, didn't allow a single completion longer than 15 yards and got a key stop against Aaron Jones on a fourth-and-1 run in the first half when the outcome was still in doubt.

Garoppolo then put it away with the two long touchdowns, part of a day when he went 14 for 20 for 253 yards and most importantly committed no turnovers.

He was helped by the return of Kittle, who had six catches for 129 yards in his first game back after missing the past two contests with injuries

to his knee and ankle.

The 49ers broke it open late in the first half after forcing the Packers to punt following the two-minute warning. Garoppolo threw a 42-yard TD pass to Samuel to cap a three-play drive that made it 20-0. The Niners then forced a three-and-out and took over at their 48 with 24 seconds left. Garoppolo completed a 22-yard pass to Kittle that set up Chase McLaughlin's 48-yard field goal.

The Packers got into an early hole when Fred Warner sacked Rodgers on the opening drive, forcing a fumble that Nick Bosa recovered at the 2. Tevin Coleman ran it in on the next play.

When the Packers finally got something going offensively with a touchdown drive taking 8:34 in the third quarter on Rodgers' 2-yard pass to Davante Adams, things quickly fell apart defensively with the blown coverage on Kittle's long touchdown.

Rodgers responded, leading the Packers on a 14-play, 75-yard march. It ended with him taking a quick snap with the Giants having too many defenders on the field and finding Adams in the end zone for a 24-13 lead.

17 Davante Adams, WR, 6th Year, Fresno State

- Led the team with a career-high 111 receptions in 2018, the second most in team history behind only WR Sterling Sharpe's 112 in 1993, for a career-best 1,386 yards (12.5 avg.) and a career-high 13 TDs on his way to earning Pro Bowl honors for the second straight year, his first as an original selection.
- Was the only player in the NFL with 70-plus receptions and 10-plus TD catches in each of the last three seasons (2016-18). Joins Sharpe (1992-94) as the only players in team history to accomplish the feat in three straight seasons.
- Has 38 receiving TDs since 2016, No. 1 in the league over that span. Has caught at least one TD pass in 30 games since '16, tops in the NFL over that span.
- Was the lone player in the league to have 10-plus receiving TDs each of the past three seasons (2016-18). Joins WR Don Hutson (1941-43) and Sharpe (1992-94) as the only players in team history to do so in three straight seasons.

- Has posted eight games in his career with 10-plus catches, the most in franchise history (Sharpe and Donald Driver, seven each).

- Led the team with a career-high 122 receiving yards on a career-best six catches (20.3 avg.) in Week 3 vs. Cincinnati in 2017, highlighted by his career-long 72-yard grab in overtime that set up K Mason Crosby's gamewinning 27-yard field goal.
- **2019 SEASON:** Has appeared in all 12 games with six starts and has posted 28 receptions for 240 yards (8.6 avg.) and two TDs along with one carry for 7 yards...Has registered one tackle on special teams.
- ► At Chicago (Sept. 5): Appeared on 32 plays on offense.

- Was a second-team *AP* All-Pro selection in 2016 and 2017, making him one of only two Green Bay tackles (Gregg, 1962-67) to earn *AP* All-Pro honors in three consecutive seasons. Joined Chiefs RT Mitchell Schwartz as the only tackles in the league to earn *AP* All-Pro honors in each of the last three seasons (2016-18).
- Was selected to his first career Pro Bowl in 2016, having initially been named a first alternate before being selected as an injury replacement for Eagles T Jason Peters. Was also named a Pro Bowl alternate in 2014 and 2017-18.
- Has started all 102 regular-season games he has appeared in at LT since entering the league in 2013. Opened all 16 regular-season games in four of his first six seasons in the NFL.
- **2019 SEASON:** Has started all 12 games at LT...Part of an offense that ranks No. 2 in the league in red-zone TD percentage (70.0), No. 1 in zero-turnover games (eight) and tied for No. 2 in giveaways (eight)...Has helped the offense register 13 rushing TDs this season (tied for No. 7 in the NFL).

- Registered 1,310 receiving yards with the New Orleans Saints in 2011, the second most in NFL history by a TE to that point behind only Gronkowski (1,327 in 2011), and posted 16 TD catches in 2013, No. 2 in a season among TEs behind only Gronkowski (17 in 2011).
- Appeared in 137 games with 101 starts during his first nine NFL seasons, playing in 15 or 16 games in eight of his first nine years in the league.

- Ranks No. 1 in NFL history (min. 1,500 attempts) in career passer rating (103.1), interception percentage (1.39) and TD/INT ratio (4.39, 360/82).
- Set an NFL single-season record in 2018 with his interception percentage of 0.34 (two INTs on 597 attempts), besting the previous mark held by Chiefs QB Damon Huard (0.41 in 2006). Also set a league record last season for consecutive passing attempts without an INT (402).

- Has posted seven seasons (2009, 2011-12, 2014-16, 2018) with 500-plus passing attempts and eight or fewer INTs, the most in NFL history ahead of Patriots QB Tom Brady (four), Redskins QB Alex Smith (two), Falcons QB Matt Ryan (two) and nine QBs (one).
- Has been named the NFL's Most Valuable Player by *The Associated Press* twice in his career (2011, 2014), one of only eight players in league history to win the award multiple times.
- Has been selected to the Pro Bowl in seven of the last 10 seasons (2009, 2011-12, 2014-16, 2018).
- Is the only quarterback in league history to record a 100-plus passer rating in six consecutive seasons (2009-14), with no other QB doing so in more than four straight seasons.
- Is one of only three QBs in NFL history with 40,000-plus passing yards and 3,000-plus rushing yards (Fran Tarkenton, John Elway).
- In 170 career regular-season starts (since 2008), has posted 59 games with 300-plus passing yards (No. 5 in the NFL over that span), 105 without an interception (No. 1, min. 15 attempts) and 90 with a 100-plus passer rating (No. 2).

- ►At Chicago (Sept. 5): Connected on 18 of 30 passes (60.0 pct.) for 203 yards and a TD with no INTs for a 91.4 rating...On Green Bay's first offensive play of the second quarter, found WR Marquez Valdes-Scantling on a deep pass down the middle of the field for a 47-yard gain to the Chicago 27...Three plays later, connected with TE Jimmy Graham for an 8-vard TD pass...Added 8 rushing yards on three carries (2.7 avg.).

30 Jamaal Williams, RB, 3rd Year, Brigham Young

- Is one of only three players in team history (RBs Gerry Ellis and Eddie Lacy) to register 400-plus rushing yards and 200-plus receiving yards in both of his first two seasons in the NFL.
- Posted 95 rushing yards and 61 receiving yards at the N.Y. Jets last season in Week 16, becoming just the third Packer since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to have 95-plus rushing yards and 60-plus receiving yards in a game (RB John Brockington, Nov. 17, 1974, at Minnesota; RB Dorsey Levens, Nov. 16, 1997, at Indianapolis).
- Rushed for a team-high 556 yards in 2017, the fourth most by a Green Bay rookie in team history, and four touchdowns on 153 carries (3.6 avg.). Added 262 receiving yards and two TDs on 25 catches (10.5 avg.), the most receiving yards by a Green Bay rookie RB since Keith Woodside totaled 352 yards in 1988.
- After moving into the starting lineup in Week 11 as a rookie, posted 672 yards from scrimmage over that span (No. 11 in the NFL) and 455 rushing yards (No. 10). Registered 100-plus yards from scrimmage in four of the final six games.
- **2019 SEASON:** Has played in 11 games with two starts and has rushed for 377 yards and a TD on 86 carries (4.4 avg.)...Has posted a career-high 36 receptions for 227 yards (6.3 avg.) and leads the team with a career-high five receiving TDs...Ranks No. 2 in the league among RBs in receiving

- TDs (Chargers RB Austin Ekeler, six)...His five receiving TDs are tied for the second most by a Green Bay RB in a single season (Johnny McNally, 10 in 1931)...Has added four tackles on special teams...Was inactive for one contest (concussion).
- ►At Chicago (Sept. 5): Played 26 snaps on offense and carried the ball five times for 0 yards (0.0 avg.)...Added a pair of receptions for 15 yards (7.5 avg.).
- ►Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 15): Appeared on 35 plays on offense and rushed for 28 yards on nine attempts (3.1 avg.)...Added three catches for 13 yards (4.3 avg.) an a TD...Capped off Green Bay's opening drive with a 15-yard TD reception on a screen pass from QB Aaron Rodgers.
- ►Vs. Denver (Sept. 22): Led the team with a season-high 59 yards rushing on 12 carries (4.9 avg.) while adding two receptions for 27 yards (13.5 avg.)...Registered five rushing first downs and three runs of 10-plus vards.
- ▶ Vs. Philadelphia (Sept. 26): Made his first start of the season as the Packers opened the game with two RBs...Caught a pass on the Packers' first play from scrimmage, but sustained a concussion on a late hit by Eagles DE Derek Barnett and did not return to the game.
- ▶ At Dallas (Oct. 6): Inactive (concussion), his first game missed due to injury in his career as his streak of games played came to an end at 36. ▶ Vs. Detroit (Oct. 14): Returned to action and paced the team with 104 rushing yards on just 14 carries (7.4 avg.), the fewest attempts by a Green Bay player in a 100-yard rushing game since RB James Starks (10-112) vs. San Diego on Oct. 18, 2015...Posted a career-long 45-yard run in the second quarter, Green Bay's longest carry of the season, as he took it up the middle and made a cut to make S Tavon Wilson miss on his way to the Detroit 10 to help set up a 37-yard Mason Crosby FG just before halftime... Added four receptions for 32 yards (8.0 avg.) and a TD, scoring from 5 yards out as he came in motion and took the pass from QB Aaron Rodgers out of the shotgun midway through the second quarter...His 136 yards from scrimmage was the second-highest single-game output of his career behind only his 156-yard effort at the N.Y. Jets in Week 16 last season.
- ▶Vs. Oakland (Oct. 20): Was tied for the team lead with four receptions for 26 yards (6.5 avg.) and a TD, scoring from 2 yards out on a pass in the flat from Rodgers late in the first half for his career-high third TD catch of the season...Rushed three times for 5 yards (1.7 avg.).
- ▶ At Kansas City (Oct. 27): Rushed for 22 yards and a TD on seven carries (3.1 avg.) and added three catches for 14 yards (4.7 avg.) and a score, his third career game with a rushing TD/receiving TD (two in 2017)...Late in the first quarter, took the shotgun handoff from Rodgers for a 1-yard TD run up the middle...Early in the fourth quarter on third-and-1 from the Kansas City 3, initially came across the middle before circling to the back corner of the end zone to make a diving TD catch with LB Ben Niemann in coverage.
- ▶At L.A. Chargers (Nov. 3): Started as the Packers opened with two RBs, finishing with 10 rushing yards on two carries (5.0 avg.) and six receptions for 39 yards (6.5 avg.) and a TD...Caught a 10-yard TD pass with 6:21 remaining in the game, giving him a TD reception for the fourth consecutive game as he tied Green (2003) for the longest single-season streak by a RB in team history.
- ►Vs. Carolina (Nov. 10): Rushed for 63 yards on 13 carries (4.8 avg.), picking up a season-high five first downs.
- ► At San Francisco (Nov. 24): Led the team with 45 rushing yards on 11 carries (4.1 avg.) and was tied for the team lead with seven receptions for 35 yards (5.0 avg.), matching his single-game career high for catches... Added a tackle on special teams.
- ► At N.Y. Giants (Dec. 1): Led the team with 41 yards rushing on 10 carries (4.1 avg.) and added four receptions for 26 yards (6.5 avg.)...Also posted a tackle on special teams.

38 Tramon Williams, CB, 13th Year, Louisiana Tech

 Has appeared in 155 regular-season games for the Packers (2007-14, 2018), the fourth most among defensive backs in franchise history behind only LeRoy Butler (181), Willie Wood (166) and Mark Lee (157).

- Has 38 career interceptions (including playoffs), the most among active NFL players.
- Returned to the Packers and started all 16 games in 2018 after spending three seasons with the Cleveland Browns (2015-16) and Arizona Cardinals (2017).
- Has three career TDs, including INT returns of 43 yards (2011) and 70 yards (2010 postseason) and a 94-yard punt return (2007).
- Ranked No. 1 in the NFL with a combined nine interceptions in 2010 (six in regular season, three in postseason) and was chosen for the Pro Bowl as an injury replacement.
- Was one of only two NFL players (CB Terence Newman) to register at least one interception each season from 2007-17.
- **2019 SEASON:** Has played in all 12 games with three starts and has posted 29 tackles (10 solo), two interceptions, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and nine passes defensed.
- ►At Chicago (Sept. 5): Started at CB and played all 73 snaps, finishing with three tackles (all solo) and two passes defensed...Early in the second quarter, got his right hand in to break up a pass from QB Mitchell Trubisky intended for WR Allen Robinson...Late in the third quarter, came over to drill Robinson as he made a leaping catch near the pylon but landed out of bounds.

- ►At San Francisco (Nov. 24): Played 33 snaps on defense and posted two assisted tackles and a pass defensed.
- ▶At N.Y. Giants (Dec. 1): Started as the third CB, appearing on 44 snaps and recording three tackles (all assisted), an interception and two passes defensed...Midway through the fourth quarter, ran stride for stride with WR Darius Slayton and made a leaping interception of QB Daniel Jones' pass at the Green Bay 38.
