

PACKERS PLAY REGULAR-SEASON FINALE AGAINST DETROIT

Green Bay will finish the regular season with a road trip to Ford Field to play the Detroit Lions.

- The Packers are closing out the regular season against the Lions for the fourth straight year and the fifth time in the last six seasons.
- The Packers lead the regular-season series, 99-72-7 (.576), and have won both postseason contests the two have played.
- Green Bay's 99 wins over the Lions are the most the Packers have against any team.
- Dating back to 2007, Green Bay has won five of seven games played between the two in Week 17, with the winning team scoring 30-plus points in each of those games.
- ► Green Bay is looking to sweep the regular-season series with Detroit for the first time since 2016 and for the 11th time in the last 20 seasons (since 2000).
- Green Bay has a 28-11 overall mark against Detroit since 2000, a .718 winning percentage that ranks No. 2 among NFL teams (Minnesota, 29-11, .725) that have played the Lions 10-plus times over that span, according to pro-football-reference.com.
- The Packers are closing out the regular season with two road games for the first time since 2004 when they played at Minnesota and Chicago.
- ► With 12 wins, Head Coach **Matt LaFleur** is **tied for the fifth most wins** by an NFL head coach in their first season (Jim Caldwell and George Seifert had 14 and Jim Harbaugh and Steve Mariucci had 13).
- Green Bay has 12 sacks over the last three games, the **most in the** league over that span.

RODGERS AND THE LIONS

- Rodgers has led the Packers to 14 wins in 19 games as a starter against the Lions, completing 389 of 592 passes (65.7 pct.) for 4,809 yards (253.1 per game), 39 touchdowns and seven interceptions with a passer rating of 107.7.
- Rodgers has recorded a 100-plus passer rating 12 times against Detroit, including three of the last five times has faced them.
- ► The Packers have won 11 of the 12 games against the Lions when Rodgers recorded a passer rating of 100-plus.

IN WEEK 17

- ► With QB **Aaron Rodgers** as the starter, the Packers are 6-3 in Week 17 games, including 3-1 against Detroit. Rodgers' only loss against the Lions in Week 17 came last season in a game where he only threw five passes before an injury ended his day.
- ► Rodgers has recorded a passer rating of 115.0-plus in five of the nine Week 17 games he has started (126.0, 139.6, 131.8, 117.1, 132.2).

Dating back to 2008, Rodgers has thrown for 18 touchdowns and just four interceptions in Week 17 games with a passer rating of 110.3 that ranks No. 1 in the NFL among active quarterbacks (min. 150 pass att.) over that span (according to pro-football-reference.com).

REGULAR-SEASON WEEK 17

WITH THE CALL

FOX Sports, now in its 26th season as an NFL network television partner, will broadcast the game.



- Play-by-play man Kevin Burkhardt joins analyst Charles Davis and sideline reporter Pam Oliver.
- Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since November 1929, heads up the Packers Radio Network that is made up of 50 stations in four states. Wayne Larrivee (play-by-play), two-time Packers Pro Bowler Larry McCarren (analyst) and three-time Packers Pro Bowler and two-time All-Pro John Kuhn (sideline) will call the action. McCarren first joined the team's broadcasts in 1995 and enters his 25th season calling Packers games. After originally being paired together in 1999, McCarren and Larrivee enter their 21st season of broadcasts together. They surpassed Jim Irwin and Max McGee for the most regular-season and postseason games broadcast for the Packers with 313 at the 2018 season opener against Chicago.
- The broadcast is also available on Sirius Satellite Radio (WTMJ feed).

DIVISION CHAMPS

- ►With a victory over Minnesota in Week 16, the Packers clinched their 24th division title and first since 2016.
- ► Matt LaFleur is the first head coach in team history to lead the Packers to a division title in his first season.
- This is the sixth division title Green Bay has won with Aaron Rodgers as the starting quarterback.
- ► Dating back to 1995, the Packers have the second-most division titles in the NFL:

- ► The Packers have started 5-0 in the NFC North for the first time since 2012 and for just the third time (2011) since the division was formed in 2002.
- Green Bay joins Kansas City (5-0) and New England (5-0) as the only teams to be undefeated in division games this season.
- Green Bay has allowed the third-fewest points in division games in the NFL this season:

- Dating back to 2002 when the NFC North was formed, the Packers have given up less than 100 points to division opponents twice (83 in 2010 and 90 in 2006).
- ► The Packers rank No. 6 in the NFL in point differential in division games this season:

- The Packers swept the regular-season series with the Bears for the 15th time in the last 26 years (since 1994) and the seventh time in the last 11 seasons.
- Green Bay gave up a total of 16 points in two games to the Bears this season. Dating back to 1940, that is the seventh-fewest points the Packers have allowed to Chicago in a single regular season and the fewest since giving up nine in two games in 1994 (according to profootball-reference.com).
- Green Bay swept the regular-season series with Minnesota for the first time since 2014 and the seventh time in the last 18 years (since 2002).
- ► The 42 points that the Packers allowed to the Vikings and Bears this season is the fewest in a season by Green Bay since 1994 (32).

DAVANTE RETURNS

- After missing four games due to injury, WR Davante Adams returned in Week 9 and has recorded six-plus receptions in six of the ensuing seven games, including a career-tying best 13 receptions in Week 16.
- Adams ranks in the top five in the NFL in games with six-plus receptions since Week 9:

KEEPING IT GOING

- Green Bay has won 12 of its first 15 games, marking the sixth time the Packers have won at least 12 of their first 15 games of the regular season since 1970 (14-1 in 2011, 12-3 in 2007, 2002, 1997 and 1996).
 Below are the Packers' best regular-season records since the NFL went
- to a 16-game schedule in 1978:

- ►With a win over Washington in Week 14, Head Coach Matt LaFleur (12-3) passed Mike Holmgren and Mike Sherman (9-7) for the most NFL wins by a Packer head coach in their first season.
- ► Green Bay is one of five NFL teams with at least 12 wins this season, with three of those teams residing in the NFC:

- Since the NFL went to a 16-game schedule in 1978, this was the first time that there were four NFC teams with 11-plus wins through the first 14 games of the season. The last time it happened in the AFC was in 2004 (Pittsburgh, New England, Indianapolis, San Diego), according to the Elias Sports Bureau.
- ► The Packers are 9-2 this season in Sunday games, an .818 winning percentage that is **tied for No. 2 in the NFL**.
- Green Bay is 9-2 against NFC teams this season with an .818 winning percentage that is tied for No. 1 among NFC teams:

► The Packers' nine wins against NFC teams are tied for the most in the NFL this season.

BACK IN THE POSTSEASON

- ► With a win over the Chicago Bears in Week 15, the Green Bay Packers clinched a playoff birth for the first time since 2016.
- ► Head Coach Matt LaFleur became the first coach in franchise history to lead his team to the postseason in his first season.
- ►Green Bay has now made the postseason 33 times, tied with the Dallas Cowboys for No. 1 in league annals.

DOUBLE-DIGIT-WIN REGULAR SEASON

- ► The Packers recorded at least 12 wins during the regular season for 12th time in franchise history (15 in 2011 / 13 in 2007, 1997, 1996, 1962 / 12 wins in 2019, 2014, 2002, 2001, 1966, 1931, 1929).
- Green Bay reached 10 regular-season wins for the 30th time in franchise history, and for the first time since 2016.
- The Packers have recorded 10 or more wins 17 times in the last 25 seasons (since 1995) after registering 10-plus victories just 13 times in the first 74 seasons the Packers were in the NFL (1921-94).
- In Aaron Rodgers' 12 seasons as starting quarterback (since 2008), the Packers have recorded 12-plus wins three times and 10-plus wins eight times.
- From 2008-19, the Packers' eight seasons with 10-plus wins are the second most in the NFL behind the New England Patriots (12).

HOW THEY HAVE FARED

While the Packers have made the postseason this year, they are still fighting for a top seed.

- Since the NFL went to a 12-team playoff format in 1990, the Packers have made postseason appearances as all six seeds.
- A breakdown of the Packers' playoff seeds, and their postseason record as that seed, from 1990-2018:

PRO BOWL

- T David Bakhtiari and quarterback Aaron Rodgers were named to the Pro Bowl by the National Football League.
- Bakhtiari earns his second trip to the Pro Bowl and his first original selection after being chosen as an injury replacement for Philadelphia Eagles T Jason Peters in 2016.
- ▶For Rodgers, it marks the eighth Pro Bowl selection of his career (2009, 2011-12, 2014-16, 2018). He has the second-most selections by a Green Bay quarterback, trailing Brett Favre's nine (1992-93, 1995-97, 2001-03, 2007), and is tied for the third-most selections by a Packer behind only Favre and T Forrest Gregg (nine).

WHAT MATTERS MOST

While many stats exist, the ultimate number is the score. How many do you put up and how many do you give up.

Green Bay has recorded 20-plus points in 12 games this season, tied for No. 5 in the NFL:

The Packers are 11-1 this season when scoring 20-plus points.

- ► The 12 games of 20-plus points by the Packers this season are the most they have registered in a single season since recording 14 in 2016.
- ►The Packers have scored 23.5 points per game this season, tied for No. 13 in the NFL.
- ►Green Bay has scored 42 offensive touchdowns, tied for No. 10 in the NFL.
- ► The Packers have 18 rushing TDs this season, the most they have had since 2009 (20), and are tied for No. 5 in the NFL:

- ►If the Packers finish allowing under 20 points per game, it will be the first time they have given up less than 20 points per game in a single season since 2010 (15.0).
- Green Bay has given up 15 or fewer points in four consecutive games (Weeks 13-16: 13, 15, 13, 10). It is the **longest active streak in the NFL** and is tied for the second longest this season (New England, eight). It is also the first time the Packers have allowed 15 or fewer points in four consecutive games in a single season since 2002.

►The Packers have given up fewer than 20 points in eight games this season (8-0 in those contests), tied for No. 5 in the NFL:

ODDS AND ENDS

In Week 16, Green Bay held Minnesota to seven first downs, the fewest gained by the Vikings at home since 1971. It was also the first time the Packers allowed 140 or fewer yards and seven or fewer first downs in a game since at Tampa Bay on Dec. 21, 2014.

KENNY KEEPS IMPROVING

DL Kenny Clark continues to be an improving force on the defensive line.

- ►Clark has 4.5 sacks in the last three games, including tying his career high with two sacks in Week 15 vs. Chicago.
- Clark has nine sacks in the month of December over the last three seasons (11 games, 2017-19), tied for No. 9 in the NFL.
- According to NFL Next Gen Stats, Clark ranks in the top five in the NFL this season in QB pressures among players that play at least 75 percent of their snaps on the interior defensive line:

Among among players that play at least 75 percent of their snaps on the interior defensive line (NFL Next Gen Stats), Clark ranks No. 2 in the NFL with 43 disruptions (the combined total of hurries, pressures or sacks - one per play) this season.

Dating back to 2016, Clark is one of six players listed as a DT on pro-football-reference.com to have at least four forced fumbles (four) and four fumble recoveries (four).

After recording 4.5 sacks in 2017, Clark was second on the team with a career-high six sacks in 2018, a total he has matched this season.

<u>COACHES CAPSULES</u>

MATT LaFLEUR...In his first season as the Packers' 15th head coach.

- In his 11th season in the NFL, having served as an offensive coordinator for two seasons (Los Angeles Rams, 2017; Tennessee Titans, 2018), a quarterbacks coach for six seasons (Washington Redskins, 2010-13; Atlanta Falcons, 2015-16), and an offensive assistant for two seasons (Houston Texans, 2008-09).
- ► Guided the Titans' offense in 2018 to a No. 7 league ranking in rushing (126.4 ypg) as Tennessee registered 11 games with 100-plus rushing yards, tied for No. 2 in the NFL.
- Helped the Rams lead the league in scoring with an average of 29.9 points per game in 2017, more than doubling their average from 2016 (14.0 ppg).
- ► Tutored QB Matt Ryan, who led the league in passer rating (117.1) in 2016 on his way to being named NFL Most Valuable Player by *The* Associated Press.
- ► Coached rookie QB Robert Griffin III with the Redskins in 2012, who became the first QB in team history to win *AP* Offensive Rookie of the Year.

MATT PATRICIA...In his second year as the Lions' 27th head coach.

- His first season as head coach featured an improvement in the running game, highlighted by rookie RB Kerryon Johnson, who produced two 100yard rushing performances and three touchdowns.
- Served on the New England Patriots' coaching staff from 2004-17, including six years (2012-17) as defensive coordinator.
- ► Helped lead the Patriots to three Super Bowl championships (XXXIX, XLIX, LI), six AFC championships and 13 AFC East division titles.
- ►From 2012-17, led a Patriots defense that ranked third in points allowed (19.2), fourth in games allowing 20 points or fewer (53) and second in games allowing 17 points or fewer (47).

THE PACKERS-LIONS SERIES

- The Week 17 victory in 2016 gave the Packers their 100th win (including playoffs) against the Lions franchise. Green Bay's 101 victories against Detroit are the club's most against any one opponent.
- A Green Bay victory on Sunday would mark the 100th regular-season victory for the Packers over the Lions.
- Green Bay won 29 of the first 38 matchups in the series before the Lions reeled off 11 straight wins over a six-year span (1949-54).
- The teams have met twice in the postseason, with the first playoff matchup in the Wild Card round of the 1993 season. That game saw QB Brett Favre find WR Sterling Sharpe for a game-winning 40-yard score with less than a minute to go, marking the first playoff win for the Packers in more than 10 years.

NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

Packers head coach Matt LaFleur is from Mount Pleasant, Mich., and played quarterback at Saginaw Valley State (2000-02). LaFleur later became an offensive assistant at his alma mater (2003), and then a graduate assistant at Central Michigan (2004-05) and guarterbacks/wide receivers coach at Northern Michigan (2006)...Packers LB Rashan Gary played three years at Michigan (2016-18)...Packers T Jared Veldheer is from Grand Rapids, Mich., and played collegiately at Hillsdale...Packers offensive line coach Adam Stenavich played collegiately at Michigan (2002-05), and later was a strength and conditioning intern (2011) and a graduate assistant (2012-13) for the Wolverines...Packers quarterbacks coach Luke Getsy was the wide receivers coach at Western Michigan in 2013...Packers offensive quality control coach Kevin Koger played at Michigan (2008-11) and later became a graduate assistant for the Wolverines (2013-14)...Packers chief of staff Darryl Franklin spent three years as a graduate assistant at Central Michigan University. - Packers QB Aaron Rodgers completed 24 of 39 passes for 283 and two TDs, one each to Williams and WR Allen Lazard. Rodgers also completed passes to nine different Green Bay receivers for the third week in a row.
- Lions K Matt Prater converted 5 of 5 field goals with his longest made from 54 yards out.

- ►LB Za'Darius (zuh-DARE-ee-us) Smith is tied for No. 5 in franchise history (since 1982) for the most sacks in a single season. He trails Ezra Johnson (14.5 in 1983) for fourth place and Aaron Kampman (15.5 in 2006) for third place.
- ► The Smiths are the first duo in the team history with 12-plus sacks in the same season and only the second tandem in Packers history (since 1982) to each have 10-plus sacks in a season (Reggie White, 13.0 and Bryce Paup, 11.0 in 1993).
- ►LB **Preston Smith** is the **only player in the NFL** with 25-plus sacks (36.5), five-plus INTs (five) and five-plus forced fumbles (five) since 2015.
- ▶ P. Smith has already set a career high with 12.0 sacks this season. He matched his single-game career high set on Dec. 26, 2015, at Philadelphia with three sacks in Week 3 vs. Denver.
- P. Smith registered 1.5 sacks in Week 1, including taking down Trubisky on fourth down to seal the victory. It was the third time in his career that Smith recorded at least one sack in Week 1. He followed it up by picking off QB Kirk Cousins in Week 2.
- ►Z. Smith's 13.5 sacks have surpassed his career high of 8.5 that he set last season.
- ► In a Week 16 win at Minnesota, Z. Smith set a career high with 3.5 sacks, making him one of three NFL players (MIN DE Danielle Hunter and CAR DE Mario Addison) to register three-plus sacks in a game in both of the last two seasons.
- ► For the third year in a row, Z. Smith registered a sack in the season opener. He is **one of six NFL players** to record a sack in Week 1 each of the last three seasons (2017-19).

- ► Jones is the first player in team history and the 10th player in NFL history to have a 150-yard rushing game (154 in Week 16) and a 150-yard receiving game (159 in Week 8) in the same season.
- In the win over Washington in Week 14, Jones posted 192 yards from scrimmage (134 rushing, 58 receiving) on 22 touches, joining WR Don Hutson (1942) as the only players in franchise history to register two games in a season with 190-plus yards from scrimmage on 25 or fewer touches (per the Elias Sports Bureau).
- ►Also in Week 14, Jones became the first Packer with 130-plus rushing yards (134), an average of 8.3-plus yards per carry (8.4) and 50-plus receiving yards (58) in a game since Taylor (at L.A. Rams, Dec. 13, 1964).
- ►Week 14 also marked Jones' second game since 2018 with 15-plus rushing attempts and an average of 8.3-plus yards per carry, joining Tennessee Titan Derrick Henry are the only two RBs in the league with two games since 2018.
- In Week 8, Jones posted a career-high 159 receiving yards and two TDs on seven receptions (22.7 avg.), the second-most receiving yards in a game by a RB in franchise history behind only Andy Uram (174 yards, vs. Chicago Cardinals on Nov. 1, 1942).
- Jones added 67 rushing yards on 13 carries (5.2 avg.), giving him a career-best 226 yards from scrimmage, the fourth-best single-game total in team annals and the best mark since Green's 227-yard game vs. Denver on Dec. 28, 2003.

- ► Jones (47) and Williams (39) are the **only RB duo in the league** to have 37-plus receptions each this season.
- ► They are the first Packers RB duo to each have 35-plus receptions since Ahman Green (40) and Tony Fisher (38) in 2004.
- ► Green Bay has rushed for over 115 yards in eight games this season, tied for No. 9 in the NFL and for 160-plus yards in four games this season, tied for No. 6 in the league.
- Green Bay has 18 rushing TDs this season, tied for No. 5 in the NFL.

- ► This season has seen the most receptions by Packers RB/FBs since 2006 (113), most receiving yards since 2006 (820) and the most receiving TDs since 2003 (10).
- ► Jones (three) and Williams (five) are the **only RB tandem in the NFL** to both have at least three receiving TDs this season. The last time the Packers had two RBs/FBs with three-plus TD receptions in a season was 2003 when Ahman Green had five and William Henderson had three.

- ► The Packers have recorded two games with 170-plus rushing yards on fewer than 30 rushing attempts, the **most in the NFL in 2019**.
- ► In Week 10, the Packers posted 163 rushing yards and three TDs on 27 carries (6.0 avg.), just the **fifth time** since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger that the team registered 160-plus rushing yards and three-plus rushing TDs on 30 or fewer attempts. Jones (93 yards on 13 att.) and Williams (63 yards on 13 att.) became the **first Green Bay duo** to rush for 60-plus yards each on 15 or fewer carries each in the same game since RB Paul Ott Carruth and FB Gerry Ellis did so vs. Minnesota on Dec. 7, 1986.

- ► Williams is the **first Packer** to post 400-plus rushing yards and 200plus receiving yards in **each of his first three seasons in the NFL** (according to the Elias Sports Bureau).
- ►Williams has registered 200-plus receiving yards in each of his first three seasons in the league to tie Jessie Clark (1983-85) for the most consecutive seasons with 200-plus yards by a Packers RB to start their career (according to the Elias Sports Bureau).
- Williams registered a receiving TD in four straight games (Weeks 6-9), joining Green (2003) as the only RBs in Packers history to have a TD catch in four consecutive games in a single season.
- ► In Week 8, Jones had two receiving TDs and Williams had one, marking the first time the Packers have had three TD receptions in a game by RBs since Nov. 12, 1995, vs. Chicago (Edgar Bennett with two, Dorsey Levens with one).
- Among fullbacks/running backs with five-plus receptions (seven), Vitale ranks **No. 1 in the league** in yards per catch:

- ►The Packers rushed for 120-plus yards in Weeks 5-6 on fewer than 30 attempts. It was only the fourth time since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger that the Packers had posted back-to-back games with 120-plus rushing yards on fewer than 30 attempts and the first time since 2006.
- Week 6 marked the fifth time since 2017 that the Packers posted 150plus rushing yards on fewer than 30 attempts, which is tied for the most in the league over that span (Kansas City, San Francisco). Green Bay is also the only team in the league to have at least one of those games in each of the last three seasons (2017-19).
- ► Jones tied a franchise record with four rushing TDs in Week 5. It was the Packers' first game with four rushing TDs since Dec. 23, 2012, vs. Tennessee.
- ►The Packers rushed for 170 yards on 29 carries (5.9 avg.) in Week 6. They were led by Williams, who posted 104 rushing yards on just 14 attempts (7.4 avg.), the fewest carries needed by a Packer in a 100-yard rushing game since RB James Starks (10-112) vs. San Diego on Oct. 18, 2015. Williams recorded a career-long 45-yard run, the longest by a Packer this season.
- ► Jones (107 yards in Week 5) and Williams (104 yards in Week 6) going back-to-back with 100-plus-yard rushing games marked the first time Green Bay has had different RBs post a 100-yard game in back-to-back weeks since Weeks 2-3 in 2013 (Starks in Week 2, Johnathan Franklin in Week 3).

IMMEDIATE RETURNS

RB **Tyler Ervin** was claimed off of waivers by the Packers prior to the Week 14 game against Washington and has made quite the impact in three games.

- ► For the Packers, Ervin has averaged 9.9 yards per punt return and returned two kickoffs for an average of 35.5 yards.
- ► In his first game with the Packers (Week 14), Ervin returned all four punts for 10-plus yards (10, 12, 18, 11), marking the first time a Packer had four punt returns of 10-plus yards in a game since Derrick Mayes posted four at Minnesota on Dec. 1, 1997 (according to the Elias Sports Bureau).
- ► In his second game with Green Bay, Ervin posted a 45-yard kickoff return in the second quarter, the longest by a Packer since WR Jeff Janis registered a 47-yarder at Oakland on Dec. 20, 2015.

NEW LEADER

The Green Bay Packers named **Matt LaFleur** (la-flew-er) the 15th head coach in franchise history on Jan. 8, 2019.

- LaFleur is the first coach in franchise history to lead his team to a division title in his first season.
- In Week 14, LaFleur (12-3) passed Mike Holmgren and Mike Sherman (9-7) for the most NFL wins by a Packer head coach in their first season.
- ►LaFleur led Green Bay to seven home wins, the most by a Packers head coach in his first season.
- He is the first head coach in franchise history to win seven of his first eight NFL games and the first to win his first three road NFL contests.
- LaFleur is the 19th NFL head coach and the first since Jim Harbaugh in 2011 to win at least seven of his first eight games (Elias Sports Bureau).
- He joined Vince Lombardi (3-0) as the only head coaches in franchise history to win their first three NFL games.
- It was the first time since 2015 and just the third time (2011) in the last 12 seasons that Green Bay has started 3-0.
- According to the Elias Sports Bureau, LaFleur joined John Harbaugh (2008) and Don Coryell (1973) as the only head coaches since the merger (1970) to win each of their first two games, both against divisional opponents.
- ►With a win at Chicago in Week 1, LaFleur became the sixth head coach in franchise history to win his first game, joining Curly Lambeau, Vince Lombardi, Phil Bengston, Forrest Gregg and Ray Rhodes. He joins Lombardi as the only Packers head coaches to beat the Bears in their first game.
- LaFleur became only the second coach to make his head-coaching debut in the NFL's primetime kickoff game (since 2002), joining Jim Zorn, who made his debut with Washington in a losing effort against the New York Giants (16-7) in 2008.
- ►LaFleur is in his 11th season in the NFL in 2019, having served as an offensive coordinator for two seasons (Los Angeles Rams, 2017; Tennessee Titans, 2018), a quarterbacks coach for six seasons (Washington Redskins, 2010-13; Atlanta Falcons, 2015-16) and an offensive assistant for two seasons (Houston Texans, 2008-09).
- During his first 10 seasons in the NFL, LaFleur was a part of offensive staffs that helped their teams rank in the top 10 in the league in total yards seven times (2008-09, 2012-13, 2015-17). In three of his last six seasons in the NFL, he was on a staff that helped its offense finish in the top five in the league in scoring, highlighted by No. 1 rankings in 2016 with the Falcons and in 2017 with the Rams.
- The former quarterback began his coaching career in 2003 at his alma mater, Saginaw Valley State. LaFleur has six seasons of coaching experience at the collegiate level.

THE NEW STAFF

LaFleur explored various avenues to compile his coaching staff, bringing in new coaches and retaining some from the 2018 staff.

- Offensive coordinator Nathaniel Hackett brings 10 years of NFL experience to Green Bay, including five as an offensive coordinator (Buffalo, 2013-14; Jacksonville, 2016-18). In 2017, he guided the Jaguars to a No. 1 league ranking in rushing (141.4 ypg) for the first time in team history on their way to an appearance in the AFC Championship Game.
- ▶ Defensive coordinator **Mike Pettine** was retained after a 2018 season that featured 16 different players with at least a half-sack, the second most in team history (since 1982) behind only the 1987 campaign (strike season) that saw 17 players register a half-sack or more. The defense finished 2018 tied for No. 8 in the league in sacks (44), the most by Green Bay since 2013, and No. 12 in the NFL in pass defense (234.5 ypg) after finishing No. 23 in the category in 2017.
- Special teams coordinator Shawn Mennenga (MEN-in-guh) begins his eighth season in the NFL and returns to the league after leading the special teams at Vanderbilt last season. From 2011-17, he served as the special teams assistant for the Cleveland Browns, assisting Chris Tabor as the team ranked No. 7 in the league over that span in both punt return average (9.9) and opponent kickoff return average (21.8).
- Chris Gizzi, who served as a strength and conditioning assistant from 2014-18, was promoted to strength and conditioning coordinator. As a player, he appeared in 23 games for the Packers as a linebacker in 2000-01, ranking No. 5 on the team with eight tackles on special teams in 2000. Gizzi will lead a staff that consists of Mark Lovat, Thadeus Jackson and Grant Thorne.

Quarterbacks coach Luke Getsy returns to the Packers after spending last season as the offensive coordinator/wide receivers coach for Mississippi State. Over his last two seasons in Green Bay (2016-17), Getsy worked as the wide receivers coach after originally joining the Packers in 2014 as the offensive quality control coach.

DOPE SHEET

- ▶ Defensive line coach **Jerry Montgomery** is entering his fifth season with the Packers and second as defensive line coach. He worked as the defensive front assistant for Green Bay from 2015-17. Montgomery has helped with the development of DL Kenny Clark, who recorded 10.5 sacks in 2017-18, the most among Packers defensive linemen.
- Inside linebackers coach Kirk Olivadotti (ah-luh-vuh-DOT-ee) joins the Packers after coaching for the Washington Redskins for 16 seasons. He is one of 11 members of the Redskins' assistant coach honor roll, which recognizes coaches with at least 10 seasons of service as an assistant in Washington. During his time with the Redskins, Washington ranked in the top 10 in the NFL in overall defense eight times.
- ►Tight ends coach Justin Outten (OW-ten) was the offensive assistant for the Atlanta Falcons the past two seasons (2017-18). He began with the Falcons as an offensive intern in 2016. Over the last three seasons, Atlanta averaged 27.2 points per game (No. 4 in the NFL over that span) and 389.9 yards per game (No. 3 in the league over that span).
- ▶ Defensive backs coach **Jason Simmons** is entering his ninth season with the Packers having worked in various roles (secondary in 2018, assistant special teams coach from 2015-17, defensive/special teams assistant in 2014 and a coaching administrator from 2011-13). Before coaching, he played for 10 years in the NFL as a defensive back and was a standout on special teams during his career.
- Running backs coach Ben Sirmans is entering his fourth season in that position for the Packers. From 2016-18, Green Bay led the NFL with an average of 4.66 yards per carry, including an average of 5.01 yards per carry in 2018 (No. 2 in the NFL) that was the second-best singleseason mark in team history. He joined the Packers after spending the previous four seasons (2012-15) as the running backs coach for the St. Louis Rams.
- Outside linebackers coach Mike Smith joins the Packers after spending the last three seasons with the Kansas City Chiefs, first as the assistant defensive line coach in 2016-17 and then coaching outside linebackers last season. In 2018, Smith coached Dee Ford, who was selected to his first Pro Bowl after tying for the NFL lead with seven forced fumbles and tying for No. 2 among NFL linebackers with a career-high 13 sacks.
- ▶Offensive line coach Adam Stenavich (STEN-uh-vitch) comes to the Packers after serving as the assistant offensive line coach for the San Francisco 49ers the last two seasons. He helped coach a line that cleared the way for RB Matt Breida to average 4.96 yards per carry in 2016-17, ranking No. 5 in the NFL over that span (min. 200 att.). The Marshfield, Wis., native played left tackle at Michigan (2002-05) and was named first-team All-Big Ten in 2004-05.
- Wide receivers coach Alvis Whitted (WHITT-id), who played wide receiver for nine seasons in the NFL, worked for the last seven years as the wide receivers coach at Colorado State. During his tenure at CSU, Whitted mentored three All-America wide receivers, including two consensus first-team All-Americans who also were finalists for the Biletnikoff Award (Michael Gallup in 2017 and Rashard Higgins in 2014).
- Assistant offensive line coach Luke Butkus comes to Green Bay after serving as the offensive line coach for the University of Illinois for the past three seasons (2016-18), a position he also held for the Fighting Illini in 2012. Between the two stints at his alma mater, he was the assistant offensive line coach for the Jacksonville Jaguars (2013-15).
- Assistant defensive backs coach Ryan Downard begins his second season in Green Bay after serving as the defensive quality control coach last year. He came to Green Bay after working at Bowling Green for two seasons, serving as the safeties coach in 2017 and the director of football operations in 2016.
- Assistant special teams coach Maurice Drayton was retained and is entering his fourth season coaching in the NFL. He worked as the assistant special teams coach for each of the past three seasons (Green Bay in 2018 and the Indianapolis Colts in 2016-17).
- Offensive assistant Jason Vrable enters his seventh season as an assistant coach in the NFL, previously working for the New York Jets (2017-18) and Buffalo Bills (2013-16).
- ► The staff also consists of four quality control coaches: Wendel Davis (defense), Kevin Koger (offense), Christian Parker (defense) and Rayna Stewart (special teams).

QB **Aaron Rodgers** surpassed the 1,500-attempt plateau for his career in 2010, the benchmark to qualify for passer rating in the NFL record book. ►Rodgers ranks **No. 1 in NFL history** in career passer rating:

- ► In Week 7, Rodgers set a single-game franchise record with a perfect 158.3 passer rating after connecting on 25 of 31 passes for 429 yards and five TDs with no INTs. It eclipsed the previous single-game team record of 155.4 by Rodgers at Cleveland on Oct. 25, 2009.
- ► Rodgers also posted a rushing TD in Week 7, making him just the second QB in NFL history (Redskins QB Mark Rypien; Nov. 10, 1991) to throw for 400-plus yards with five-plus passing TDs, a rushing TD and no INTs.
- Dating back to 1950, Rodgers is just the sixth NFL QB to register 400plus passing yards and a perfect passer rating in a game, according to pro-football-reference.com.
- ▶ Rodgers' average of 13.84 yards per attempt in Week 7 was a singlegame career high (min. 15 att.) and was the best by a Green Bay QB since Brett Favre registered a 14.52-yard average (363 yards on 25 att.) at Indianapolis on Nov. 16, 1997. Rodgers' 13.84-yard average was the best in team history in a game with 30-plus attempts.
- ► Weeks 7-8 marked the sixth time in his career that Rodgers has had two or more consecutive games with 300-plus passing yards, three-plus passing TDs and no INTs. No other QB in team history has done it once.

- Rodgers reached 40,000 passing yards in his 154th career game (Week 5 at Detroit, 2018). At the time, he had 323 passing TDs, becoming the first quarterback in NFL history to reach 40,000 passing yards and 300 TD passes in fewer than 157 games, the number in which both Peyton Manning and Dan Marino reached the two marks.
- Rodgers tied Manning for the fourth-fewest games to reach 40,000 passing yards, trailing Matt Ryan (151), Drew Brees (152) and Marino (153), according to the Elias Sports Bureau.
- Rodgers threw for 400-plus yards in Week 7 to extend his franchise record to nine 400-plus-yard games. No other quarterback in franchise annals has more than one 400-yard passing game (four QBs with one).
- ►In Week 4, Rodgers passed Hall of Fame QB Fran Tarkenton (342) to rank No. 9 in NFL history in touchdown passes. He (362) trails Steelers QB Ben Roethlisberger (363) for the No. 8 spot and Giants QB Eli Manning (366) for No. 7 in NFL history.
- Rodgers reached 5,000 career attempts in Week 3 of 2018. At the time of his 5,000th career attempt, he had 319 TD passes and 78 INTs, setting the record for the most (Johnny Unitas, 284) and fewest (Donovan McNabb, 107) in each category in NFL history at the time of the 5,000th attempt.
- Rodgers ranks No. 10 in the NFL this season in completions (326). He finished the 2018 season with 372 completions, tied for the second most in a season in team history behind his franchise mark of 401 (2016).
- Rodgers finished 2018 with 4,442 passing yards, 25 passing touchdowns and just two interceptions, marking his sixth season with 4,000plus passing yards, 25-plus passing TDs and 10 or fewer interceptions, the most by an NFL player since 1920, according to pro-football-reference.com:

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

Green Bay went 7-1 away from Lambeau Field in 2011, with the seven road wins setting a single-season franchise record.

- ►The Packers are 5-2 (.714) on the road this season. If they win this Sunday, it would be just the **fourth time since 1978** (7-1 in 2011 / 6-2 in 2007 and 2004), when the NFL went to a 16-game schedule, that Green Bay won six-plus road games in the regular season (pro-football-reference.com).
- Dating back to 2000, the Packers have been able to stay above the .500 mark on the road, a notable achievement in the National Football League.
- Since 2000, Green Bay is one of only six NFL teams to have a regularseason road record above .500.

350 AND COUNTING

Another packed house at Lambeau Field against the Chicago Bears in Week 15 of 2019 brought the stadium's consecutive-sellouts streak to 350 regular-season games (not including replacement games).

- The league's longest-tenured stadium, Lambeau Field is hosting its 63rd season of football in 2019. For the victory over Dallas in the Divisional round of the 2014 playoffs, Packers fans set a new Lambeau Field paid-attendance record (79,704).
- Across American professional sports, only Boston's Fenway Park (1912) and Chicago's Wrigley Field (1914) have longer tenures.

THE LAMBEAU ADVANTAGE

The crown jewel of the National Football League, Lambeau Field has long been known as one of the tougher venues to play in, particularly during the harsh Wisconsin winter.

- ► Re-establishing home-field advantage after a 4-4 mark in 2008 was one of the goals of 2009, and with the Packers finishing 6-2 at home, they accomplished that goal. Green Bay followed that up with a 7-1 mark at Lambeau Field in 2010, a perfect 8-0 record in 2011, the first undefeated home mark since 2002, and a 7-1 mark in 2012. The Packers were one of two teams to finish undefeated at home during the 2014 regular season (Denver).
- ► Green Bay was 7-1 (.875) at home in 2019, marking the ninth time in the last 11 seasons that the Packers won five-plus games at home.
- Since Ron Wolf and Mike Holmgren began the revitalization of the franchise in 1992, Green Bay owns the best home record in the NFL. A look at the top regular-season home W-L records since the '92 season:

Detroit Lions, 23-22, on Monday night GREEN BAY, Wis. (AP) — It took Mason Crosby 13 seasons to perform his first Lambeau Leap. The 35-year-old kicker nailed a 23-yard field goal as time expired and jumped into the crowd with a boost from long snapper Hunter Bradley after he finished off a rally for the Green Bay Packers, who benefited from some questionable officiating to edge the

Aaron Rodgers, in his second straight game without top target Davante Adams, completed 24 of 39 passes for 283 yards and two touchdowns, including a beautiful 35-yard throw to Allen Lazard for the first-yaar pro's first career score. Rodgers linked up with Jamaal Williams for the other TD. Williams finished with 104 yards on 14 carries and four catches for 32 yards for Green Bay (5-1), which captured its first with in five tries against its NFC North firal. The Packers, who are off to their first 3-0 start in the NFC North since 2012, might not have pulled it off if not for two fourth-quarter penalties for illegal hands to the face against Detroit's Trey Flowers, both of them on third down. The first set up Lazard's touchdown,

and the second allowed Green Bay to run the clock down to two seconds before Crosby's game-winner. In both cases, replays showed Flowers' hands on the neck or shoulder — not the face — of a Packers lineman. Kerryon Johnson scored the lone touchdown for the Lions from 1 yard out in the first quarter. Preston Smith and Za Darius Smith each had a sack for Green Bay. Preston Smith and Kyler Fackrell combined for the other. Rodgers was sacked once by Damon Harrison Sr. and threw an interception that bounced off the facemask of an open Darrius Shepherd near the goal line. James Coleman snagged the ball and returned it 55 yards, setting up Prater's last field goal that made it 22-13.

• Led the team with a career-high 111 receptions in 2018, the second most in team history behind only WR Sterling Sharpe's 112 in 1993, for a career-best 1,386 yards (12.5 avg.) and a career-high 13 TDs on his way to earning Pro Bowl honors for the second straight year, his first as an original selection.

 Has started all 105 regular-season games he has appeared in at LT since entering the league in 2013. Opened all 16 regular-season games in four of his first six seasons in the NFL.

2019 SEASON: Has started all 15 games at LT...Part of an offense that ranks No. 3 in the league in red-zone TD percentage (66.7), No. 2 in giveaways (12) and No. 1 in zero-turnover games (nine)...Has helped the offense register 18 rushing TDs this season (tied for No. 5 in the NFL), the most by the Packers since 2009 (20)...Was selected to his second career Pro Bowl, his first as an original selection.

• Returned to the Packers and started all 16 games in 2018 after spending three seasons with the Cleveland Browns (2015-16) and Arizona Cardinals (2017).

• Has three career TDs, including INT returns of 43 yards (2011) and 70 yards (2010 postseason) and a 94-yard punt return (2007).

• Ranked No. 1 in the NFL with a combined nine interceptions in 2010 (six in regular season, three in postseason) and was chosen for the Pro Bowl as an injury replacement.

• Was one of only two NFL players (CB Terence Newman) to register at least one interception each season from 2007-17.
